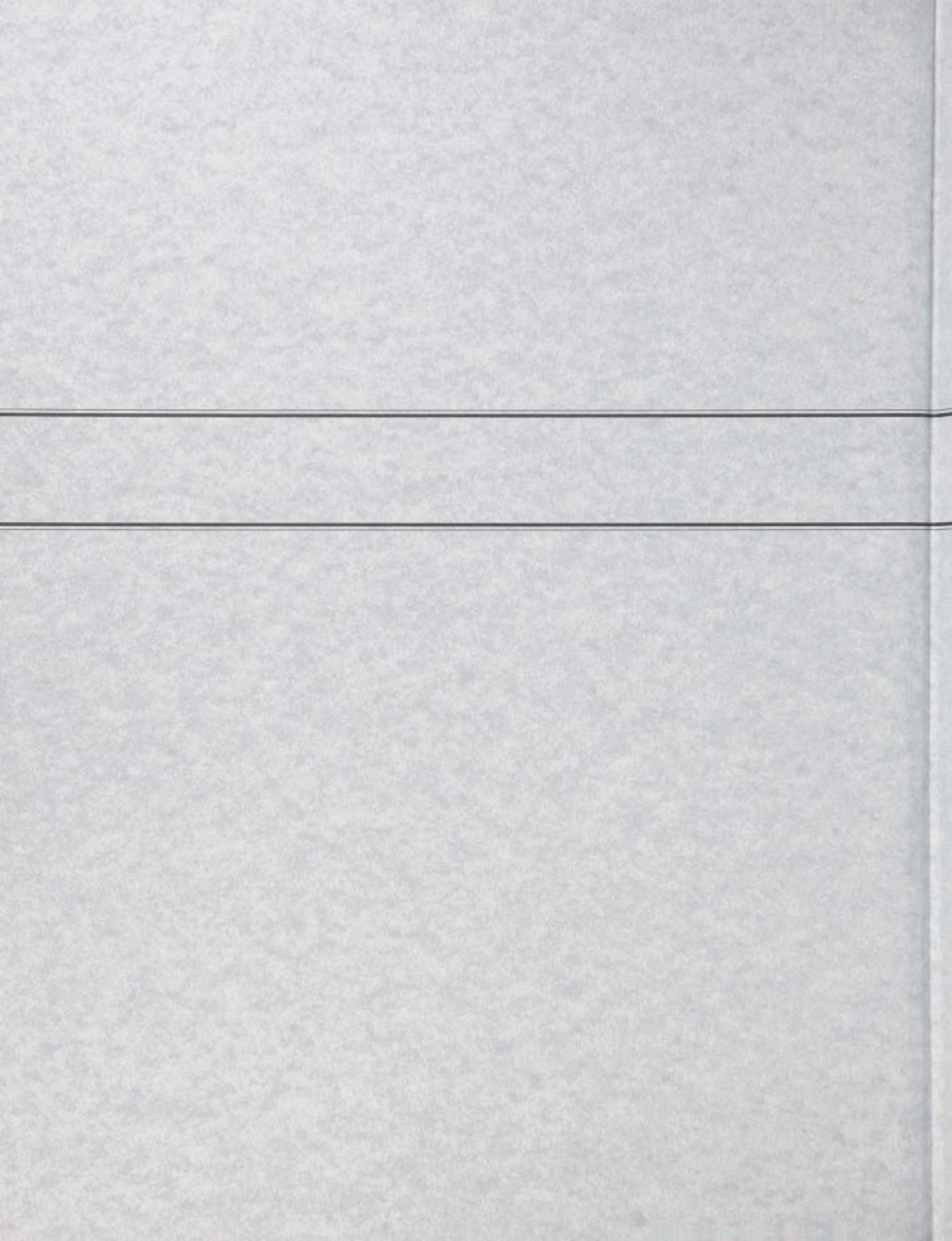

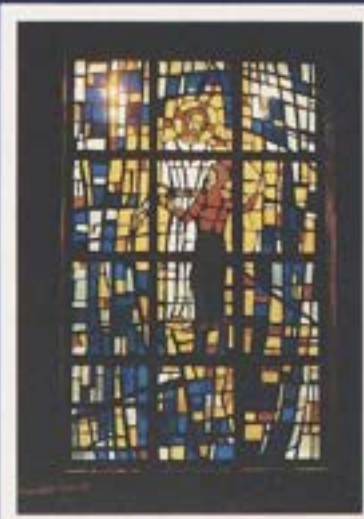

# CONTINUING THE TRADITION

**C**hristian Brothers Academy has a long history of achievement. Since its doors opened for the first time in 1959, a record of success has been established in several areas, and for many reasons. For one, CBA did not have to start from scratch: the Brothers of the Christian Schools have experience in school-building that dates back to 1680

In that year, a wealthy priest risked his family's fortune on his strange ideas about the education of youth. This priest, John Baptist de La Salle, gathered around him first a group of children whose education he fostered, and then a number of men who thought as he did about education. He formed this congregation of men into the *Fratres Scholarum Christianum* — the Brothers of the Christian Schools. In 1901, de La Salle was canonized as a Saint, and Patron of Teachers.

The religious order that he founded 318 years ago has served thousands of people. It is easy to find people who were taught by the Christian Brothers. In any crowded place one need only to call out loudly the start of the beloved prayer: "Saint John Baptist de La Salle ..." You almost certainly will hear an answering chorus of, "Pray for us!"

With a history like this behind them, the Brothers certainly knew how to build a winning school. And so they did. From humble beginnings, CBA can now boast of academic excellence, winning records in many sports, of a dedicated and talented faculty, of a diverse and interesting student body, and of an influential presence in the community.

## ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

There are many indicators of CBA's excellence in academics. High on that list is our record at placing students in bachelors' and associates' programs. Typically, more than ninety-eight per cent of our graduates go on to higher education. These students are helped on their way by scholarships that total some 3.5 million dollars each year.

Our program of academics is crafted to meet the needs of a diverse student body. We offer Advanced Placement courses so that those with special interests and talents may qualify for college credit. Many students are enrolled in honors classes. In return for a more rigorous course of study, the grades in these classes are weighted when calculating the GPA. Not to be overlooked are the standard classes, which are designed to prepare students for college-level work. It is commonly heard from alumni that their first semester or two at college is made **much** easier because of their experience here at the Academy.

One sterling facet of the CBA experience is that our students own stock in each other's learning. The GURU Peer Ministry program affords the freshmen an opportunity to be guided by seniors as they adjust

to life at CBA. Also, a walkthrough the cafeteria or library will turn up many students helping others to master a key point of algebra, chemistry, or grammar.

While CBA is a conservative school, dedicated to teaching by proven methods, the curriculum is not stale or outdated. There is a constant re-evaluation of course content and of the overall academic program. This approach to education has earned the Academy several awards and much recognition.

## SPORTSMANSHIP

The CBA athlete displays an attitude of sportsmanship that is second to none in victory as well as in defeat. This professionalism on the part of the athletes fosters a certain confidence on their part, and pride in the hearts of the fans.

Our coaches are dedicated to their student athletes; supportive, but also demanding. By sharing their experience and talent, they inspire in the players a desire to achieve. While taking nothing from the students who are on the field, much credit for our history of success in athletics must go to the coach on the sidelines.



Our athletes' success comes at the price of dedication, hard work, and much time spent practicing and honing their skills. In this crucible raw talent, of which there is much, is transformed into the stuff that legends are made of. And these legends have come to the attention of many. We are the avowed rival of many schools in many sports. We may be in the same division, but we are in a league of our own.

The tradition of excellence at CBA is nurtured by its outstanding faculty, the hallmark of which is caring. This diverse group of men and women brings to the students a wealth of knowledge and talent that supports a high quality of education. Our faculty cares for the total student: academically, athletically, and spiritually.

Besides fine teachers, CBA is administered by a special group of people. Stern when needed to be so, they are selflessly devoted to the students in their care. In the LaSallian tradition, the administrators lovingly conduct the business of the school for the benefit of all its members.

## STUDENTS & ALUMNI

Christian Brothers Academy is more than just the buildings and the grounds; it is people who make CBA special. In large measure, the credit and responsibility for bearing CBA's reputation falls on the student body. The reason that CBA exists is to serve the needs of the young men who walk its halls. It is to these young men that the tradition of excellence has been entrusted, and as a rule they bear the responsibility with grace.

This responsibility takes many forms: making the grade in class, getting involved in school activities, supporting the sports teams and performing arts, supporting their schoolmates through the liturgical ministries, and being true friends to their fellow students.

This involvement gives the students a sense of ownership of the school. With this ownership comes a healthy pride, both in what we have achieved and in what we have yet to achieve. This pride is also something that will live in the hearts of the students when they leave these hallowed halls to experience life beyond CBA.

## COMMUNITY PRESENCE

During a student's four years here, he is encouraged to dedicate his free time to others through the Service Project program coordinated by Br. Joseph Miggins. By volunteering in his community, he is expressing his Christian ideals that CBA has invested in him, and at the same time earning credit toward graduation. Students in Christian Service Learning distill that spirit of volunteerism into an even more concentrated form. CBA helps to support the needs of the community also by sponsoring blood drives in the winter and spring, and through student organizations dedicated to the service of others.

Our Theatrical productions are of great renown throughout central New Jersey. The students who perform as actors and musicians take on an enormous commitment; no less is that taken on by the set designers, lighting and sound crews, and stage hands. As a result, CBA's fall and spring stage shows are second-to-none in amateur theater.

## SPIRITUALITY

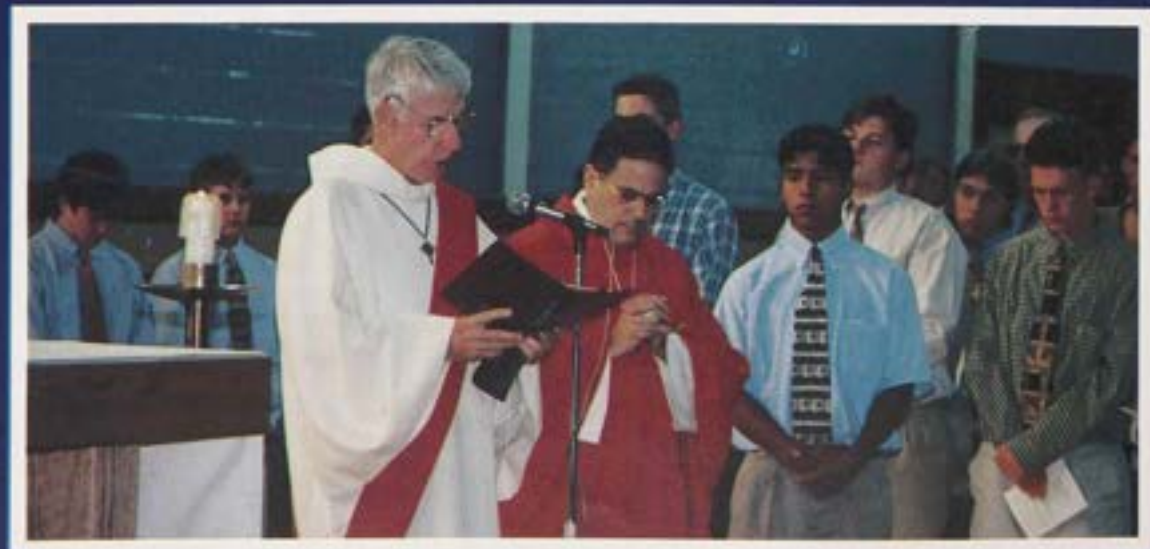
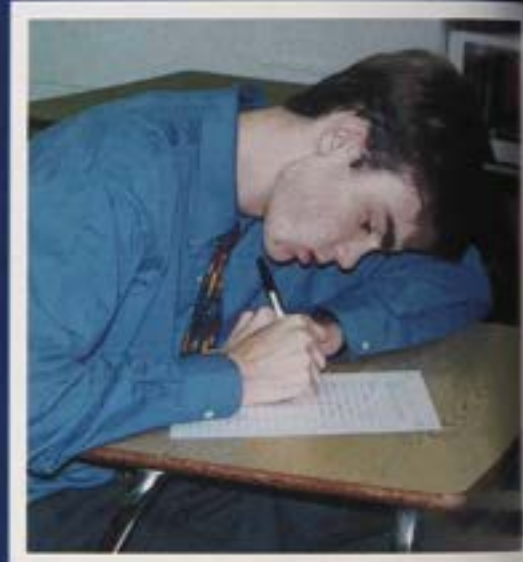
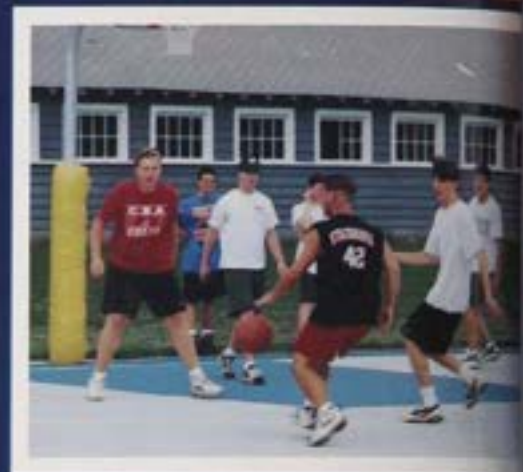
The presence of God in our midst is an important part of life at Christian Brothers Academy. At least nine times during the course of each school day we pause to take notice of that Presence.

We are fortunate to be blessed with a priest-chaplain and a deacon on our faculty, and to have the opportunity to attend daily morning Mass in our Chapel.

Several times during the course of the school year, the entire community gathers for Mass. Frequently, smaller groups are invited to Liturgy for special occasions. We start the first day of classes with Mass, and the last day that seniors are here likewise begins with Mass.

Each year students are selected to serve the whole community as Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, Ministers of Sacred Music, Ministers of Hospitality, Liturgists, Acolytes, and members of the Liturgical Planning Committee.

In addition, prayer services are held on Ash Wednesday and other occasions, and the Sacrament of Penance is available at all times.



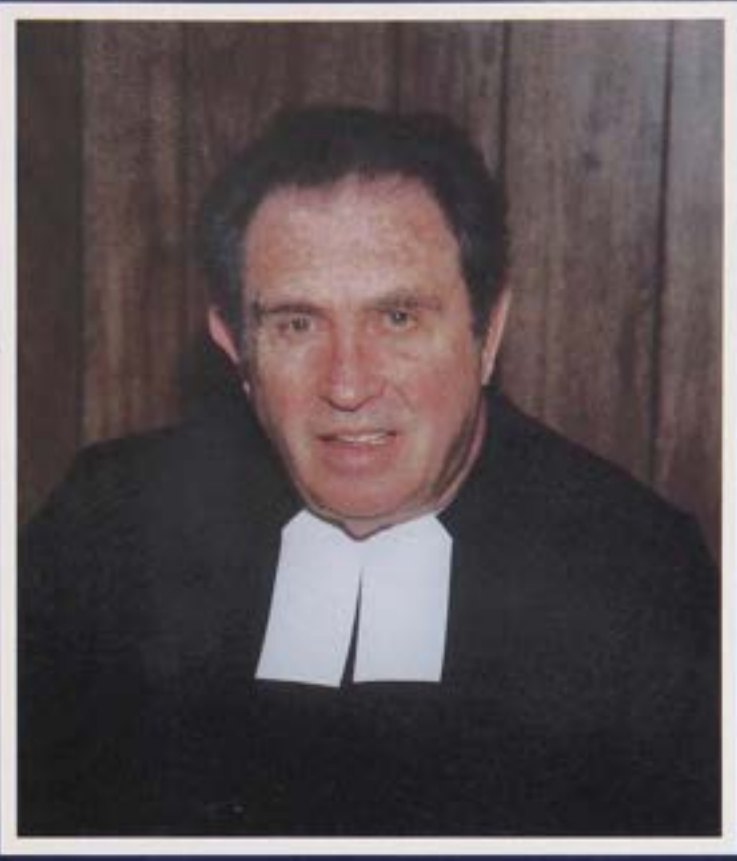

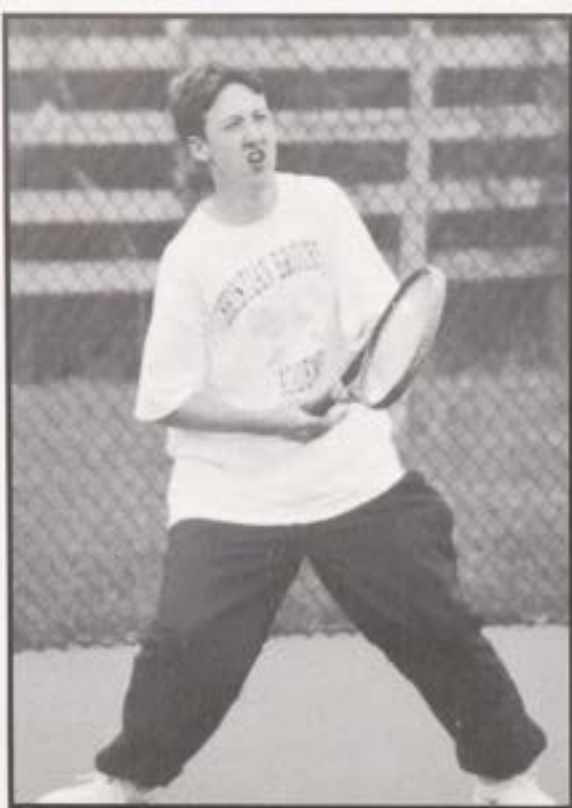
## The 1997 Colt Netters

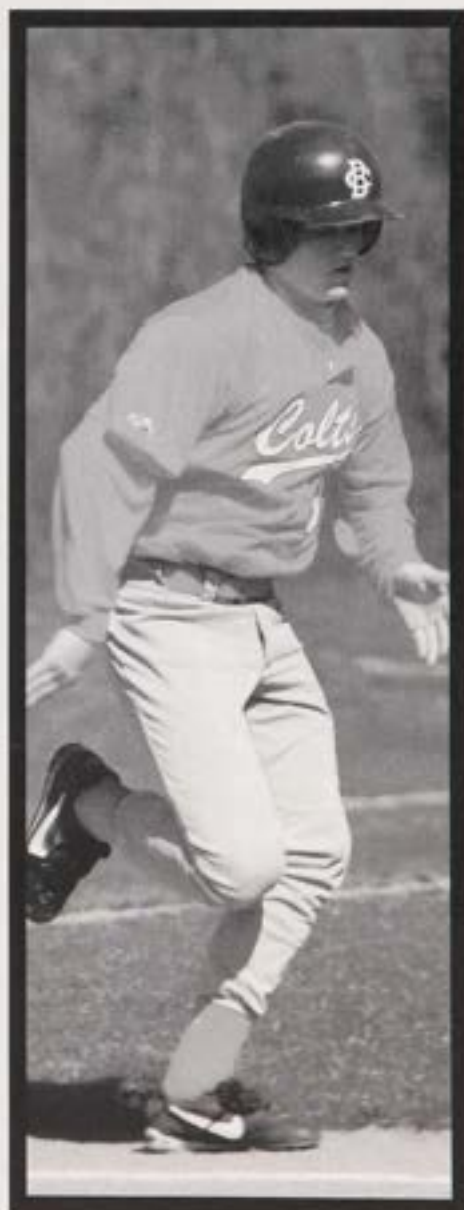
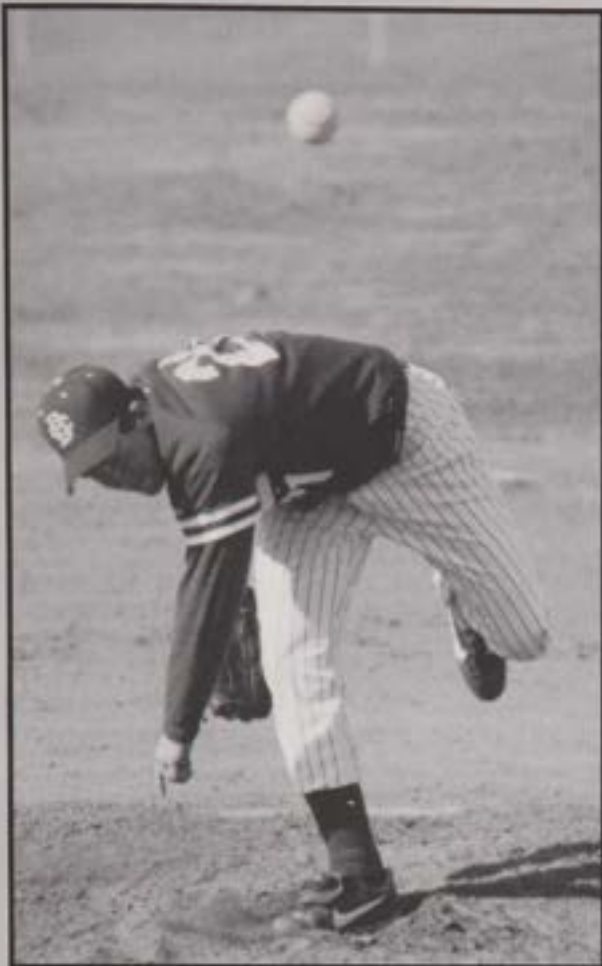
## The Spring 1997 Season

# Cross-Country

The 1997 Cross-Country team started out uncertain of the success they could achieve, but in the end, there was no question that they were the best team in New Jersey. The Colts, driven by the leadership of seniors Bill Hoffman, Dan Connelly, and Byron Larkins, had a history-making season. They started out the worst team in the last twenty years, but they were soon to learn an important lesson: Hard work pays off. Former CBA runners turned assistants, Coaches Lippin and McCafferty taught them that important lesson. The team had its first race at the Suffolk Coaches meet in Long Island. After finishing as the top team of the day, they never looked back. The team saw the opportunity for greatness and they capitalized on it. They were soon to face the best team in the state, Morristown, at the Shore Coaches Invitational. Here, they won a commanding victory and the Colts became one step closer to achieving one of their most important goals- being ranked in the top 25 in the country. In order to do this, they would have to win the Manhattan Invitational, one of the largest meets on the East Coast. The Colts won their race and national ranking was theirs. There was still more to be done, however. The team had an opportunity to be the first team to win the Meet of Champions three years in a row. They became determined as ever and won the Monmouth County and Shore Conference Championships for the 16th year in a row. They also won their thirteenth state title. The team was now intent on achieving the goal they had worked so vigorously to obtain for the last six months. They knew what had to be done, and the seven man team of Bill Hoffman, Dan Connelly, Geoff Fahey, Brian Hoffman, Andrew Filachek, Brian Kerwin, and Steve Schaffer made history. They had won an unprecedented third consecutive All-Group State Championship and a state record of ten overall. They had defeated Morristown by 31 points. Mr. Heath, the New Jersey high school cross-country coach of the year, and the Seniors had led the team to a victory that was well deserved. The Colts, who were undefeated in dual meets, extended state record to 218 consecutive wins. They finished 10th in the nation in the final poll by USA TODAY.

While the athletes and the coaches are out front receiving deserved notoriety for the tremendous accomplishments of our sports teams, Mr. Przygocki toils in anonymity behind the scenes. Our batteries are constantly recharged by all the positive feedback we receive while he must be content helping provide "the wind beneath our wings."

In either of his positions at CBA, as teacher or athletic director, Mr. Przygocki has been a great asset to our school. When you begin to understand the dual role he has served over the last 25 years you start to realize how big a part he has played in shaping CBA history. 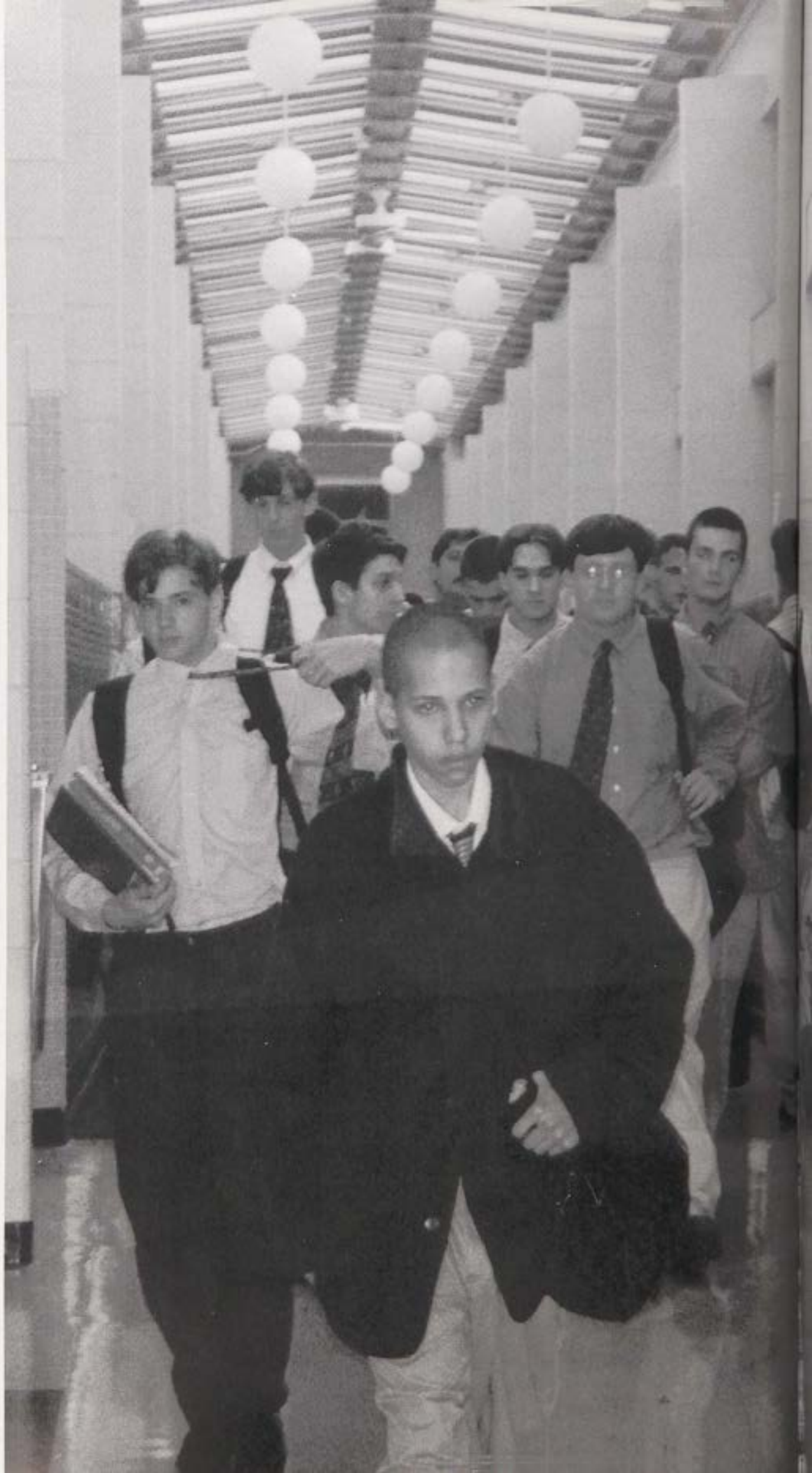

We hope Brother Henry will continue to be a vital part of CBA for a long time to come.

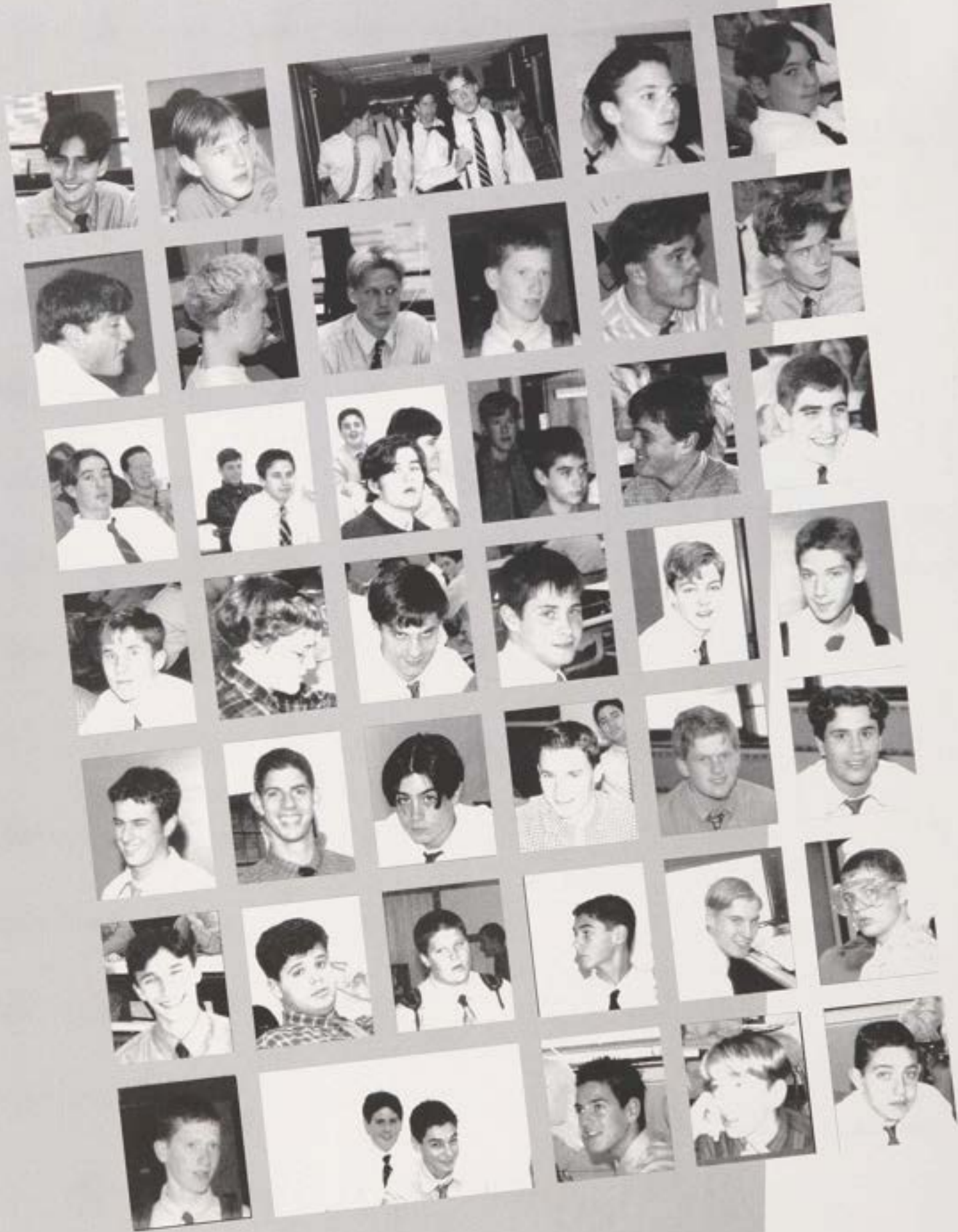

*The word **liturgy** comes to us from a Greek term meaning **work of the people**. In truth, the Liturgy consists of a give-and-take between God and His People, the Church. We offer adoration, and the sacrifice of our lives in devotion to Him. He supports us and sustains us; gives us life, and leads us to life eternal.*

*The source and summit of the Christian life is the Celebration of the Eucharist. We bring to the celebration our own gifts and talents to build up the community. There, God sanctifies our efforts, and makes them bear fruit to His greater glory.*

*These efforts, insofar as they serve the community, are called ministries. There are several of these ministries through which our students help to enrich the school's liturgies. They are: the Extraordinary Ministry of the Eucharist, the Ministries of the Word, of Service, of Hospitality, of Sacred Music, and of Sacristan.*

*Extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist have the privilege and grave responsibility of bringing Christ to the CBA community in the Blessed Sacrament. Lectors deliver God's written Word to the assembly by a clear and worthy announcement of it. Acolytes support the priest and deacon in their work, and help to direct the assembly's attention to the sacred events. Hospitality ministers make sure that all in our large community find welcome. They also assist the ministers of the Eucharist at Communion time. Sacred music helps to bring the assembly to full, conscious, and active participation in the Liturgy. Sacristans help to make sure that all of the necessary accouterments are ready for the community's celebration. Here at CBA, the sacristans are also involved in planning the liturgies.*

*We are blessed to have a wonderful priest to be our chaplain, and twice-blessed to have a deacon on staff as well. Father John and Deacon John work daily to help the community, individually and collectively, to grow in holiness. From daily Mass, to First Friday Eucharistic adoration; from Ash Wednesday prayer services to special lenten observances; from special class Masses to everyday access to the sacraments, these men of God serve their Master worthily.*

## The Tradition of *Pegasus*

The Christian Brothers Academy *Pegasus* debuted under the direction of Brother Robert in 1963. Long before the yearbook office was presently located in Henderson Hall, editors and helpers alike travelled in the open classrooms of the main building. With a listed staff of only 24 students, a 168 page yearbook was published. While the yearbook was and has continued to be reflective of high school, *Pegasus* sought to capture the essence of the Christian Brothers Academy experience.

With the move to Benilde Hall in 1966, the *Pegasus* earned the Columbia Scholastic Press award in 1966, '67, and '69. Despite office changes to Lombardi Hall (1972), Henderson Hall (1996), and most recently McKenna Hall (1998), *Pegasus* has added to its content.

*Pegasus* has had co-editors-in-chief only eight times previous to this year, and this staff is this first to be directed by three executive editors, instead of the traditional editor-in-chief.






