


#### Odyssey: A Journey of Life

of loss. During the four years we have spent here, we have learned to value not only the knowledge we have gained, but also the people we have met.






On Friday, July 21, 2000, a helicopter crashed in Maui, Hawaii. There were seven passengers onboard. Two days later, the grim news was released that four of the seven passengers were the Jordan family of Shrewsbury. Some of the goals of the Religious Studies Department are to inform the intellect and touch the heart with the values and message of Jesus Christ and the Catholic Christian tradition, to prepare students for future academic inquiry into their faith, and to respect the various faith traditions and levels of faith response of each student. Freshman religion presents an overview of Catholicism, highlighting Scripture, world religions, and the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church. Brown's experiences of living in the Pine Barrens. In junior religion classes students analyze Scripture in greater detail, treating its literary and stylistic aspects. There are four choices for senior religion; Dimensions of Catholic Life, Theological Inquiry, GURU, and Christian Service. Dimension of Catholic Life summarizes the previous three years' teaching and prepares students for entering the world as informed Catholics. In Theological Inquiry students learn about Christian theology and theological ethics. The Christian Service class emphasizes volunteer activities in the community.

Besides classroom learning, religious topics are covered on the retreats that the school sponsors. Freshmen have a special Welcome Day when they meet their GURUs and get to know the other members of their group. Juniors and seniors participate in a retreat led by Fr. Paul Wierichs, who runs a retreat house in Long Island and works with a group of seniors called the Society of the Passion.

The Mathematics Department, co-chaired by Brother Christian Jones and Mrs. Amanda Lobkowicz works hard to impart to students a solid base in the areas of mathematics and the theory and practice of mathematical analysis. The higher math courses, such as statistics and calculus, strive to give students an understanding of real world applications of mathematical techniques.

Freshmen can start their journey through the CBA Math Department at a variety of levels. Most freshmen start at Algebra I, but some freshmen who show exceptional mathematical talent on the math placement test may be placed into sophomore level courses, such as Geometry or Geometry-Algebra II.

The same variety of courses is offered during sophomore year. The students who take a higher-level course freshman year can take more advanced courses, such as Trigonometry-Analysis, taught by Brother Christian or Mr. Speidel.



CBA's SADD Chapter is dedicated to addressing the issues of underage drinking, drug use and other destructive decisions and killers of young people. Simply stated, our mission is:



Learning Center in Red Bank, a vibrant, burgeoning program providing after-school tutoring and mentorship to the children of Red Bank.


