During many years spent in the Brothers High Schools, I've taught a gamut of subjects from Religion, English, Health, Physics, Chemistry, and all the Maths to my current Algebra I and Calculus courses.

The students at CBA are a breed apart. Since I've been here they have shown themselves to be highly motivated, very intelligent and enthusiastic students. They have developed a spirituality in Christianity that's rather unique among high school students. It's here that I've found an attitude and approach to life that exemplifies the Christian ideals.

In Memoriam . . .

Brother Camillus Hayes, F.S.C. 1910-1992

The philosophy of our school is based upon the LaSallian spirit and the cornerstone of our curriculum is steeped in Christian value. Brother Camillus Hayes lived his life as close to those ideals as anyone could have. Not only is this page dedicated to him because of "who he was", but his life's work will remain forever part of the foundation upon which this school stands.

Brother Camillus entered the Novitiate in 1924 and began his active teaching career in 1929 with a fourth grade class at the N.Y. Catholic Protectory. He arrived in Lincroft in 1963 where he served the C.B.A. community for the remainder of his apostolate. For almost 30 years he worked in the guidance office updating student records and preparing the many college applications sent out each year.

Brother Cam's early career was entirely connected with music. The choirs he directed at Good Shepherd and St. Mary's performed at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City and were heard on radios and seen on television on numerous occasions. Brother Camillus was himself, so talented that many of the pieces he composed were published and are currently a part of collections of liturgical music. His accomplishments during 68 years of achievement are impressive enough, but seem pale when compared to the man himself. All who came to know him were captivated by the simplest of all his talents-his smile.

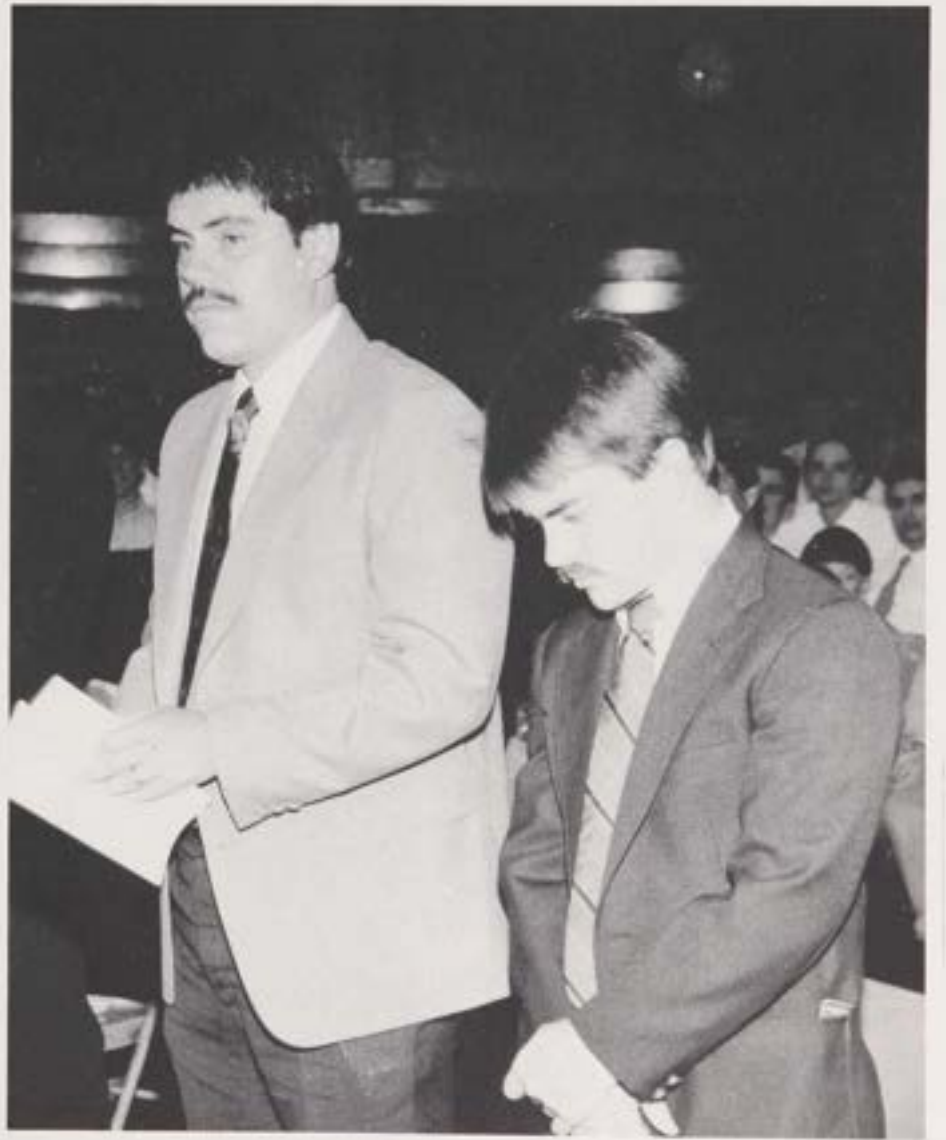

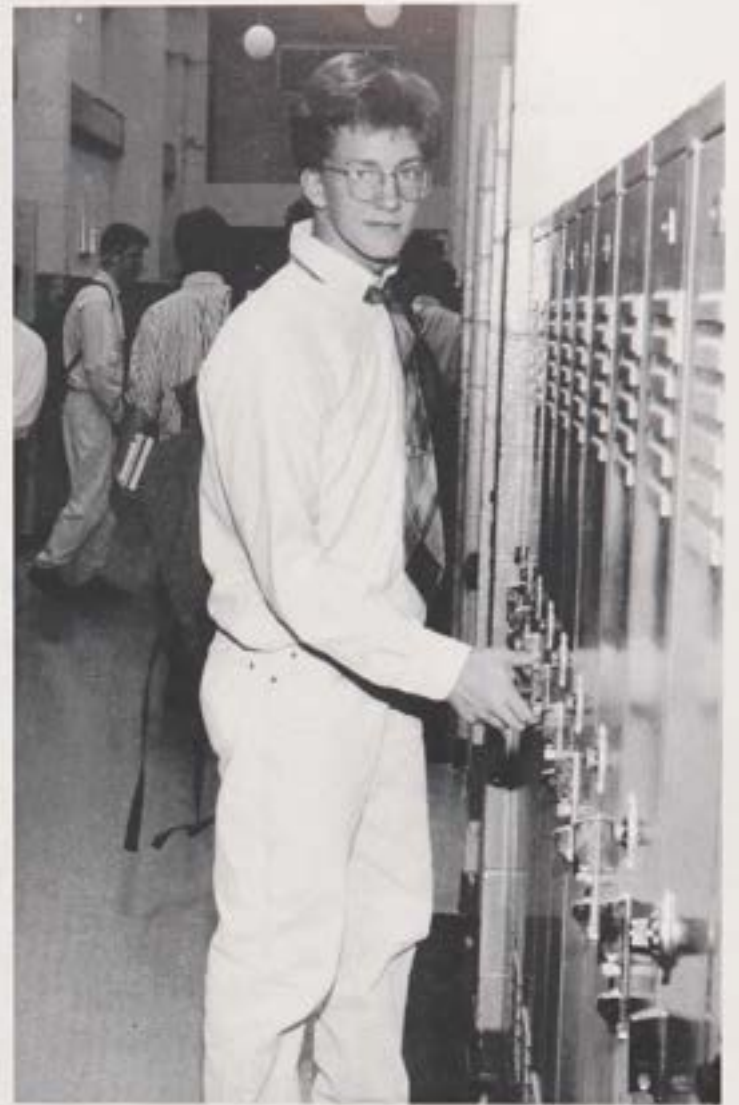

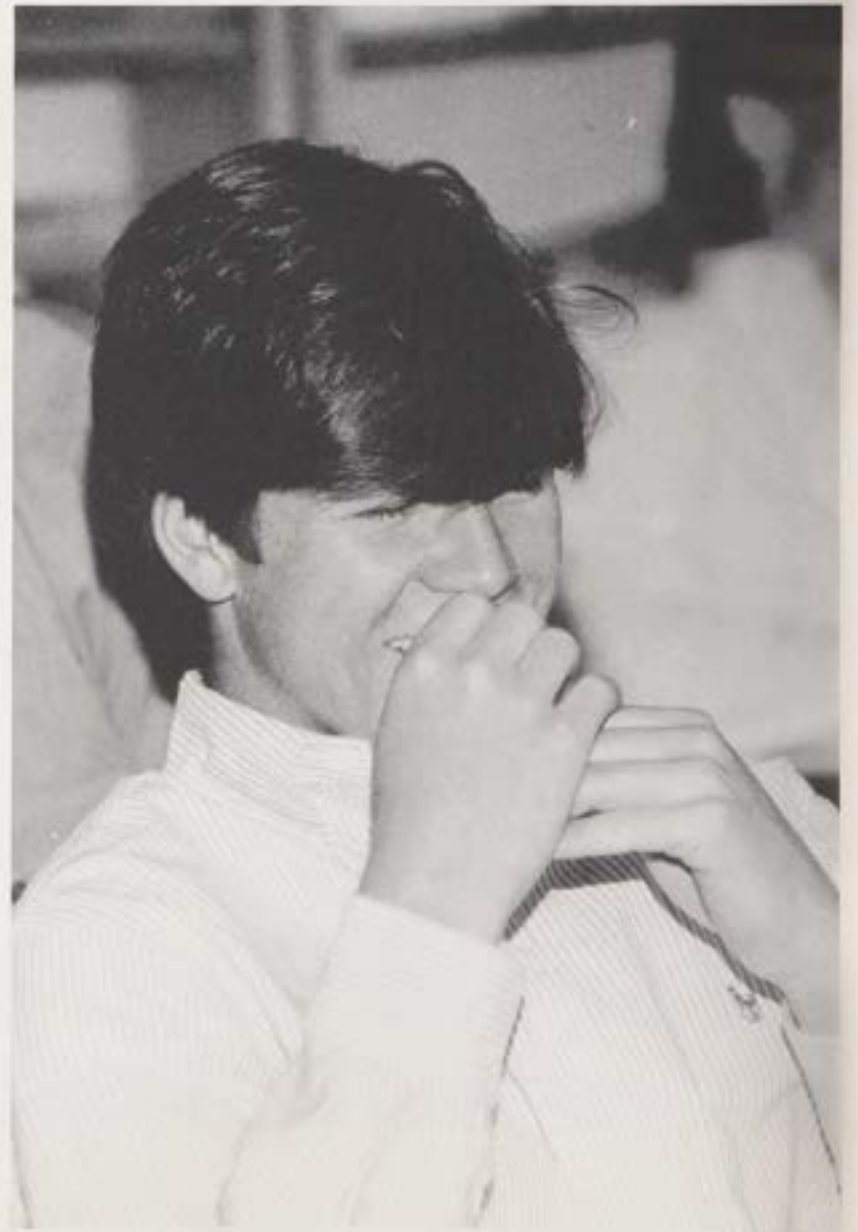

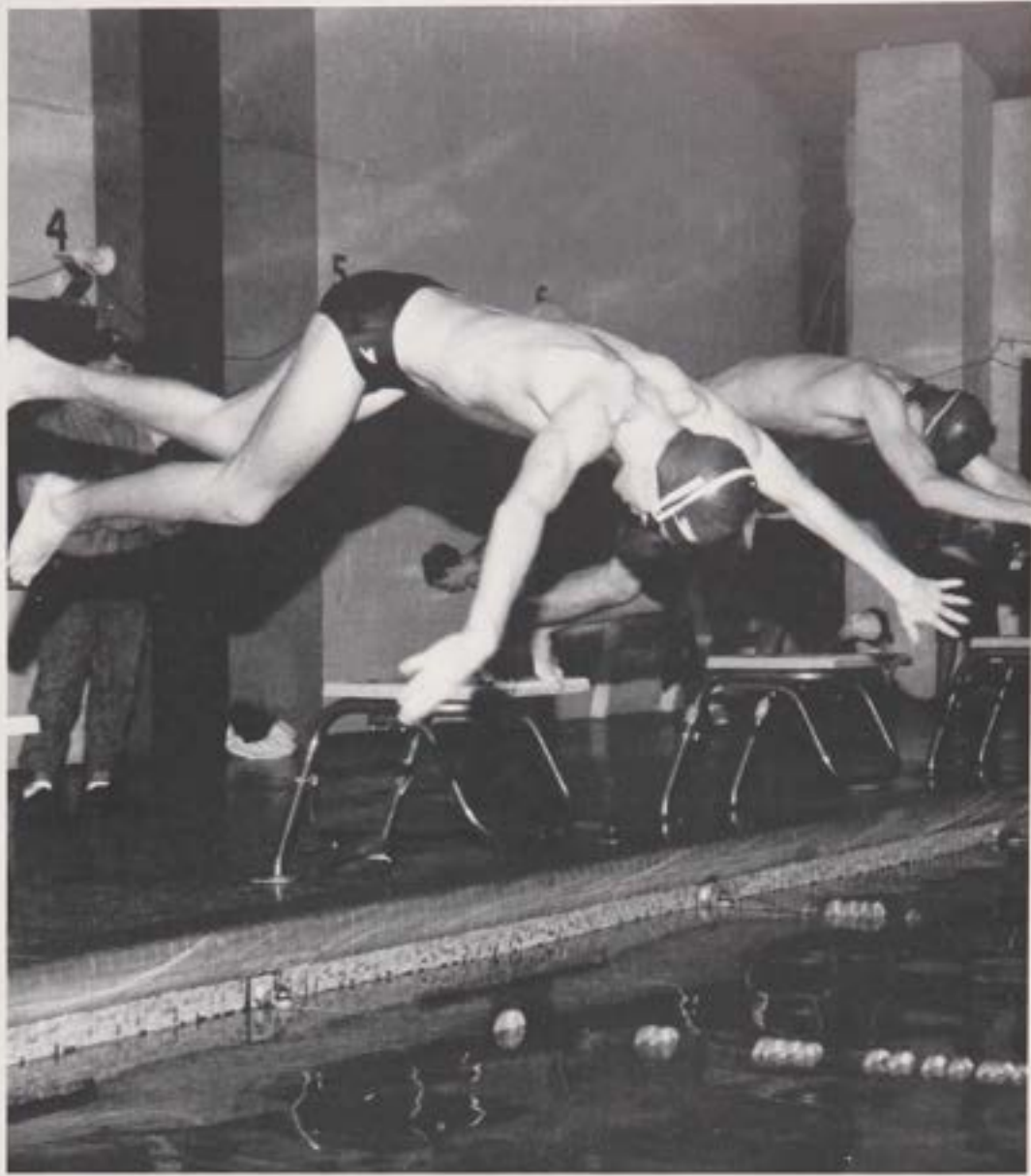

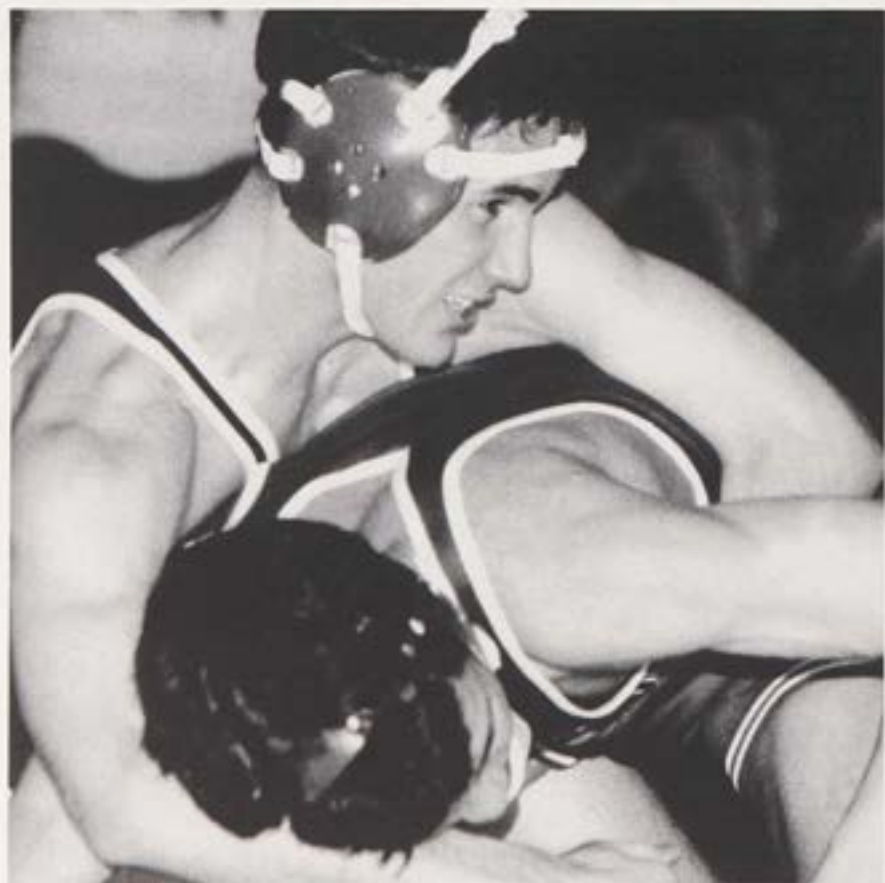

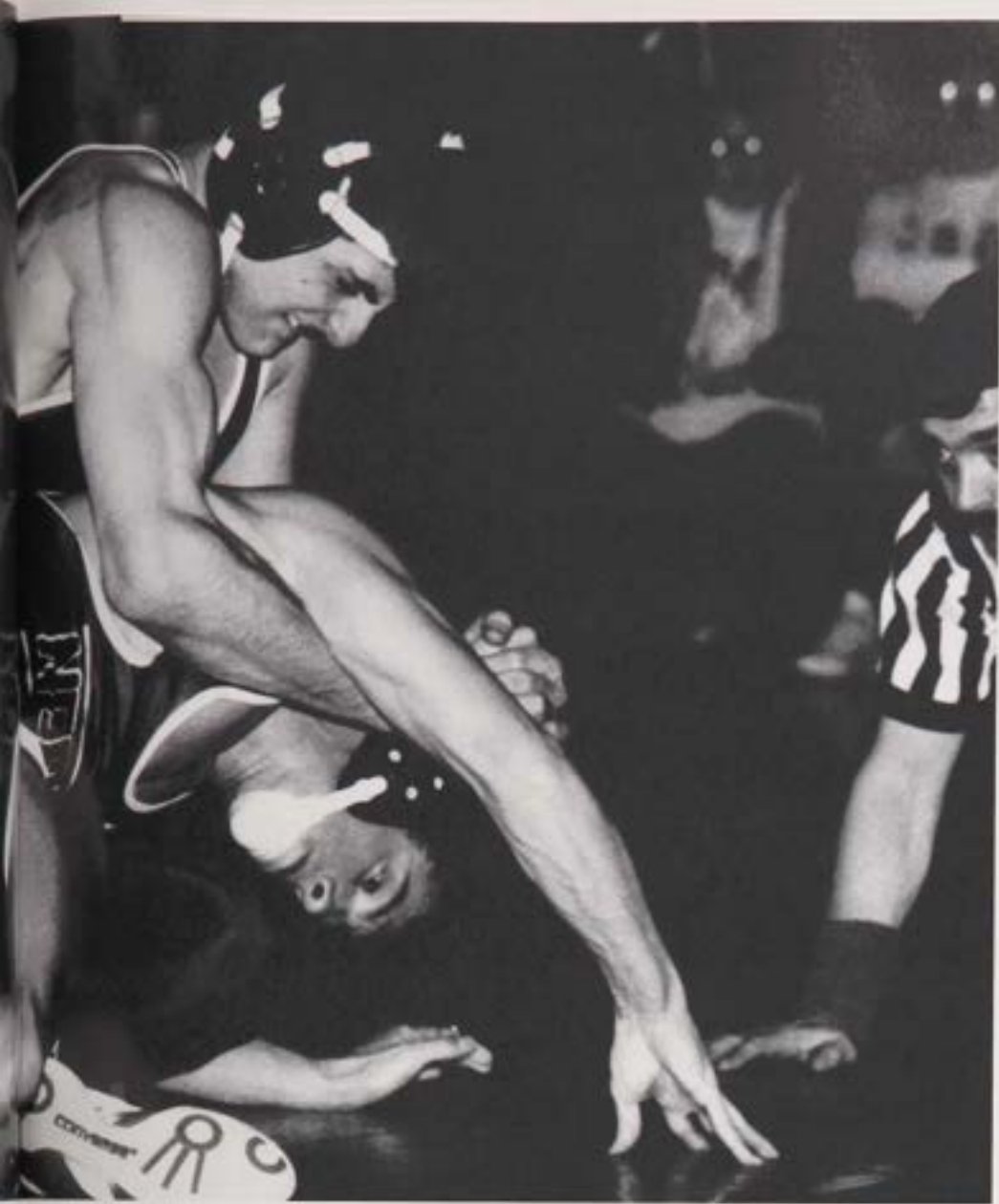
