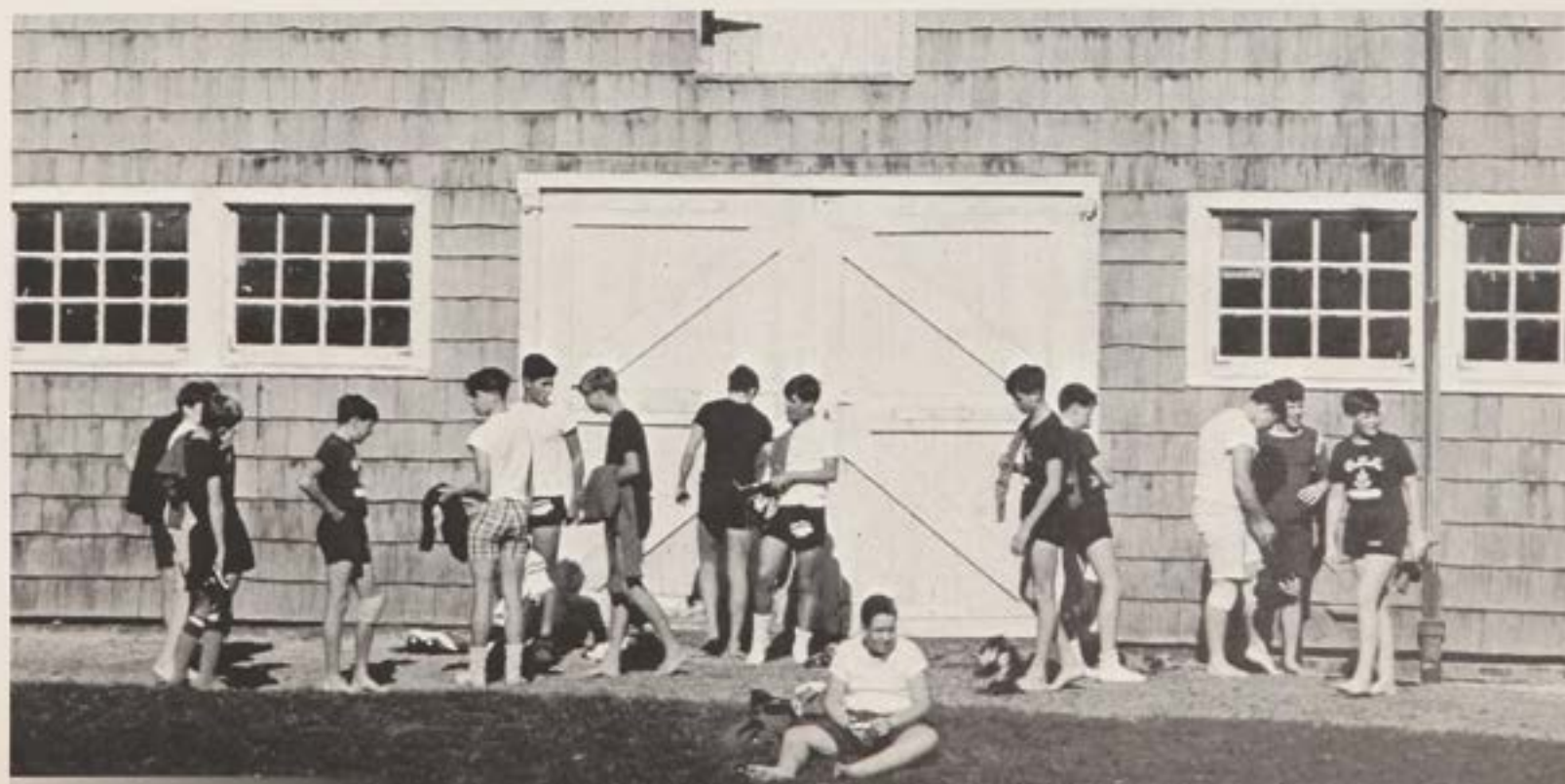

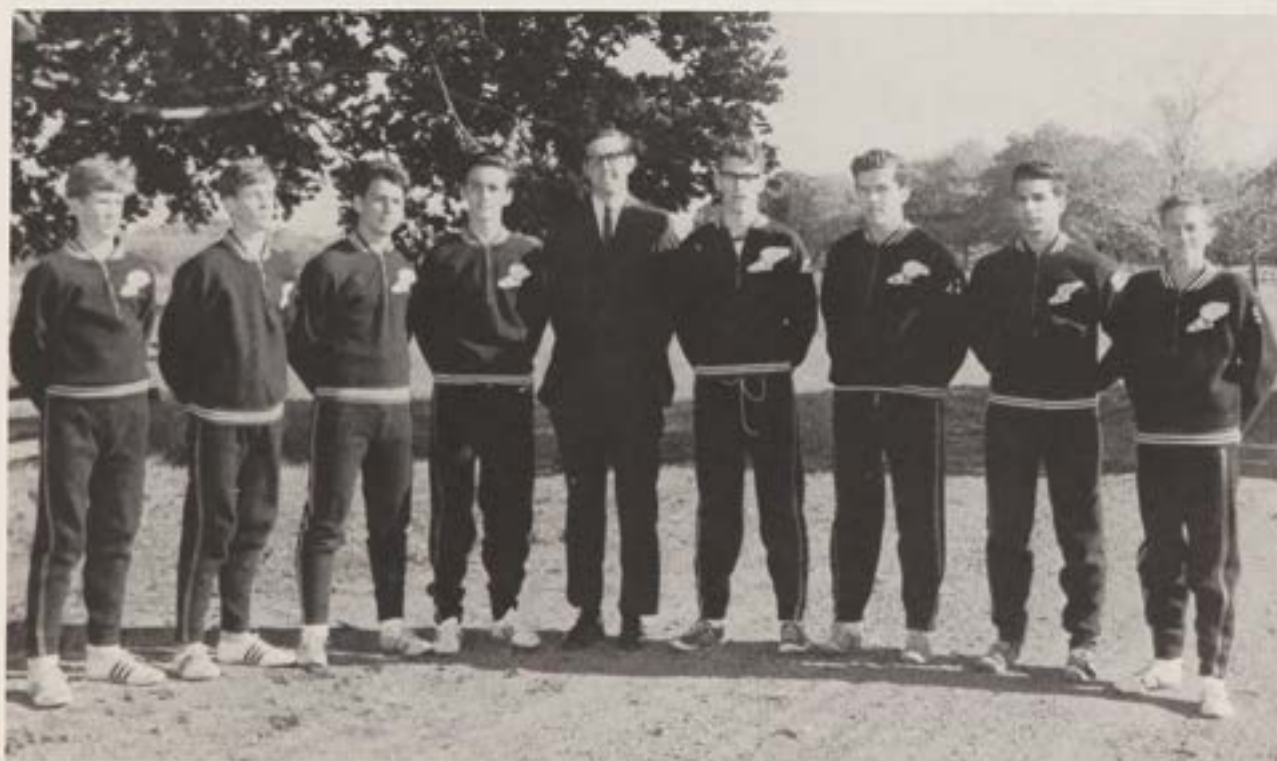

### Colts Vow Return In '70

Bishop Eustace continued their perfect season by routing the surprising C.B.A. Colts, 66-38, thus continuing their march to the State Championship.

C.B.A. (14-9), having surprised two experienced and strong teams, St. Joseph's, Metuchen, and Trenton Cathedral, went into the game 35 point underdogs on the basis of their lack of size and experience, but a slow, deliberate offense enabled Vincent Cox's team to hold the strong Pennsauken team from running away from the Colts in the early going.

After winning the opening tap, the Colts started a deliberate offense to try and hold the rugged Eustace team from running away with the game; however the Colts could not break early game shakiness and were charged with turnovers their first four times down the court. The Colts stayed in the

game on the offensive board work by sophomore Bill Koch and fell behind by only a 4-0 count. The Colts came back on the fine shooting of junior star Pat Mullin to tie the score 7-7, the only time it was tied in the game.

A last second lay-up by Pete Furey gave Eustace a 15-9 first quarter lead as the powerful 3-2 zone defense of Eustace forced the young Colts into many turnovers.

In the second quarter the Colts made a futile attempt to speed up the game; however the fine shooting of Gary Melchionni and the board work of Jim Crawford, Jeff Banasz, and Bob Rosenfeld took control of the game as Eustace rattled off 13 of the next 15 points to build up a 30-14 lead. The Colts tried to battle back for the rest of the quarter and trailed 34-20 at the half.

The Colts' chances for victory going into the second half depended on a hot streak at the beginning of the third period; however, when Eustace ran off the first four points in the period it was all over for the Colts. It was now just a matter of how high the score would rise for the powerful Pennsauken team, who had previously defeated Holy Spirit, 85-40, and Notre Dame, 92-41. As Eustace continued to control the boards, they rolled to an easy 66-38 win. Eustace, using their size, strength, and shooting ability held C.B.A. to 7 fourth period points.

The only bright spot for the defeated Colts was Pat Mullin's 22 points, although he shot only 8-24 from the field, thus ending the season with a 25.9 average.

Even with the harsh defeat, it was a tremendous season for the Lincroft team in a year that was to be for rebuilding. Bigger and better things are being looked forward to next year as this year's team loses only three players—Jim Tibbitt, Bill Wattiker, and Skip Bott—while it gains some strong support from a 20-0 JV team, among whom include Ray Kelly, who started for the Varsity after being called up, Mike Mosco, Tony O'Shea, Dave Wiegand, Pete Brewin, and Mark Pe-traitis.

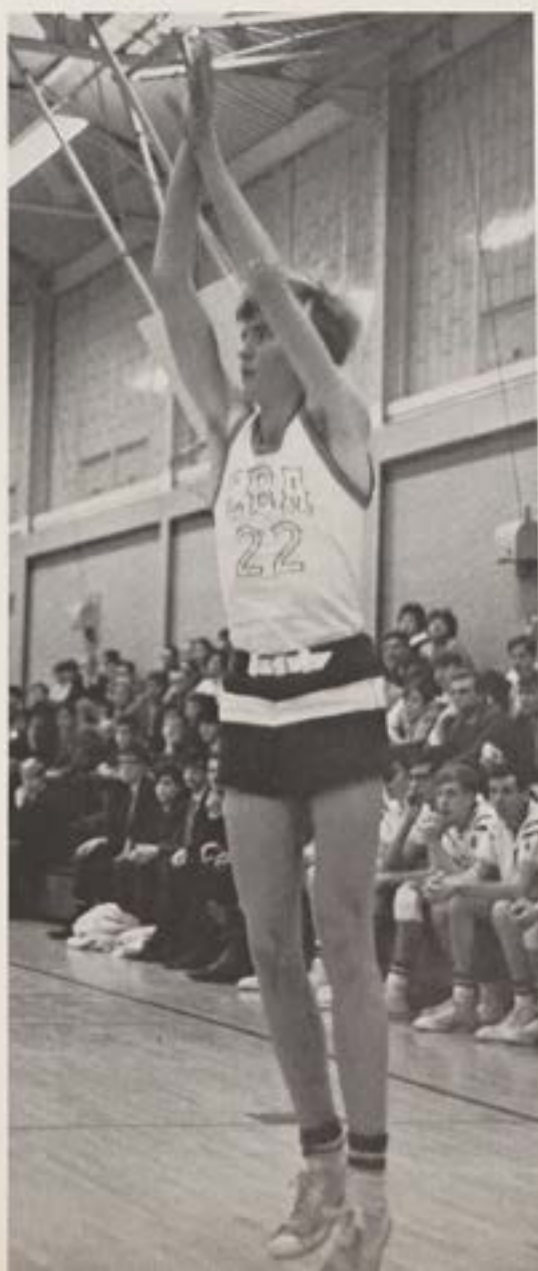

Sporting a quick and skillful starting five of ball-handler and court-general Mike Mosco, along with strong Mark Petraitis at guard, fleet-footed freshman Dave Wiegand and eagle-eyed Tony O'Shea at forwards with high jumping Ray Kelly at center, the team, with a strong bench, was able to substitute without losing strength at any position. Sixth man Peter Brewin, along with Paul McMullen, Bill Schroeter, Kevin Doph, Richard Seel, Brian Neuworth, Mark Landers, Gene Szlankiewicz, and Paul Kolarsick were able to give a rest to the starters and keep up the game scoring with fight, hustle and effort.

The Christian Brothers Academy Junior Varsity basketball team of the 1968-1969 season has gone undefeated, winning all twenty of their scheduled games, making it the most successful J.V. club C.B.A. has ever produced.

Much of this success must be attributed to the fine coaching of Mr.

William Magarity with his clever alert running of this young ballclub. Comprised of thirteen sophomores and one freshman, the squad specialized in tight defense and deliberate offense, scoring an average of 71.0 points per game while only giving up 47.7 points a tilt.

The opener at Hudson Catholic seemed to set the standard for the rest of the season as the Colt J.V. took it 66-56. Wiegand proved his ability first time out by pumping in 25 points. Traveling to South Amboy for a game with St. Mary's the team really showed its stuff by winning by an impressive 37 point margin 81-44. O'Shea led the team with 16 points. The return match at home had the same outcome with a different score 59-48. Neptune, a recognized Shore J.V. power, was up next, and while the Varsity was having early season difficulties at Asbury Park Convention Hall Christmas Tournament play, the J.V. downed the Scarlet Fliers at Neptune 73-55, ruling out a Christmas sweep for Neptune. O'Shea again

was team high man with 24, while Mike Mosco added 20. Moving out of state to play LaSalle Prep, Ray Kelly scored 20 to lead a 61-54 win for the Colts.

As the season progressed and the schedule became tougher, the team strengthened into a cohesive unit, racking up victories over rival St. Rose twice (77-54 and 74-35), Notre Dame twice (60-53 and 80-49), and rough North Jersey school Roselle Catholic, 81-48. An all round scoring effort by the whole team swamped Manasquan 60-28. Peddie Prep J.V. fell victim to C.B.A. 88-60, the game highlighted by

a strong 26 point showing by O'Shea.

Decisive wins over St. Anthony's of Trenton (70-42), Seton Hall (74-60), and a double overtime win at St. Joe's Metuchen (72-64) gave the team consideration for the status of best Junior Varsity squad in the state.

A 75-27 rout of Mater Dei, two wins over strong Arch-rival Red Bank Catholic (63-55 and 67-37), and a tight final game victory over fast and powerful Asbury Park (75-71) rounded out a spectacular season. O'Shea hit for 36 points in the finale.

O'Shea was high man on the season with a 20.3 point average. Kelly and Wiegand did most of the work off the boards, with Schroeter leaving the bench often giving rebounding relief to the starters.

Tom Roman, Varsity Team Manager said, "The J.V. wins all came from talent, hard work, and team play, and with a combination of the three, you can't lose."

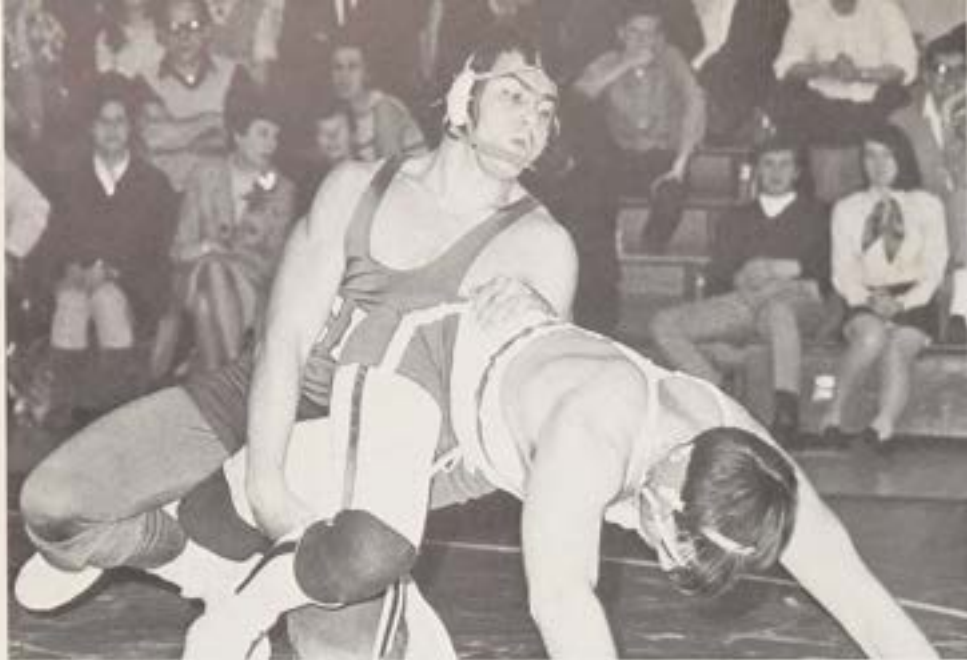

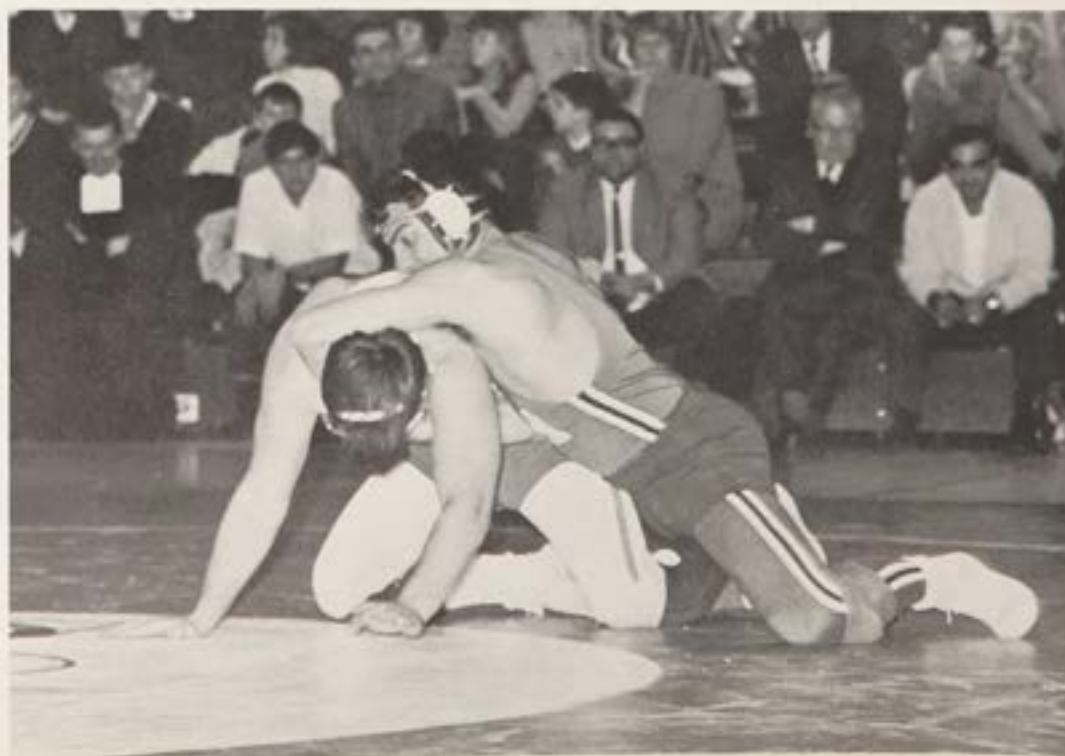

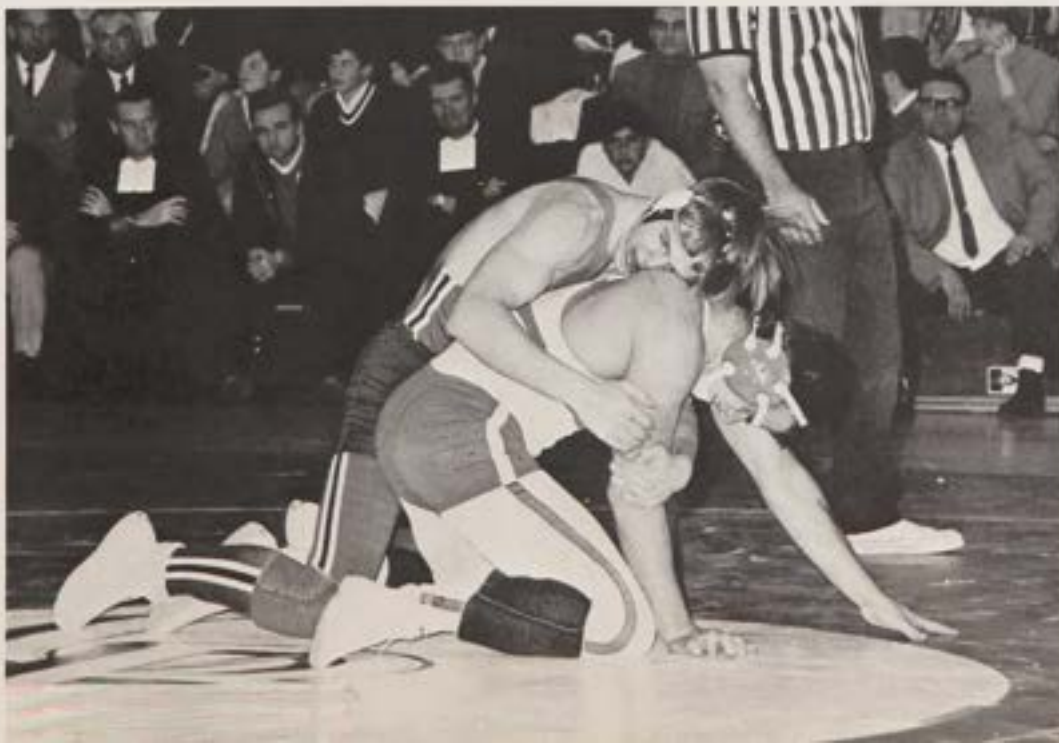

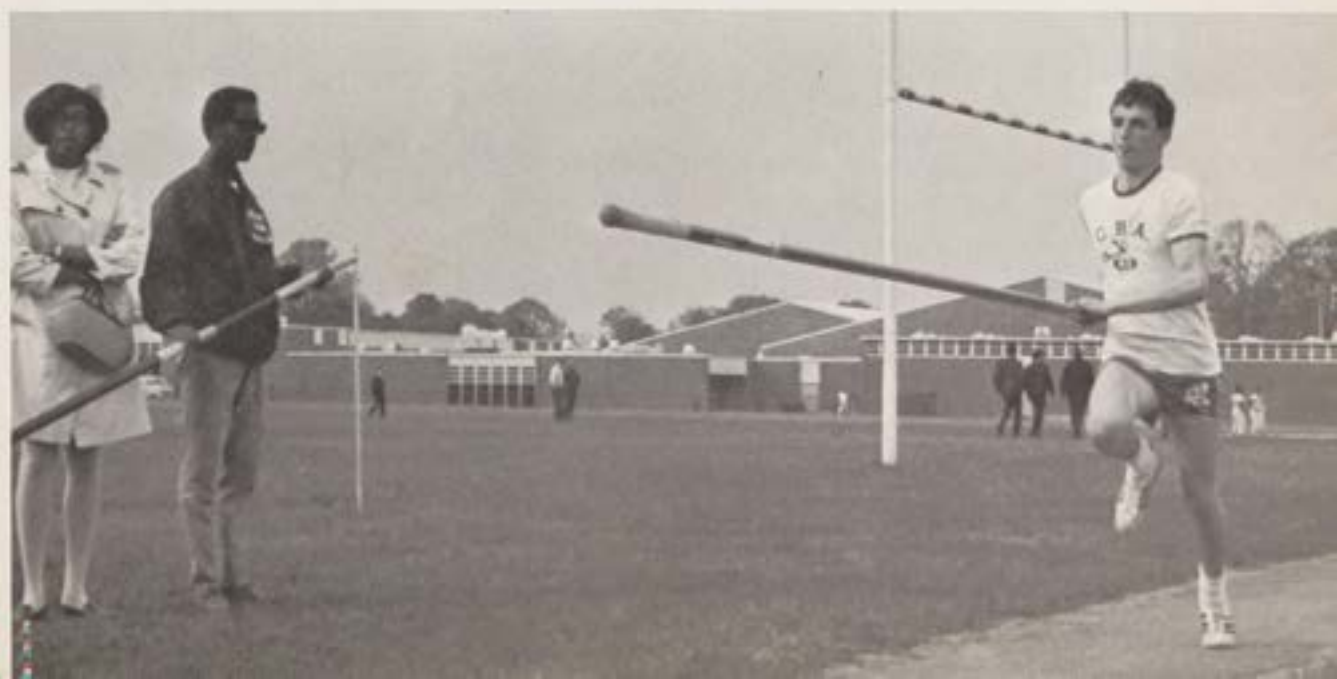

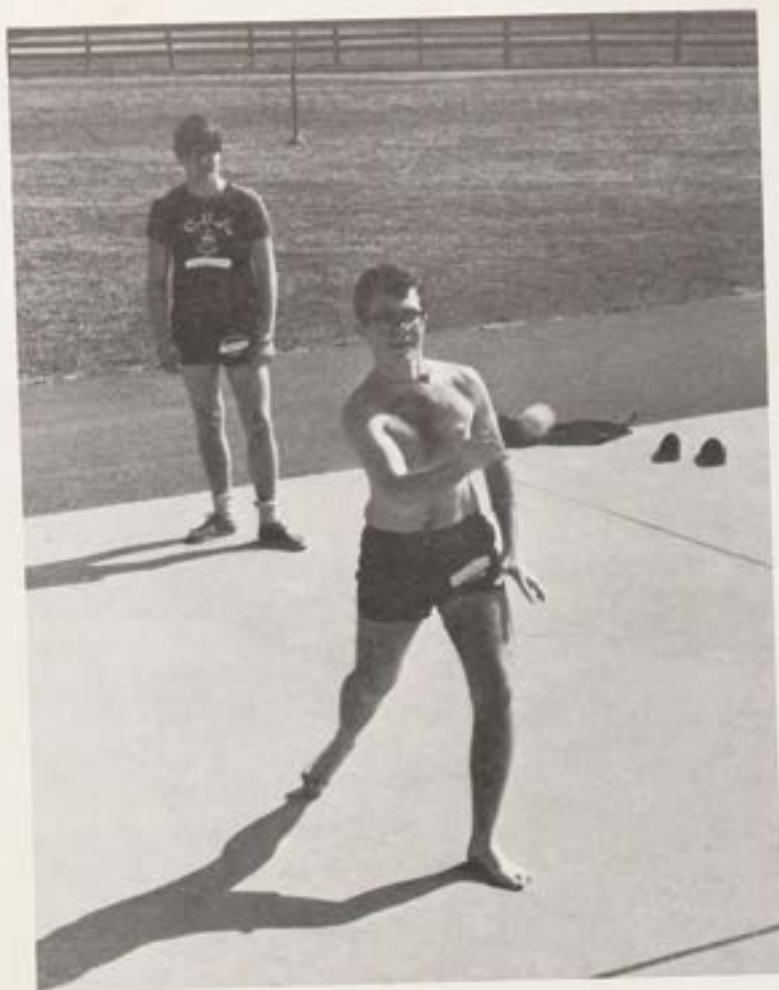

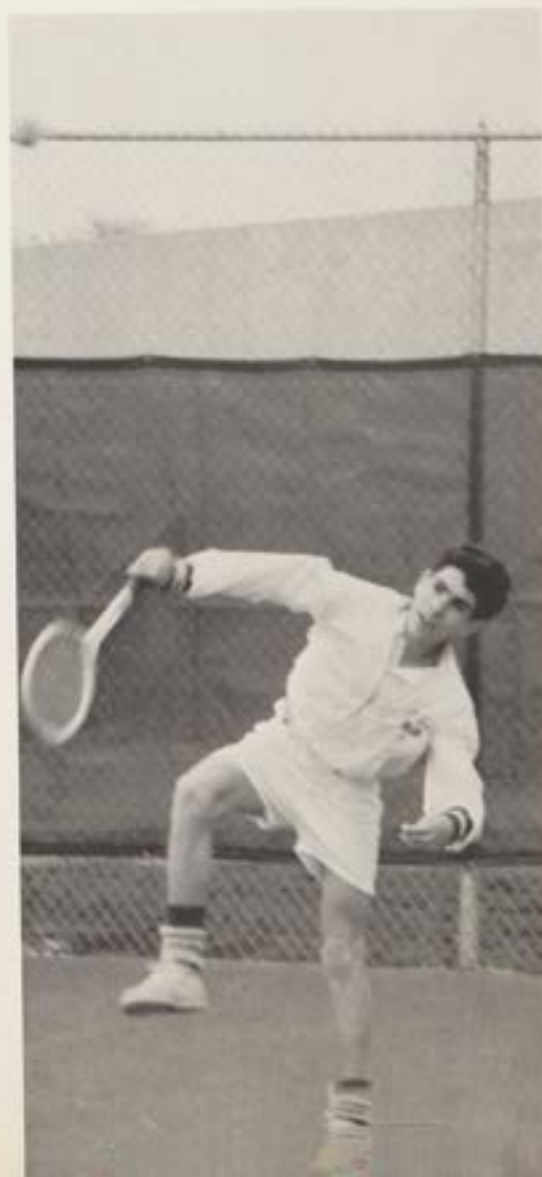

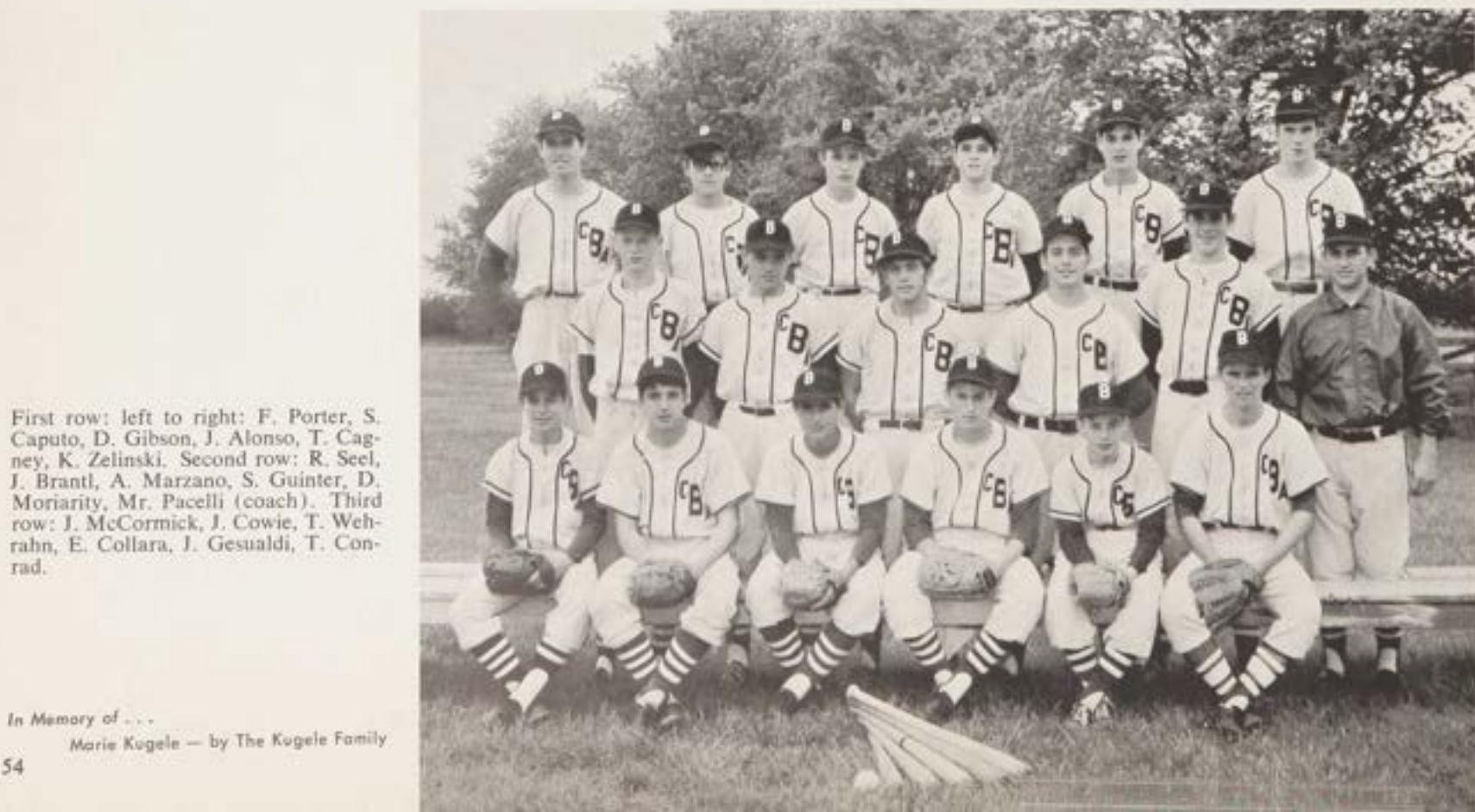
