Brother A. Patrick Martin, F.S.C.

The Twenty-fifth graduating class of Christian Brothers Academy is honored and proud to dedicate the 1987 Pegasus to Brother A. Patrick Martin, F.S.C.

Brother Patrick (Francis Harold Martin) was born on June 1, 1917, in Newport, Rhode Island. He attended De La Salle Academy, in Newport, from 1930 to 1934, where he was an honor student and an outstanding athlete. He was captain of the varsity football and tennis teams in his senior year. He was the first graduate to enter the Brothers of the Christian Schools in Barrytown, New York.

Brother Patrick entered the Brothers in June 1936 and upon completion of his novitate, made his first vows in September, 1937. He graduated magna cum laude from Catholic University in 1941. He earned his masters degree at Manhattan College in 1951 and continued graduate studies at Canisius College, Fordham, Seton Hall and Niagara Universities.

Brother Pat first taught at St. Patrick's School in Newburgh, New York. His teaching career followed with positions as principal and director of four parochial schools in New York State. Under the leadership of Brother Pat, these schools were declared "banner schools" for outstanding athletic and academic leadership.

In 1955, Brother Pat began a long career of teaching and administration in the secondary schools of the New York Province. For the past twenty-one years he has taught Religion and History here at the Academy. He was the Dean of Henderson Hall and now of the Freshman Wing. He is known to all as "Tennis Pat" for his remarkable ability as coach, player, moderator, and friend to the entire C.B.A. community.






We came to C.B.A. unsure of what we would find, but with great expectations. What we found was a school that emphasized the totality of human life — physical, spiritual, intellectual, social.

FOCUS: SOPHOMORE RETREAT

The Religion department offers to all sophomores a wilderness awareness retreat. The retreats are conducted by Jon Young and are held at Tatum Park in Holmdel.

During the retreats, the students learn about a wide range of subjects from edible plants to tracking deer to the affects of modern society on the local ecology. However, the main purpose is to help them to get in touch with nature as a primary focus of a creationcentered spiritual focus. They are given approximately an hour to sit alone in silence to reflect and meditate in a wilderness setting.




FOCUS: AP EUROPEAN HISTORY

"In one given grade there are students working on four different levels of math", according to Brother Christian Jones, chairman of the math department.

Before entering the academy, those students who had Algebra I in eighth grade may take a placement test and enter into Geometry or Geometry/Algebra II in their freshman year. By the time they reach their senior year, these students may have advanced to A.P. Calculus II.


Each year students may choose between four, sometimes 5 different math courses. Naturally the course level depends on the students performance in the previous year.


FOCUS: THE NEW PHYSICS LAB






Ron Boro 1935-1986


I have had the privilege of knowing Ron in many capacities over the years: as colleague, as friend, but above all else, as teacher. It is that relationship which I treasure the most. Ron taught me religion while I was a student here nearly ten years ago. It is Ron Boro — Mr. Boro — my religion teacher, whom I remember with you this evening.

Ron was an excellent teacher—an excellent religion teacher and for Ron that specification was crucial. Ron looked upon his work in the classroom as a way of witnessing to the Kingdom of God. Teaching, for Ron, was a ministry and those of us in his class sensed this. His commitment and dedication have left a lasting impression on the countless CBA students he touched during the many years he taught in this very building.

What greater gift can a teacher give his or her students than a love of the subject being taught? I most especially thank Ron for that gift which he gave me. Above all else though, Ron wanted to impart to his students a lasting sense of the relevance of Christianity for our lives. Christianity, Ron insisted, was not simply a set of doctrines or debates carried on by a privileged few. The gospel message was much more than that. It reached down into the very depths of each believer and proclaimed loudly and boldly that "Christ is risen!" It involved not merely the mind, but the heart as well. Christianity, for Ron, was a source of joy and hope. It announced to the world that God's love conquers all adversity.

Ron took seriously the belief










that God's Spirit is a lifegiving Spirit. It is this Spirit at work in the heights and depths of our lives which provided Ron with hope during his long struggle with cancer. It was that Spirit which made him an energetic and animated teacher. Ron loved teaching and we as his students saw before our eyes a man filled with abundant life and enthusiasm. He challenged his students to see clearly the truth which he himself embodied; namely, that the spirit gives love. Ron's persistent optimism was grounded in the belief that our God is a loving God whose concern is the wellbeing of all His creation. With that assurance, Ron challenged us to see the world as a place filled with opportunities to imitate God's universal love and concern. Ron emphasized that Christianity not put into practice is no Christianity at all. As a student of Ron's one could not help but see a man aware of both the demands of Christianity and the hope of Christianity.

Ron lived what he taught. His teaching and his life both gave testimony to his faithful commitment to our loving God: a God who raised His son and showed the world that suffering, pain, injustice, and even death do not have the final word. Through his life and teaching, Ron proclaimed the message of Christianity: love will conquer hatred, trust will conquer fear, hope will conquer despair, and eternal life will conquer death. To that, with Ron, we say "Amen."


