


"Always in motion is the future." — Yoda


What attracted people to Brother Cassian Thomas Wilkinson? What was so special about him? Simply, he loved people and they loved him.




































LITURGY





CBA is blessed to have two ordained men on staff: Father John Folchetti and Deacon John Fitzsimmons. They have fostered growth in an already-strong program of prayer and devotion at the Academy. Of course, Mass is celebrated with the whole community on special occasions. On Ash Wednesday there is a special service to prepare for the season of Lent. During Lent and Advent there are particular devotional observances, including communal praying of the Rosary or the Stations of the Cross. On First Fridays, the Eucharist is exposed for quiet adoration throughout the school day, culminating in Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Throughout the year, small groups, especially religion classes, will gather for special Masses or penance services.









Of course, the hidden treasure is daily morning Mass. Each day the Sacred Mysteries are celebrated in the school chapel. This year has seen an increased participation by students and parents. During Lent and Advent, special invitations are extended to the various homerooms to attend Mass together. During the month of November, particular attention is paid to remembering our Beloved Dead at Mass.

Everyone is called to participate fully at Mass, each according to his proper role. Some are called to serve the community as acolytes, readers, sacred musicians, sacristans, ministers of hospitality, or extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. Students are selected to serve the community on the basis of character and desire. All who serve are charged especially with the duty to serve as witnesses to Christ in their daily lives.

The program of liturgy, para-liturgical celebrations, and communal devotions is intended to foster an evergreater personal commitment to prayer and sanctity in the lives of the individuals here at CBA.


Baccalaureate Liturgy






John McCormack's Valedictory Address

Brother Andrew, Brother Ralph, Mr. Santanello, Brother Daniel, members of the Board of Trustees, Faculty, parents, friends, and members of the Class of 2000:

A line in a popular song reads: "Every new beginning comes from some other beginning's end" [Semisonic, *Closing Time*]. My fellow graduates, this evening a very important chapter in our lives closes - but a future of untold opportunity lies ahead for us all. Tonight is the final time we will be gathered together as a class. In a few brief months, we will be moving on to face new challenges — college, careers, and service — and our four years in Christian Brothers Academy will be just a memory.

The question becomes, what will we take with us as we continue on life's journey? Will we remember the sense of awe we felt the first time we walked into the school lobby? Will we recall the mornings we spent sitting in the cafeteria, or the long hours we spent in classrooms? Or will we always remember the feeling of satisfaction we felt after completing our last exams as CBA students? These priceless recollections may remain with us throughout our lives, but they will not sustain us. What will support us however, through success and failure, good times and bad, are our values - those principles that we hold dearest and would un defend at any cost. Values give direction, establishing an ideal for conduct and attitude for which we can strive. This type of motivation is of immeasurable importance for success, for as William Blake quips, "The hours of folly are measured by the clock, but of wisdom no clock can measure." Further, values impart a sense of purpose, and with that comes the passion and energy of believing in something greater than oneself. Though rain threatened throughout the day, and finally did come down, the weather held long enough to complete the ceremonies and allow the new alumni to celebrate with their families and classmates.



Valedictory Address (continued)

The question remains then, what values will we take with us from our time at CBA?

One could easily look to the Value-of-the-Month program for inspiration; tolerance, dignity, community, and honesty being just a few of the many worthwhile ideals highlighted during the past two years. If we look closely at our experiences at the Academy, however, we find a pattern of values and morals that have been shown to us since our first days as freshmen.

We might recall our history classes, which imparted to us both an understanding of the past and a way to analyze the present; from there we can take a sense of tradition, of interconnectedness and interdependence on others, and of civic duty.

Perhaps we might look to our classes in science and mathematics, which gave us an understanding of the world around us and a glimpse of just how powerful knowledge can be. We could also look to our classes in foreign languages, which showed us the value of cultural diversity.

Or, we could heed the lessons of our religion classes, which taught us about spirituality, morality, the Church, and Gospel values, as well as how to temper the rational perception of the natural sciences with the humble, respectful essence of the Christian vision.

We might even look to our extra-curricular activitics, which instilled in us a sense of commitment and dedication. Finally, we could recall CBA athletics, which through both success and disappointment always presented a shining example of sportsmanship, hard work, and synergy. But we need only look to the people around us the Christian Brothers, our teachers, our parents, and our friends — for evidence of the power of values. Without their help, none of our success, health, or happiness would be possible, and it is through their constant support and guidance that we have come this far and are able to stand here tonight.

Still, what are we to do with these values that have been presented to us?

My fellow graduates, tonight we are sent on a mission - a mission to serve others by putting to use our values. At the heart of our mission is another essential value: a commitment to justice. Justice brings together all other values: it calls us to see ourselves as connected to other people, challenges us to have sincere concern for the dignity and wellbeing of others, and demands that we use our gifts and talents to reach out to those in need.

In the words of Alexander Solzhenitsyn, "Justice is conscience, not a personal conscience but the conscience of the whole of humanity. Those who clearly recognize the voice of their own conscience usually recognize also the voice of justice."

Thus, in building our own system of values we are tapping into a global network of people all working towards a common goal - the improvement of the quality of life for all human beings. And we must do this selflessly, reaching to out everyone not just those who can give us something in return. We should strive to be wise enough to understand this mission, dedicated enough to undertake it, caring enough to believe in it, and humble enough to admit that we need assistance, both from God and other people. It should be our mission, today and everyday, to carry on the quest for justice, Jesus' quest for justice. No matter what path we choose in life, we should remain focused on this, which is in fact the reason we are here: because some three hundred years ago St. John Baptist de la Salle took the mission of justice to a new level.

So, as we bid farewell to Christian Brothers Academy, let us pledge to ourselves, to one another, and to God that we will remain true to our values and open to the voice of justice.
