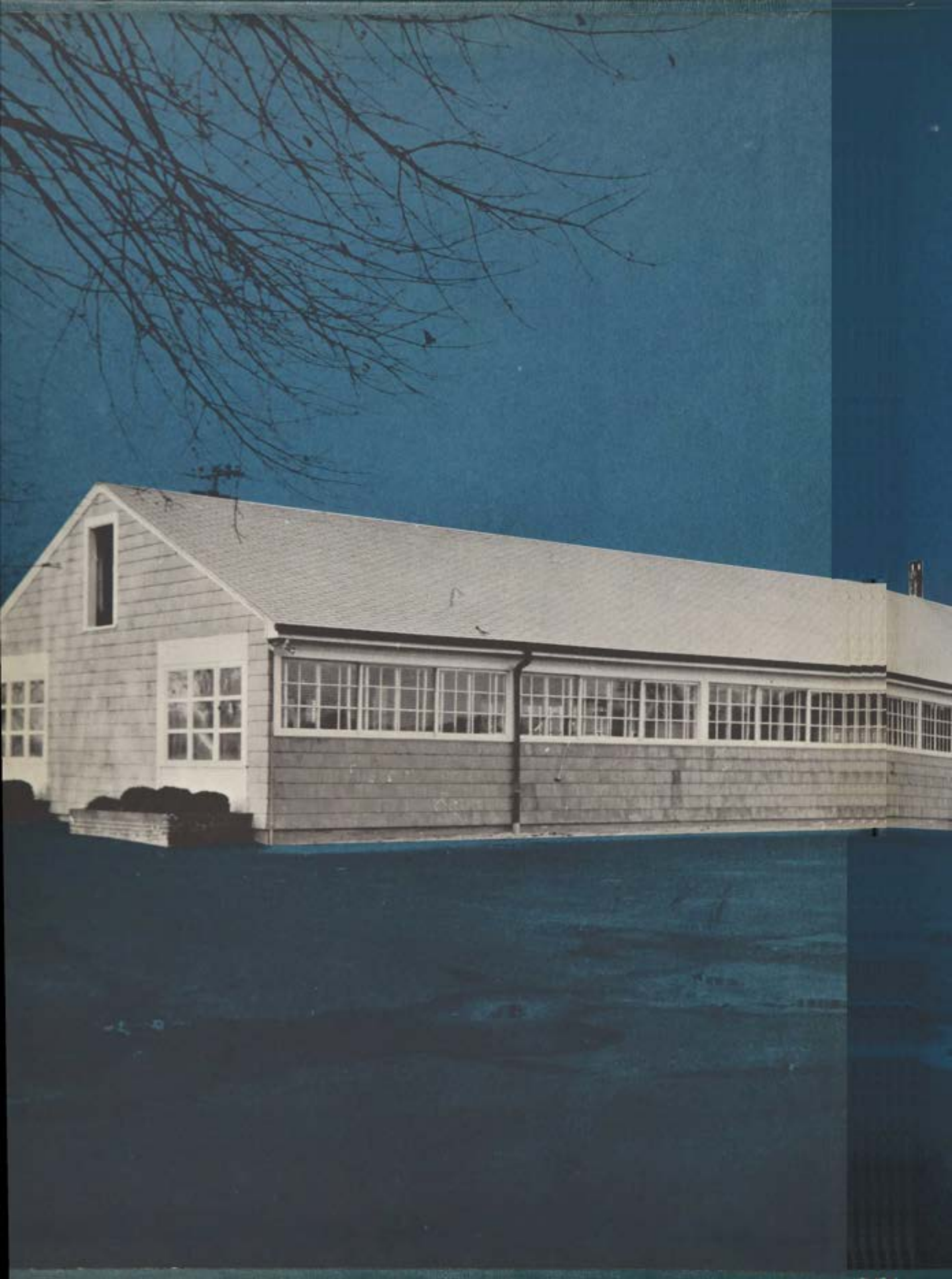

Drops of blood from Medusa's severed head which fell into the sea were utilized by Neptune who created from them PEGASUS. PEGASUS was later changed into a northern constellation.

HONOR SOCIETY

The National Honor Society is a nation-wide organization by which member schools give recognition to their Juniors and Seniors whose record is especially worthy of commendation. Four categories of requirements must be met by candidates before they can be admitted: character, scholarship, leadership, service.

In the Christian Brothers Academy Chapter, the character and leadership requirements are met by recommendation of the Faculty. The requirements of scholarship, and service are met by acquiring a specified minimum number of points in each category, depending on participation in activities.

Christian Brothers Academy awards First Honors to those students who obtain a ninety average with all their grades above ninety. Second Honors are awarded those students who maintain an eighty-five average with no grades below eighty.

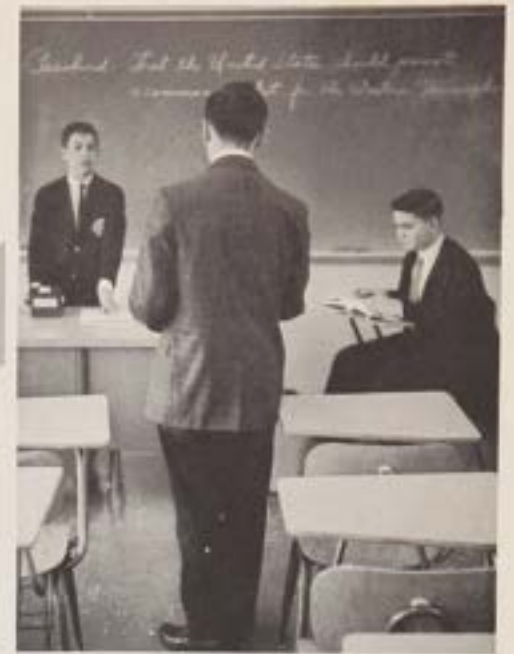

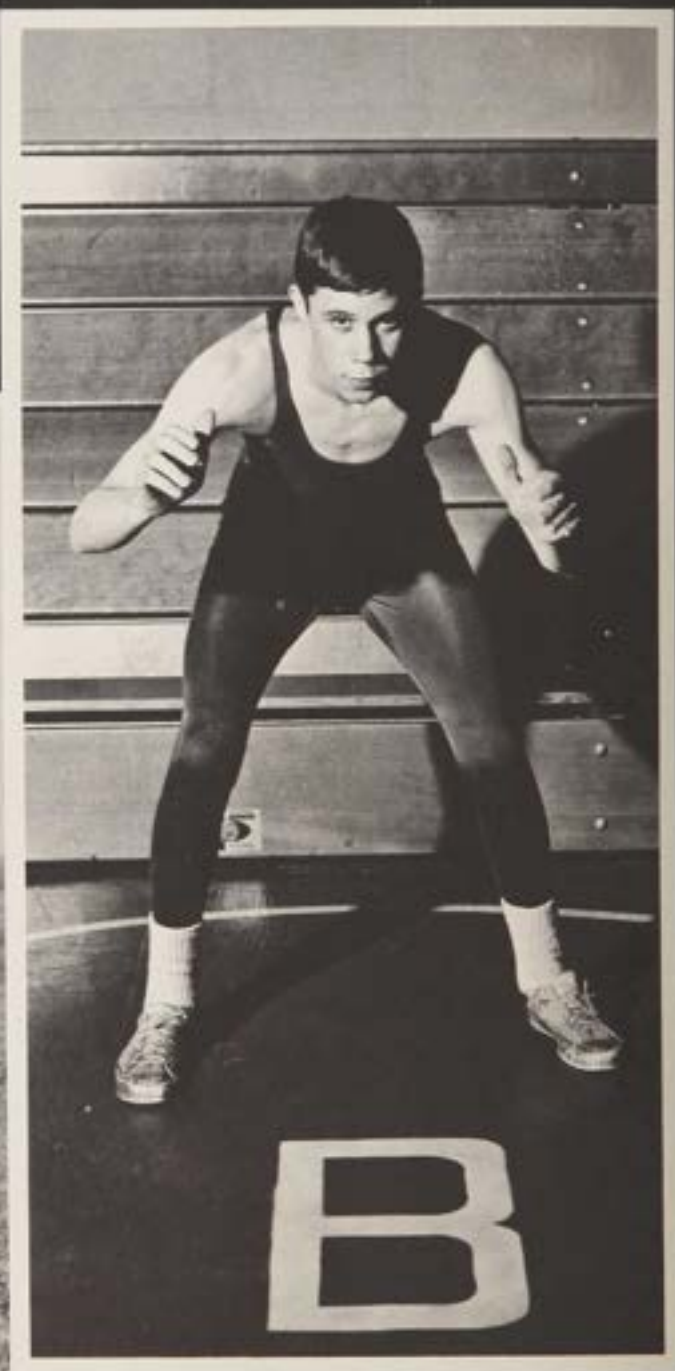

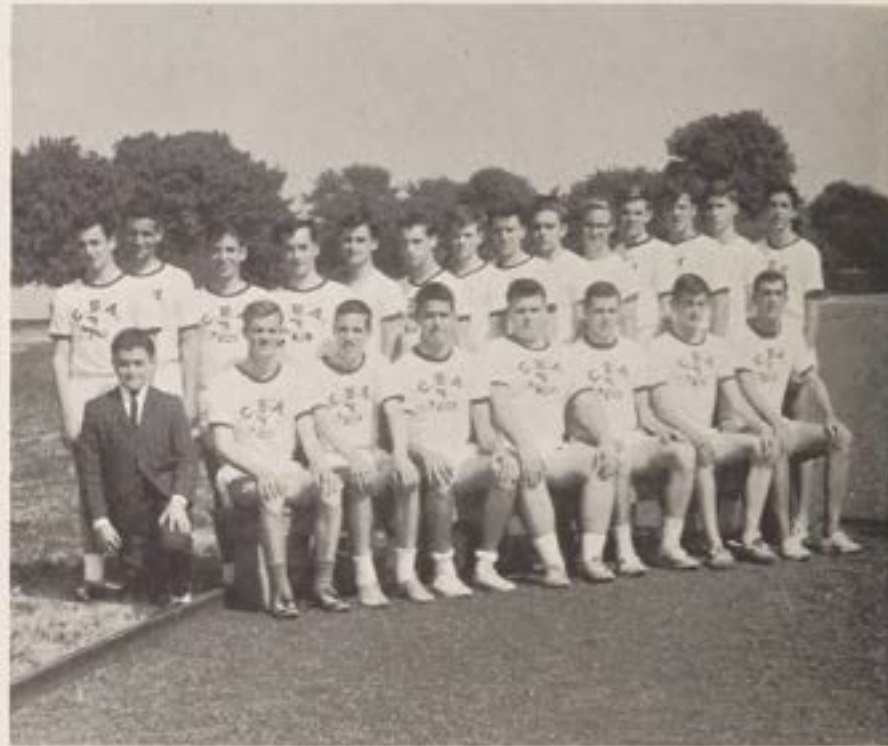

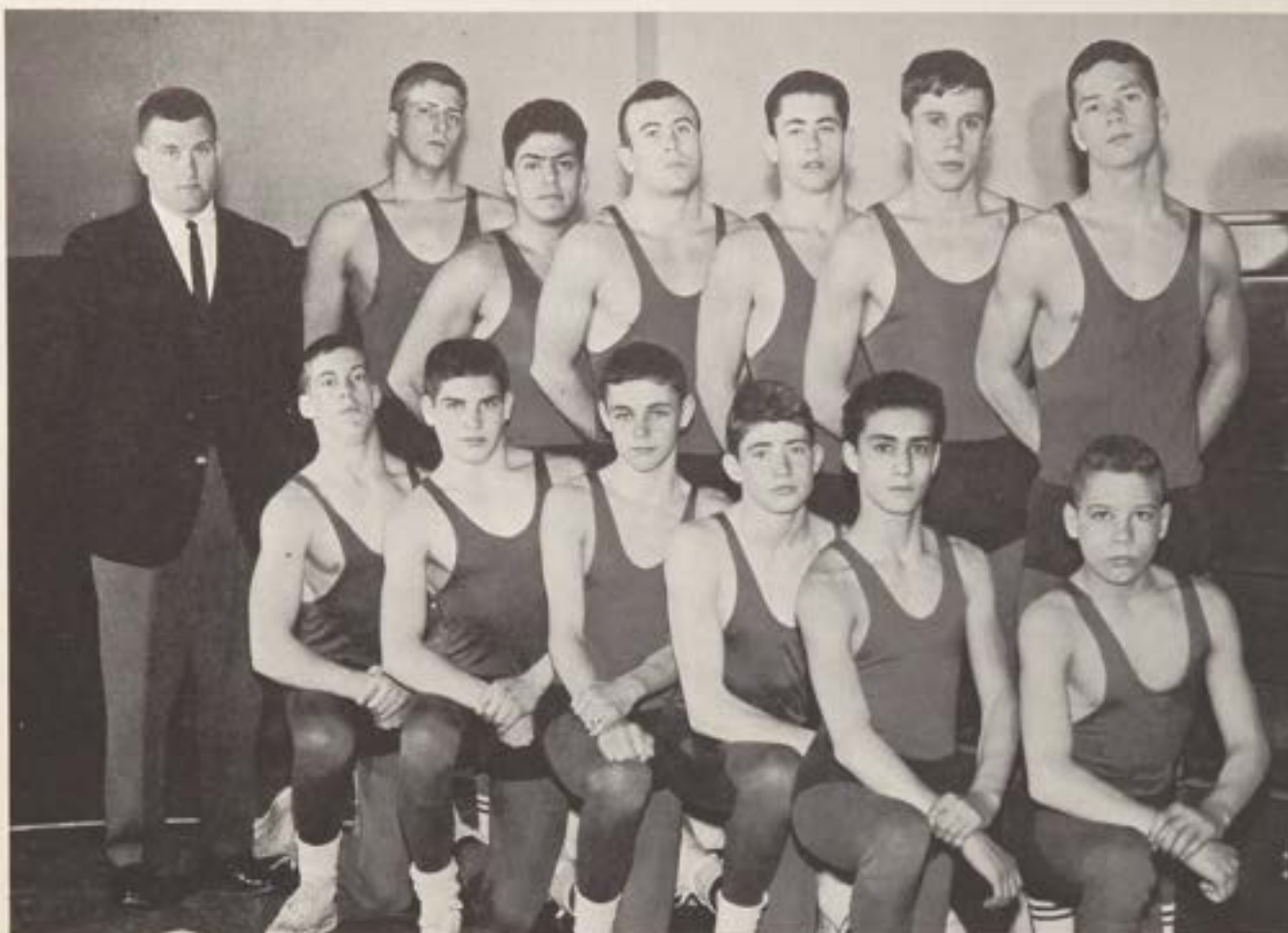

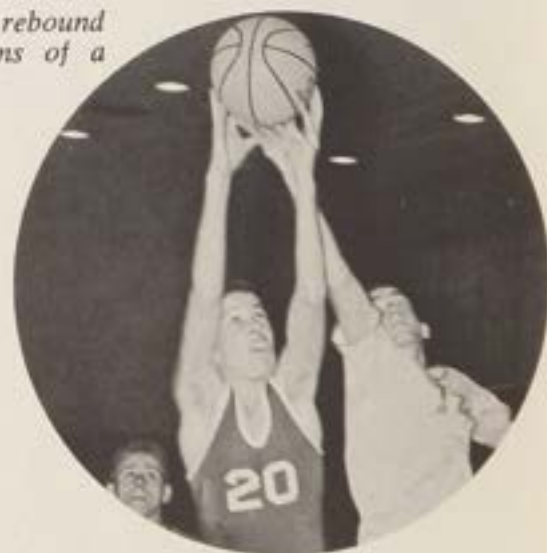

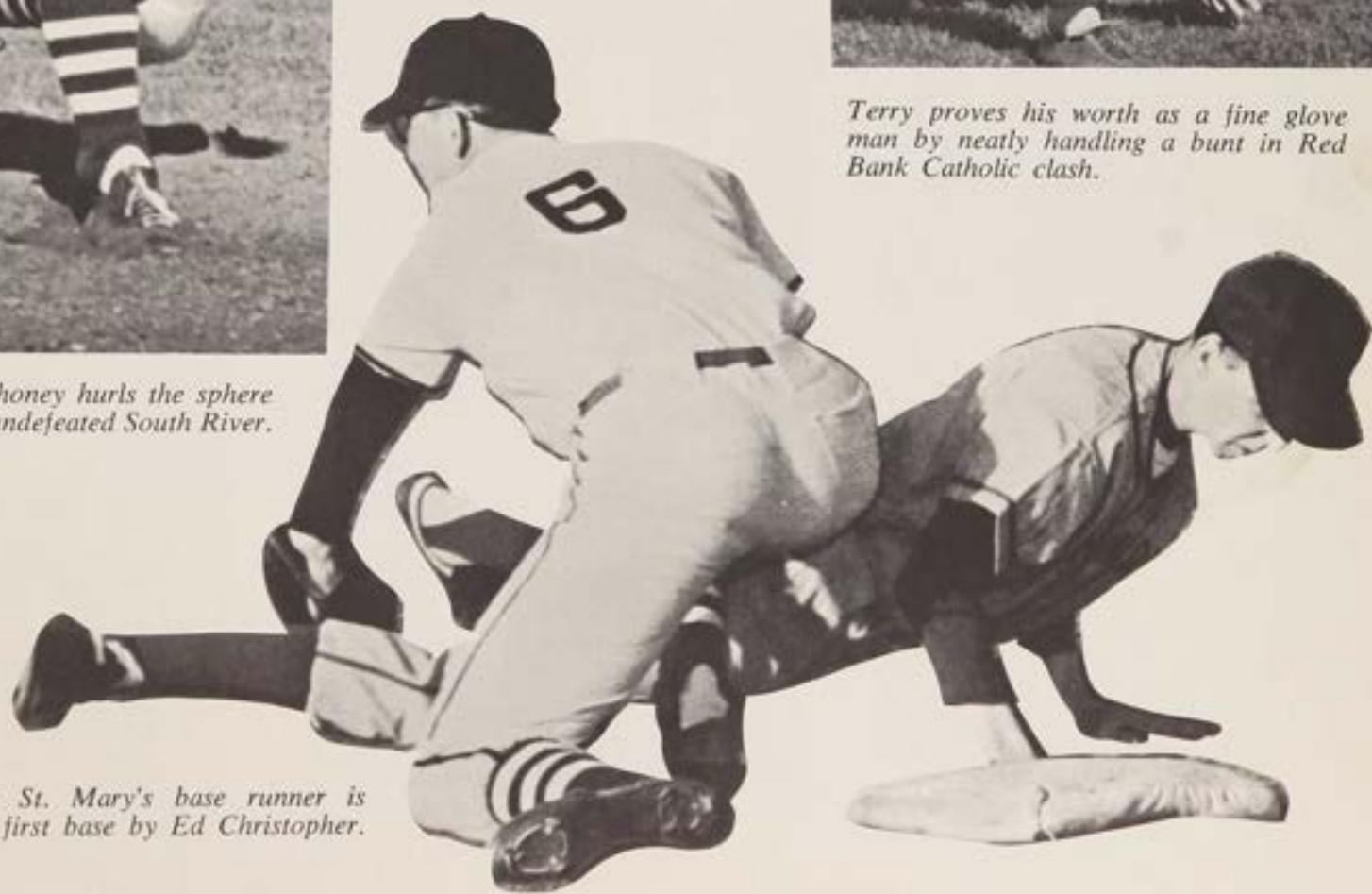

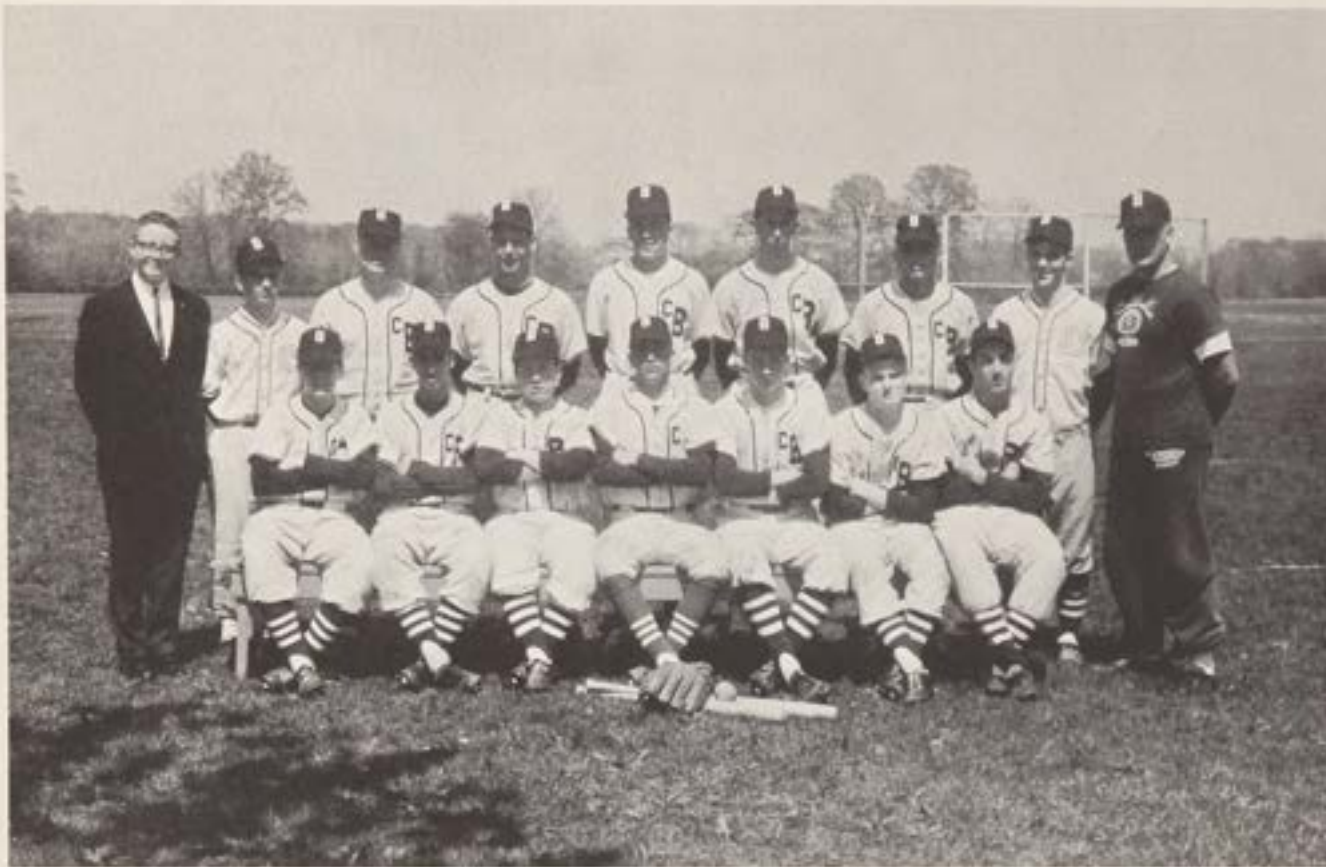
