VENAVER: COME AND SEE

The Christian Brothers San Francisco District established the VENAVER Program in 1988. "Venaver" means, "come to see" in Spanish. Annually up to 15 Lasallian schools (both colleges and high schools) send groups of students (5-10 in number) to Tijuana, Mexico to participate in a program of service, prayer, community building and cross-cultural awareness. For the first time in the history of the program, a school from the Christian Brothers New York district has participated.


Mr. Sewnig and Mr. Thawley accompanied 5 CBA students (Jimmy Hamill '08, Chris Cangialosi '09, Mike Dzema '09, Sam Holanov '10 and Eric Nordgaard '11) during their Holy Week participation in VENAVER.

When interviewed by the Asbury Park Press about their experience, Jimmy Hamill recalled the joy on the faces of the children he met, in spite of the economic poverty in which they lived. Chris Cangialosi recalled the "town dump site" as an experience that left a lasting impression; where students distributed 250 lunches to men, woman and children who live along the side of the town dump in conditions that rival some of the worst living conditions on the face of the Earth.

Mr. Sewnig and Mr. Thawley both sensed it was a prophetic and moving experience to be with some of the poorest of the poor on Good Friday.

Following the trip, several local newspapers came to the campus to interview the students. Articles appeared in the Asbury Park Press, The Monmouth Journal and The Monitor among others.













































The Rude Awakening Program

Founded by the Middletown EMS in 1994, The Rude Awakening Program has existed in the Township of Middletown for the past ten years. The program, over the past five years, has gained tremendous momentum. Through untiring efforts, preparation, and execution by the Middletown Township Police Department, the program has sent a clear and somber message to high school students regarding the devastating consequences of drinking and driving. The program consists of speakers from law enforcement, municipal court judges, lawyers, nurses, social workers, physical therapists, dentists, and parents of those lost from drunk driving incidences. Along with the assembly, the students experience what driving drunk really feels like. DWI Fatal Vision goggles simulate impairment while the students drive a golf cart through a coned-off course. Along with the hands on application, there is a basketball toss and a sponge toss while wearing the Fatal Vision goggles. Also students observed a mock car crash whereby police, fire, first aid, and paramedics would be dispatched. An Airbag simulator is also set up to deploy actual airbags, which demonstrate the forces on the body from the airbag while the passenger is unrestrained/restrained.










Academic Team


JSA




French Club is made up of members who seek to deepen their understanding to the French way of life. The language is further learned. Understanding the culture is also a goal of the club.








Italian Culture Society








Varsity Baseball


SENIOR YEAR:
