
he Class of 1991 proudly dedicates this edition of Pegasus to two teachers who have each provided over a quarter century to education at Christian Brothers Academy: Mr. Anthony J. Chesney and Mr. Vincent Cox.

To faculty and student alike, Mr. Chesney and Mr. Cox serve as the "living memory of C.B.A." They have seen each graduating class and their collective memory serves to keep alive the spirit and legends of the Academy. Their influence has spanned through two generations, as the sons of many alumni are now at C.B.A., and a number of their former students have returned to share in the task of educating the young men of the Academy. Together their almost sixty years of service have enlightened and inspired the five-thousand-plus alumni of Christian Brothers Academy.

This is Mr. Chesney's thirtieth year at the Academy. During this time he has taught everything from business management, to practical economics, accounting, health, physical education and even earth science. He initiated the wrestling program, and worked for many years as baseball coach. 
continuous up-beat and positive flair for the C.B.A. community. He and his wife Barbara have three children, and his son Kevin is a member of the Class of 1985.

A year after Mr. Chesney arrived at C.B.A., he was joined by Mr. Cox. Coming from Archbishop Molloy High School in Queens, NY, Mr. Cox was hired to teach history and to coach basketball. During the twenty-nine years he has been at C.B.A., Mr. Cox has taught history on all four grade levels, as well as an elective in practical economics. 
We did not travel this path alone. We had companions to share our hardships and joys




encountered on the journey. Now as we go our separate ways, we must see how all these relationships, all these experiences, are unique because of this common choice of CBA.





Chess Team





It was a year of highs and lows that ended with a high note for Coach Tom Heath's Harriers. The Colts cruised through its dual meets, extending their streak to 167 straight wins. (Last defeat was in 1973!) C.B.A. also placed first in its first four invitationals, beating the #1 in the state Paul VI at the Shore Coaches Invitational. The Colts' first loss came to archrival Paul VI at the Eastern States Championship at Van Cortlandt Park in New York. That didn't stop C.B.A. at the shore, however, where they won the Monmouth County Championships, and their ninth straight Shore Conference title. The Colts' race at the New Jersey Catholic Track Conference was their 11th win in the last 12 years with the fourth fastest team average in state history at the invitational.

The Colts seemed to be ready to add a Parochial "A" title to their collection, but were defeated for the third straight year by Paul VI once again. This devastating loss made Paul VI the big favorite to repeat at the All-Group State Championship, but after the gun fired and the smoke cleared, Heath's Harriers won a record fifth All-Group State title. C.B.A. became the first team in state history to lose in the states, but win the All-Groups. After it was all said and done, Christian Brothers Academy ended up the season as the best cross country team in New Jersey.










Wrestling


Bowling



Then took the other, as just as fair, And having perhaps the better claim,


Because it was grassy and wanted wear:

I doubted if I should ever come back.


