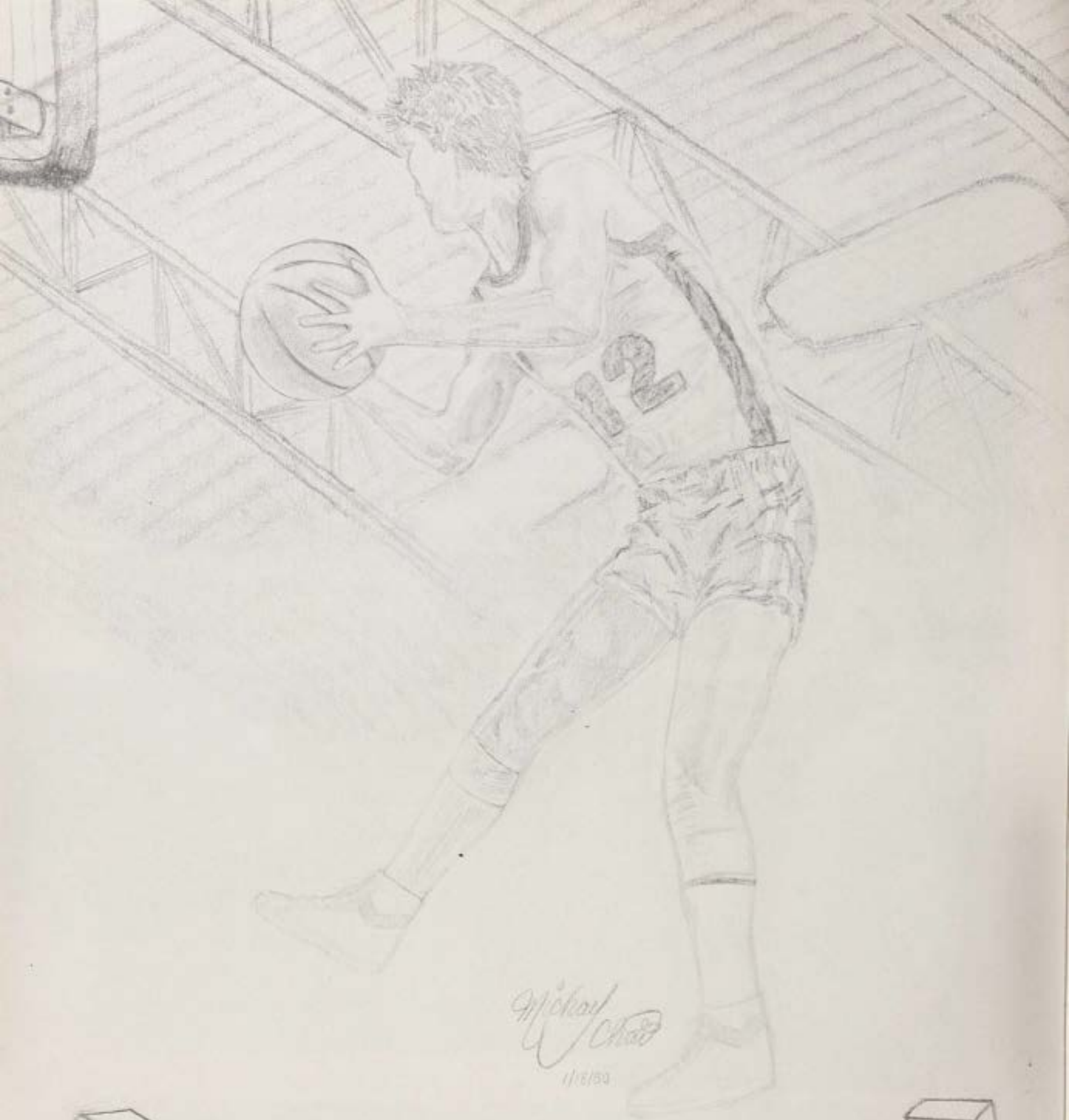

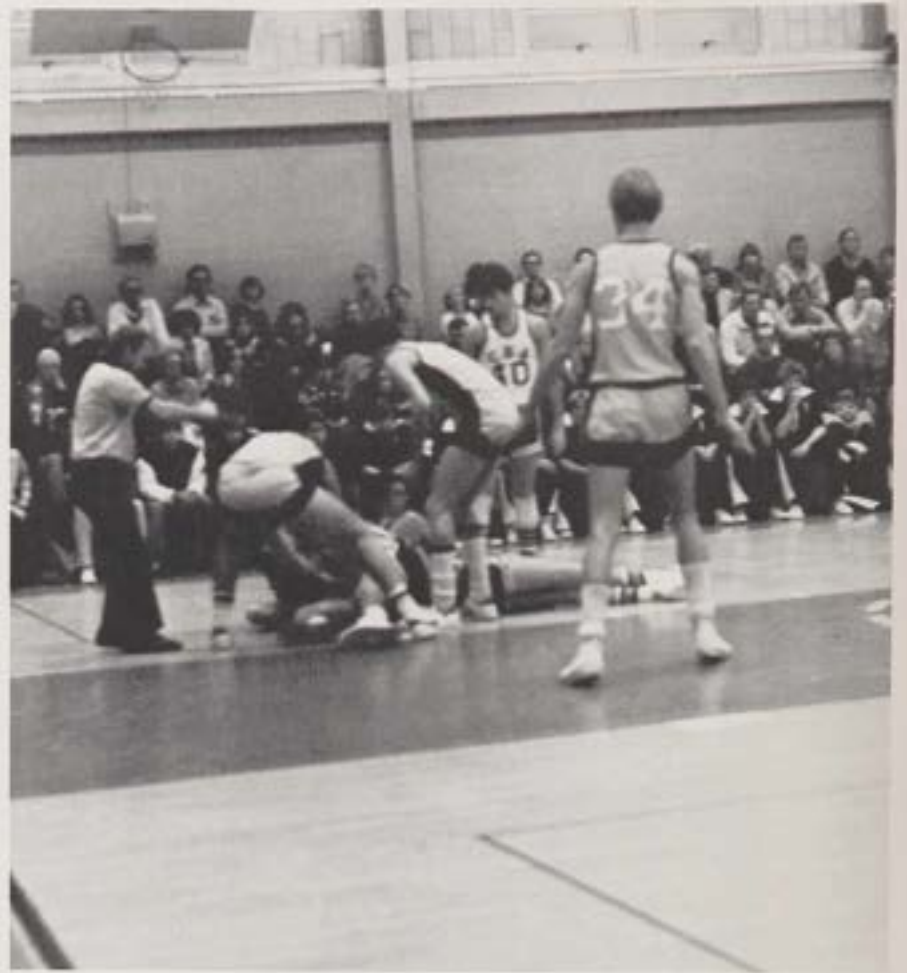

The 1979-1980 school year, was one which again marked the growth of the Student Council in both its freedoms and responsibilities. New programs were initiated, physical and structural changes were incorporated, and traditional Council projects were executed successfully, all in an attempt to provide students with growing experiences of a nature not offered in the classroom.

The school year began in September with a very successful Freshman Field Day. Enticed by the warm weather, a record two hundred students participated in the day's activities, in what proved to be an enjoyable day for all those involved.

As for the other Council traditionals, each was met in turn with a high degree of success. Dances once again proved their undisputed reign as the Council's chief fund-raiser, as well as, its largest social activity. For instance, the Council's first Battle of the Bands held in November drew 1,000 local high school students, to see the band Nightfall defeat the band Step Aside. In addition to dances, the Council sponsored seven exchanges with neighboring schools, involving over 100 students in the program.

With the restoration of the Football Barn, came the birth of the Council's McKenna Hall Program. Students, during their unassigned mods, were invited to view films or listen to speakers that the Council had running on a modular schedule at McKenna Hall. The films ranged from "Rocky" to Three Stooges shorts, while the speakers included a social service worker, a chiropractor, and a teacher of law enforcement.

In conclusion, it is my hope that the new programs which surfaced this year, as well as, the fervor with which traditional Council projects were carried out, spill over into next year. For if the Council can continue to grow, as it has through the experience of the years, it may someday become the dynamic center of student activity that will best further the growth of students as both individuals and a community.

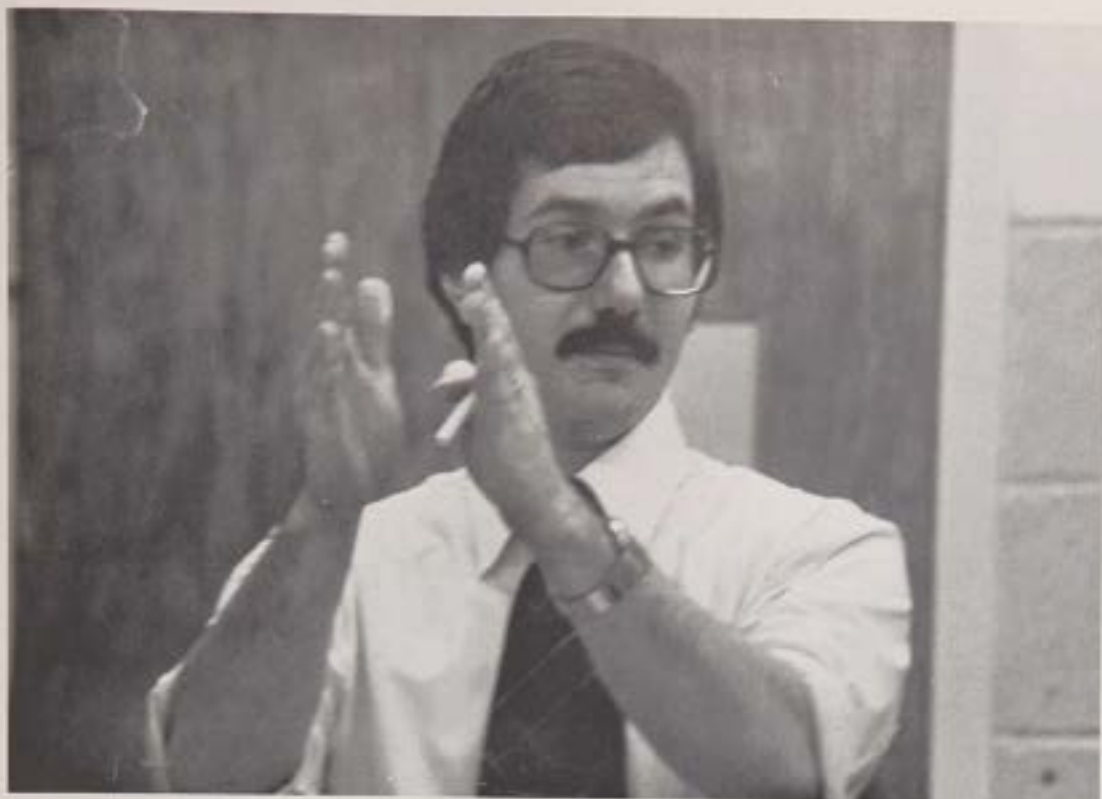

This brings up a question which is on the minds of many of our students. What is the purpose of the school newspaper and what role should it play in the daily lives of the students?

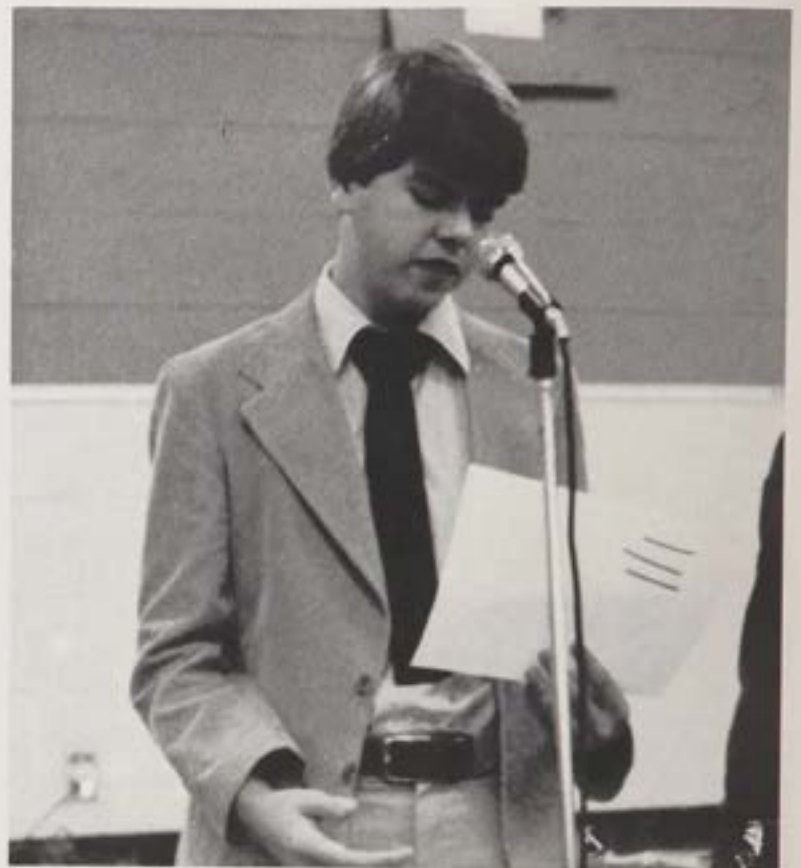
