














































Dennis Zilinski Run

LaSallian Youth Mission Trip


To The Blackfeet Reservation in Montana













In November 2013 several CBA students, led by Mr. Butler and Mr. Sewnig, traveled to the Blackfeet Nation in Browning, Montana to partake in a service and cultural immersion trip. Located just south of the Canada - United States border, the reservation suffers from a wide range of socio-economic problems including widespread poverty, alcoholism, abuse, and drug use. The group representing CBA spent the week tutoring students within the De La Salle Blackfeet School, a grammar school run by the Christian Brothers for students in grades 4-8. The group helped to reinforce the mission of the Brothers and the school: to help direct youth on the reservation towards a positive path moving forward into high school and beyond. The group was privileged to encounter the Blackfeet culture firsthand through several different immersion experiences made possible during the stay. Overall, the experience proved to be immensely profound spiritually for those involved while it also reinforced the service-oriented, LaSallian spirit of CBA.




Model U.N.




Spanish Club












CBA Pipe and Drum Club

Letter From the Editor

Dear Reader,

After 12 months of editing, photographing, and designing, the book that you are currently holding was created. The amount of time and effort that went into this book is more than you could imagine. I tried my hardest to make this the best yearbook possible. I hope that you enjoy this book for years to come, and never forget the memories from the 2013-2014 school year.

The yearbook is much more work than people realize it to be, especially with only a 2-person staff. The 2013-2014 yearbook began creation in April of 2013. It began by designing a unique cover for the book, which is not easy. With so many years of exquisite yearbooks at CBA it is difficult to come up with a new cover that is not similar to previous ones.
