Like Project '80s and Project 2000 before it, Project 50th is another step forward in the completion of CBA architect Bernard Kellenyi's original "master plan." In the late 1950's, Mr. Kellenyi envisioned an "ultra modern high school" that included all the elements that have been added to CBA over the years. His design even included a swimming pool and field house, both of which will be constructed during Phase III of Project 50th.



Building on Tradition

With the commencement of Phase II of Project 50th in June 2010, CBA officially entered its second half-century. This major renovation will forever change the appearance of CBA. Within a few months, current and future CBA students will enjoy a state-of-the-art media center, two new computer labs, and an improved main office and guidance suite.



The yearbook theme of "Building on Tradition" captures the motivation behind all of these construction projects. With each generation, the school building has expanded to accommodate increases in enrollment, advances in technology, and improvements to the athletic program. More importantly, however, the theme represents the spirit of the CBA Community. With the completion of Project 50th, CBA will continue to develop its own unique traditions among a new generation of CBA students.

There are few people in the history of Christian Brothers Academy whose impressive dedication, zeal, and work ethic have shaped the Academy on their own merit. For the past twenty years, one man and his crew have worked tirelessly behind the scenes to make daily life at CBA possible. During the last year in particular, this man has labored around the clock to ensure a safe, comfortable learning environment throughout the Project 50th construction. We the yearbook staff are proud to dedicate this 49th edition of *Pegasus* to CBA's own Director of Maintenance, Mr. Bernard "Bernie" Arnella, Class of 1975.

During his time at CBA, Bernie was actively involved in the school community. He was the basketball team manager, a baseball player, and an assistant to Br. John Loehr, then-Director of

Maintenance. His classmate Br. Frank recalls, "I remember Bernie as a very friendly guy who was heavily involved at the school... Bernie has a true love of his work and of CBA." After graduating CBA and attending Slippery Rock University, Bernie returned to teach history at the school he loved. In July 1992, he replaced Mr. Bill Preston as Director of Maintenance, and the rest is history.

Today, Bernie oversees the entire 157-acre campus with an annual budget of about \$800,000. He works closely with his crew--Ray Dykstra, Pete Alter, and John Burtnick, Jr.--and with several student workers, including Sergio Mata '12. "He's not your typical boss," says Sergio. "Bernie is easy to talk to and makes the maintenance crew feel like one big family." With his faithful yellow Labrador retriever, Isabella, by his side, Bernie can be seen around campus Monday

through Saturday making sure CBA is fully operational. In a testament to his loyalty to CBA, Bernie and a few of his crew sometimes spend the night in the gym during snow storms in order to plow the campus in the morning. Bernie is certainly a selfless individual in all that he does for CBA.

He is a loving husband to his wife, Karen, and a role model to his two sons, Christopher '01 and Matthew '04, both alumni of the school to which Bernie has dedicated almost 40 years of his life.

On behalf of the entire CBA Community, we thank you, Bernie, for all you do to make CBA the place it is today.

Project 50th Groundbreaking & BBQ

On Saturday, June 11, 2010, CBA officially ended its 50th Anniversary celebrations with a family barbecue. Faculty, students, alumni, families, and friends were invited for a full day of activities spread throughout the campus. There was a video game truck, rock climbing wall, faculty dunk tank, live music from student bands, and buffet lunch. The barbecue provided an opportunity for the entire CBA Community to see the school one last time before the Project 50th construction began. In preparation for this historic event,

the BBQ also served as the Project 50th Groundbreaking. Br. Frank, the Board of Trustees, and the Project 50th committees broke ground with specially made golden shovels. This brief ceremony marked both the end of a CBA's first half-century and the beginning of CBA's future.

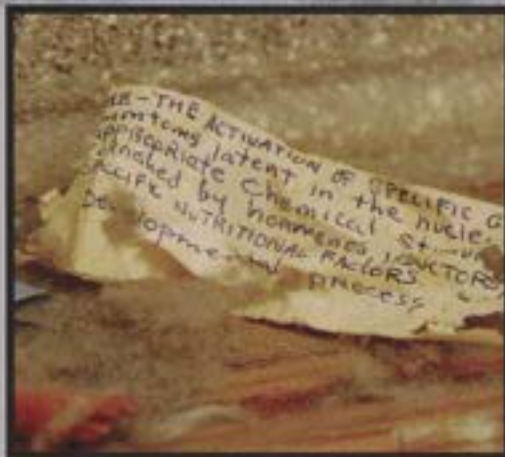

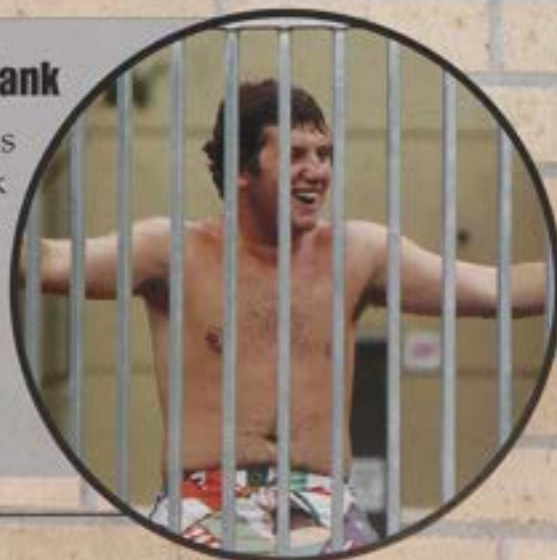

Project 50th Construction



Phase II Construction

As CBA's 51st year began, the campus was transformed with the commencement of Phase II of Project 50th. When students arrived in September, the former entrance to the main building was little more than a hole in the ground surrounded by chainlink fence. Henderson Hall was fitted with lockers and became the center of the junior homerooms, McKenna Hall added classrooms for the first time in years, the main office was downsized, the theater ticket booth, and the senior lounge had been relocated to the Varsity Gym stage; the list goes on. Regardless of these changes, the construction has progressed smoothly throughout the year and has caused few disruptions to daily life at CBA. By the second semester, windows were already installed and the addition



began to take shape. Upon completion of this \$10,000,000 expansion (\$2.25 million of which will be used for endowment growth), CBA will house a brand new media center and computer lab, a new guidance office, an expanded main office, and a new science wing complete with labs. The Brothers' Residence will also receive a \$1,000,000 facelift in the process. At the rate the construction is moving, the Classes of 2012-2015 should expect to occupy the new building by the end of this calendar year.

Construction Begins

Construction of the Phase II additions began in June 2010 and will continue through the end of 2011.



Rendering of Main Building

Santos Passageway

In order to facilitate hallway traffic from the main wing to the senior wing, construction workers built this temporary walkway over the summer. Dubbed the "Santos Passageway," the walkway links the rear of Mr. Santos's Room 22 to a door leading to the main hallway. Although the Passageway has become crowded at times, students have learned how to navigate through it and arrive to class on time.

Temporary Main Entrance

The rear entrance to the school has become the main entrance for this year. In addition, the main office is temporarily located in the theater ticket booth.

Guidance Office

In May 2010, the guidance department moved temporarily to Benilde Hall, the former Brothers' Residence.



Main Building Addition

This blueprint shows the layout of the new media center, main office, and guidance suite. Rooms 23 and 24 (top right) will remain classrooms when the construction is completed. There will also be a new computer lab across from the library.



Science Wing Construction

Construction of the new science wing began simultaneously in the rear of the building. Workers progressed quickly and had the entire structure closed in by January 2011.

Science Wing Addition

This extension of the science wing will compensate for the classrooms lost in the front of the building as well as add two new labs for Anatomy & Physiology and several other science courses. In addition, a hallway will connect this wing to the music room and theater hallway.

Phase III: The Future of Project 50th



Phase II Progress

As of March 2011, the Phase II construction is well on its way to being complete by the end of the year.

From the outside, the building already resembles the architectural renderings seen on the previous page.

With the expected completion of Phase II approaching rapidly, CBA will soon look ahead to Phase III, the final chapter of Project 50th. Totalling \$11,000,000, Phase III is the most expensive stage of Project 50th. It will focus mainly on expanding CBA's athletic facilities with the addition of a \$5,000,000 Aquatic Center and \$3,750,000 Field House. The McKay Gym will also receive a \$1.25 million addition, which includes new locker rooms and an expanded fitness center. \$1 million will be added to CBA's endowment as well. Given the enormous cost of such a project, Phase III is still several years down the road for CBA. Further

growth of CBA's endowment is the long-term goal so that CBA may become a scholarship school many years from now. Ultimately, Phase III represents not only the completion of Project 50th but also the completion of the original master plan of the campus over fifty years in the making.



McKay Gym Addition

Running the length of the wrestling room and weight room, this addition will more than triple the size of the current weight room. Such an expansion will provide more space for training athletes as well as exercising students during physical education classes. This addition also contains a second floor that will house offices, showers, bathrooms, and four brand new locker rooms.

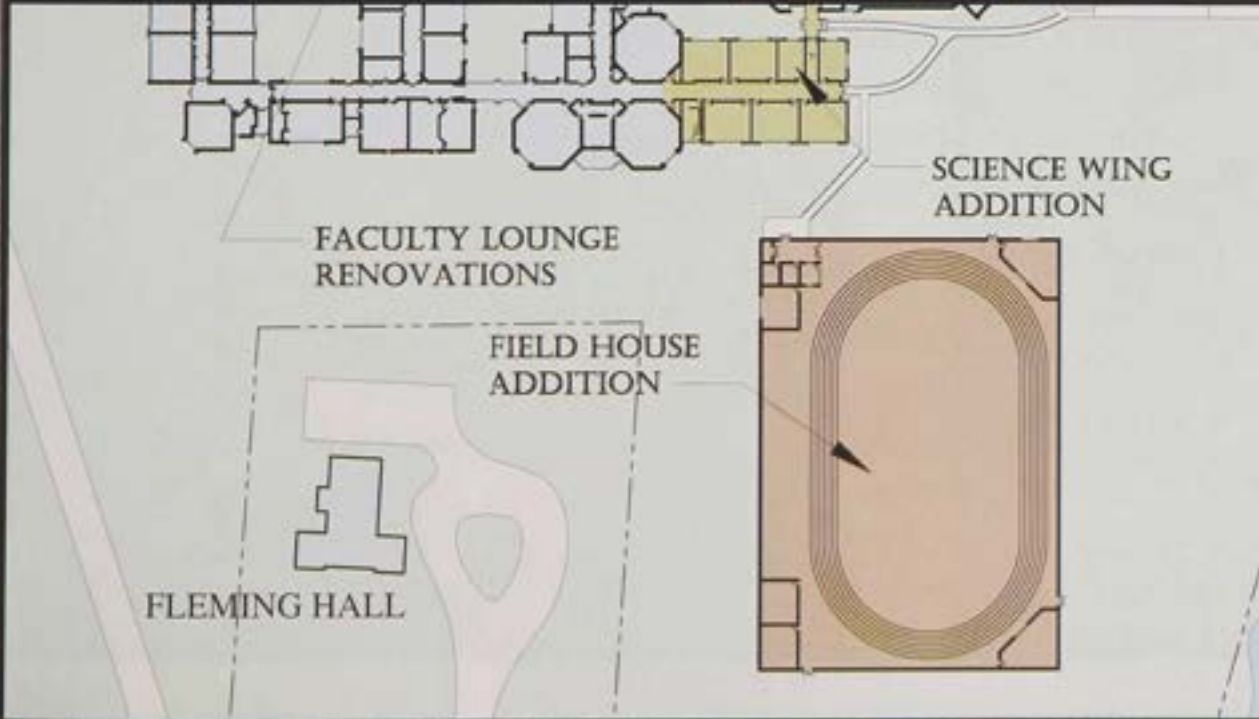
Aquatic Center

The National Honor Society exists to promote scholarship, service, leadership, and character among the student body. Since 1962, only a select group of juniors and seniors have been admitted to the St. De La Salle Chapter each year based on a stringent set of criteria. The main functions of NHS are to tutor students every Tuesday after school, staff the annual Open House, perform a service project or fundraiser, and serve at school events when needed.

This year, the Chapter was involved with two important projects. In January, CBA participated in "Manuary," a fundraiser for prostate cancer research. Students were allowed to remain unshaven for one day by donating \$5.00 during homeroom. In the end, the school raised \$1,375.00, which was donated to the Prostate Cancer Foundation in California. 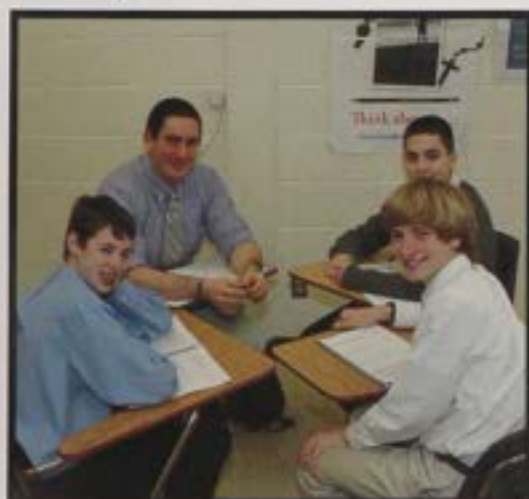

Giving Us Religious Understanding



To foster the development of incoming freshmen, CBA inaugurated the Peer Ministry/GURU program in 1978. The GURU program strives to nurture LaSallian values instilled in new students at the Academy. Each freshman becomes a part of a small group of 4 to 6 students under the leadership of a specially trained senior. The groups meet one day each academic cycle with their GURU in order to strengthen the knowledge of their faith. Through various group discussion activities, freshmen are incorporated into the CBA Community. 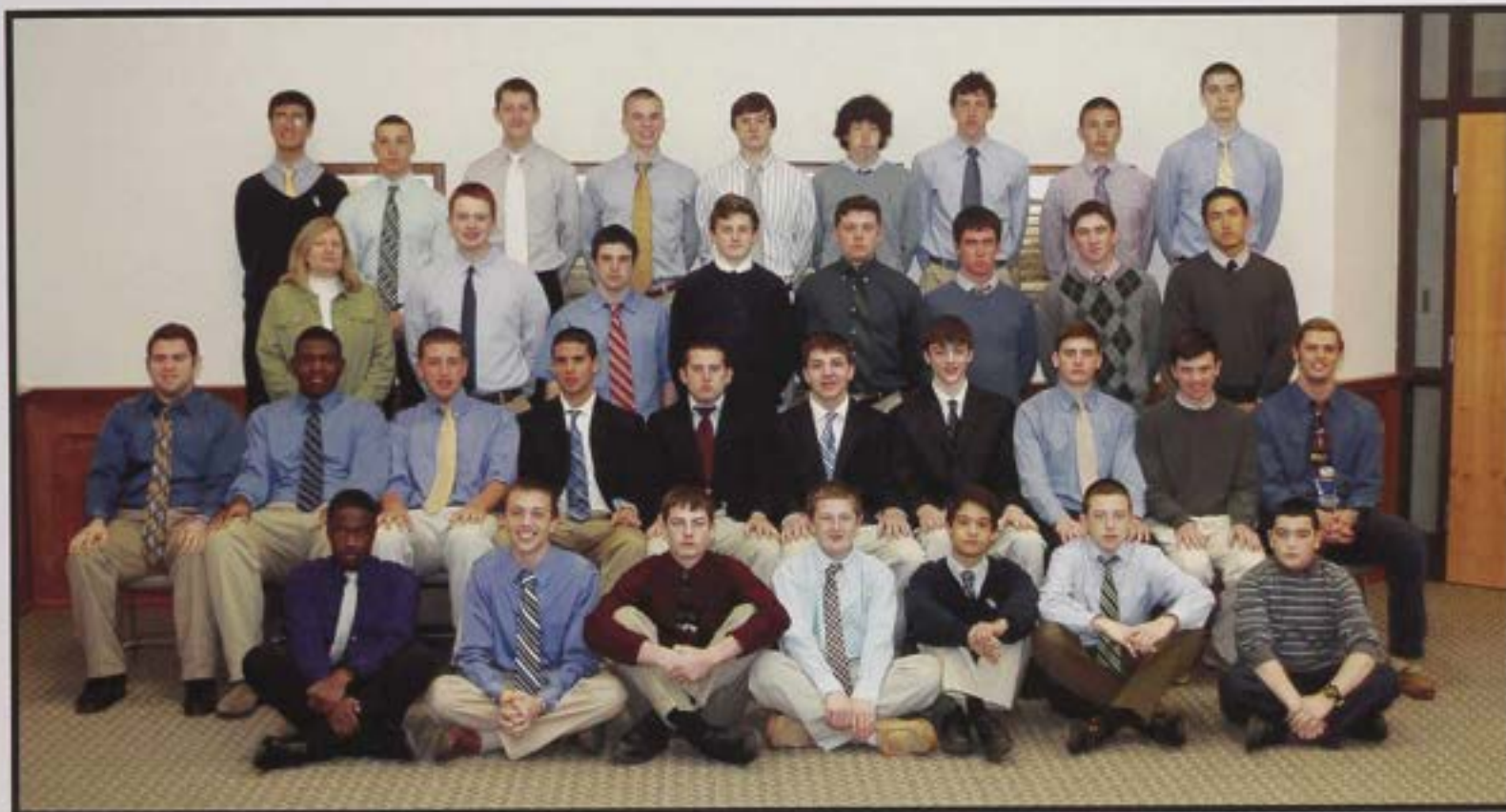
CBA Ambassadors

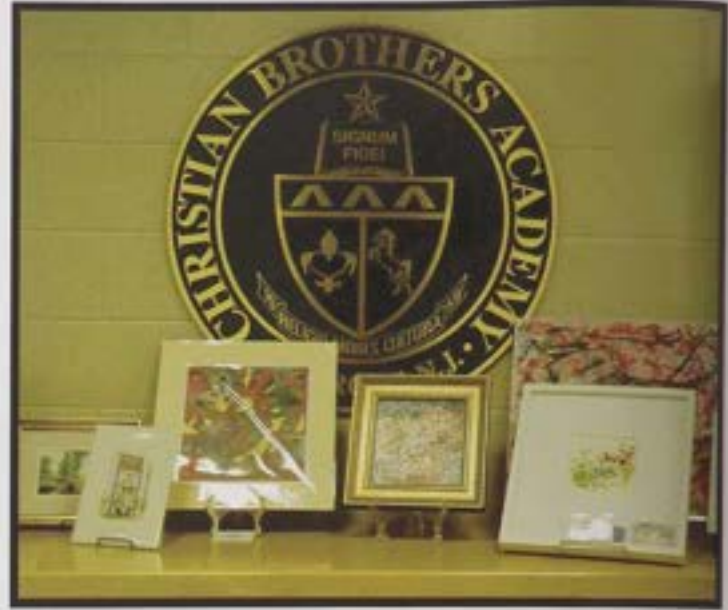

LaSallian Youth



Faith Service Community



LaSallian Youth is CBA's primary service organization. Founded in 2001, it is just one of many chapters present in LaSallian schools around the world. Twice each month, students prepare bagged lunches during the school day for the Asbury street ministry. Fifteen student

volunteers sign up to hand out these lunches to the poor in Asbury. Five of these students volunteer to tutor at an after school program. In addition to these trips, LaSallian Youth conducts several charity drives throughout the year and is called upon to help staff outside events like the annual Zilinski Run. La Sallian Youth members also have the chance to participate in major service trips. In recent



years, LaSallian Youth members have traveled to Mexico, Nicaragua, and a Blackfeet Native American reservation in Montana. Each summer, six members of LaSallian Youth attend the annual LaSallian Youth

Assembly, a week-long gathering of LaSallian students from throughout the Northeast.

SADD

Students Against Destructive Decisions



SADD is a club that promotes the well-being of the student body in terms of the many peer pressures than high-school-age students face. The club meets six to eight times each year, usually in the cafeteria from 5:00 to 7:00 P.M. Activities include speakers and videos on topics such as drunk driving, drug addiction, steroid abuse, self-image, bullying, stress, and relationships. The club works closely with Mr. Fales to develop appropriate programs for student life. SADD events include the annual Zilinski Run, the Pasta Dinner for the troops, the Sports Equipment Drive, the three-on-three basketball tournament, and the Charity Talent Show.

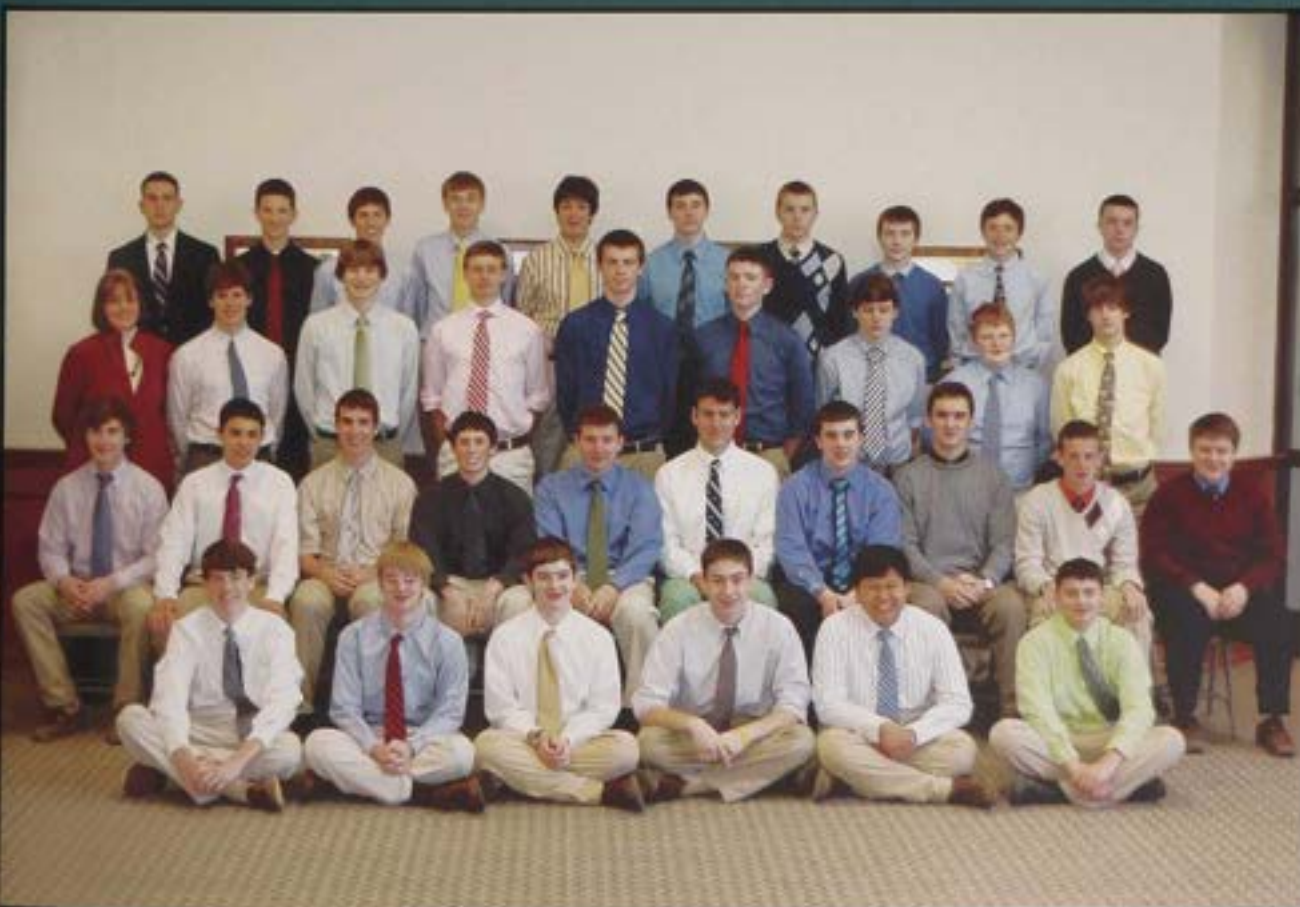


Future Business Leaders of America

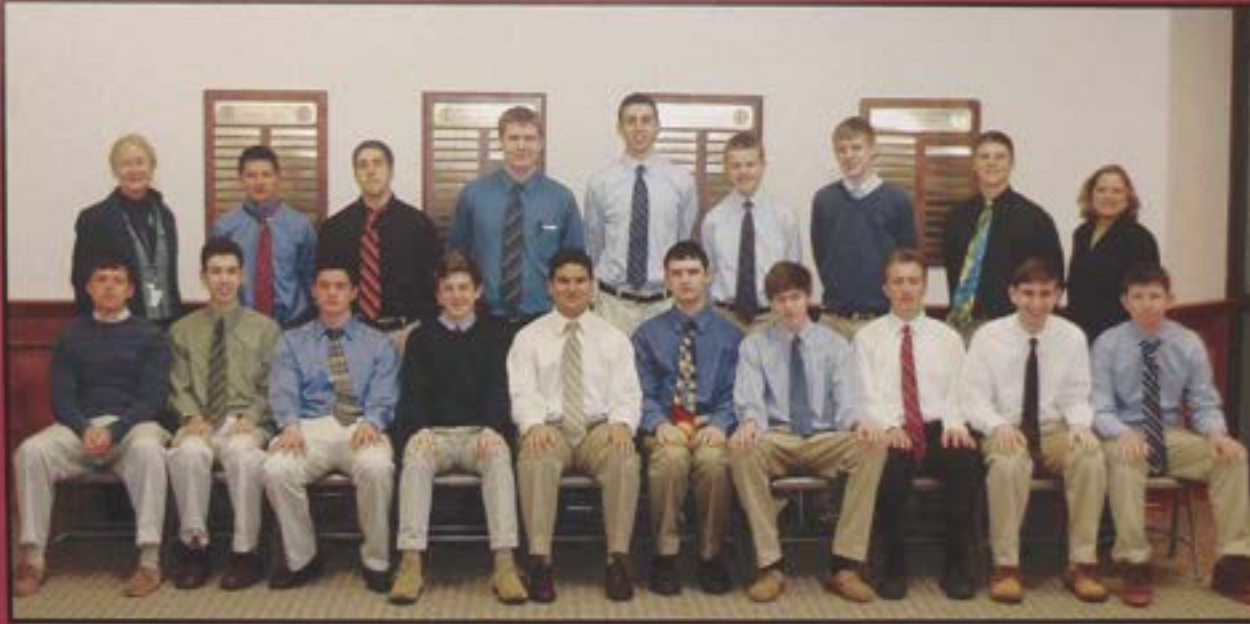
French Club

Academic Team



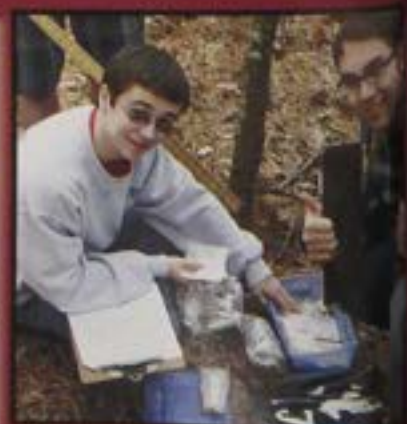

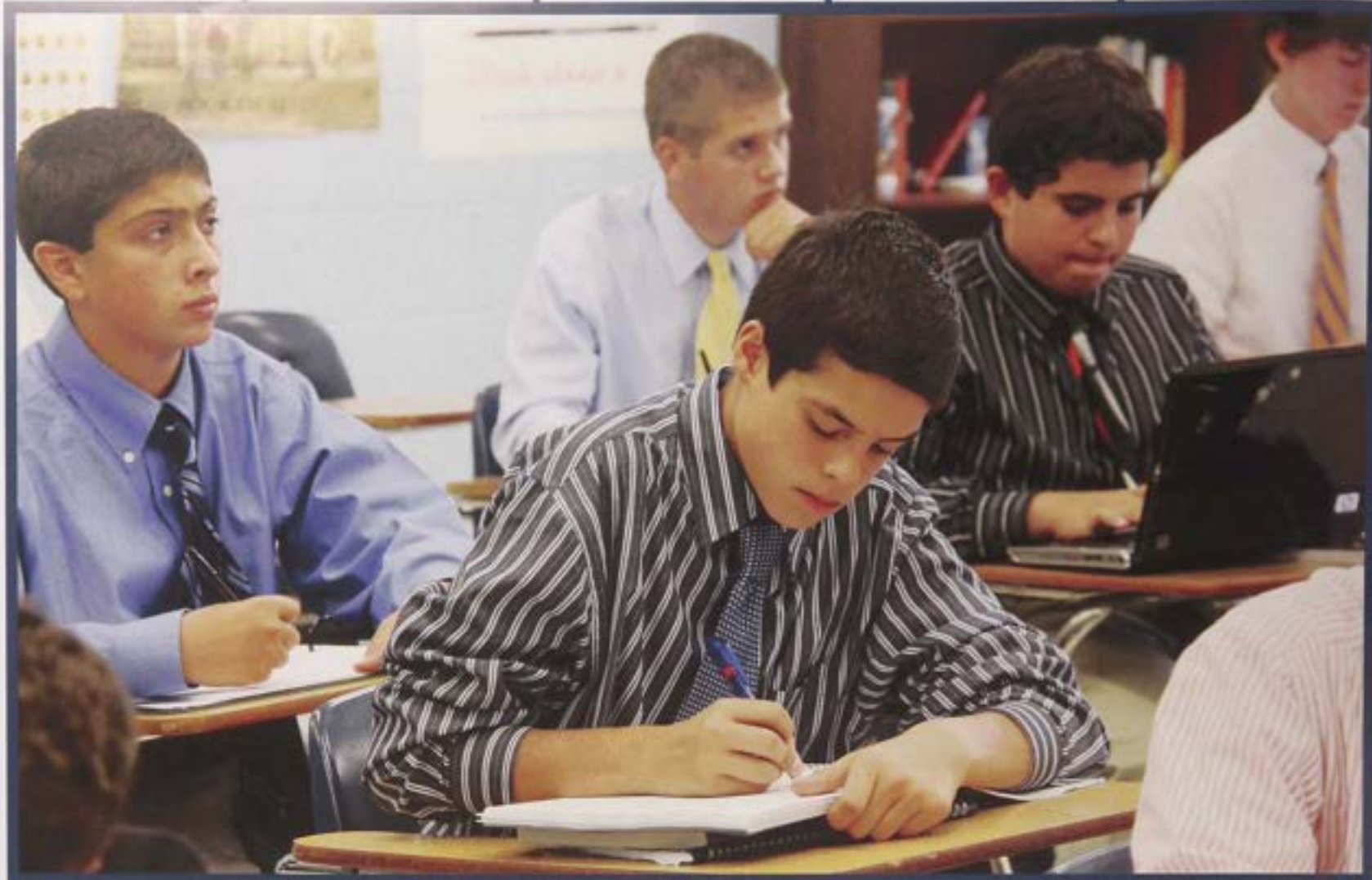


Polar Bear Plunge

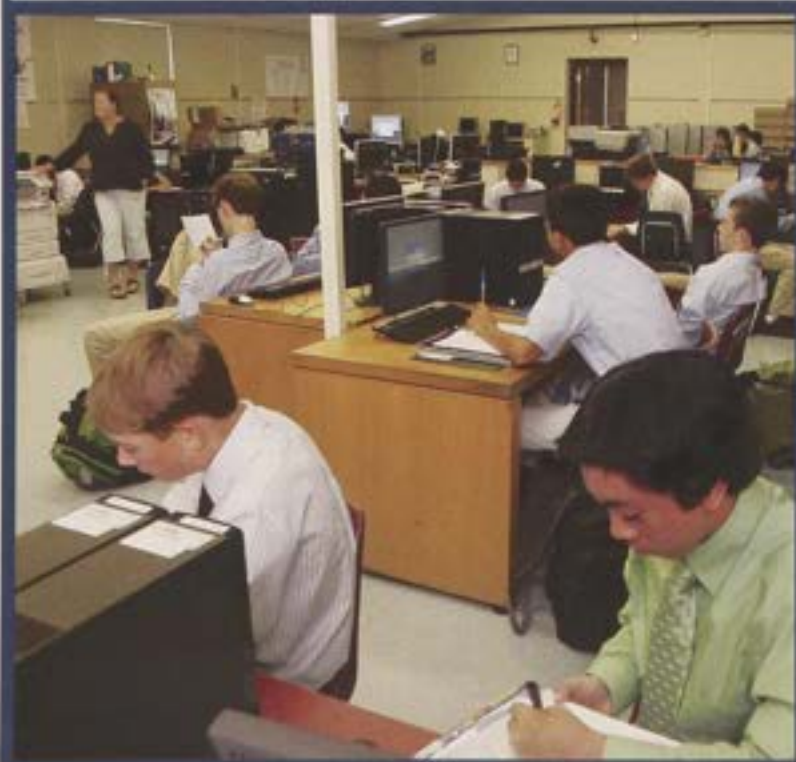

Men of the Class of 2011:
