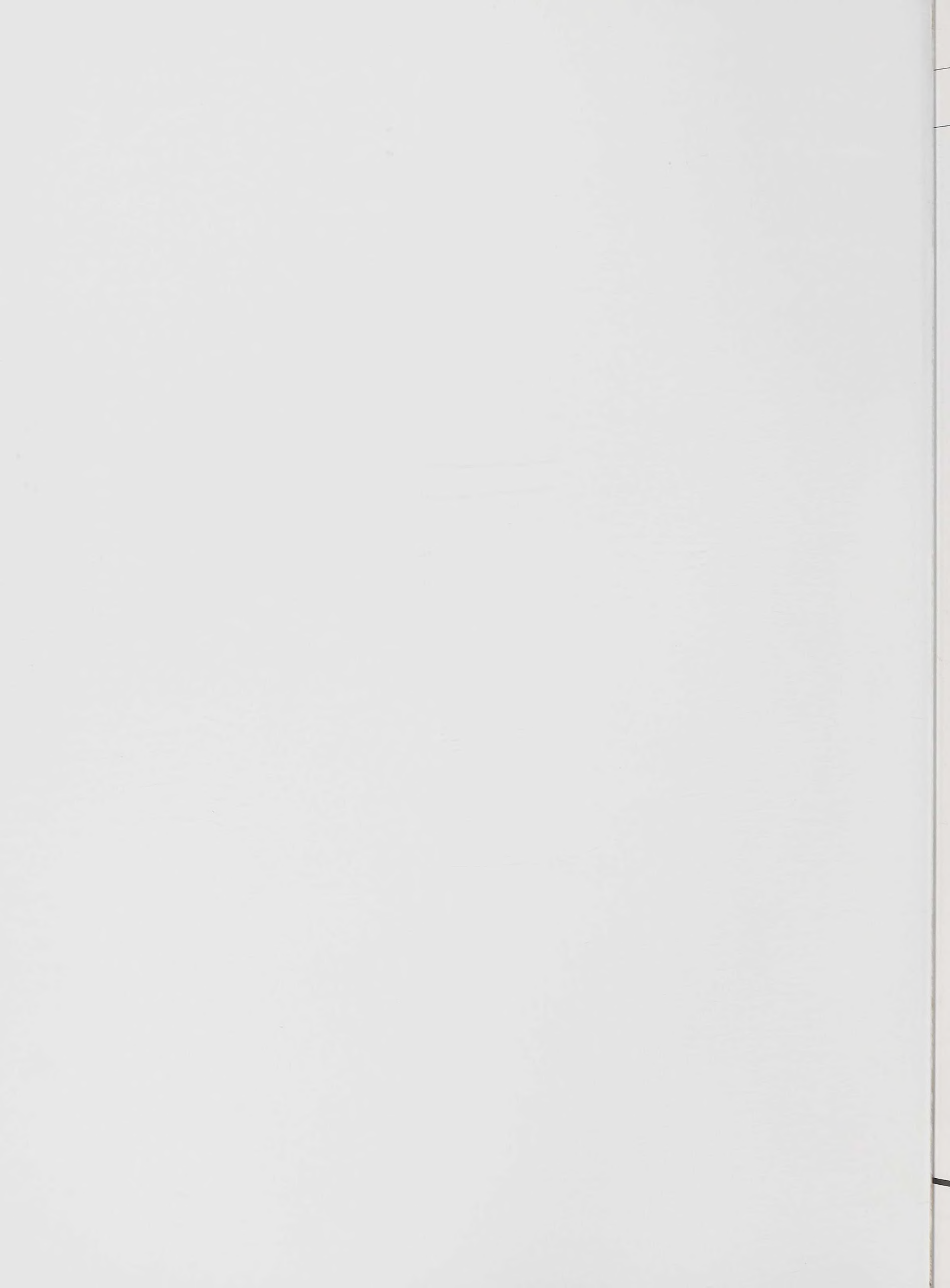

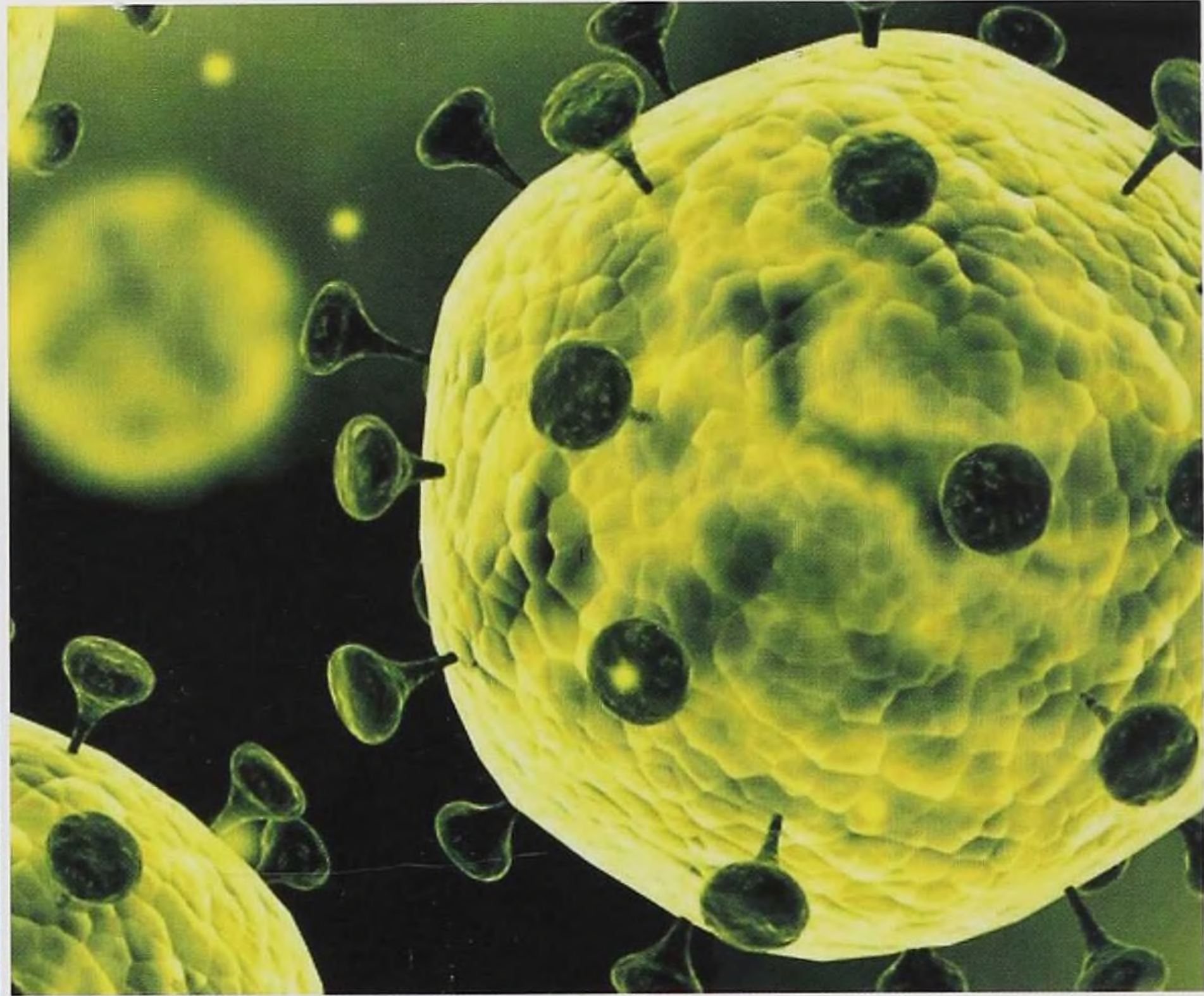

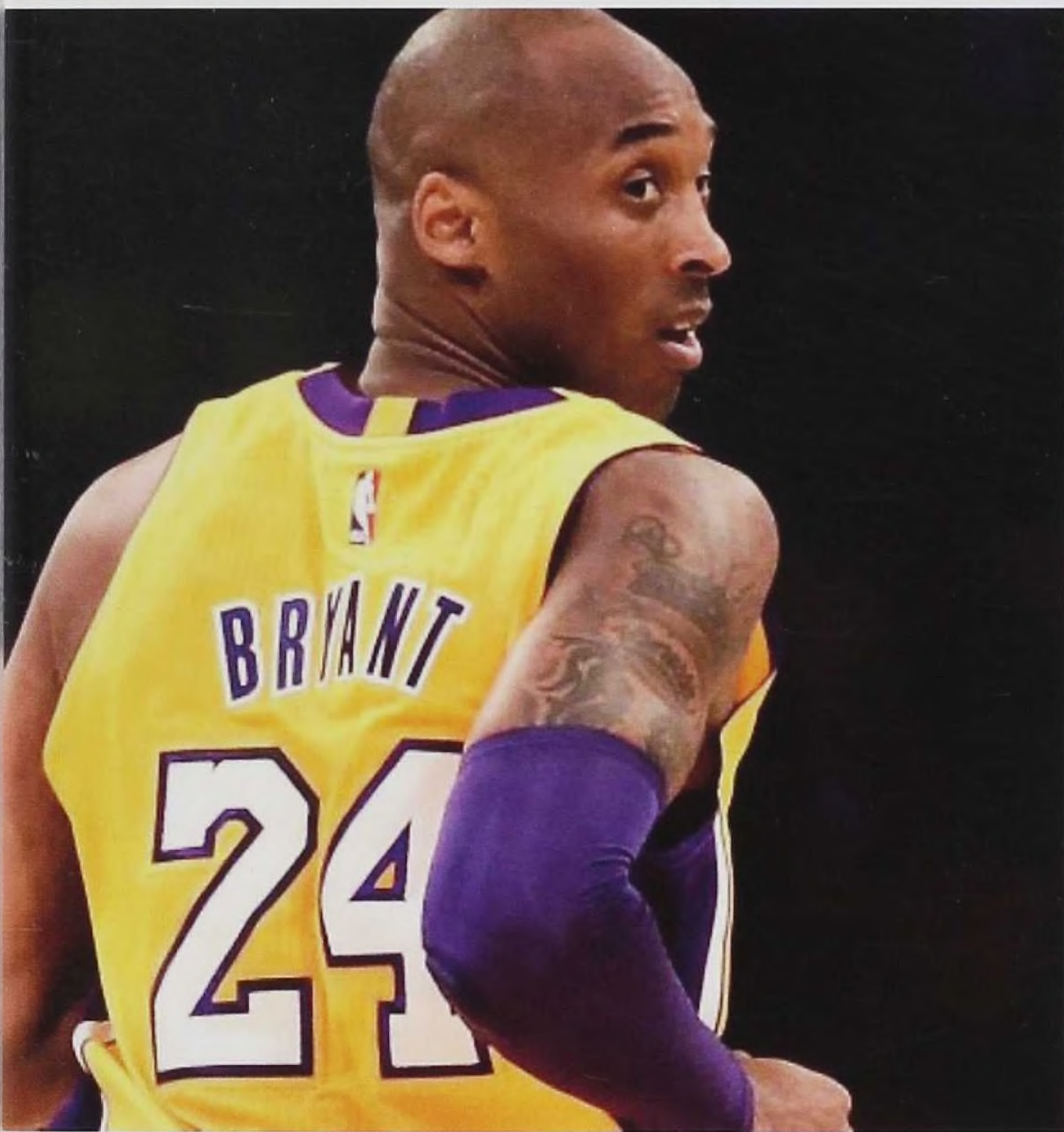

In the fall of 2019, MLB was riddled with scandal, when the Houston Astros and the Boston Red Sox were implicated in a sign-stealing scandal. At the center of the controversy was Astros manager AJ Hinch.

Mass protests erupted in the streets of Hong Kong in October of 2019. Demonstrators, many of them college students, protested Chinese laws that they deemed to be an infringement on their civil liberties.

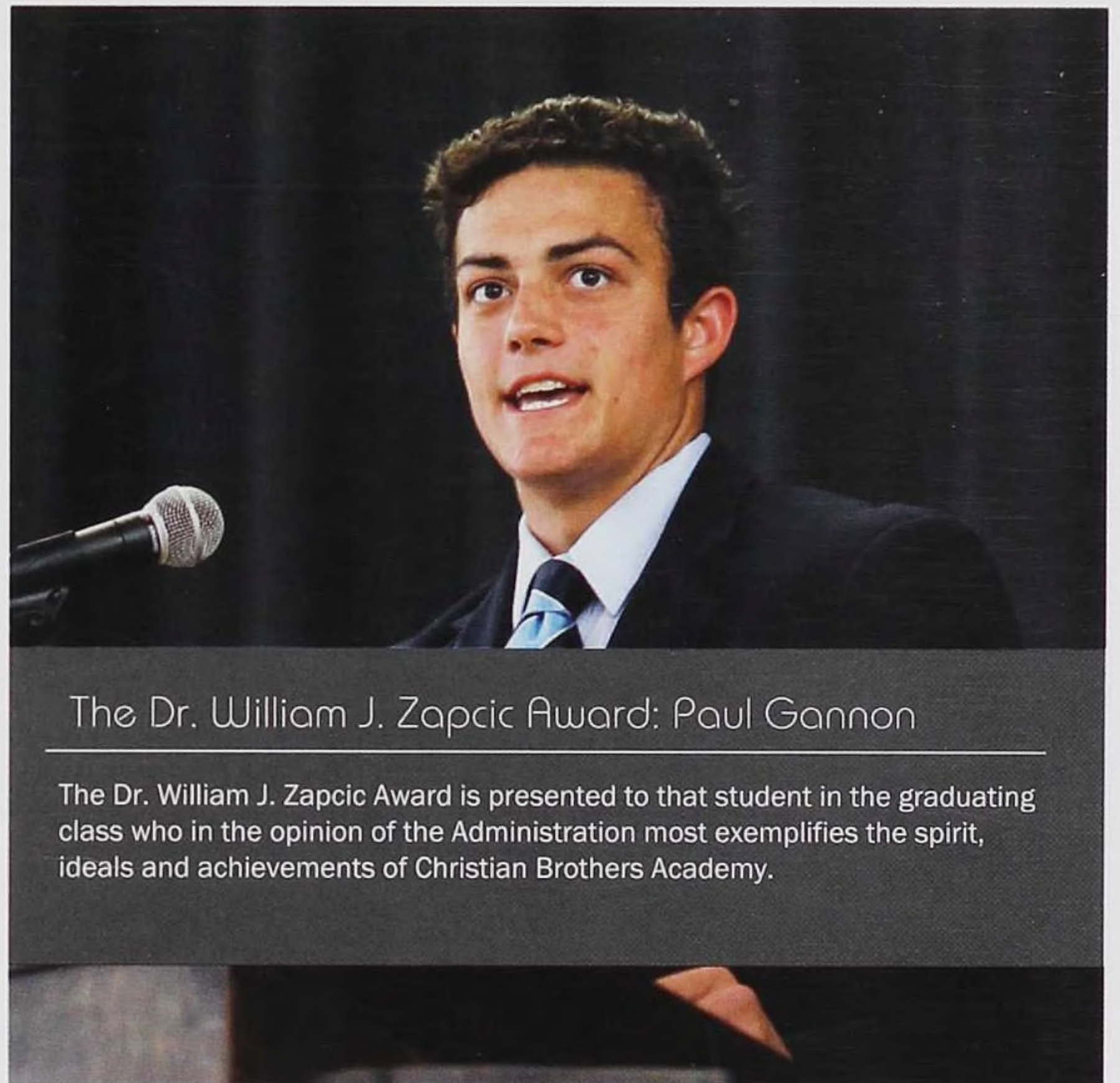
## 2020 cba graduation award winners

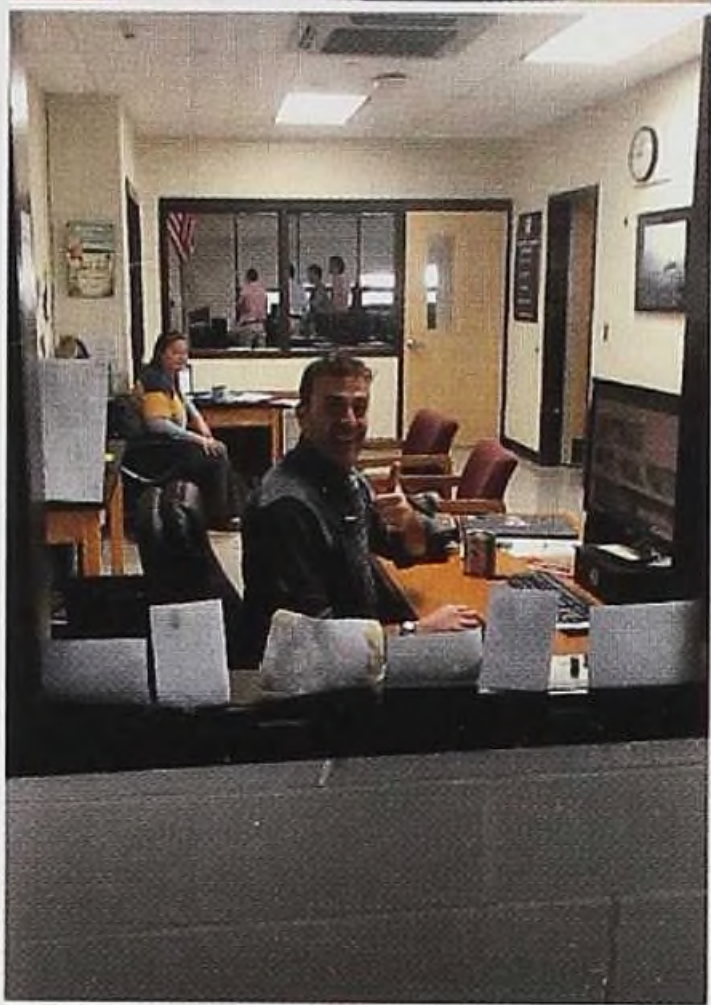
# computer science department

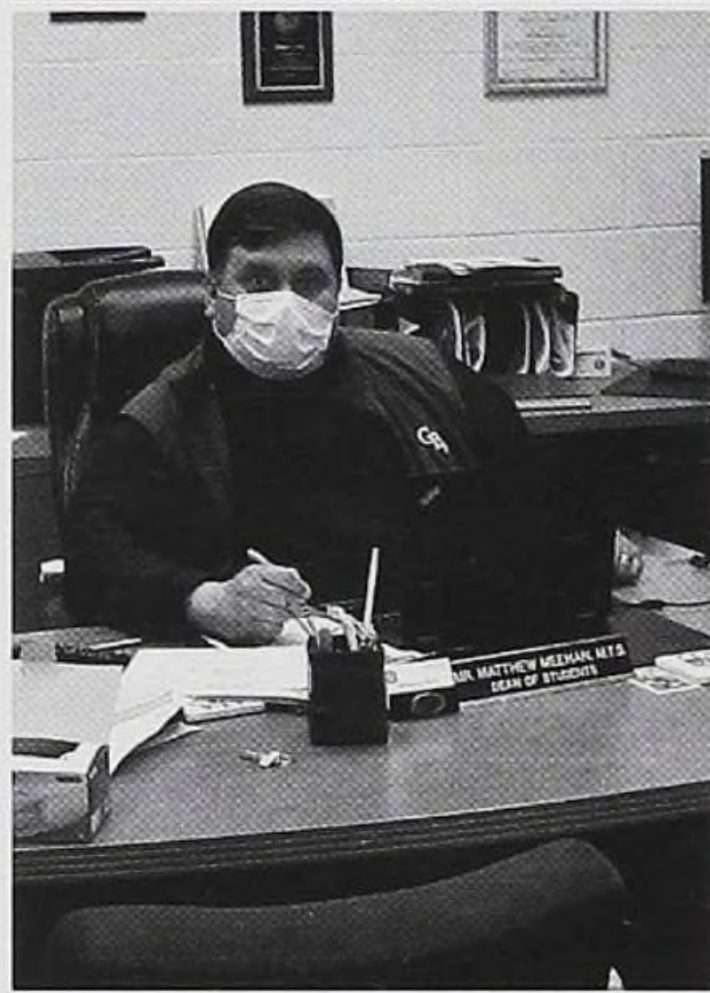
### Academic and student life in the wake of COVID-19.

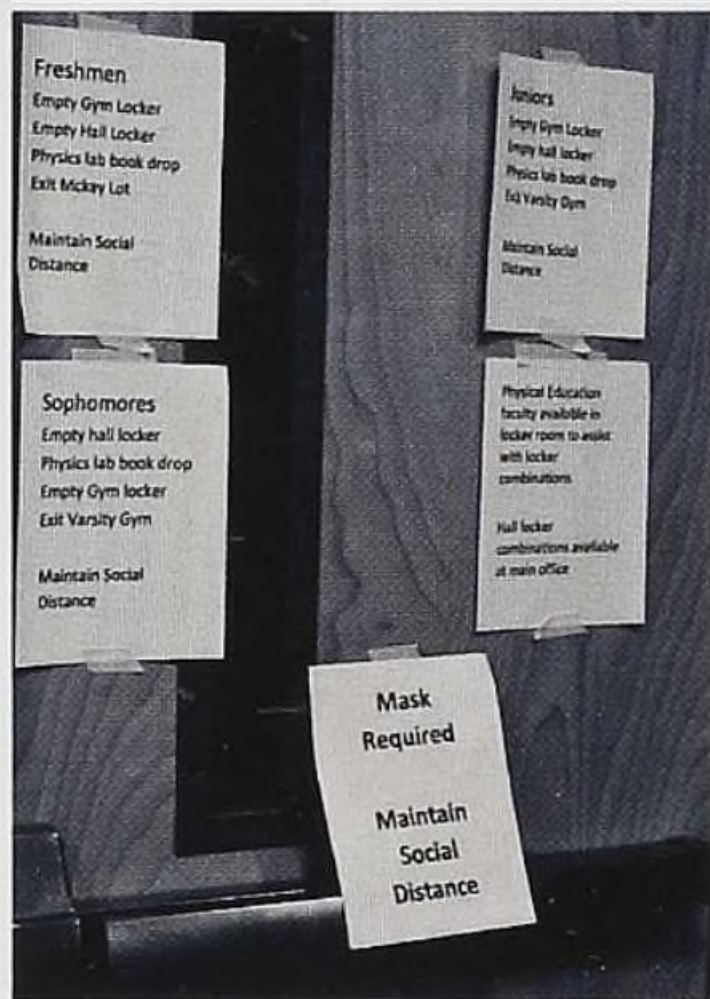
#### Evidence of time stopped

As of late June, the door of Room 204 was still decorated for St. Patrick's Day. School was dismissed shortly before the community celebrated the holiday.



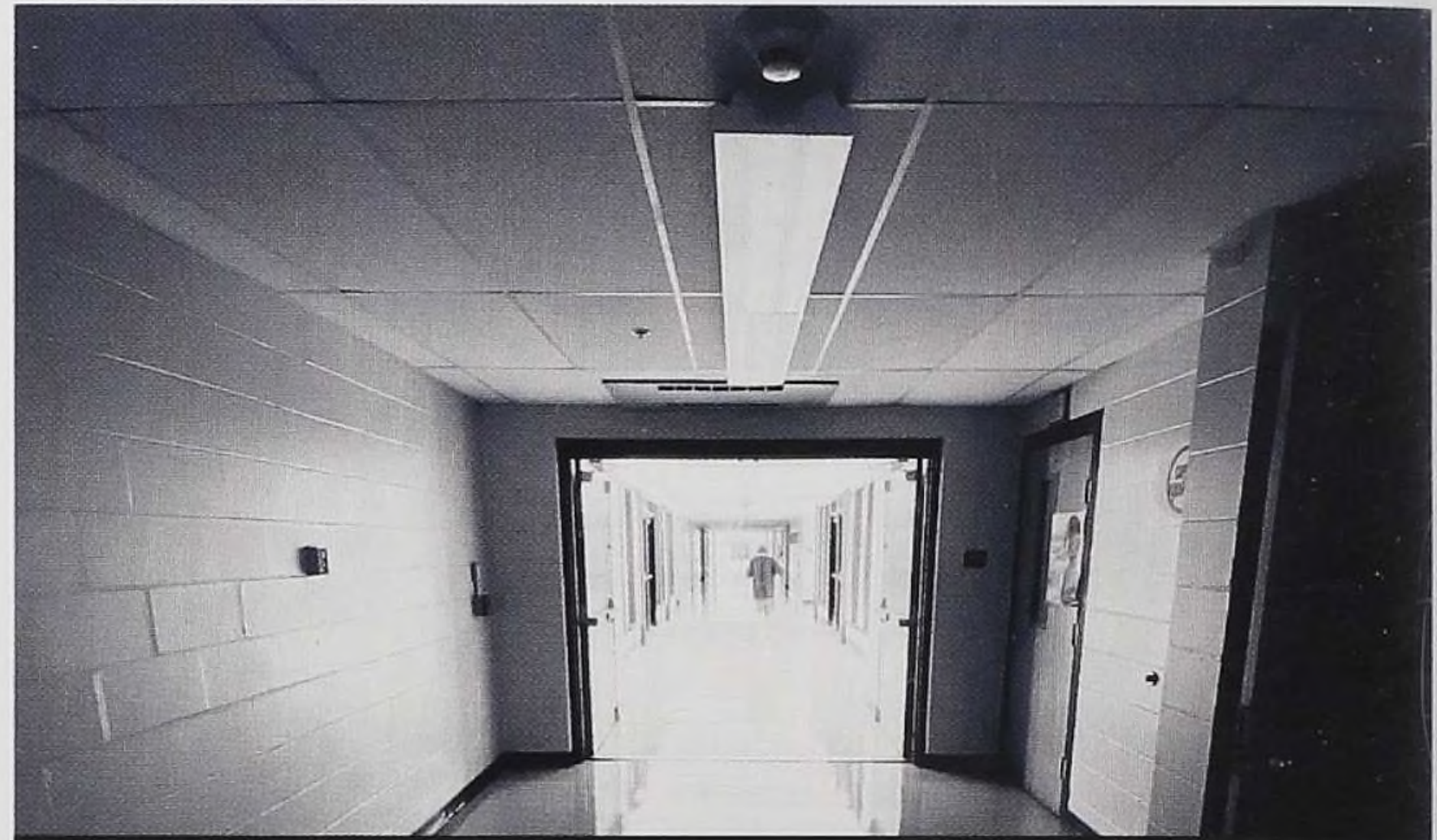

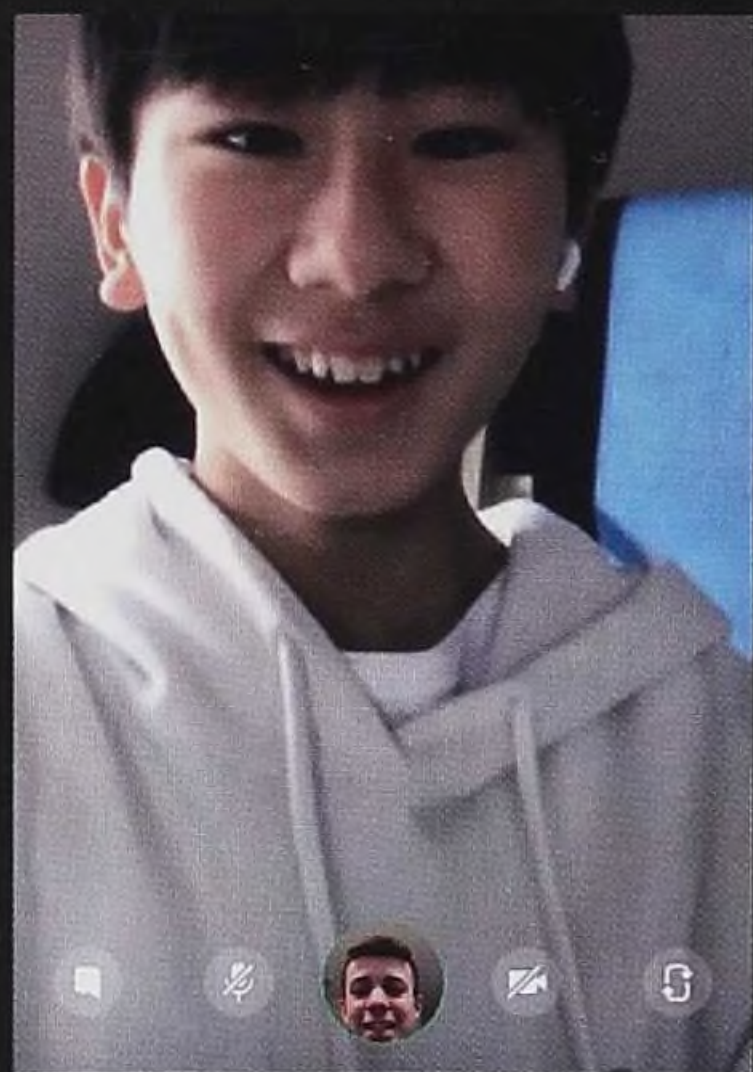

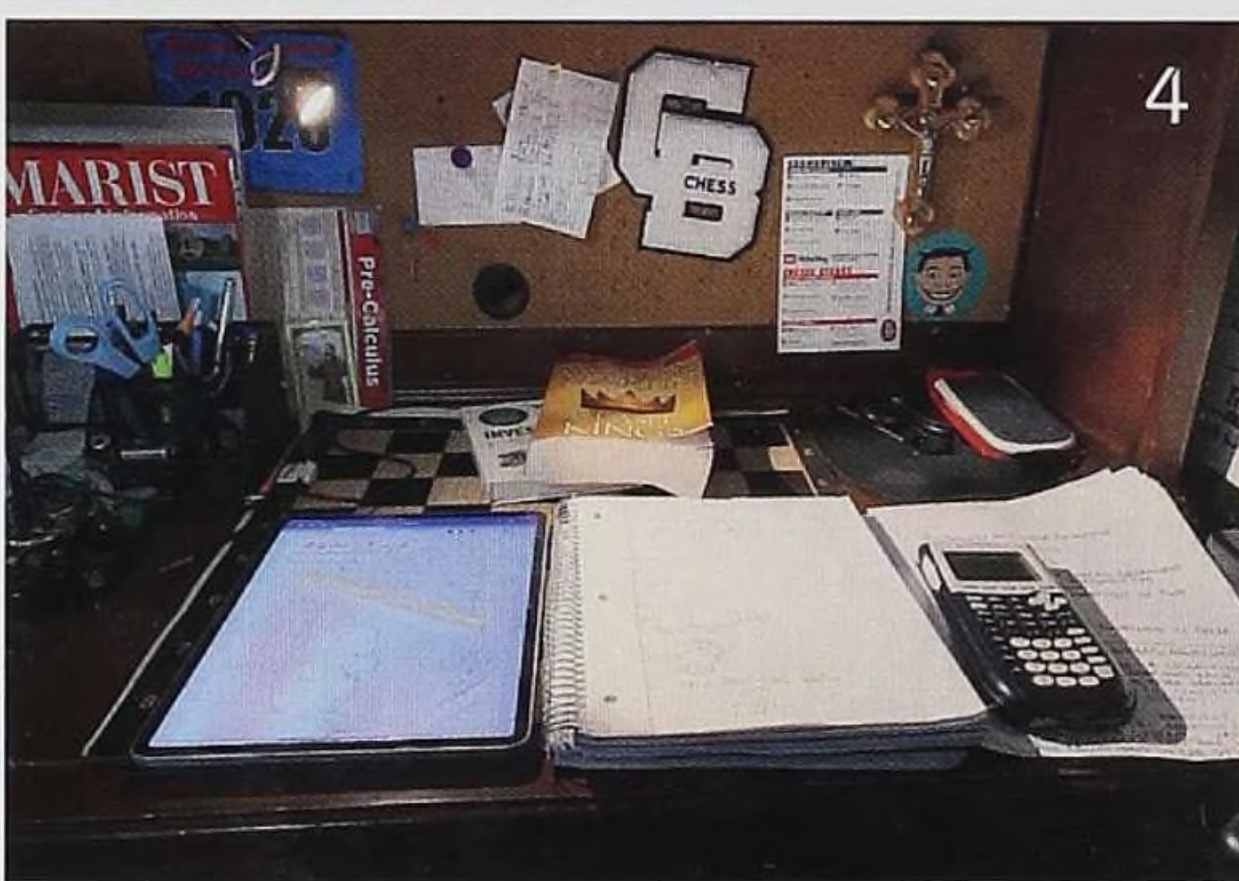

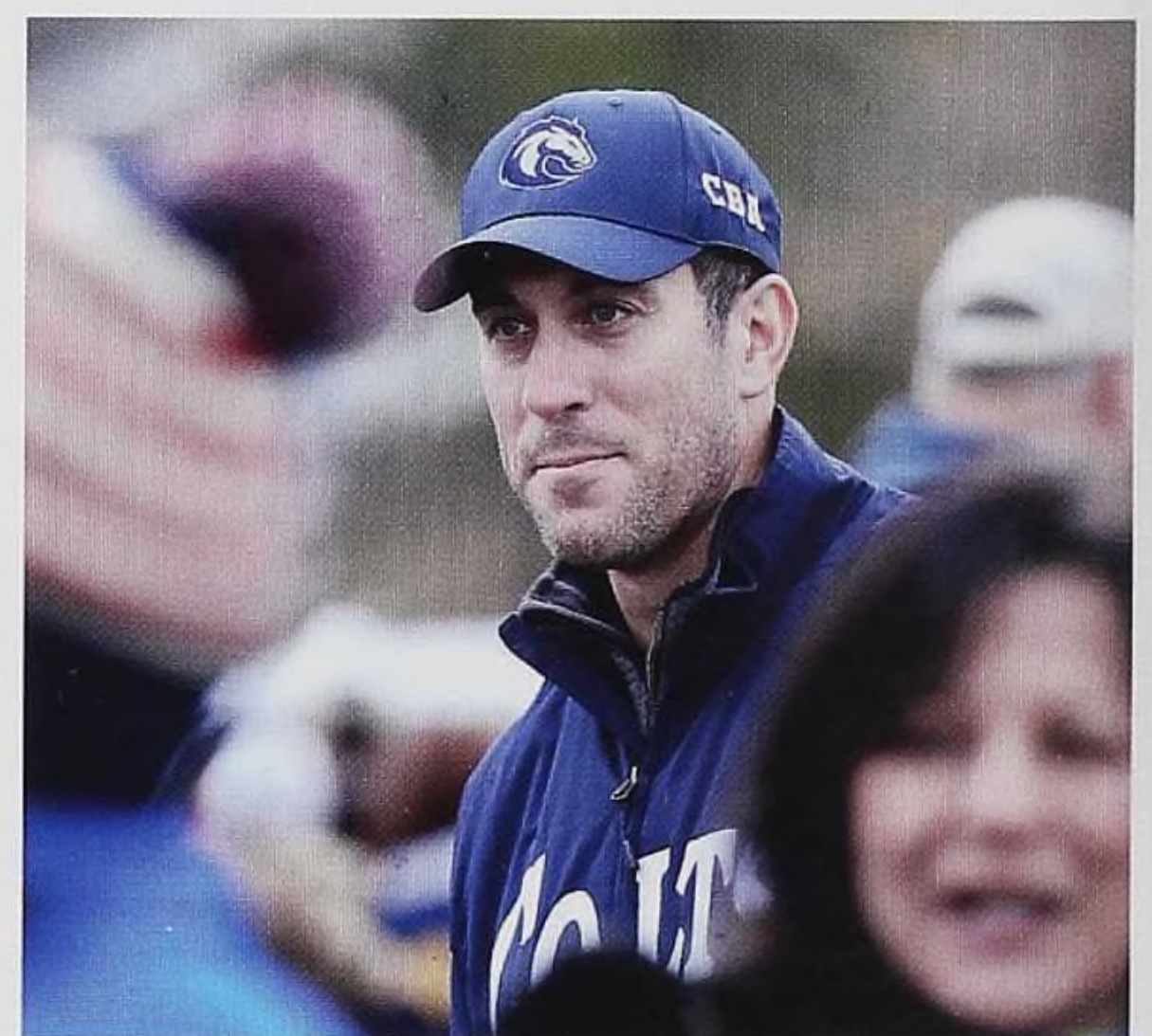

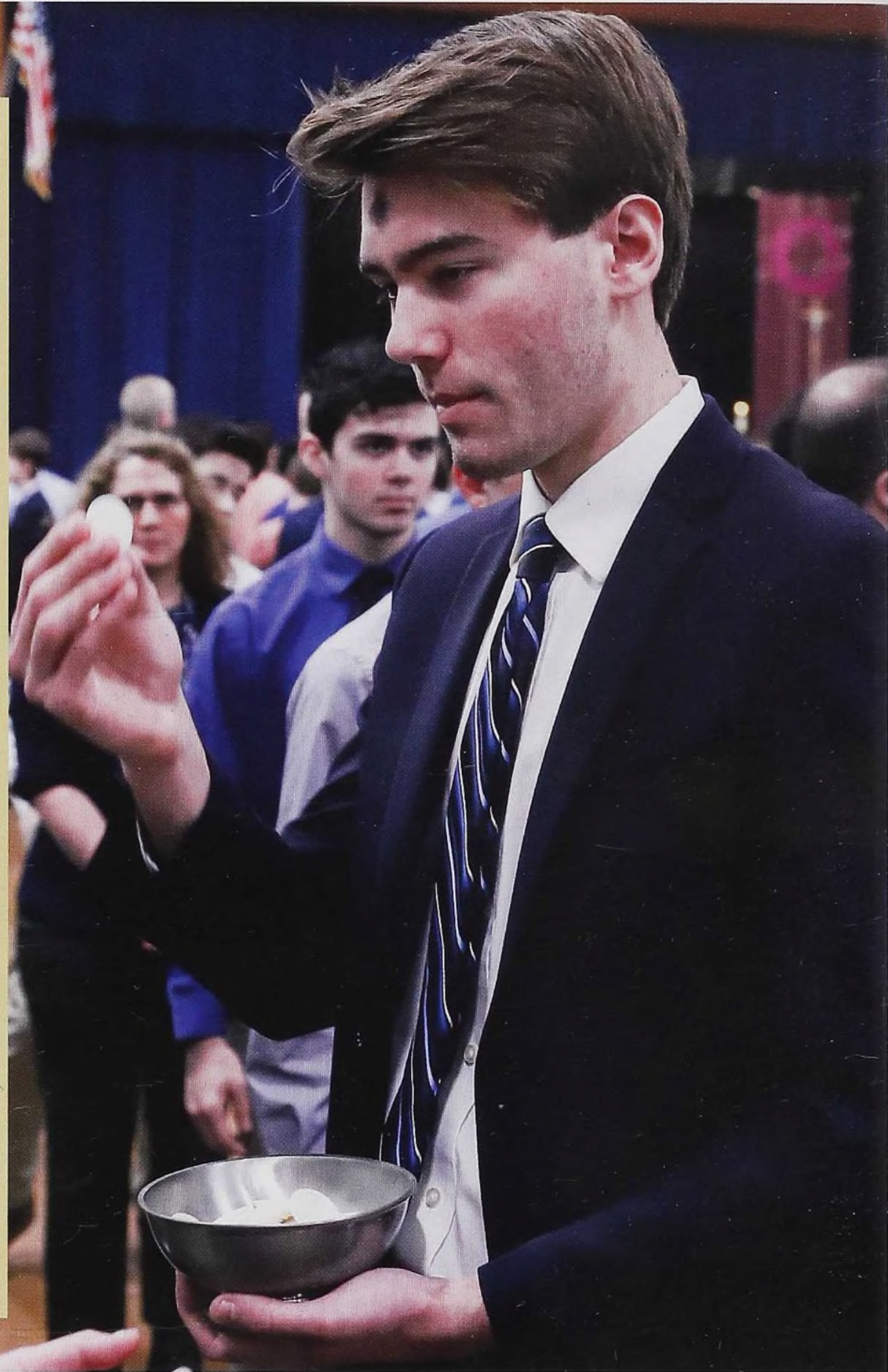

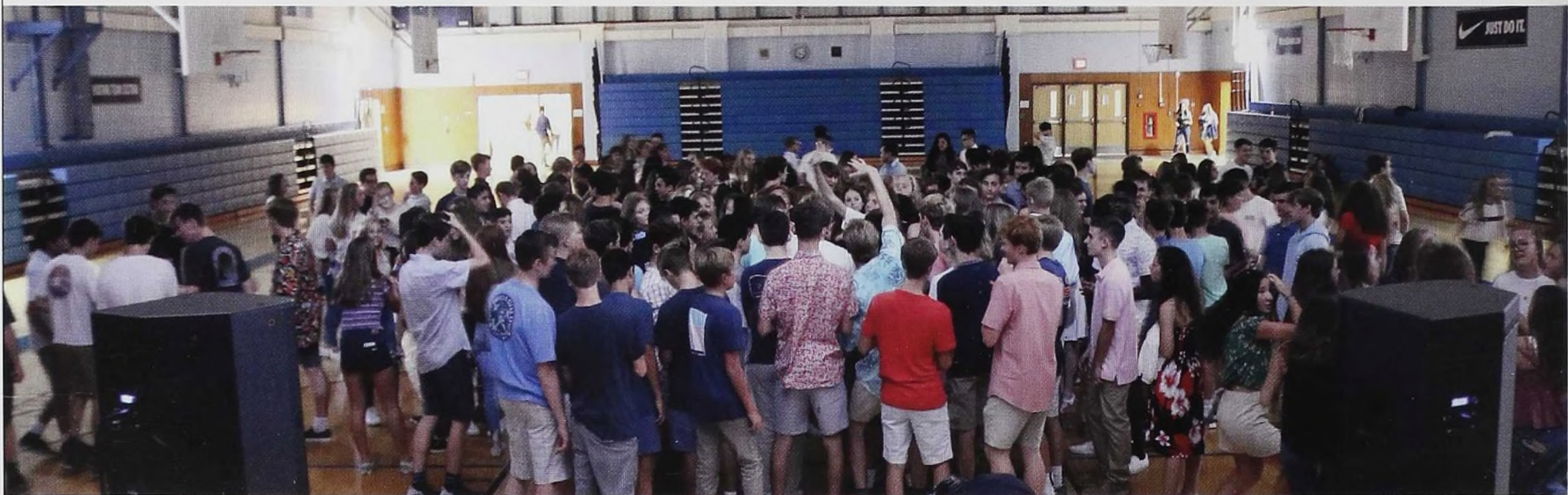

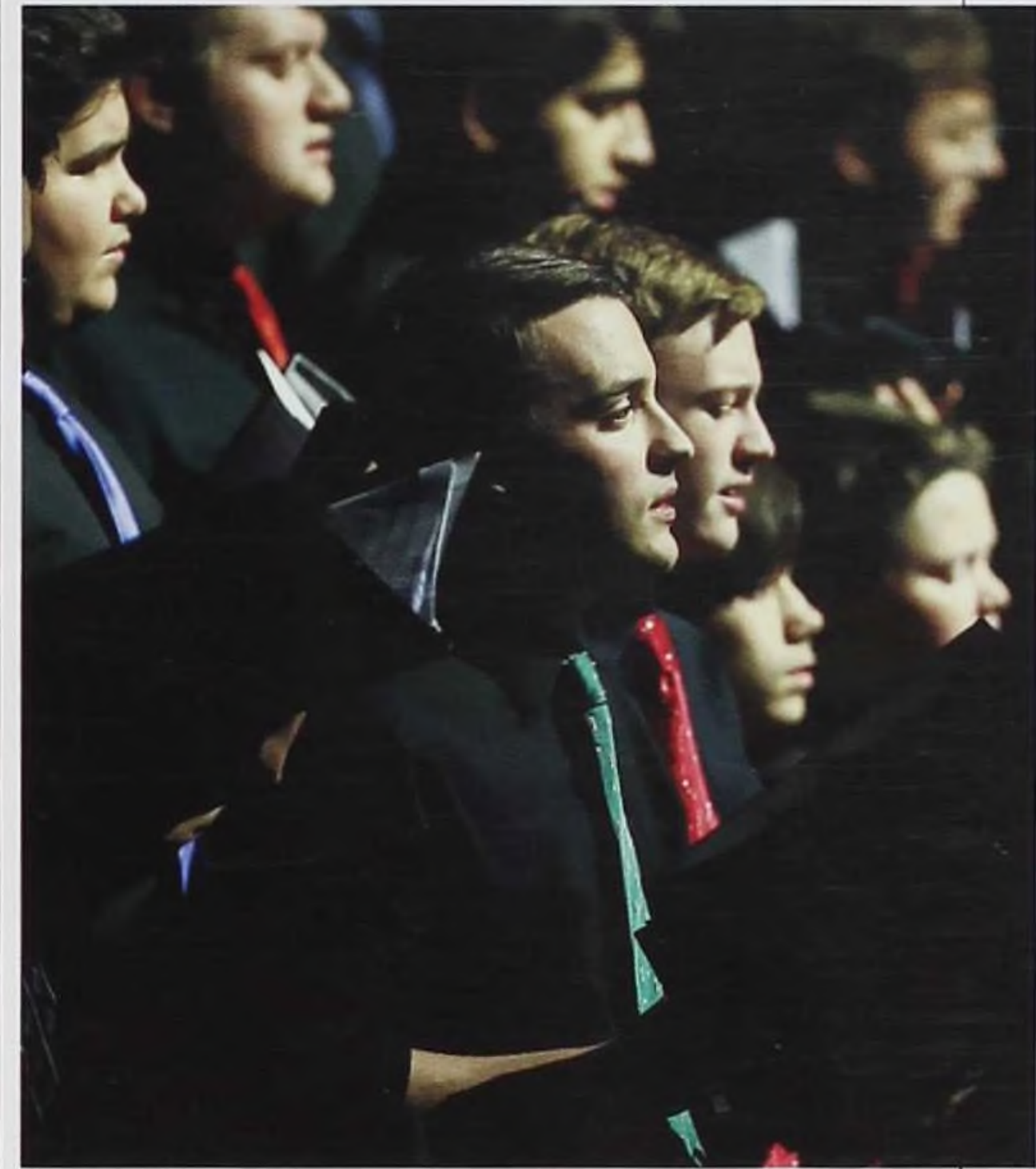

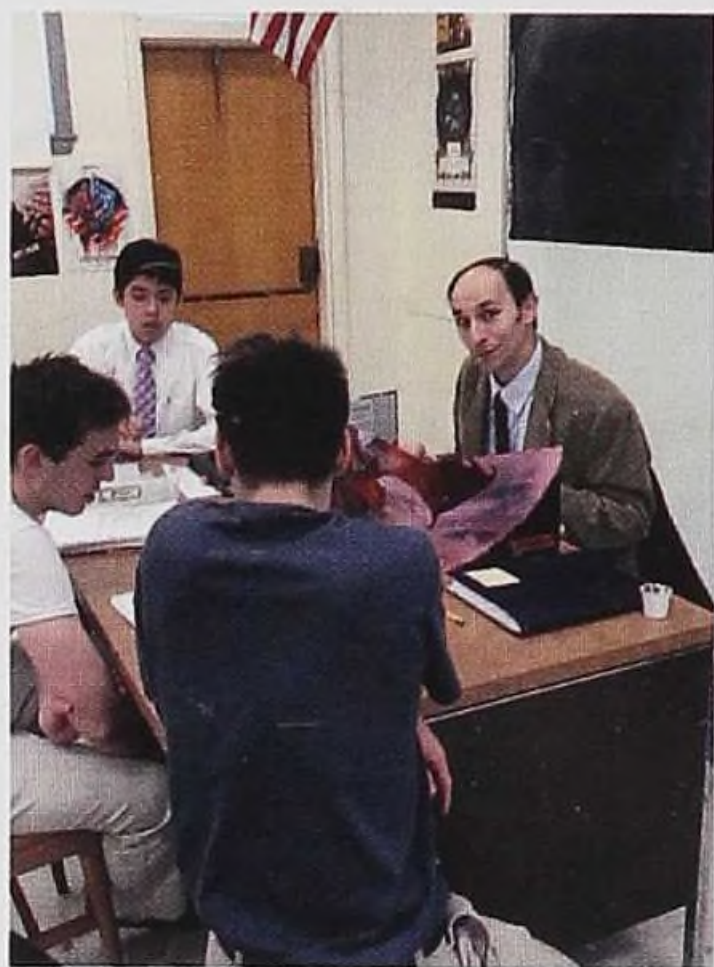

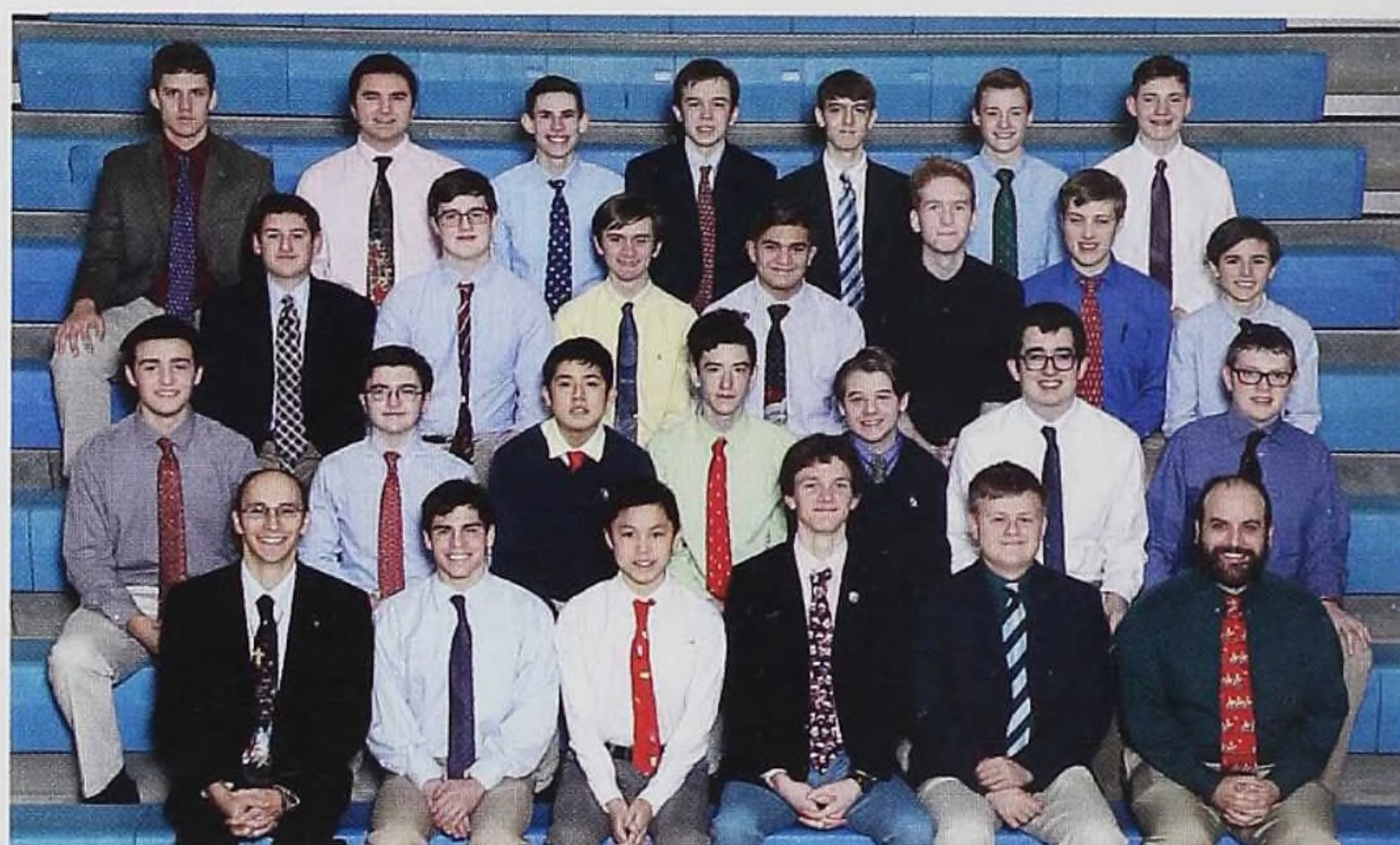

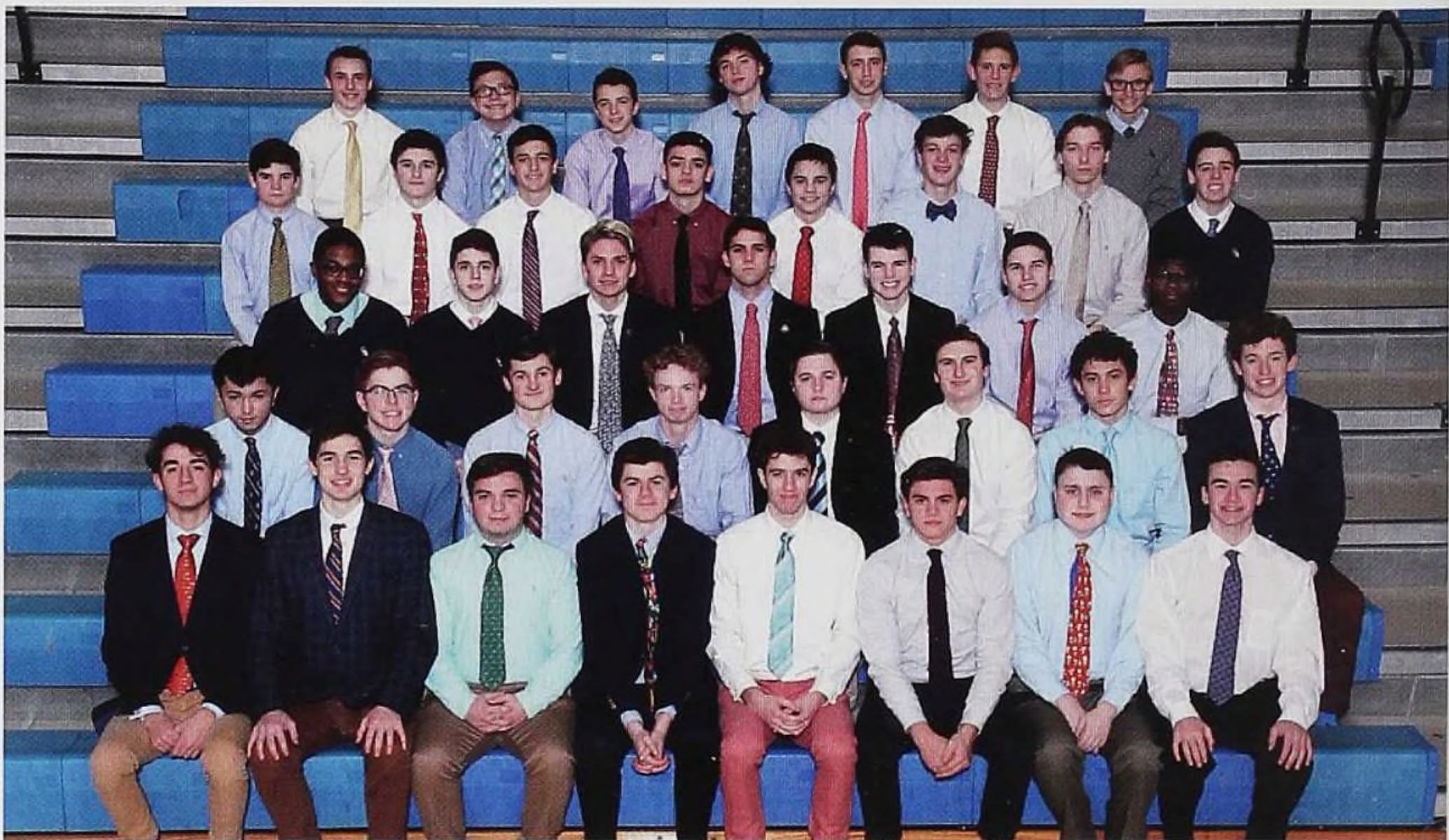

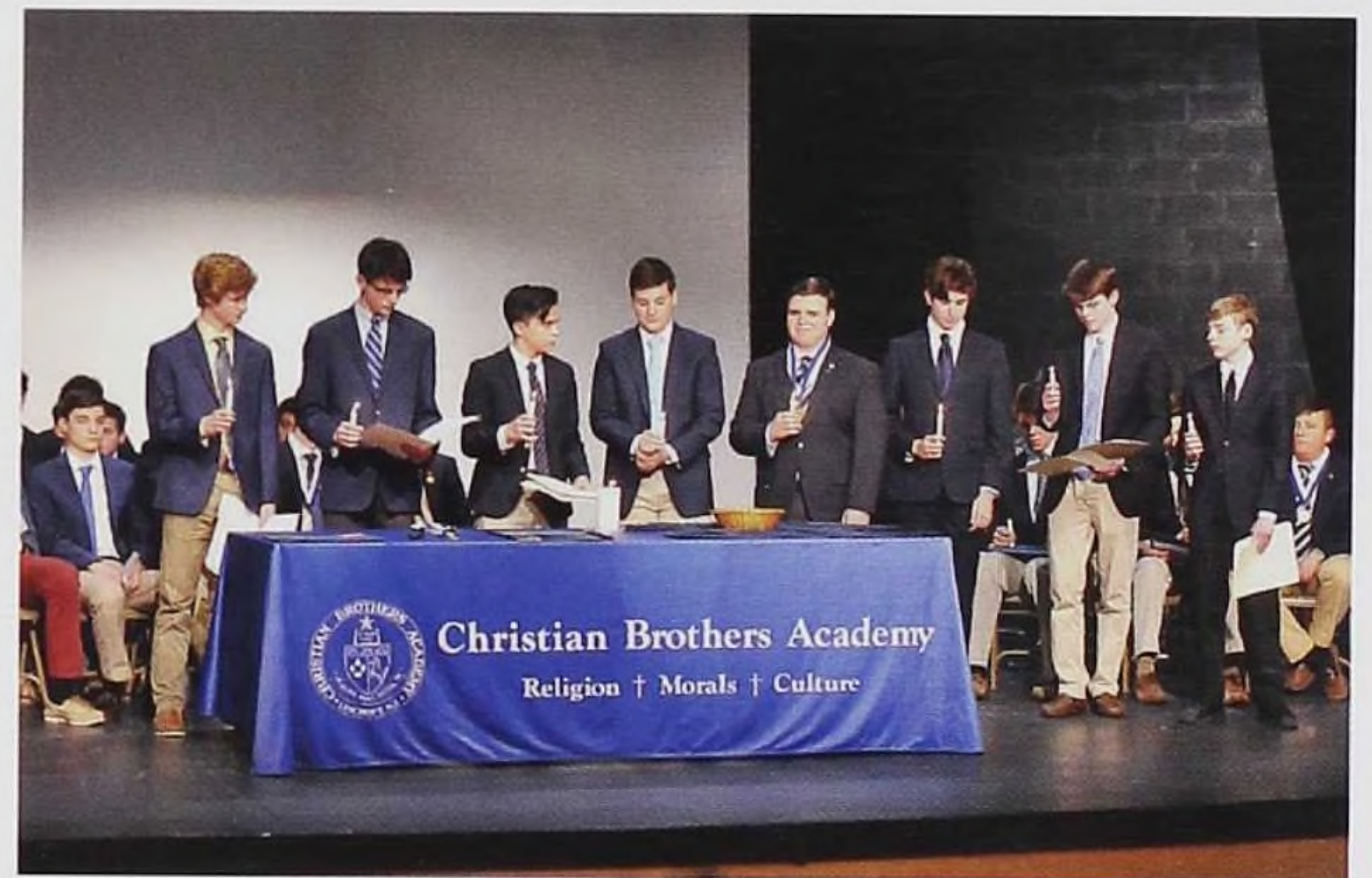

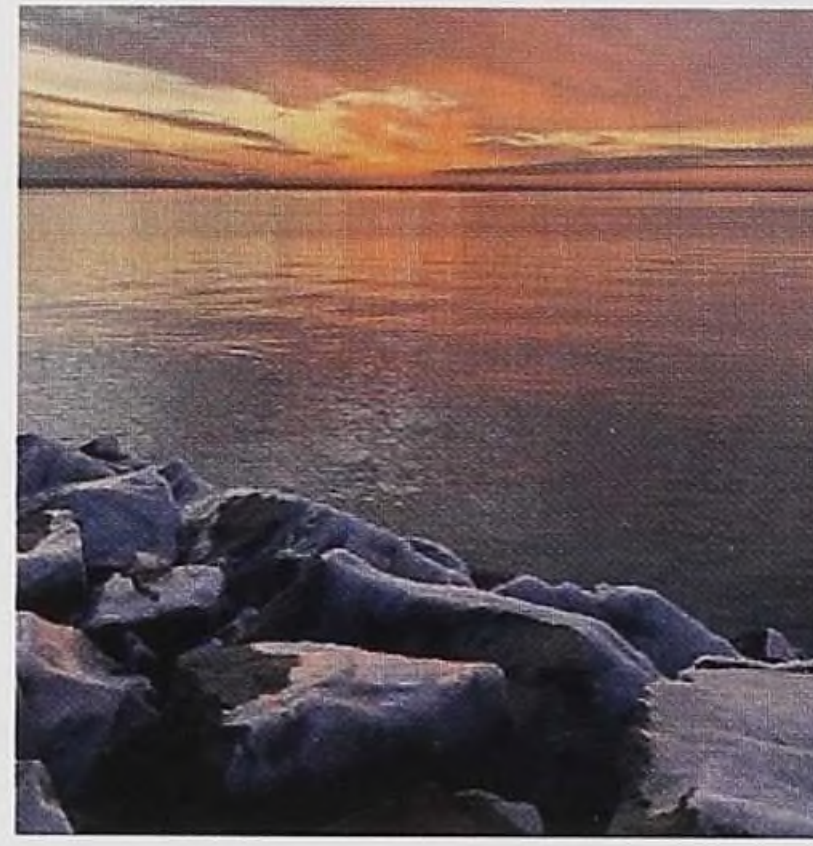

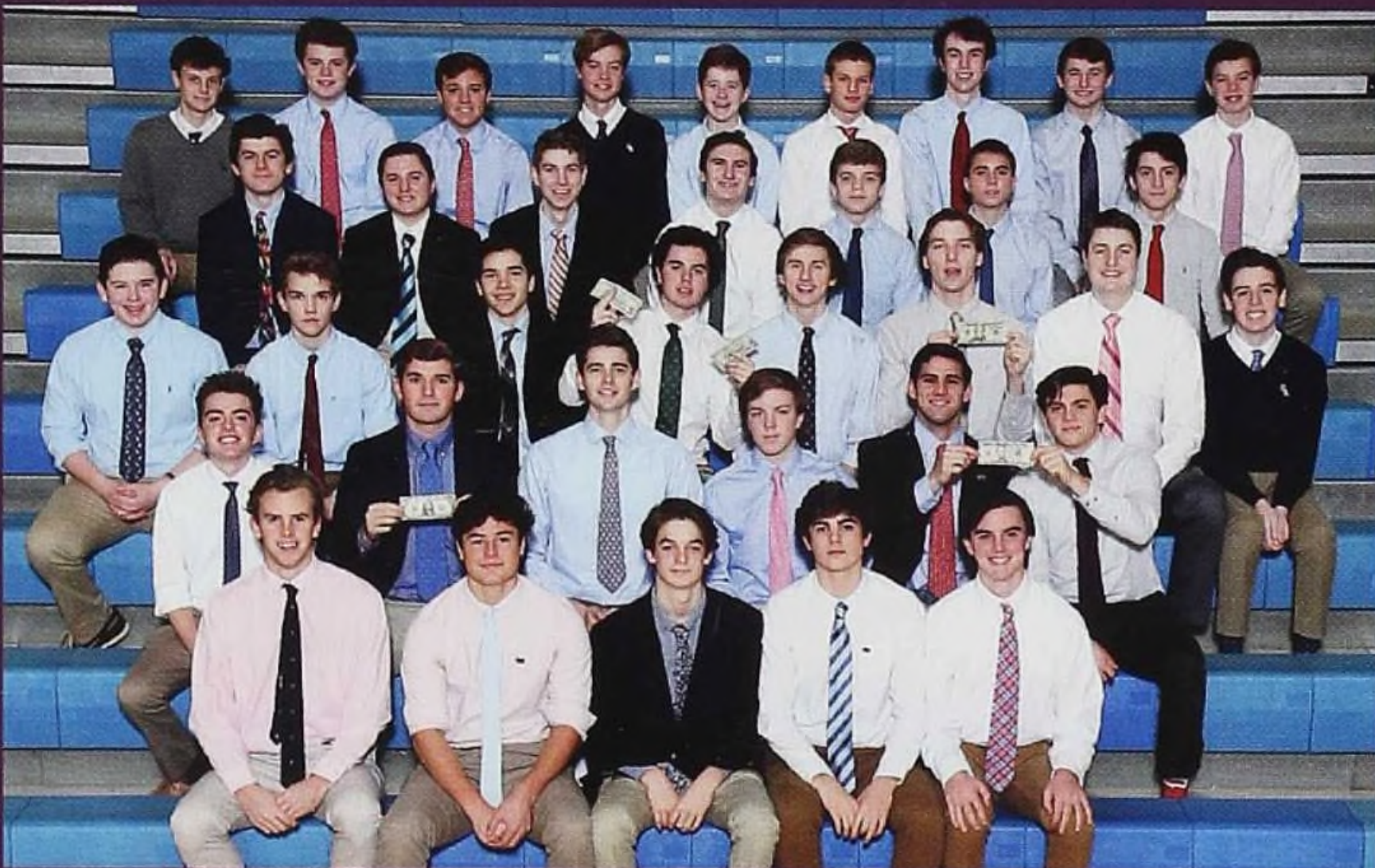

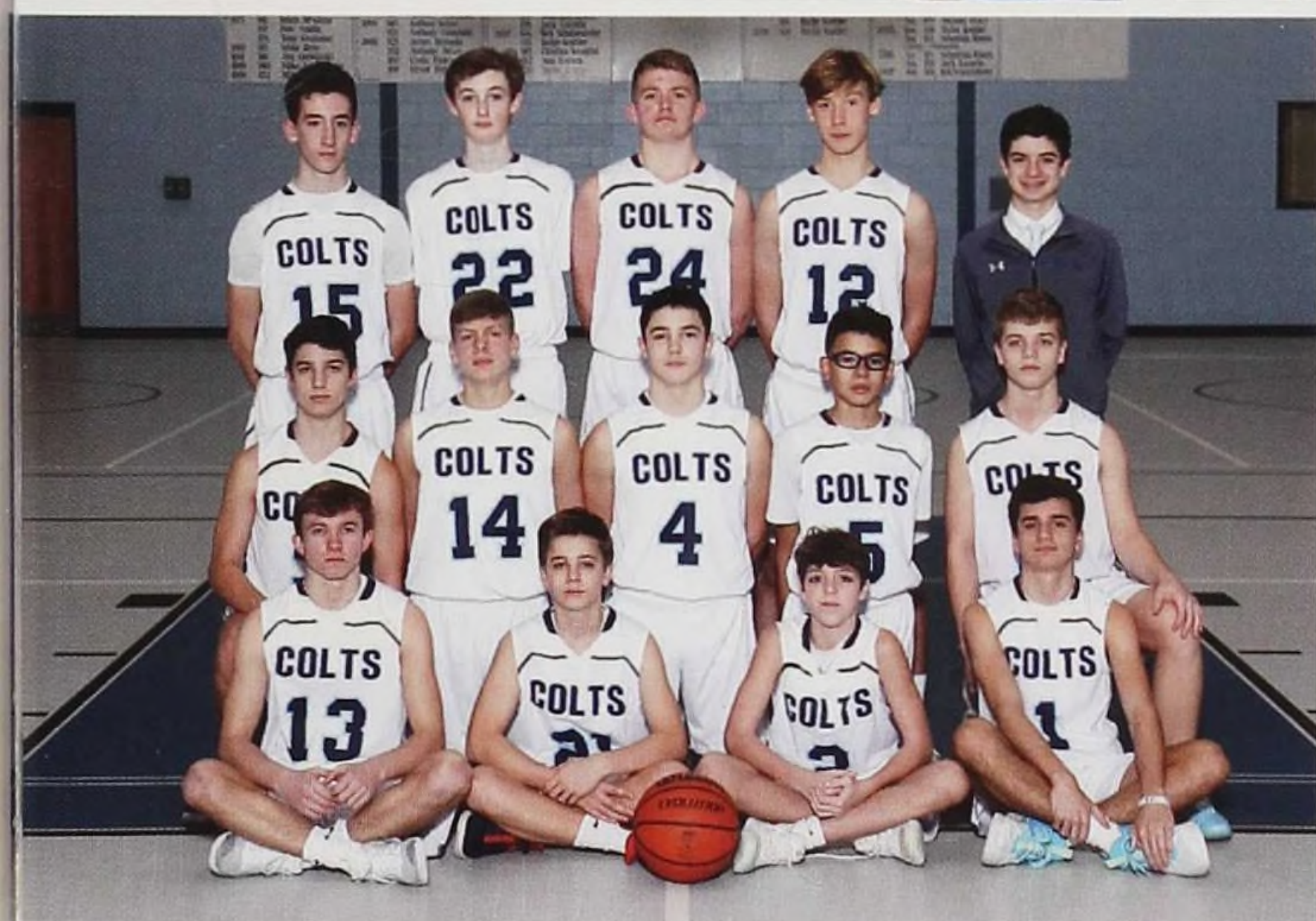

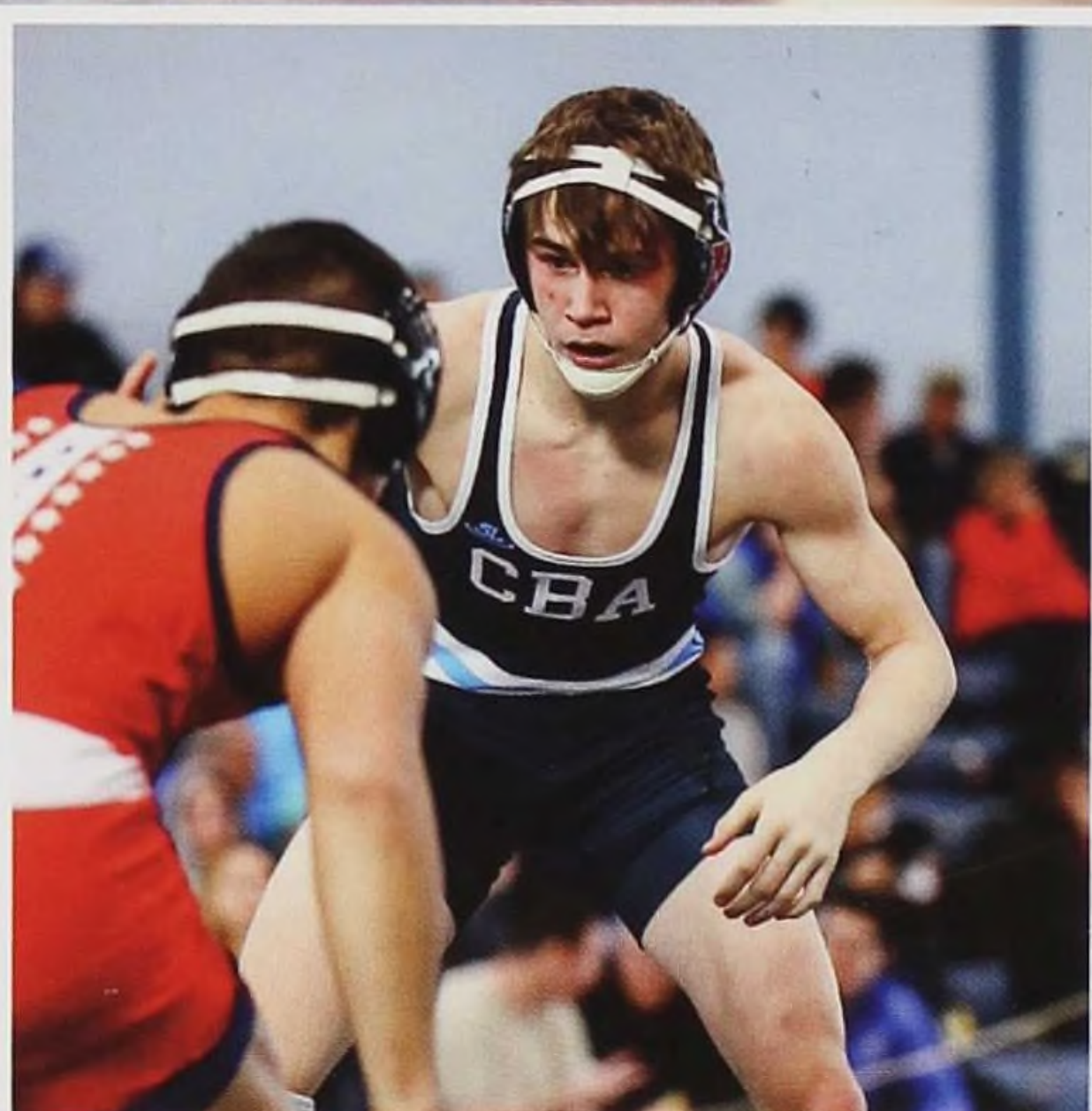
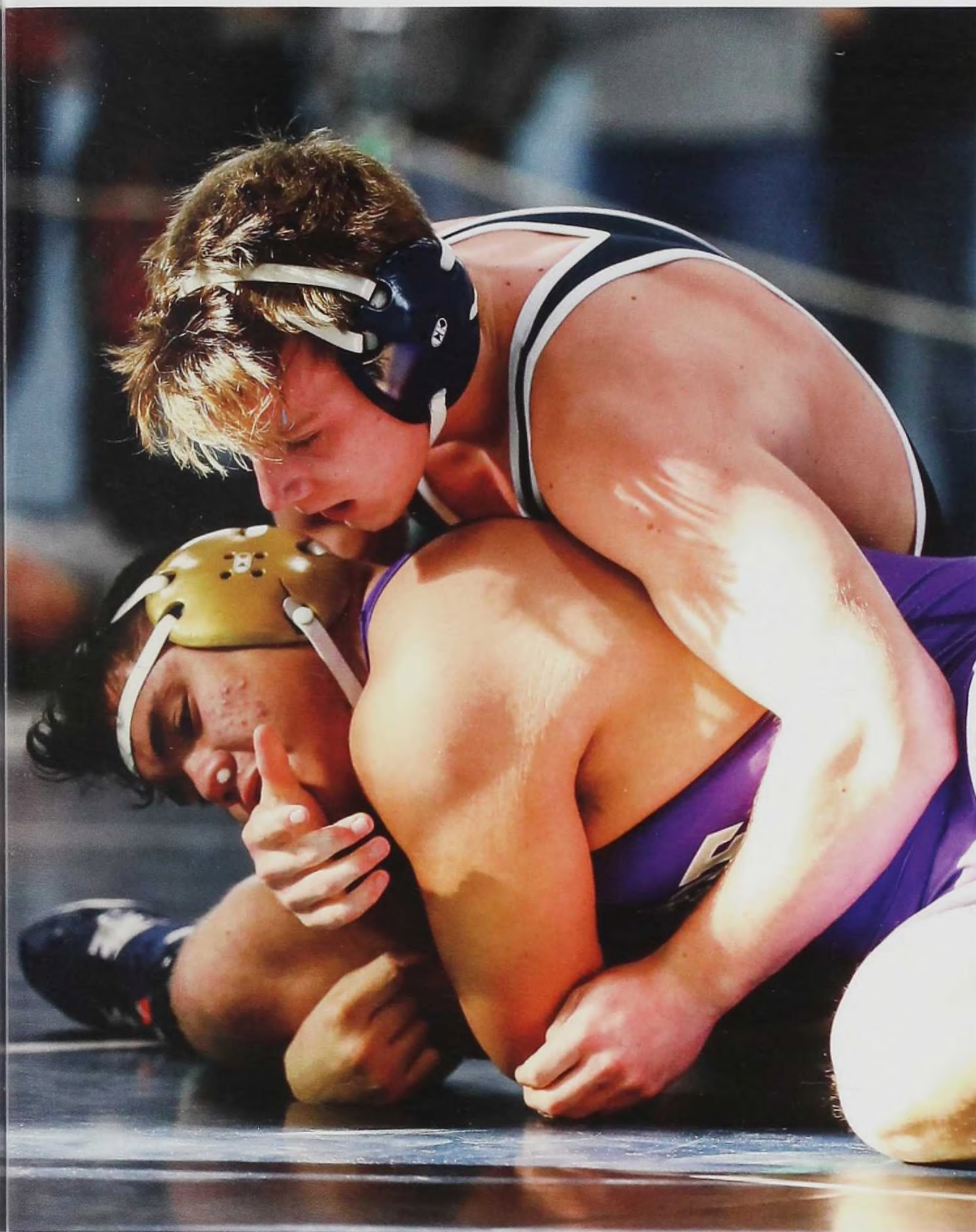
# Varsity Wrestling

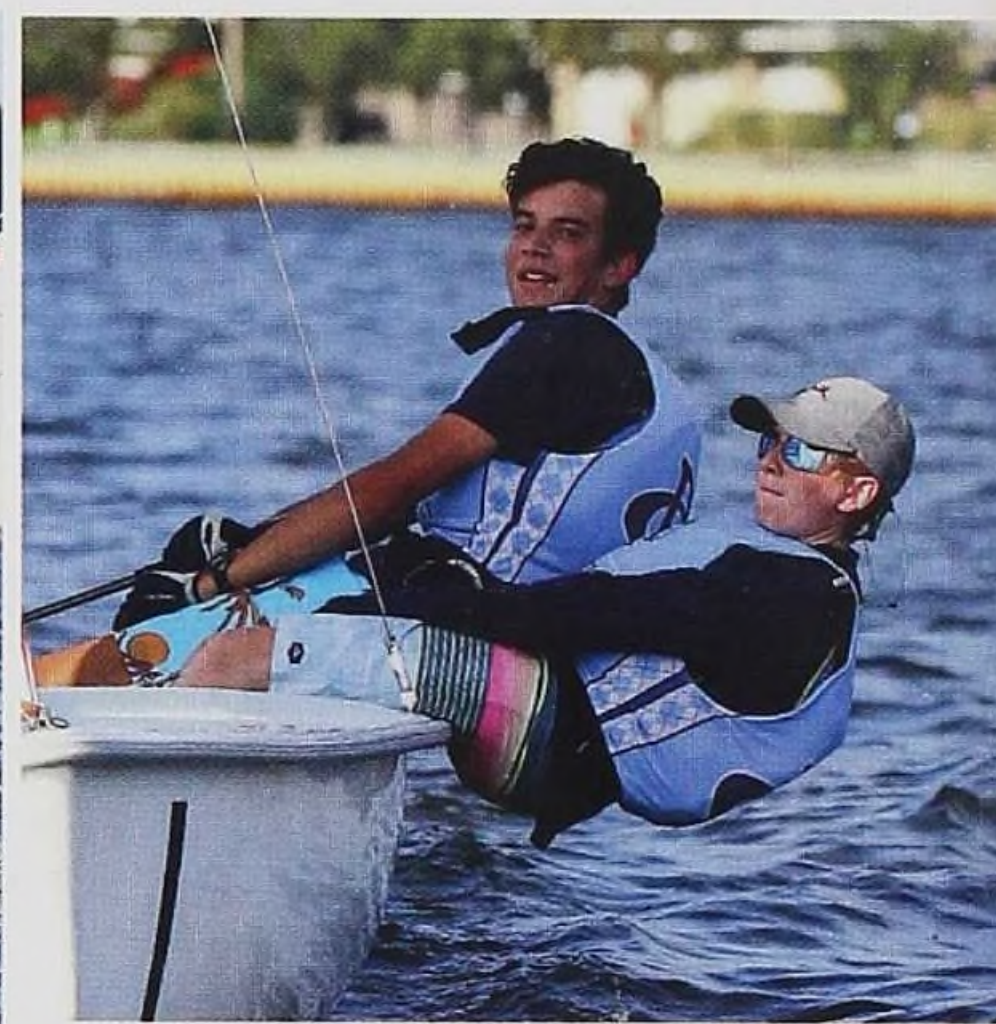

## special message to spring athletes

CBA spring athletes,

You prepared. Sharpened your tools. Focused your mind. Built your body, day-by-day. You sacrificed. A lot. You invested months - even years - for an opportunity. A moment of greatness. And you were ready. But then everything changed. The game changed. The rules changed. The world changed. This wasn't the fight you wanted, but it was the one you were presented. And it's a fight you need to win. Your game was stolen from you. All that was once familiar no longer applies. Rules, referees, umpires, officials, sportsmanship, equipment, clocks, periods, quarters, innings, timeouts, in-bounds, out-of-bounds, fair, foul - typically, you knew what to expect. Instead, you have had to face an opponent who ignores all the rules. It hasn't been a level playing field. Not by a mile. You feel robbed. That life is unfair. And you would be right. Life is unfair. If anyone ever told you it wasn't, they lied. You feel angry. Sad. Powerless, even. And you would be justified. You have every right to feel intense disappointment. You feel broken. As if all the work was for nothing. A feeling of despair. As if all the preparation was meaningless - worthless - without the opportunity to perform. But that isn't true because everything you've done up to this point has been for a reason. All you have learned from being an athlete at CBA is needed for this very moment. Now is not the time to sulk. Now is the time to get to work. And here is why.

### You're a Colt

The spring of 2020 brought uncertainty and confusion that we have never before experienced. Almost suddenly, everything changed. This situation went from something in another land to something in our backyards - all in the blink of an eye. Before we knew it, our school year was taken from us. Being a CBA athlete means something. And that something is being demanded of you now more than ever. That's because the qualities that make a great CBA athlete are also the characteristics required to get through a crisis. You were made for this. Better put, you were built for this. You've worked for this pivotal moment in time. Just because games weren't played doesn't mean you stopped being a Colt. In fact, when the clock stops and the uniform is off, that's when the Colt is needed most. Because to get through this, you will need to lean on all that you've learned.

### A Colt is a Fighter

CBA athletes love a challenge. Easy is not what drives you. What drives you is the satisfaction of knowing you can overcome any obstacle. There is no doubt the end of this year has presented you with a challenge. And you already know that with great challenges come even greater opportunities. So what are the opportunities that lie ahead of you now? How will this situation make you better? How will you grow from this? Take time to think about this. Write everything down. There is light to be found even in the darkest places.

There is no challenge too great for you to conquer. Remember, you're a Colt.

### A Colt is Resilient

Athletes may feel broken at times, but a CBA athlete never fully breaks. Resiliency is a trait you must possess if you want to be successful. When you get knocked down, you get up and dust yourself off. Simple as that. Because if you don't, you know the game is over. Responding fiercely in the face of adversity is programmed into the DNA of every CBA athlete. This situation is uncomfortable. Colts know what it means to feel uncomfortable. You are put in uncomfortable situations all of the time. Now you need to make the necessary adjustments to win. You've had things taken from you. Special things. Comfortable things like school, games, friends, workouts, freedom, restaurants, proms and other special events. Even toilet paper. You've been knocked down. Time to respond.

All of those years you have spent building resiliency is about to be put to good use. Remember, you're a Colt.

### A Colt is Disciplined

Wash your hands for 20 seconds. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth. Stop shaking hands (that's ok, we love fist bumps). Stop fist bumps (that's ok, we can elbow it out). Stay six feet from everyone. Disinfect frequently used items often. Avoid large social gatherings. Rules? No problem. You're a CBA athlete. You got this. You have to be disciplined to be great. Wake-up. Work-out. Go to school. Study. Go to practice. Do homework. Eat right. Get proper rest. Your entire life is structured and scheduled. Endless drills. Hours of methodical, intentional practice to perfect your technique. Intense focus on the smallest details.

Being disciplined is a way of life for you and it will guide you through this crisis. Remember, you're a Colt.

### A Colt is Patient

Work while you wait. CBA athletes understand this concept better than most. The things we want most in sports take time. Winning doesn't happen overnight. A great team cannot be built in a day. Championships cannot be won the first week of the season. It takes weeks, months, even years to build success. But all along, you keep grinding. Instant gratification doesn't exist in our world. Imagine a swimmer who has been training years in and out of the pool for a moment that lasts less than a minute. Imagine a wrestler who has poured his heart and soul on the mat, waiting his turn for a chance at the title. Imagine a basketball player taking countless foul shots in practice so that her hand is steady when the moment comes to sink two to seal victory for her team. CBA athletes understand that the game is the "end product." Rarely do people see the intense hours of preparation that go into those relatively short competitions. We love the competition. We live for it. If asked, almost every athlete would tell you they prefer games over practice. And therein lies an interesting dichotomy - athletes are competitive by nature and want success so badly they are willing to sacrifice beyond ends to attain it, but the success we so desperately seek takes time to pursue. We are forced to wait for what we want. And because of that very fact, we have developed incredible patience. Through all of this, your patience has been tested. You don't know when life will return to "normal." No one has the answer, it's all speculation. But, what we do know is that, just like in sports, patience will be rewarded. Hard work and patience doesn't guarantee you will make the team or win a championship, but it does guarantee you will develop quality character. The type of character that will be needed well beyond sports. The type of character that is needed right now, to get you through this very moment. It's a good thing you've been working on it all these years.

Patience is an important virtue that will get you through this crisis. And you already have it. Remember, you're a Colt.

### A Colt is a Great Teammate

CBA athletes know that in order to win, you must be unselfish. You must care more about the success of your teammates than that of your own. You understand that nothing special was ever accomplished alone. It requires committed coaches, mentors, teachers, teammates, supporters, loved ones, friends, and so on to reach your potential. Without great teammates, our chances of getting through a crisis situation drops significantly. If we look out for one another, stay disciplined in our approach, exercise prudence and patience, we can get through anything. Together, and only together, will we be able to change the world.

### A Colt is a Man of Faith

Of all your great qualities, this is the most important. Especially in times of doubt and despair. Having a strong faith - trusting the Lord with all of your heart - will not only fuel you with hope and optimism, it will make you a bright light that inspires others to follow.

Right now, we need great teammates. Right now, we need great leaders. Right now, we need great faith.

Right now, we need you.

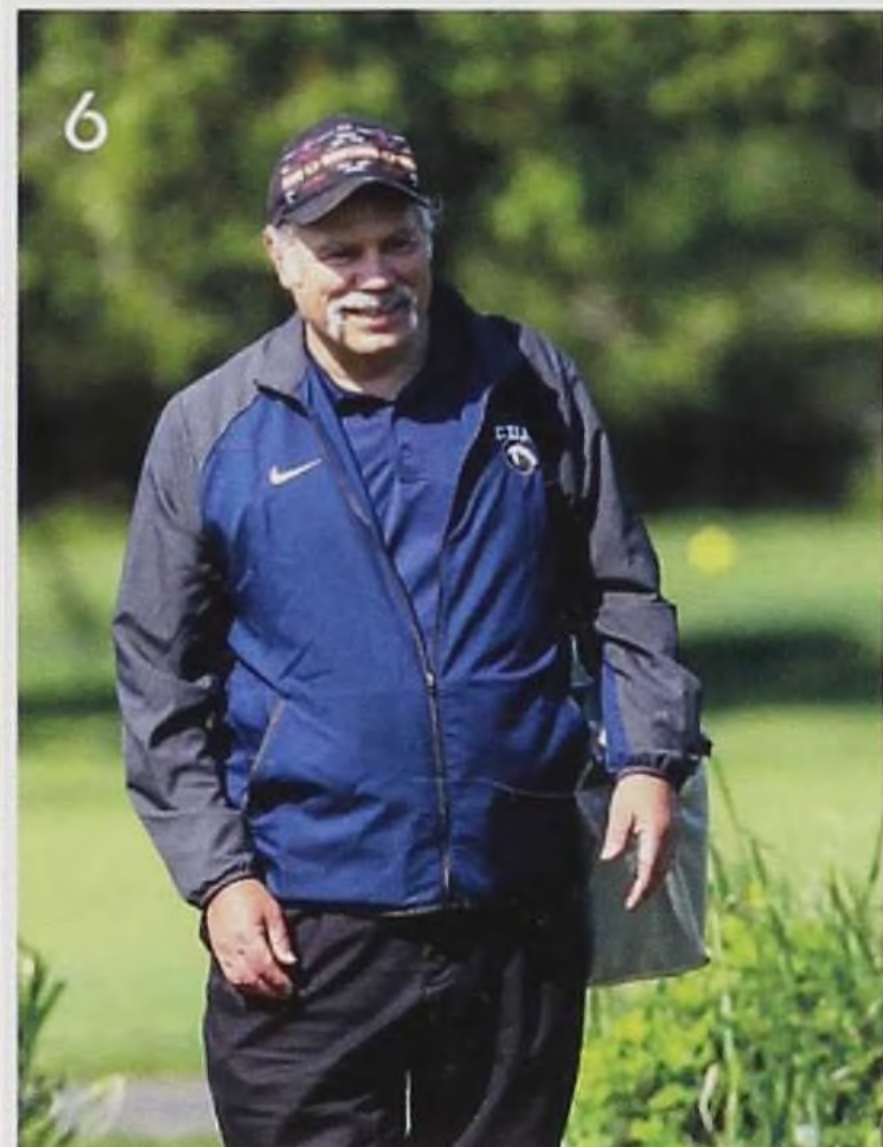
## student reflection

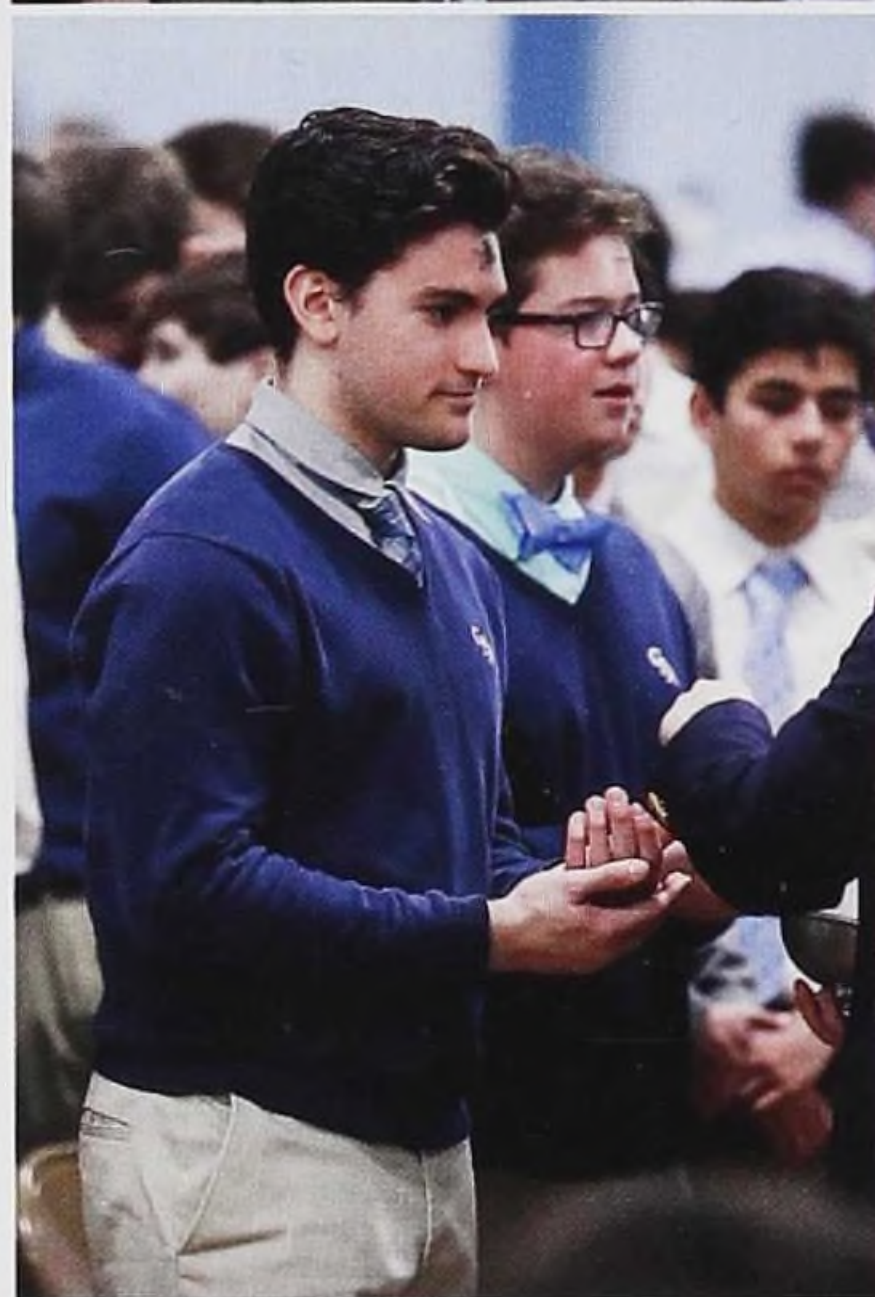

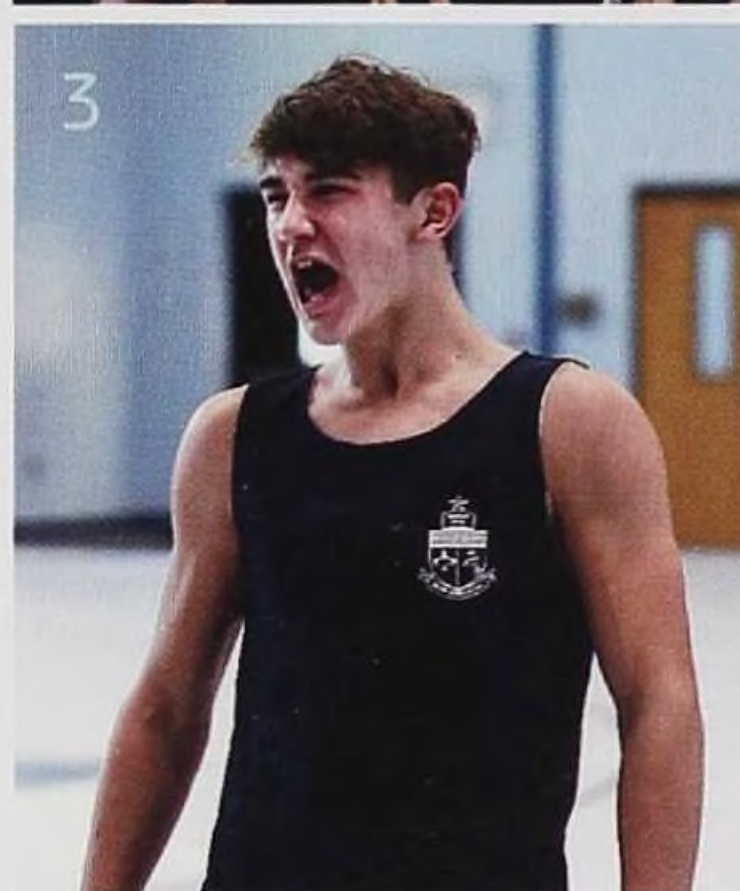
