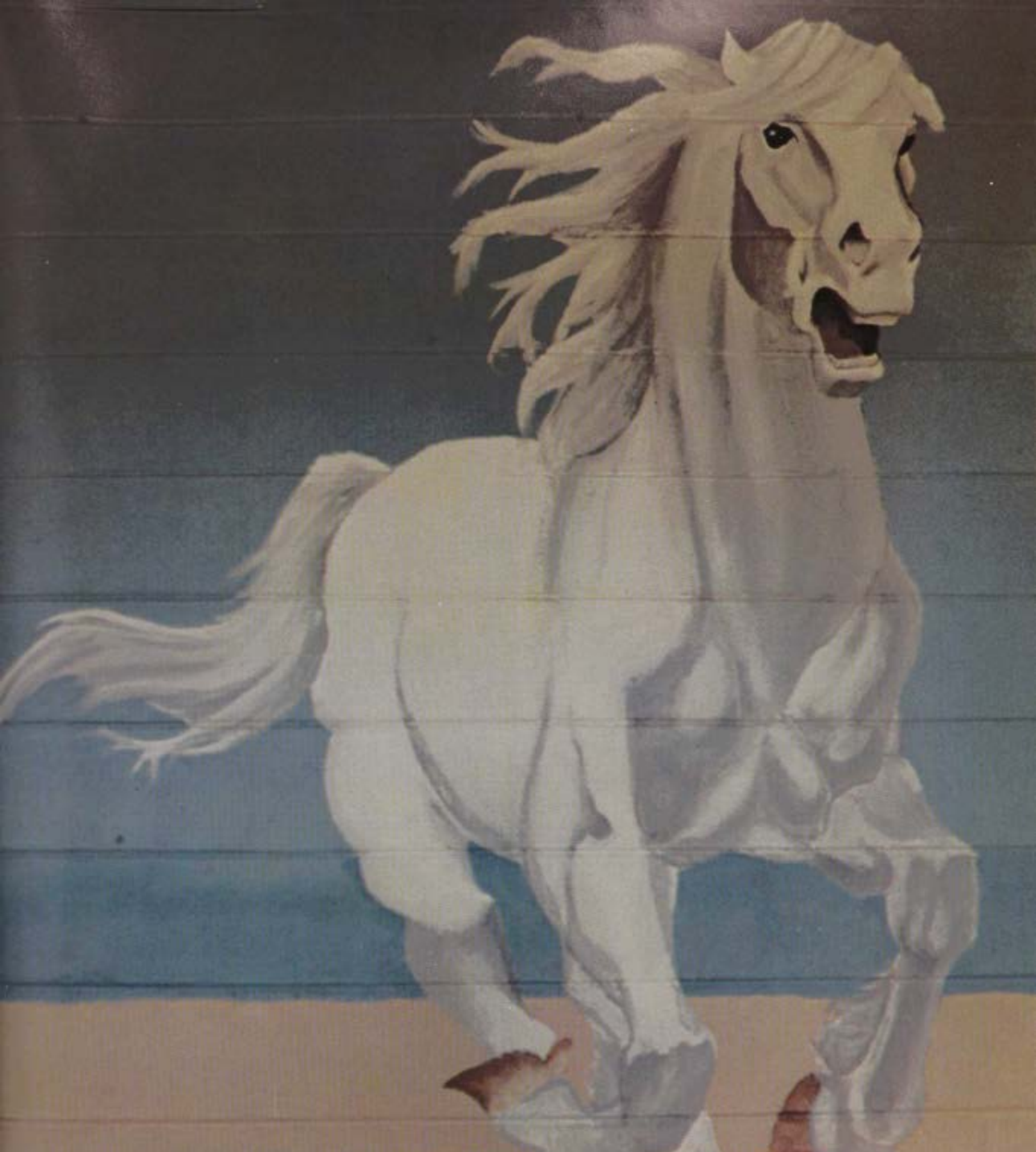

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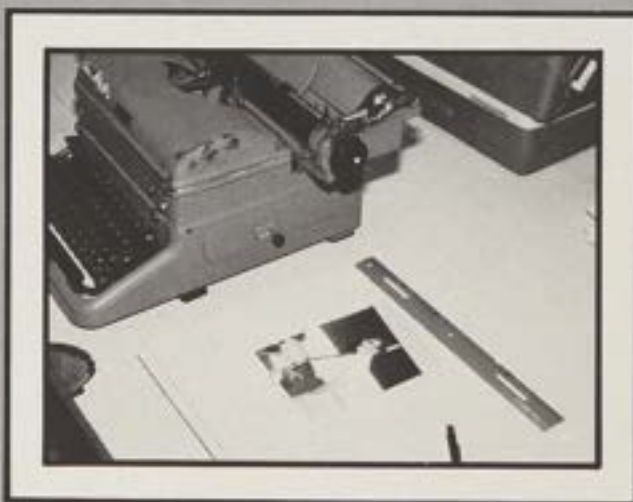

Dedication

The twenty-second graduating class of Christian Brothers Academy takes great pride in dedicating the 1984 *Pegasus* to Brother James Dobson. Brother James is the man primarily responsible for the new computer curriculum at CBA. Brother James' dedication and contributions to the CBA community will never be forgotten.

Brother James was born in New York City on October 10, 1920. He attended Bishop Loughlin High. In 1936 he took his vows and became a Brother of the Christian Schools. From there he went on to Catholic University, and later to Manhattan College where he received his Masters Degree. Brother James came to C.B.A. in 1969 and has been with us ever since.

Brother James' greatest contribution to C.B.A. has been the creation and expansion of C.B.A.'s computer curriculum. From a few lone computers in Benilde Hall, Brother James has expanded the curriculum so that we now have a complete lab



housing more than thirty computers, located in McKenna Hall. The computer department teaches both Pascal and Basic, and this year has started a new A.P. computer course. Brother James is also Chairman of the newly formed Computer Club.

Computers are not Brother James' only contribution to C.B.A. He is also responsible for the sound crew on our plays, and is the photographer of special events at C.B.A. He is also a frequent contributor to the Yearbook Photography Staff. These jobs demand a great deal of time and effort, and are greatly appreciated by

the students of C.B.A.

Today, Brother James, through his relentless efforts, has made the computer department at C.B.A. one of the best equipped and staffed in the state. For those students lucky enough to have been taught by Brother James, his extensive knowledge and enthusiasm have been mastering the computer easier and more interesting. We the class of 1984, to show our appreciation for Brothers contributions to the C.B.A. community, dedicate the 1984 *Pegasus* to Brother James Dobson.

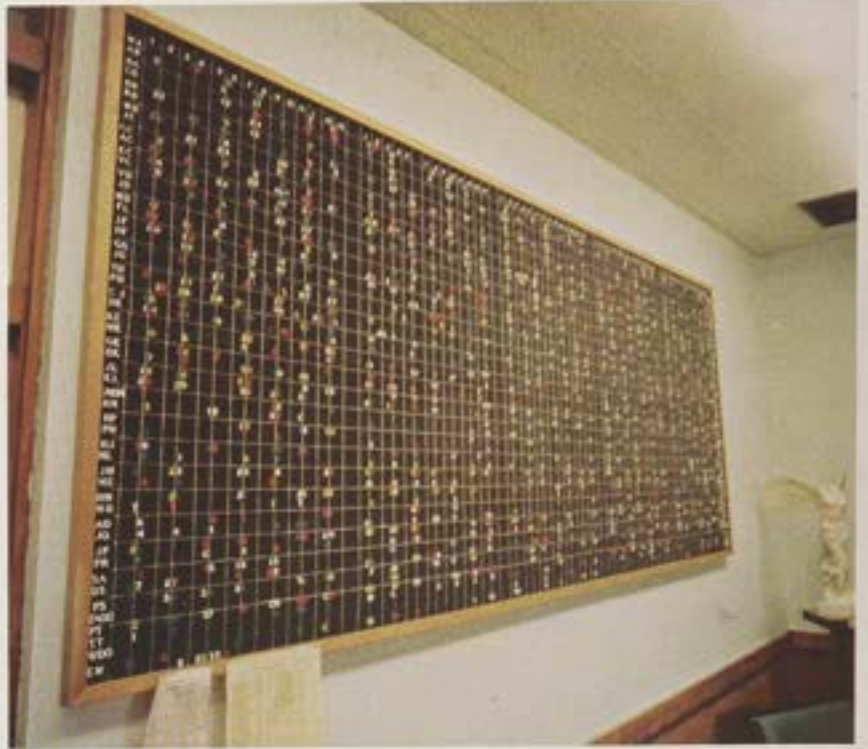

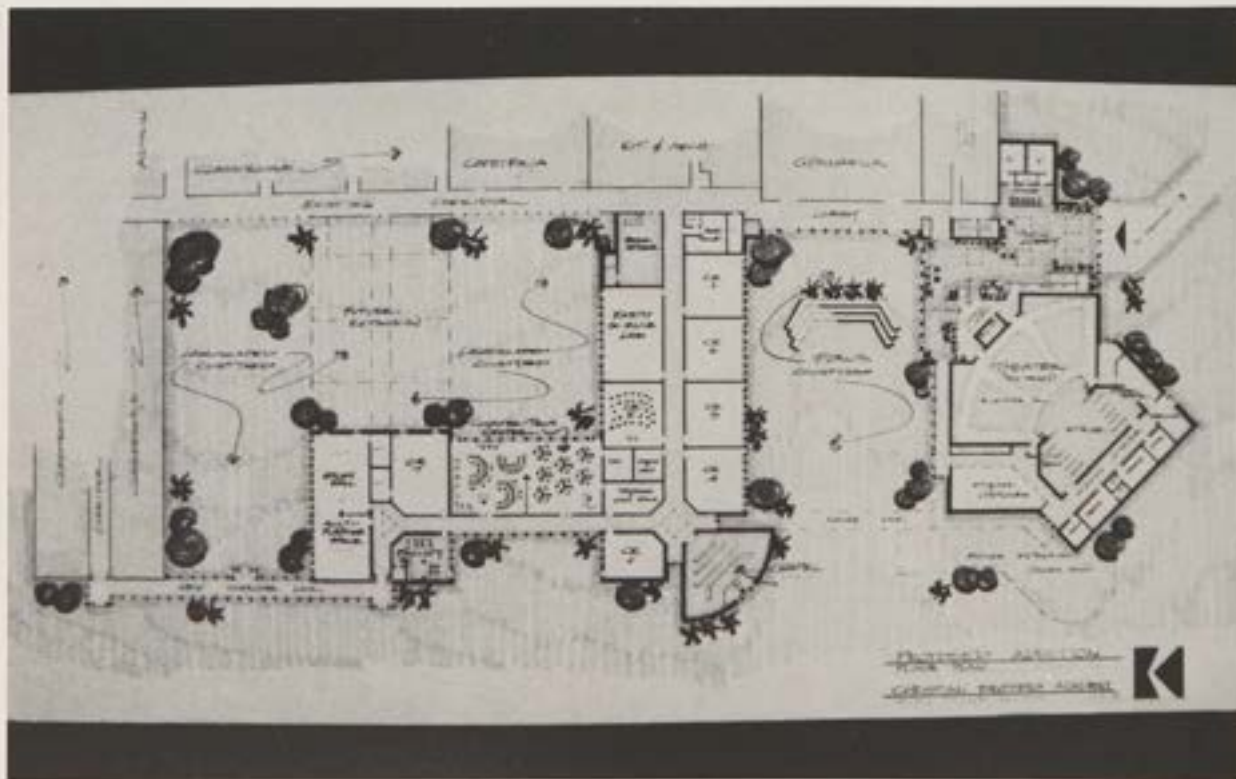
PROJECT 80's

The wing will contain much needed classroom space. In addition to the classrooms, the wing will contain a new chapel, offices, and storage space. The auditorium, separate from the new wing, will have a sizable seating capacity. This auditorium will be used for student productions and assemblies.

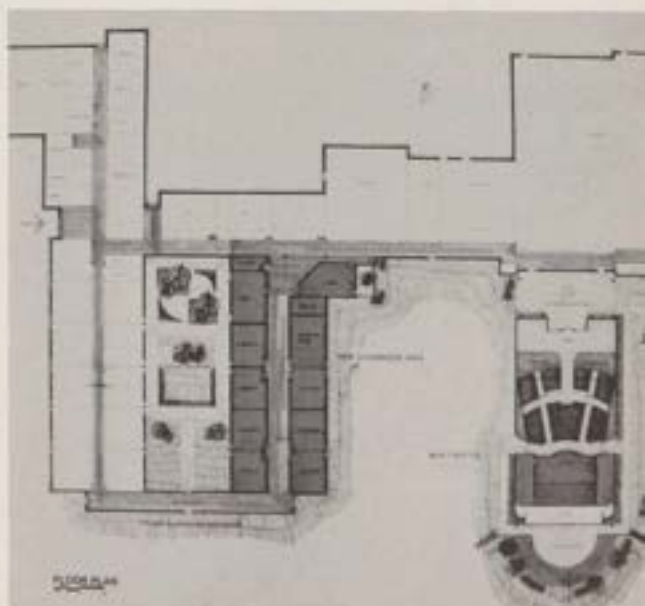
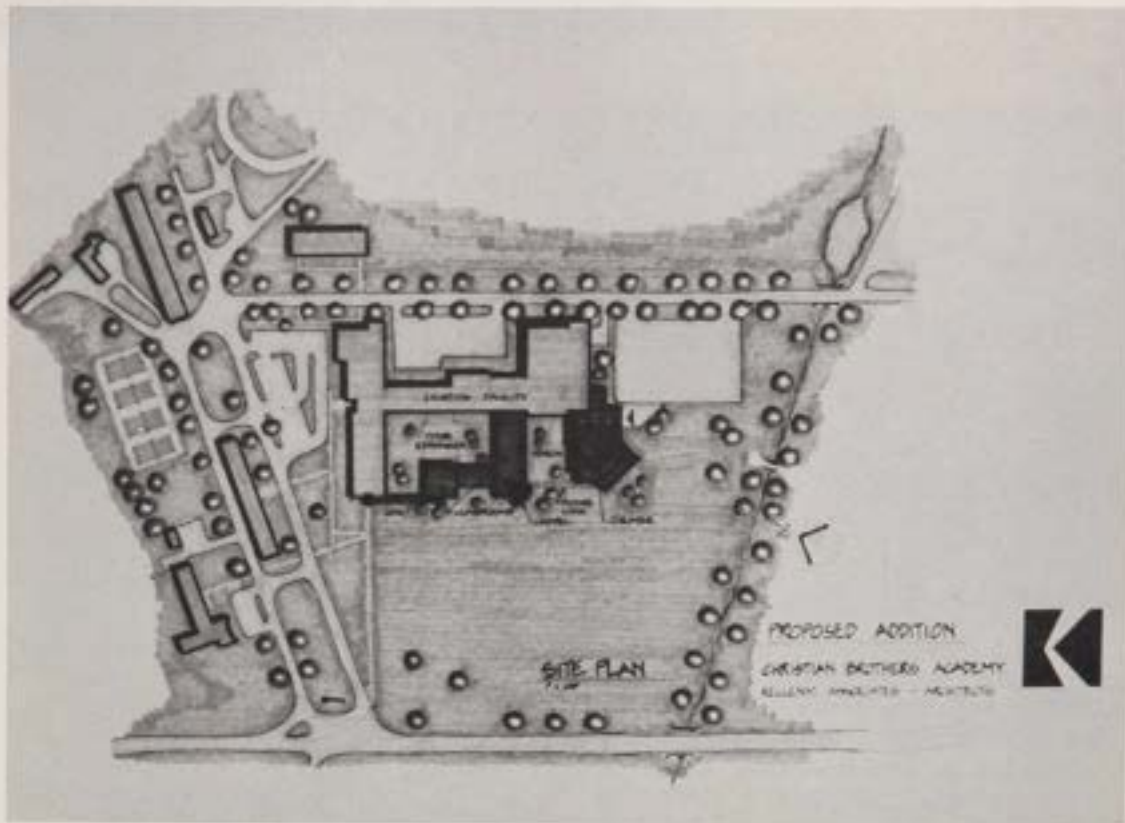

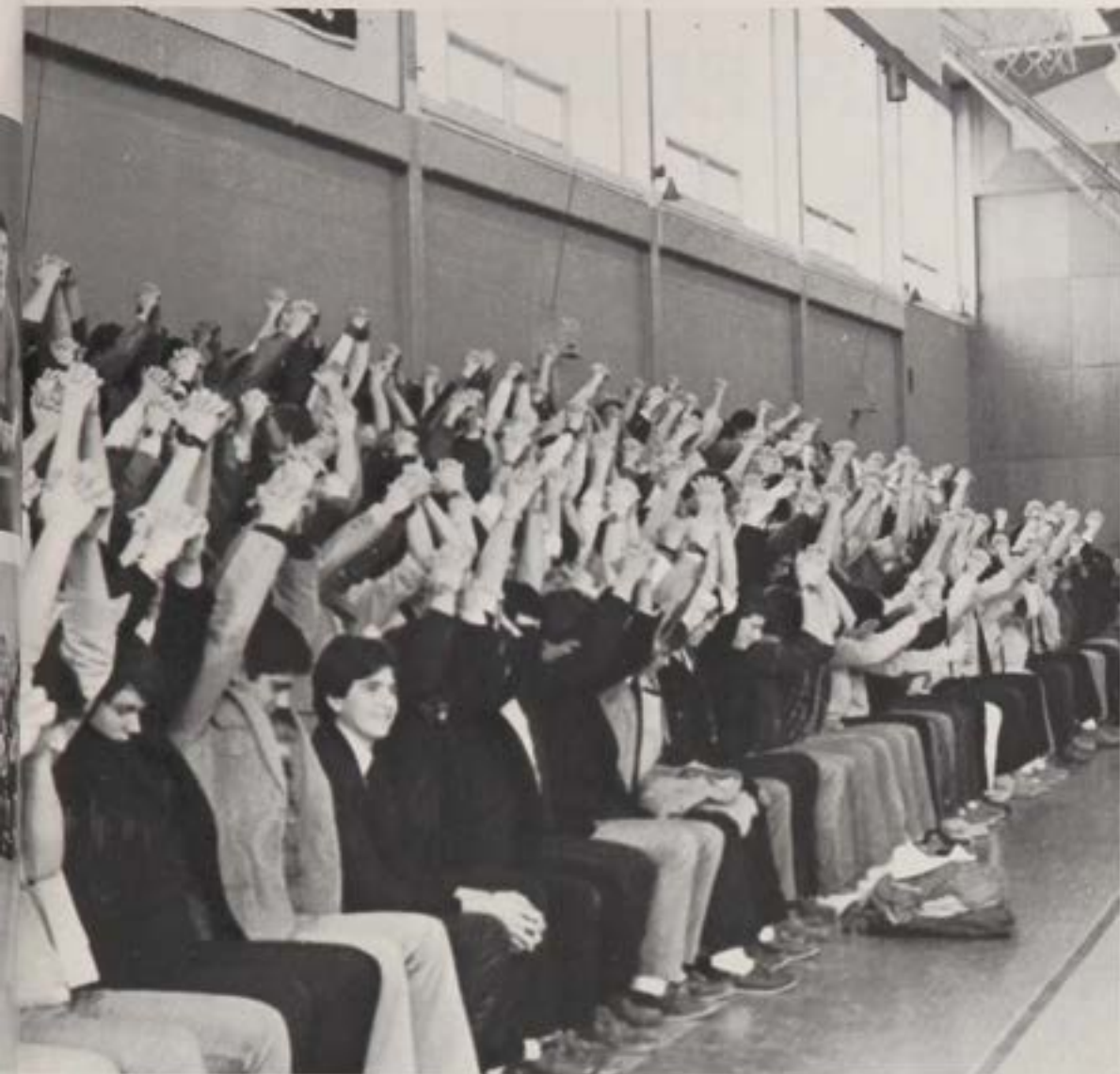

THE NATION - A YEAR OF TRIUMPH

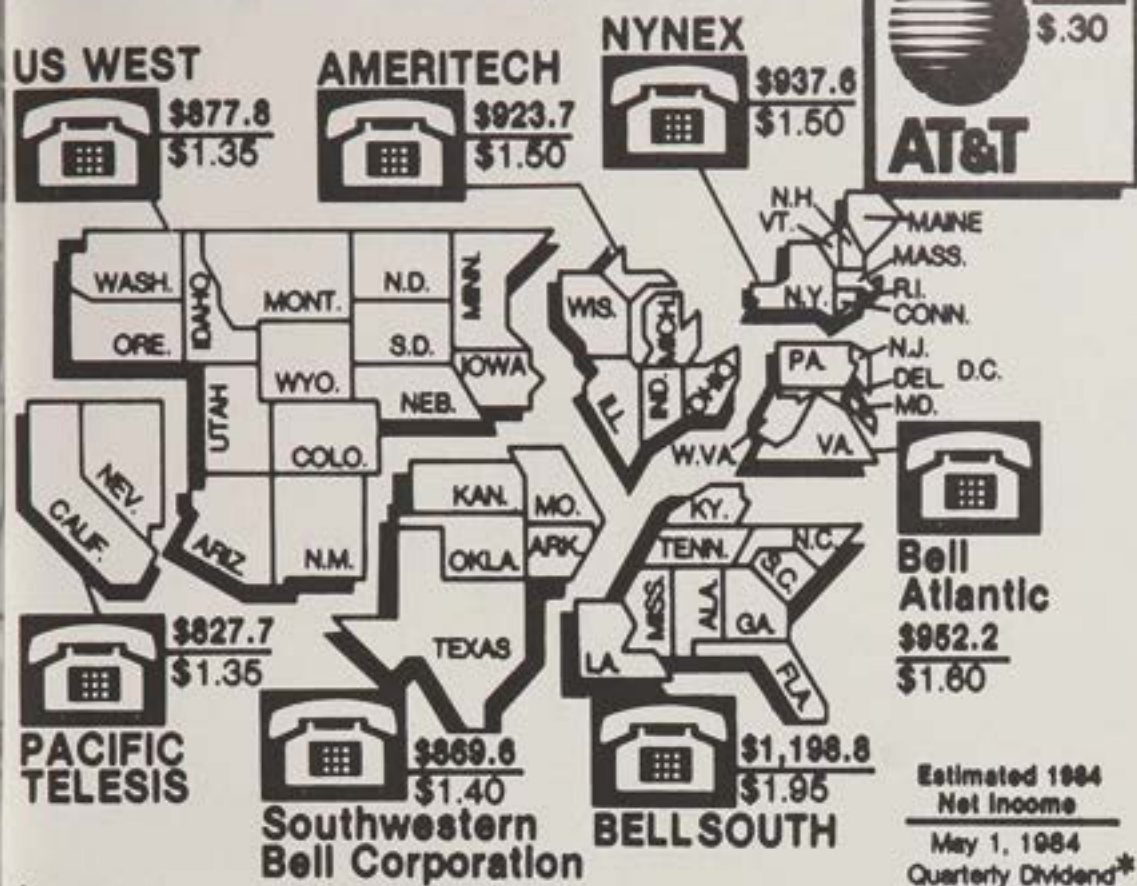

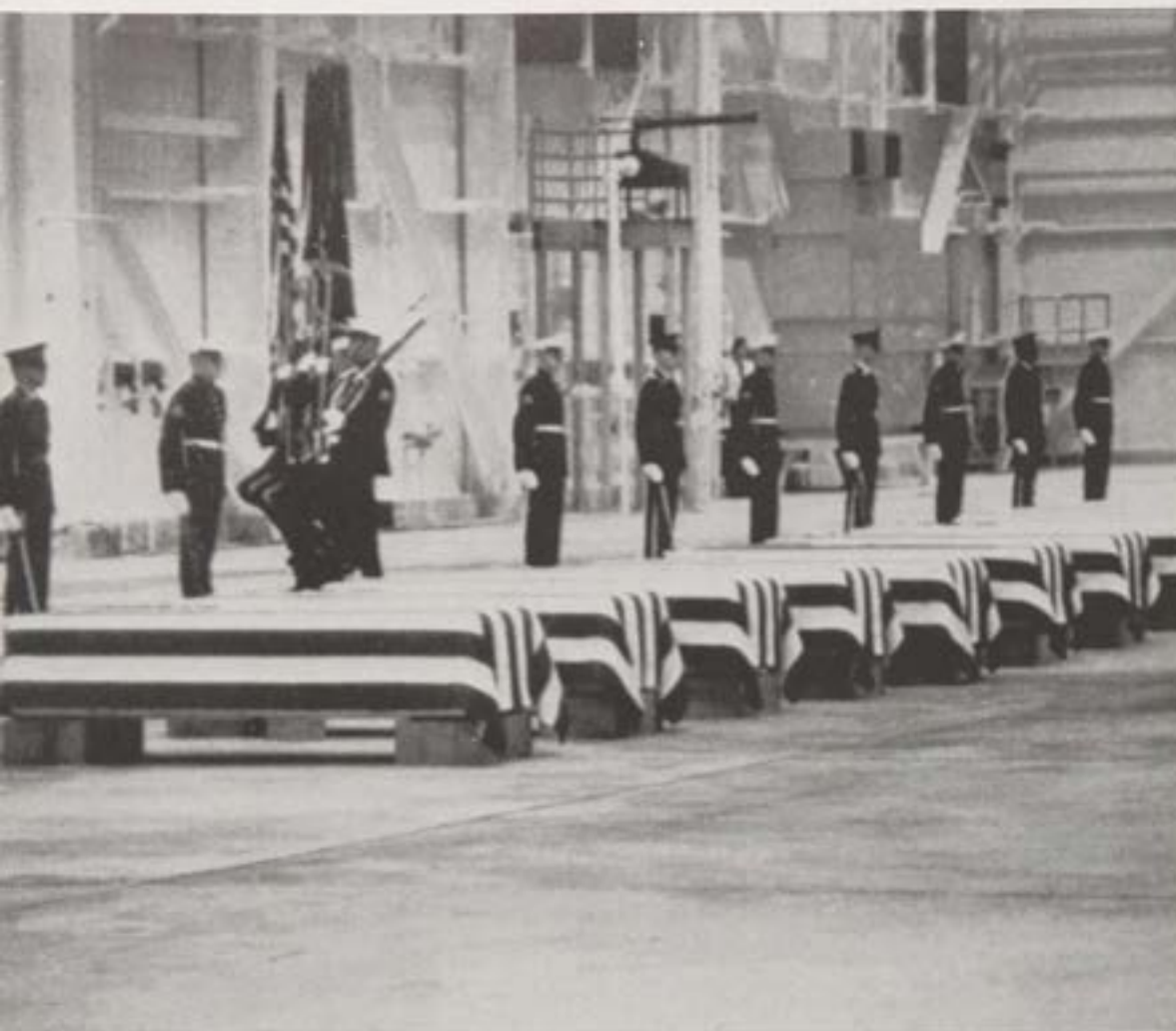

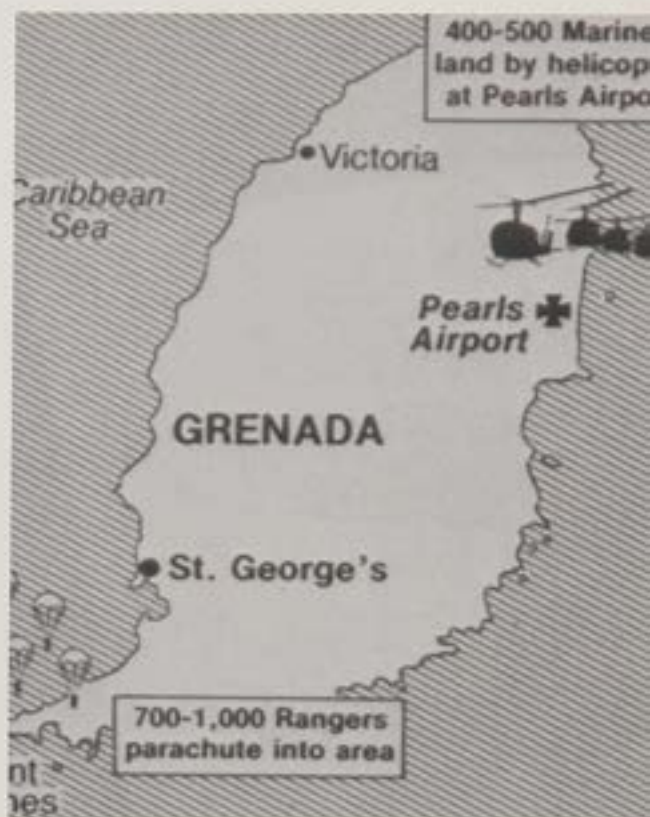

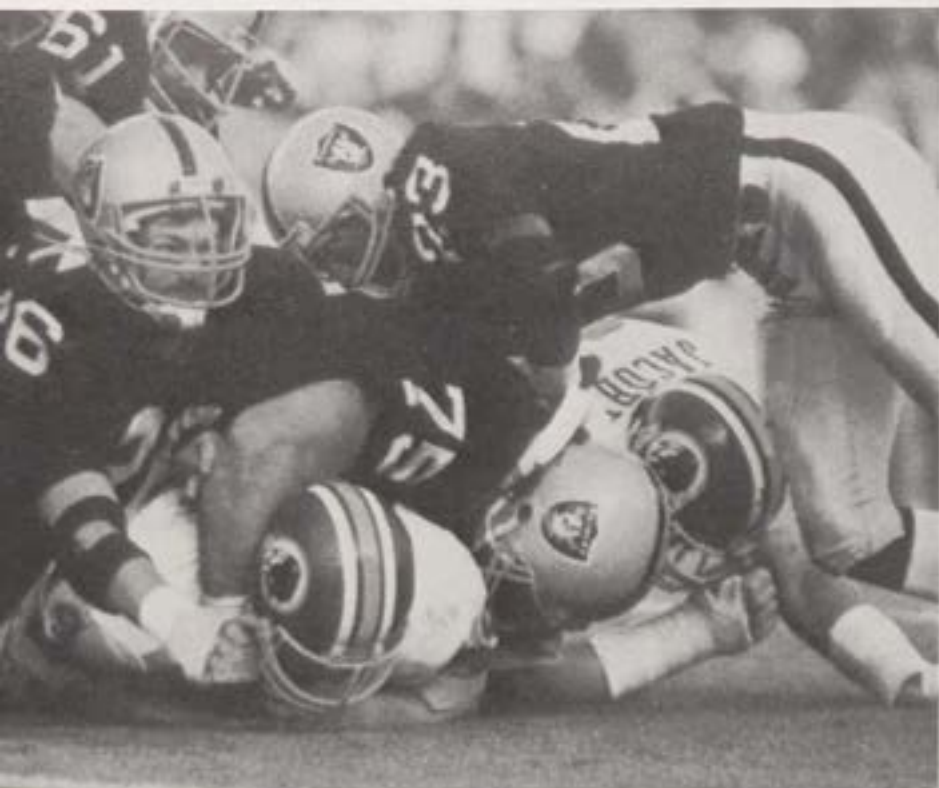
SHOOTING The Soviets Dest

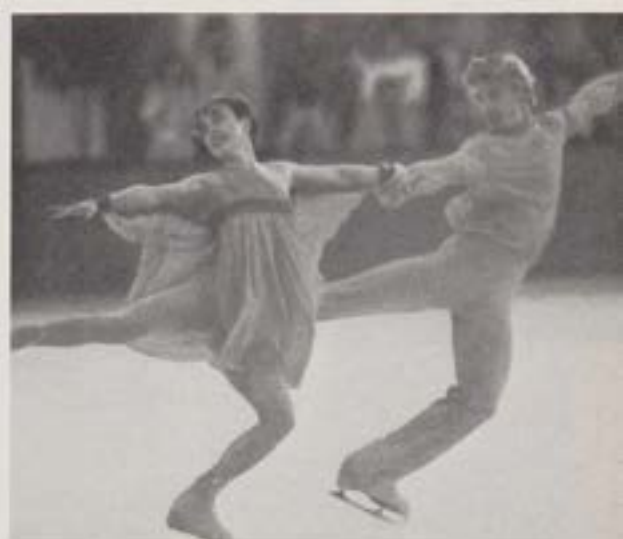

A REAL CHALLENGE

At the beginning, even before Freshman year, students are encouraged to take a mathematics placement test if they wish. This test determines the students' proficiency in Algebra and Geometry, and allows students to skip these courses if they have already mastered them.

As the courses build on each other, so does the excitement. Algebra II-Trig and Trig Analysis bring the student great exposure to graphs, functions, and equations. Those students who find that they want to do some extra work in math can do so by joining our award winning math team. Besides brushing up on their math, members of the math team also get to travel. The die-hard mathematicians can opt for a Calculus course in junior or senior year if they have the courage. CBA offers a phase three Calculus course and two AP Calculus courses.

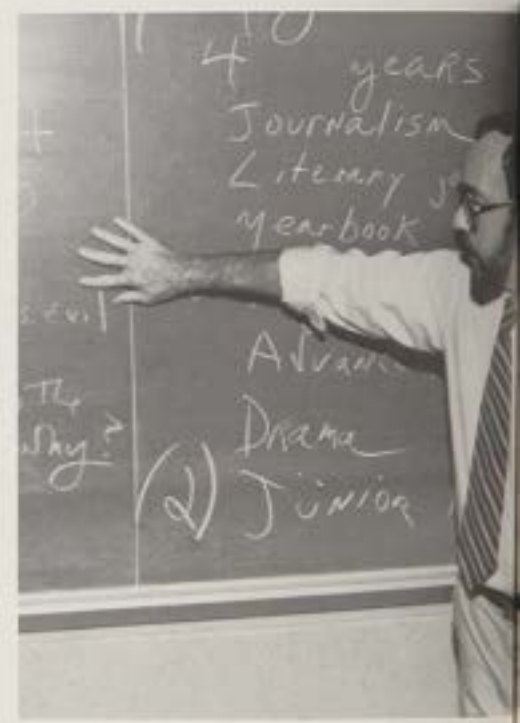

ENGLISH—The required course everyone loves.

Four years of English are required in order to graduate from CBA. Although the first two years of English are basically grammar and American literature, CBA does start to offer some diversity starting junior year.

The phase three English courses are taught by Mr. McKenna and Dr. Flanagan. They are more comprehensive than the regular curriculum and offer the student the opportunity to write more. The phase three English courses are usually a stepping stone to Advanced Placement English and Project Advance English.

AP English, taught by the English Department Chairman Mr. Fili, is a college-level course designed to prepare the student for the Advanced Placement Exam in May. It includes such topics as the study of tragedy, Greek Philosophy, and Eastern Theology. It also helps the "APE" develop and improve his expository and literary writing skills. If a student gets a four or five on the exam, he is eligible to receive as many as six college credits.

Project Advance English is another alternative to the normal English curriculum. This course is sponsored by Syracuse University and is taught by Mr. Maier. The course involves a number of "mini-courses" in which the students must do a vast amount of writing. Unlike the AP course, Project Advance English allows the student to gain credit throughout the year.

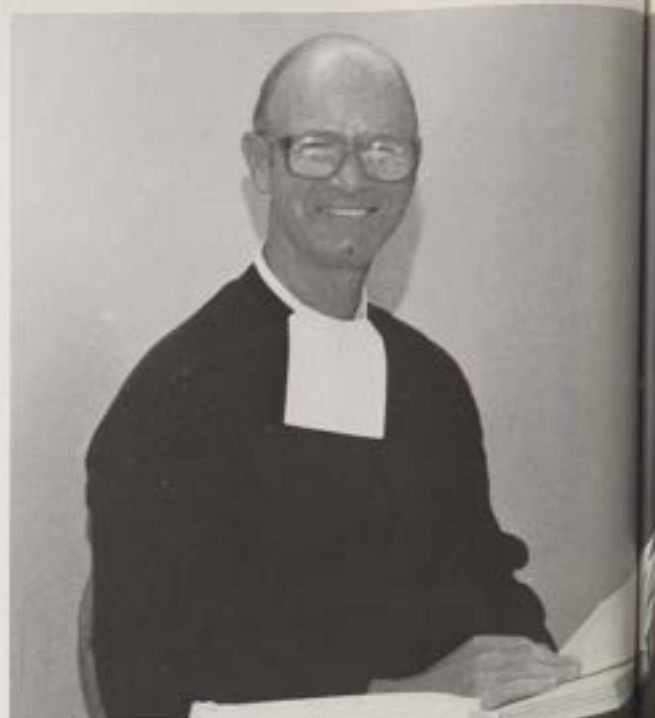

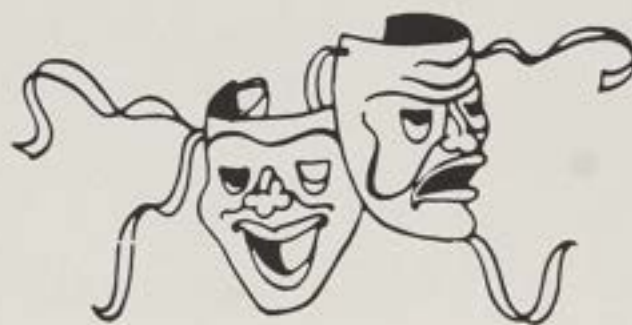
FOREIGN LANGUAGE DEPARTMENT WELCOMES TWO NEW SPANISH TEACHERS

One attractive addition to the department is the new Spanish teacher, Miss Janet Iseicz. Miss Iseicz was born and raised in Yardville, N.J. She attended the College of Saint Elizabeth and has earned a B.A. in Spanish and a B.A. in Psychology. 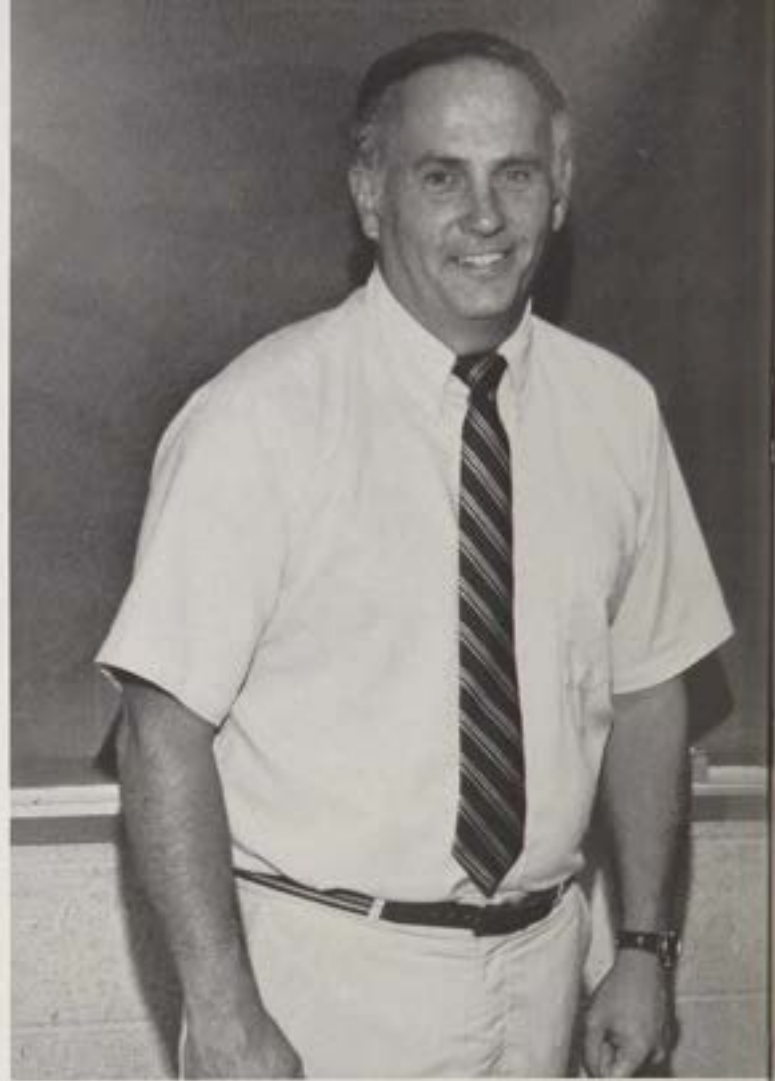

GROUP GUIDANCE

In the freshman year, the Group Guidance program involves becoming adjusted to new friends. It also is a great help in challenging the difficult curriculum here at C.B.A. Study skills, including skills and note taking, are treated extensively. There are many aptitude tests administered during the Freshman year. Among these are the National Education Development Tests, as well as an I.Q. test. All these are looked at and examined during the group guidance class. The results are analyzed and study habits are reviewed.

In the sophomore year, the Group Guidance sessions are designed to increase the student's awareness of future career possibilities. These sessions are also designed to stress the importance of your high school record and the importance of not getting in trouble. Such activities as Career Day and the Interest Inventory Survey, are designed to strengthen such skills as decision making and your ability to decide your own future. At the end of the year, preparation is given for the S.A.T.'s the following year.

The Junior year program is primarily a way to get information about some of the colleges that the students are considering. There are standard college handbooks and profiles administered as well as hundreds of college catalogues that are available in the Guidance Office. The P.S.A.T.'s are administered for eligibility in the National Merit Competition. The importance of the S.A.T. is discussed and study materials are used for more S.A.T. preparation. The process for applying to college is also stressed. Such activities as Career Day, a college day, and a College Fair are well part of the curriculum.

In the senior year, the students have the opportunity and responsibility for consulting their guidance counselors concerning their choices of colleges as well as help in getting their applications in before Christmas. Although seniors have no special activities or regular classes, they perform well in all college entrance exams because of their excellent training in their previous years.

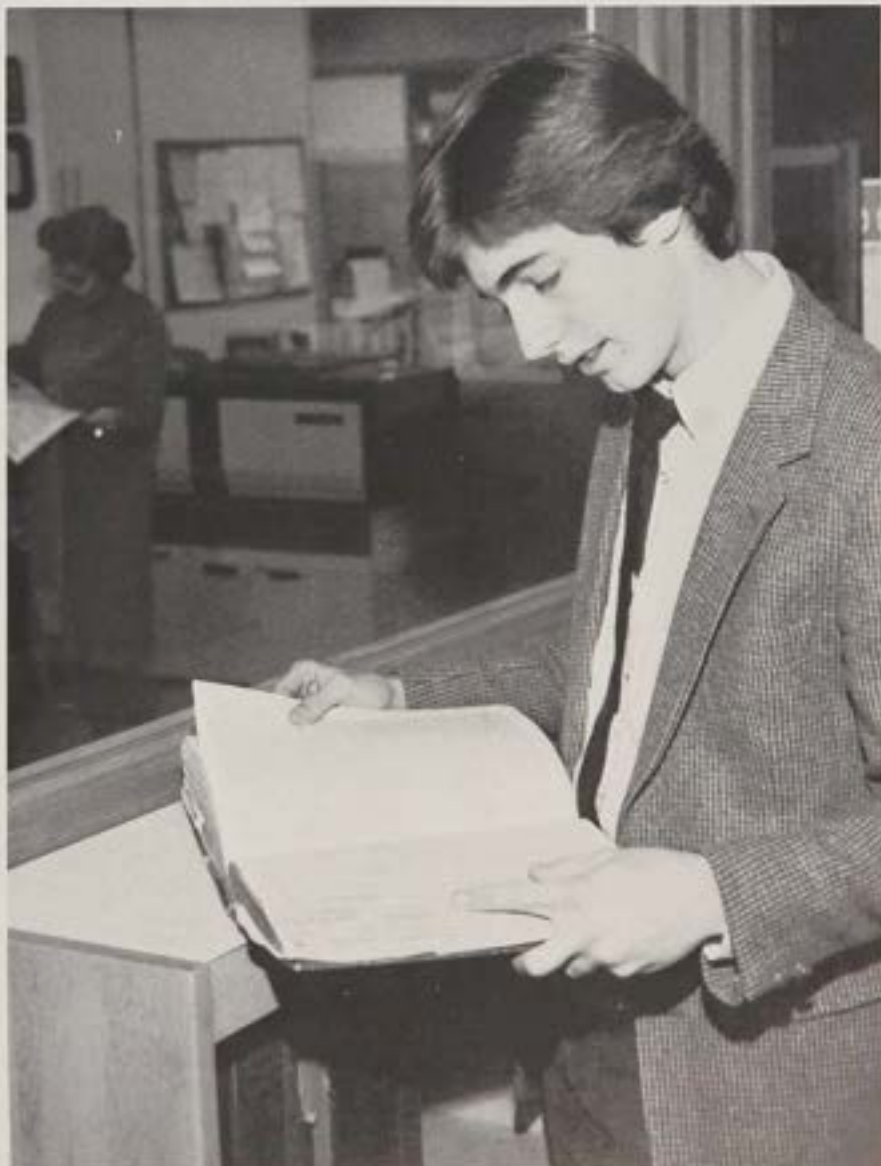

MOCK TRIAL

Mock Trial is a competition sponsored by the New Jersey Bar Association. In the competition, teams from participating schools prepare the opposite sides of a court case, and try the case in a courtroom. Two teams present cases in a "trial". Before the trial, each team prepares both sides of the case because they do not find out what side they are to present until a few minutes before the trial begins. A team consists of two lawyers who prepare the side of the plaintiff, the person who is bringing the lawsuit to court, two lawyers who prepare the side of the defendant, the person being sued, and three witnesses. These witnesses each learn to play two roles as either the plaintiff's or the defendant's witness.

At the trial, the two lawyers who prepared their team's chosen side of the competition act as lawyers. The other two lawyers act as the alternates, and fill in if someone is missing. The witnesses act as witnesses on the side their team is presenting. The teams are judged in three parts: team's lawyers, the witnesses, and the overall team. Each team's lawyers, are judged upon their opening statements, direct-examinations, cross-examinations, and closing statements. In addition, they are judged upon the knowledge they exhibit in using properly phrased questions and courtroom procedure. The witnesses are judged upon their believability, how they answered in direct examination, and how well they responded under cross-examination. The overall team is judged upon how well they observed courtroom procedure and etiquette, and if they kept their presentation within their time limits. These categories are added up for a maximum total of 50 points. The team with the most points wins the trial, and it is possible to lose the case but still win the trial. This is the second year this competition has been held, but the first in which C.B.A. has participated. This year's team consists of: James Carton, Plaintiff's council; Tim Chapman, Defendant co-councils; Greg Chapman, Tom Burgess and Tom Spaltoff, witnesses. Other members are Ron McKay and Eddie Chu. The moderator is Mr. Navarra, and the advisor is Mr. Michael Warshaw. Superior Court Judges, retired Superior Court Judges and lawyers act as judges in the competition, which is held at the Monmouth County Court House in Freehold. The main purpose of the mock trial is for people who want to become lawyers or work in the court system to gain experience and a sense of how it works.

CBA'S COACHING LEGEND

Among the seemingly numerous athletic dynasties existing at CBA, the Cross-Country, Track and field teams immediately come to mind. The driving force of these squads, quite obviously, has been Mr. Thomas Heath.

A one time sprinting star himself, Coach Heath knows his sport and has equally proven to his students and peers that discipline and determination is the key to success. From the first Cross-Country practice in early August to the final invitational the following June, the Harriers have been pushed by some eager, screaming leader for thirteen years.

During his thirty-nine grueling seasons, Coach Heath has, to say the least, produced results. Thanks to his expertise and perfectionism, CBA has sported Cross-Country teams which have claimed 65 invitationals, 5 state championships, and 2 Eastern State Meets. Mr. Heath is only the third coach in history to wear the Eastern State crown twice, which is awarded to the finest team from Maine to Texas. On top of this, the Colts have gone unbeaten in 117 straight dual meets.

Success, however, does not change with the weather. As head track and field coach, Mr. Heath has claimed four state relay and five individual indoor titles in addition to five outdoor crowns. His athletes have also captured 52 invitationals and compiled a 161-10 dual meet record. When added to the 45 invitationals his frosh and J.V. have claimed, it becomes elementary that great coaching builds great teams.

This year, Mr. Heath has left the Indoor Track Team's head coaching position in the very capable hands of Mr. Maier. We congratulate Coach Heath in his creation of a legend, and wish him continued success with his Harriers.

One of the most accurate summaries of Mr. Heath's career has been quoted from Mr. Bruno, "Whenever we win a State Championship or an Eastern State Title, it's expected because the students are used to hear about us winning. However, when we are upset, it comes to a surprise to the student body." —That in itself is a tribute to the record of Mr. Thomas Heath.
