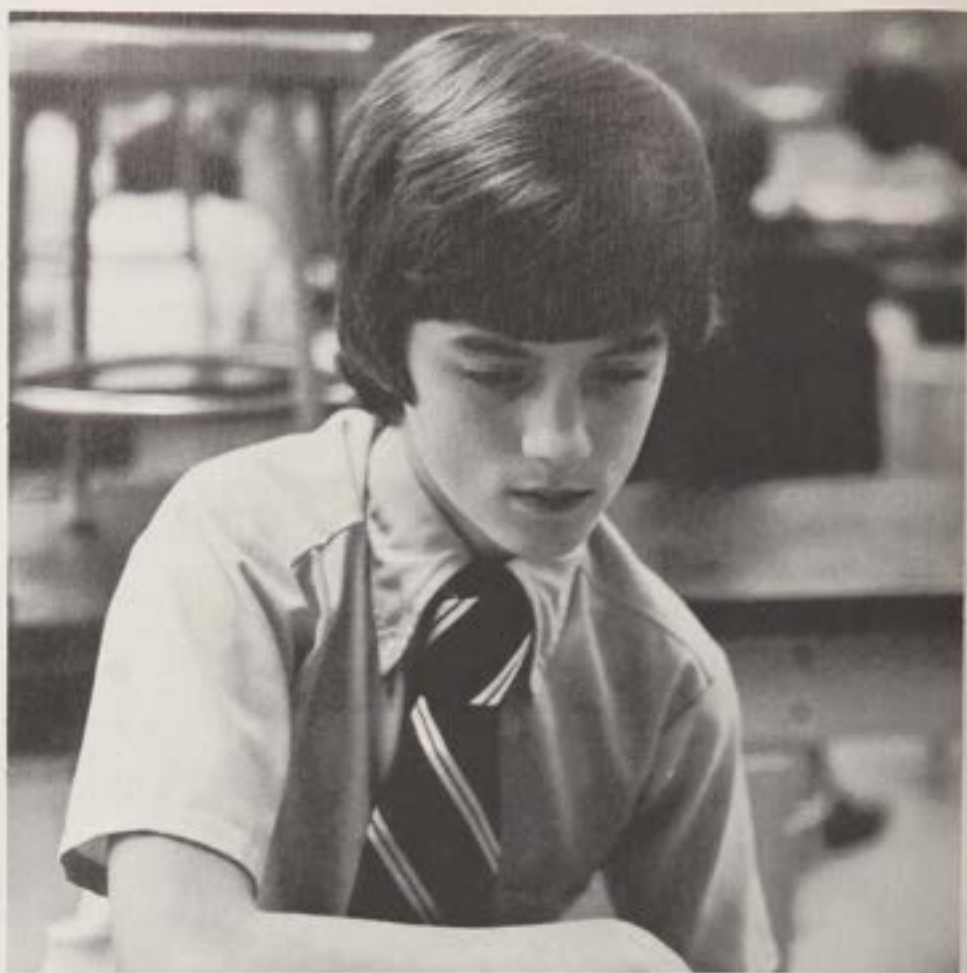

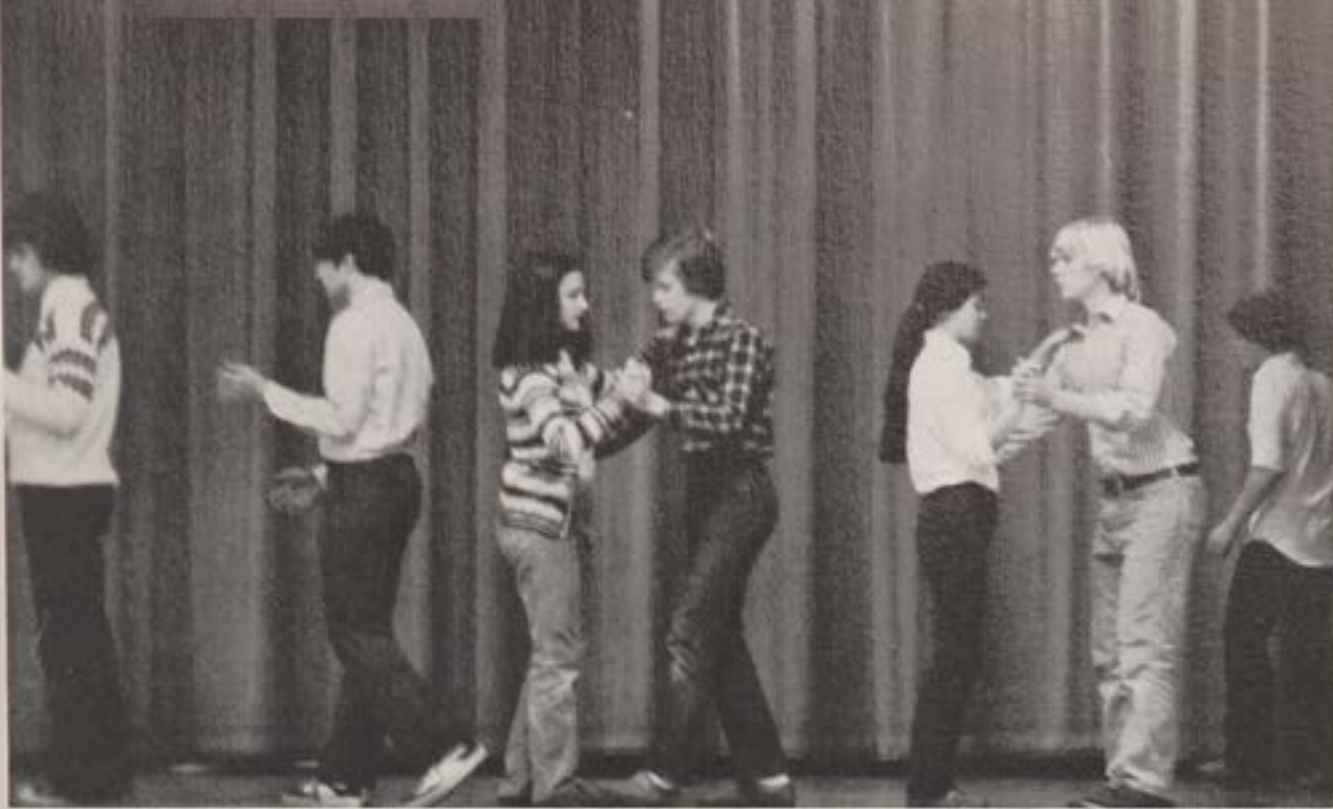

In Memoriam



It is with our regret that we recall Brother Patrick Duggan's death during this last school year. The staff feels it is most fitting to include the following reflections of Brother James Sullivan on Brother Patrick's lifetime of Christian work.

Brother Patrick Duggan was born in Brooklyn on January 8, 1915. As a youth, he attended St. Bridget's Grammar School in Brooklyn, and later he attended St. Michael's Diocesan School in the same borough. He graduated from St. Michael's school in June of 1933, and it is worthy of note to mention that he was voted the best dancer in his graduating class.

After his graduation he entered the novitiate of the Christian Brother in Barrytown, New York in June of 1933. He received the habit of the Christian Brothers on September 7, 1933, and upon completing his novitiate, he pronounced his first vows on September 8, 1934. He entered De La Salle College in Washington, D.C. upon the completion of his novitiate, and graduated from this institution in June of 1937. He started his teaching career in Holy Name School in New York City in September of 1937, and the following year he was transferred to the Christian Brother's Academy in Albany, New York.

In September of 1946, Brother Patrick was assigned to Bishop Loughlin Memorial High School in Brooklyn where he was again an outstanding professor of the classical languages.

In September 1950, Brother Patrick began his teaching career as well as his prefecting career at La Salle Military Academy at Oakdale, Long Island. Also during the time that he was there, he taught forensics, as well as the classics, and distinguished himself in the three fields of prefecting, teaching classics, and oratory. Two of his outstanding orators were Enzo DiGiacomo, who is now an outstanding doctor, and John Zuccotti, who is now the assistant mayor of New York City. In September of 1955, Brother Patrick was given the job of Principal of St. Patrick's School in Newburgh, New York.

Brother Patrick retired from his job as principal in September of 1964, but wanted to continue teaching the classics. As a result he came to Christian Brother's Academy in Lincroft, New Jersey, and continued to teach both Latin and Greek until the end of 1975. On the 30th of December, 1975, he entered Riverview Hospital in Red Bank. As a result of numerous tests, it was medically decided that he had inoperable cancer. After a long stay at Riverview, he was transferred to the Nursing Home in Holmdel, New Jersey, where he calmly expired on March 22, 1976.

Anyone who ever came into contact with Brother Patrick had the highest regard for his wisdom, his patience, and his understanding. His wake was held at the Christian Brother's Residence in Lincroft, and his Funeral Mass was said at the Church of St. Leo the Great in Lincroft. On the 25th of March 1976, he was interred in St. Charles Cemetery in Pinelawn, Long Island, to rest at peace, in the same spot at which his parents had previously been interred. All who knew him at Lincroft, will certainly miss him for a long time to come.
