







Preparing for the Future





Brother Christian has been a part of the CBA community for twenty-five years, joining the faculty in 1972. He has devoted his life to making higher mathematics accessible to his students, and the students of many schools via the Catholic High School and Shore Conference Math Leagues. Brother Christian finds great joy in solving complex problems, which has made him so good at another of his jobs, that of Assistant Principal for Programming and Scheduling. He founded and directs the CBA Eighth Grade Math Contest, which has brought many fine students to the Academy. Brother Christian's JV and Varsity Math Teams consistently win trophies in the Catholic High School Math League and the Shore Math League.

Brother Christian was himself taught by the order he later joined. A graduate of Bishop Loughlin Memorial High School in Brooklyn, Brother Christian earned his BA and MA from Manhattan College. 















Lectors are those to whom has been entrusted the sacred task of proclaiming God's Word to His


Sacred Music







BLOOD DRIVE
