Preparing for the Future

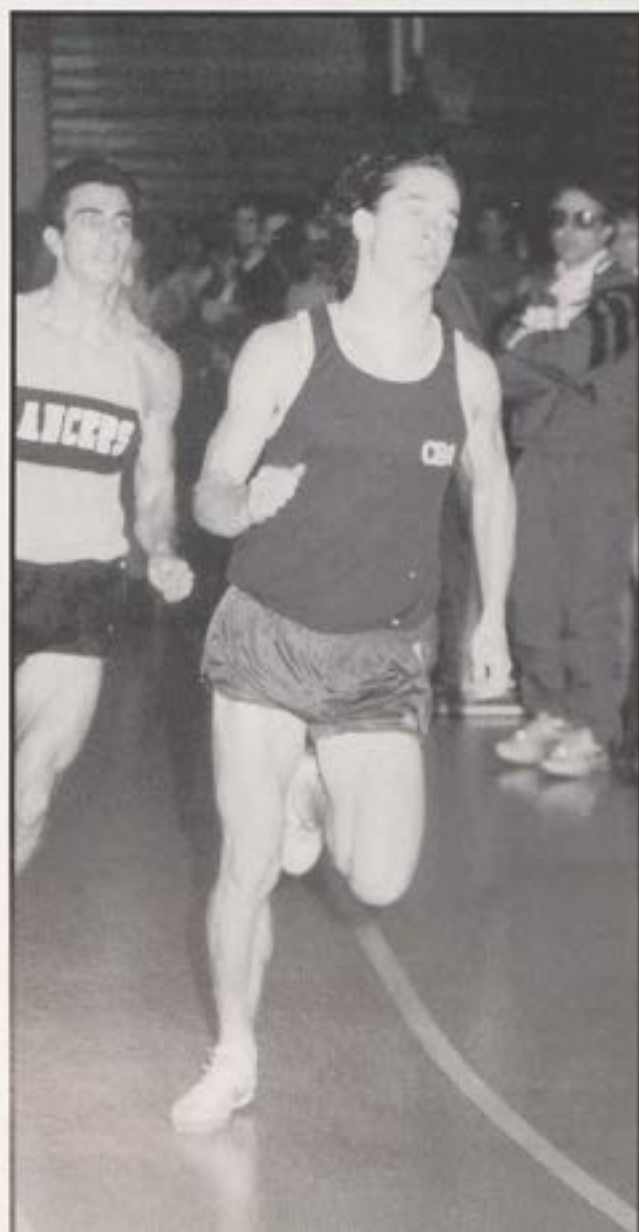


INDOOR TRACK

SKI CLUB

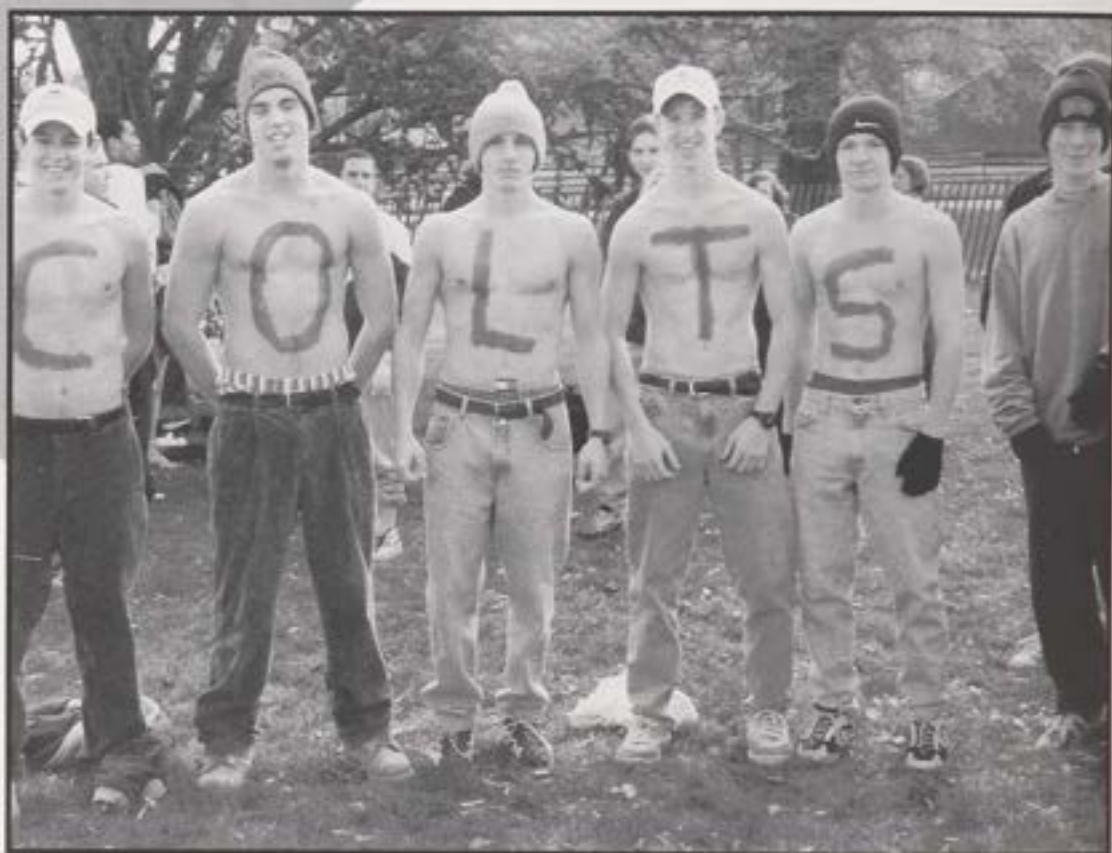
