


STUDENT LIFE




For the past four years, Christian Brothers Academy has fostered and shaped our

Our theme, "In Your Eyes" by Peter Gabriel, is very symbolic to us in that we hope this night will remain in our eyes and in our hearts forever.







GURU Peer Ministry

One of C.B.A.'s most unique and well-known programs is the G.U.R.U. Peer Ministry. Each year, 24 juniors are chosen by the senior GURUs to be the new GURUs for the following year. At the time of their selection, most of them knew only about the program from what they had deduced during their own freshman experience. Starting in the summer before the senior year, these future GURUs begin to learn the true significance behind the acronym G.U.R.U. which stands for "Give Us Religious Understanding". Preparation starts early as the 24 GURUs meet at St. Agnes Parish for an overnight retreat. Each GURU, led by Dr. Koch and Father Joseph Farell, gets aquainted with the other GURUs and learns more about the program.




Christian Service/Learning



Senior Retreat



C.B.A. provides the opportunity for students to attend various retreats so they may place their studies on a temporary hiatus and begin to employ what St. Augustine called "introspection". Just as the level of difficulty of the studies increases, so does the level of intensity of the retreats. The Senior Retreat is the culmination of the previous years' retreats because during this one, the students are able to take a step outside of themselves and examine their inner consciences from an external vantage point.

Father Paul Weirichs conducts the Retreat for the Seniors. They arrive at St. Catharine's in Holmdel (the place from which they will eventaully graduate) at 8:30 in the morning and do not return home until 5:30 in the afternoon. Because the focus of the Retreat is reserved for only the Seniors who are attending it, a summary of the days' activities cannot be divulged. However, it can be stated that the theme for this year's retreat was "Packing your Parachute" and this theme was expanded upon and was applied to the daily lives of the Seniors. They arrived at St. Catherine's as spiritual novices — they left as pros of the inner self.

The Retreat is the most fulfilling aspect of the school year. It allows the Seniors to share their thoughts and convictions with one another and offer advice on related topics. The three aspects that Father Paul advocates during the Retreat are openness, honesty, and respect. The Seniors incorporate each of these aspects into their consciences and by giving careful consideration to their inherent meaning, the Seniors are able to employ introspection ("looking within"). By using this beneficial technique, the Seniors are completing the first requirement for being a good Christian: knowing themselves (as Socrates would suggest). They are then able to go out into the real world and complete the second requirement: helping others. By having the Seniors partake in such a wonderful experience, Christian Brothers Academy is rooting Christianity deep within the Seniors so that they may share this with all the people they meet.

I'll never forget my first encounter with Tom Heath. I was a rookie teacher at CBA out watching my first cross-country meet. After several runners had crossed the finish line and the outcome decided, I saw this "maniac" with a booming voice go tearing across the baseball field toward one of the CBA runners. With about two hundred yards to go, Tom went face to face, stride for stride, all the way in, delivering an unforgettable critique for all to hear of the shortcomings of this particular performance. I was struck on that occasion, as I believe all who watch one of Tom's coaching performances are, by his incredible intensity and almost brutal honesty. But what I remember most of all of that first encounter is the rather surprising response of both the runner who was finishing the race as well as the other members of the team. Virtually no one seemed to react at all; to a man, they behaved in a "business as usual" manner.


For the longest time, I believed that this was the "real" Tom Heath, simply a person of unwavering directness and intensity. But after many years of coaching with Tom and many years of friendship, I have come to realize what I suspect all of Tom's athletes understand all too well: that at the source of these outbursts is a man deeply committed to excellence and deeply committed to bringing out the excellence in others. And it is this intensity of dedication that at times spills over into the public arena and at times inaccurately characterizes the person we know as Tom Heath. But at the core, I think that Tom Heath embodies what Christian Brothers Academy is all about: the willing ness to pay the price of excellence and the refusal to settle for anything less. And as we all know, the price of this pursuit can be very high indeed: no vacations, short weekends, late evenings, endless hours of preparation.

In the end, I believe that there is much more to Tom Heath than the familiar image of the bellowing cross-country coach who roams the hills of Holmdel Park. And it is regrettable that more people have not had the privilege of knowing what he does: Tom Heath is not only a great coach, but also a great teacher, a great parent, and a great friend.

Our Gospel highlights two significant centers of Brother Adrian's life ... his vocation and his advocation. His vocation, being carefully natured by a loving father who took Jimmy on many fishing trips and by his equally loving mother Anne, his sister Nancy, and his brother Joseph ... led him to the Christian Brothers at Ascension School and De LaSalle Institute, where he said "yes" to God's call entered the juniorate in 1933.

After his graduation from the Catholic University of America with his Bachelor of the Arts in French, with honors, Adrian began his teaching career at La Salle Academy, Providence, Rhode Island. His ten years at La Salle 1939-1949 gave evidence of his leadership potential. He was head of the French Department and the Principal of the Annex of La Salle Academy.

In 1949 he was assigned to St. Peter's, Staten Island as a Subdirector. The following year he was made Director and Principal and after three years went back to his first love — the classroom where he spent the next 47 years as a most effective teacher of French, Spanish, and Italian. During these years without getting time off from teaching, he earned his Masters' Degrees in Education, French, and Spanish as well as studying foreign languages under Federal Government Grants.


As for his vocation, Adrian was a lover of sports during his teaching career his extra-curricular activities found him coaching boxing and moderating swimming and baseball. He was president of the New York Catholic High School Athletic Association for five years, a great tribute to his interest and ability. His favorite personal sport was fishing. I was priviledged to accompany Adrian on many fishing ventures. Adrian always came back from these fishing trips with fantastic amounts of fish.

His diverse interests reflected his great enthusiam for life, and his spirit lives on in all the lives he has touched.

Robert T. Mason, a teacher at CBA for 18 years, died last October following a stroke and several years of progressive physical deterioration. He had been living with his younger son, Steven, in Keyser, West Virgina. He was seventy-two years old.

Bob was born in Everett, Massachusetts, the youngest of four children. He attended Boston College High School where his academic and athletic accomplishments earned him a scholarship to the College.

His career at Boston College was interrupted in 1941 when, after completing his freshman year, he enlisted in the Army Air Corps. The next three years were spent flying as tail gunner on a B-52. He flew a total of 67 missions.


Returning to B.C. in 1945, he resumed a career which was to lead to induction into the Boston College Hall of Fame. An indicator of his outstanding skills as an athlete can be deduced from the fact that as a senior, he was the captain of three Varsity sports: baseball, hockey, and football.


Upon graduating from Boston College in 1948, he accepted a teaching position in Columbus, Ohio. In 1952 he left Ohio to begin his association, with the Christian Brothers, an association that was to last for the next 26 years. He obtained a position at LaSalle Military Academy in Oakdale, Long Island, NY, a school staffed by the Christian Brothers. In 1961 he accepted the invitation of Brother Albert Bernard McKenna, CBA's first Principal, to come to Lincroft. There followed 18 years of intense dedication to the work to be done.

At CBA he was a member of the English department, a department he headed for several years. He taught several different courses offered by the department, taught religion to seniors and freshmen and moderated the school's Literary Journal for a few years. As the Athletic director for some years he supervised the school's entire athletic activities. He spent a dozen or so years as a baseball coach, formed and ran a hockey program for a few years which grew to become Club Hockey and eventually led to hockey on a Varsity level CBA's ranking today as #1 in the state.

He and his contributions will never be forgotten and may his soul rest in peace.









Language Clubs



Gráce aux efforts des responsables, Mme. Maloney et M. Smith, l'enthousiasme de cette organisation se voit et continue à se répondre à CBA.






Math Team


Chess Team








Pegasus

Project 2000

As Christian Brothers Academy prepares for the future, it has embarked on a new \$10 million capital campaign to raise funds which will be used for construction of the school's third wing, as well as for renovation and endowment.

Christian Brothers Academy's Project 2000, as this campaign is known, will better prepare us to meet our goals for the remainder of this century and well into the 21st century.

Project 2000 will provide new classroom and laboratory facilities, intramural and interscholastic athletic facilities, and a music studio. Project 2000 will also fund renovations to the original school building, and establish an endowment fund to ensure the continued success of C.B.A.



We all passed through the Dam of Chal-


