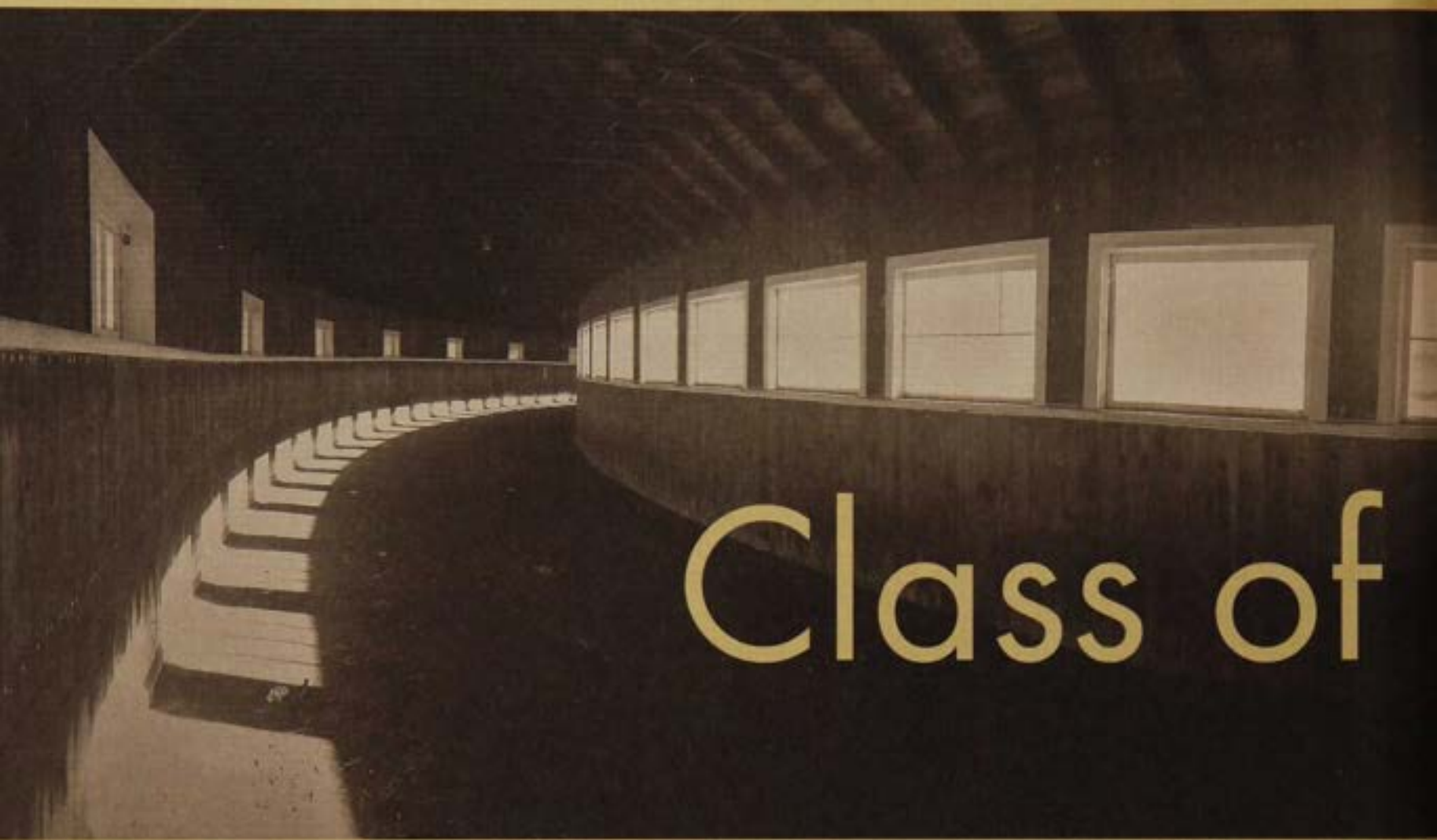

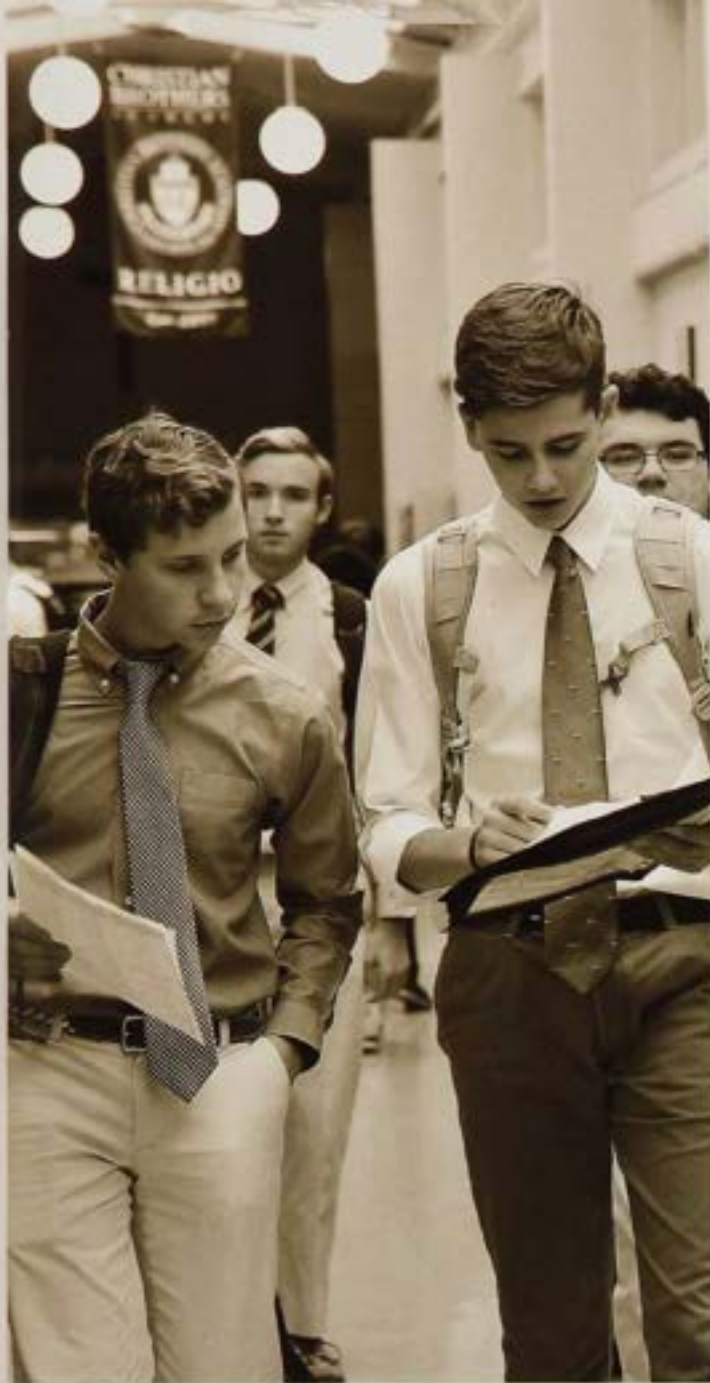

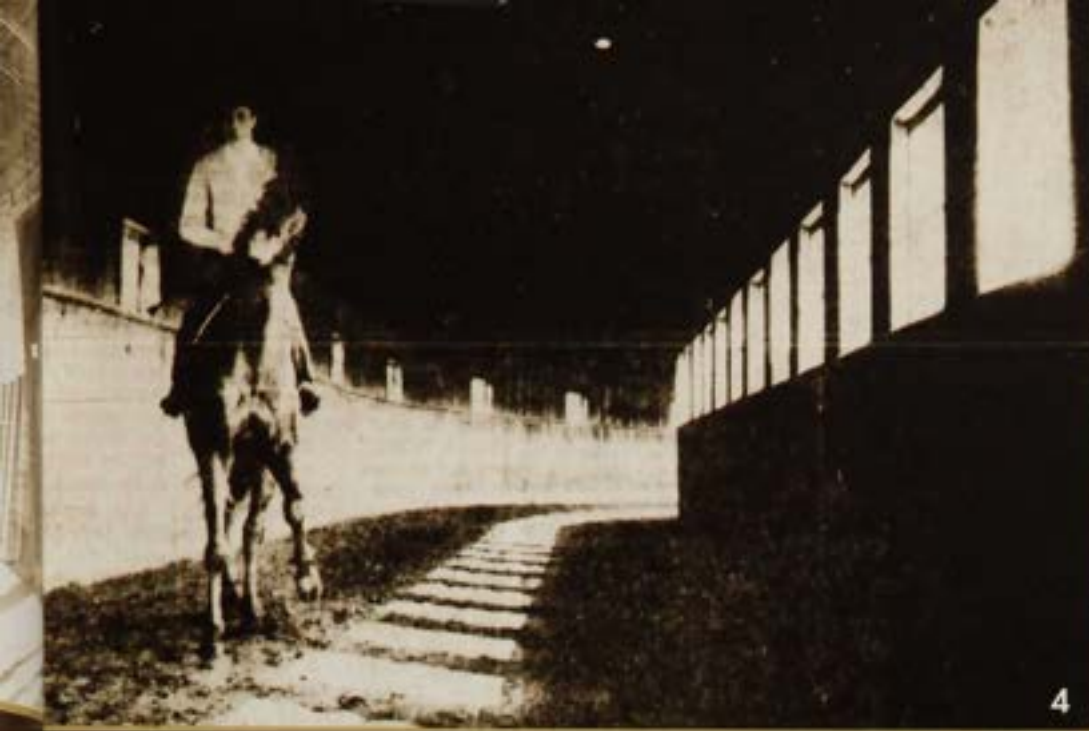

IN LOVING MEMORY MRS. DOLLY SULLIVAN

August 31, 1927 - March 12, 2018



This year, Christian Brothers Academy lost a legend. Mrs. Dolly Sullivan's association with CBA began in 1960 when she and her husband, Jim Gartland, visited the campus each morning to provide coffee for the workers of Walter C. Hurley Construction Company. Brother Bernard McKenna, our first Principal, asked Dolly and Jim if they would like to run the cafeteria once the school opened in 1961. From that time forward, CBA became Dolly's second home.

Over the next 57 years Dolly and her staff served over 11,000 students and hundreds of brothers, faculty, and staff. Dolly truly enjoyed her interactions with the boys, and she took great pride in seeing them grow into fine gentlemen. The students truly appreciated Dolly and would often stop into the kitchen to say hello. Dolly's cookies became famous, and in recent years she gave the Alumni Association these cookies to mail out to the college freshmen so that they could feel a little more at home.

The students, alumni, faculty, and staff of Christian Brothers Academy were blessed to have known Dolly Sullivan. She was an integral part of CBA for almost sixty years, and she will always have a special place in our hearts.

St. John Baptist De La Salle told the first Brothers that, "To touch the hearts of your students is the greatest miracle you can perform." Dolly certainly did this, and we are all better people because of her contributions to the CBA community.

The class of 2018 and the staff of Pegasus Yearbook lovingly dedicate this yearbook to Dolly. Rest in peace. Live Jesus in our hearts. Forever.

On Sept. 28, 2017, the US Department of Education awarded CBA the National Blue Ribbon Award for educational excellence. The announcement made CBA one of only two Catholic schools in the state to receive the award for a second time. Later that day, students and faculty gathered to hear to news and celebrate the honor. Mr. Sean Nunan, Associate Principal for Academic Affairs, took the podium to explain the gravity of the award and thank the community for their hard work, dedication, and commitment to excellence in Catholic education. After moments of praise, Mr.

Nunan went on to challenge the CBA community to continue to reach new heights by saying, "This means that every year, we must be stronger, we must be prepared to do more, to live up to our own high standards and to honor the legacy and tradition of our school. In the end, we may win this again, we may not. But we will not stop. We will not stop being a paragon of excellence in American education." In November, Mr. Nunan and Mr. Fales travelled to Washington DC to officially accept CBA's latest prestigious accolade.

The Academy Oath's line, "To serve and stand for those in need," is not only applied daily at The Academy, but it is part of what it means to be an Academy Man.

Challenged by this message, seven students traveled to the Romero Center Urban Challenge in Camden, NJ. Seniors Sam Houston and Paul Mlodgenski; sophomores Anthony Barb, Jordan Chesebrough, Christian Lee, Patrick Reilly, and Will Seijas; along with theology teachers Mr. Tim Sewnig and Mr. Matthew Butler; spent four days immersed in the urban experience.

The Romero Center has provided immersion retreats incorporating Catholic education values to students since 1998. Students spent the weekend emphasizing prayer and recognizing those struggling in poverty. After viewing a documentary describing Camden's conflicts with poverty, the group spent the morning sorting donations at the Food Bank of South Jersey. Later that evening, several students assisted at a soup kitchen. "It's important to recognize the privileges we often overlook. This experience emphasized the idea that those who have little, often share the most," said Mlodgenski.

In addition to serving the hungry, the students assisted the disabled at the Inglis House in Philadelphia, PA, a rehabilitation facility for patients diagnosed with multiple sclerosis and those injured in paralyzing accidents. "Inglis was an eye-opening facility in which I was able to recognize how lucky all of us are to have the privilege to walk. Walking is a gift that we often forget, but this experience opened my eyes to how grateful I truly am," said Seijas.

Students completed poverty simulation exercises, preparing meals with a limited budget. Students also reflected on their experiences in prayer journals, sharing experiences each evening as a group. "Through helping the less fortunate, bonding with classmates, and learning to see God's light in everything, the Romero Center enables volunteers to leave with a greater character than when they arrived," said Chesebrough.

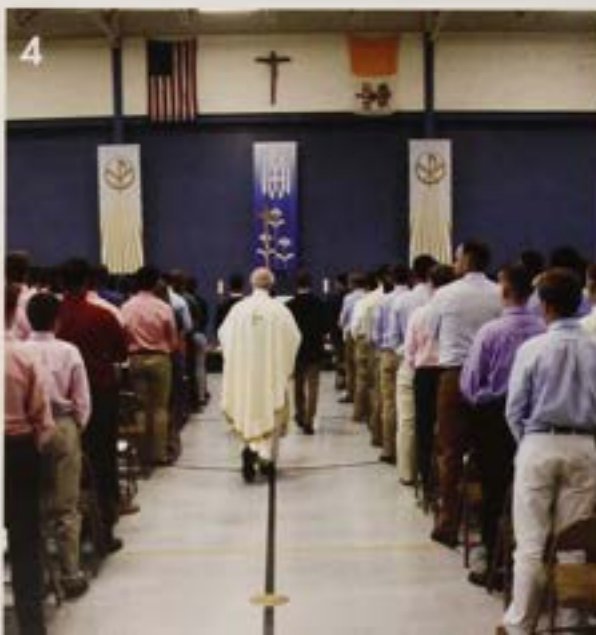

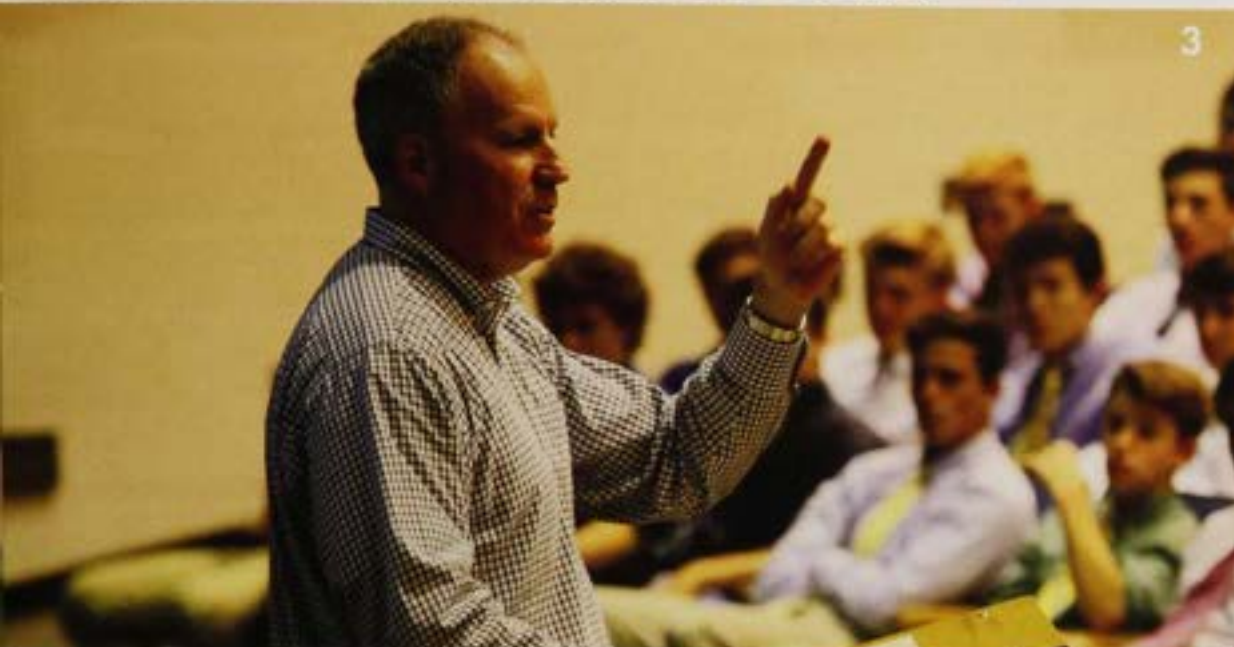

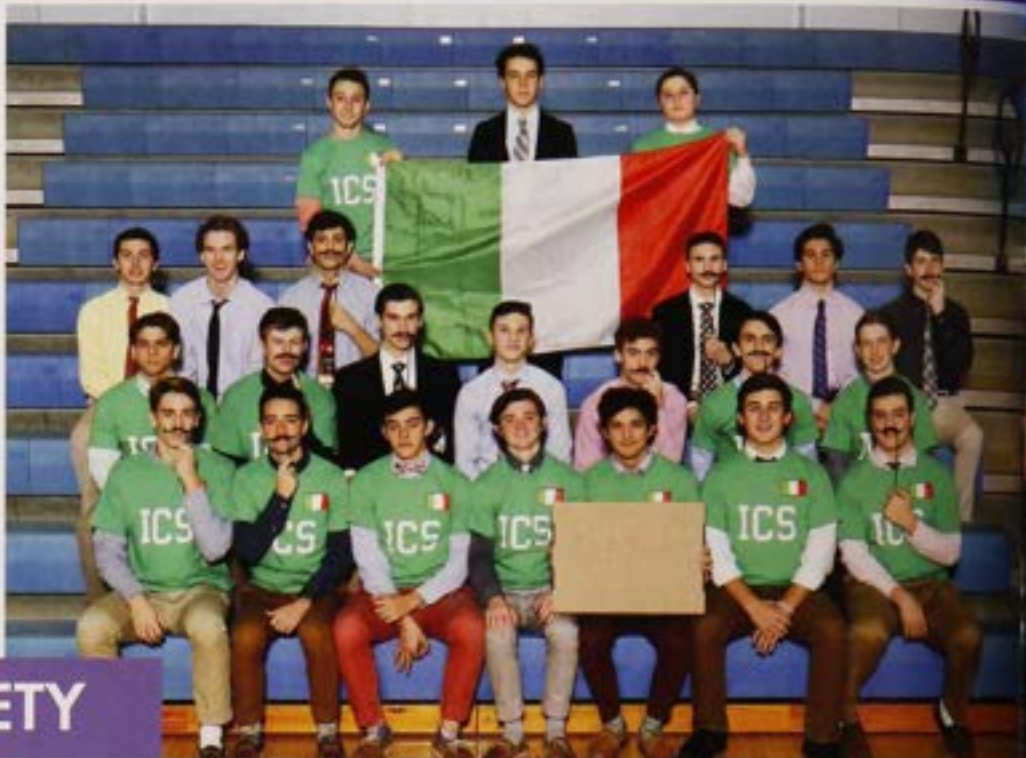
CULTURED COLTS GLOBAL SOCIETIES

IN MEMORIAM BR. PETER LAGONOWICZ, FSC

June 1, 1930 - January 2, 2018

On January 2, 2018, the CBA community lost Br. Peter Lagonowicz, FSC. Originally from Providence, RI, Br. Peter was introduced to the Christian Brothers at La Salle Academy. He began a life dedicated to education when he joined the Brothers' novitiate in 1948. His teaching career began in a small grammar school in the Bronx. From there, his posts included virtually every position in education, including teacher, director, and administrator. In 1995, Br. Peter joined the Brothers at their novitiate community in Poland. Since he was raised in a devoted Polish-American family, he had an understanding of Polish faith, culture, and language. He was able to utilize his skills to aid the young Brothers in their studies of English. After ten years serving the Polish novitiates, Br. Peter returned to the United States as part of the CBA family. At CBA, he served as a library assistant, took copious photographs, and moderated Bible Studies for CBA students. For twelve years, Br. Peter was a fixture in the halls of CBA. He passed away peacefully at the Brothers' Residence. His constant, peaceful presence will certainly be missed throughout the community.

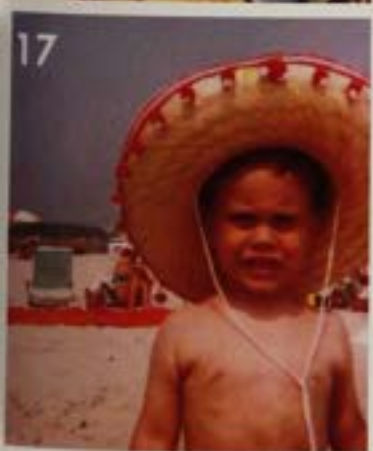
