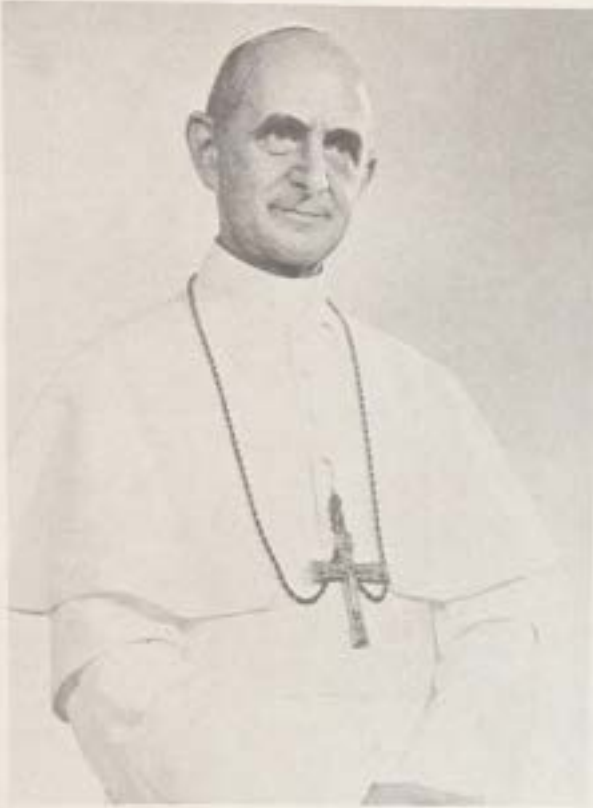


FIFTH ANNUAL BUFFET-DANCE

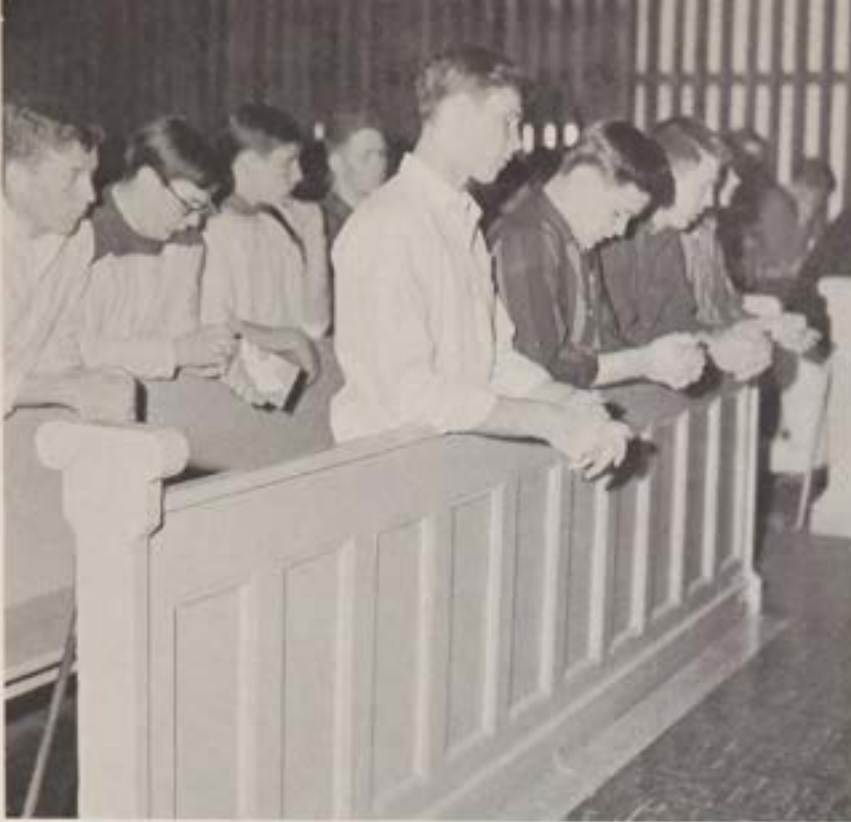

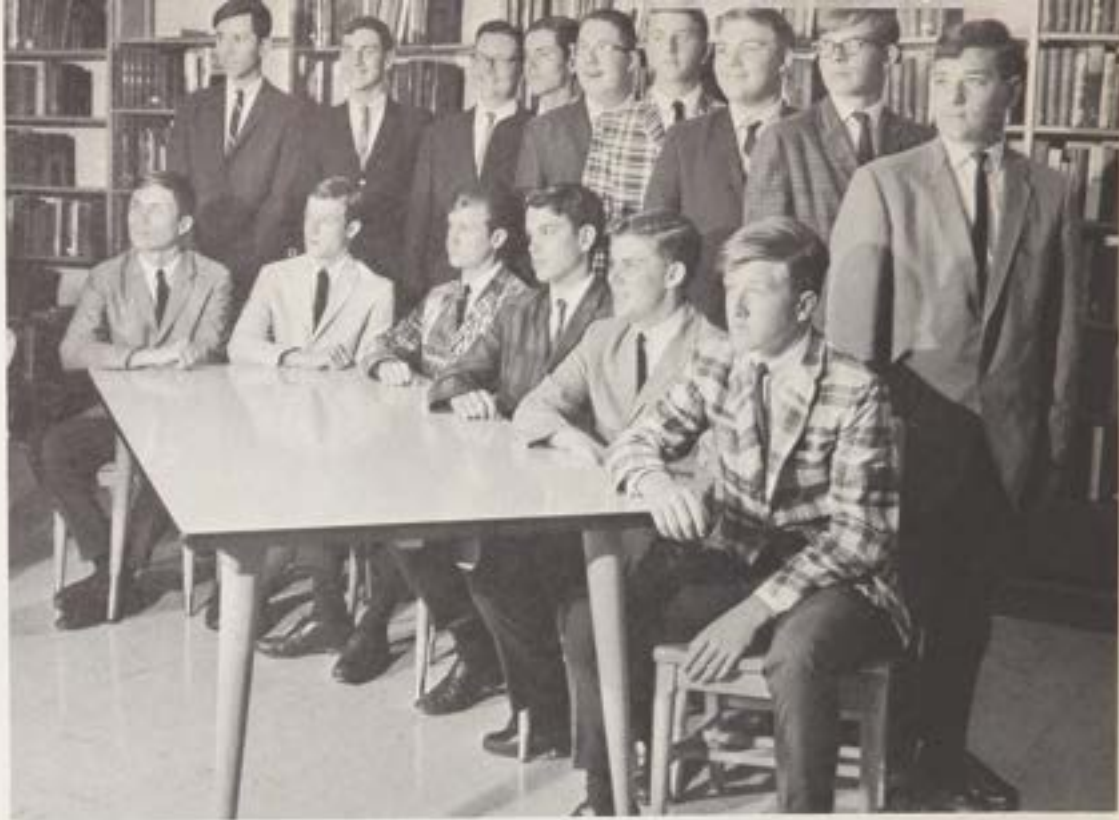

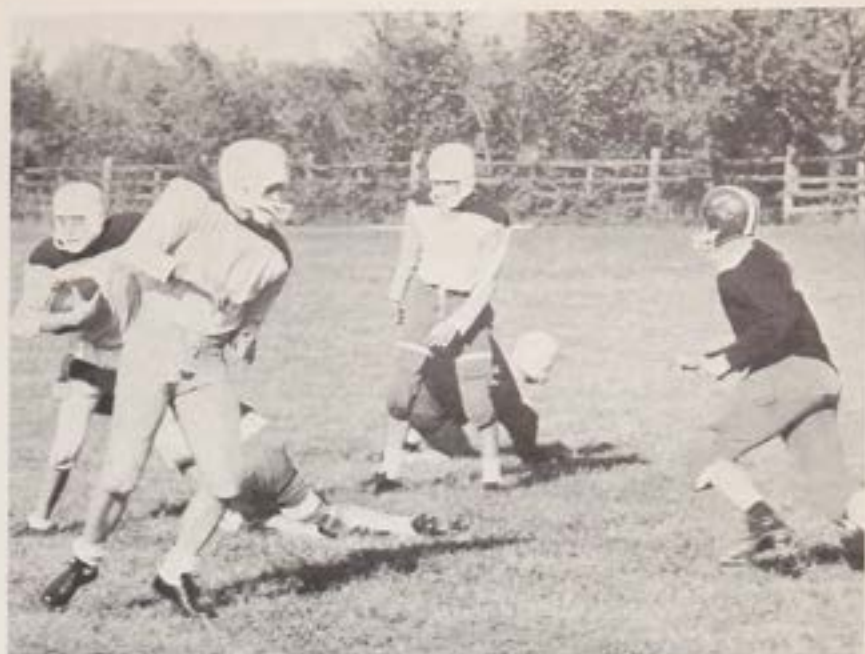

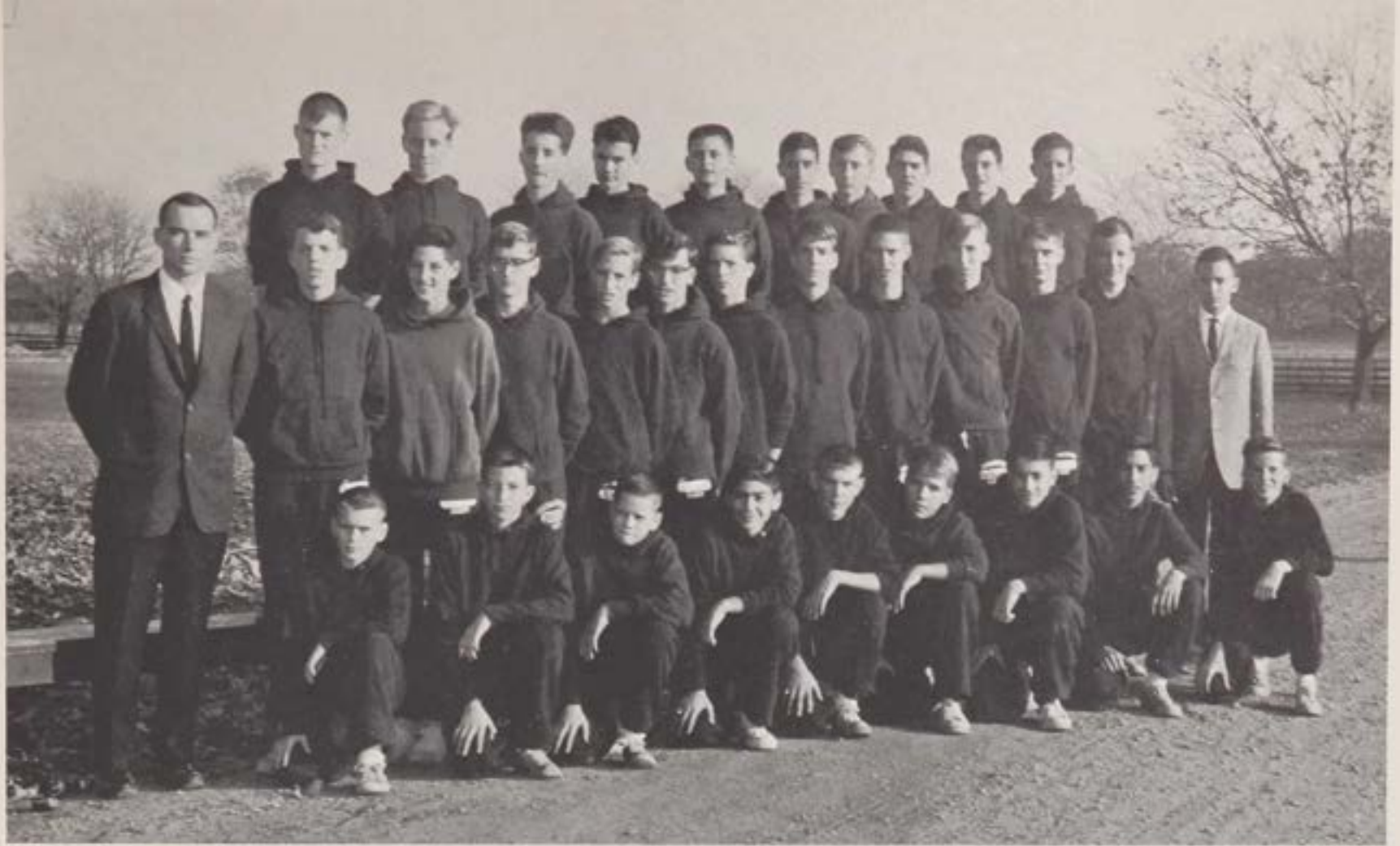

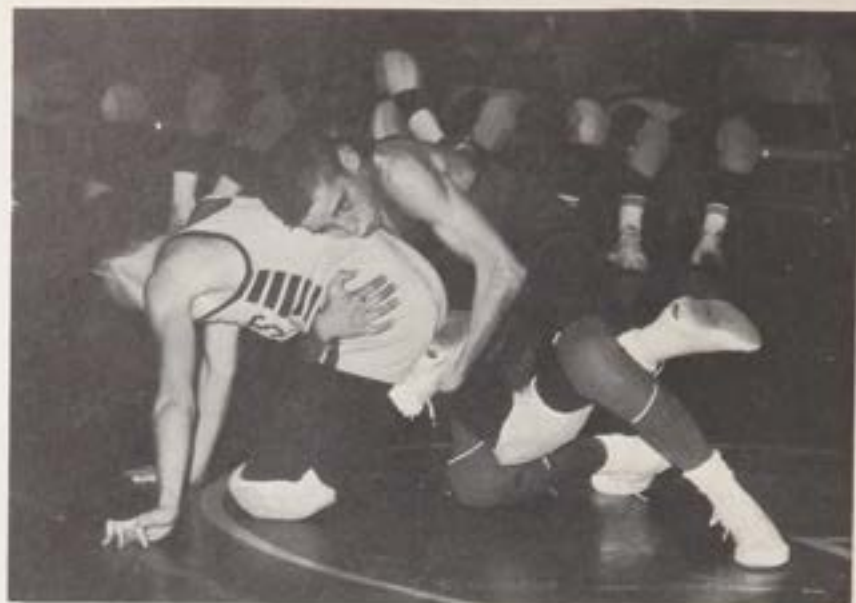

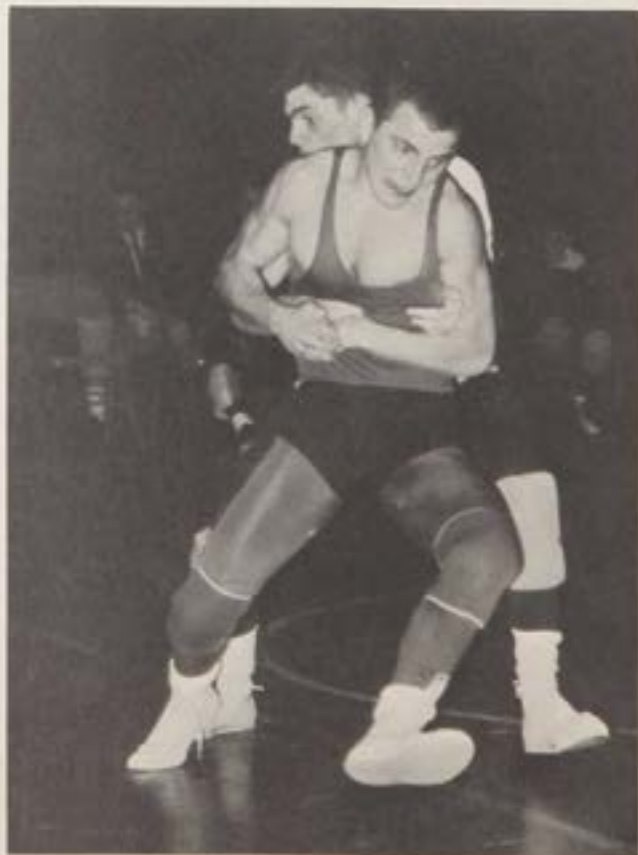

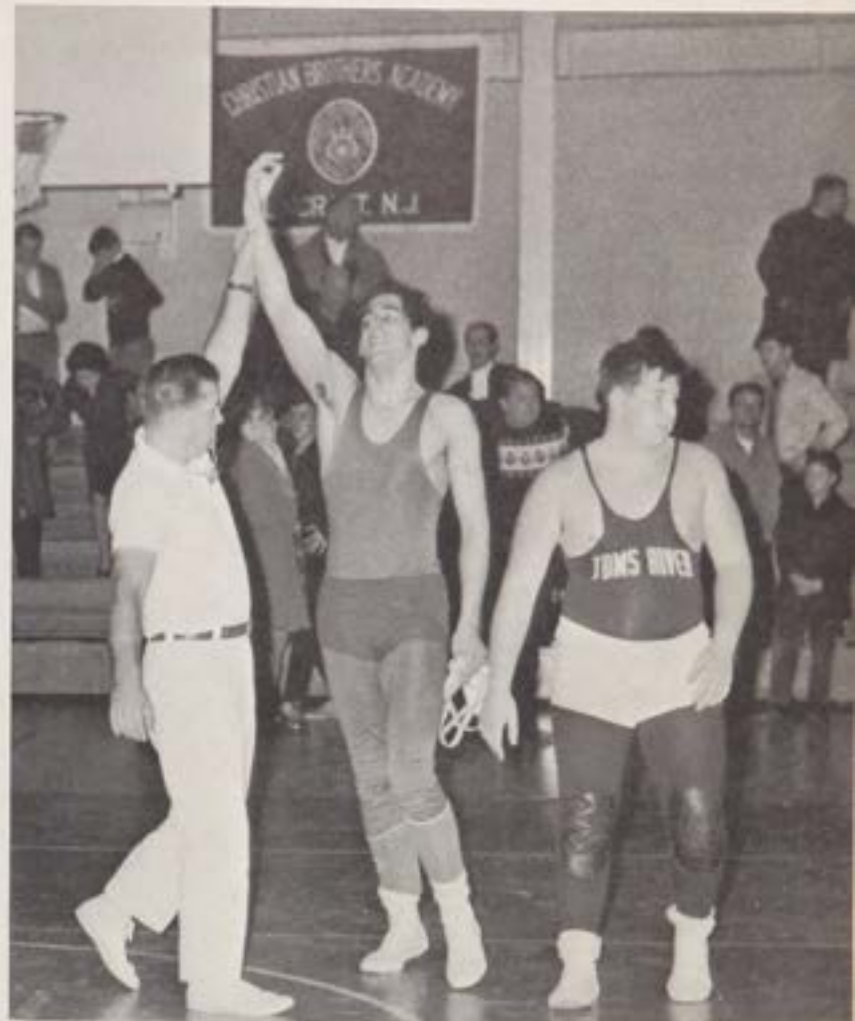

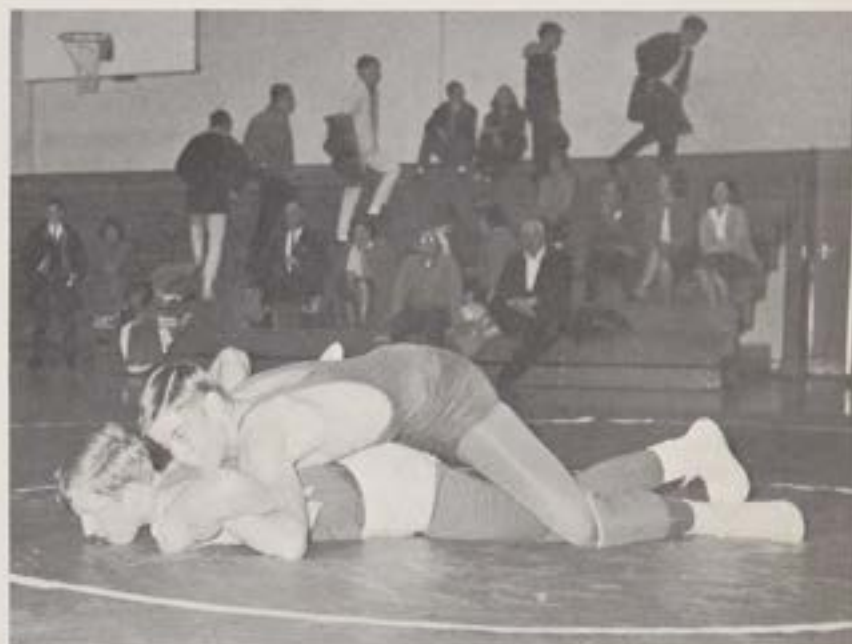

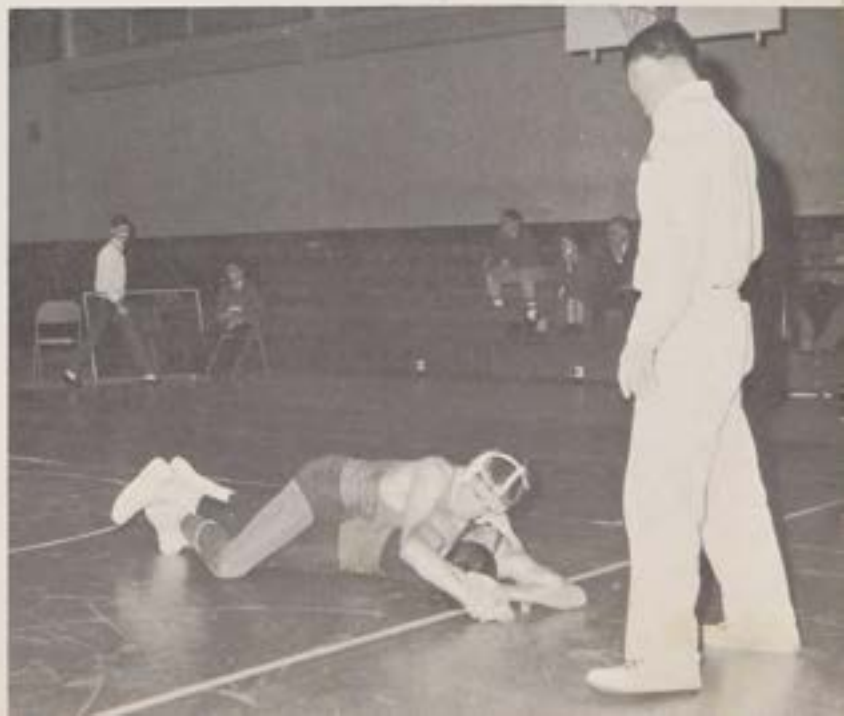

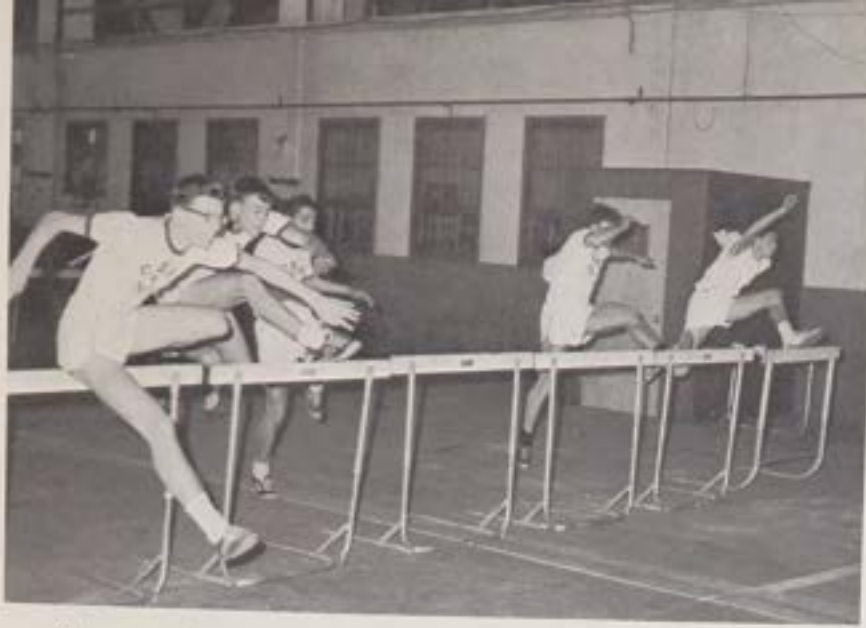

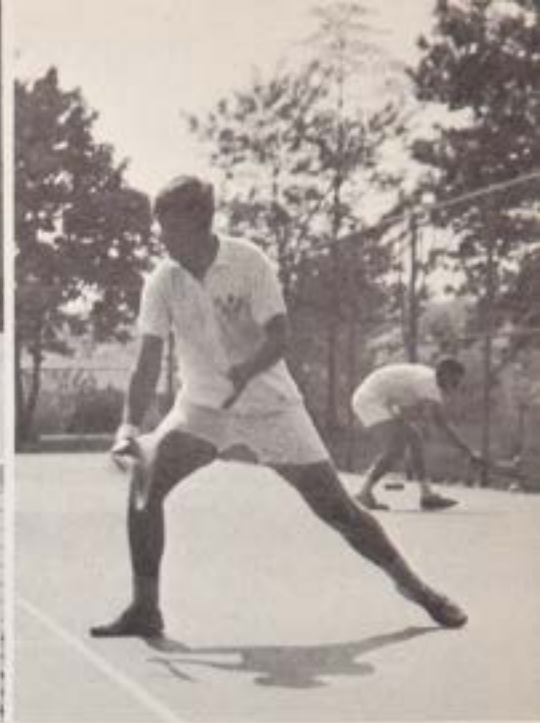

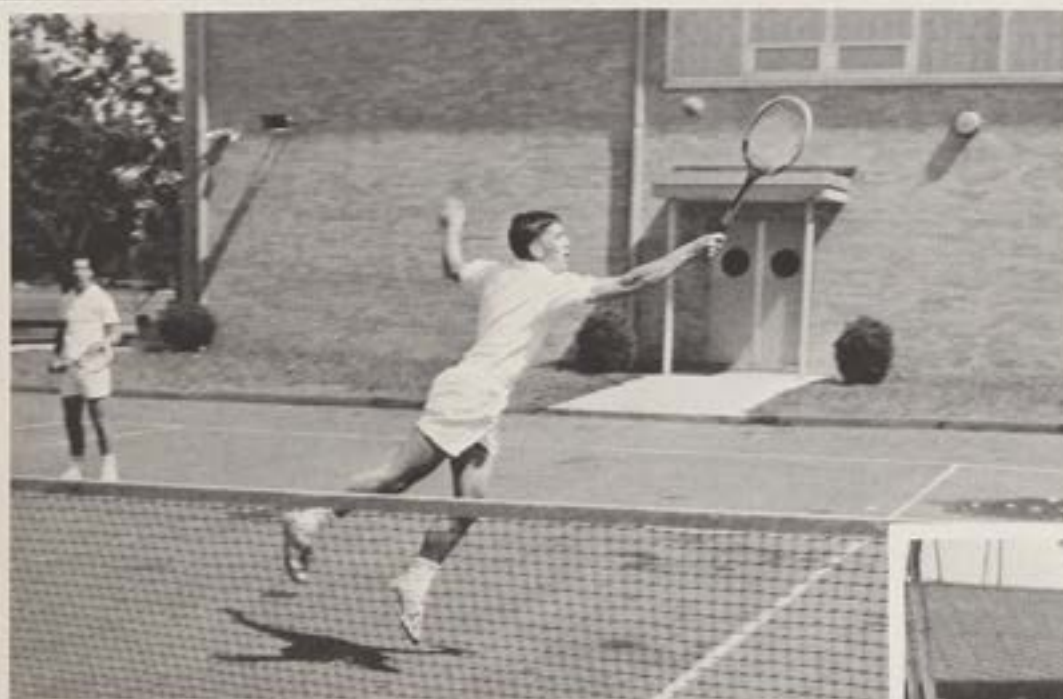

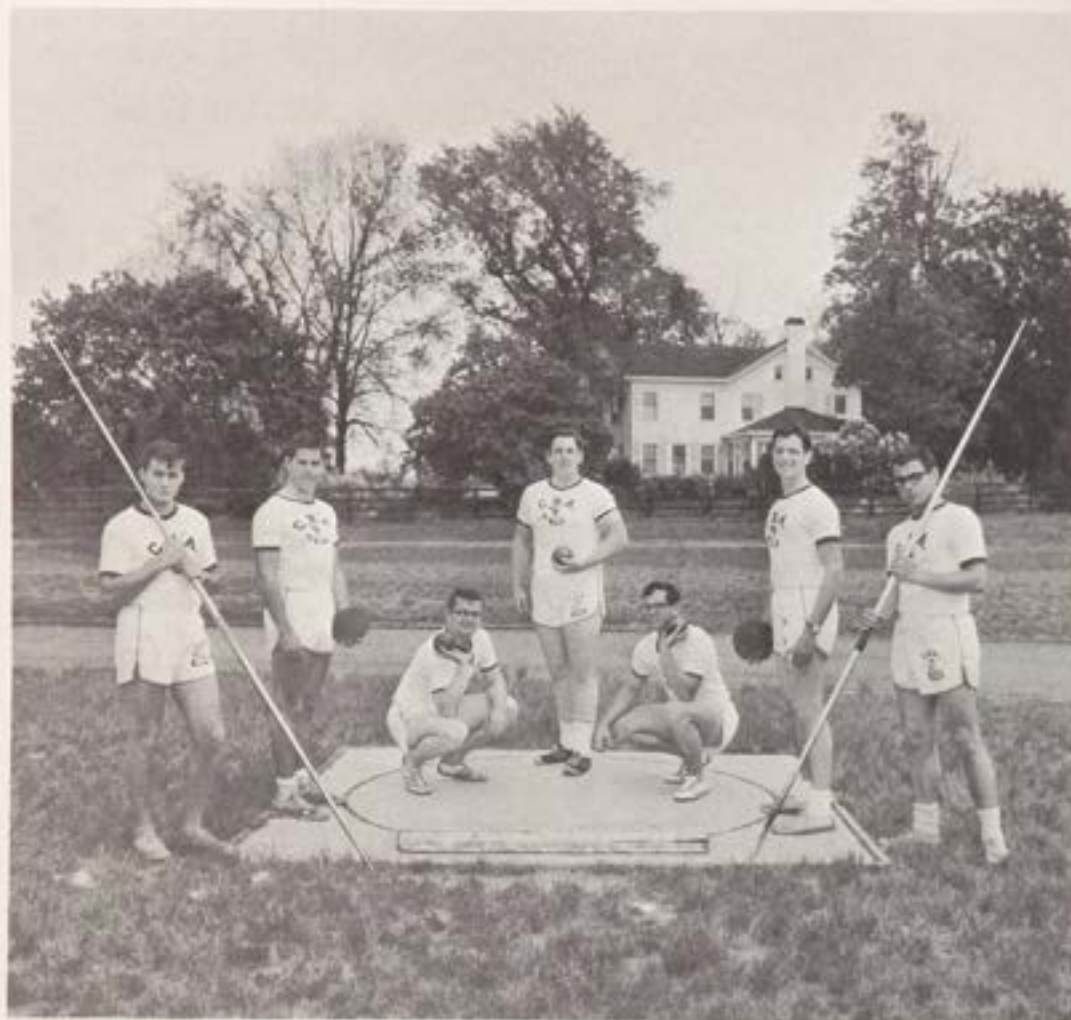

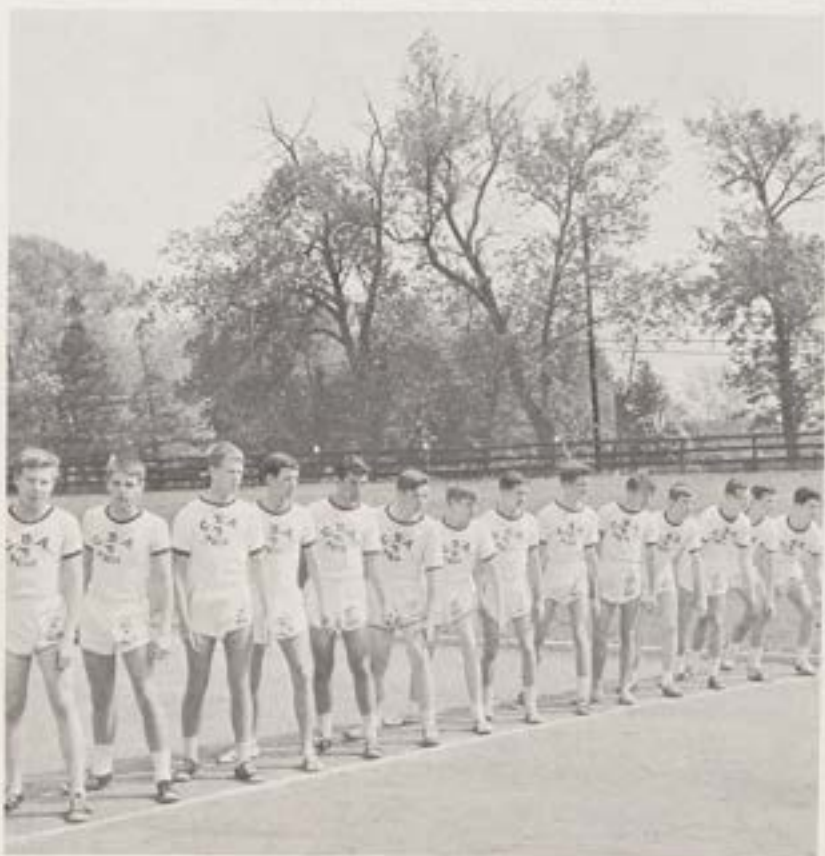

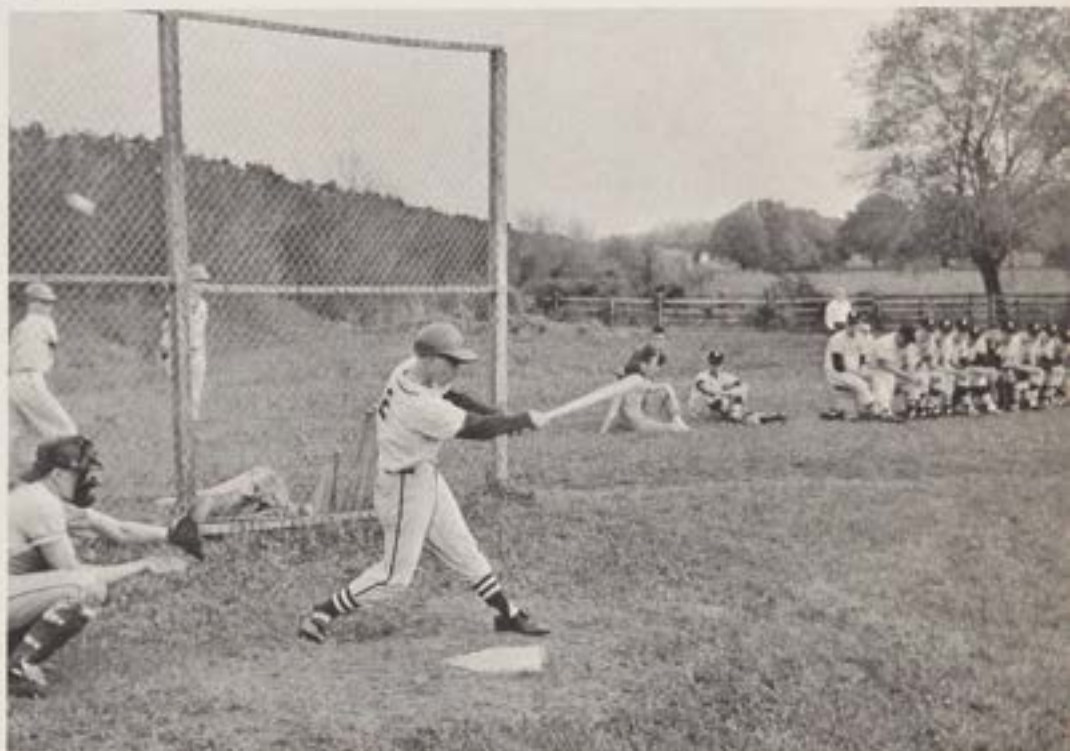

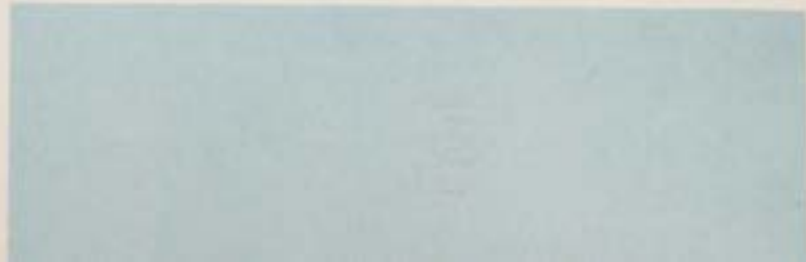
