




Ann and her husband Charlie, a long time active member of the Father's Club, have two children, Mary Anne and Charles, along with four grandchildren.






Christian Service





Religious Activities



The dedication of the wrestlers and coaches will lead to the team's success. The addition of Coach Alger will lead C.B.A wrestling to the top of the sport.




Tennis


