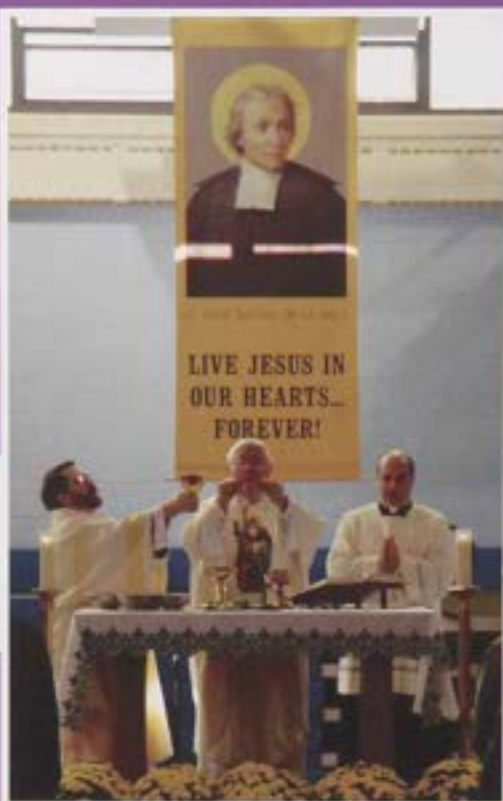
Project 50th

This summer, I plan to do it again, possibly for the fifth or sixth time since 1994: catch a ferry out of Circular Quay in Sydney and chug out to Watson's Bay, one of the last stops on Sydney Harbour's south shore. There I'll climb a hill rather too steep for an old man and look out from the elevation known as South Head. Gazing across the inlet to the Manly side, I'll admire a very similar vantage point called, you guessed it, North Head.

Impressive scenery, maybe not quite spectacular, but impressive. Yet spectacular indeed when you think back to January, 1788. After about a year's voyage, Captain Arthur Phillip and the assembly of English vessels known as the First Fleet had arrived in Botany Bay, near where Kingsford Smith Airport is today. Finding no fresh water, though, the British had to set sail again. I like to imagine them sailing through the twin Heads and thinking hopefully, "Maybe there's a nice little freshwater cove here somewhere."


Oh, what they found instead!

The full magnificence of Sydney Harbour gradually unfolded before them as they meandered onwards: Watson's Bay; Middle Harbor; Vaucluse; Rose Bay; Double Bay; Neutral Bay; The Rocks; Darling Harbour; Homebush Bay. On and on, up to the mouth of the Parramatta River. And they had no idea it was there.

At this time of your lives, gentlemen, you are at that narrow entrance to Sydney Harbour. During your four years at Christian Brothers Academy, you have found the clean water that will refresh you throughout the journey: friendship; fraternity; intellectual and athletic development; external and self-discipline; challenge and rigor; humor; the call to integrity; and, most importantly, a passionate trust in the person of Jesus, known as a brother and friend. 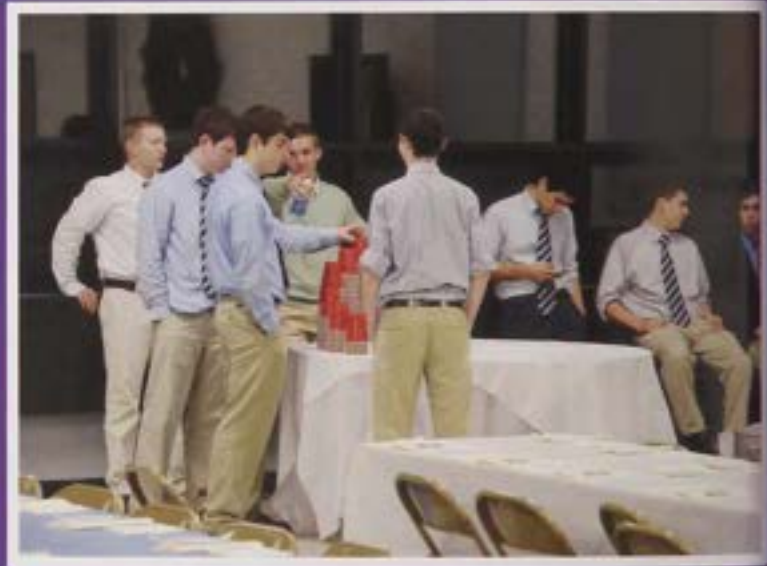
LaSallian Youth

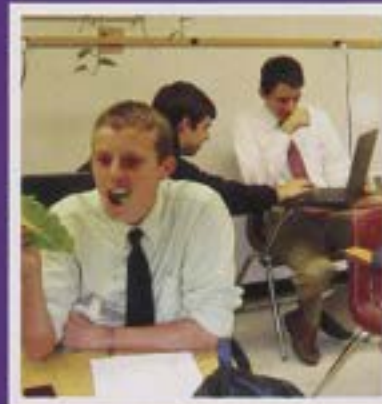

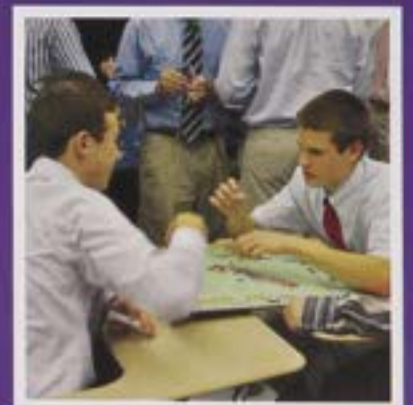
Yearbook

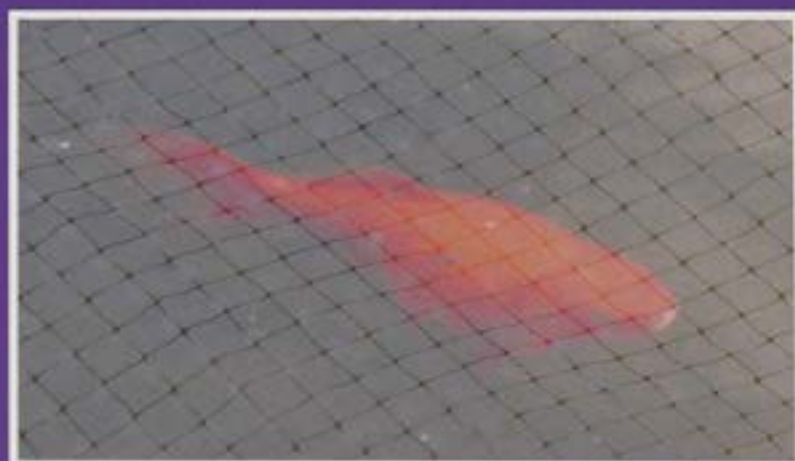


Mock Trial

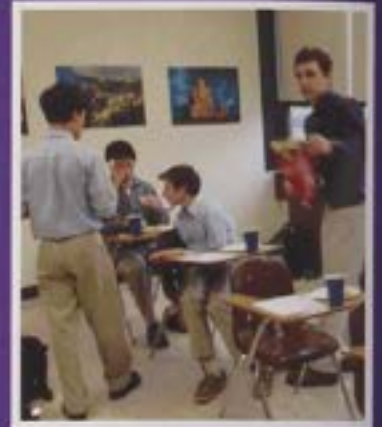


L.E.A.D

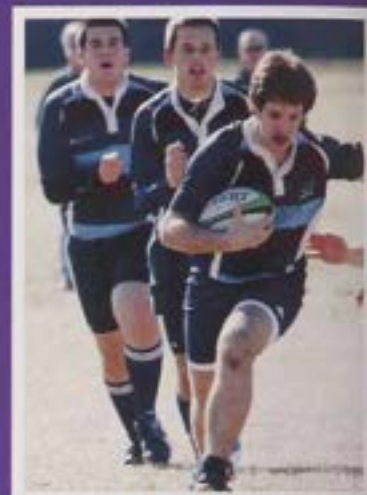
Sci-Fi Club

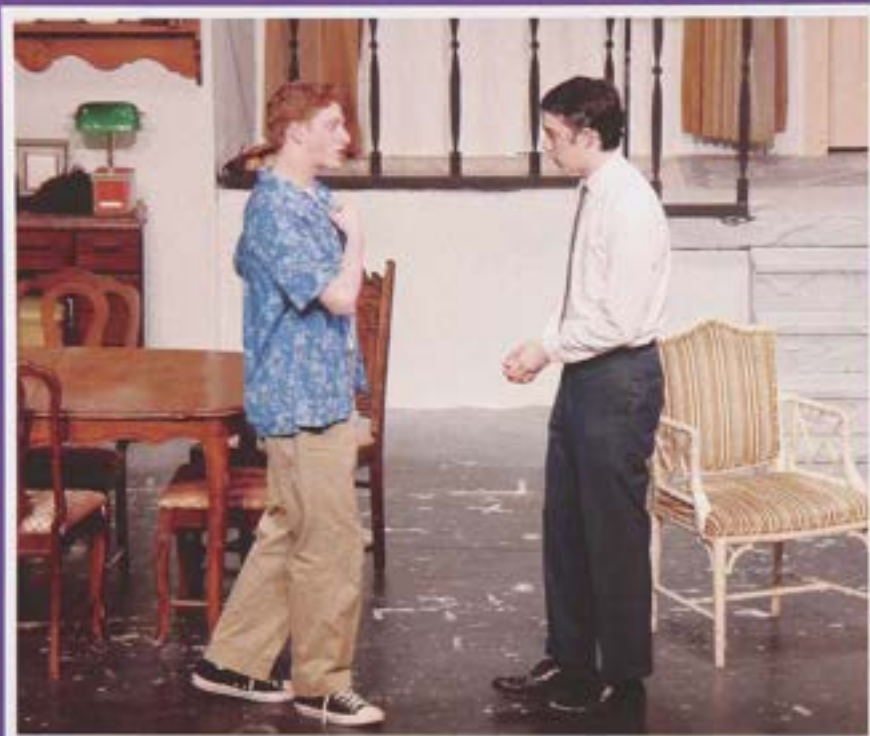
Music Program

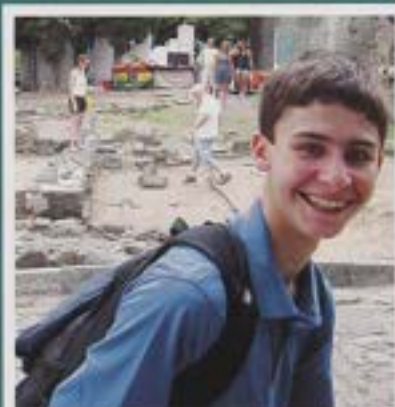
Dennis Zilinski Run



On November 13, 2011, 1,200 people came together at the PNC Arts Center in Holmdel to honor the memory of Lt. Dennis W. Zilinski, II and to pay tribute to all our Veterans and military personnel. Lt. Zilinski grew up in Middletown, NJ, attended Christian Brothers Academy, Lincroft, NJ and the United States Military Academy at West Point. On November 19, 2005, Lt. In autumn of 2011, several CBA students led by Mr. Timothy Sewnig traveled to the Blackfeet Nation in Browning, Montana to partake in a service and cultural immersion trip. Located just south of the Canadian-United States border, the reservation suffers from a wide range of socio-economic problems including widespread poverty, alcoholism, abuse, and drug use. The group representing CBA spent the week tutoring students within the De La Salle Blackfeet School, a grammar school run by the Christian Brothers for students in grades 4 – 8. The group helped to reinforce the mission of the Brothers and the school: to help direct the youth on the reservation towards a positive path moving forward into high school and beyond. The group was also privileged to encounter the Blackfeet culture firsthand through several different immersion experiences made possible during the stay. I gladly confirm and heartily endorse the recommendation of the Lasallian Committee at Christian Brothers Academy that Mr. Frank Bulzis be our school's Distinguished Lasallian Educator for 2011-12 and recommend him to the Mission Executive Council of the District of Eastern North America for their review, approbation, and edification.
