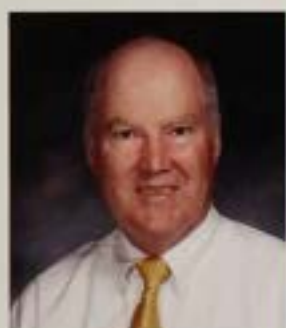
theology *in action*

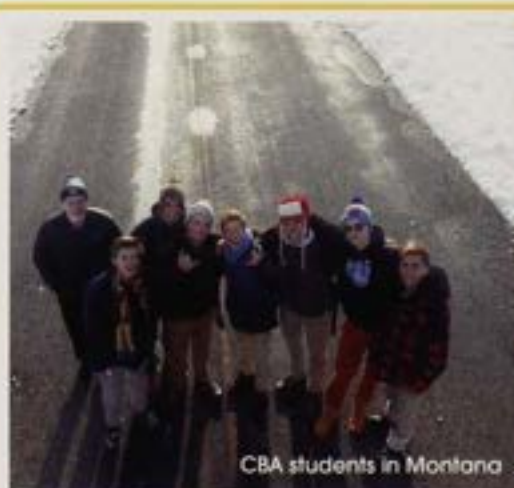

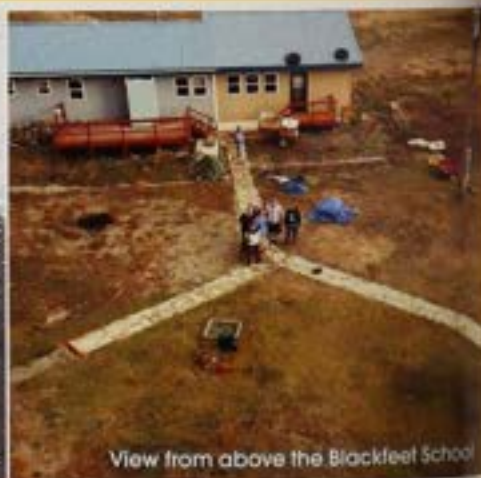

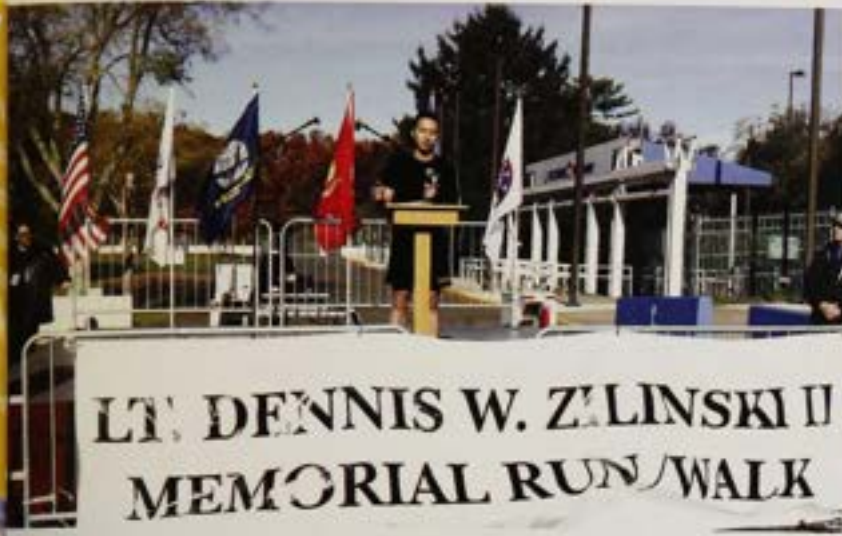
Zilinski Run

The music department lent their skills to many student assemblies. This included the welcoming of our Lasalian brothers from Japan.

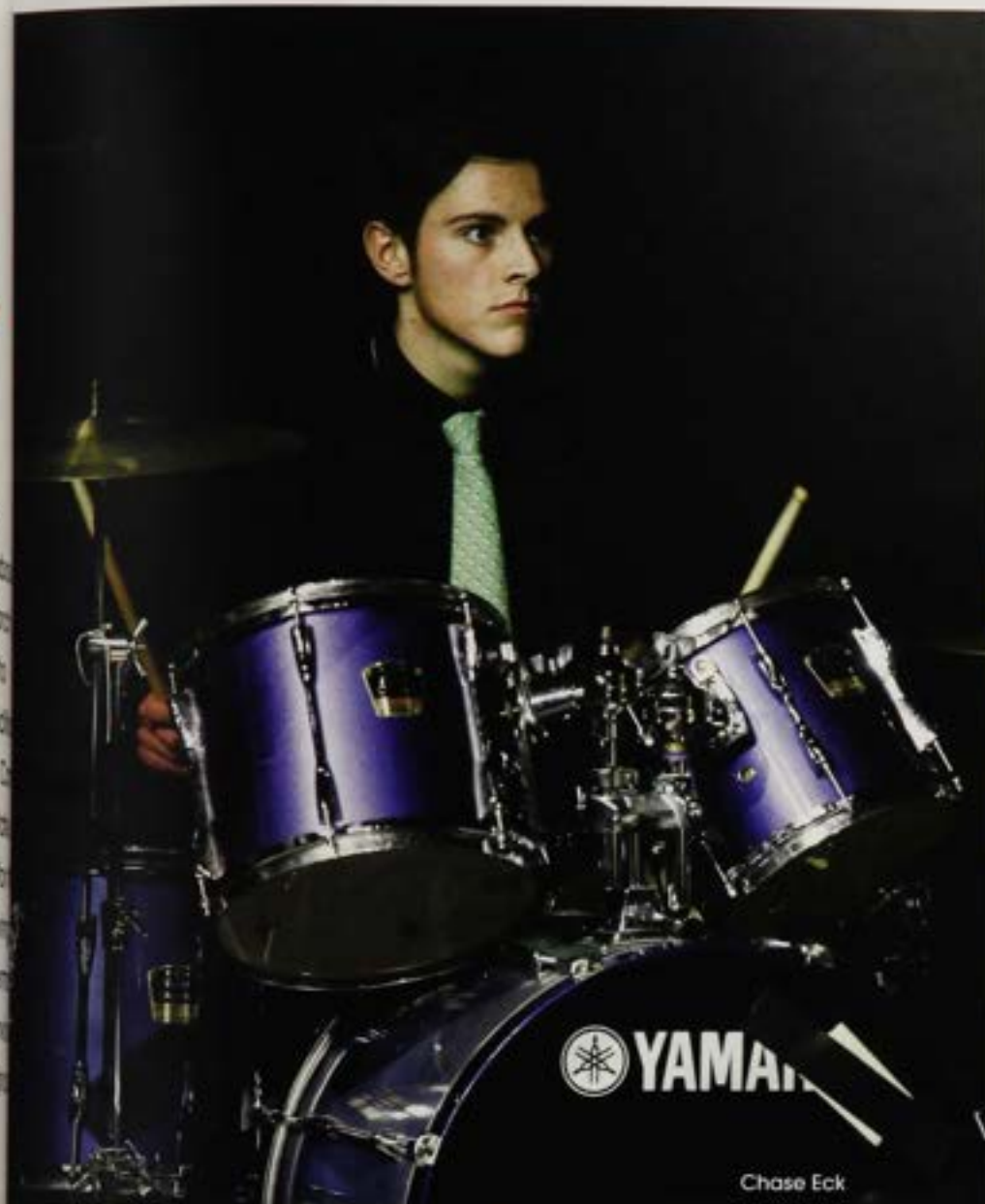

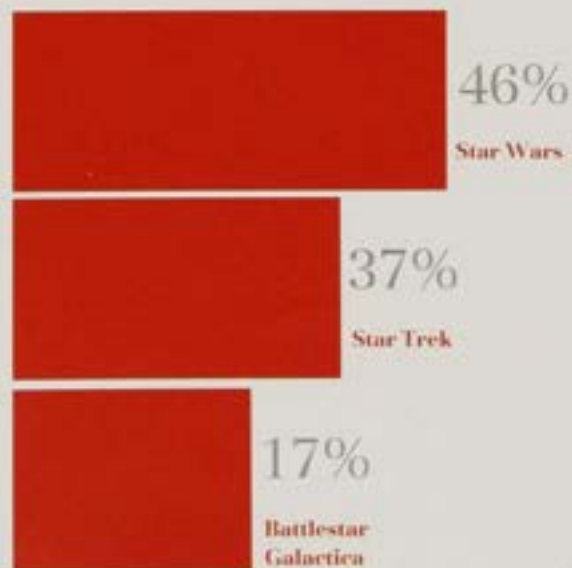

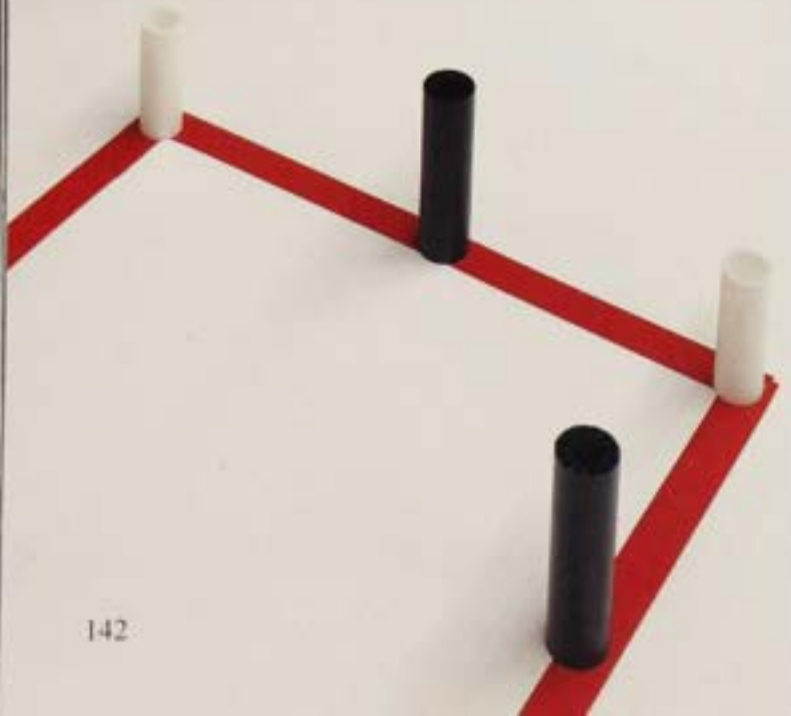

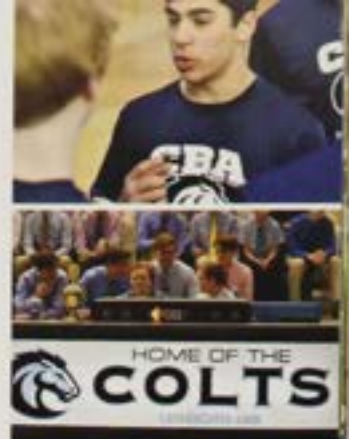

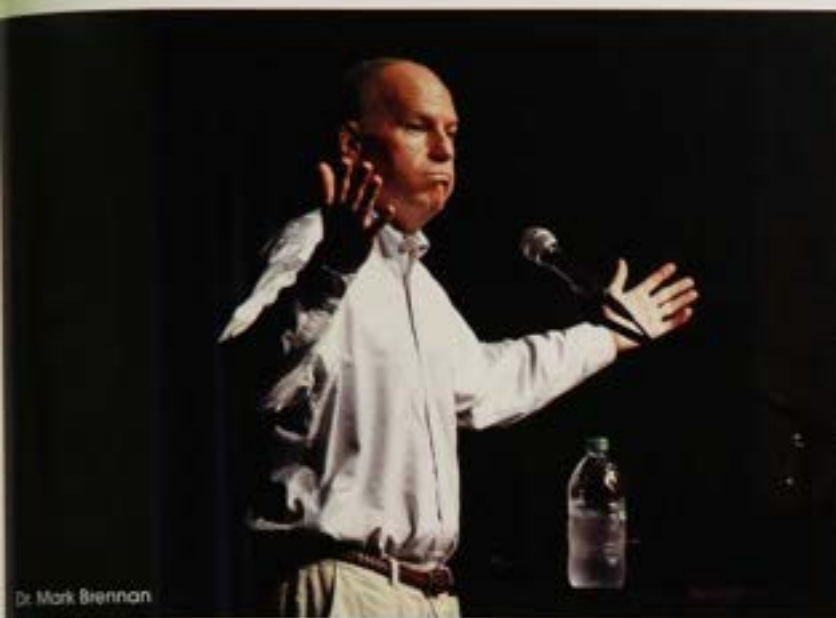


Heath Freshman Run

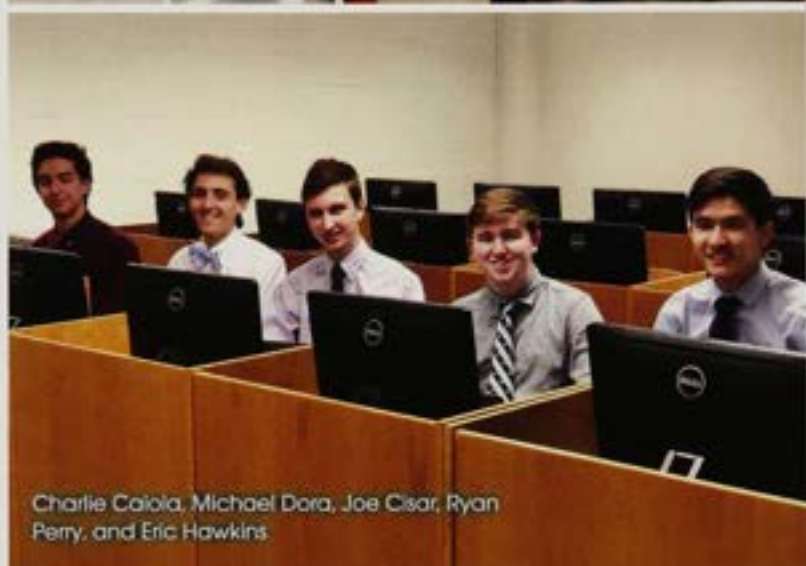

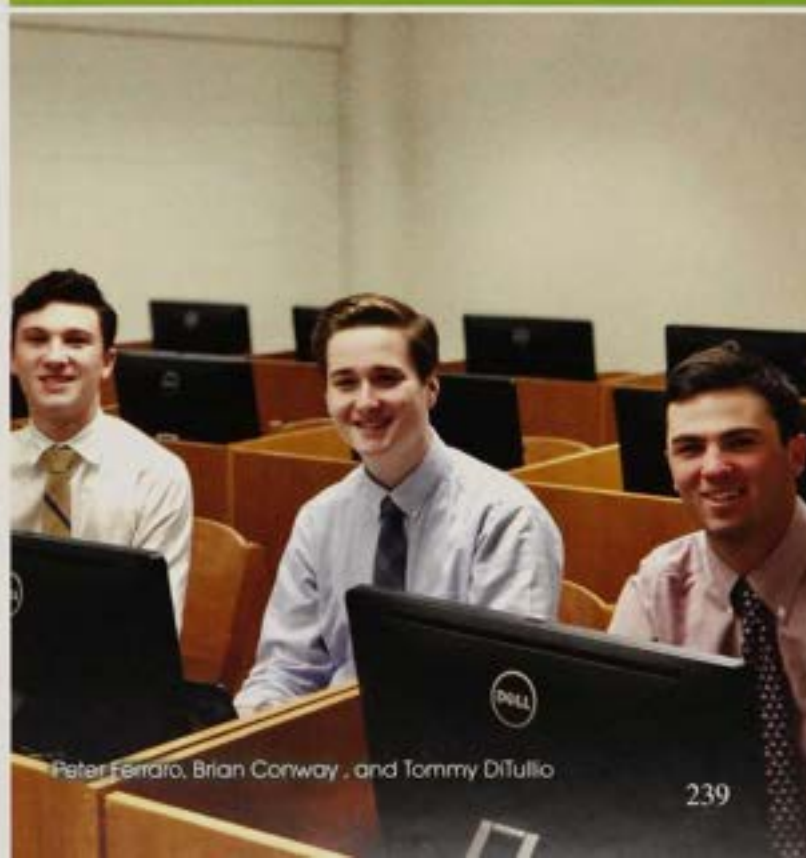

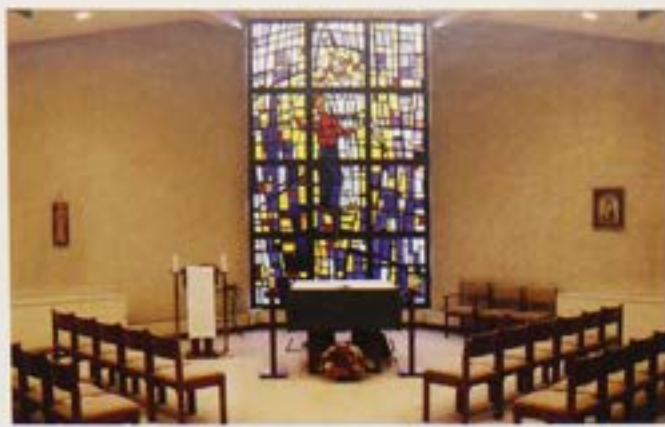


AWARD WINNING TEAM

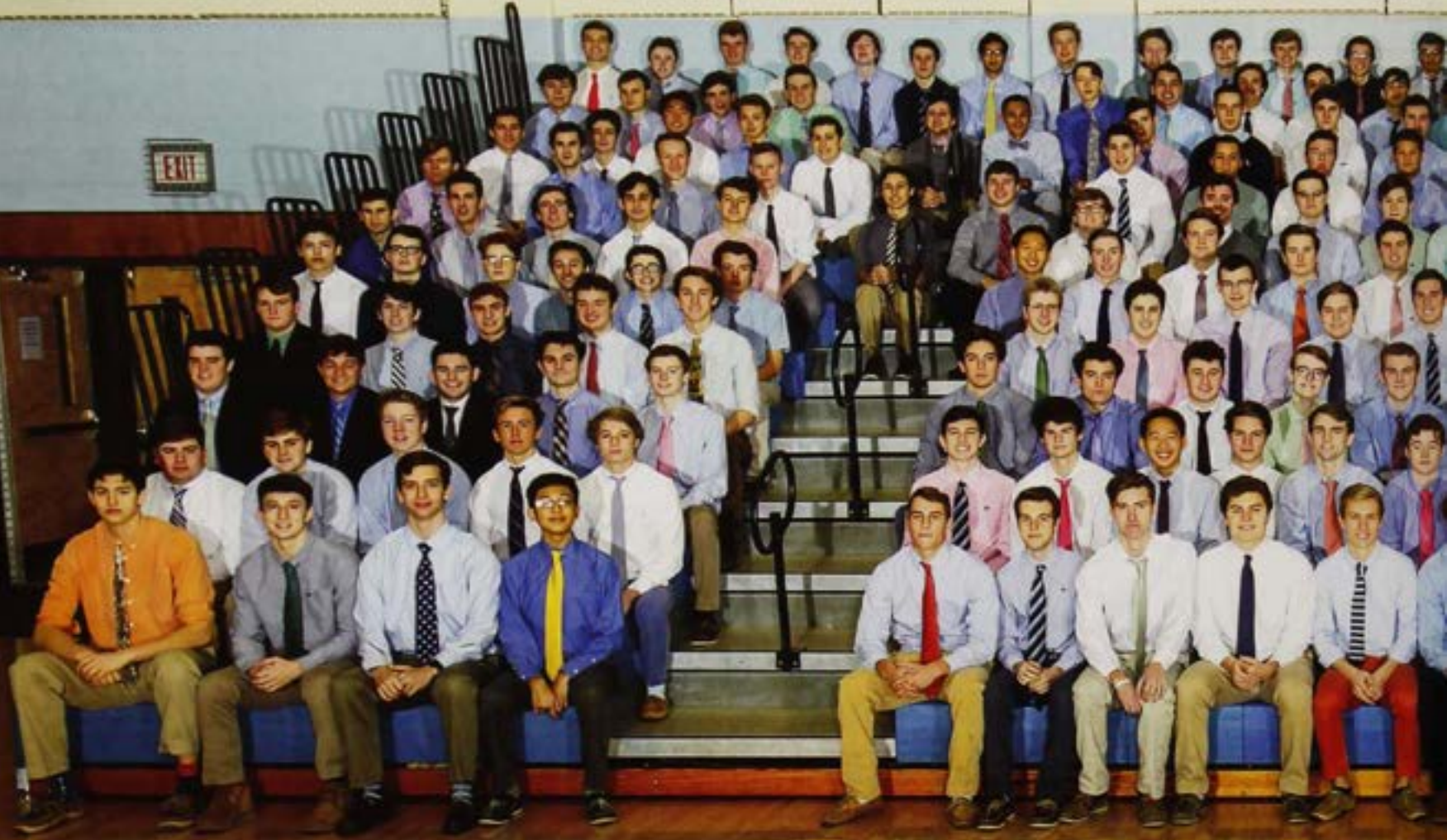
