
Guru Peer Ministry





Christian Service-Learning


The main focus in the Christian Service-Learning course is volunteer work. This class recognizes the importance of assisting the community. Each student is required to spend at least two hours each week volunteering their time and effort by working in hospitals, working at latchkey, tutoring homeless children, teaching CCD classes, building homes, and teaching young children how to swim. Along with his service work, a student is expected to write about his experiences in a journal. This helps the student develop an understanding of his relationship with God and with others. In the third marking period, students give a presentation about their service work to the class. The best reports are then given to underclassmen to teach them the importance of volunteer work.





In Recognition of 30 Years of Service at CBA

In his usual quiet, unassuming, and almost carefree way, Mr. John O'Shea marks his thirtieth year as a member of the faculty of Christian Brothers Academy. Those thirty years comprise virtually the entire history of CBA, and in so many ways Mr. O'Shea has been an integral part of the growth in reputation and status of the Academy.

A graduate of the College of Holy Cross, Mr. O'Shea began his CBA career as a Language Arts and French teacher. He also taught Latin for many years, before finally settling in the mathematics department in the early 1980's. For a long time he taught Algebra I, and only recently has returned to including Geometry and Algebra II in his schedule. He also enjoyed a brief return to the classical language several years ago.

Mr. O'Shea made his mark in the sports pages as the successful coach of the varsity tennis team. Under his tutelage CBA won 242 matches, and 6 parochial "A" state titles and 2 over-all state titles. His methodical and patient instruction brought CBA to dominance in the state of New Jersey. Students at the Navesink Country Club continue to benefit from his tennis expertise, as he directs their tennis school. Mr. O'Shea and his wife Patricia, are the parents of three daughters, each of whom made their marks in the academic and athletic worlds of Rumson-Fair Haven Regional High School, as well as their respective colleges. He is now seen sporting a Villanova Wildcats hat, as his youngest daughter is a first year student there, and a member of their tennis team. Besides playing and teaching tennis, Mr. O'Shea enjoys casting a line and pulling in blues, as well as frequent trips to Florida, and watching as many Villanova games as possible.

His patience in teaching, pleasant demeanor, and respect for his students, are those qualities which are witnessed through longevity as a member of the CBA community. We congratulate him on his milestone, and hope for his continued health, success, and positive presence, as a member of the faculty.

In Recognition of 50 Years as a Christian Brother and Distinguished LaSallian Educator

After a ten year hiatus, Brother C. Thomas Wilkinson returned to the Christian Brothers Academy community in 1988, and immediately assumed a strong leadership role in the Guidance Office. His seemingly tireless dedication to the students with whom he works has gained quick notoriety within the community. Brother can be seen each morning scouring the hallways making sure his students have completed their forms or have submitted their applications to college. He sets strict deadlines and insists that the students keep to a schedule and procedures that provides them with the best advantage throughout the college application process. His vast experience and concern for each student works to their advantage as they make those decisions which will affect the future of their lives. Brother gives his time to each student and, as long as the student has his paperwork in order, Brother works with the lower ranked student with the same enthusiasm and concern as with the highest ranked student.

Brother has the deepest respect for the teachers of the school, and clearly respects the time and effort that each teacher spends on behalf of the students. He sends notes to the faculty thanking them for their time with the letters of recommendation, and he encourages the students to recognize their teachers as well. Similarly, Brother is quick with a word of encouragement, praise, condolence, congratulations, as the situation warrants. He shows a genuine interest in the lives and work of the faculty.

In 1992, Brother assumed the position of Director of Guidance. He meets weekly with the Academic Dean to discuss the progress of the students, and he is responsible for overseeing the work of the other members of the department, as well as establishing directives for the direction of the Guidance Office. Brother is widely respected for his professionalism and concern for the continual up-dating of the services. Likewise, he has developed a positive working relationship with the parents of the students, and works closely with them through the application process. For Brother Thomas, the LaSallian community clearly extends to the parents.



In Recognition of 50 Years as a Christian Brother

Brother Christian Jones, F.S.C. was taught by the Christian Brothers at Bishop Loughlin Memorial High School. Having been so impressed by the Brothers he wanted to become one himself. He also became a Christian Brother because he wanted to share his joy of academics with his students.

Brother Christian received his B.A. and M.A. from Manhattan College. His first teaching assignment was in 1947 at the Sacred Heart School in the Bronx, New York. At this school they didn't have professionals to teach track, so Brother Christian offered to help. During this experience he realized his love for track. While teaching in other assigned schools he became very interested in the Catholic High School Math League, of which he is now the President.

He came to Christian Brothers Academy in 1972. Brother Christian takes part in many aspects of C.B.A. life. Along with being a math teacher, he is also the Associate Principal for Scheduling and Programming. Before the advent of modern technology, Brother had to do all of CBA's scheduling by hand. He also is the founder and director of the CBA Eighth Grade Math Contest every year to interest prospective students in our school. Brother Christian is the coach of both the J.V. and Varsity Math Teams and plays an important role in running the Shore Math League. His teams are perennial powerhouse in the state. When Brother Christian is not concentrating on mathematics, he helps the track team with timing duel meets. After serving as a Chritian Brother for fifty years, Brother Christian has exemplified the discipline of a true LaSallian educator.


In Memoriam . .

Brother Leo Kirby, F.S.C.

Brother Leo Kirby served the Institute of the Christian Brothers of the Schools in many influencial leadership positions: Director of the Washington Scholasticate, Provincial-Visitor of the New York District, Assistant Superior General. In 1976 Leo returned to the United States and began his ministry at LaSalle School in Albany visiting the "forgotten alumni"- those in prison. Leo brought to these young men solace, comfort, hope, and mostly his heart and himself. When they returned home, he continued to stay in contact with them and offered them encouraging words as they transitioned to home and back to schools.

In 1988, the osteoporosis that had forced him into a wheelchair led him to De LaSalle Hall. Leo's faith and zeal wouldn't allow him to simply retire so he began a new ministry at CBA. Many of us can remember Leo zipping around the corridors in his motorized wheelchair offering a smile, simple conversation, a show of concern, a gift of candy. He taught the sophomore group guidance classes and worked with the lectors for both morning Mass and school liturgies. He resurrected the forensics program at CBA working with many students during their free periods in the theater lobby and helped in the work of the Pegasus Production Company. It took a stroke in the spring of 1992 to limit his presence at the Academy. Leo continued to strive to overcome his disabilities until his death last July.

Brother Leo lives on in the hearts of those he came in contact with for he truly lived the word of John Baptist de La Salle- "to touch the hearts of your students is the greatest miracle that you can perform and one that God expects of you."



Brother Charles O'Hanlon, F.S.C.

Brother Charles O'Hanlon joined the De La Salle Brothers of the Christian Schools in 1935. After a long career as teacher and principal, he came to CBA in 1973 to serve in the Finance Office.

Brother Charles worked closely with Mrs. Cokelet in organizing and executing the routine needs of the administration, faculty and staff. He made the daily run to the bank, handled the mail and managed the stationery supplies for the school and development office. While he never taught students at the Academy, Brother's most significant contributions have been in his relationship with the parents' associations. He was instrumental in the growth and development of the Fathers' Club. Brother was also called upon to apply his talents to organizing and coordinating the activities of the Century Club, a major fundraising activity at the Academy. In 1991 he was honored by the Century Club with the designation of the "Brother Charles O'Hanlon Circle" giving category.

During the past few years Brother Charles' health began to fail and after celebrating his seventy-fifth birthday he retired to De La Salle Hall. On July 4, Our Lord called him home.

Brother Charles will be remembered for the amiable way he conducted his daily routine. His quiet and friendly demeanor endeared him to many. In a reflection, Brother Anthony Lamb described his tenure as the principal of La Salle Academy as follows:

"He added to community life a graciousness and quiet sense of humor, an influence without pressure, a leadership without tension. Regardless of justified annoyances, harsh words never escaped from Charlie. A humorous needling, a gentle quip, sufficed to express concerns or expectations of others. In his six years at La Salle with us, he never abused his authority, never dominated others, but was able to motivate everyone in a friendly spirit of comaraderie."

The CBA cross country team ended its 1993 season as the eighth best team in the United States. The Academy harriers raced through the state of New Jersey as well as the Northeast undefeated. The Colts were the best team at every single meet in which they competed. This total perfection is only the third time in CBA's illustrious cross country history that it has happened. The '80 and '87 teams were the other perfect teams.

The cross country team entered the season ranked 16th in the country as well as #1 in New Jersey. From day one the Colt machine was unstoppable. At the first meet of the season, the Stewart Memorial, the Colts met the defending All-Group State Champions in Don Bosco. The harriers finished the day with 19 points and one of the most lopsided wins in the meet's long history.

The season had many highlights. The Colts traveled to legendary Van Cortland Park for both the Manhattan Invitational and the Eastern State Championships. They walked away winners at both, Senior Brian Zink was the individual champion at the Manhattan meet with Chris Chiaro in 2nd. Zink also led the Colts at the prestigious Easterns in 5th place. CBA is the most successful school in the history of the Eastern States Championships.

CBA won both the Monmouth County and

the Shore. Senior Chuck Grosso was the top finisher in the County Championships, placing second. In the NICTC Championships, CBA placed 1-2-3 and ran away with the trophy for the 14th year in a row. This race saw the emergence of future stars of CBA. Eric Savoth, Brian Cunniff, and Matt Coleman.

The state championships saw CBA trounce traditional arch-rival Paul VI of Haddonfield for its third straight title. Chris Bennett became the first CBA runner to win the Parochial A individual title. Brian Zink was just 1.7 seconds behind in second place. Bennett placed 8th, Chiaro 13th, Zink 15th, Savoth 28th, and Cunniff rounded out the scoring in 48th.

The post-season honors are starting to come out and CBA is cleaning up. Zink, Bennett, and Chiaro all made All Shore teams as well as All State teams. Grosso, Savoth, Cunniff and Matt Coleman also made All Shore teams. The '94 squad looks strong but will lose a



proud.









A Tribute



Dr. George Sheehan

1918-1993

Founding Father of C.B.A.

Sheehan remembered as visionary and achiever of dreams

Monmouth County and the rest of the world knew him as a successful cardiologist, charismatic lecturer, philosopher, journalist, author, athlete, and pioneering leader in the fitness movement. At Christian Brothers Academy we remeber him as a visionary and achiever of dreams.

A principal dream he had once was the allboys Catholic High School in Monmouth County with the De La Salle Christian Brothers on its faculty. With the help of his father-in-law Peter Fleming, business man John Henderson and a host of like people his dream became reality in 1959 when the first class was admitted to Christian Brothers Academy. Continuing his impossible dreams, Dr. Sheehan worked and led in the development of the present CBA. For the years from the 1960's through the 1990's he brought clear insights, a cool head and a steady goal to the Board of Trustees of the Academy, even in a period of drastic changes. CBA today is grateful that Doctor Sheehan was a dreamer, but more so, a doer.

The close bond between the De La Salle Christian Brothers and George Sheehan dated back to 1953 when he enrolled at Manhattan College. It was there he first established himself as an outstanding student, an exceptional runner in both cross-country and the mile run. Christian Brothers' values and ideals learned at Manhattan College inspired his personal, professional and civic development. Association with the Brothers enabled him to capture the spirit of faith and zeal which marked his service to Catholic secondary education. In their turn the Christian Brothers confered in him the honor of becoming an Affiliated Member of their Institute.

George Sheehan had shown them that persons are great because they can dreams and then make the dreams come true.

Be a legend in your own mind- Dr. George Sheehan

Running guru and Academy founder leaves this legacy to past and present CBA students.

George Sheehan, one critic has said, is a legend in his own mind. Of course I am. You should be too. Each one of us must be a hero. We are here to lead a heroic life. When we cease to do that we no longer truly exist. Alfred E. Housman described it well: "Runners whom fame outran/and the legend died before the man"

What fame? you ask. The only true fame, is the inner celebration of yourself. Nothing else lasts. Legends are perpetually dying. They must constantly be revived. We must always be searching for the grail, never ceasing in our labors; forever on trial for the gift of existance.

Susan Cheever writes of her father John Cheever's battle to escape his constant pressure. "To leave behind the torpid stability of the suburbs and the responsibilities of a house and family and most of all to escape the pressure to continually surpass himself as a writer."

Each of us knows those urges. We look to a future where we are free to do as and with whom we please. We look to the time when work and effort, duty and obligation will cease. To a day when we can take our ease and enjoy the friuts of our labors, no longer in contention with the most difficult of rivals - our youthful self.

We should know better. The battle is never over. The war is never won. Today's bear landscape is always and ever the arena where I contend with myself. I say my prayers and go to combat.

No one else may be aware of this struggle. It does

not matter. The hero needs no recognition. The deed is done. The audience of one is satisfied.

No matter how much we are aware of these truths, we put them aside. The heoric is too much for us. Perhaps the most searching question anyone can ask of themselves is "Why don't I feel heoric in this life?" Few of us admit that which gnaws at our innards is this question of making some heoric contributions to our own or the general good.

A young artist who read these lines said "These words stuck out a new strength in me. They revived resolutions, long fallen away and made me set my face like flint."

That strength is there. Those resolutions have substance. That flinty determination is part of our higher nature. We need only read William James to have these qualities renewed with us. "Mankind's common instinct for reality," he writes, "has always held the world to be essentially a theater for heorism."

That is the reason, wrote Ernest Becker, we still thrill to Ralph W. Emerson and Freidrich W. Nietzche. "We like to be reminded that our central calling, our main task on this planet, is the heroic."

The universal problem, says Becker, is the fear of death, and only through a superlative cosmic heorism can we overcome it.

"What one is doing to earn his feeling of heorism is the main self-analytic problem in life."

"It begins to look as though modern man cannot find

his heorism is everyday life anymore, writes Becker. Do not for a minute believe it. Heorism is ever available. Through ordinary experinces the ordinary man can become extraordinary. The heoric, said Kierkegaard, had no relation to the diffrence between one man and the other. Heorism means being great in what every human can be great in.

So life does resolve down to finding the way we are best suited to be a hero. To find our arena, our event, what it is we do best. My legend will not be your legend. We are about the business of making unique self. How we can best to that is next on the agenda.

The common man reaches excellence by makind demands on himself.

Our highest need is to be a hero. From childhood on we want to be number one. As adults we seek some assurance of immortality. We want those we leave behind to remember we were here.

The greatest psychiatrists and theologians and philosophers have given us their thoughts on this subject. That need not deter us from deciding for ourselves, coming to our own conclusions, living our own lives. Their words may stiffen our spines, gird our loins and stiffen our faces like flint - but what course we pursue then will be our very own. The hero, if nothing else, is his own man.
