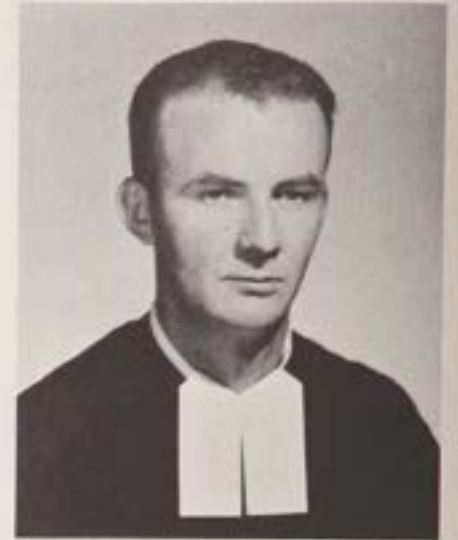

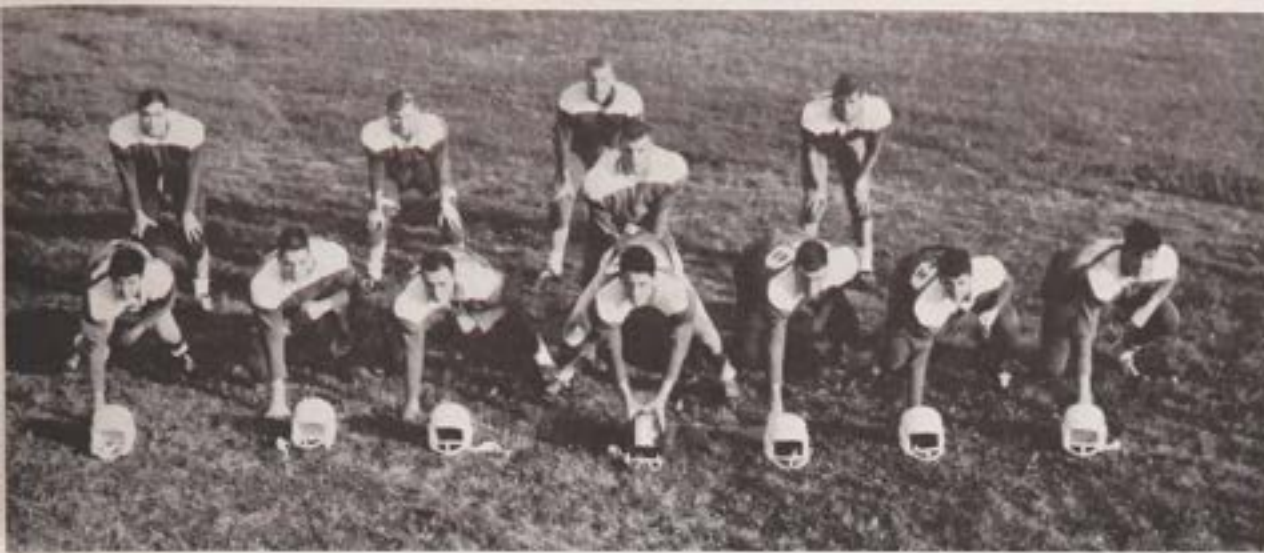

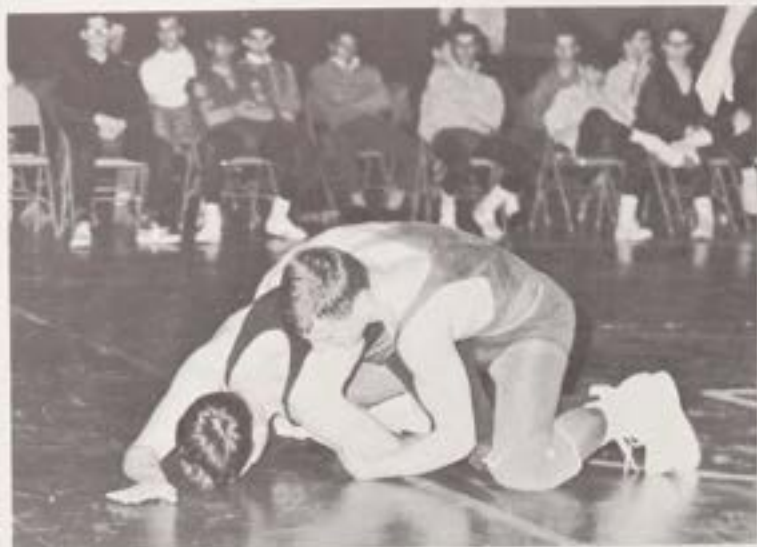

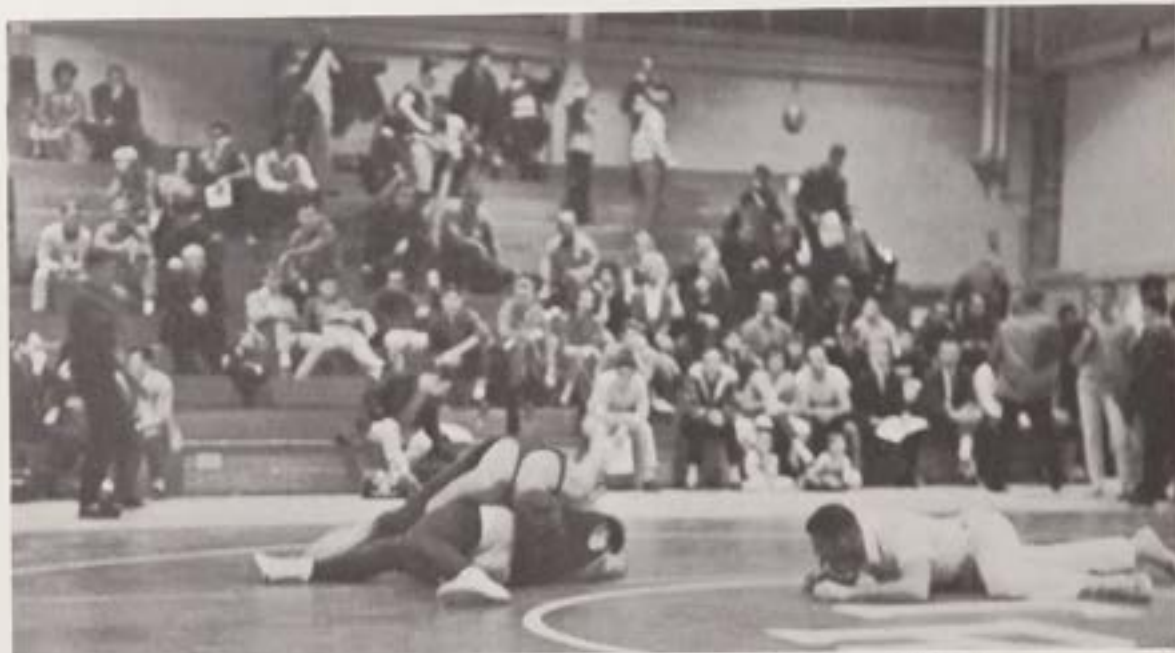

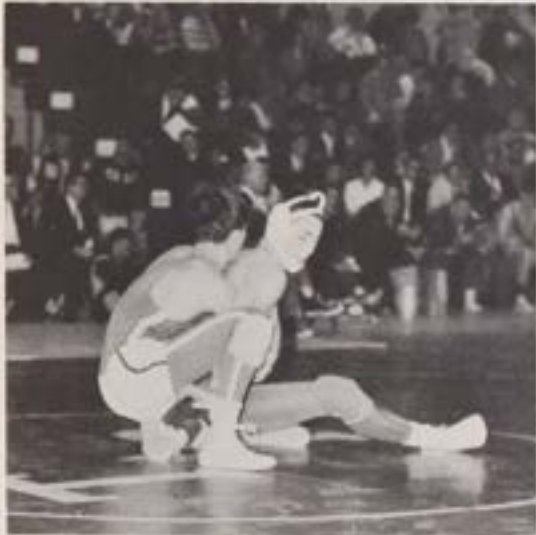

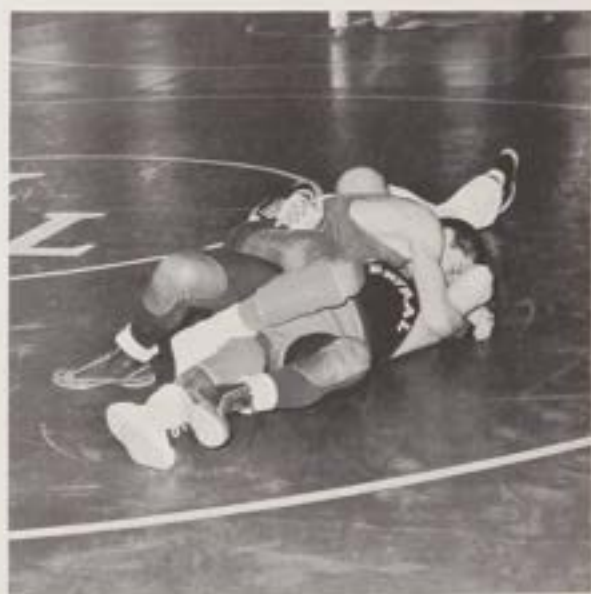

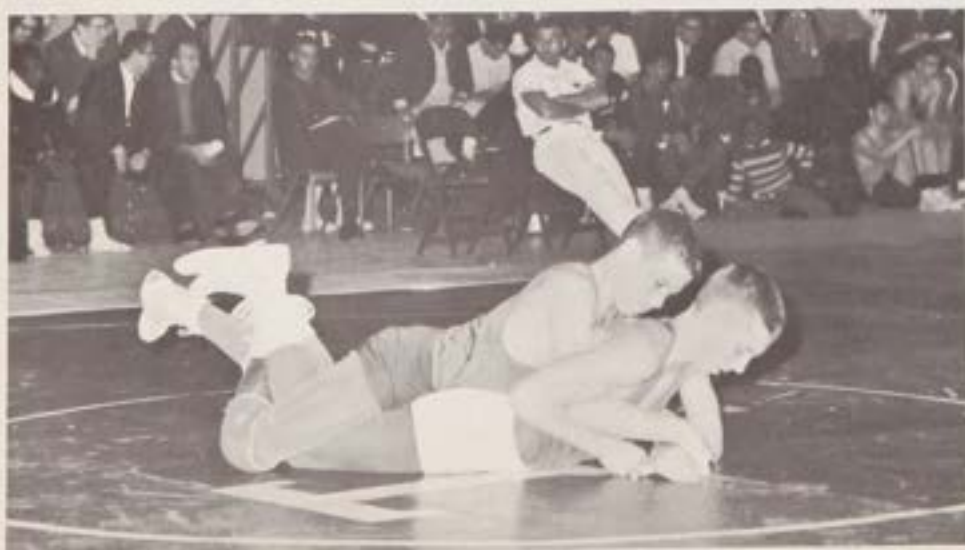

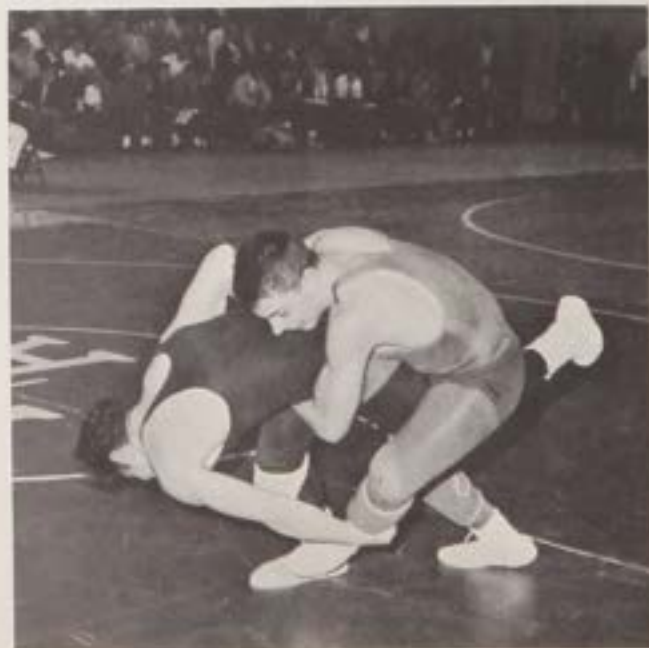

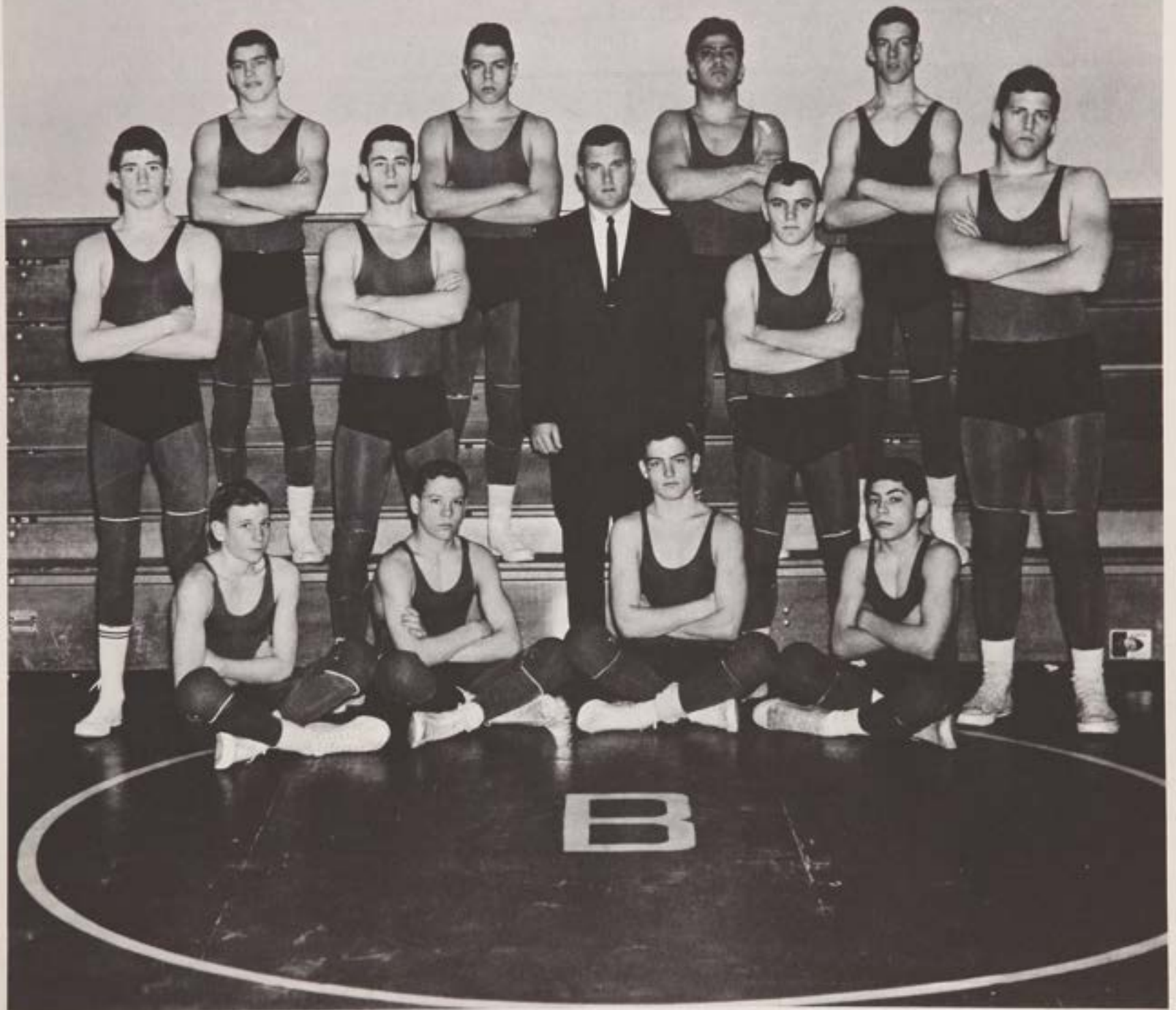

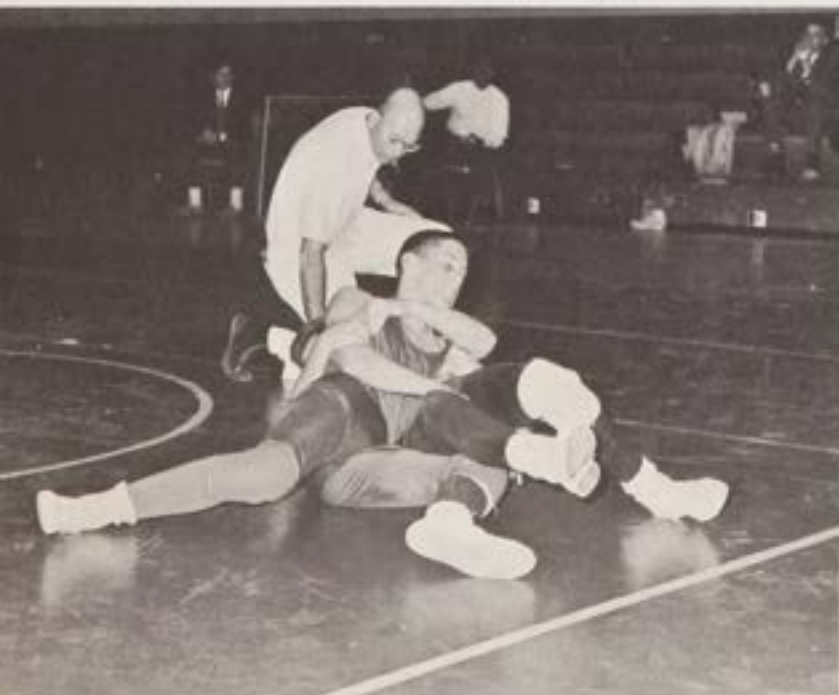

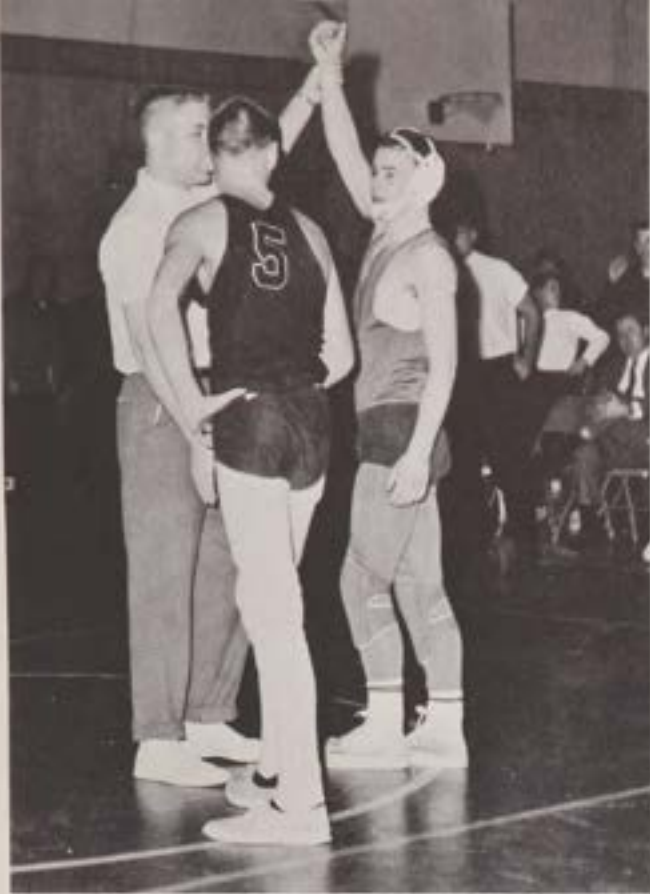

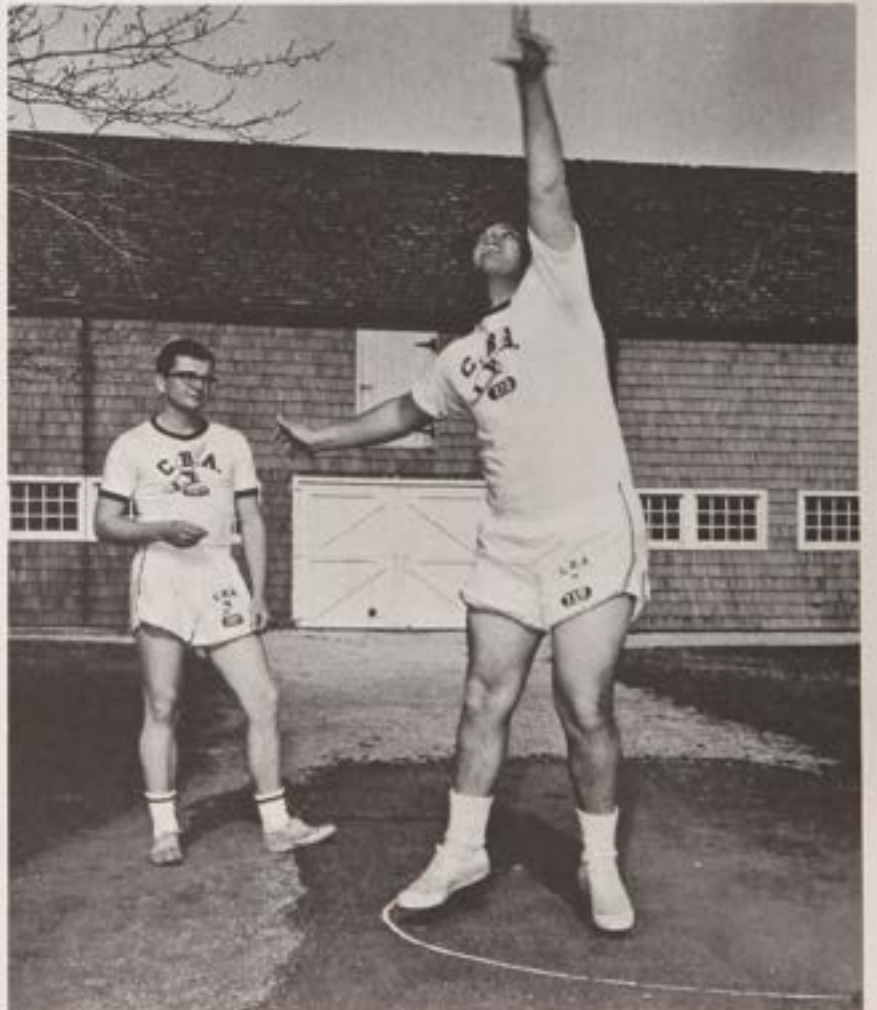

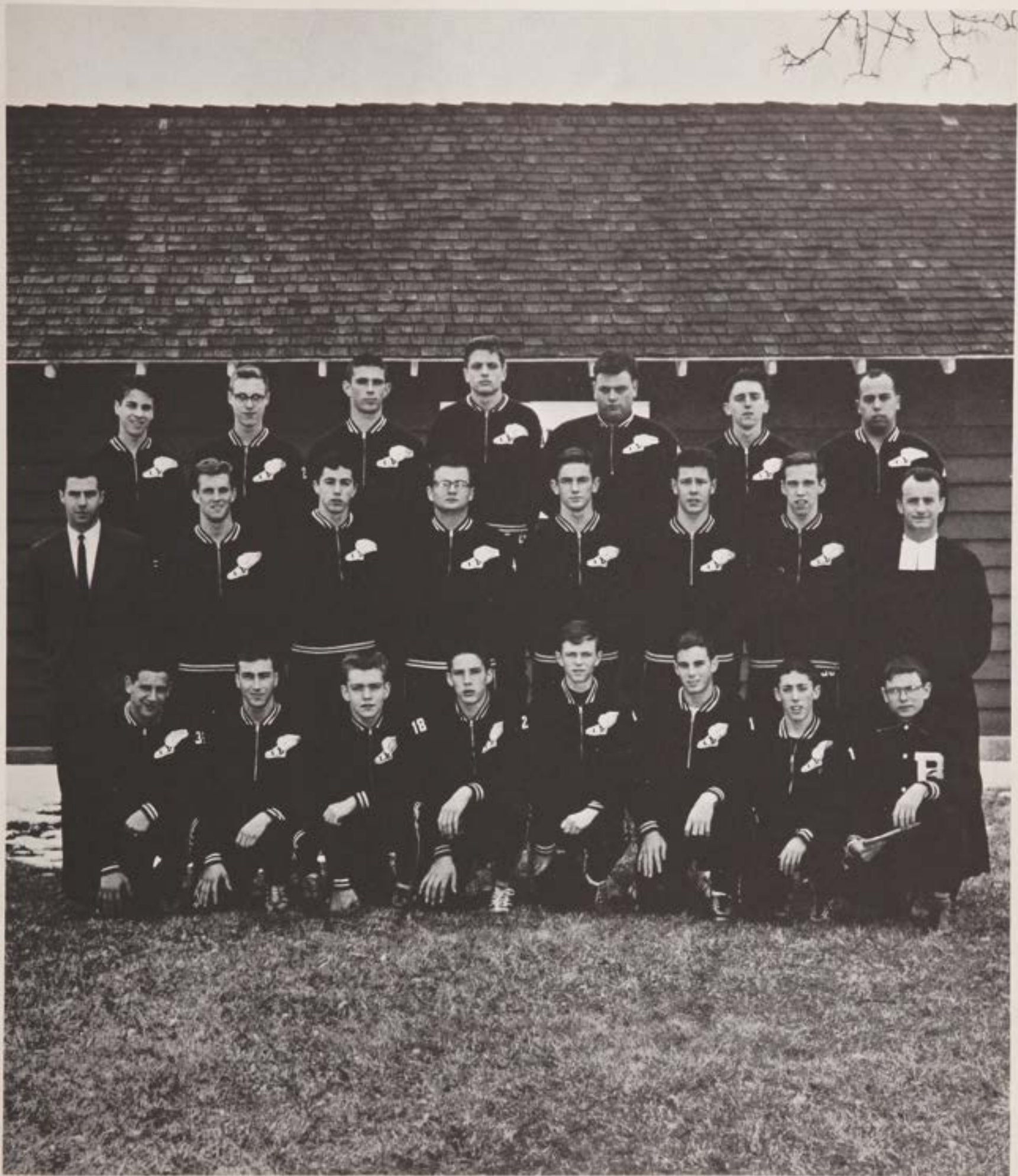

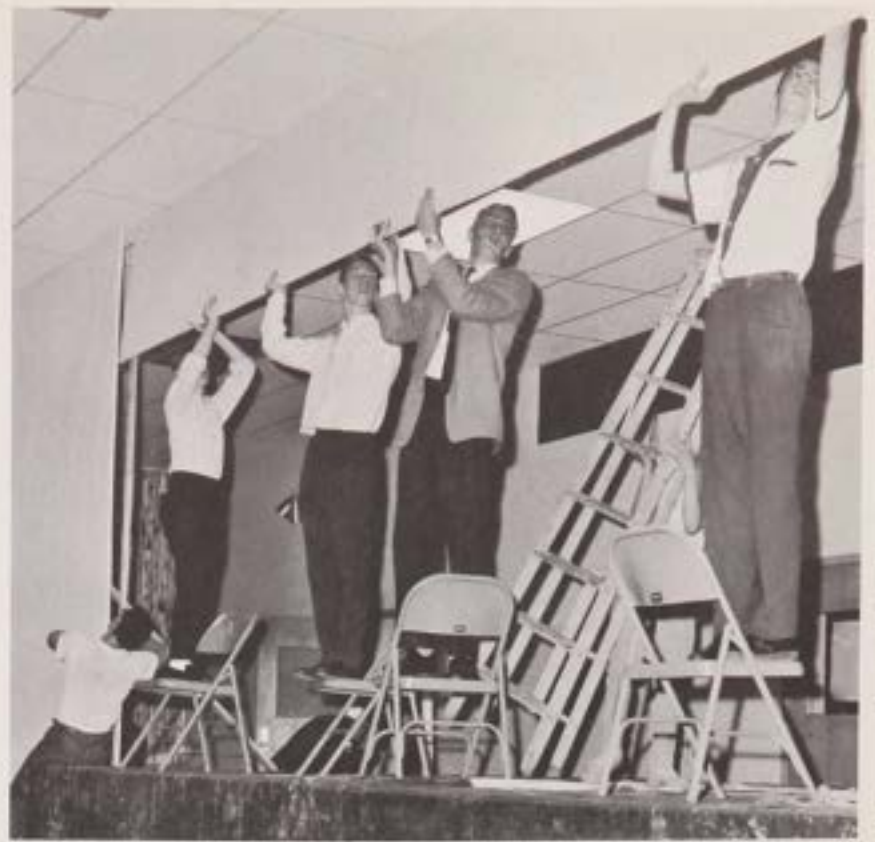

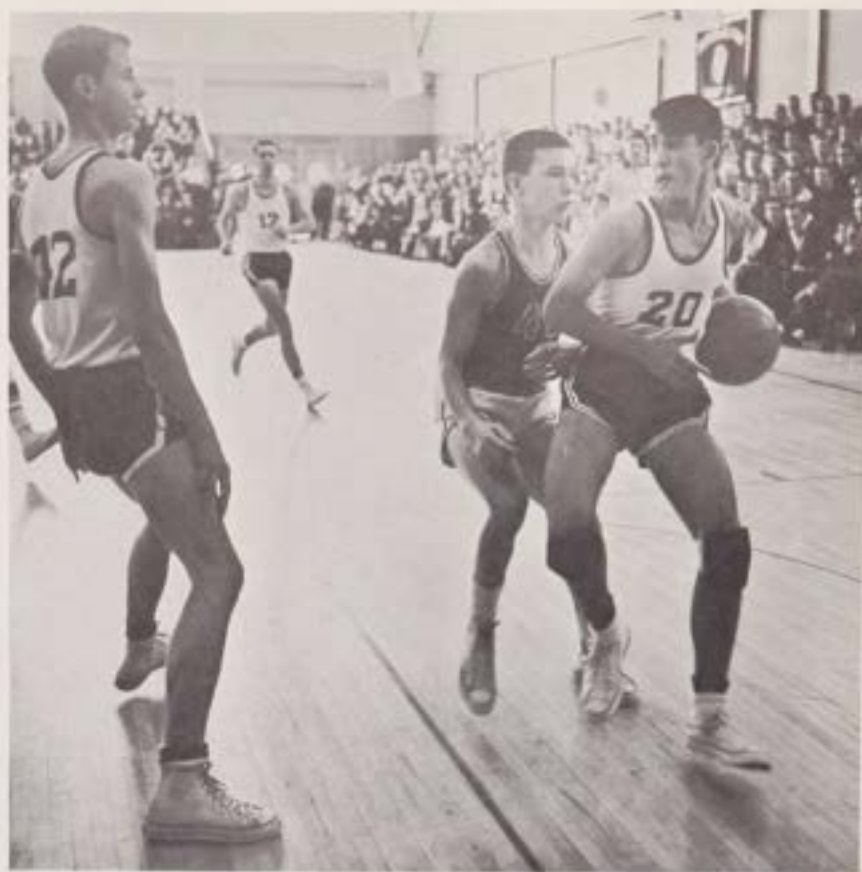

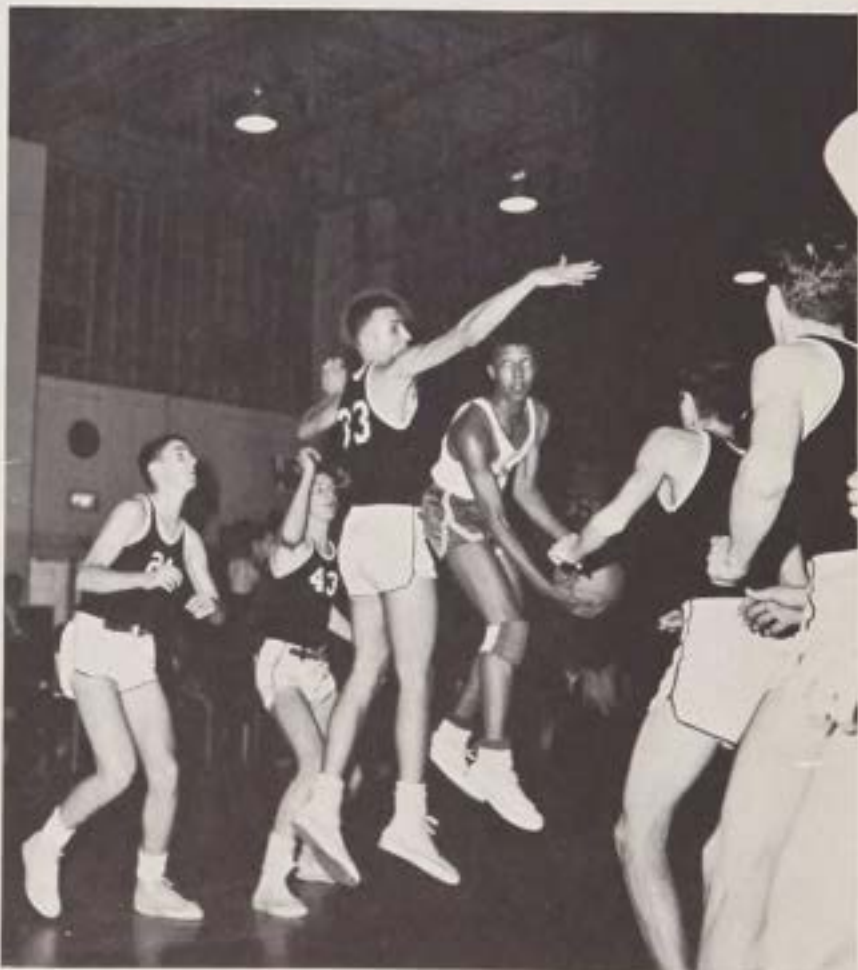

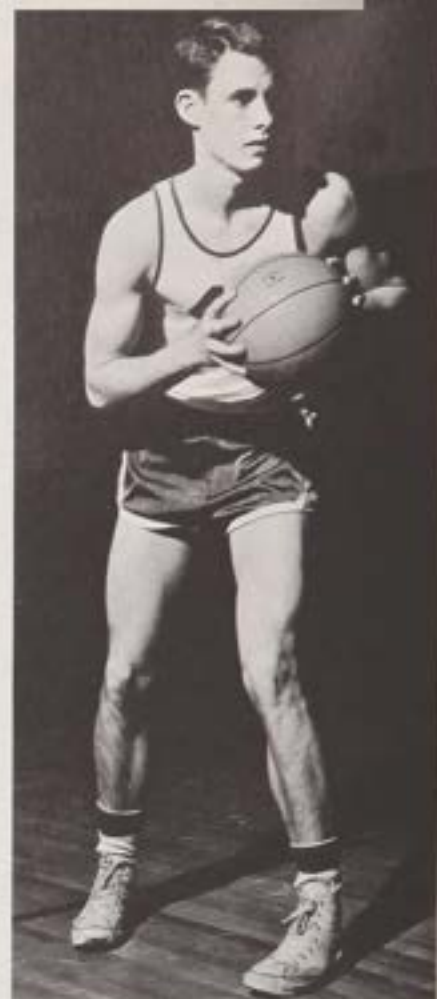

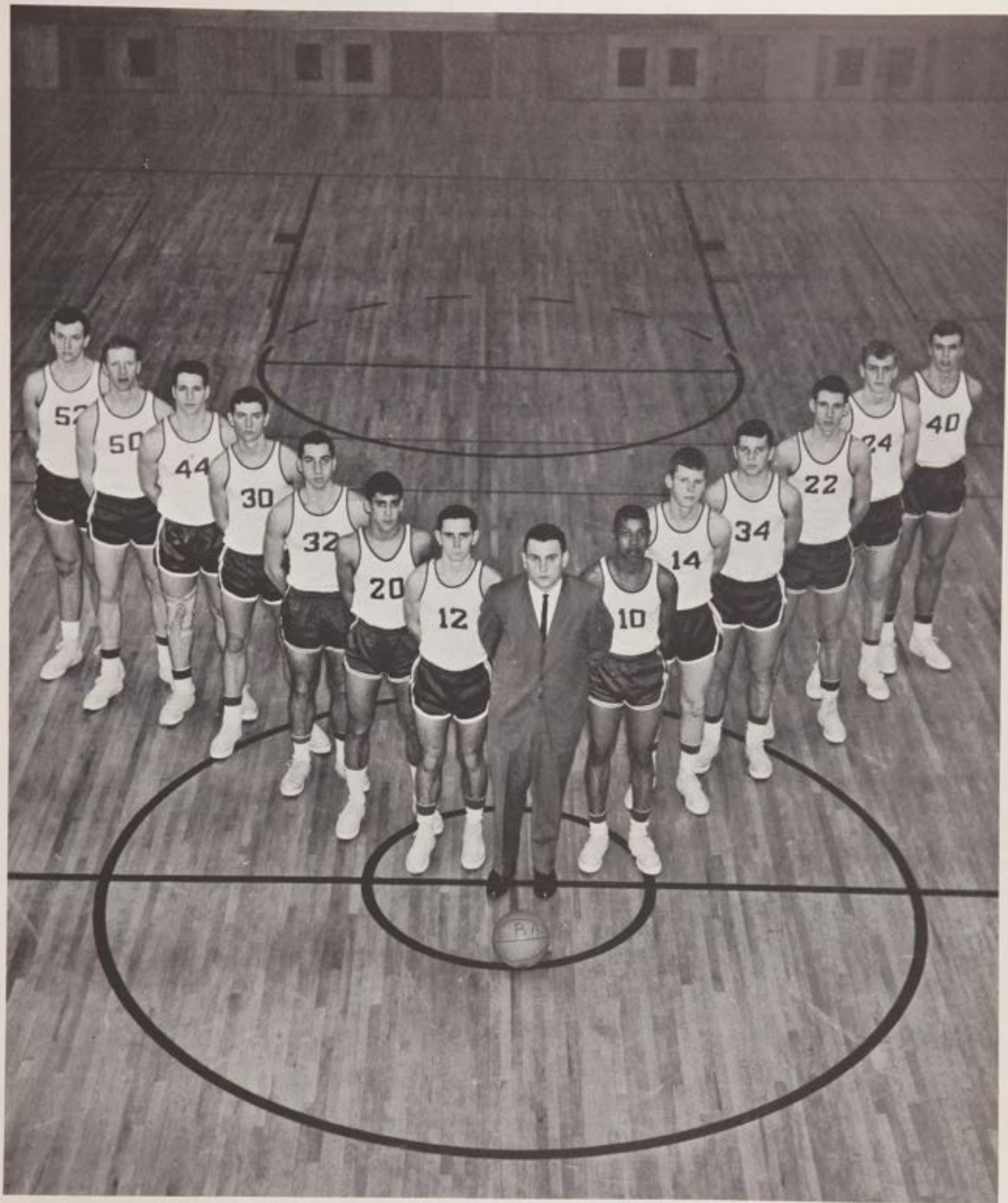

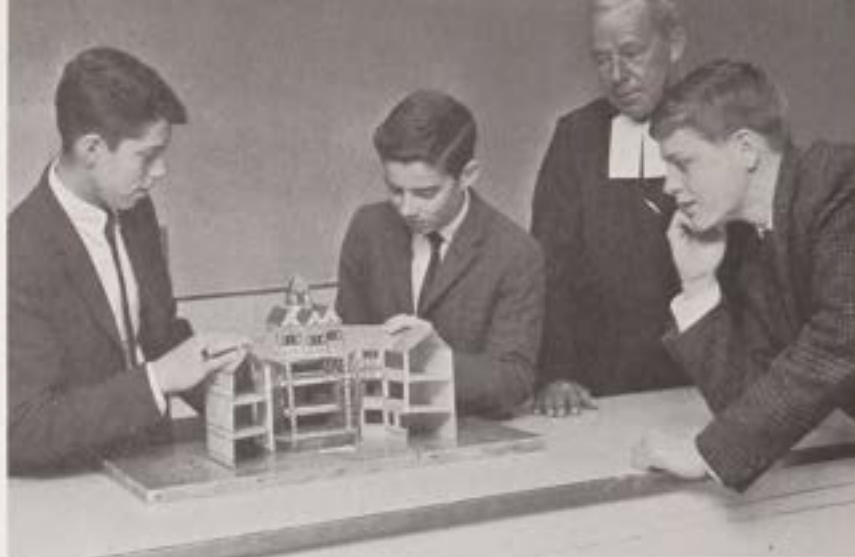

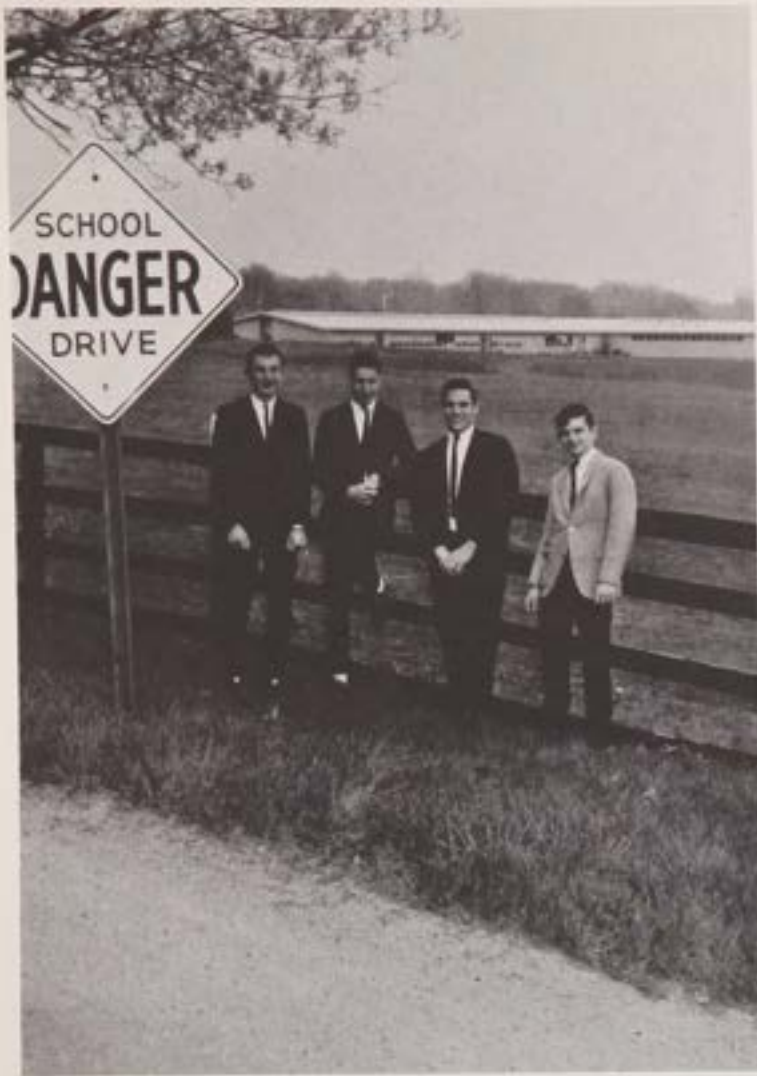

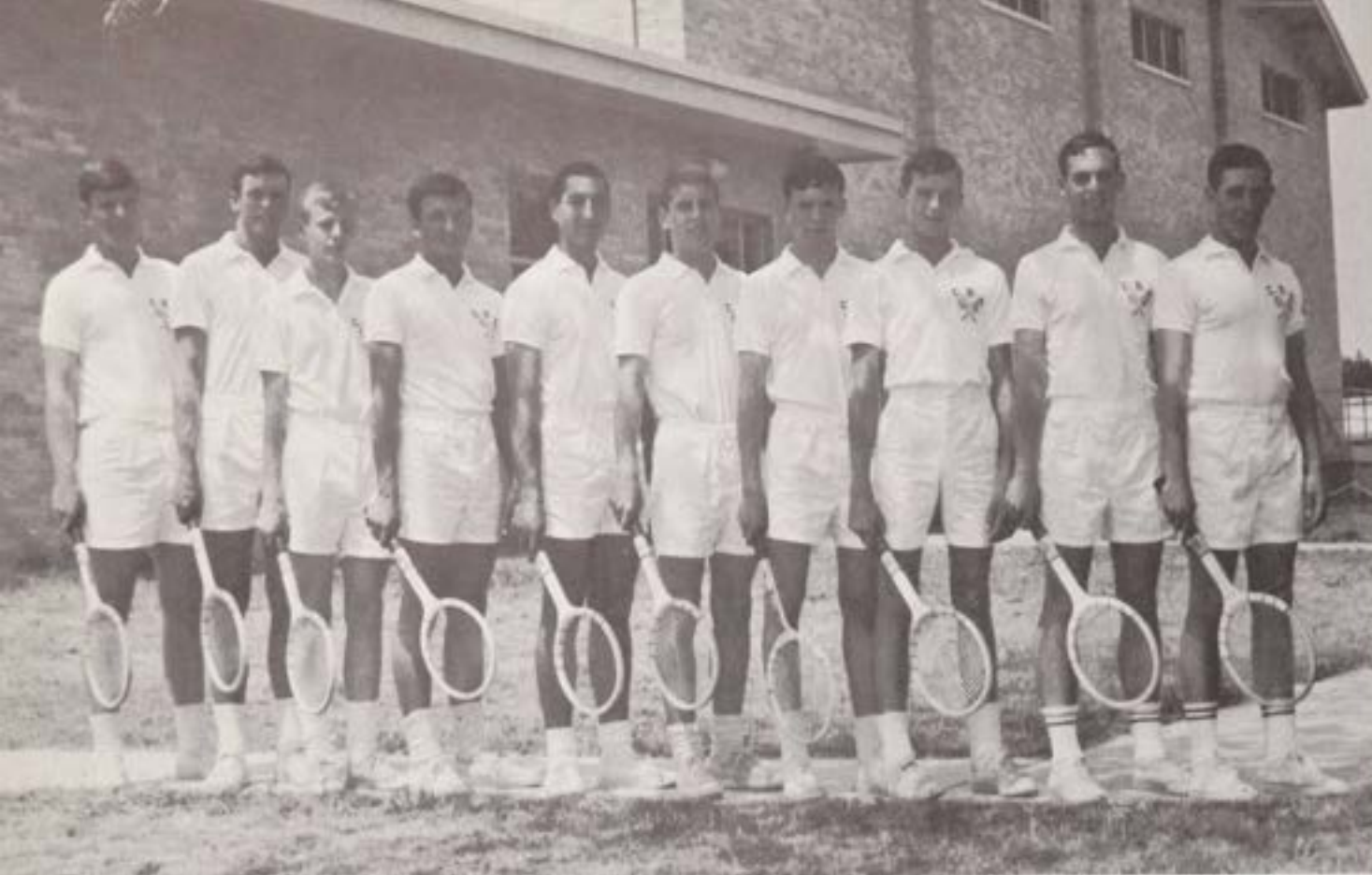


JUNIOR PROM

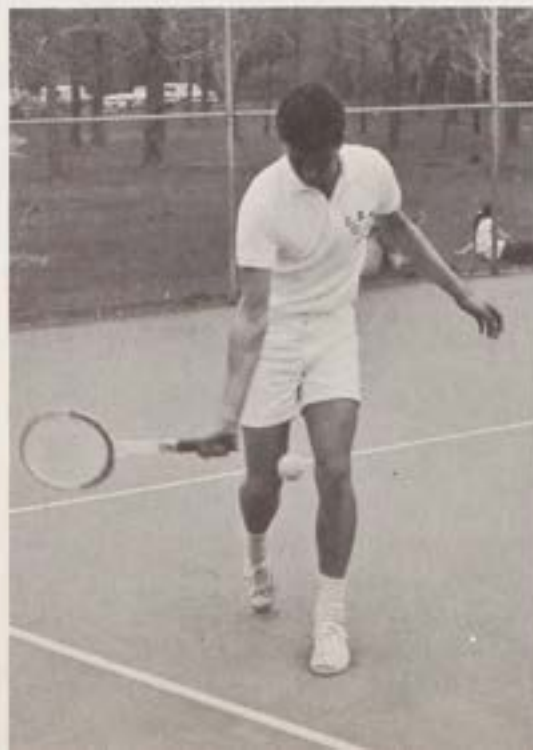

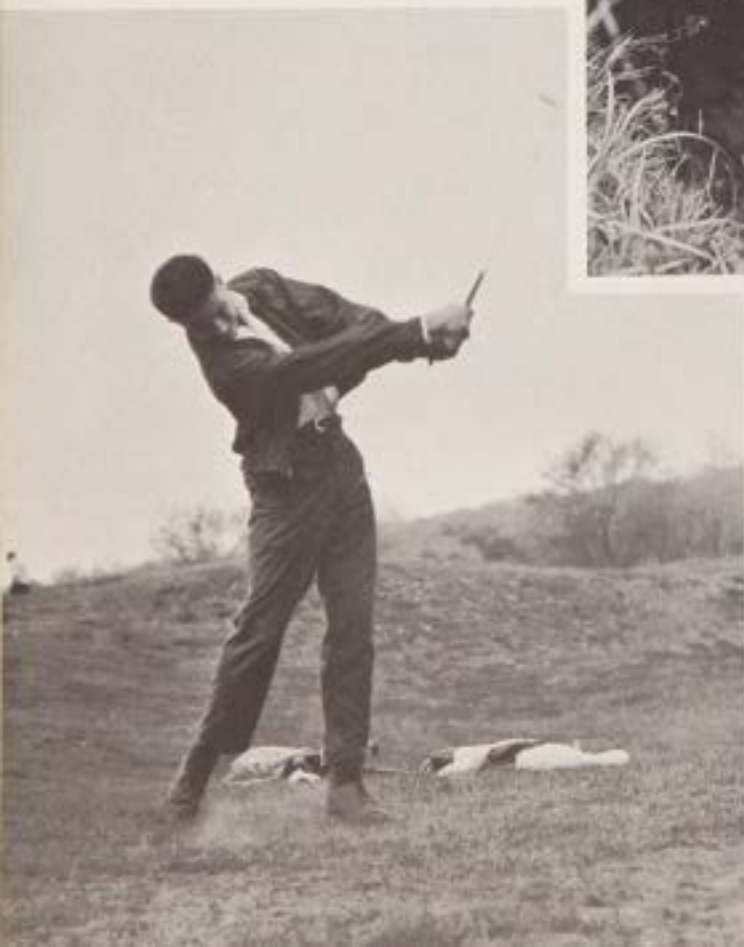

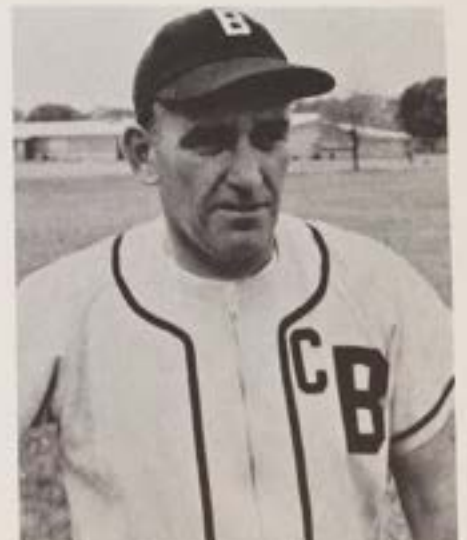

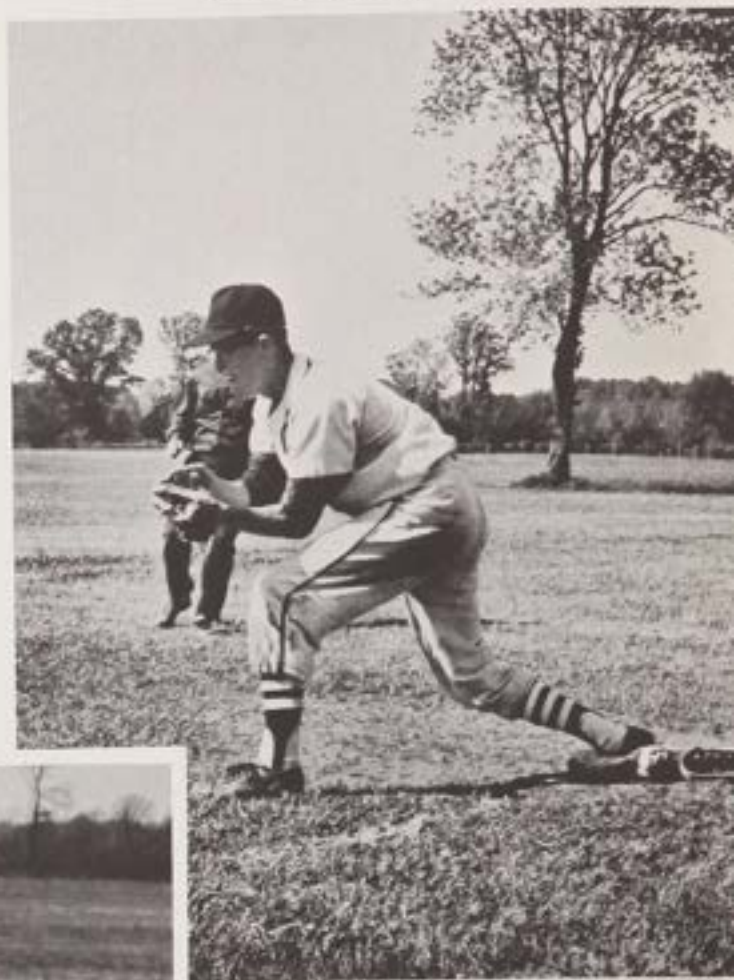
