It is with great pleasure that the Editorial Staff dedicates this year's edition of the Pegasus to Brother Camillus Hayes, who recently celebrated the fiftieth anniversary of his entrance into the religious order known as the Brothers of the Christian Schools.

Brother Camillus was born in Haverhill, Massachusetts on the 3rd of November in the year 1910. In his young days, he attended St. James School in Haverhill from which he was graduated in June of 1924. Upon the successful completion of his elementary education, he decided to enter the Junior Novitiate of the Christian Brothers then located in Pocantico Hills, New York on July 1, 1924. After he had completed three years in the Junior Novitiate, he was promoted to the Senior Novitiate in July of 1927, and on the 7th of September in that year Thomas Matthew Hays received the holy habit of the order, and the name Brother Camillus Justus.

Brother Camillus is a talented musician, and a lover of the classics, with a special yen for Latin, and as a result the assignments which followed his first one were varied in order to encompass as many of his talents as possible.

While Brother Camillus has been at Christian Brothers Academy, he has taught music to the Seniors and Freshmen and in more recent years, he has been doing the Guidance Office work in the Guidance office at the school.

Brother Camillus is a very familiar sight to the present students of the Academy, as well as to the more recent graduates, who see or have seen him toiling away daily at his duties in the Guidance Office. Due to the cheery disposition that he enjoys, he gets many a friendly word or wave during the course of the day in the school. He has a host of friends who certainly will be wishing him well during the course of the year. All of his confreres rejoice in the fact that he has reached this milestone, and hope that he will have many more fruitful years in the service of the Lord.

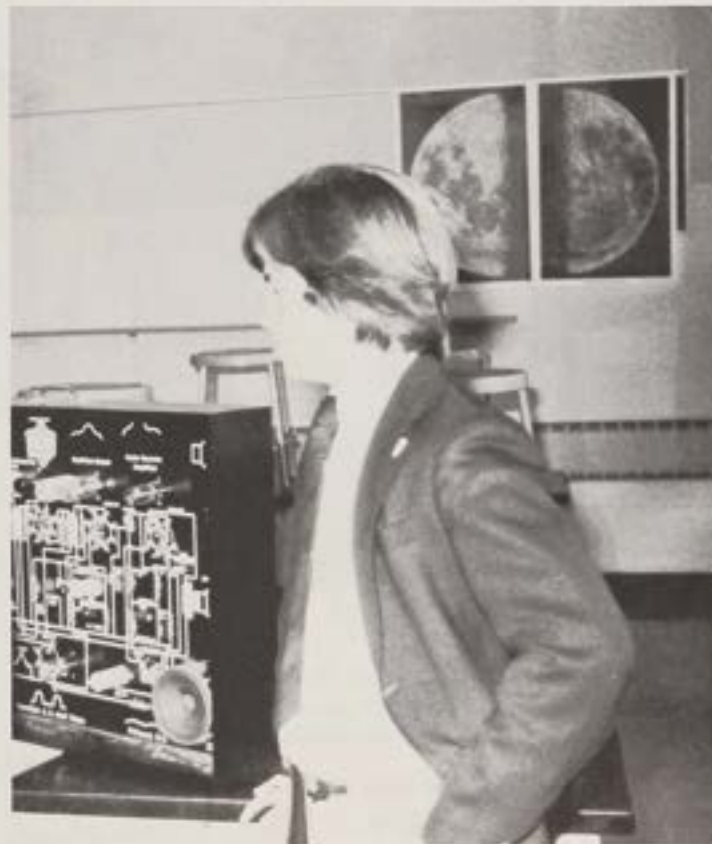

ONE MOTHER'S TRIBUTE TO C.B.A.

Way back in 1967 there was a woman, freshly divorced, no job, no income, no alimony or child support and stone broke — but with an awful lot of hope and a dream. There was also three sons to raise, at that time aged 14, 10, and 7 respectively. The Mother went to work seven days a week and the oldest boy took over a parent's job toward his younger brothers and gave up a good part of his own interests in order to help.
