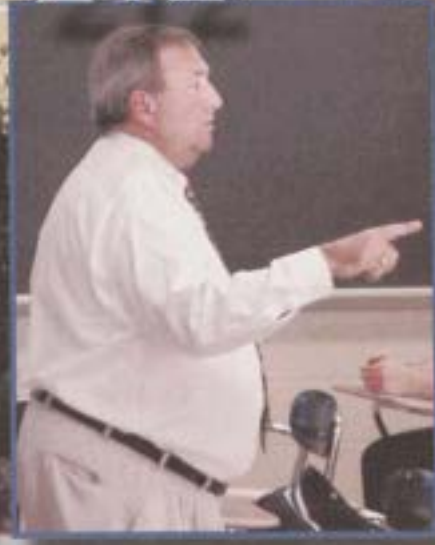
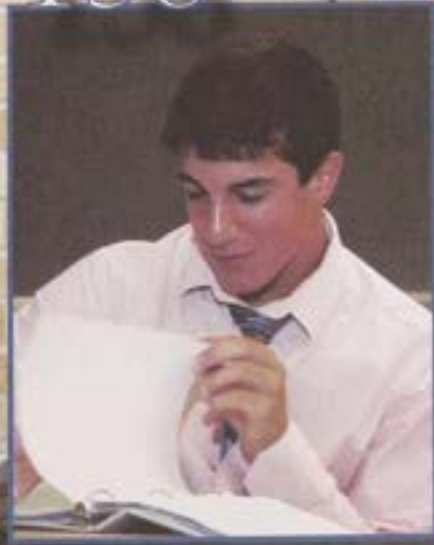

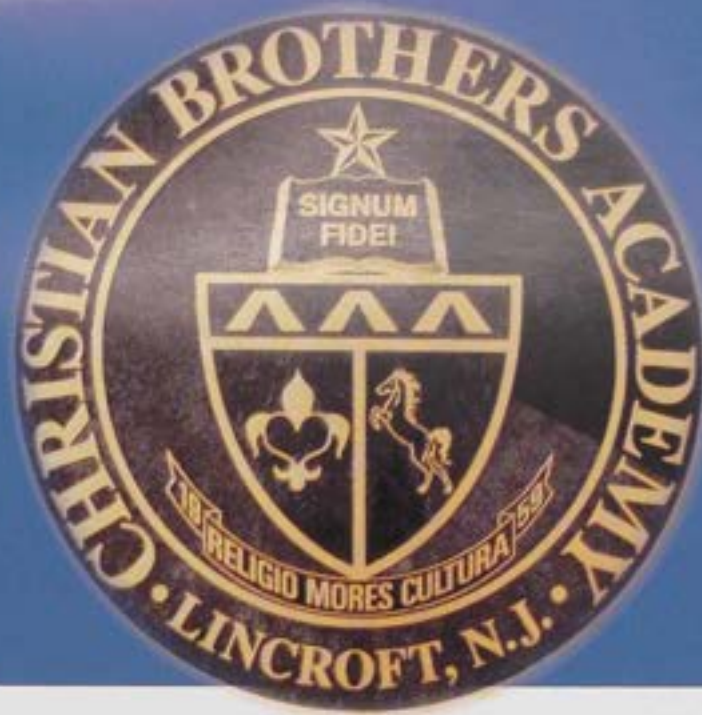

A New Look

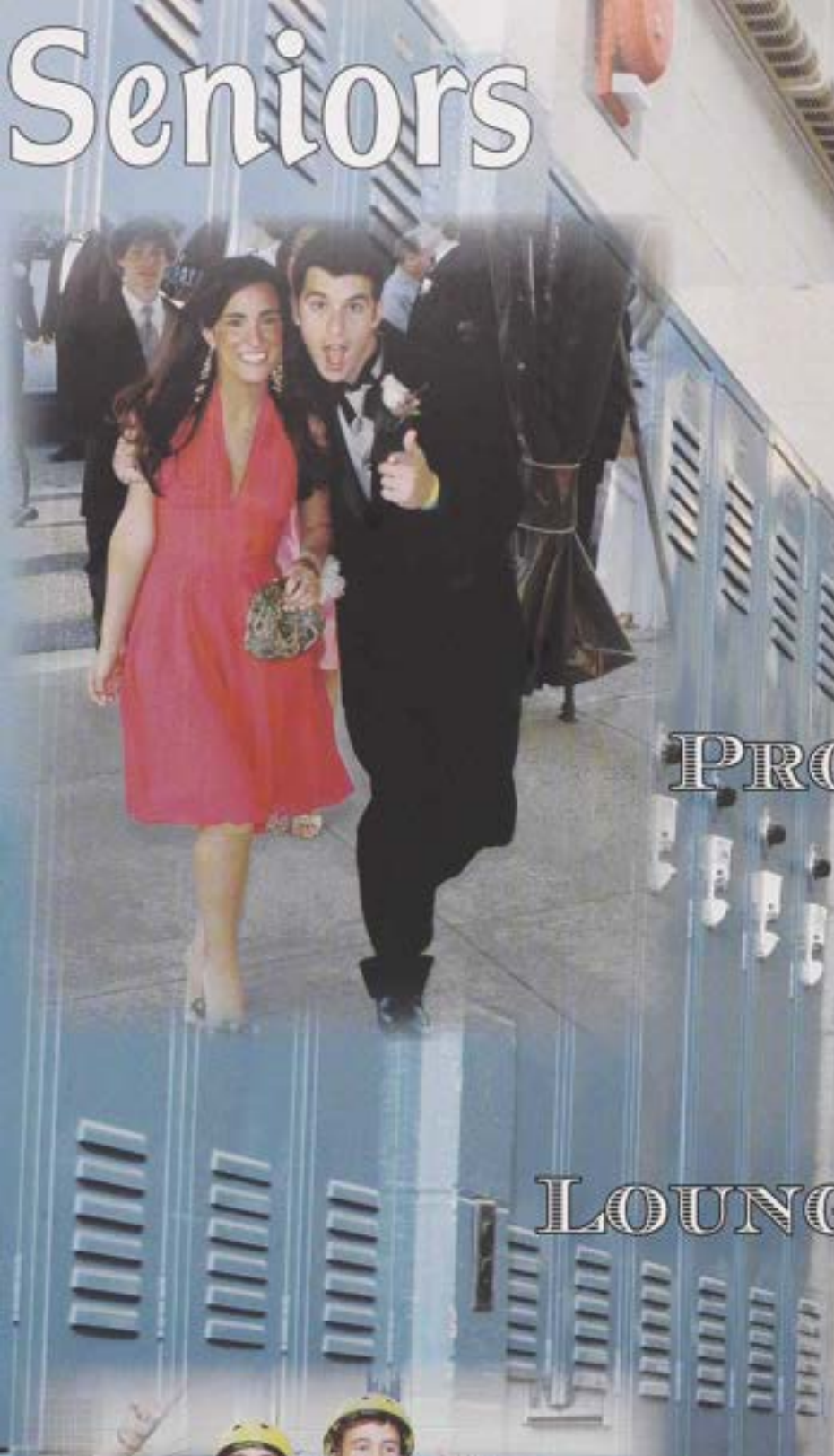
It is a banality to observe that appearances are deceptive. Nevertheless, we are often deceived by any change in look. Over the past year, CBA has witnessed much change, some of it profound, and it would be no small understatement to say that the academy has a new look. Fundamentally, however, the school has retained the core characteristics that mark it out from other high schools and that make its education so distinct.

For alumni, the most obvious change in the school's appearance is the new principal, Brother Stephen Olert. Brother Steven, who replaces Brother Ralph, has spent the past six years in the environs of the campus, the first three as director of De LaSalle Hall, the next three as Assistant Provincial. He hopes to strengthen the LaSallian nature of Christian Brothers academy and to emphasize the religious and moral components of a sound and well-balanced education.

There are many other changes as well. The CBA faculty welcomed several new teachers this year. In the fall, Brother Andrew gave the opening kick to inaugurate the new soccer fields that were built on the property, complete with an underground sprinkler system. There is also a new sign at the entrance to the campus.

CBA's new look reflects the constant struggle humans face when confronted with change. Change is necessary and unavoidable; at the same time, however, too much change can lead to deracination and chaos. Every student at the academy must confront the demands of change, both those of adolescence and those of high school. Ultimately, the results of this change are rewarding: the student leaves CBA with a firm academic, moral, and spiritual preparation for the future. Such a solid preparation is possible because, despite a new look, CBA retains its strong LaSallian tradition, its commitment to excellence, and its tightly knit community.

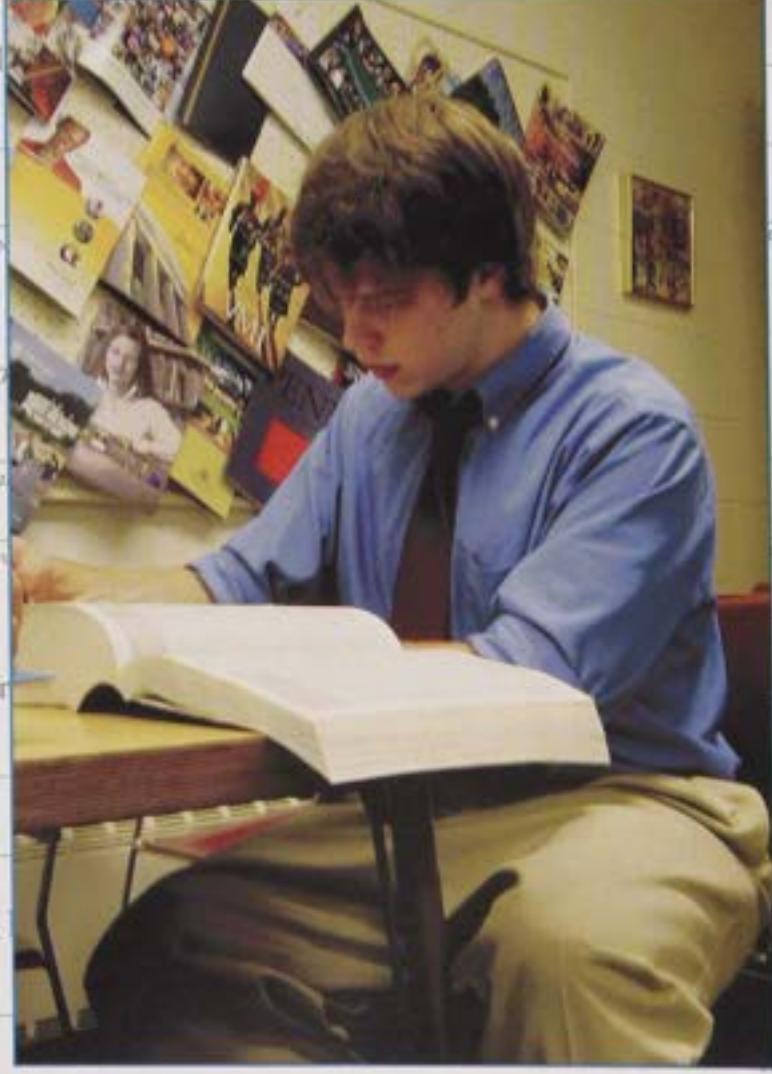
COMMON APPLICATION college apps 2005-2006

The CBA Soccer season began with Brother Andrew O'Gara's ceremonial first kick to open the brand new soccer fields. Led by Coach Jeffrey Matson and Coach Dan Keane, the Colts finished the season with a 10-6-1 record, earning seven of their wins at home. Captains Justin Kahle and Matt Savolskis provided the Colts with strong leadership. Junior Scott McCaliff was solid in his first goalkeeping season for the white and blue. McCaliff recorded five shutouts, including eight games where he only gave up one goal. Another key junior was Mike Rizzoli, who led the team in scoring and will be next year's co-captain along with Tim Brady. The Colts reached the quarter-finals of the Shore Conference, the semifinals of the State Sectional Tournament, and placed tenth in the shore.

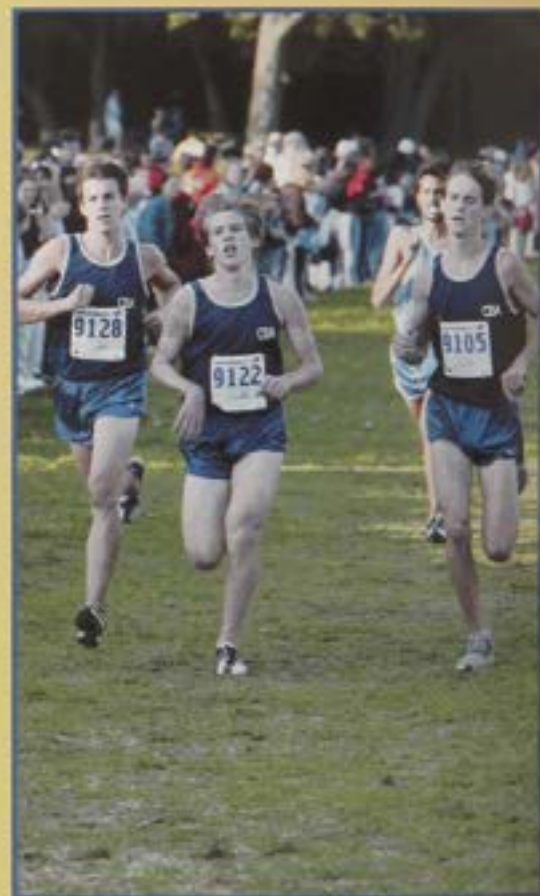
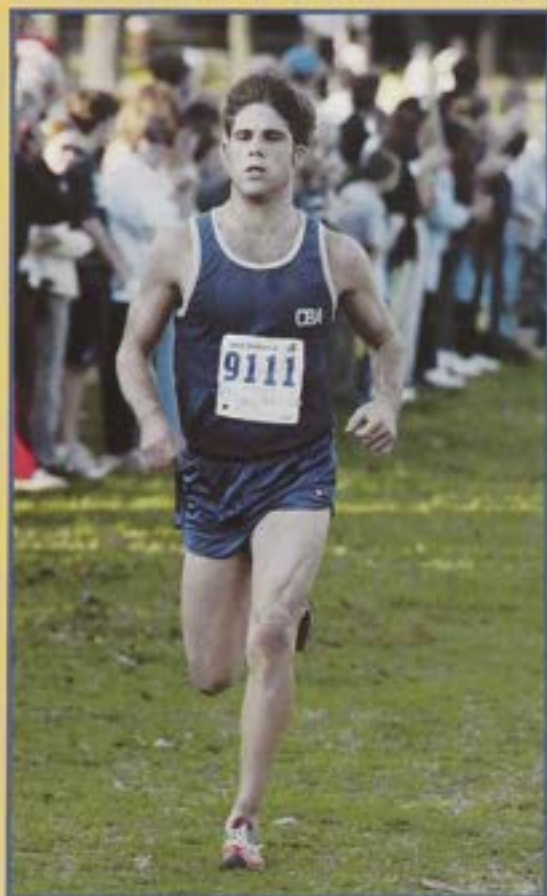

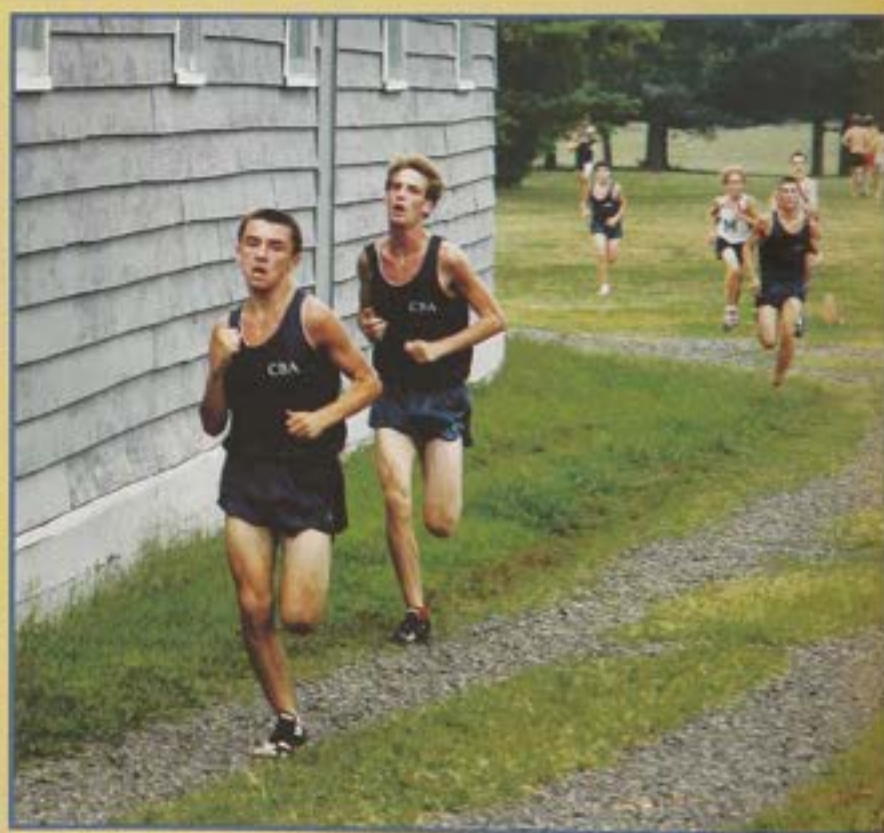




The CBA Cross Country team continued their great achievements in 2005 under Coach Heath. The team extended its national record of dual-meet victories to 275, marking its 32nd consecutive season of undefeated success. The Colts finished a stellar first place in the Monmouth County Championships, Shore Conference Tournament, Catholic Conference Championships, Parochial A Championships, and the Meet Of Champions. The Colts highlighted their season when they set a New Jersey state record for the Five Man Average at Holmdel Park with a time of 16:15.6. Kevin Rogers, Chris Horel, Greg Leach, Chris Lombardi, and Anthony Pellegrino made up the record setting team. The team went on to compete in the National Championships in Oregon for the second year in a row. Led by a tenth overall finish by Kevin Rogers, the Colts placed eighth overall. The Colts' success in 2005 ranked them the eighth best high school cross country team in the nation.

This year, the seniors were a dominating force as they provided leadership, poise, and concentration both on the court and off. Stevens Tech-bound Matt Higgins was the Runner-Up 6th Man of the Shore, Sean Light is headed to be a Mountaineer, Dan Werner made First Team All-State, was the State Player of the Year and the Shore Player of the year, to name a few honors, and signed a letter of intent to NC State, Co-Captain Tim Andree made Second Team All-Monmouth and First Team All-Division and is headed to Notre Dame, Co-Captain Craig Woehnker is headed to Merrimack, and Jon Haspilaire, who brought energy off the bench throughout the season, hopes to play at Fairfield.



The CBA Basketball team had another great season under Coach Wicelinski who picked up his 600th career victory. Led by seniors Dan Werner, Tim Andree, and Craig Woehnker, along with juniors Derek Becker and Spencer Van Wagoner, the Colts went undefeated and won the Class A North Division. Senior Matt Higgins and juniors Justin Schwartz and Will Grier provided the team with sparks off the bench. The regular season ended with a 12-game win streak and was highlighted by a 53-52 victory over St. Patricks at the Convention Hall in Asbury. Before 3,500 spectators, the Colts won their 14th Shore Conference Tournament 65-56 over Monsignor Donovan. The team finished first in the Shore Conference and ranked second in the state by Gannett N.J.

In class, Dr. Koch advises the peer ministers in group psychology and how to get the most out of each member of their group. The GURUs are graded both by their in-class work and how they perform with their freshman group, through the freshmen teachers and their assignments. Their work helps to begin a four-year spiritual journey for the class of 2009.
