For fifty years, Christian Brothers Academy of Lincroft has provided the best in Catholic education in the Lasallian Tradition for thousands of young men in northern New Jersey. I am happy to salute you on the occasion of the fiftieth anniversary of the founding of CBA. Catholic laity from the area contributed to building of the school as Brother Bernard McKenna, the first Principal, and several Brothers arrived to staff the school allowing for Catholic and Lasallian secondary education to strive in Monmouth County.

Not only has CBA provided a strong education, but it also emphasizes that the study of Religion is not completed only in the class room. Service projects put students in contact with the needs of others. I am happy to see that, to celebrate this 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary, students are encouraged to contribute 50 hours of service in hospitals, soup kitchens, Special Olympics and other programs for the disadvantaged. This is dramatically evidenced by the participation of CBA students in the service trip to De La Salle Blackfeet School in Montana for the Native Americans. Projects like this show the commitment of CBA faculty and students to idea of "Lasallians without Borders" as young people travelled to a far part of the country to help others.

The fifty years of CBA has been an important part in the development of the Lasallian Mission in the United States teaching and forming young people who will contribute to the future, not only of their own cities and towns, but their country, their Church and the world. In the name of the world-wide Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools, I greet and congratulate all at Christian Brothers Academy and all those who made this school a reality.

# CBA History: The First Twenty-Five Years

In 1958, Dr. George A. Sheehan, Mr. John C. Henderson, and Mr. Peter E. Fleming had a dream: to establish a new Catholic high school for boys in Monmouth County. After months of planning, Bishop George W. Ahr of Trenton granted approval for a fundraising campaign. The Brothers of the Christian Schools, under their provincial, Br. Anthony John Haplin, agreed to staff the new all-boys academy. By January 1959, the laymen had raised the \$400,000 needed to purchase the 157-acre JayCee Farms from the Holsey family in Lincroft. Four months later, construction began on the horse stable that would become Henderson Hall, and the first freshman class awaited their chance to attend this "Christian Brothers Academy" -- an academy whose reputation was predicted to rival that of other area schools in its first quarter-century alone...

### Project 50th



In early 2007, Br. Andrew O'Gara announced "Project 50th" in celebration of CBA's Golden Anniversary in the 2009-2010 school year. This \$23 million campaign includes the renovation of Fleming Hall, the Sprint Barn, the Round Barn, the McKay Gym, and the front of the school. There will also be the addition of a new library, several classrooms, and a swimming pool, as well as an increase in CBA's endowment so that the Academy may eventually become a scholarship school.

Project 50th is also the completion of the original master plan of CBA architect Bernard Kellenyi . In 1958, Mr. Kellenyi envisioned an "ultra modern high school" that would included the future freshman and sophomore wings, chapel, theater, gym, and even a swimming pool!



PEGASUS was later changed into a northern constellation.

Christian Brothers Academy, formerly Greentree Stables, aims to develop in its students an appreciation for intellectual excellence, to encourage valuing the mind and spirit above material possessions, and to train its students to reach their ultimate desiny, heaven.

This title was suggested by Joel Cunningham and Michael Quinn because of the similarity between the symbolism of PEGASUS and the aims of C.B.A.
















# LaSallian Youth


At Christian Brothers Academy, LaSallian Youth is a charitable organization that helps to gather and distribute food to the needy, perform community service projects for charitable organizations, and sponsor food and monetary drives for the less fortunate. LaSallain Youth organizes a trip to Asbury Park, New Jersey, twice a month,

where we provide educational assistance and distribute clothing and food to the impoverished. For the past three years, LaSallian Youth has traveled to Camden, New Jersey, where a group of twelve students visited nursing homes, worked at demolition sites. planted trees, and served lunch at the AIDS Welcome Center. For the past five years, LaSallian Youth has also sent a small group of five or six students to the LaSallian Youth Assembly, where they were introduced to students from other LaSallian Schools along the East Coast and participated in various community service projects.


### **CBA** Ambassadors















































# Art Show














There are dozens of clubs for students to join at CBA. These clubs cater to the varied interests of the student body. For example, students interested in writing can join Arister. CBA's literary magazine, or The Academy Torch, CBA's newspaper. For those students who enjoy learning about other cultures, there are three world language clubs, the Italian Culture Society, and the Celtic Society. All clubs are a great way to get involved with student life and are essential to a well-rounded college resume. Likewise, all students interested in joining the **National Honor** Society in junior year must participate in at least four clubs. By joining extracurricular activities, students are given the opportunity to make new friends and learn more about their interests.

The main purpose of the NHS is to tutor students needing help. do tours at the Open House, and be on call whenever the students are needed to assist at a function. Every year, the members of the NHS complete a service project. This year, the students raised \$1,000 for Lifestyles for the Disabled. They also went to the Lifestyles for the Disabled community to run a Christmas party for the young men and women who are part of the organization.

The NHS has been in existence since 1962. Only a select group of young men (juniors and seniors) meet the criteria for selection. The four pillars of scholarship, leadership, service, and character are taken seriously. NHS's accomplishments are service projects, tutoring, and being the face of CBA.

The Student Council, led this year by President Ciro Saverino, is a student organization that enables students to assist in planning school activities in addition to representing the student body. SADD is a club that promotes the well being of the student in terms of the many peer pressures that face high school-age teenagers. We work closely with the student government and Mr. Fales's office to develop appropriate programs for student life. SADD events include the Zilinski Run, the Pasta Dinner for the troops, the Sports Equipment Drive, the 3x3 basketball

#### The Academy Torch











#### Language Honor Societies







The Language Honor Societies distinguish the students who exhibit a level of expertise in their French, Latin, or Spanish language studies. Students who qualify for their respective honor societies have cumulative averages of 95 by their sophomore year and many move onto Advanced Placement courses in their language for college credits.

#### Spanish Club

The purpose of the Club is to offer students the opportunity to enhance their appreciation and knowledge of Hispanic culture. Our activities include watching Spanish movies, playing soccer, eating Spanish food, and competing against other language clubs. The Spanish Club began in 1963 under the direction of Brother Denis.


#### Sci-Fi Club


















the spring.


















## Brother Robert Fagan, F.S.C.

Currently, the CBA Ice Hockey program is a part of both the Shore Conference and the Gordon Conference, the elite hockey conference in the state of New Jersey. Many Division I NCAA colleges and universities in the U.S., such as Yale and Cornell, have recruited our players because of their participation in the Gordon Conference. The Shore Conference allows CBA to compete against local rivals. The purpose of the program is to allow the players to grow and mature into responsible young men through stiff competition via ice hockey. In order to compete against the most talented teams. the players are forced to play as a team, which teaches them such values as empathy, leadership, responsibility, and commitment. This enables CBA hockey players to be faithful, respectful, and successful young men in their years beyond CBA.

The CBA ice hockey team is one of the top high school programs in the state and is continually ranked nationally. Early in the program's history, the Colts Ice Hockey Team was under the tutelage of Bob Smith when they won their first state championship in 1983 and their first Gordon Cup Championship in 1991. In 1993, Mike Reynolds took over the reigns and the program took off with great success. In 1994, '95, and '96 CBA won the state Championship, Gordon Cup, and Shore A North Championships. The same team will be inducted into the New. Jersey High School Hockey Hall of Fame this year. In 2005, with the new assistant coach Ryan Bogan, CBA's ice hockey team won another state championship and, in 2006, captured another Gordon Cup Title. Ryan Bogan was named head coach of the program in 2007 and has led the colts to a 58-11-3 record over the last three seasons. He loods to lead the Colts back to "The Rock" or Prudential Center to avenge last year's State Final loss to Delbarton.



Men of the Class of 2010:

As most of you have learned, I am a man of few prejudices. A liberally educated person in the Humanist tradition, I pride myself on openness to new people, contexts, and experiences.

Of course, there's one exception. I admitted it in a vulnerable moment, and it has been exploited by Gino Mazzarella and similarly unprincipled seniors ever since. Ever since I first heard "Fireflies," I have had a visceral loathing for anything associated with the so-called musical group (or is it a person?) called Owl City. I still remember the first time I heard it, at the corner of RT 537 and Muhlenbrink Rd. in Colts Neck. I didn't know if the more appropriate way to erase the trauma would be by stopping at Mary Ann's (somewhat scary looking) Bar on that corner or driving a little farther and throwing myself in the Swimming River Reservoir!

Though a prejudice is by definition an irrational predisposition, I'd like to suggest two cogent reasons supporting my feelings; these reasons are, in fact, the core of the lesson I'd hope this letter can teach. The first is that it's not just all about "Fireflies." Have you ever looked at the Owl City website? There are about fifty songs now, unforgettable ditties like "Strawberry Avalanche," "Vanilla Twilight," and "Hot Air Balloon" (at least the last of these doesn't sound like something available at Dairy Queen). Fifty songs, all sounding exactly alike! As you 229 young men go forward into college and your careers, I hope you will have learned to treasure your distinctiveness. Despite some superficial similarities, those who know you appreciate your uniqueness of spirit and style. I also hope that, by your example, people will continue to perceive another distinction, one I have heard repeatedly since coming to this area: "You can always tell a CBA man, there's a certain special something about him"—a spirit of faith, a commitment to integrity and service, a pride in accomplishment, a generosity of disposition and judgment. When you return for your 25th or 50th reunions, your lives will have taken vastly different trajectories. I hope and expect you will always be able to return to that core experience which unites.


The other prompt to my unyielding disdain is in this line: "I'd like to make myself believe that planet Earth turns slowly." Nothing could be further from the truth, and few beliefs will do more harm to your karma. As these past four years should illustrate and your parents will concur, the world spins at an amazing rate—no matter what Mr. O. City believes. To us, the adults in your lives, the transition from anxious boy at freshman orientation in the Henderson Theater to self-confident graduate in the Collins Arena has gone by in the twinkling of an eye. Though you have seen Shore Conference and state championships pile up, scholarships roll in, friendships fade and bear the test of time, teachers and friends move on—to other schools and to the Communion of Saints—let me assure you, the pace is going to pick up. In the experience you've had here, I hope you will find a spiritual anchor which grounds you when you've come to comb grey hair (or precious little hair), and the world seems to spin out of control.

Ultimately, and perhaps fortunately, fireflies are among the most ephemeral of God's creatures, both in nature and the music world. I pray that in your future you will be sustained by what really lasts, though you may no longer be reminded of it seven times a day: the life of Jesus in your hearts. Forever.



36 years of service to Christian Brothers Academy

Brother Christian Jones, F.S.C., 84, of Lincroft died Saturday, March 13, 2010 at De La Salle Hall, Lincroft. Brother Christian was born in Brooklyn, N.Y. and received the Holy Habit of the Christian Brothers on September 7, 1943.
