
Noting how successfully you have met the challenges placed before you and the contributions you have made to the CBA Community, please accept my sincere congratulations on your graduation!

I ask for your prayers and promise you that you will always be in mine.

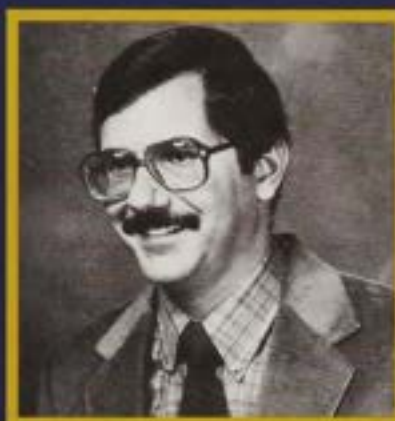

Thank You Mr. Santanello...

As Mr. Santanello prepares to leave us after 41 years it seems only fitting that we reflect on the many and varied accomplishments of this dedicated man. Mr. Santanello joined Christian Brothers Academy in 1974 as a member of the Math Department. During his time here he has served as the Lighting Director for Pegasus Productions (1974-84) and Moderator of the Student Council (1975-92). In 1982 he was named Associate Principal of Academics and remained as such; while still teaching Calculus; until 2012. Mr. Santanello served under five Brother Principals, Brother Peter Mannion, Brother Andrew O'Gara, Brother Ralph Montedoro, Brother Stephen Olert and Brother James Butler. In 2012 he made CBA history by being appointed as the first lay principal of The Academy. The quote which follows was written in 1998 when he was named Outstanding LaSallian Educator, the words are as true now as they were then. "He has consistently and quietly shown his dedication, zeal and concern as a professional person and a very fine Christian gentleman. He conducts a well-run school with an atmosphere conducive to learning and directs teachers to be student-centered, to know them as individuals. He inspires teachers to look upon their profession as a ministry, not just a job. He directs teachers to begin each class with a prayer recalling the presence of GOD. In short, we hold Mr. Peter Santanello to be a model educator!" Mr. Santanello truly epitomizes the four attributes of an Academy Man, Faith, Integrity, Accomplishment and Promise. Faculty, staff and students wish him well as he begins this next chapter of his life!

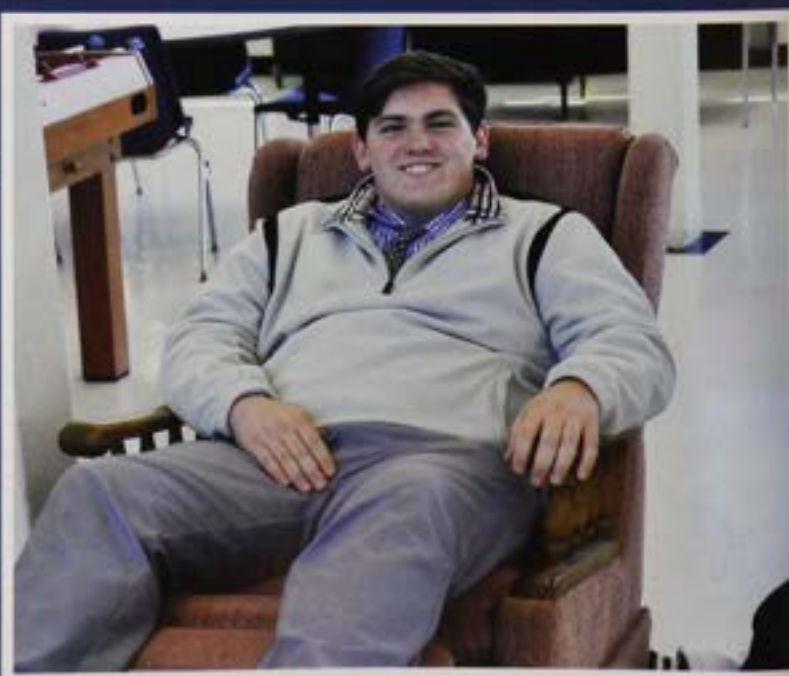
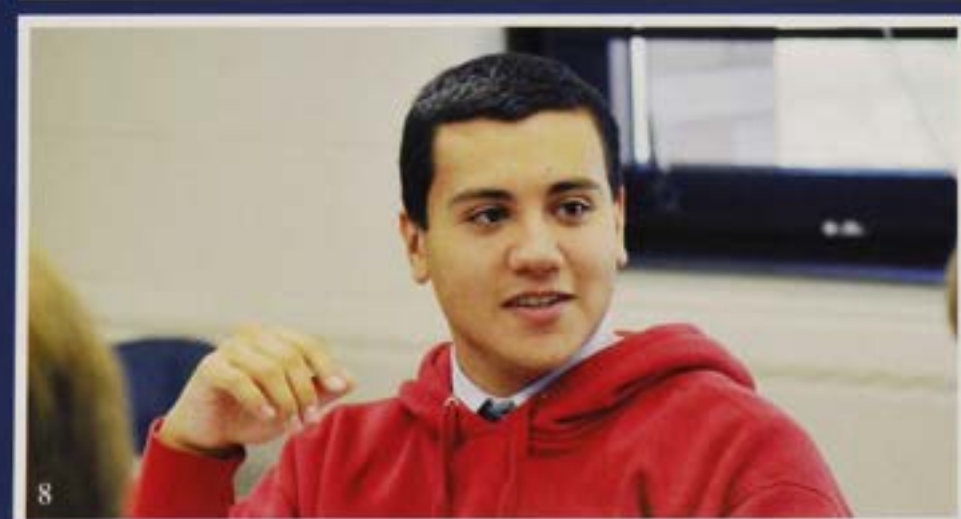
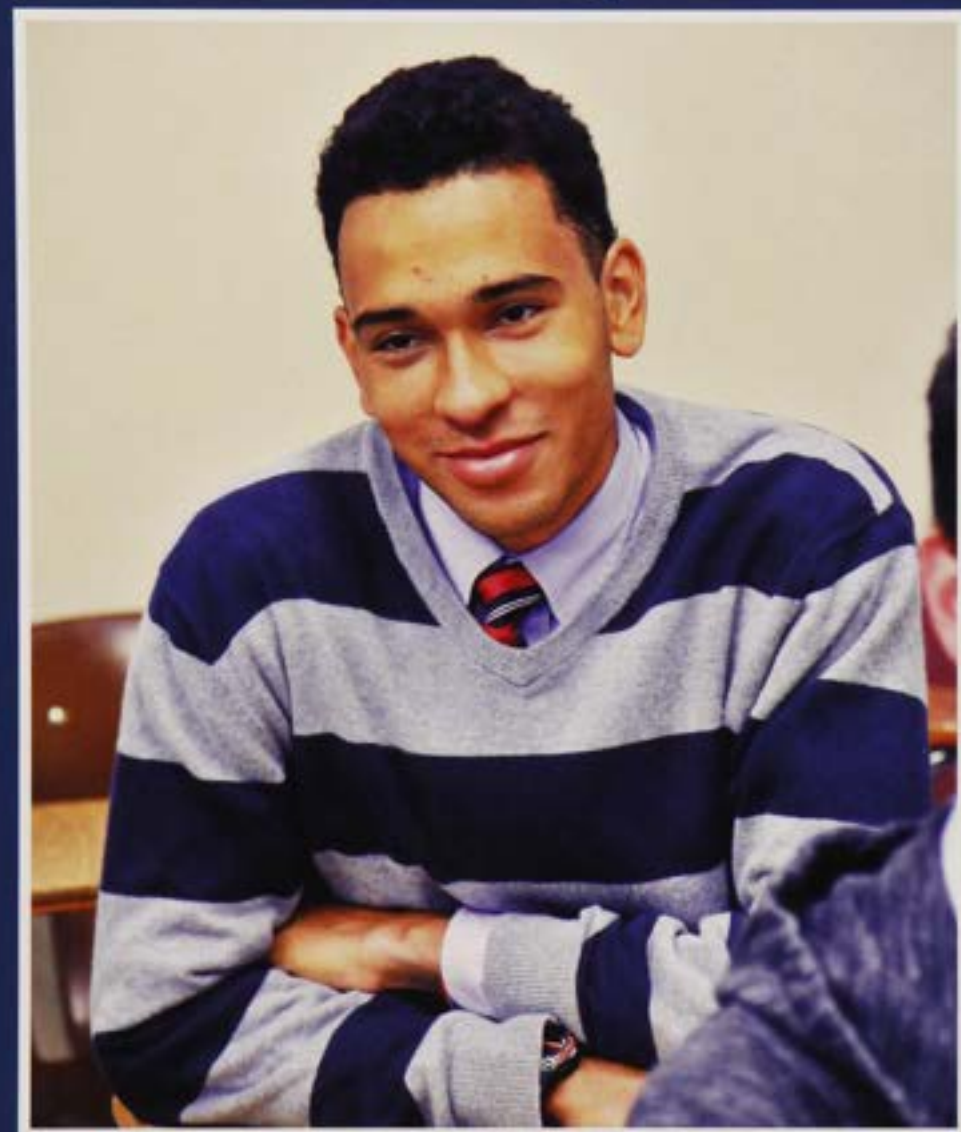
Mr. Richard Courter Smith

Dennis Zilinski Run

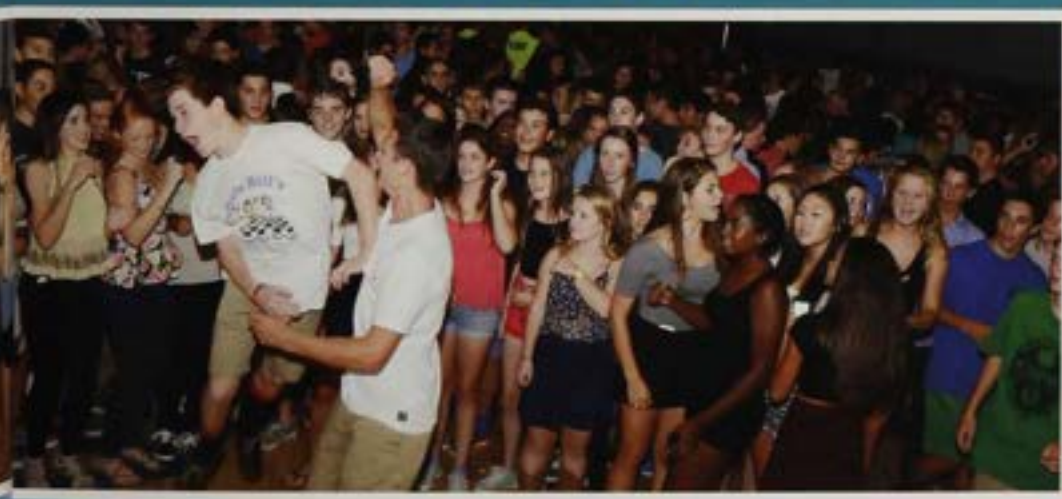

To The Blackfeet Reservation in Montana

In October 2014 several CBA students, led by Mr. Butler and Mr. Sewnig, traveled to the Blackfeet Nation in Browning, Montana to partake in a service and cultural immersion trip. Located just south of the Canada - United States border, the reservation suffers from a wide range of socio-economic problems including widespread poverty, alcoholism, abuse, and drug use. The group representing CBA spent the week tutoring students within the De La Salle Blackfeet School, a grammar school run by the Christian Brothers for students in grades 4-8. The group helped to reinforce the mission of the Brothers and the school: to help direct youth on the reservation towards a positive path moving forward into high school and beyond. The group was privileged to encounter the Blackfeet culture firsthand through several different immersion experiences made possible during the stay. Overall, the experience proved to be immensely profound spiritually for those involved while it also reinforced the service-oriented, LaSallian spirit of CBA.

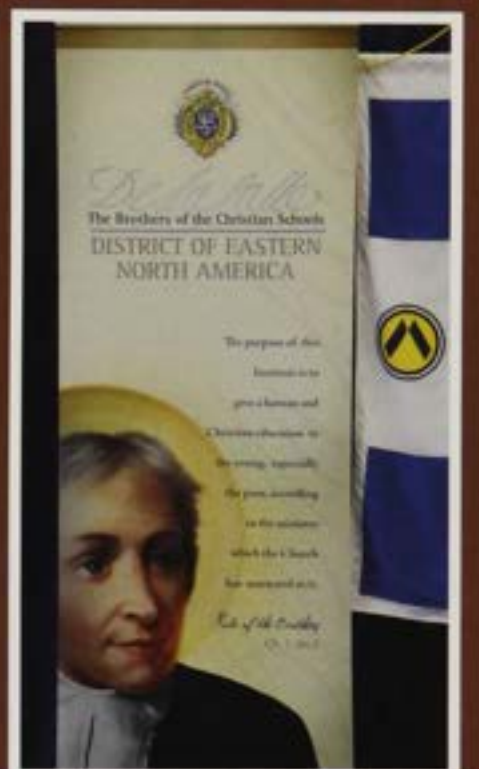
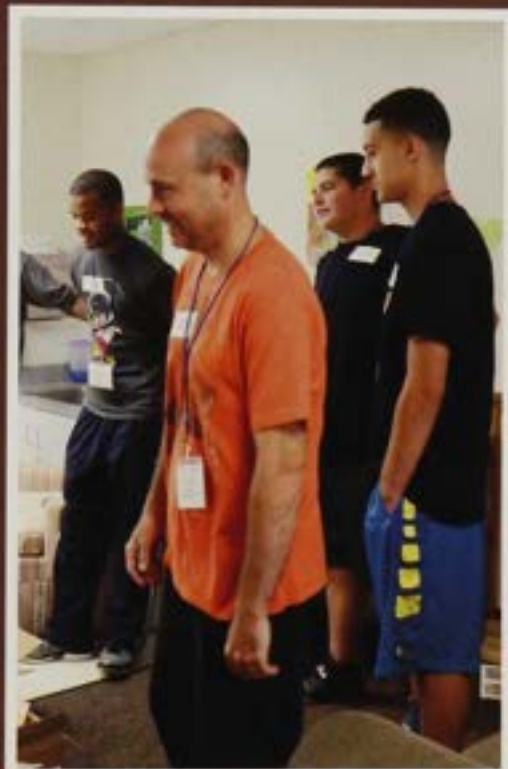
Clubs



LaSallian Youth

LaSallian Youth is the primary service organization at Christian Brothers Academy. Founded in 2001, this organization is one of many chapters in LaSallian schools around the world. Spanish Club

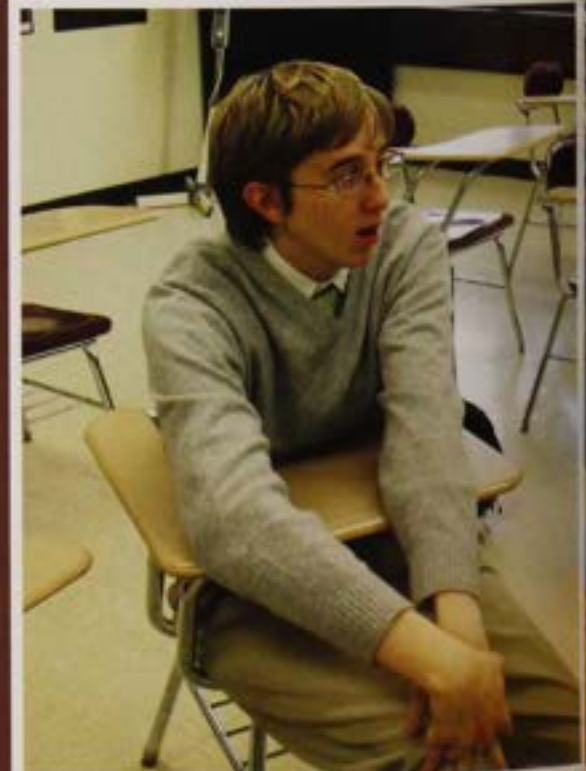

Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu

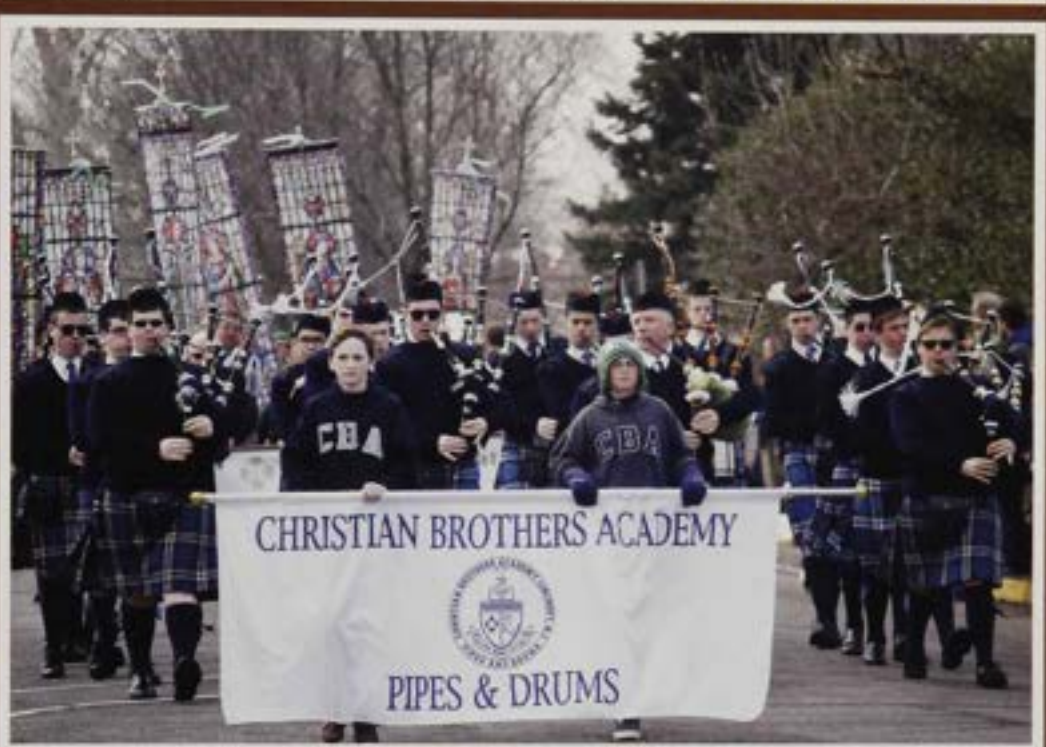

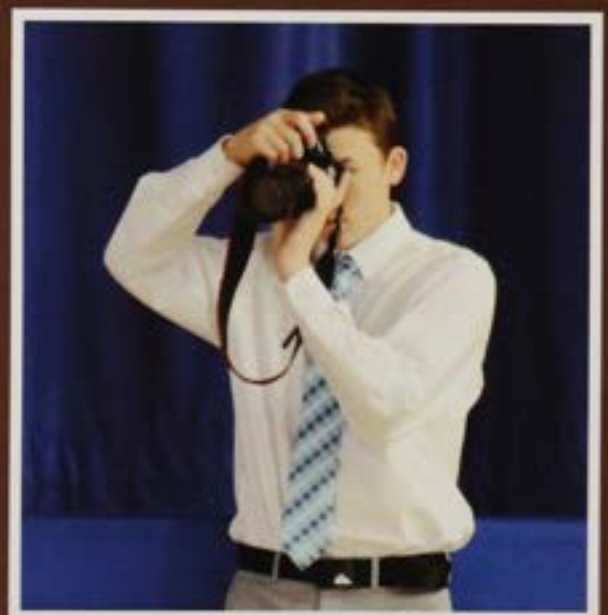
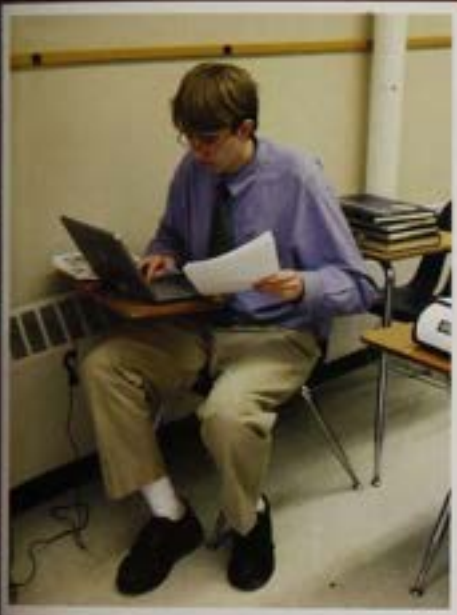
Teens for Oceans
