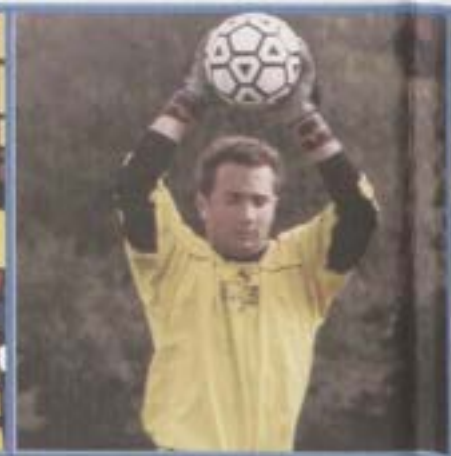

In Focus

Christian Brothers Academy

Fo • cus (fō'kes) n. The distinctness or clarity of an image.

Focus. It's a word we hear all the time: from teachers, parents, and coaches. Keep your focus. Stay focused. But what is focus? And how does one maintain focus at Christian Brothers Academy? High school can be so overwhelmingly complicated that focus is often hard to define and even harder to find. At the Academy, we are often forced to prioritize between schoolwork, clubs, sports, a social life, and the all-too neglected sleep. The CBA student has little opportunity to lose focus.

Our years in high school are filled with eventualities and glimpses into a future we so seldom comprehend; and yet, it is for this future that we must plan. Most students have trouble planning one day ahead, let alone four years. So, we all set goals for ourselves: to graduate, to win a state championship, to make it to summer, or even just the weekend. But how are these transcendent goals accomplished? It is through a series of individual, smaller accomplishments, for what is a goal but an accumulation of minor achievements. Therefore, graduation is achieved through eight semesters of consistent hard work. Even a passing grade for one semester takes five months of concentration. Winning a championship takes an entire year(s) of dedication. And those five days to the weekend usually feel more like a marathon than a sprint. The CBA student has little opportunity to lose focus.

Now that another year has passed and another class has emblazoned its mark on the Academy, the essence of our focus must change. What do we focus on after the fact? What stands out most about the CBA experience? We find that our failures fade to the background, there to help and not haunt us in the future. The long nights and early mornings of studying are recalled with more fondness than disdain. And singular moments, the baby steps toward reaching our ultimate goals, are indelibly marked in our memories. For once, the CBA student has the opportunity to gain focus. Thus, in the future, while our manifold accomplishments should remain with us, it will be those singular moments—the satisfaction of a hard-earned A, the euphoria of a last-second score, the spontaneous laughter of a classroom of friends—that will echo through time, that will bring a smile to our faces, and that will forever keep our experiences at the Academy IN FOCUS.

In Focus

For the senior class, this last year at the Academy was the hardest of their scholastic career. In addition to a demanding advanced course load, the past nine months have been marked by the trials of the college admissions process. For most, this hectic search for the "perfect college" began over a year ago with basic internet research and some preliminary school visits. Many students had begun strengthening their transcripts by taking SAT II Subject Tests and Advanced Placement Exams. Almost all seniors had at least two sittings of the SAT I test under their belts by September. When this school year finally started, even the more prepared students were in a mad dash to complete the many parts of their applications. In addition to the actual forms, there was still much to be done. The mere practice of writing strong, meaningful essays that best expressed the author's character and virtue was enough to monopolize weeks of time and effort. Like the relieving calm after a storm, the pressure disappeared shortly after Christmas, as the first students began receiving their letters of acceptance from top-choice schools. Gradually, the entire class realized the rewards of such hard work throughout the year, and the acceptance letters rolled in until mid-April. The final step of the college process was the easiest: walking up to Brother Ralph in the company of friends and family and receiving that well-earned CBA diploma.

This past year the group set the standard for CBA dances, organizing a Christmas benefit dance that funded the bi-monthly street ministry trips to Asbury Park.

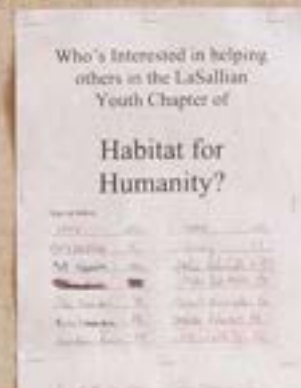
Last summer CBA send a group of eight to Providence, RI to participate in the annual East Coast LaSallian Youth Conference.

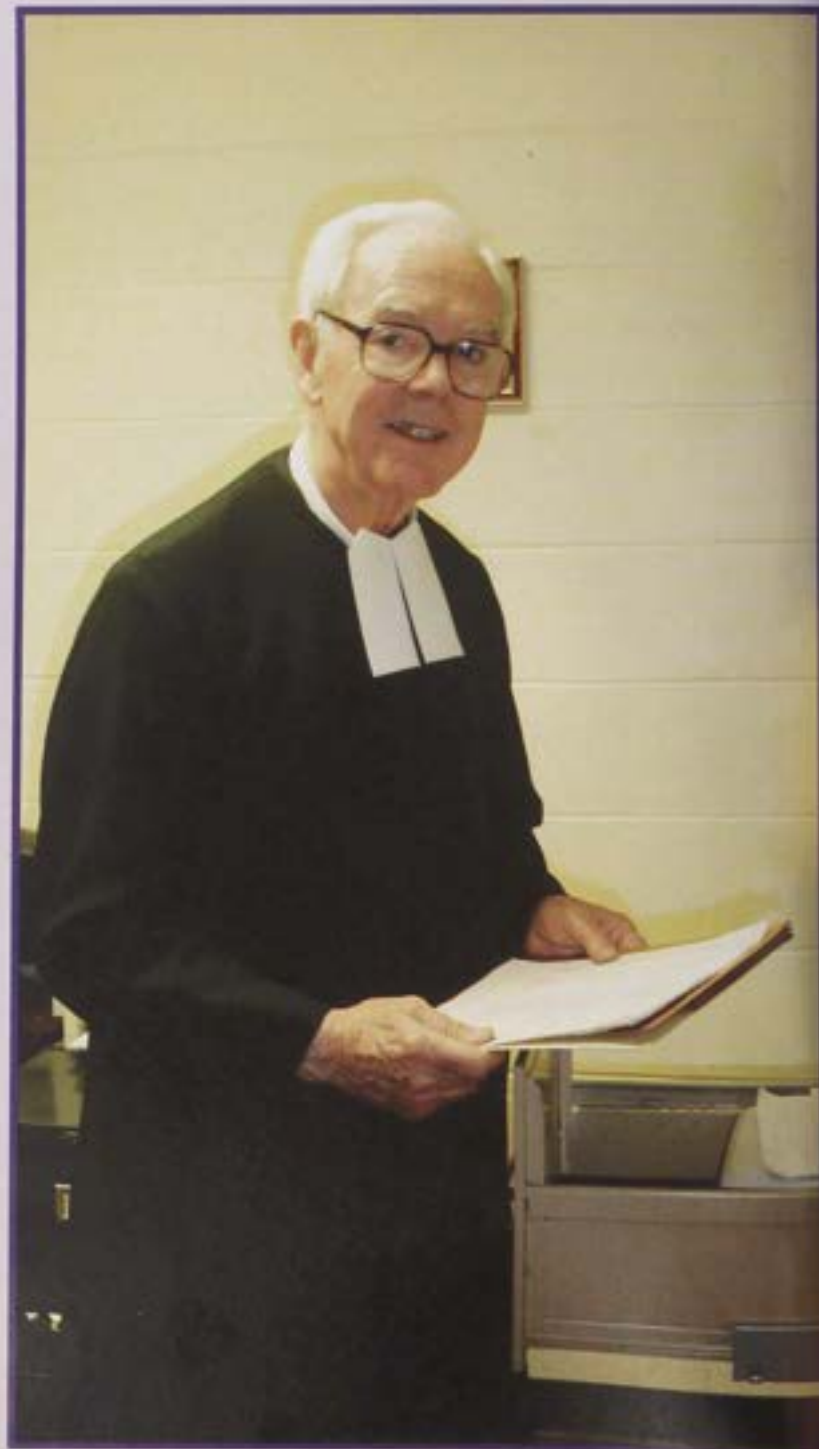

In-Focus

Since 1994, the CBA service project has played an integral role in the life of many CBA students. Each student, under the supervision of Brother Joseph Miggins, is required to complete a minimum of fifty hours of community service throughout his CBA career. Inspired by the La Sallian spirit, many students choose to go far beyond this minimum. Students engage in such activities as making sandwiches for the needy, raising money for charities, serving in soup kitchens, tutoring English as a Second Language, and participating in local volunteer organizations. For CBA students, the service project is an opportunity both to grow in faith and to form close relationships with the people they serve. The service project is rooted in one of the underlying principles of CBA's educational philosophy: that a complete education must provide for character and moral growth as well as intellectual achievement.

One option for the CBA Service Program is at the Red Bank Charter School, a small public school alternative in downtown Red Bank. Every year, RBCS holds an after school tutoring program called Study Buddy. This year, two CBA seniors, Anthony Squillaro and Phil Dumontet, participated in the program and tutored third graders. They met with the children on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 4-5 PM every week to tutor in math, English, reading, and more. The students benefited greatly from Phil and Anthony's hard work and dedication.

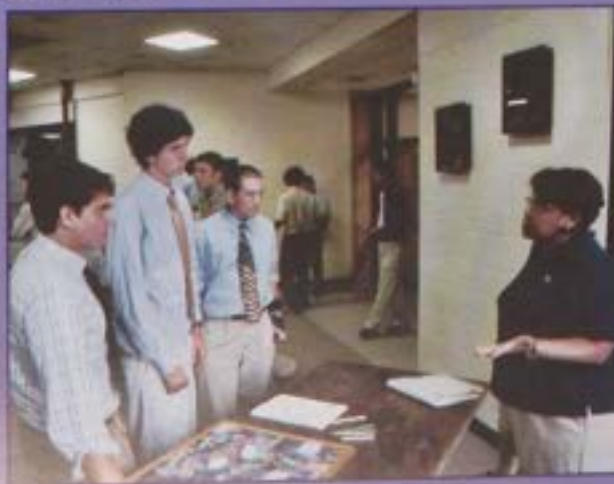
Above: Reverend Elmer Ray Jackson of the West Side Christian Academy always draws a crowd at the Christian Service assembly.

In Focus

Christian Service Learning is an option to fulfill the CBA senior religious studies requirement. One of the key draws to this class is that it is one of the few cooperative learning programs offered by the Academy. The applicants who are accepted for this class tackle their fourth year of religion class both in the classroom and in the community. The classroom course is directed towards the issues of peace and justice. They study the social problems facing people today throughout the world. By far the more important aspect of the course is the off-campus learning. Each student involved is required to do two hours of service each week. Students in the Christian Service class choose a particular service agency, tutoring program, or nursing home and participate in an ongoing service project. The goal of this program is to turn out students who are not only aware of issues regarding social justice, but actively exercising their baptismal commitment of service to the poor.



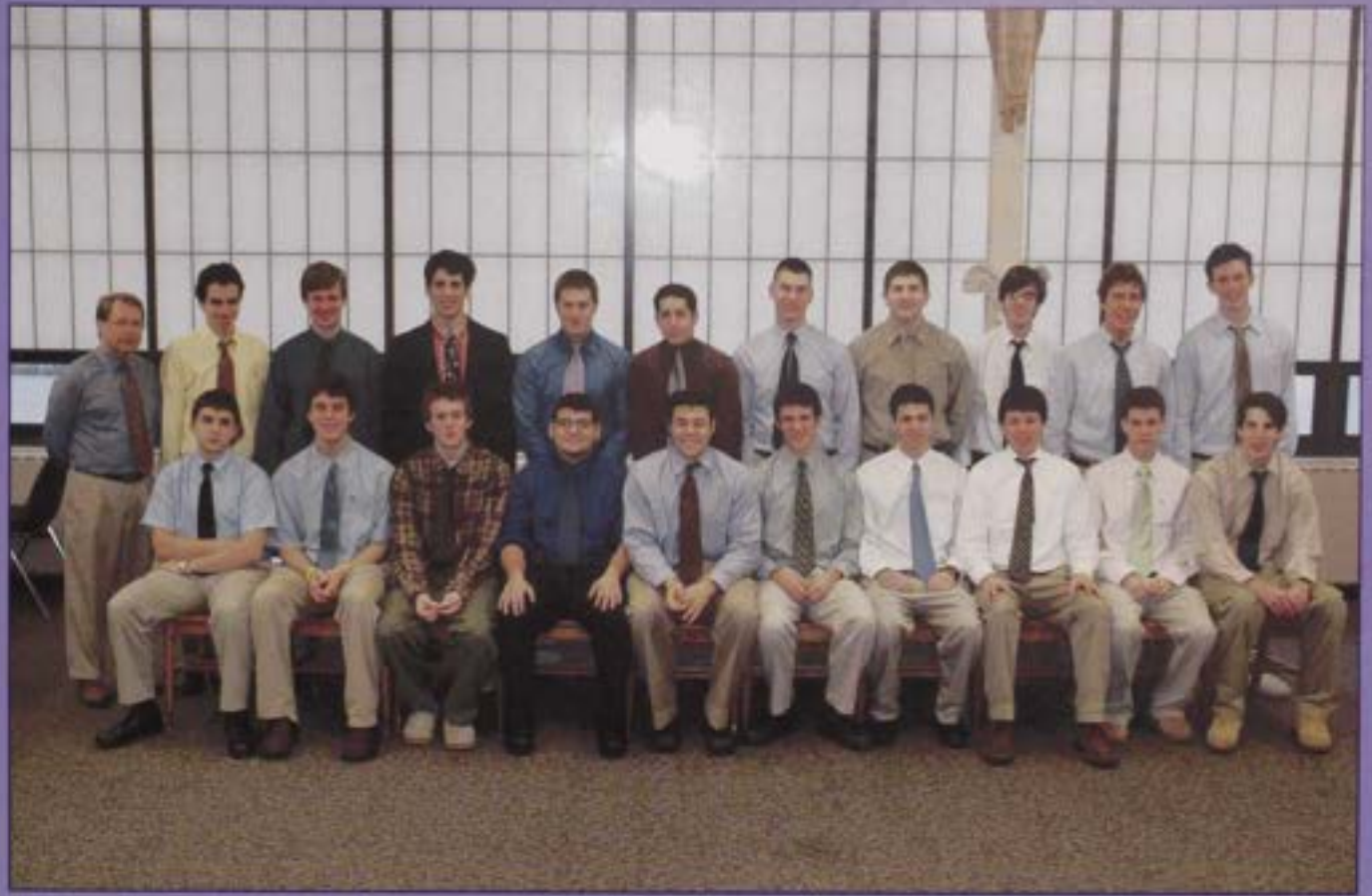

GURU, short for "Give Us Religious Understanding," is a peer ministry program unique to CBA. The program is intended both to help freshmen make the transition from grammar school to high school and to provide spiritual and moral guidance for them. The GURU program is ministered by select CBA seniors, who lead small groups of freshman in discussion and reflection. Topics of discussion include the Gospels and the meaning of the Beatitudes, peer pressure, world affairs, and issues facing adolescents in general. The program culminates in the Freshman Day of Recollection, a day of retreat and prayer run by the GURUs. Dr. Koch acts as the program's advisor, instructing senior peer ministers in the intricacies of group psychology. Because of its unmatched combination of peer guidance and scholarship, the GURU program has become one of the most sought-after and enriching aspects of the CBA experience.

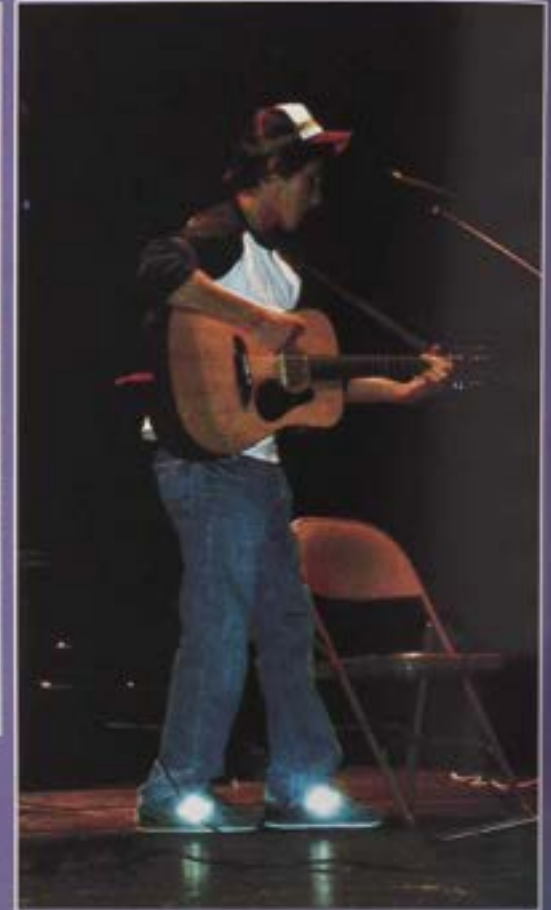

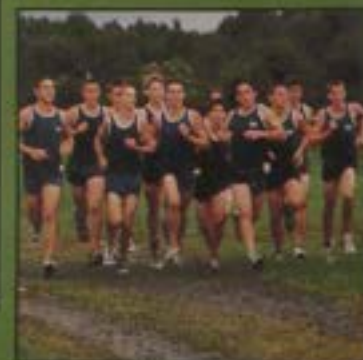

Varsity Cross Country

The CBA Cross Country team had a truly historic 2004 season. The team stamped its way to its 31st consecutive undefeated dual meet season enroute to its 266th straight dual meet victory, a national record. The team didn't stop there, extending the record to 268 before season's end. The Colts continued their record-breaking season with dominating performances in the Monmouth County Championships, Catholic Conference Championships, Parochial A Championships, and the Meet of Champions. This string of victories earned the Colts an invitation to the first-ever National Championships in Oregon, where they culminated the season with an impressive 11th place finish.



In Focus

September 30, 2004: the culmination of 31 years of hard work and determination. As a corral of Colts crosses the finish line in the dual meet versus Middletown North, Coach Tom Heath's dream, set in his sights for over twenty years, has come true. The Colts have broken the national record for most consecutive dual meet victories with their 266th straight win. Coach Heath is not just a legend at CBA, he's an institution, leading CBA's perennially unbeatable Cross Country teams for (33 or 34) years. This season was one of Coach Heath's finest and one of the most memorable in school history, with a record-breaking regular season and an invitation to the National Championships. He's still not fully satisfied, however, as he looks forward to 2005, with an eye toward extending the streak even further.

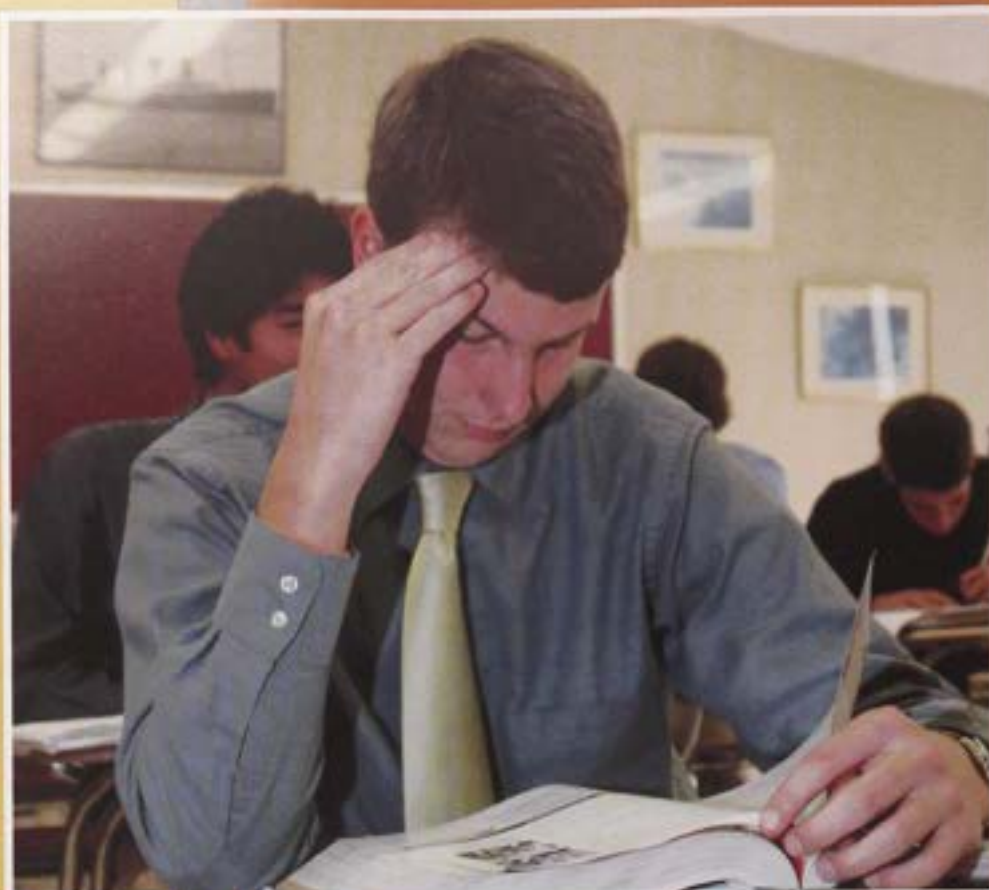


In Focus

In Focus

Each year, the faculty chooses one of its own to be recognized as the Lasallian Educator of the Year. Unlike other schools who choose their teachers of the year based on longevity, popularity or student performance, the CBA community is challenged to recognize those teachers who, while they may have each of the aforementioned criteria, enliven their teaching and student interaction in the spirit of St. John Baptist de La Salle. It was De La Salle who instructed his Brothers to "touch the hearts" of their students.

This year the CBA community is happy to recognize Dr. Garry Koch as the Lasallian Educator of the Year. A member of the faculty since 1982, Dr. Koch teaches Religious Studies, supervises the GURU/Peer Ministry Program and is adviser to the National Honor Society and co-adviser of the yearbook. Over the years he has also taught Psychology and World History and was director of the intramural sports program. In addition, Doc is the timekeeper and announcer for home basketball and wrestling games.

Dr. Koch is a faith-driven individual who sees his commitment to Catholicism and the Lasallian tradition as essential elements in his life. Doc's concern for his students and availability to them outside the classroom attests to this devotion.

In addition to teaching at CBA, Dr. Koch is an instructor in the Diaconate and Catechetical Formation Programs for the Diocese of Trenton. He writes the weekly Scripture column for The Monitor and is a guest columnist for The Asbury Park Press.

On November 19, 2004, Dr. Koch was recognized as the Lasallian Educator of the Year for the New York District of the Brothers of the Christian Schools, only the second CBA teacher to be so honored. As he noted in a letter to the faculty, "I am also keenly cognizant that the District Award is extended to the entire Academy and not simply to me as a person."

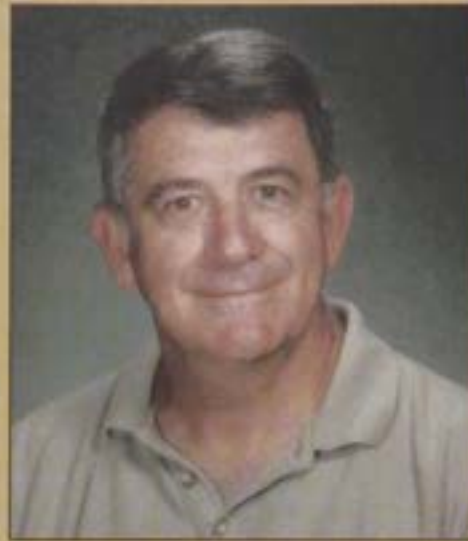

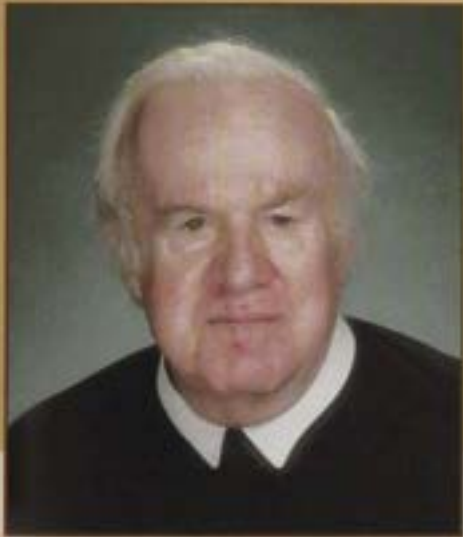

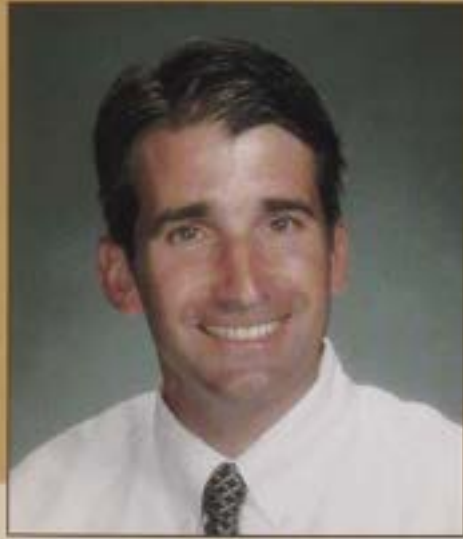

Brother Ralph arrived at Christian Brothers as Campus Minister in 1983. In 1986 Brother was assigned as the Assistant Principal for Student Affairs, working with then Principal Brother Andrew O'Gara and Mr. Peter Santanello, Assistant Principal for Academic Affairs. It was in 1991, when Brother was named Principal of the Academy. At the same time, Brother Andrew was named President and Brother Michael Dwyer took the position of Assistant Principal for Student Affairs. During Brother's 14 year tenure, the longest of any CBA principal, Mr. Santanello has continued to hold the position of Academic Dean. However, Brother Augustine Nicoletti, Brother Daniel Gardner and presently Brother James Dries, have served in the capacity as Deans of Students.

Brother Ralph's time at CBA has been marked by many important accomplishments. We have seen the completion of two major building programs, plus other changes to the physical plant. Brother oversaw the furnishing of the School Chapel, including purchasing the Stations of the Cross on a trip to Paris. Along with members of the Father's and Mother's Clubs, Brother planned and executed the plans for the celebration of the Academy's 25th and 40th Anniversaries.

Intending to make sure that CBA has maintained its position as a premier Catholic High School in the LaSallian Tradition, Brother implemented an expansion of the academic programs, including the addition of the wide array of advanced placement programs presently available. To that end, there has been a steady growth in the faculty, enabling both more course selections and small class sizes.

Among the accomplishments for which Brother is most noted is his development of the CBA Service Program. In keeping with the LaSallian mission of the school, the Academy now requires each student to complete a minimum of service hours per year.

Most importantly, however, Brother Ralph exercised a leadership style punctuated by empowerment. Reflecting the LaSallian characteristics of Effective Management and Collegiality, Brother enabled his professional colleagues and the students at CBA, to achieve ownership of their work by being free to challenge themselves and others.

In recognition of his many talents and great contributions to CBA, the faculty honored him as the LaSallian Educator of the Year in 2001.

At that time, Mr. Santanello said of Brother Ralph: "His priority is always sure to share his deep faith, time and many talents with the students and lead them to the Lord in any way that he can...Brother works together with his associates to foster a collegial style of administration. In fact, he corrects any associate member of his administration who uses the word 'I.' It is always 'we' -- the administration of 'we' the CBA community."

The CBA community expresses its deepest gratitude for the grace that has been ours in Brother Ralph Montedoro and bid him best wishes as he moves on. It is with fondest affection and personal regards that this community sends him forth, hoping that some day he can return and again bless us with his talents and spirit.

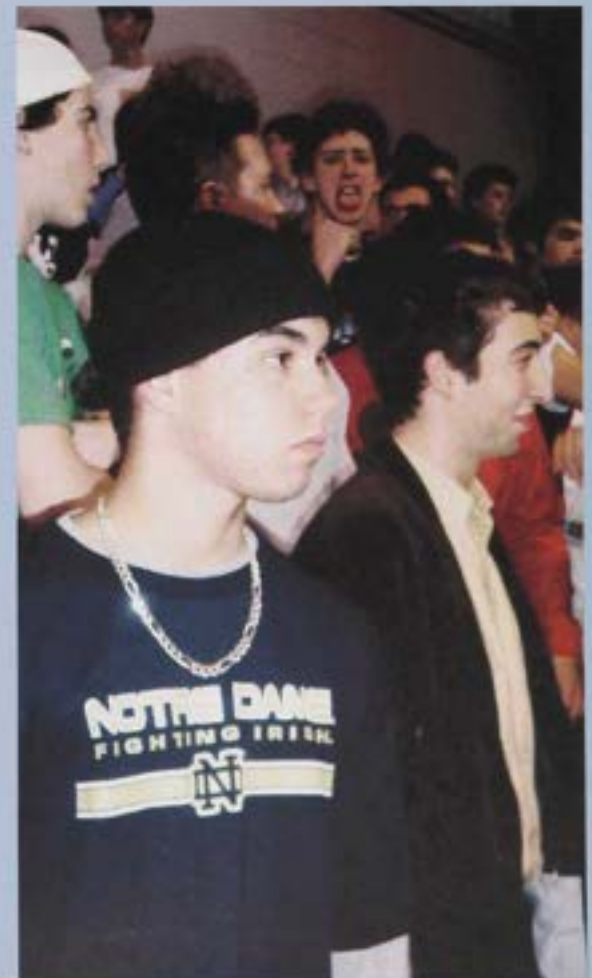
