





The busses still pull into the same driveway, the Crazies still cheer in the same gymnasium, and students still converse outside their lockers throughout the day. Time has flown, and will continue to fly, through the lives of us and our school.


SERVICE Brother Joseph Miggins


VARSITY VOLLEYBALL

throughout the year and return next year to compete at an even higher level. Is it possible to add another state championship team to CBA's collection? We sure hope so.






LaSallian Educator of the Year

Religious Studies



The CBA community was saddened in November as Brother Henry McGrath, a 20-year member of the Guidance Department, passed into eternal life.


Brother was honored in 1999 as the LaSallian Educator of the year.


SERVICE Brother Joseph Digits




throughout the year and return next year to compete at an even higher level. Is it possible to add another state championship team to CBA's collection? We sure hope so.




LaSallian Educator of the Year

Brother Michael Dwyer, FSC

With a life-long commitment to the spirit and values of the La Sallian tradition Brother Michael Dwyer has, over his seventeen years at CBA filled a variety of roles. Each endeavor he has undertaken as a minister of grace, as an effective manager and in association with his La Sallian colleagues. Bro. Michael came to CBA in 1986 and quickly established himself as one of the best teachers at the Academy. His knowledge of, and passion for, history are legendary among his students and colleagues. In 1991, and contrary to his personal interests, Bro. Michael took on the role of Associate Principal for Student Affairs. This was a demanding and time consuming position and one that took its toll on him. Even after suffering from a difficult physical illness, Bro. Michael remained in this position until 1996.

As Associate Principal, Bro. Michael was a strong and fair disciplinarian, acting out of concern for the students, the faculty and the overall welfare of CBA. He was encouraging of the work of the faculty and an enthusiastic



supporter of the initiatives of the students. Bro. Michael distinguished himself as the protector for the weaker students, with a special concern for those who were the object of abuse by their peers. He worked closely in association with his La Sallian colleagues in promoting the overall principles and objectives of the Academy.

Upon completion of his term as Associate Principal, Bro. Michael took the challenging step of returning to the teaching faculty. He has continued to remain a positive member of the faculty, offering encouragement to younger teachers and support to all of his colleagues. Administration





Religious Studies




The CBA community was saddened in November as Brother Henry McGrath, a 20-year member of the Guidance Department, passed into eternal life.

Brother was honored in 1999 as the LaSallian Educator of the year.


Well into the age when most people were enjoying retirement, Brother Henry continued his ministry to the Academy as freshman guidance counselor.
