Mark, do you have any reflections on these times?

MARK BENNETT: This period in our country's history is being characterized by domestic strife at home and international conflicts abroad. The disheartening situations that exist, the energy crisis, corruption in government and law enforcement, and the ominous confrontation in the Middle-East, to name just a few, have had an adverse effect on the way people view themselves, others and their country. They seem to have lost their respect for government, their faith in others and, most grievously, their confidence in themselves. Now we, as seniors in high school amidst all of this, must ponder the inescapable question which confronts every generation—how shall we live our lives?


I think that before deciding upon how one is to live his life (not to say that a person simply sits down and makes such a decision) he must first discover himself. For a person to relate to and deal with the problems of our era, he must first relate to himself. He must recognize his abilities and his individual deficiencies, and from this self-evaluation develop realistic aspirations in relation to others and himself. This is the area of confrontation where one chooses between others and himself. Where he sees iniquity and suffering, will he merely take notice and not let such happen to him, or will he take part in the relief of that transgression and suffering, regardless of the sacrifice? A person must have priorities in his life. If those priorities lie in making more money and seeking the top rung on society's ladder, with a flagrant disregard for anybody or anything, that person has developed a rather reprehensible set of values, values that place all others as obstacles in the way of his self-serving achievement.

When a person becomes captivated with his own desires he negates his full capacity as a human being which manifests itself in a concerned interaction with other human beings. Herein lies the paramount challenge to youth and C.B.A. seniors in particular. To unearth and incarnate from the mass of hatred, distrust and corruption the 'missing link' in the chain of Christianity, between finding and fulfilling oneself and creating a better world for everyone.


If our attitudes toward life and other people, which ultimately determine how we live our lives, can be determined by the 'quality of the day', then certainly we should never be content with the way in which people are presently living their lives. Such characteristics as brotherhood, generosity, good will and understanding are today disdainfully viewed as simply impracticable if one is to "get ahead" in society. Life has become a blur of over-energized, hyper-ambitious people who transform our existence into a vacuum in which those practicing precepts of Christian human values are oft times suffocated.

Well then, how shall we live our lives? We must approach life conscientiously and responsibly, devoid of false fronts and divest of artificial and impersonal masks. We must step out from behind our facades and confront problems with realistic optimism and confidence. Finally, and most importantly, we must have the courage to initiate a social uplift by using our opportunities with devotion and with reliability, for this is where the strength of America lies; in beauty and elevation, not in ugliness and degration, in confidence and love, not in disruption and hate, and in tradition and a faith in God, not in disrespect and disillusion.

It has been my four years at C.B.A. that has engendered these feelings within me, and opened my eyes to various diverse opinions and outlooks towards life. For this reason I value my four years here very much, and proceed on with satisfaction and optimism.

As I look back over my four years I remember the fun that we had and that most of my friends during those years were Catholics. In fact, I only had a few non-Catholic friends.




Scott, before moving on to college, how about a glance over these four years?
















