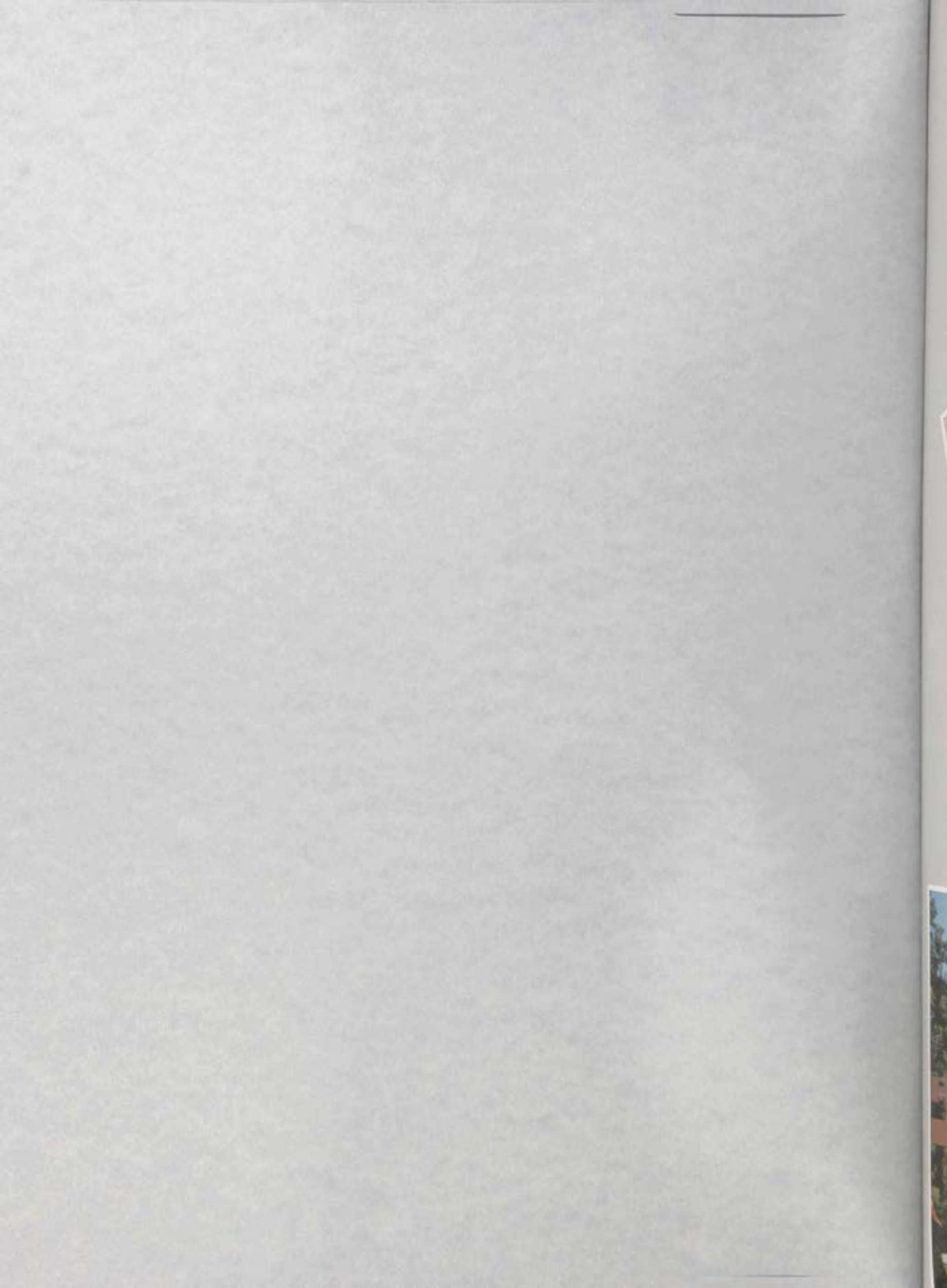
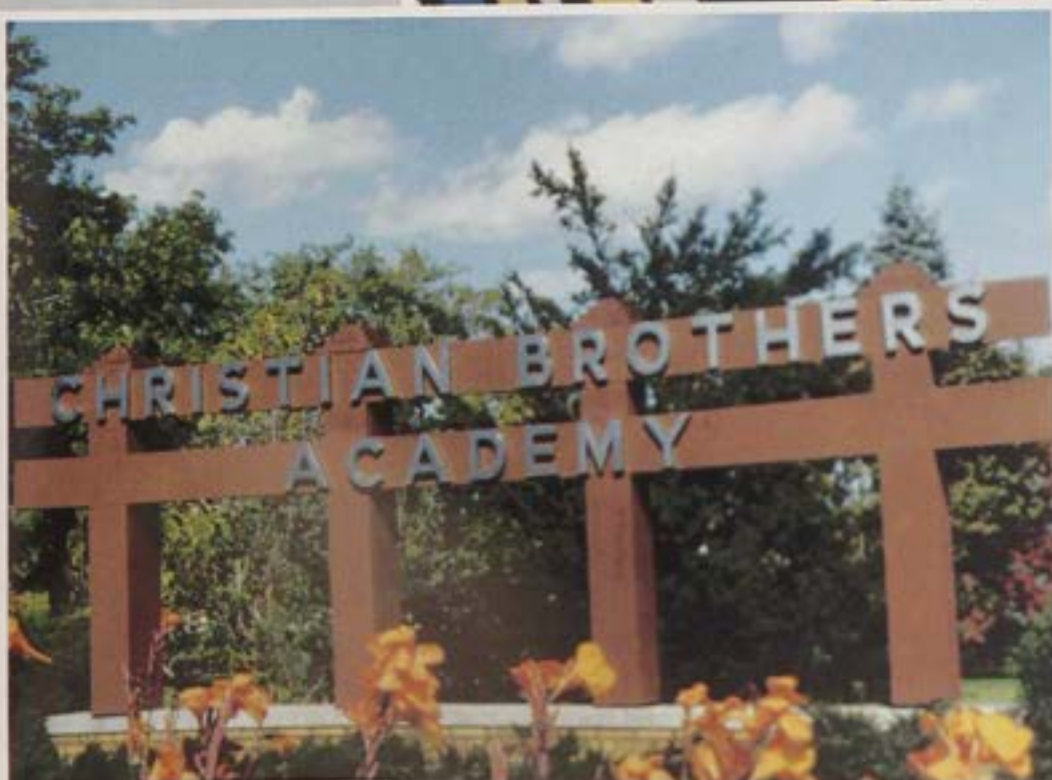

e, the graduating class of 1990, are both pleased and honored to dedicate the 1990 Pegasus to Brother Gregory O'Rourke F. S. C. on the 50th anniversary of his entering the brotherhood.

Brother Greg was born on October 16, 1922 in New York. He attended Power Memorial High School in 1936 and then moved on to St. Joseph's NI where he studied from 1936 to 1939.

Brother Greg received the habit of the Christian Brothers on September 7, 1939 and made his first vows in 1940. He attended Catholic University from 1940 to 1944 and while there obtained a Bachelor of Arts Degree. He followed this up with a Masters Degree in History from Manhattan College in 1950 and a Ph. D. in History from St. John's University in 1959.

Brother Greg began his teaching career in 1944 at St. Cecilia's School in Brooklyn as a junior high teacher. Since that time he has taught at various grade levels in both grammar and high schools. For a time, he was also a teacher at Christian Brothers College in Memphis, Tennessee.

In 1979, Brother Greg began teaching at CBA. He left for a position at Manhattan College in 1981, but returned in 1983. In his years here at the Academy, Brother Greg has served as the Advanced Placement Director, the moderator of the Fathers' Club and a teacher of various levels of American and European history.

But these mere facts don't tell enough about Brother Greg. Behind all of his degrees lies a man who truly loves both teaching and history. He has combined these two loves into a lifelong profession. Through his innovative teaching methods he has been able to reach many students. Many of us enter his class expecting to memorize a few dates and be done with it, but Brother will not allow that. He wants us all to gain a respect for history and its contemporary values. As a result of his class, we no longer view history a dead subject, but rather something alive and vital to our lives. For this we wish to thank him.

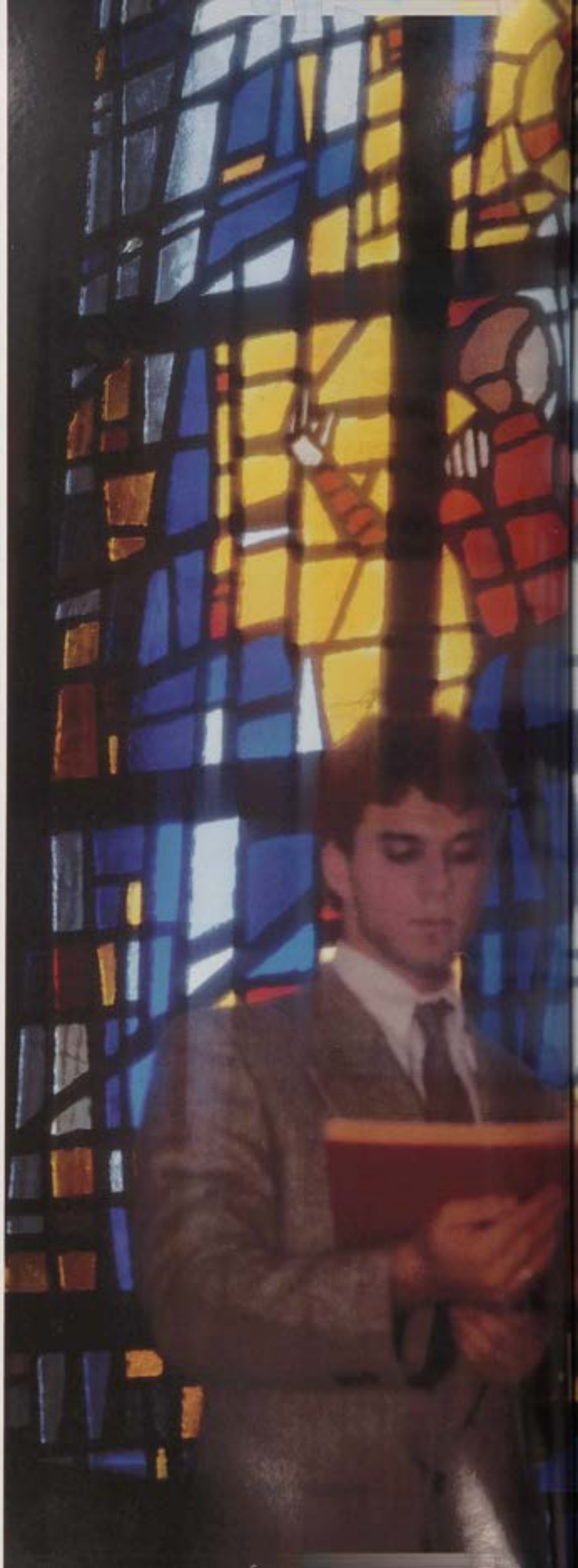
Much Is Expected

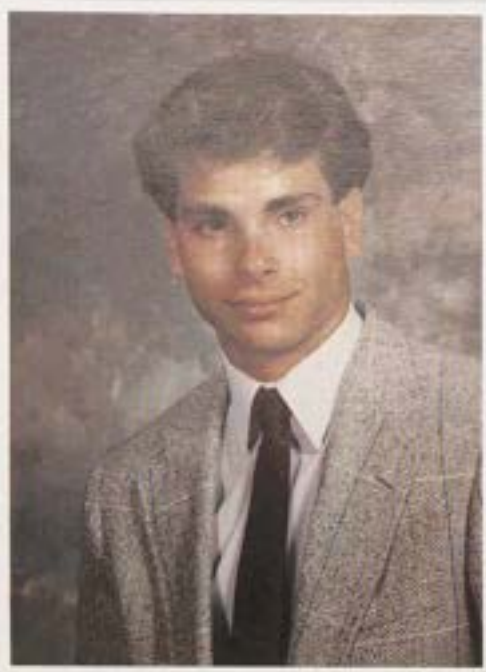


To Whom Much Is Given . . .

The dedication of these, and many other wrestlers, resulted in many close scores in both individual and team competitions. Overall, the Colts fared quite well this season in their battles with their opponents.

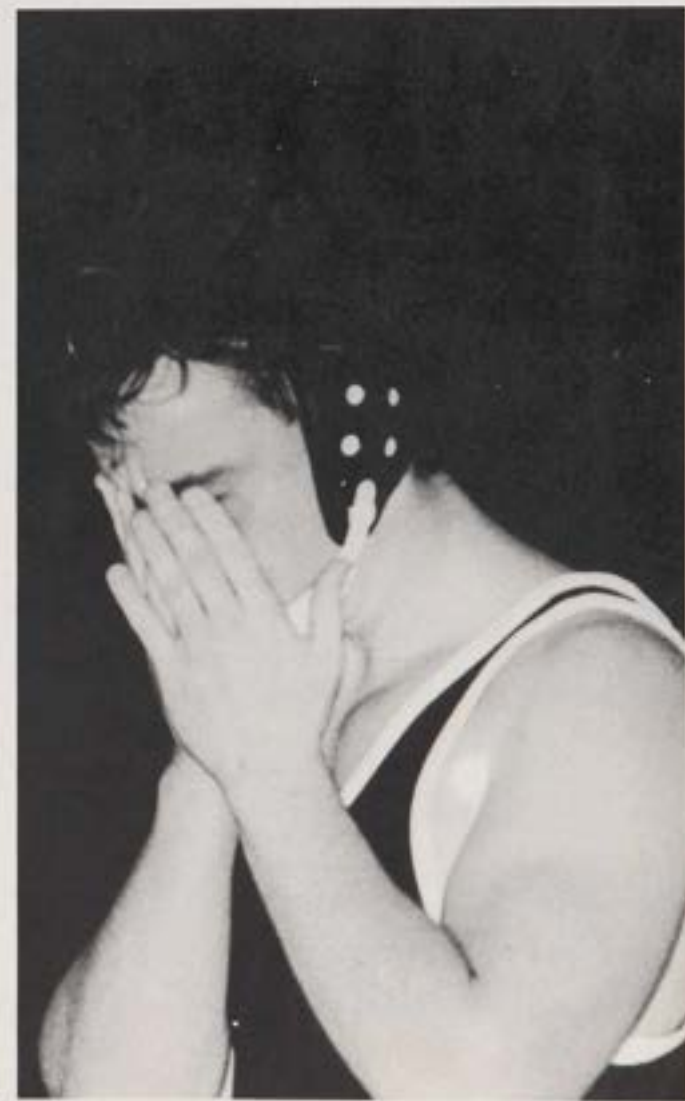

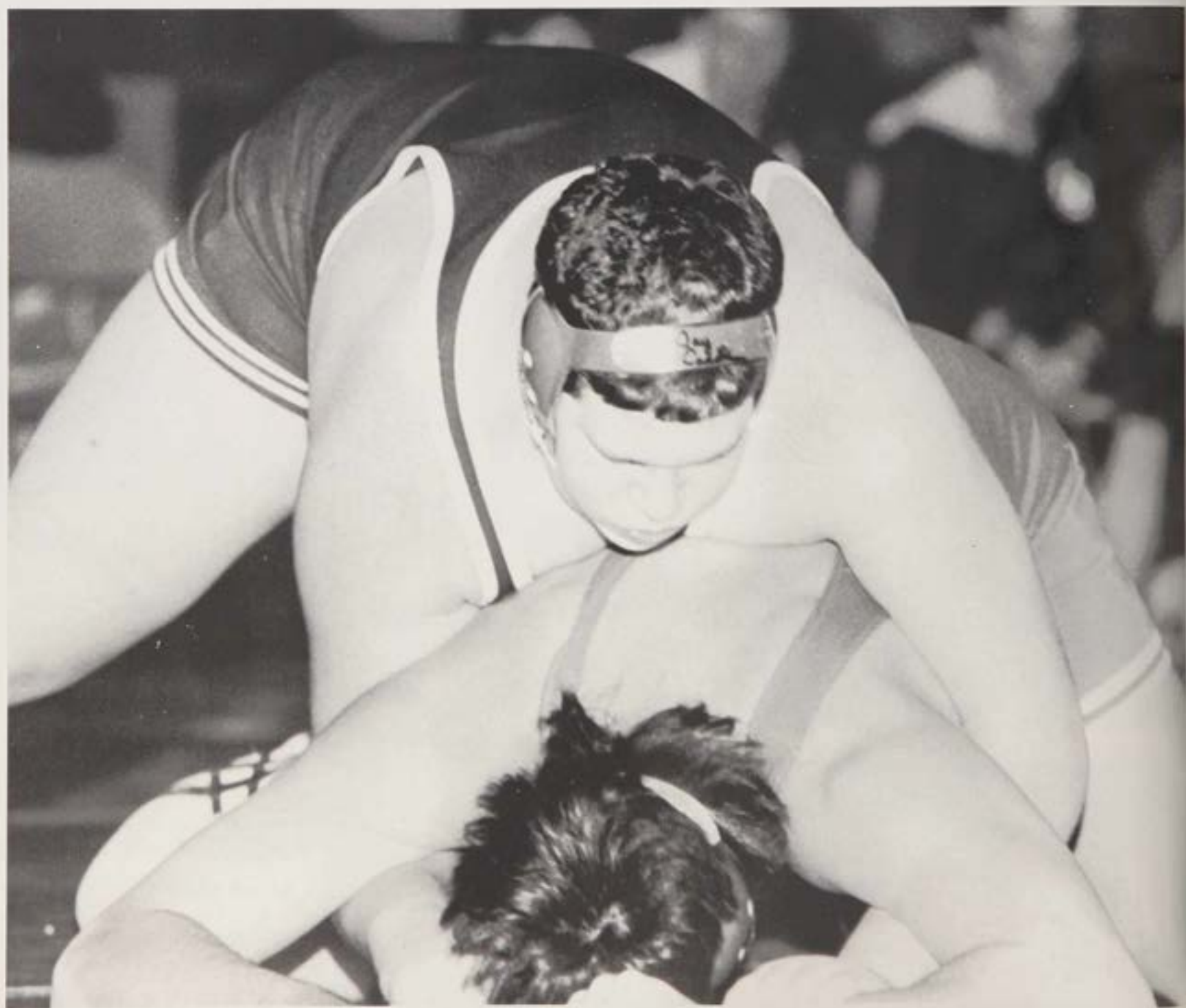
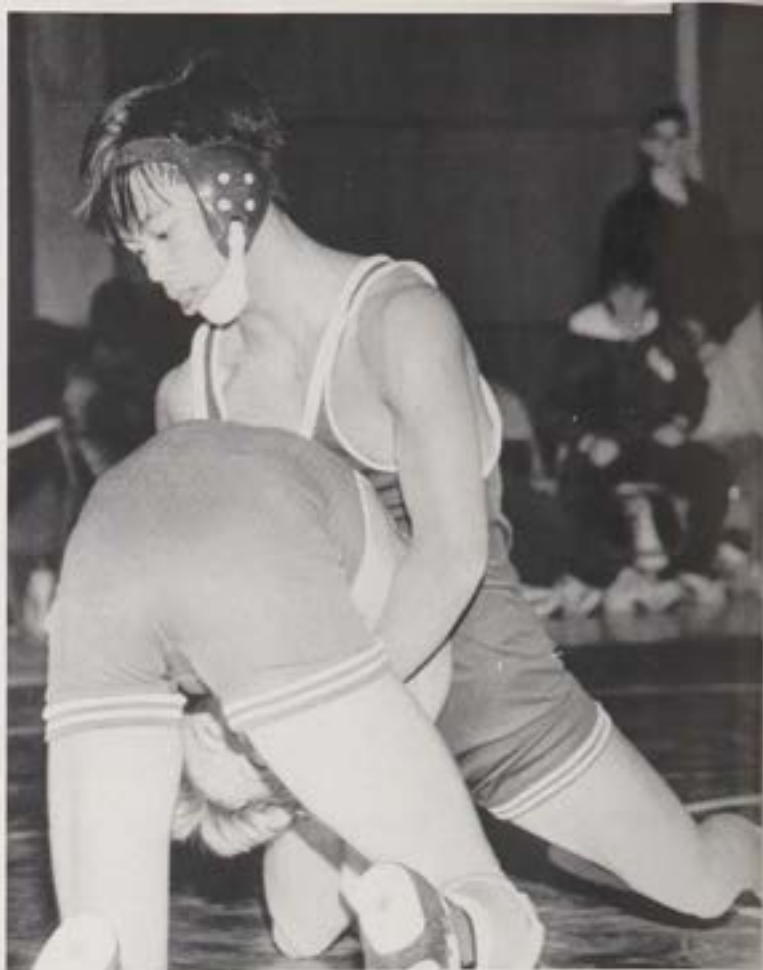

Coach Kenney also feels that junior Devin Sullivan may make an immediate impact upon the team.

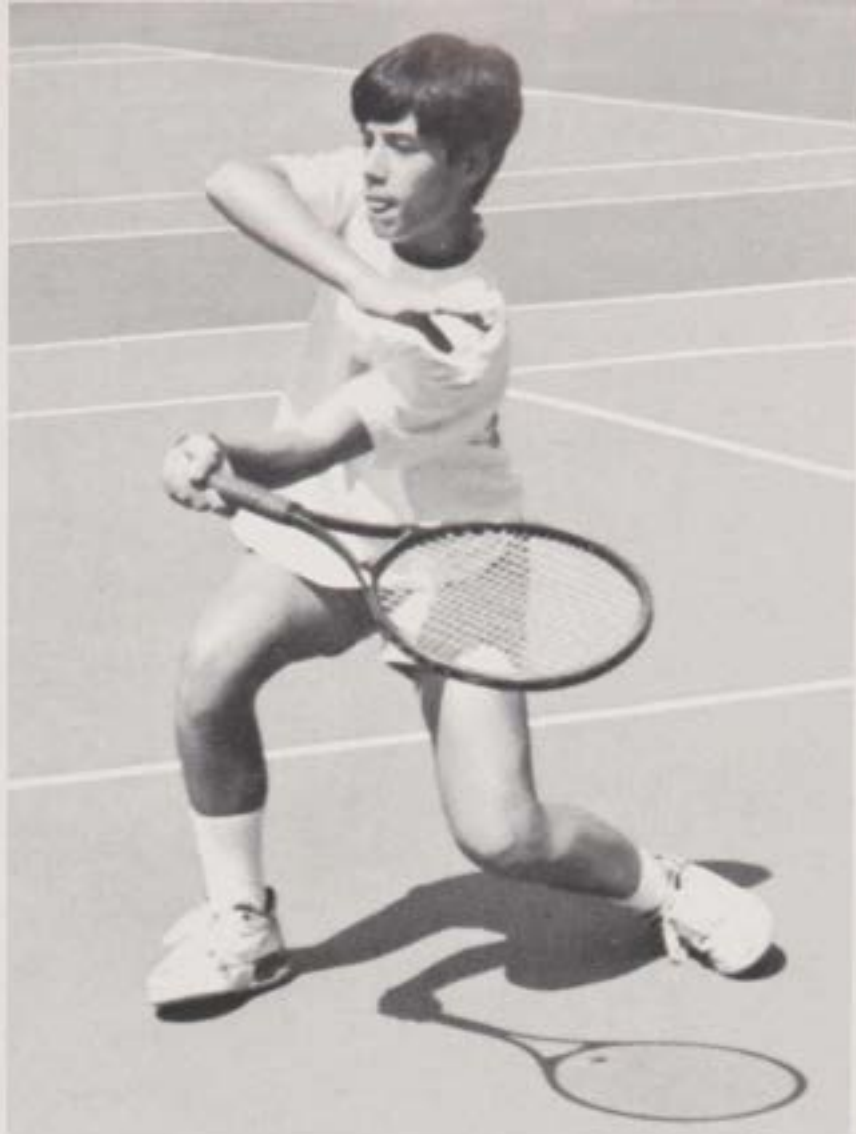
Tennis

After years of studying the theories, doctrines, and beliefs of the faith, we are challenged to act on those beliefs by offering service to our communities. Christian Service-Learning is in its eighth year at CBA. In addition to regular classes, seniors commit themselves to weekly after-school volunteer service throughout the scholastic year. During class, we process our weekly experiences through reflective exercises, journaling, and shared discussions. We study the scriptural and theological foundations for community involvement as we learn to "Think globally and act locally".

Over the past year, members of the three Christian Service-Learning classes have logged over 2600 hours of community service in their various jobs. These jobs include working in hospitals and nursing homes, teaching CCD classes, and aiding children through latch-key and other recreational programs.

When one looks back to freshman year at CBA, the GURU program inevitably becomes a part of the memory. Based on the principles of Peer Ministry, the twenty-three seniors who serve in this role are asked to serve as positive role models for freshmen to assist them in becoming the best possible persons they can be. After twelve years as an integral part of the Religious Studies curriculum, the program itself continues to experience growth. In this, his third full year with the program, Mr. Koch called upon the vast experiences of CBA alumnus Fr. Joseph Farrell to assist in preparation and processing of GURU experience with the seniors.

The program with the freshmen has several aspects. Initially, the GURU experience aids them in the socialization skills necessary for a successful CBA career. The program then systematically moves towards issues involving self-esteem, forming positive peer relationships, probing ethical/moral questions, and investigating religious values, beliefs, and experiences. The freshmen meet in small groups with their GURU once every six days for the entire year. Hopefully the values and insights which they gain there will serve to make them the best persons they can be, and certainly, three years hence, twenty-three of those former freshmen will themselves assume the task of GURU for another generation of CBA freshmen.

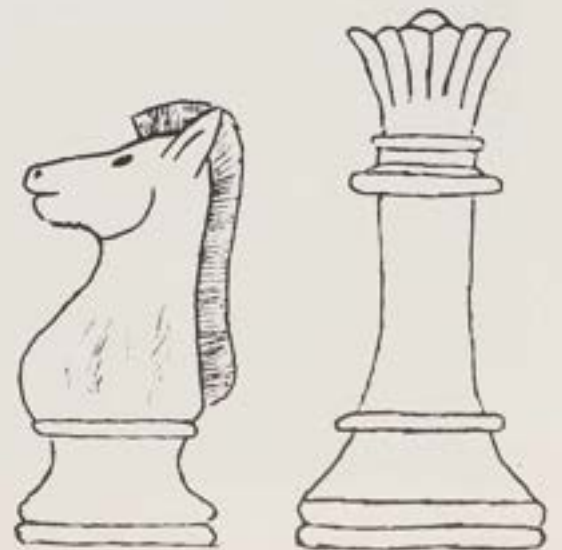

Non-existent 15 years ago, there is now a great environmental awakening among high school students. There is evidence of this on the Christian Brothers campus: The Wilderness Club. If you ask the students of this club why they belong, the answers are varied.

The common thread is a concern for nature. These students show a genuine desire to become active in learning about the environment. Besides being fun, the club responds to specific student needs and interests. Some say it provides an alternative to television. Some students feel they are called to learn and to become closer to the natural environment.

The exponential growth of club enrollment bears this out: over 160 students joined up in the school year 1989-1990. Now members go on trips and have the opportunity to attend many weekly meetings.

The Wilderness Club at CBA is an informal study group that meets in a variety of ways and times to answer the "call of the wild." The club begins each day at 7:40 a.m. in homeroom 5 and the Wilderness Club library. Students belonging to the club assemble there each morning to read and talk. A lot of conversation centers around their experiences from previous days' outings.

During the school day, Mr. Steve Smith or Mr. Jon Young moderate a student organized-meeting and conduct on-campus excursions. Different students are able to participate each day, but not all of the 164 students on the club roster can meet due to unavoidable schedule conflicts. Finally, there are many after-school meetings which administrate the club's organization.



Social Awareness

The Social Awareness Council is a student organization dedicated to the raising of awareness in the student body and the integration of spirituality and human responsibility into our lives. Such projects as fasting for Oxfam America, a coffee house, and letter writing campaigns have been on the Council's calendar. A major part of the Council's activities is the "Awareness Series", a series of guest speakers. Among the topics covered by special guests have been "Racism in American Culture", Missionary experiences in Guatemala and El Salvador, and "Why Social Awareness". The Council looks forward to continued support as it enters its third year.

We owe a special debt of gratitude to Dave Schofield. Representing Delmar Publishing Co., Dave went out of his way to assist us in design and photography.


