Brother Patrick Higgins, F.S.C.

The twenty-seventh graduating class of Christian Brothers Academy is both honored and proud to dedicate the 1989 Pegasus to Brother Patrick Higgins, F.S.C.

Brother Pat received the LaSallian habit in 1945 and professed his first vows a year later. He has earned his M.A. in both history and theology and has an extensive background in teaching. Brother Patrick began his career in various elementary schools in the New York district before moving on to the LaSalle Academy in New York City and later De LaSalle Collegiate in Detroit. Before joining us here in September of 1977, he taught at C.B.A., Albany.

Brother Pat currently teaches biology while moderating the Christ-

mas, Organic Gardening, Camera, and Rocketry Clubs. He is also responsible for landscaping the property and maintaining the biology lab.

Brother Patrick typifies the dedication of the Christian Brothers. Perhaps the most striking aspect of his service is his deep involvement in the C.B.A. community outside of the classroom. His love for all he does is evident in the beautiful displays of the Christmas Club and gardens. A large part of his effectiveness, both in and out of the classroom, can be attributed to the contagiousness of his energy which has endeared him to students and faculty alike.

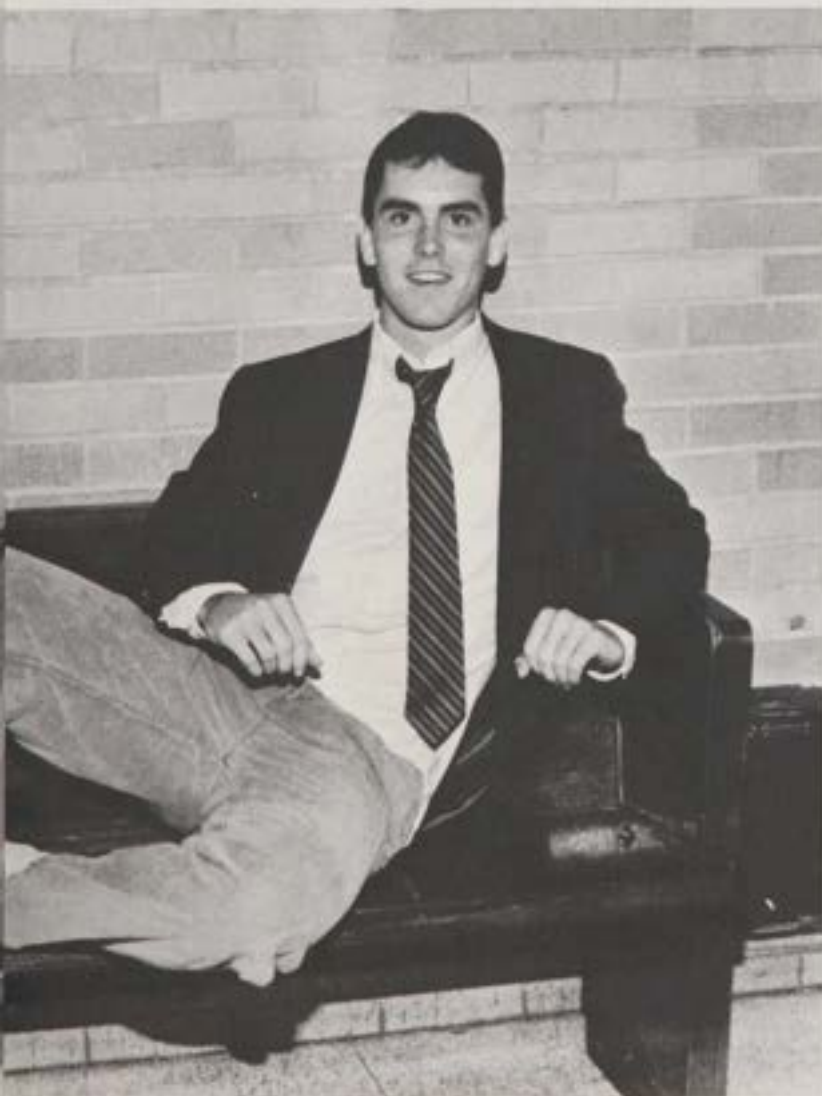

Once again, the Christian Brothers Academy Cross Country Team led by a fine group of seniors was very successful. The team, coached by Tom Heath, was undefeated in dual meets (7-0), stretching its dual meet winning streak to 153. Invitationally, the Colts won major meets on both coasts of the United States. They won their division of the Manhattan College Invitational at Van Corland Park in New York City and traveled to Walnut, California to win the prestigious Mt. Sac Invitational beating some of the best teams in California. In addition to these two victories, the Colts by winning the New Jersey Catholic Track Conference Championships set a state record for most consecutive invitational wins (26). 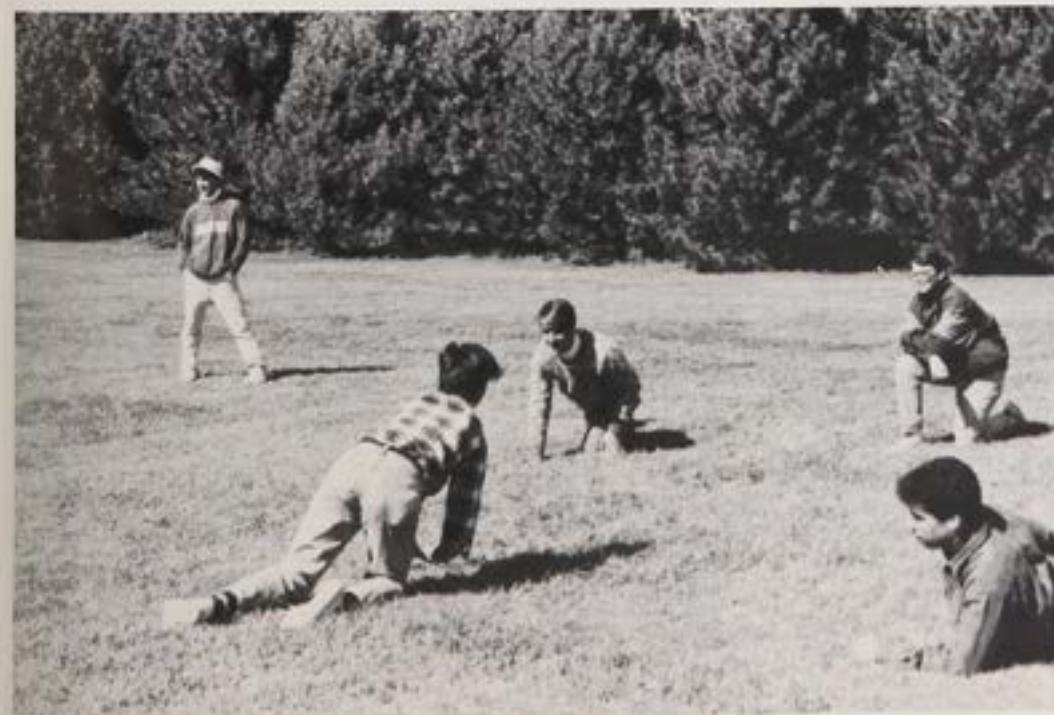

Retreats

The Retreat Program at CBA is an integral part of the religious and personal development of the individual student. The freshmen are introduced to the program on a welcoming retreat scheduled for the first full week of school. 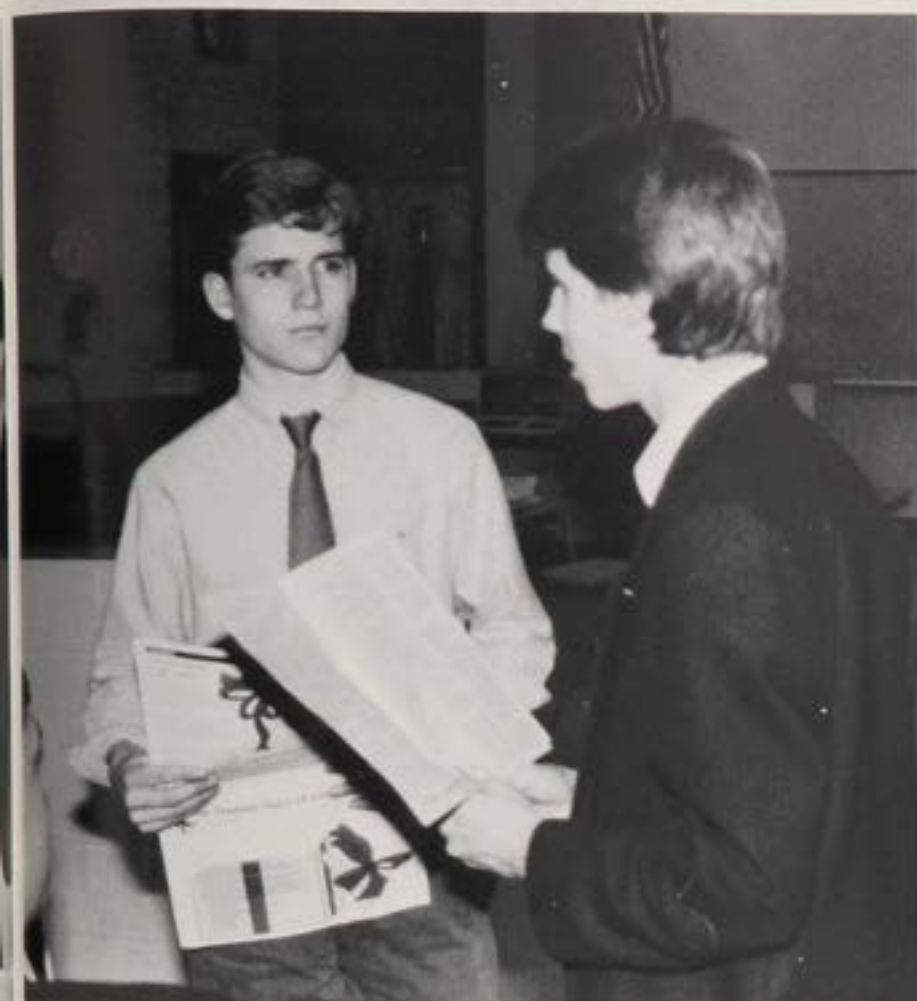

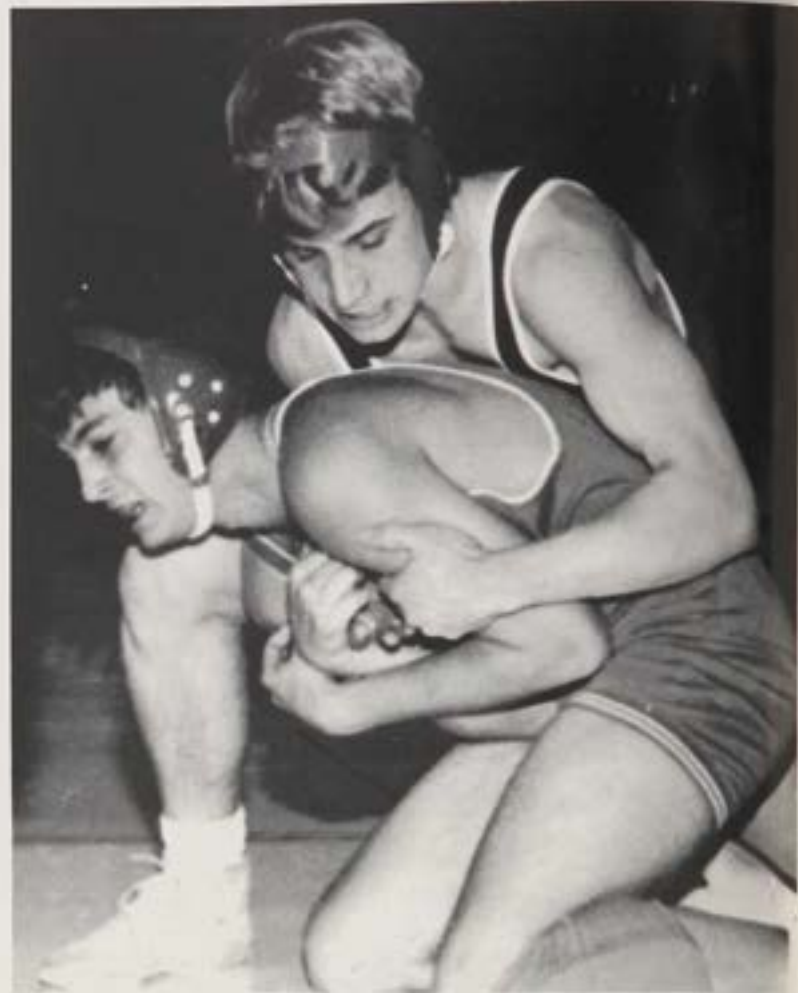

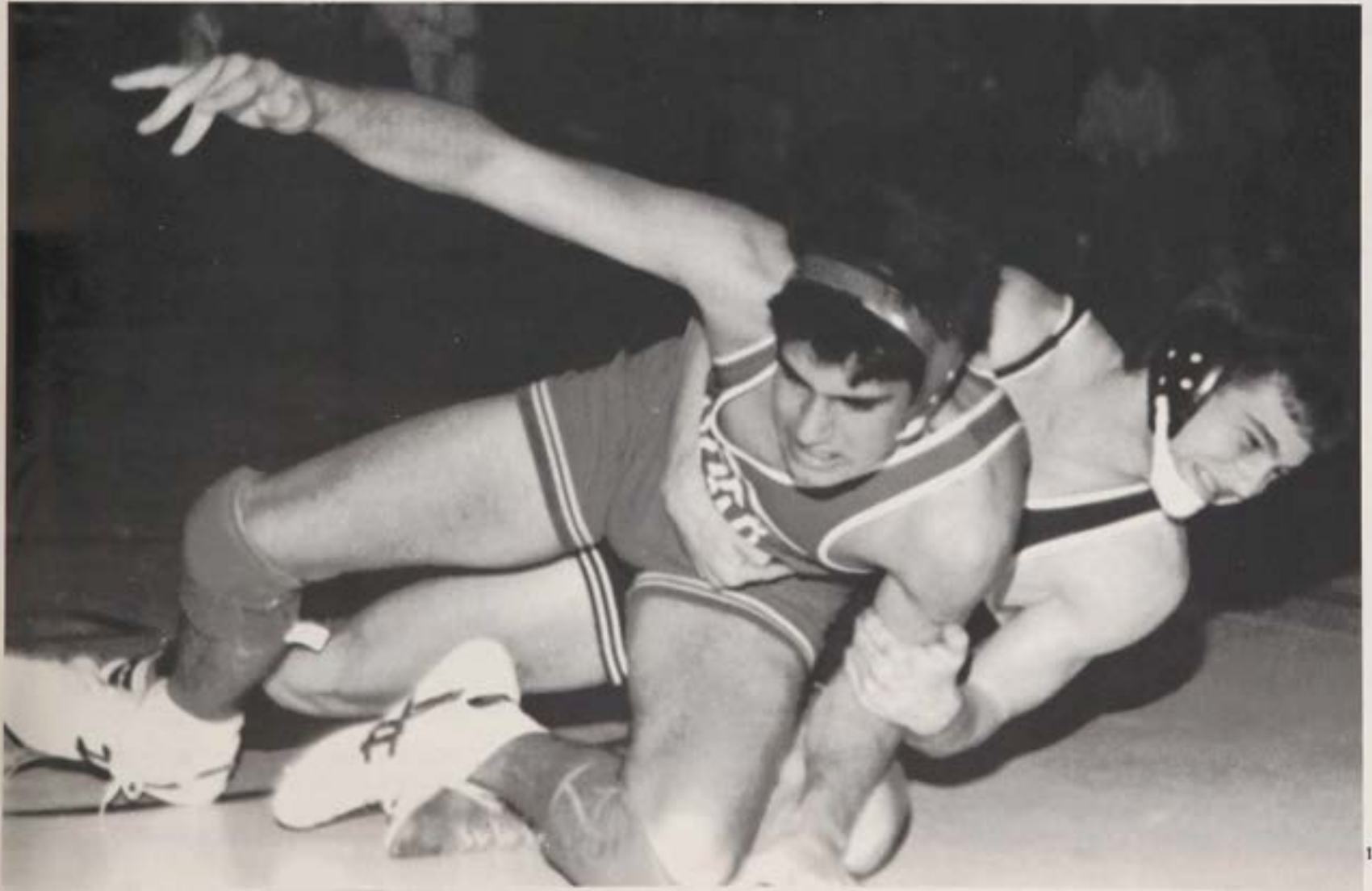
