





Mrs. Belford has a B.A. from Rutgers University and a M. Ed. from Rutgers as well. She teaches English I and English IV.


Mr. Steven Middler




An account from a CBA student whose house was destroyed by Hurricane Sandy:

On October 29th, the final preparations for Hurricane Sandy were completed on my house in Sea Bright, New Jersey. I went to bed that night, expecting a hurricane similar to Irene, little did I know that that was the last night I would ever sleep in my house again. We came back to the town I had once called home, with mounds of sand in the streets, and houses completely flooded. My house had gotten five feet of water. Enough to fry any wiring in the walls, along with destroying every possession my mom and I owned on the first floor. This hurricane, although devastating, taught everyone on the Jersey shore a powerful lesson. The one thing I have learned, from all of this, is that people, no matter how rich or how poor, will reach across social classes to help those in need.



















































Academy Torch

Arister







Model U.N.





The Model United Nations Club challenges students to address global issues and conflicts. Students attend a variety of Model United Nations Conferences including the North American invitations Model United Nations or the NAIMUN Conference hosted by the students of Georgetown University and Princeton Model United Nations (PMUNC). Model United Nations Conferences are simulations in which student delegates represent an assigned nation in committee meetings where a wide range of global problems are discussed. Delegates seek to reach diplomatic solutions to these problems. Students are responsible for researching their assigned country's position on the issues and writing a position paper. Once at the conference, student delegates are judged on their position papers and their ability to solve problems through discussion, debate, and negotiation. Participation in these conferences helps students understand the international system and allows them to increase their knowledge of other countries and cultures.







Mock Trial





The CBA Mock Trial team consists of students who are interested in the American judicial process and in participating in staged trials as part of a statewide competition run by the New Jersey State Bar Foundation. Students study a fictional case over the course of several months and prepare to assume the roles of attorneys and witnesses in the weeklong county competition held at the Monmouth County Courthouse in January. The team aspires to earn points by competing against other schools in staged trials judged by real judges and attorneys at the Monmouth County Courthouse in Freehold. The team gets much assistance from Ms.Opramolla, and their attorney-coaches, CBA alumnus George Veitengruber and CBA mother Claire Scully.








Chess


To The Blackfeet Reservation in Montana















In Autumn of 2012, several CBA students, led by Mr. Timothy Sewnig, traveled to the Blackfeet Nation in Browning, Montana to partake in a service and cultural immersion trip. Located just south of the Canada - United States border, the reservation suffers from a wide range of socio-economic problems including widespread poverty, alcoholism, abuse, and drug use. The group representing CBA spent the week tutoring students within the De La Salle Blackfeet School, a grammar school run by the Christian Brothers for students in grades 4-8. The group helped to reinforce the mission of the Brothers and the school: to help direct youth on the reservation towards a positive path moving forward into high school and beyond. 




