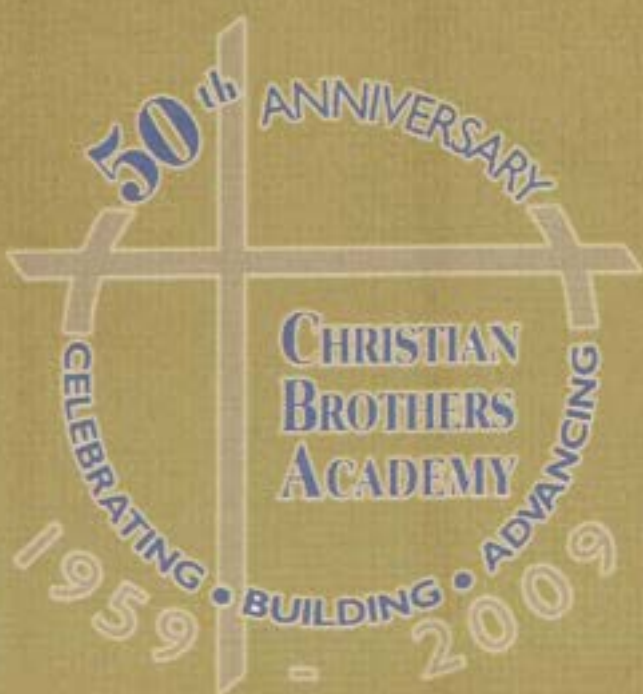

For fifty years, Christian Brothers Academy of Lincroft has provided the best in Catholic education in the Lasallian Tradition for thousands of young men in northern New Jersey. I am happy to salute you on the occasion of the fiftieth anniversary of the founding of CBA. The excellence of CBA is exemplified by its graduates who have been repeatedly successful in their chosen fields, as contributors to society, as leaders and as good Christian family men.

The story of the founding of Christian Brothers Academy is remarkable when viewed today as we speak of the role of laity in the Church. After contacting the Brothers who agreed to staff the school, CBA's illustrious history began on a former farm. Catholic laity from the area contributed to building of the school as Brother Bernard McKenna, the first Principal, and several Brothers arrived to staff the school allowing for Catholic and Lasallian secondary education to thrive in Monmouth County.

Not only has CBA provided a strong education, but it also emphasizes that the study of Religion is not completed only in the class room. Service projects put students in contact with the needs of others. I am happy to see that, to celebrate this 50th anniversary, students are encouraged to contribute 50 hours of service in hospitals, soup kitchens, Special Olympics and other programs for the disadvantaged. This is dramatically evidenced by the participation of CBA students in the service trip to De La Salle Blackfeet School in Montana for the Native Americans. Projects like this show the commitment of CBA faculty and students to idea of "Lasallians without Borders" as young people travelled to a far part of the country to help others.

The fifty years of CBA has been an important part in the development of the Lasallian Mission in the United States teaching and forming young people who will contribute to the future, not only of their own cities and towns, but their country, their Church and the world. In the name of the world-wide Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools, I greet and congratulate all at Christian Brothers Academy and all those who made this school a reality.

CBA History: The First Twenty-Five Years

In 1958, Dr. George A. Sheehan, Mr. John C. Henderson, and Mr. Peter E. Fleming had a dream: to establish a new Catholic high school for boys in Monmouth County. After months of planning, Bishop George W. Ahr of Trenton granted approval for a fundraising campaign. The Brothers of the Christian Schools, under their provincial, Br. Anthony John Haplin, agreed to staff the new all-boys academy. By January 1959, the laymen had raised the \$400,000 needed to purchase the 157-acre JayCee Farms from the Holsey family in Lincroft. Four months later, construction began on the horse stable that would become Henderson Hall, and the first freshman class awaited their chance to attend this "Christian Brothers Academy" -- an academy whose reputation was predicted to rival that of other area schools in its first quarter-century alone...

1959 - 1963

September 14, 1959

The first freshman class of 144 students arrives at CBA and is welcomed by a faculty of six Brothers, including Br. Albert Bernard McKenna, FSC, CBA's first principal.



September 1961

The newly built "permanent" school building -- the senior wing, library, cafeteria, and Varsity Gym -- opens its doors after a \$1.7 million expansion.

November 1962

Junior Michael Quinn '64 and freshman Joel Cunningham '66 win the contest for naming CBA's yearbook, *Pegasus*; sophomore James Cignorelli '65 names the newspaper *The Academy Torch*.

Mid-1970's

CBA's famed intramural football program reaches its peak with almost 300 students on 18 teams.

Steve Betti, Tom Hodgert, Mark Chiarello, and Art Jackson, Class of 1978, paint the famous *Beatles* mural in the cafeteria. This same year, Mike McNamara and Phil DiPaolo, Class of 1980, paint the colt outside the cafeteria.

1979 - 1983 & Project 80s (1984)

September 1979

Br. Andrew O'Gara begins his term as the fourth principal of CBA.



August 1984

The US Department of Education recognizes CBA as a Blue Ribbon School, one of only 60 private schools to receive this award for educational excellence. Br. Andrew and Mr. Santanello accept the award for CBA from President Ronald Reagan in Washington, D.C.

In celebration of CBA's Silver Anniversary, Br. Andrew announces this \$4 million building project that adds the freshman wing, chapel, and theater to the school.

CBA History: The Past Twenty-Five Years

The past twenty-five years at CBA have been a time of unprecedented growth in all areas of the school. The leadership of Br. Andrew O'Gara, especially, served to shape CBA physically and spiritually into the great academy and community we all know today. CBA's dedicated faculty have devoted their time to developing a rich and rigorous curriculum, and its expert coaches have made the Colts legendary among high school sports nationwide. CBA has certainly lived up to the expectations of the founders: it has become an exemplary LaSallian high school whose excellence in academics, athletics, and spiritual formation makes it one of the most highly reputable schools in New Jersey. Looking back upon fifty accomplished years of Catholic education, we can confidently look ahead to the next half-century that awaits CBA -- a time that will undoubtedly be filled with further achievements and advancements for over 9,000 more alumni...

1985 - 1989

Spring 1985

The Pegasus Production Company performs its first musical, *Evita*, in the newly completed Henderson Theater. CBA is the first high school to attempt this critically acclaimed production.

The newly built freshman wing opens for the Class of 1989 and replaces Henderson Hall as the freshman "home base."

Thirty-four students travel to the Soviet Union during their spring break.

Coach Ed Wicelinski becomes CBA's first Distinguished LaSallian Educator.

Br. Andrew becomes the first President of CBA, and Br. Ralph Montedoro begins his term as the fifth principal of CBA.

Project 50th



In early 2007, Br. Andrew O'Gara announced "Project 50th" in celebration of CBA's Golden Anniversary in the 2009-2010 school year. This \$23 million campaign includes the renovation of Fleming Hall, the Sprint Barn, the Round Barn, the McKay Gym, and the front of the school. There will also be the addition of a new library, several classrooms, and a swimming pool, as well as an increase in CBA's endowment so that the Academy may eventually become a scholarship school.

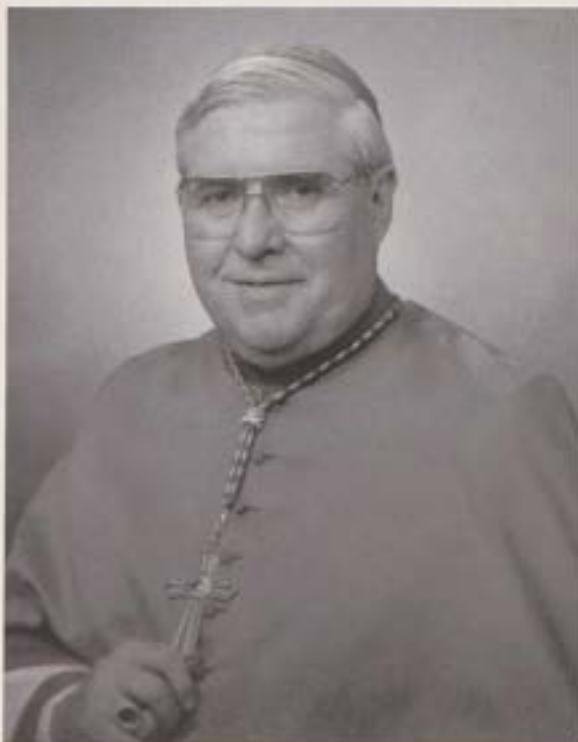

PEGASUS was later changed into a northern constellation.

This title was suggested by Joel Cunningham and Michael Quinn because of the similarity between the symbolism of PEGASUS and the aims of C.B.A.



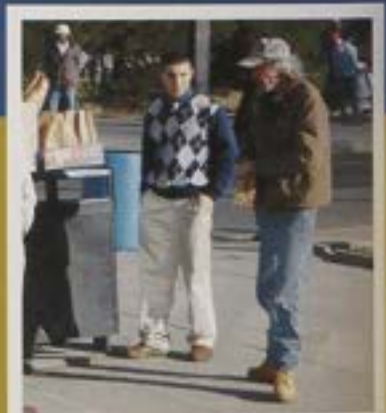

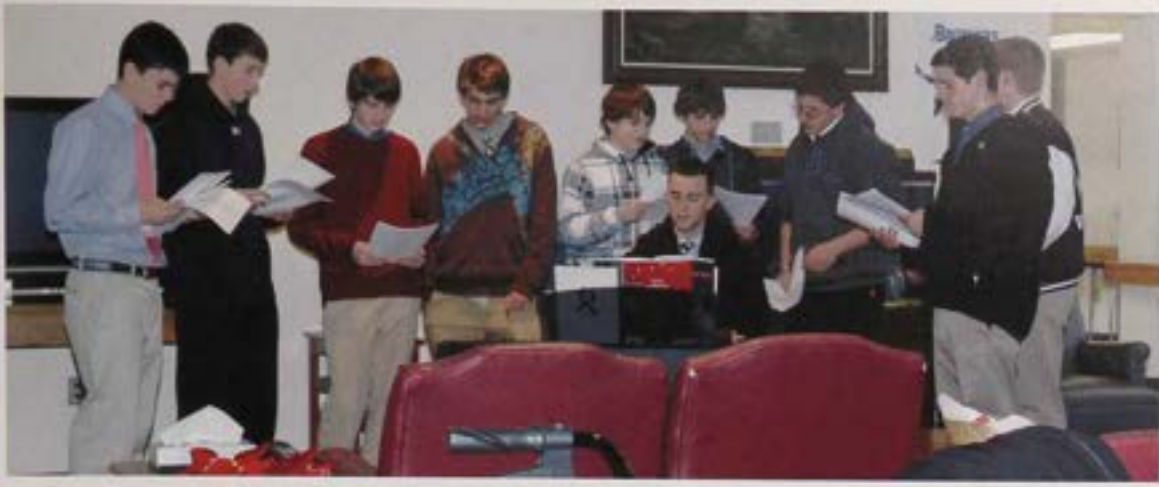

LaSallian Youth

At Christian Brothers Academy, LaSallian Youth is a charitable organization that helps to gather and distribute food to the needy, perform community service projects for charitable organizations, and sponsor food and monetary drives for the less fortunate. LaSallian Youth organizes a trip to Asbury Park, New Jersey, twice a month, where we provide educational assistance and distribute clothing and food to the impoverished. For the past three years, LaSallian Youth has traveled to Camden, New Jersey, where a group of twelve students visited nursing homes, worked at demolition sites, planted trees, and served lunch at the AIDS Welcome Center. For the past five years, LaSallian Youth has also sent a small group of five or six students to the LaSallian Youth Assembly, where they were introduced to students from other LaSallian Schools along the East Coast and participated in various community service projects.

There are dozens of clubs for students to join at CBA. These clubs cater to the varied interests of the student body. For example, students interested in writing can join *Arister*, CBA's literary magazine, or *The Academy Torch*, CBA's newspaper. For those students who enjoy learning about other cultures, there are three world language clubs, the Italian Culture Society, and the Celtic Society. All clubs are a great way to get involved with student life and are essential to a well-rounded college resume. Likewise, all students interested in joining the National Honor Society in junior year must participate in at least four clubs. By joining extracurricular activities, students are given the opportunity to make new friends and learn more about their interests.

National Honor Society

The main purpose of the NHS is to tutor students needing help, do tours at the Open House, and be on call whenever the students are needed to assist at a function. Every year, the members of the NHS complete a service project. This year, the students raised \$1,000 for Lifestyles for the Disabled. They also went to the Lifestyles for the Disabled community to run a Christmas party for the young men and women who are part of the organization.

The NHS has been in existence since 1962. Only a select group of young men (juniors and seniors) meet the criteria for selection. The four pillars of scholarship, leadership, service, and character are taken seriously. NHS's accomplishments are service projects, tutoring, and being the face of CBA.



Student Council



The Student Council, led this year by President **Ciro Saverino**, is a student organization that enables students to assist in planning school activities in addition to representing the student body. It sponsors and conducts many student activities including dances, semi-formals, contests, and talent shows. The Council Board consists of a President, Upperclassman Vice President, Underclassman Vice President, and Secretary.



SADD is a club that promotes the well being of the student in terms of the many peer pressures that face high school-age teenagers. The club meets six to eight times a year, usually in the evening from five to seven PM. This does not include small committee meetings based on an event or activity being planned. Activities include speakers and videos on topics such as drunk driving, addiction to drugs, steroid usage, self image, bullying, stress, and relationships. We work closely with the student government and Mr. Fales's office to develop appropriate programs for student life. SADD events include the Zilinski Run, the Pasta Dinner for the troops, the Sports Equipment Drive, the 3x3 basketball tournament, and the Charity Talent Show.

The Academy Torch



The Academy Torch is CBA's official student newspaper. In addition to having printed editions, *The Torch* also has articles online. The newspaper highlights important events in the lives of CBA students and teachers. It also runs stories regarding current political and sporting events for a perspective on life outside of the Academy.

CBA's Mock Trial Team consists of a group of students who are interested in learning about the U.S. justice system; the team competes against other schools in Monmouth County. The competition is located at the county courthouse in Freehold, where students use actual courtrooms to simulate a real-life trial. During the competition, students prepare a case for both the defense and the plaintiff with the help of Ms. Opramolla (the moderator) and Mr. V (the team's attorney).

Students who qualify for their respective honor societies have cumulative averages of 95 by their sophomore year and many move onto Advanced Placement courses in their language for college credits.

Spanish Club

The purpose of the Club is to offer students the opportunity to enhance their appreciation and knowledge of Hispanic culture. Our activities include watching Spanish movies, playing soccer, eating Spanish food, and competing against other language clubs. The Spanish Club began in 1963 under the direction of Brother Denis.



The Celtic Society

The Celtic Society meets once a month to discuss and learn more about Irish heritage. We watch movies, do family trees, and play Irish jeopardy. Every March, we go out to dinner to celebrate St. Patrick's Day. We also compete in the World Languages Soccer Tournament. This year is the Celtic Society's third year.



French Club

This organization provides its membership with many cultural activities outside of the classroom. We encourage all students of French to become members and participate in the Joie de Vivre "a la française." Some of our activities include watching French films, playing French Jeopardy and Scrabble, eating at French restaurants, and attending a French mass.

The French Club at CBA has been in existence since 1989. Since that time, both Monsieur Smith and Madame Maloney have co-moderated this activity. The present enrollment of the French Club is fifty members. The club meets twice a month on Wednesdays from 2:45 to 4:00 PM.



Italian Culture Society

The Italian Culture Society is a student group meant to enhance students' appreciation of Italian culture. It creates opportunities to explore the many facets of Italian culture and consists of students who are interested in the activities of the citizens of Italy. Throughout the year, the club conducts games, watches movies, and provides food so that members old and new can learn about what Italian culture truly means.



Sailing Club

The Sailing Club is one of the few club sports that CBA provides for its students. The club is designed to give students an opportunity to sail competitively. During the past decade, high school sailing has become very popular throughout the country and gives students a chance to experience collegiate-style sailing. CBA Sailing is a member in good standing of the Interscholastic Sailing Association, which sponsors sailing events for high school teams across the United States. The Sailing Club races in seven to ten events per season, which runs in the fall and spring.



Since the club's "rebirth" in the fall of 2008, CBA Sailing, led by Captain Jason Lutz, has excelled in the events in which the students have participated. In the spring of 2009, they placed first in a nine-team fleet invitational event hosted by Southern Regional High School. They went on to qualify for the Mid-Atlantic District Championship which was held at the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy on Long Island. This past fall, they won the Northeast Team Racing Championship against the best schools from the Northeast Division. CBA sailors continued to hold their own against Varsity level teams, qualifying for both Mid-Atlantic District Championships, one of which was held at St. Mary's College in Maryland, where they raced against teams from New Jersey, Maryland, Virginia, and New York.

Video Game Club

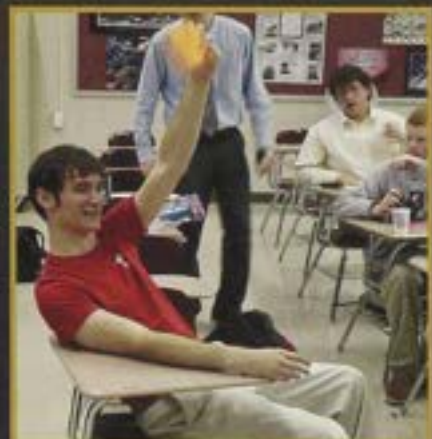
The video game club members play and explore new games. Led by Tyler Genovese, the club uses different consoles to give members different experiences in gameplay.

Besides giving students on campus an opportunity to sing, chorus helps students gain a better command for music, reading music, and intonation.



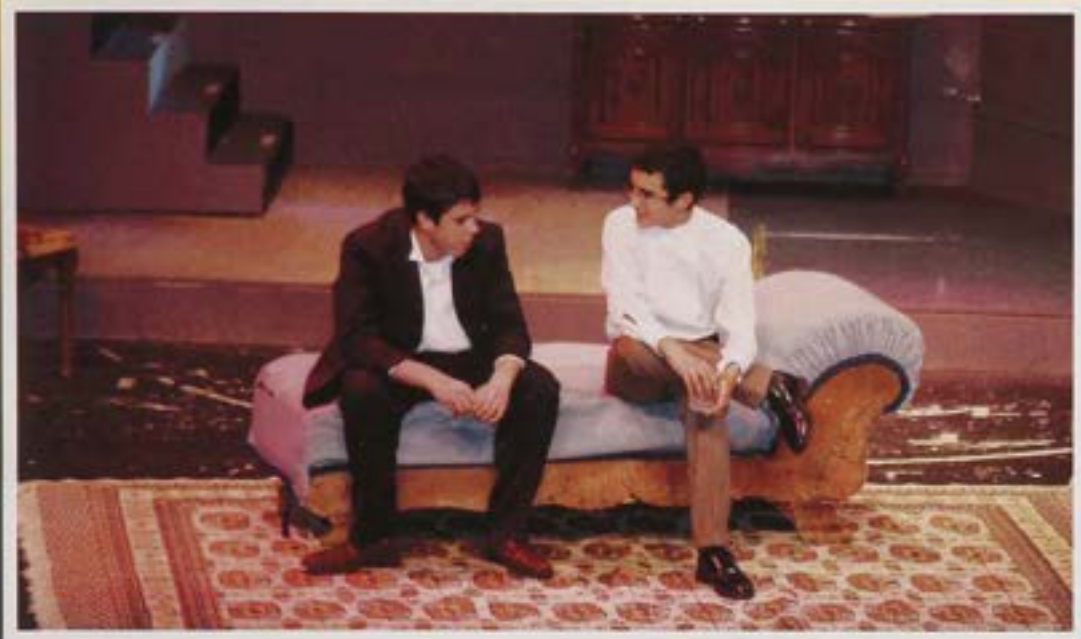
The Jazz Band gives those students that are experienced with music the forum for doing what they do best. They play all kinds of music including rock, latin, and jazz.

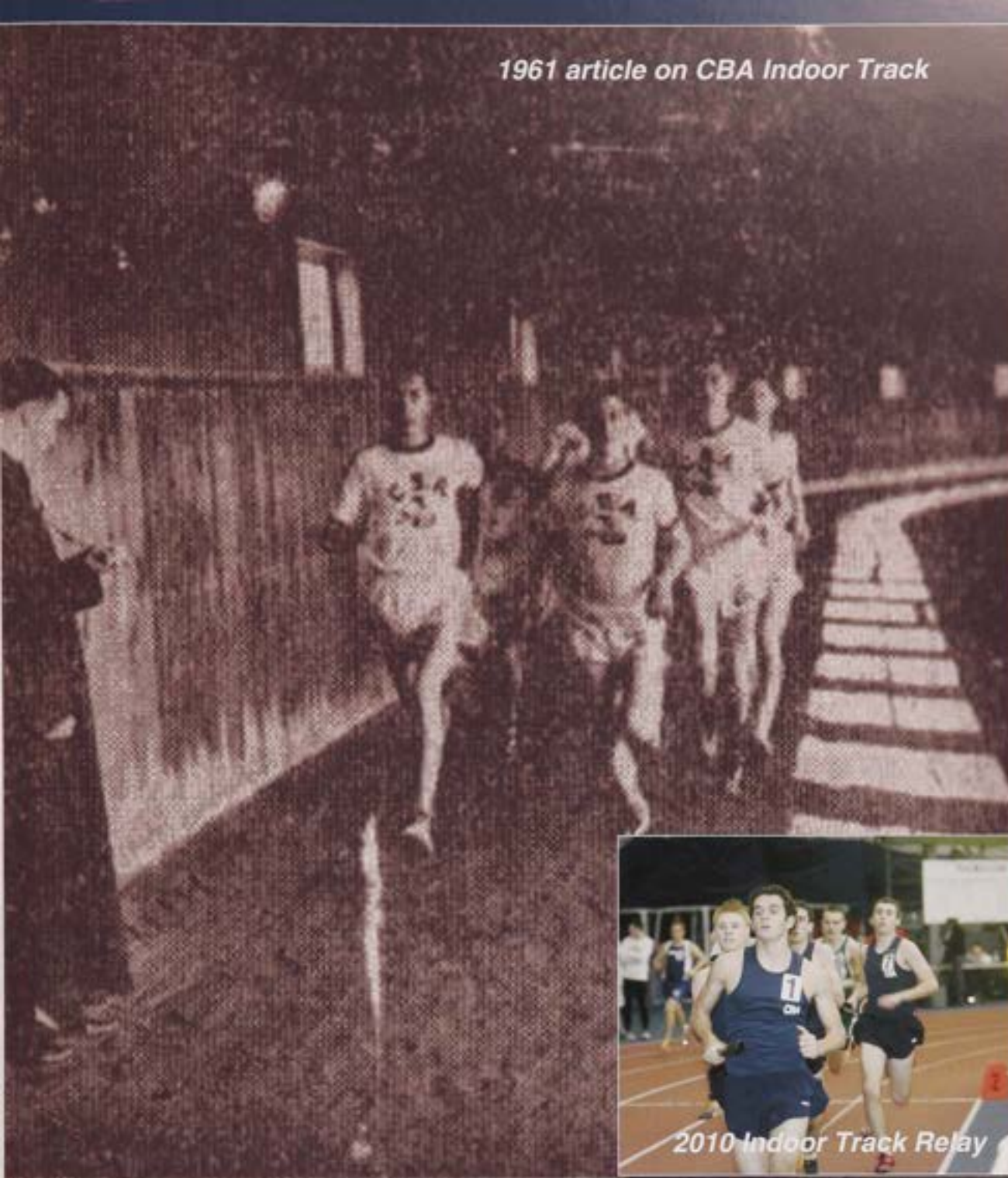

Currently, the CBA Ice Hockey program is a part of both the Shore Conference and the Gordon Conference, the elite hockey conference in the state of New Jersey. Many Division I NCAA colleges and universities in the U.S., such as Yale and Cornell, have recruited our players because of their participation in the Gordon Conference. The Shore Conference allows CBA to compete against local rivals. The purpose of the program is to allow the players to grow and mature into responsible young men through stiff competition via ice hockey. In order to compete against the most talented teams, the players are forced to play as a team, which teaches them such values as empathy, leadership, responsibility, and commitment. This enables CBA hockey players to be faithful, respectful, and successful young men in their years beyond CBA.

The CBA ice hockey team is one of the top high school programs in the state and is continually ranked nationally. Early in the program's history, the Colts Ice Hockey Team was under the tutelage of Bob Smith when they won their first state championship in 1983 and their first Gordon Cup Championship in 1991. In 1993, Mike Reynolds took over the reigns and the program took off with great success. In 1994, '95, and '96 CBA won the state Championship, Gordon Cup, and Shore A North Championships. The same team will be inducted into the New Jersey High School Hockey Hall of Fame this year. In 2005, with the new assistant coach Ryan Bogan, CBA's ice hockey team won another state championship and, in 2006, captured another Gordon Cup Title. Ryan Bogan was named head coach of the program in 2007 and has led the colts to a 58-11-3 record over the last three seasons. He looks to lead the Colts back to "The Rock" or Prudential Center to avenge last year's State Final loss to Delbarton.

English Department

Students at CBA are required to take four years of English. The curriculum begins with an introduction to grammatical styles, SAT vocabulary, and an eclectic survey of literature in freshman year. English II covers American Literature, English III reviews British Literature and the basics of writing a research paper, and Senior English surveys major literary and philosophical works. In addition, students write various literary analyses and expository essays that stress an understanding of grammar, style, and vocabulary. Seniors that show a particular competency in English may take AP English Literature. 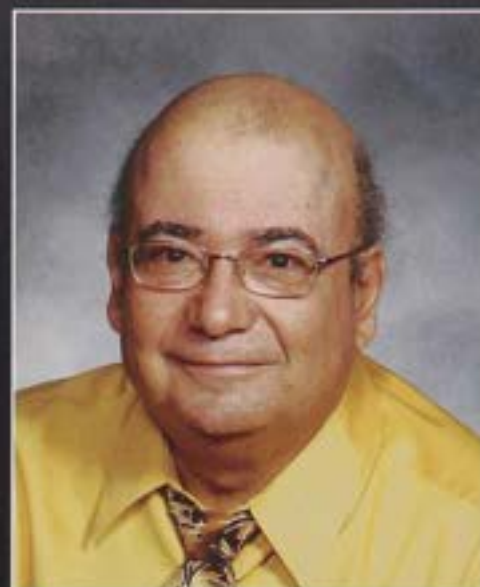

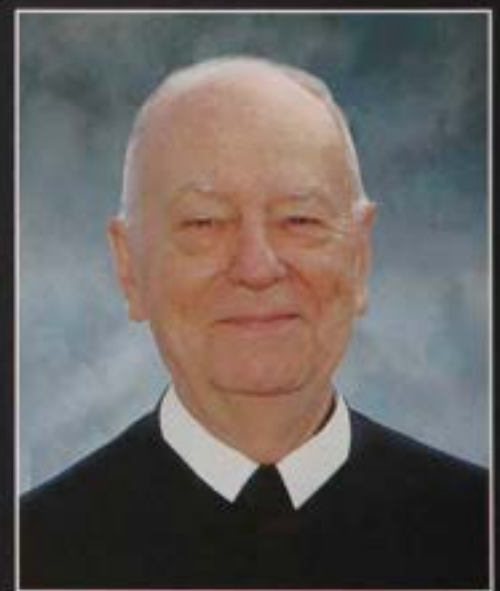

Men of the Class of 2010:

As most of you have learned, I am a man of few prejudices. A liberally educated person in the Humanist tradition, I pride myself on openness to new people, contexts, and experiences.

Of course, there's one exception. I admitted it in a vulnerable moment, and it has been exploited by Gino Mazarella and similarly unprincipled seniors ever since. Ever since I first heard "Fireflies," I have had a visceral loathing for anything associated with the so-called musical group (or is it a person?) called Owl City. I still remember the first time I heard it, at the corner of RT 537 and Muhlenbrink Rd. in Colts Neck. I didn't know if the more appropriate way to erase the trauma would be by stopping at Mary Ann's (somewhat scary looking) Bar on that corner or driving a little farther and throwing myself in the Swimming River Reservoir!

Though a prejudice is by definition an irrational predisposition, I'd like to suggest two cogent reasons supporting my feelings; these reasons are, in fact, the core of the lesson I'd hope this letter can teach. The first is that it's not just all about "Fireflies." Have you ever looked at the Owl City website? There are about fifty songs now, unforgettable ditties like "Strawberry Avalanche," "Vanilla Twilight," and "Hot Air Balloon" (at least the last of these doesn't sound like something available at Dairy Queen). Fifty songs, all sounding exactly alike! As you 229 young men go forward into college and your careers, I hope you will have learned to treasure your distinctiveness. Despite some superficial similarities, those who know you appreciate your uniqueness of spirit and style. I also hope that, by your example, people will continue to perceive another distinction, one I have heard repeatedly since coming to this area: "You can always tell a CBA man, there's a certain special something about him"—a spirit of faith, a commitment to integrity and service, a pride in accomplishment, a generosity of disposition and judgment. When you return for your 25th or 50th reunions, your lives will have taken vastly different trajectories. I hope and expect you will always be able to return to that core experience which unites.

The other prompt to my unyielding disdain is in this line: "I'd like to make myself believe that planet Earth turns slowly." Nothing could be further from the truth, and few beliefs will do more harm to your karma. As these past four years should illustrate and your parents will concur, the world spins at an amazing rate—no matter what Mr. O. City believes. To us, the adults in your lives, the transition from anxious boy at freshman orientation in the Henderson Theater to self-confident graduate in the Collins Arena has gone by in the twinkling of an eye. Though you have seen Shore Conference and state championships pile up, scholarships roll in, friendships fade and bear the test of time, teachers and friends move on—to other schools and to the Communion of Saints—let me assure you, the pace is going to pick up. In the experience you've had here, I hope you will find a spiritual anchor which grounds you when you've come to comb grey hair (or precious little hair), and the world seems to spin out of control.

Ultimately, and perhaps fortunately, fireflies are among the most ephemeral of God's creatures, both in nature and the music world. I pray that in your future you will be sustained by what really lasts, though you may no longer be reminded of it seven times a day: the life of Jesus in your hearts. Forever.

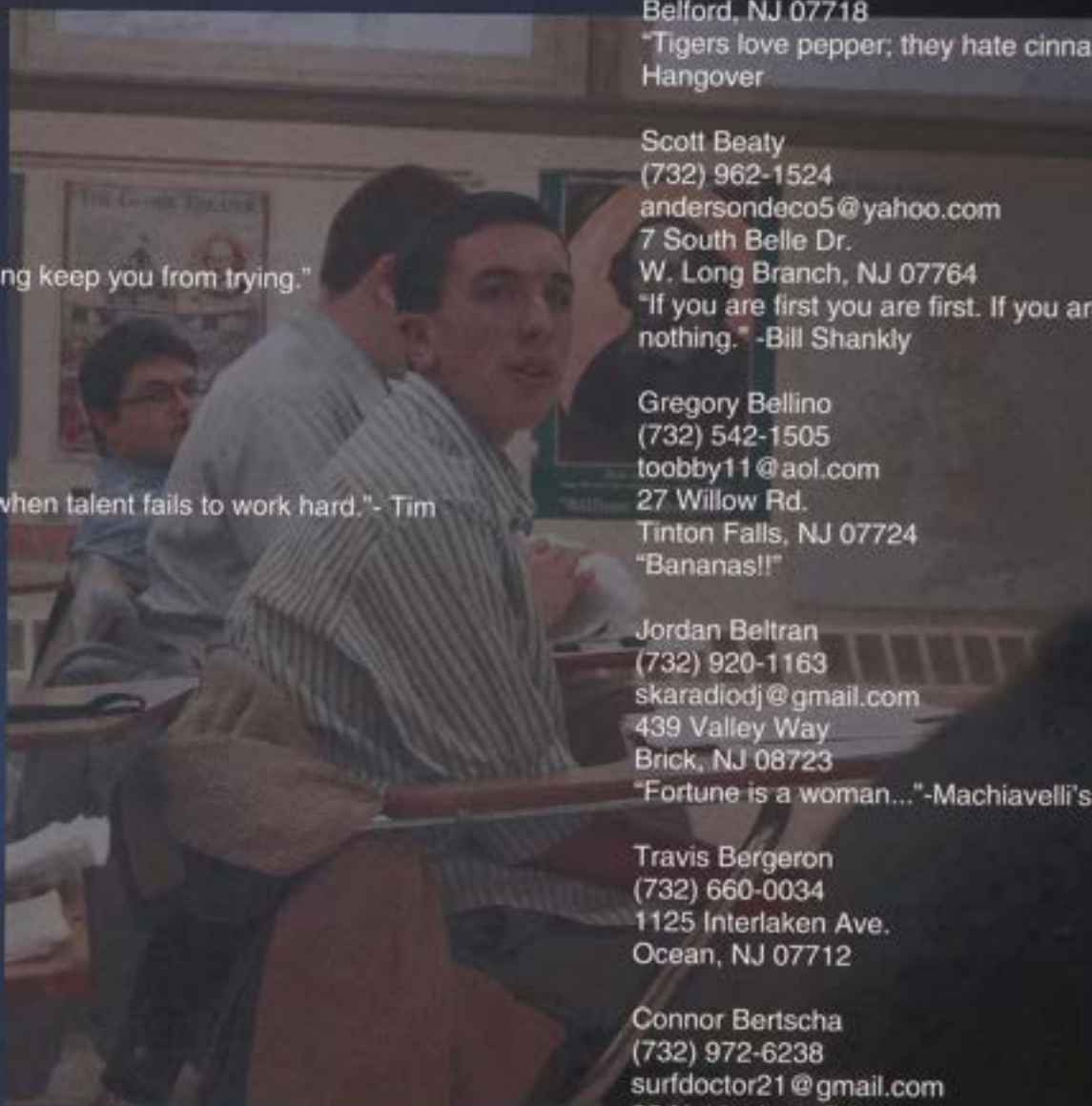

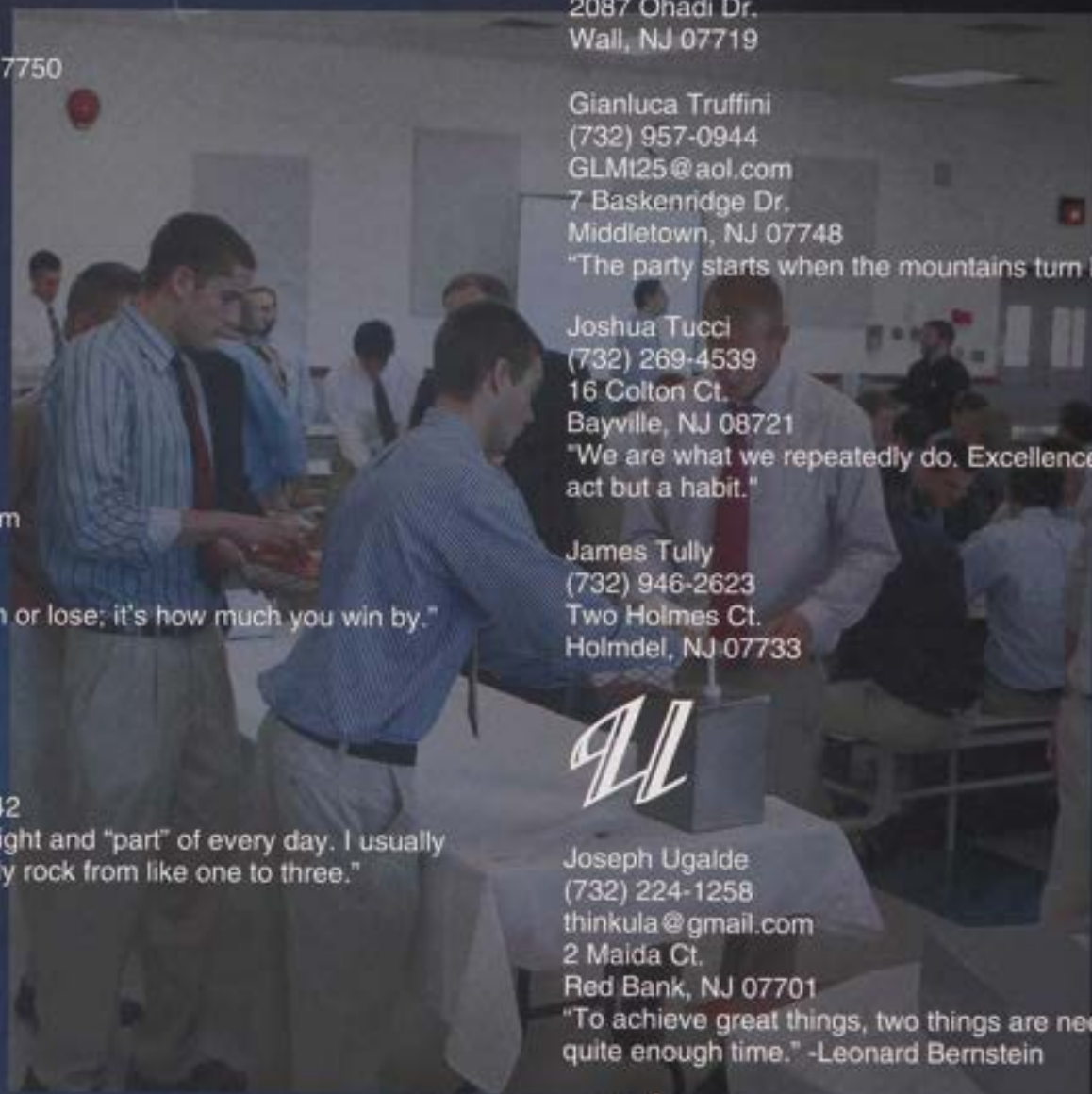

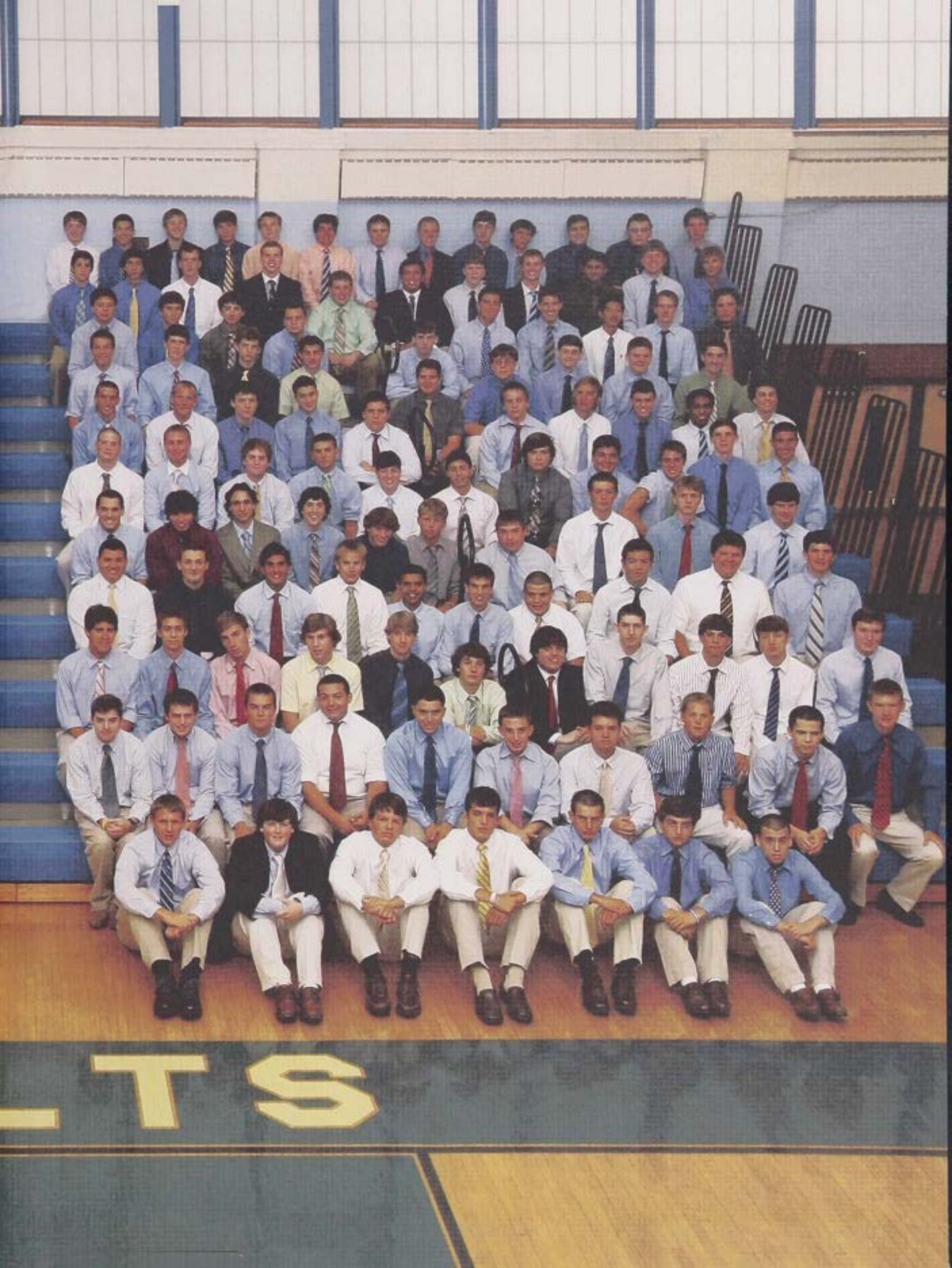
Brother Christian Jones, F.S.C.

36 years of service to Christian Brothers Academy

Brother Christian Jones, F.S.C., 84, of Lincroft died Saturday, March 13, 2010 at De La Salle Hall, Lincroft. Brother Christian was born in Brooklyn, N.Y. and received the Holy Habit of the Christian Brothers on September 7, 1943. Brother Christian was chairman of the Mathematics Department from 1972 until 2005. He established the annual CBA Eighth Grade Math Contest now named in his honor. Brother Christian was a graduate of Manhattan College, New York City in 1949 and earned his Master of Art Degree from there in 1956. He received the 1995 Edyth May Sliffe Award for Distinguished High School Math Teaching and was a member of the National Council of Teachers of Math, Mathematical Association of America, New York and New Jersey State Associations of Math Teachers, and was a past president of the Catholic High School Math League. His teaching assignments included Sacred Heart School and Holy Name School, both of New York City, Lincoln Hall, Lincroft, N.Y., La Salle School, Albany, N.Y. where he served as principal, Bishop Loughlin High School, Brooklyn, N.Y. and Christian Brothers Academy, Lincroft. Brother Christian had been in residence at De La Salle Hall since 2008.
