The goal of Campus Ministry is to support the spiritual growth and development of each student at CBA. Opportunities are provided throughout the year for students to deepen their faith, have experiences of community and be of service to others in the school community and the wider world among us.

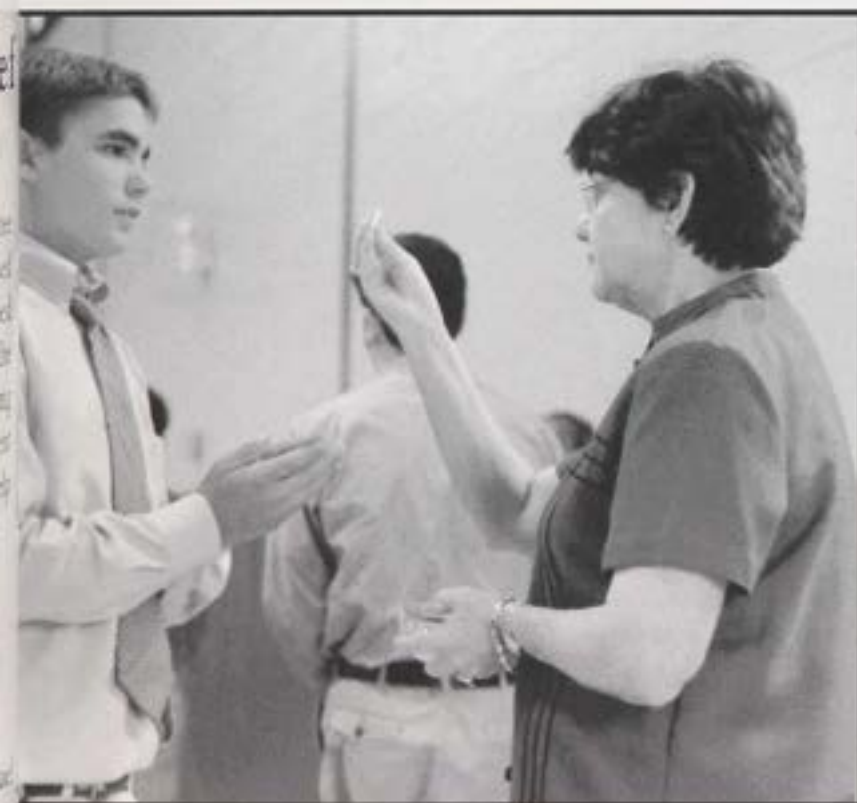

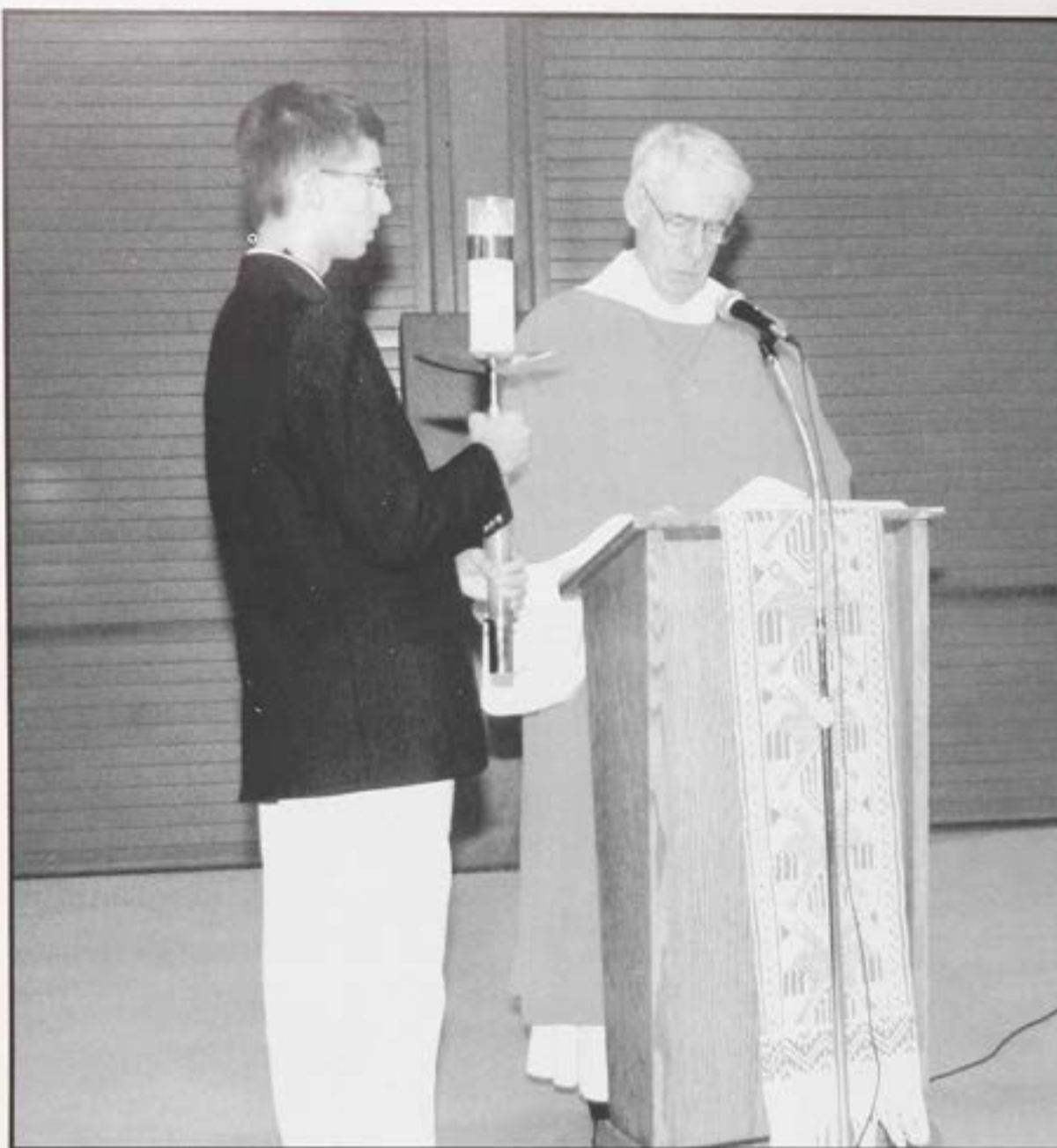

Christian Service-Learning offers students the opportunity to extend their religious faith beyond the classroom. The requirements of this senior elective include two hours per week of service, followed by journaling and reflecting on the experiences in light of the Gospel message. A key component to this course, taught by Mr. Sewnig, is developing an awareness of the Catholic Social Justice tradition. Through academic study and hands-on experience, the students gain a deeper consciousness for the *anawim*, the poor of God. Services include learning centers, hospitals, religious education, eldercare, foodbanks and soup kitchens. Many of these students will continue to offer Christian Service throughout their adult lives. By living their commitment to the Gospel these students are a continual reminder to the world that, "The Kingdom of God is at hand."

Service helps to define the experience of being an Academy man. In keeping with the La Sallian Tradition of Faith, Service and Community, CBA initiated a service requirement for graduation in 1994. Each year since then the students have offered thousands of hours of service with different agencies and organizations throughout the area. Students visit nursing homes, serve with EMT squads, teach religious education classes, raise money through different activities, and assist academically challenged students with homework and study skills. While there is a minimal number of hours required, most students choose to continue their hours well beyond that minimum.

Besides offering service, the students also take the opportunity to reflect on their experiences and to develop positive relationships with those people who are the beneficiaries of their efforts and generosity. Each student is expected to complete 50 hours by graduation, with freshmen and seniors contributing 10 hours each and sophomores and juniors each having 15 hours.

As of publication, the seniors have accounted for 19,280 hours over their four years here.

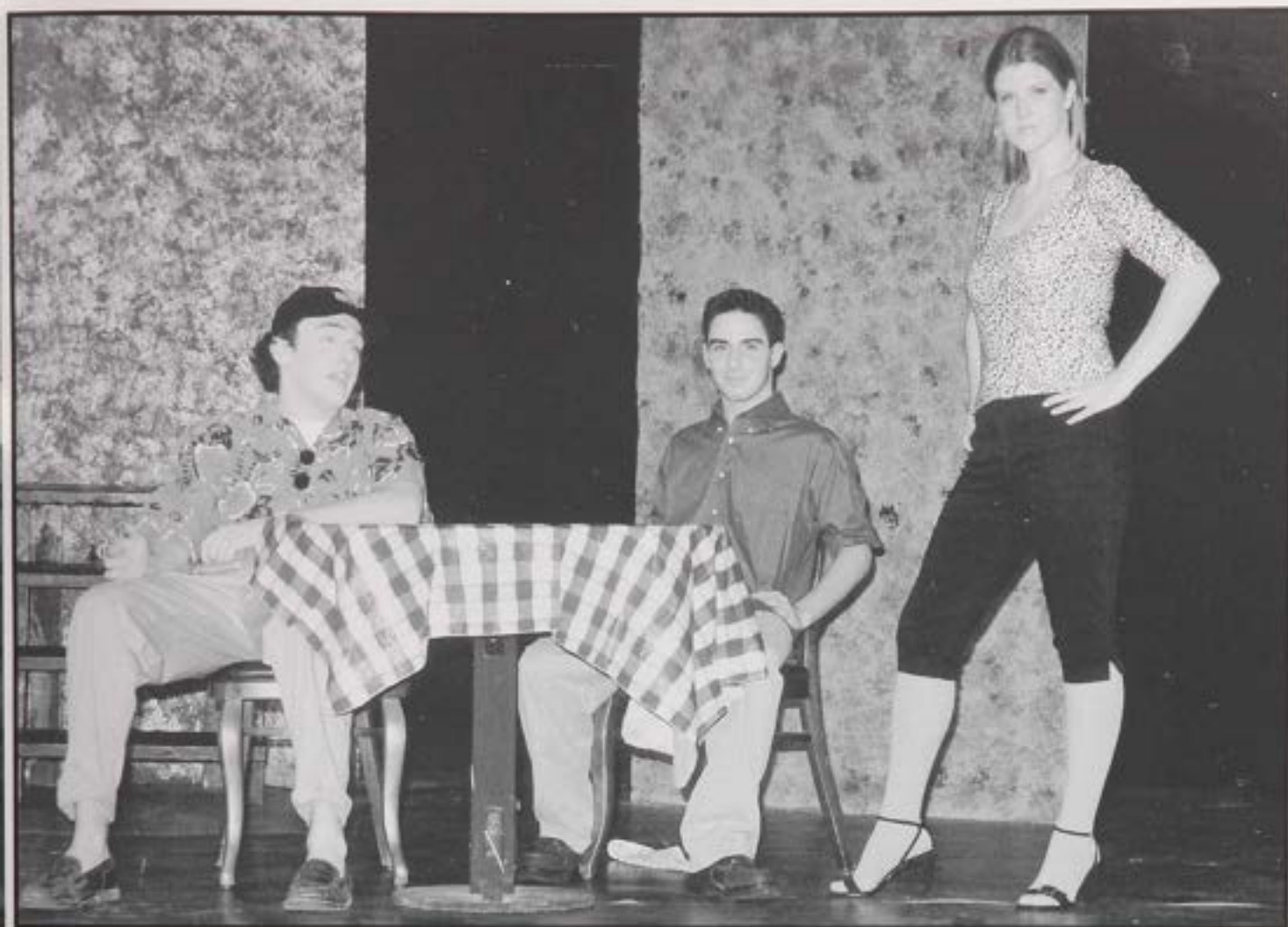

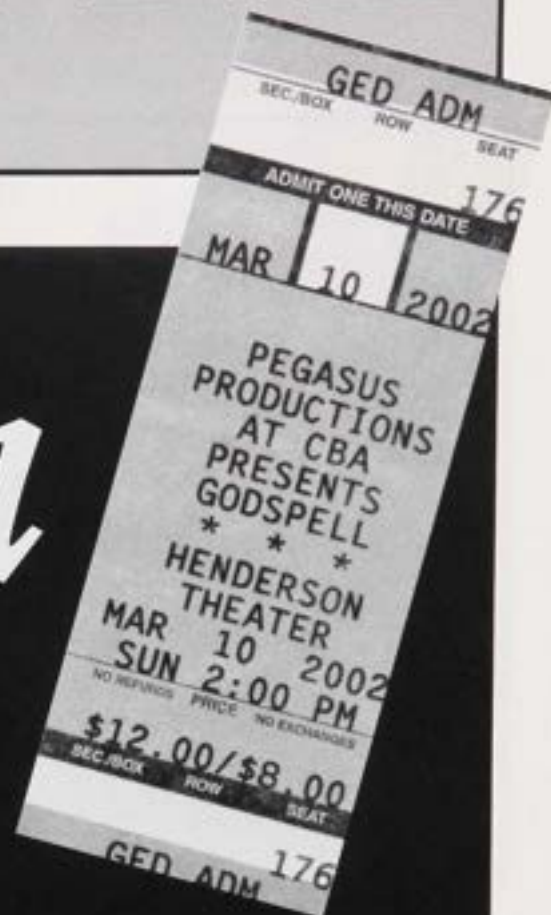

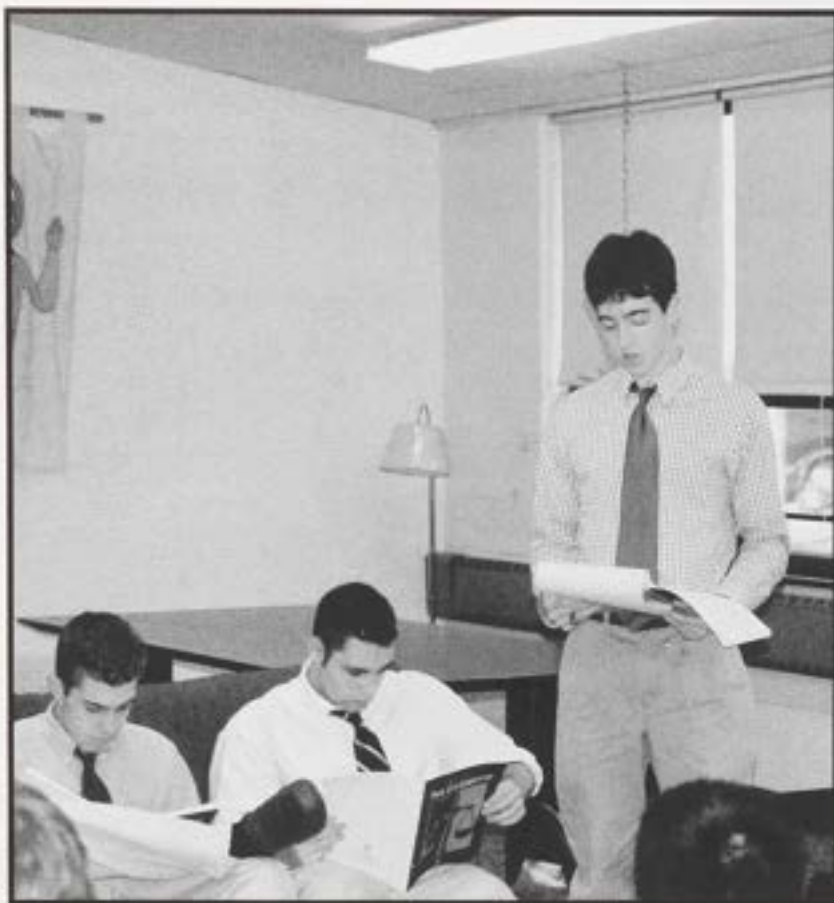

The CBA Mock Trial Team, under the leadership of Father John and Brother Robert, prepared to participate in the Vincent J. Apruzzese Mock Trial Competition, a statewide tournament. Groups of students acted as lawyers and witnesses for the prosecution and defense. This year's case centered on an accident that killed three people. The state tried to prove that the accident was caused by road rage, while the defense tried to prove that the accident was caused by the driver's own mistakes. Attorneys for both sides worked to prepare direct and cross examinations of the witnesses that would highlight facts that proved their theory of the case and discredit opposing witnesses. Witnesses for the state and defense studied the facts of the case and learned how to answer the questions they would be asked in the way that would be most beneficial to their team. Father John's knowledge of psychology was especially helpful for determining how the witnesses should behave as the characters they were playing. Mr. Peter O'Mara, a CBA graduate who is now a trial lawyer, assisted the teams in preparing their cases and in understanding the laws that applied to it. In a few productive meetings, the many different aspects of the cases were assembled and tested. The members of the team who did not get to participate in the actual competition helped the individual attorneys and witnesses to prepare and added objective criticism and opposing viewpoints during practices. The team was selected so that many members will be returning next year more experienced in competition and knowledgeable in law so that next year CBA can expect to be prepared to advance even farther in the competition.

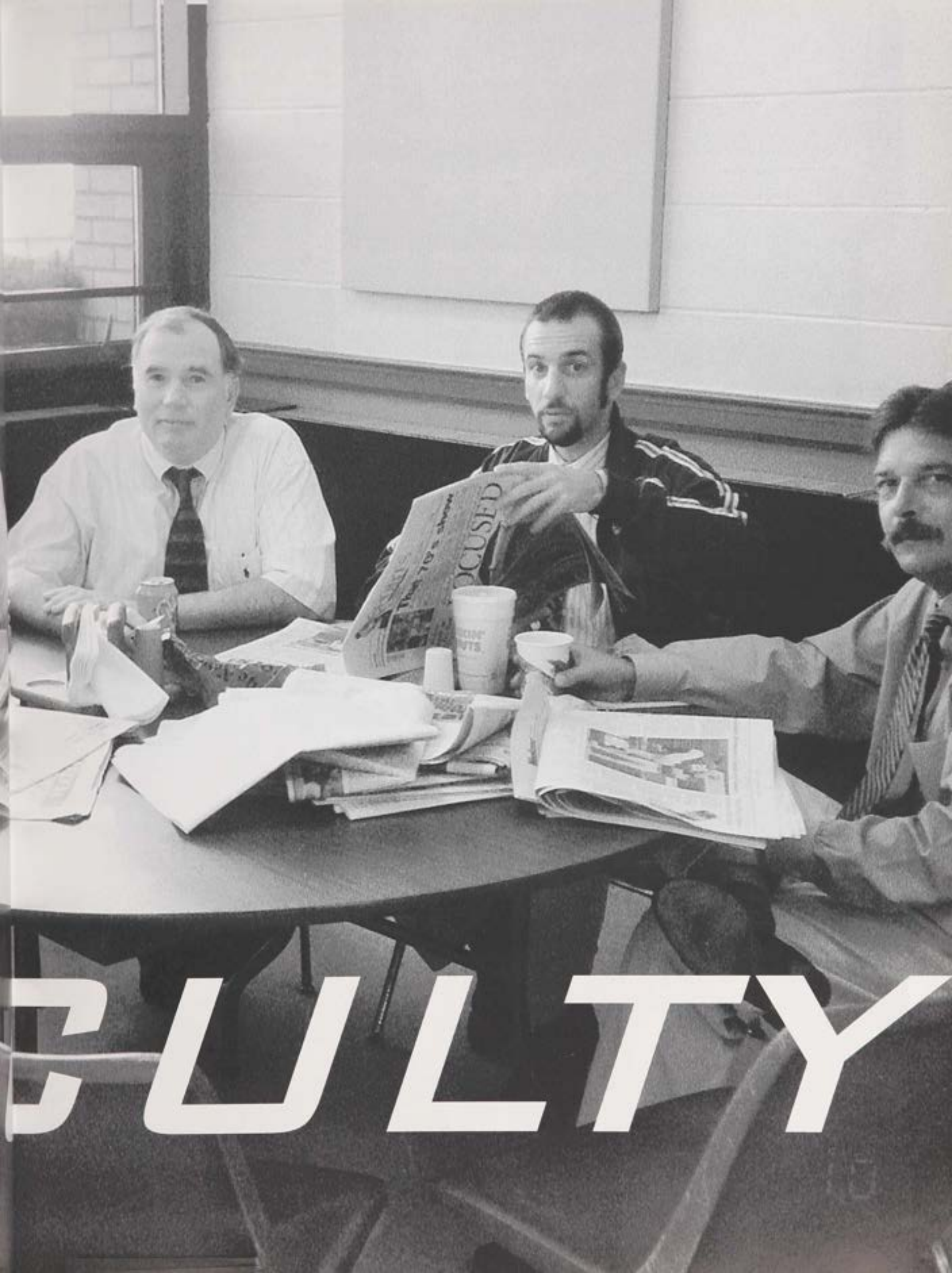
This faculty works in association. One can clearly see this as they interact among themselves. This faculty does not just work together, they pray together, rejoice together, mourn together and celebrate together.

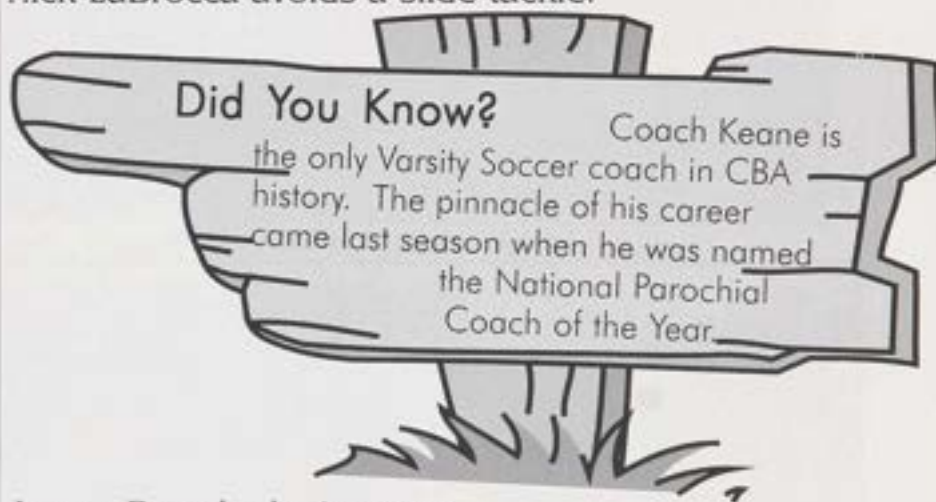
VARSITY SOCCER

The following Friday I attended my first school Mass. Before the liturgy started I looked across the McKay Gym and was awed by the presence of the entire Academy community gathered together in this setting.

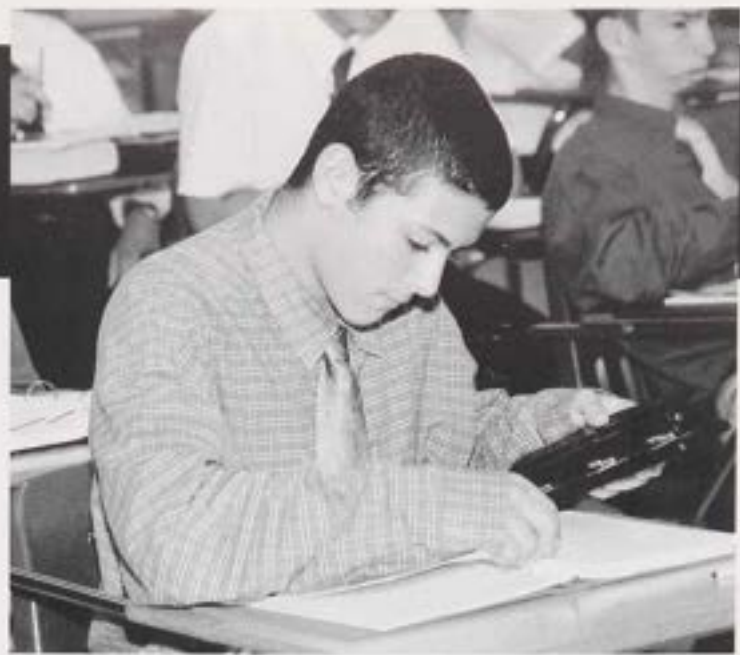
