# Some Who Have Given Much...

Brother Thomas Wilkinson F.S.C. has exemplified the spirits and ideals of being a LaSallian Christian Brother. His dedication to the students of Christian Brothers Academy is unmatched, along with his love for what he does.

On September 3, 1995, Cal Ripken Jr. of the Baltimore Orioles is scheduled to break Lou Gehrig's streak of consecutive games played. Lou Gehrig was also called the Iron Horse; that name could also be applied to Brother Thomas. Brother Thomas could often be seen racing down the hallway to a homeroom to make an announcement or strolling through the cafeteria to make sure people were working on applications.

Brother Thomas arrived at his office each day at 8 AM. He did not leave until all business for the day was completed. One could often find

Brother Thomas on weekends in his office working on some project for a student.

Brother will surely be missed at Christian Brothers Academy, but his legacy will never be forgotten. He is the true "Ironhorse."

Brother Thomas will stay close to the CBA family by working with the Administration.

For thirty one years a steady, patient and caring person helped to establish the reputation of CBA in both academic and athletic excellence. Mr. John O'Shea joined the faculty of a recently established Christian Brothers Academy in 1964, having just been graduated from the College of the Holy Cross. He was hired to teach Language Arts and

French. He was also the freshman cross-country, indoor and outdoor track coach. As time progressed and the needs of the students changed, Mr. O'Shea changed along with them. He moved into teaching Latin full time and took over the helm of the varsity tennis team from Brother A. Patrick Martin. It is during this 11 year period that Mr. O'Shea left his most public mark on the history of CBA. His well coached and disciplined teams won 242 matches, six Parochial "A" state titles and two overall state championships. During this time CBA became a tennis powerhouse in Monmouth County and the state of New Jersey.

In the late 70's new opportunities arose in Mr. O'Shea's life. He resigned as tennis coach and took up the task of running the Jersey Shore Tennis Academy in Little Silver. During this time Mr. O'Shea also joined the Mathematics Department, teaching Algebra 1 and 2 and Geometry. In later years, with a resurgence in interest in the classics, Mr. O'Shea again taught a class of Latin 1. He had also assumed the position of tennis pro at the Navesink Country Club in Middletown. In May Mr. O'Shea announced his retirement.

At CBA we will miss his steady and easygoing style. His soft-spoken demeanor, quiet sense of humor and perhaps most important, his consistency.

We wish Mr. O'Shea and his wife Pat a long, healthy and enjoyable life in their retirement. We hope that they will always feel that they are a part of the LaSallian family at CBA. My first recollection of Mr. Chesney took place in September of 1964 at I started my senior year at "THE" Academy. He was an ex-marine, crew cut and a gym teacher with drill sargeant tendencies. I really didn't know what to make of him! Wise cracks kept coming out of his mouth! When he learned that I ran track...forget it! To him, wrestlers were "REAL MEN", but track guys ran around in short pants! I was not, however, about to argue with him!

Five years later I became his peer...almost! As a new CBA teacher, it was impossible to call him "Tony"! He, however, called me, "Ace", "Stick", "Mr. Heath", "Coach", and finally, Tom.

That whole process took decades, but over the years I realized what was most important to Mr. Chesney- Family, Friendship and Loyalty,


CBA, Mrs. Ann Cokelet has lived out and exemplified these requirements.






# In Recognition of 25 Years of Service to C.B.A.



### Mr. Martin Kenney





A graduate of the Class of 1966, Mr. Martin Kenney returned to his alma mater in 1971 to assist his coach and mentor Mr. Vinnie Cox in the basketball program. Mr. Kenney played on the first-ever C.B.A. state championship basketball team in 1965. During his twenty-five years at C.B.A., he served as J.V. basketball coach and assistant varsity basketball coach, finally retiring from the latter position in 1991. He has been the varsity baseball coach since 1973, leading C.B.A. to its only state championship title in 1977. 




















#### SKICLUB



#### French National Honor Society


