Turning the Page

50th Celebration

Christian Brothers Academy first opened its doors in September 1959. The renovation of one of the stables on the former Jay Cee farms (sold to the Brothers by Linacres, Inc) initially provided for eight classrooms. The farm had formerly been the famed Greentree Farm. These classrooms would eventually be named after the chairman of the building drive; Mr. John C. Henderson of Navesink River Road, Middletown. The stable was one of nine buildings on the 157 acre estate and sheltered some of the finest race horses in the country. Equipoise, a chestnut Stallion, who was a frequent visitor to Henderson room 3, is ranked #21 of the top thoroughbreds of the 20th Century. He sired Shout Out who won the 1942 Kentucky Derby and Belmont Stakes. Many of the colts and fillies on the estate were moved to Kentucky in the late 1950s, and in September of 1959, a new breed of colts came to be sheltered in Henderson.

A page was turned in the history of the estate, and on September 7th, at 8:45 am, 140 freshmen arrived to begin their first day of High School at Christian Brothers Academy. Six Christian Brothers greeted the men and offered them instruction in college preparatory courses. Brother Bernard McKenna greeted the men as they exited buses in jacket and tie. My mid-April of 1960 ground was broken for the construction of a one million dollar, 15 room school building, library and gymnasium south-east of the existing school. And a new page in the history of the Academy was begun with the construction of the main school building.

The next major project was Project 80s announced in March 1983 by Brother Andrew OGara, then principal of the Academy. Project 80s was a \$2.5 million development program that would assure that the Academy continues its excellent academic tradition through the 80s and beyond. As the Academy celebrated its 25th anniversary, ground was broken and construction begun for a chapel, a 330 seat theater, an additional 8 classrooms and a computer learning center. Renovations were also made to Henderson Hall. And the page was turned again as the Academy, led by men of vision, responded to the needs of their time.

The ink had not yet dried on Project 80s when a new page was written with Project 2000. Brother Andrew again wanted to prepare his graduates for the future by offering them a campus that met their needs. In the Fall of 1996 ground was broken for a new wing (that would include classrooms and science labs) and new gymnasium. The cafeteria was air conditioned, and new windows were installed. All of these additions are taken for granted today as simply part of our daily life here at CBA. It was Brother Andrews vision and hard work that made it a reality.

And we now come upon an historic time in the history of any institution: 50 years !

This year we are turning the page on half a century of educating young men in the LaSallian tradition. As the school looks toward celebrating the 50th; we as seniors look back on just our four years here at the academy with grateful hearts for having been a part of this great history. It was with great pride and solemnity that we welcomed our First President back to these hollowed halls of the Academy he helped to build following his passing. We are grateful for having had the opportunity to know Brother Andrew and have him cheer us on at sporting events. It was with equal passion that we accompanied the Wheeler family in their loss of a brother and son; and our loss of a teacher, coach and friend. The dark and cold days of November were bitter; but we endured, we supported one another, we held each other up when we were weak, and we came together as a community of faith believing in the resurrection in spite of our tears! Glory Days !

With Brother Andrews passing, a chapter is closed, a page is turned and although a new chapter will be written about the Academy, Brother Andrew's spirit and memory will endure as surely as every time we hear "Live Jesus in our hearts" we will belt out with pride "forever"!

In September most graduates will begin our college life, just as the Academy begins to celebrate its 50th anniversary. Our yearbook cover alludes to this fact, as it reflects the history of the Academy through the images of every yearbook the Academy has ever published. We wish the Academy well as it turns toward its Golden Jubilee.

In its day the Greentree/Jay Cee Farms produced some top thoroughbred colts for the 20th Century. In our own time, Christian Brothers Academy had fostered some top LaSallian colts to be men of integrity and promise for the 21st Century !

Men of the Class of 2009:

One of my favorite characters in the English literary canon is Shakespeare's Prospero from his last play, *The Tempest*. Among the many memorable lines Prospero, an exiled Duke and fearsome magician, tosses off in perfect iambic pentameter is this one: "Past is prologue."

Fundamentally, I think he's right. Though your high school career had many memorable moments which have formed you, they do not define you. Your future actions do. The senior year I have shared with you has in turn been sometimes comical (as in the water main break necessitating a spontaneous holiday), sometimes triumphant (as in the basketball victory over St. Anthony's at Monmouth), unbelievably poignant on two November occasions, giving tragic reminder alike of the evanescent fragility of life and the unyielding strength of our connections. It remains to be seen, though, what you will make of these experiences in the future.

Christian Brothers Academy has doubtless been a fantastic and inimitable "prologue" to your college careers and adult life. Just as our yearbook theme reminds us, while we at CBA are **turning the page** to our golden jubilee year, you are turning the page to a new series of magnificent and life-transforming experiences for which you are well prepared, turning from the prologue to the body of the story if you will. And how might I wish that story to turn out—at least insofar as CBA is concerned? My mind turns to some lines from a popular song of your senior year, Coldplay's *Viva La Vida*. In the refrain, the speaker observes to his addressee:

Be my mirror, my sword and shield
My missionaries in a foreign field.

I think those words sum it up perfectly, if we remember that CBA is a community, a family, and replace "my" with the more inclusive "our":

- **Be our mirror:** Reflect wherever you go the values you were taught here, the standards of character and manhood you were taught to aspire after, the examples you have had;
- **Be our sword:** Be strong and assertive in doing what is right and opposing what is wrong, even when you have to go it alone;
- **Be our shield:** Treasure the bond of brotherhood you have had here and look after each other whenever the opportunity presents itself;
- **Be our missionaries in a foreign field:** Whether you are off to Monmouth University or the West Coast, remember that your actions and attitudes will lead people to form an impression of the Academy. I am sure it will be a positive one.

Though it has only been a prologue, I trust Christian Brothers Academy has set up the *magnum opus* of your lives well. I look forward to discovering how the story turns out!

He has also completed graduate studies at the Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C., the University of Tasmania, Australia, and the University of Pennsylvania, Philadelphia. Prior to coming to CBA, Brother James' assignments included: Project Director, Reconfiguration of East Coast Provinces of the Christian Brothers 2006-2008; Assistant Provincial/Director of Education and Provincial Pro Tem, Baltimore Province of the Christian Brothers 2003-2007; Instructor at Bethlehem University and Calvert Hall College High School, Baltimore, 2002-2003; Assistant Principal, Academics, and Director of the Brothers Community, Hudson Catholic High School, Jersey City, 1999-2002.

On July 1, 2008, Brother Frank Byrne, FSC, Provincial of the New York District, appointed Brother James as CBA principal on the recommendation of the Board of Trustees, in consultation with Brother Andrew O'Gara, then President of Christian Brothers Academy.

Name Change

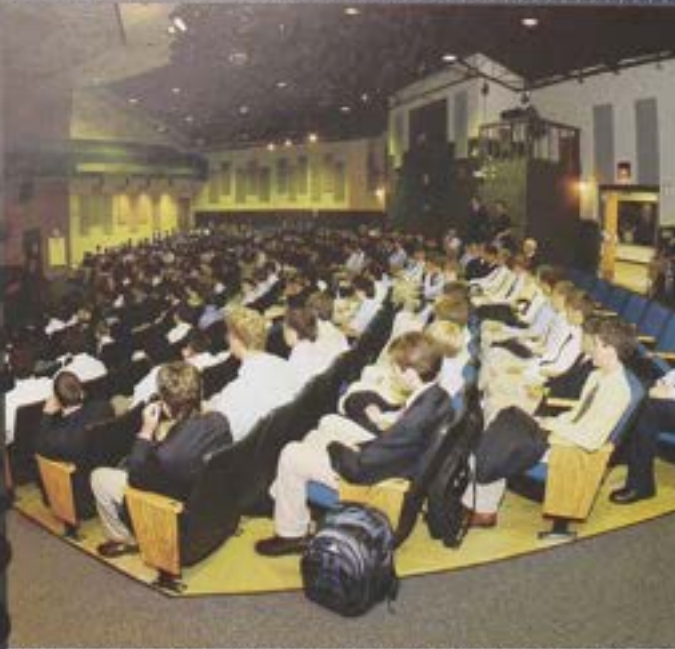

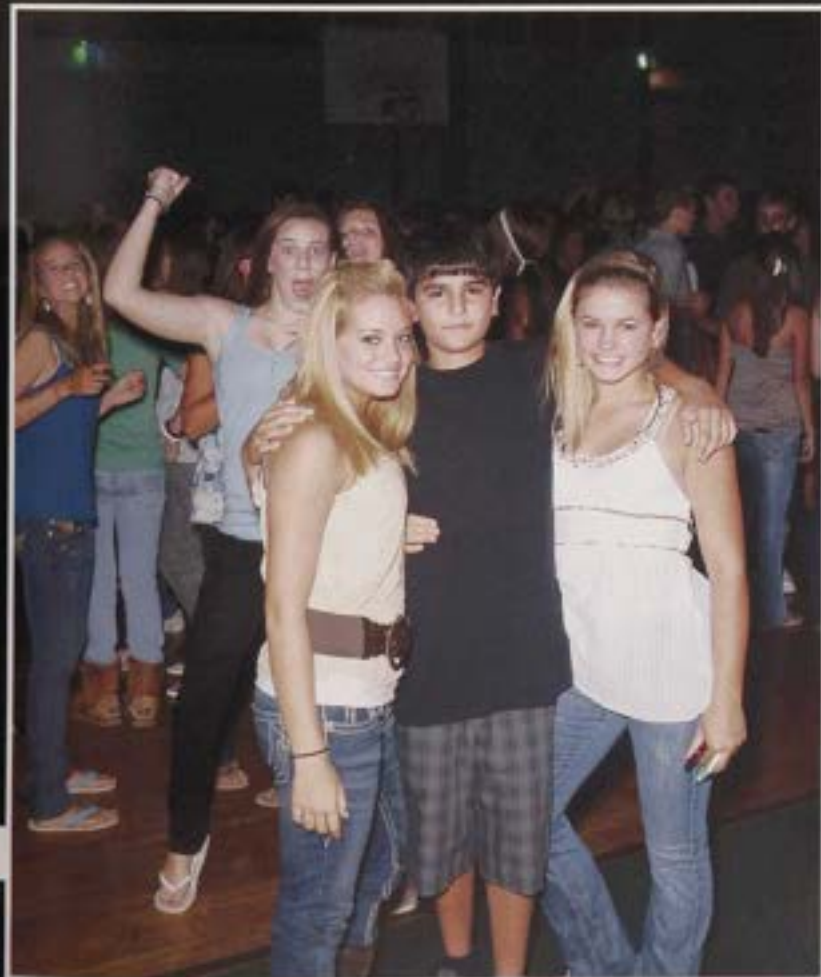
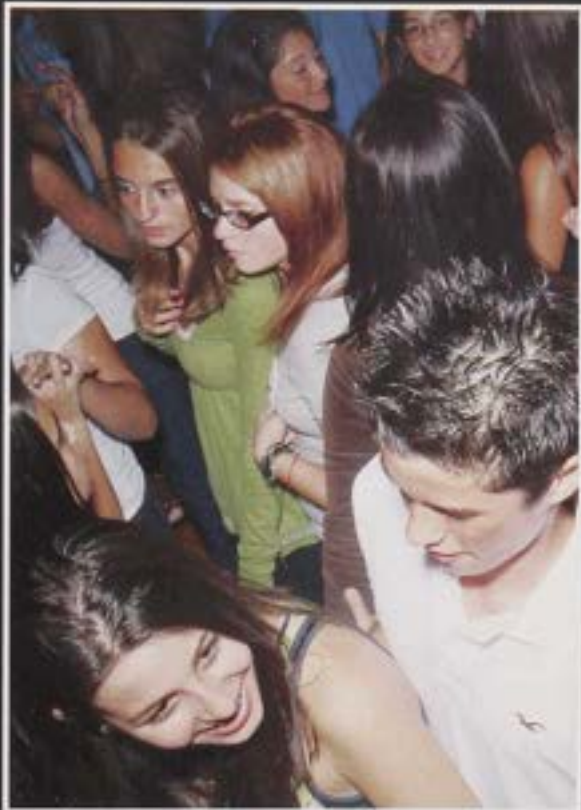
FIRST DANCE

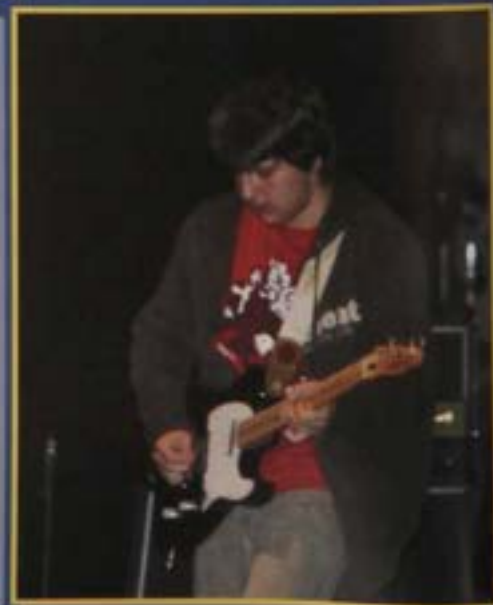




SADD: Students Against Destructive Decisions

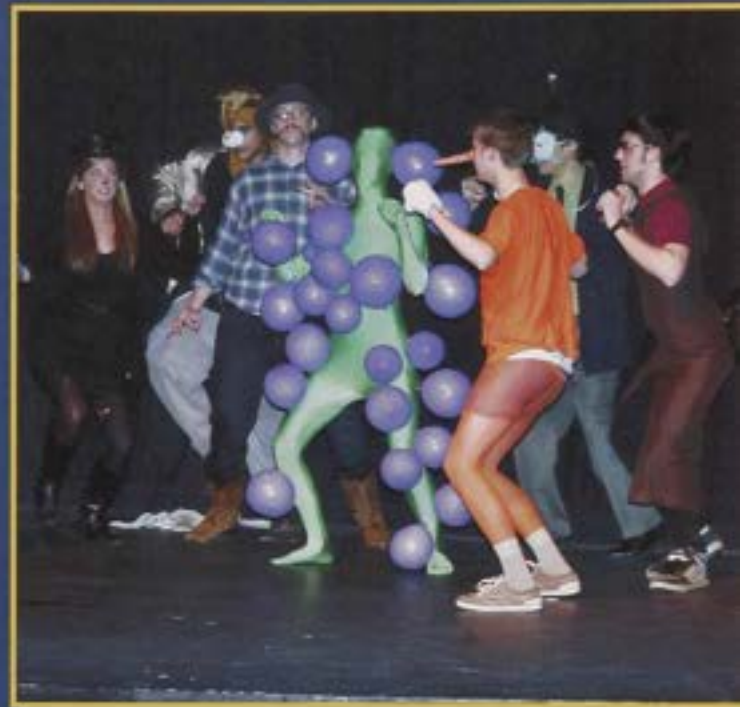
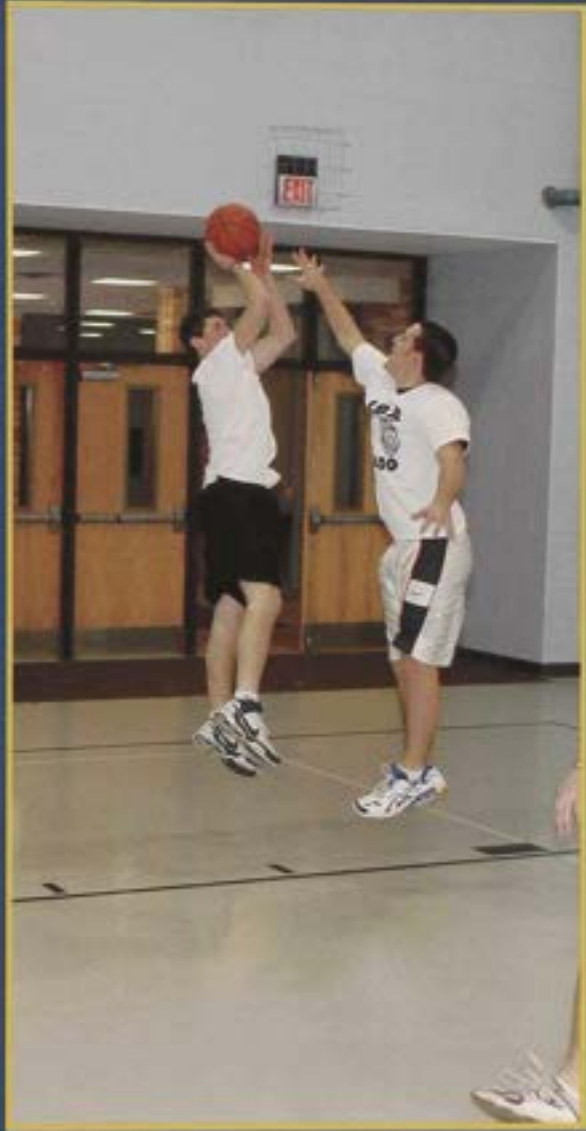


PHOTO CLUB

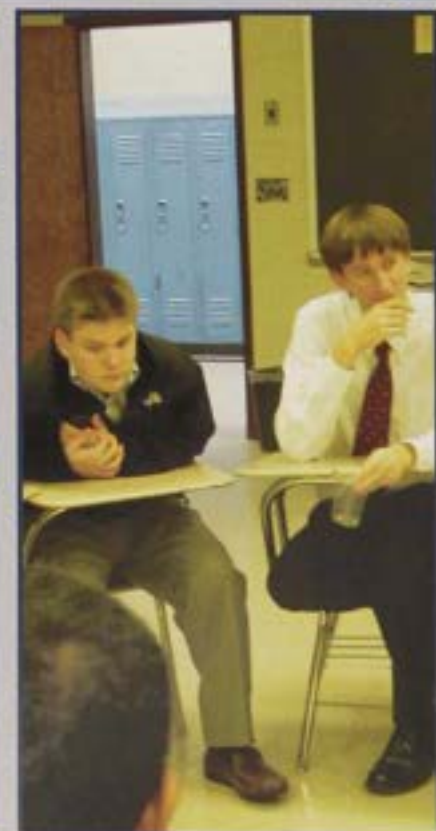
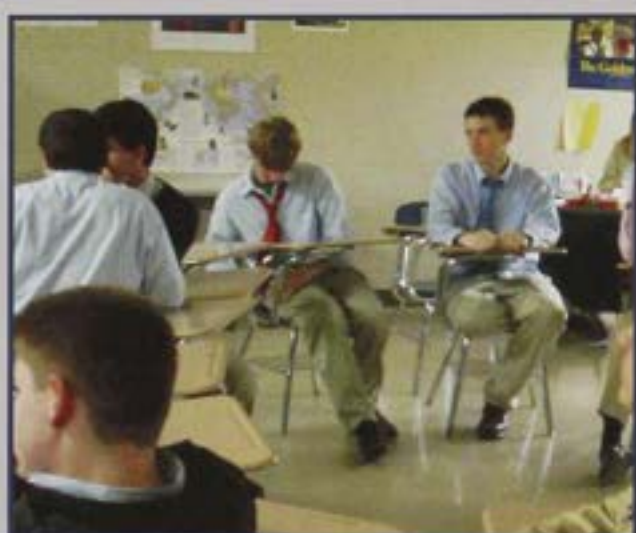

Pit Orchestra, Chorus, and Jazz Band



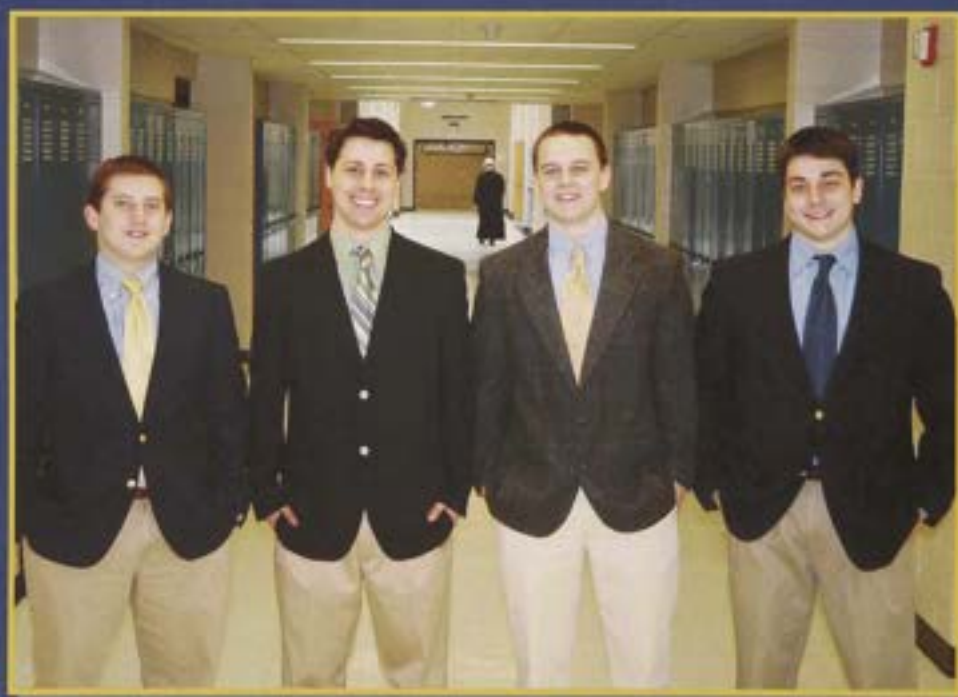
The pit band performs for the Spring Musical. The Pit Band rehearses ten times a month from January to March.
