


IN MEMORIAM

The memory of the late Brother James Dobson will always endure in the hearts and minds of the twenty-third graduating class. His many accomplishments and exemplary life serves as a reminder of what a Christian truly is.

The prestige and reputation of C.B.A. has grown with the many contributions of Bro. James. In 1969 he came to C.B.A. with an inexhaustible amount of energy to serve others. His vast knowledge of Physics and Chemistry was passed on to many students. This, however, did not keep him complacent, and with the advent of the computer age, he began the C.B.A. computer department. From a small room in Benilde Hall, Bro. James worked on a few broken computers. Today we see the fruits of his work in McKenna Hall. All of this has commanded the respect for his work as an educator and teacher.

Outside the classroom Bro. James showed his unique talent as the all around mechanic and troubleshooter. For our yearbook he contributed frequently with photos of all kinds of school events. Copies of **Pegasus** of past years are flooded with his pictures. When the play needed a better sound system in the Gymnasium, Bro. James refurbished the audio equipment. Many of his peers also admired him for his helpfulness. Besides teaching high school students, Bro. James spent much of his time teaching adults. The administration often turned to him for guidance and advice too. In a word, Bro. James was a giver, who answered any call for assistance.

Most of us at Christian Brothers have known Bro. James only for a short period of time, but during this time we were able to know how much of a friend and caring teacher he really was. His sensitivity touched all of us. In the classroom, he was a serious and positive motivating force. This image was quickly supplanted by the lightheartedness he showed when cheering for us on the playing fields after school. In these two images we saw reflected the deep desire he had for all of us to improve and become our best. For him the student came first.

Faith never was lacking in Brother James. We at C.B.A. admired his work, but loved him as a man of Christ. Although he is gone, his memory lives on.




DEDICATION



The 23rd Graduating class of Christian Brothers Academy takes great pride in dedicating the 1985 PEGASUS to the school itself. The Academy has fostered the education of Shore area students for the past 25 years and it is fitting that on its 25th Anniversary we dedicate this book to our school and to all those who have been a part of its history and who will be a part of its future.

Back in early 1958, a group of area laymen, headed by Mr. John C. Henderson, Mr. Peter E. Fleming, and Dr. George A. Sheehan, realized that there was a need here in Monmouth County for another Catholic high school. They began a fund drive to raise money for the purchase of a piece of property, with the blessings of Bishop George W. Ahr. Under their provincial, Brother Anthony John Halpin, the Christian Brothers agreed to staff the school and finance its construction.

A sprawling stable which at one time had sheltered some of the finest thoroughbred horses in the country was about to become an academy for boys by the Christian Brothers. The once famous Whitney Greentree Stables was bought by the Brothers for an estimated \$400,000. The stable property included 157 acres of land with 9 very usable buildings, one of which was converted into what is now Henderson Hall.

144 students were accepted to the Academy for the first semester of school, beginning in September of 1959. With a newly converted 8 classroom building and 6 Brothers, the tradition of academic excellence in the Shore area began.

Already the Brothers had high aspirations for their new school, as plans were being drawn up for the construction of the main building. Two years after the opening of Henderson Hall, the construction began. The main building was to house a modern school with 3 science labs, 15 classrooms, a gymnasium, cafeteria and chapel, plus the administrative offices.

With the construction of the main building complete, enrollment was increased and C.B.A. was on its way!


At C.B.A. the whole individual is developed through a well rounded education that provides a strong moral core and offers a rich, intellectual; and artistic curriculum.







In celebration of Christian Brothers Academy's 25th Anniversary, the new wing and auditorium will be ready for school opening in September, 1985.



READING AND WRITING

The Academy's English Department offers students a well-rounded program of study designed to prepare students for college. The English Department features a diversified selection of courses, each designed to challenge the student while he learns.

In Freshmen year everyone takes English I, it is here that students are introduced to college-prep. level English work. In English I, basic literary appreciation and writing skills are stressed, as well as comprehensive reviews of grammar, vocabulary, and the principles of language.

In Sophomore year everyone takes English II. Here the concentration is in the areas

of American Literature, writing, vocabulary study, and grammar.

In Junior year students are given the option of phase III or phase IV English. Both courses cover basically the same material; the phase III course however is more in depth. In Junior year, English Literature is covered as well as the fundamental principles of writing the research paper and precis. Also Junior year English covers areas of grammar, vocabulary, and speech.

In Senior year students have the option of four English courses; English IV, Advanced Placement English, Project Advance, and the Advanced Philosophy Seminar. These courses hone the student to the requirements of college level English work.

Some specialty courses offered by the English department are Journalism and Cultural Arts.

Journalism is a workshop course whose main function is to publish **The Torch** and **The Torch Fortnightly.** This course provides students with the opportunity to practice their creative writing skills.

Cultural Arts introduces students to art, music, and the theater, with an emphasis on appreciation. This course helps to further develop the well-rounded C.B.A. student.

Scientifically Speaking





A small computer room and a single course in Basic programming under the supervision of our recently deceased Br. James Dobson, was a show-place and the pride of CBA. Each terminal then was simultaneously used by two or three students. Br. James soon acquired an on site mainframe.

As interest and enthusiasm grew he worked to see two rooms in McKenna Hall outfitted with a classroom and a 45 micro-computer. Courses now include Basic, Advanced Basic, Pascal, and Advanced Pascal.

With our move to the new wing in September a modern lecture room, and computer lab, planned by Br. James, will handle courses ranging from Word Processing for freshmen to Advanced Placement Pascal for seniors and will stand as a tribute to the foresight and devotion to education of our beloved Br. James Dobson.

A LOOK BACK





Mr. Gregory Higgins, a graduate of the class of 1978, and a new Faculty member, shares with us his thoughts on the C.B.A. experience as both a student and a teacher.

Despite the changes in the faculty, the student body, and the building itself, I have the impression that the CBA I left seven years ago is, in many ways, not unlike the CBA I now see as a teacher. My fondest memories of CBA are of the friendships which were made in the classroom and in the gym, in school and out of school. In 1978, it was Tim O'Grady, Andy Daniele, and Steve Driscoll, and many others who made CBA a special place for me. Now I teach Steve's younger brother, Christopher. In 1985, I see the same camaraderie, the same spirit. The hallways, the cafeteria, and the playing fields are all places where I find once again that CBA binds students together in friendship.

CBA, for me, was a place where a number of teachers challenged me to ask certain questions about life. These questions still grasp me and I still search for the answers. One such teacher who sparked my imagination and challenged me to rethink my answer was Mr. Ron Boro. Now I am his colleague and I am still learning from him. From my conversations with the students, I can see that many of them have been similarly impressed by a

given teacher's enthusiasm for his or her subject matter.

CBA, for me, was a place where I was reminded that Jesus should live in our hearts . . . forever. In the midst of deciding what college to attend, or what assignment to do next, I was also asked to reflect on what it means to be a Christian. It was for that purpose that CBA was founded and it remains

today the reason for our existence.

Since returning to CBA, I have gained a deeper appreciation for the dedication that so many men and women have for their students, to teaching, and to CBA. The dedication which the parents, the Brothers, and the faculty have to the shool remains a quiet witness to the special quality that CBA possesses. Br. Bernard McKenna, Br. Andrew Valentine, Mr. John O'Shea, Mr. Tony Chesney, and Mr. Vinnie Cox have been with CBA throughout most, if not all, of its twenty-five years and there are countless others whose years of service have contributed to the life of CBA.

Finally, I find a great sense of loyalty to CBA among most of the alumni. We feel a certain pride and sense of belonging which ties us to CBA long after graduation. It is that sense of belonging which draws so many alumni back to teach at CBA and which fills us with hope for the coming twenty-five years.









GOLDEN JUBILEE

This past September marked the 50th Anniversary of two dedicated brothers here at C.B.A. Brother Charles O'Hanlon and Brother James Sullivan celebrated their golden jubilee in the Brotherhood on September 7, 1984.

At St. Joseph's they each spent one year in the Novitiate, a trial period in the brotherhood before the brothers take their final vows. Upon finishing their novitiate year, the two attended Catholic University in Washington, D.C.

From Catholic University, Broth-

er Charles went on to teach at such schools as Sacred Heart School in the Bronx, Holy Name School in Manhattan and La Salle Academy in New York. Throughout his teaching career, Brother Charles has taught students on the elementary and secondary school levels. He arrived at C.B.A. in 1973 and from that time on has worked in the finance office and as Moderator of the Father's Club.

After graduating from Catholic University, Brother James also went on to teach. His teaching career has taken him to such schools as Bishop Loughlin High School in Brooklyn, Christian Brothers Academy in Albany and the La Salle Military A- cademy in Long Island. In 1974, Brother James arrived here at C.B.A. He presently works as a librarian and as moderator of the chess team.

There was a mass to honor the brother's jubilee that was celebrated by the most reverend, John C. Reiss, Bishop of Trenton. The jubilee mass took place on April 27, 1985 at St. Catherine's Church, Holmdel. It was a fitting way to honor the brothers for the dedication of their lives to God for the past 50 years, with service to the young through education.



THE CANONIZATION OF BROTHER MIGUEL

On October 1984, Brother Miguel Febres Cordero was declared a saint by Pope John Paul II, amid all the ecclesiastical pomp and splendor surrounding the Rite of Canonization.

Brother Miguel, one of the Brothers' first students in Ecuador, was born as Francisco Febres Cordero on November 7, 1854 in Cuenca, a small town outside of Quito. He entered the Brotherhood upon reaching the age of 14, and from that time on served God and man as a teacher and scholar.

At the young age of 17, Brother Miguel published what would be the first of many textbooks of Spanish grammar and went on to teach for 32 years in the Brothers' El Cebollar School in Quito. Later as the young Brother's brilliance was realized, the Ecuadorean government adopted many of his texts of Spanish grammar for use throughout the entire country. Brother Miguel was later commissioned to revise his books for use in a variety of Spanish-speaking nations.

Each year, for more than three decades, Brother Miguel found no greater pleasure than to help the young children of Quito prepare for their first Holy Communion. He wrote many manuals of piety for them, and occasional hymns, all to help the children realize what a wonderful thing they were undertaking. Brother Miguel gave them their religious instruction and conducted many retreats.

He faithfully served the Christian Brothers in Belgium and Barcelona, Spain, where he died on February 9, 1910 of a long term illness.

When his body was returned to Ecuador, there was considerable public ceremony, and on the centenery of his birth, he was honored by the Ecuadorean government with the issuance of postage stamps and the erection of a monument in his honor.

The occasion of his canonization brought dignitaries and Christian Brothers from around the world, to honor this truly great man. Brother Andrew O' Gara represented the Academy at the Canonization while Brothers John Griffin and James Sullivan went as representatives for the Christian Brothers' Province of New York and New Jersey.

Saint Brother Miguel is the third member of the Brothers of the Christian Schools to become a saint. The founder of the Brothers, Saint John Baptist de La Salle was canonized in 1900 while Saint Brother Benildus of France was canonized in 1967.

Brother Miguel was truly a man of Christ and faith, and his life was one which exemplified saintliness. His life should be an example to all of us to be as successful as we can but also not to lose sight of our Christian values.

A little closer to home C.B.A. participated in the Hand-in-Hand Festival and the Hand-in-Hand Basketball game, both of which benefitted the kids afflicted with mental retardation. There were many students who participated in the Multiple Sclerosis Word Encounter which raises funds for the research of this terrible crippling disease which attacks kids our own age.

For these reasons the Academy's faculty and student body truly deserve to be called people who "reach out and touch someone."




Indoor 1984-85

The success of Joseph was the result of hard work and dedication of many people. The play, which is based on the story in Genesis, reflected the talent which was put into it. The alacrity of spirit in the players and overwhelming enthusiasm of audiences made Joseph And The Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat more than a play for dreamers.
