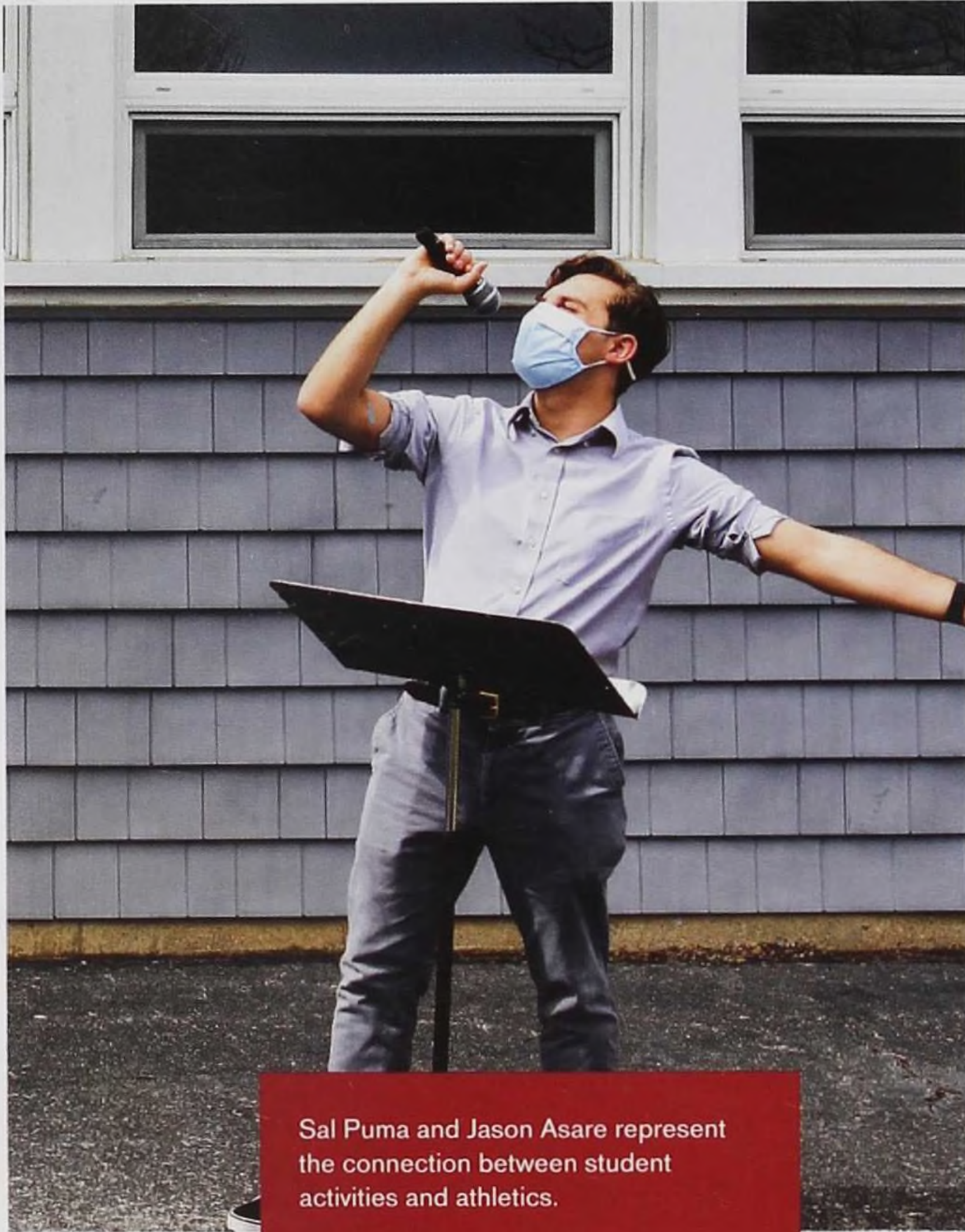

# A SHOT AT NORMAL

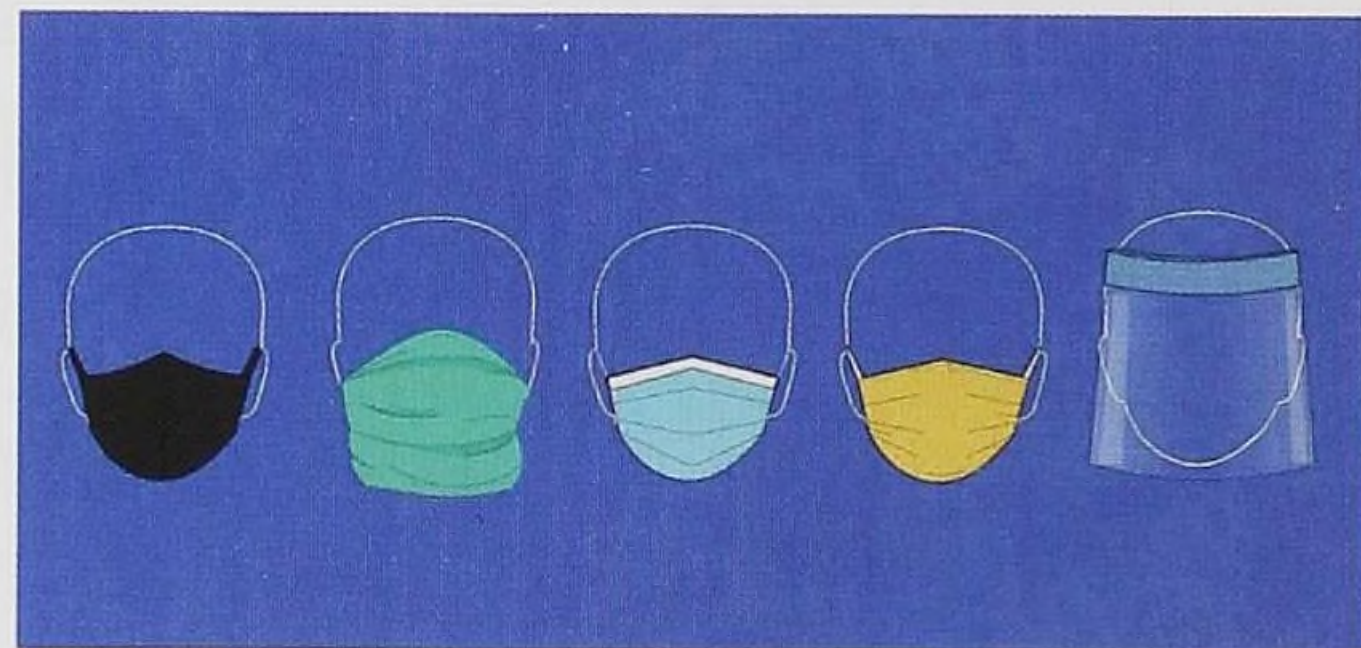

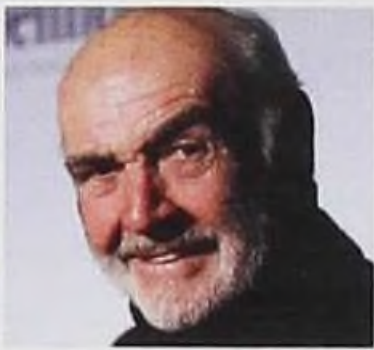

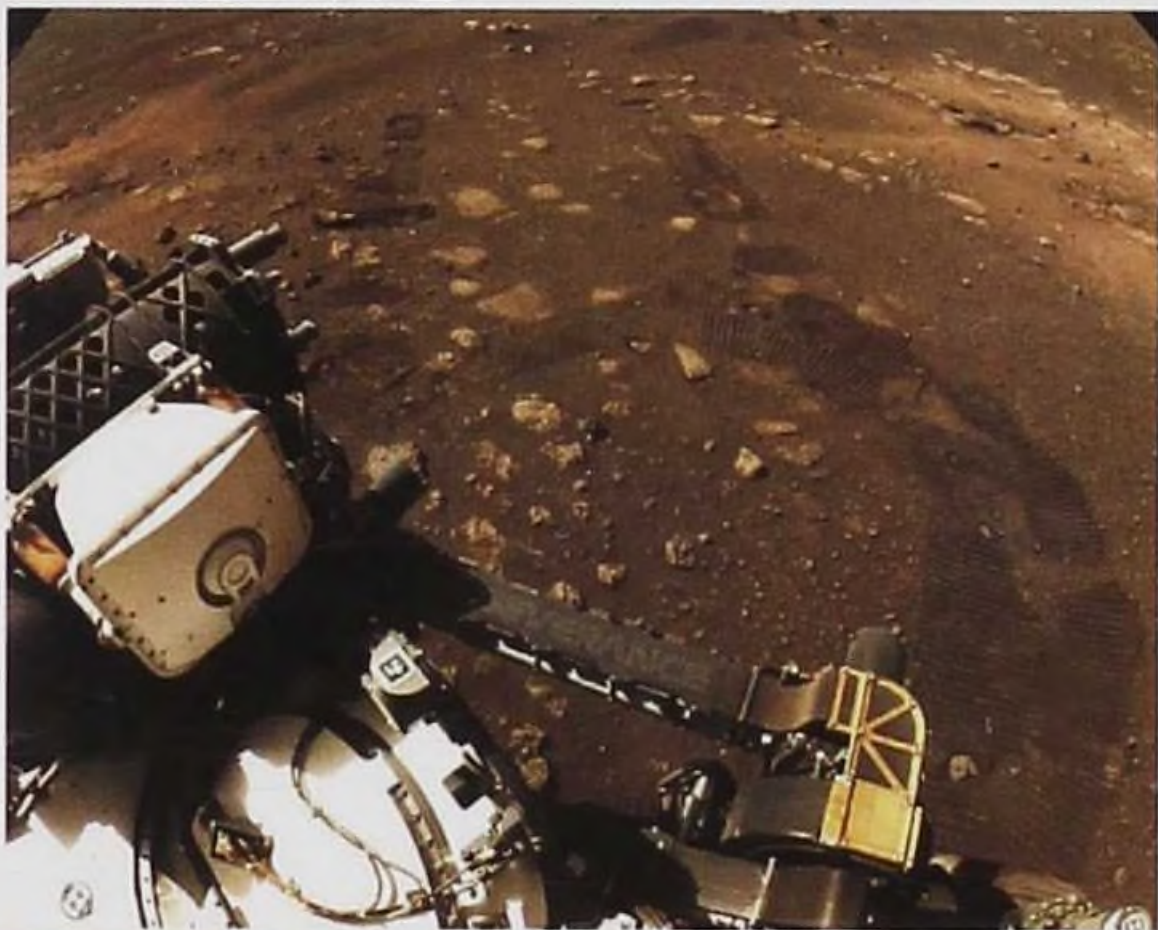
IS THE DEBATE OVER?

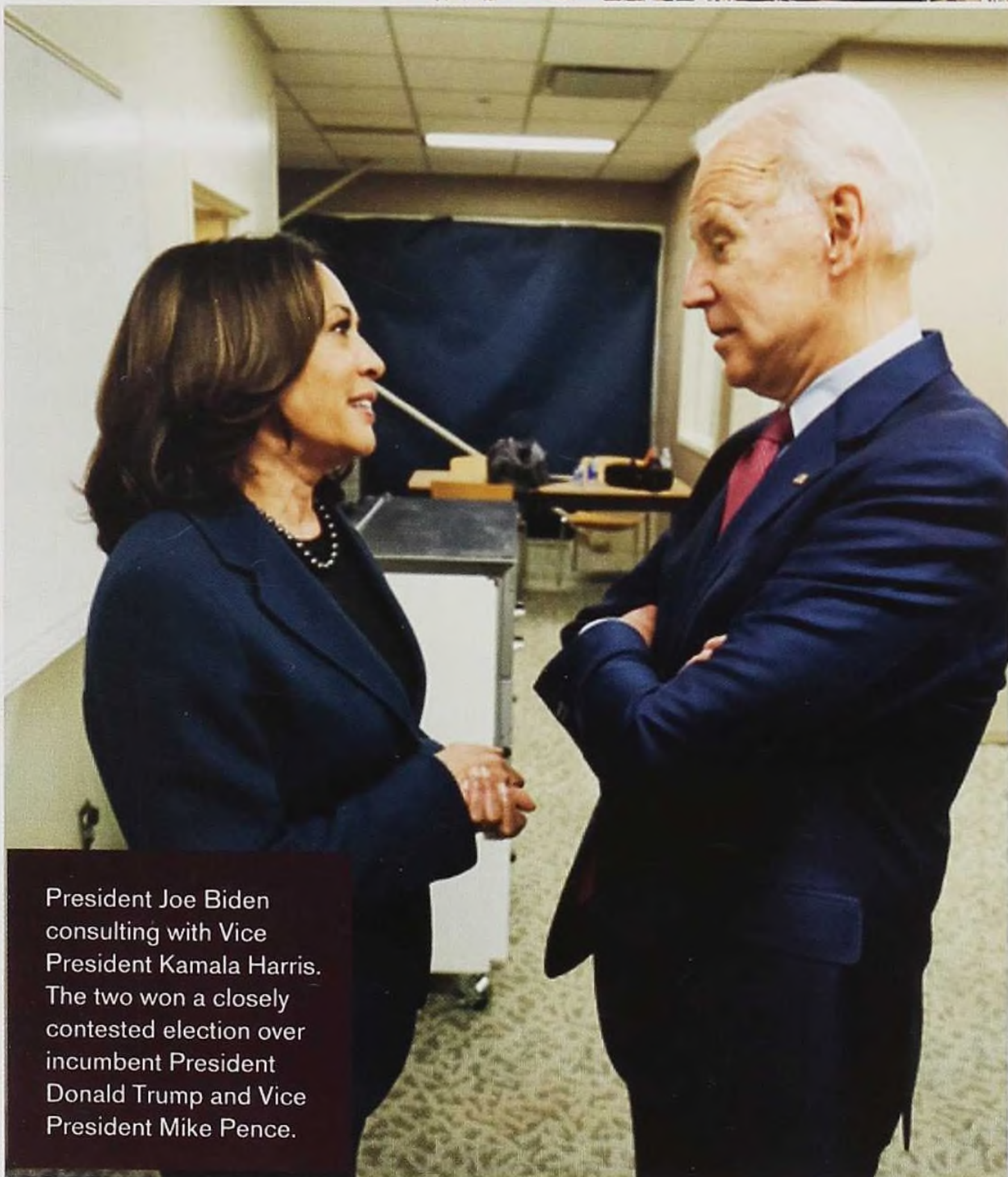
HUMANITARIAN CRISIS

Dr. Anthony Fauci is product of Catholic Education. He is graduate of Regis HS in NYC and the College of the Holy Cross in Worcester, MA.





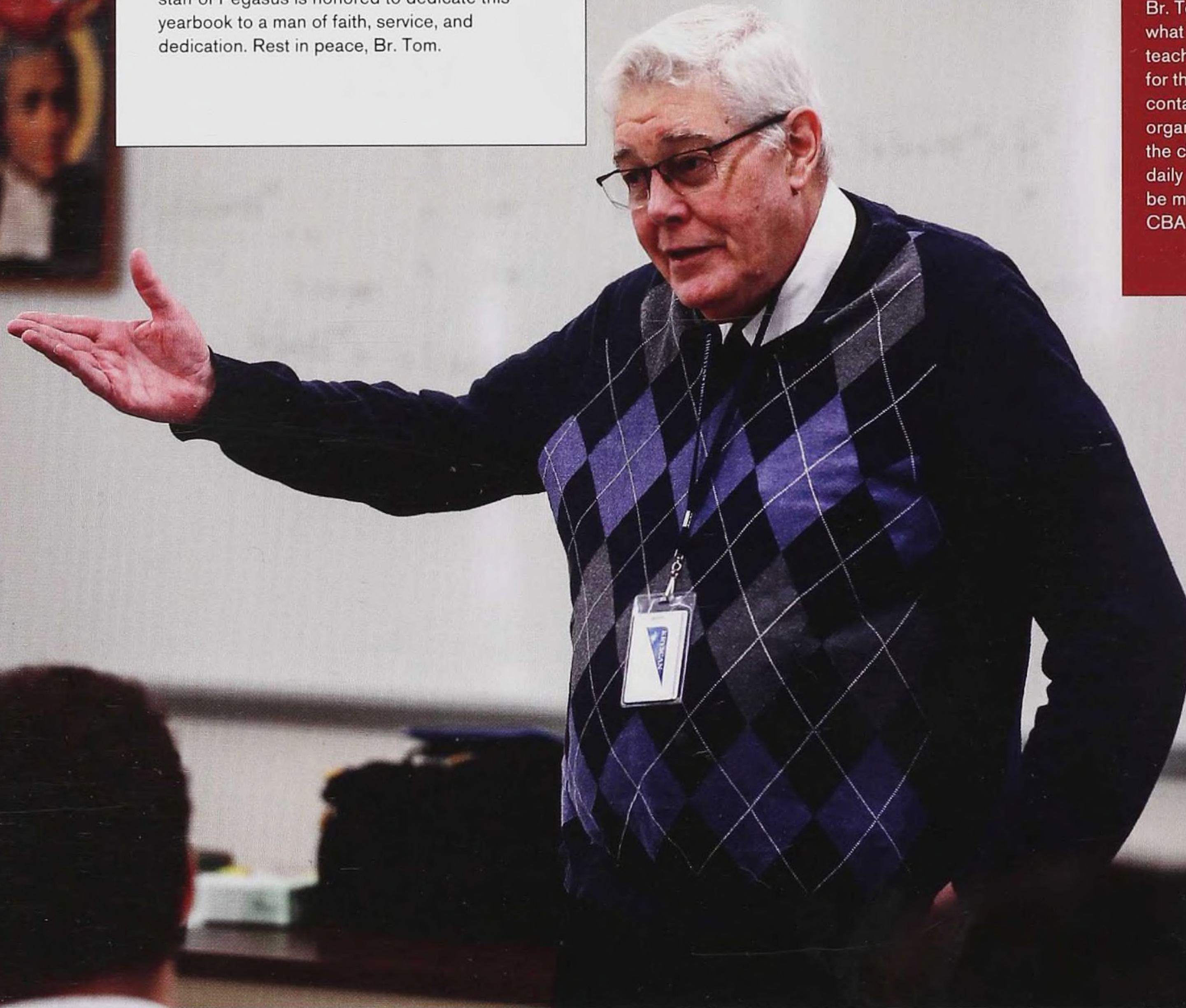
## PEGASUS DEDICATION

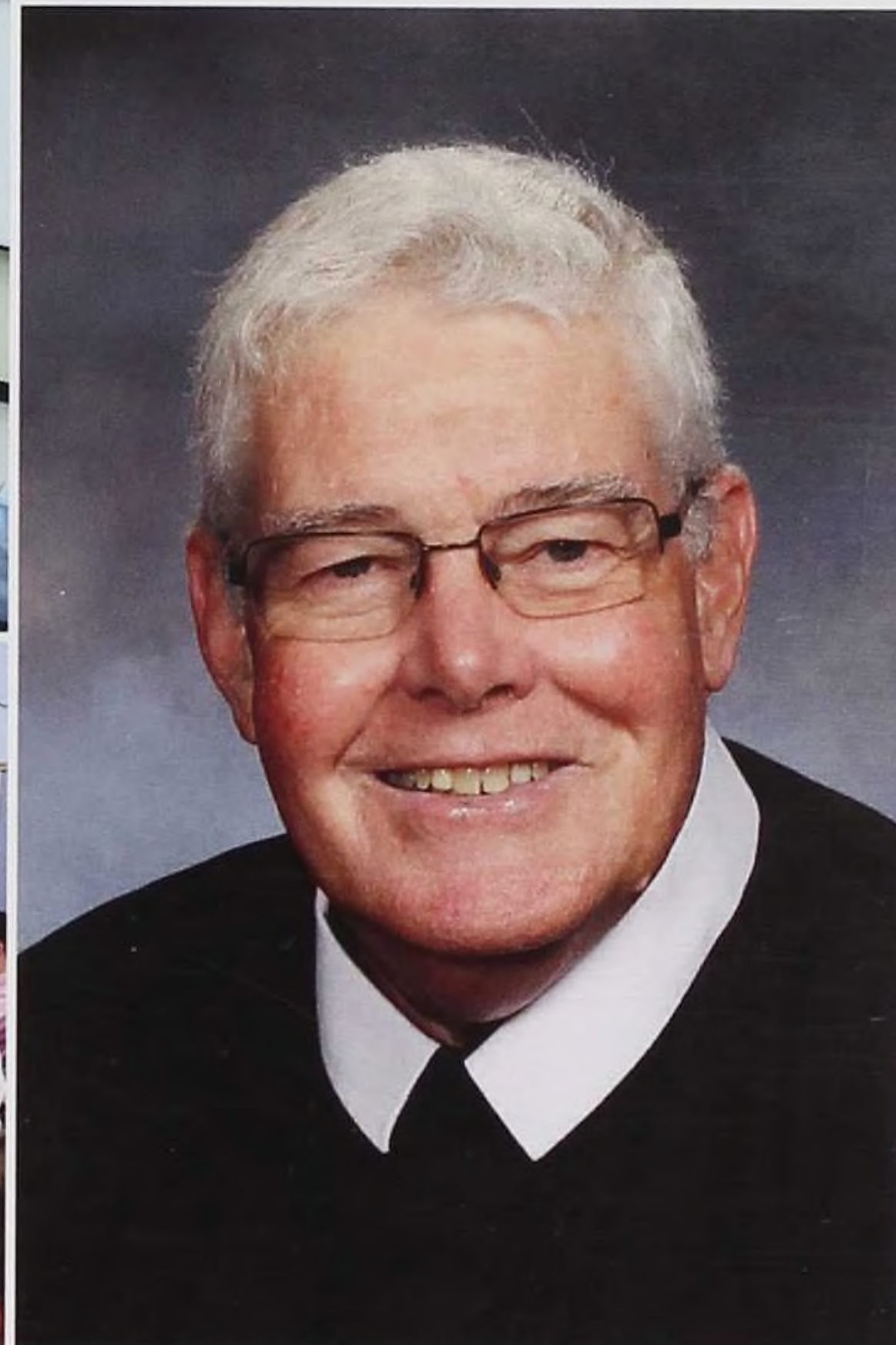
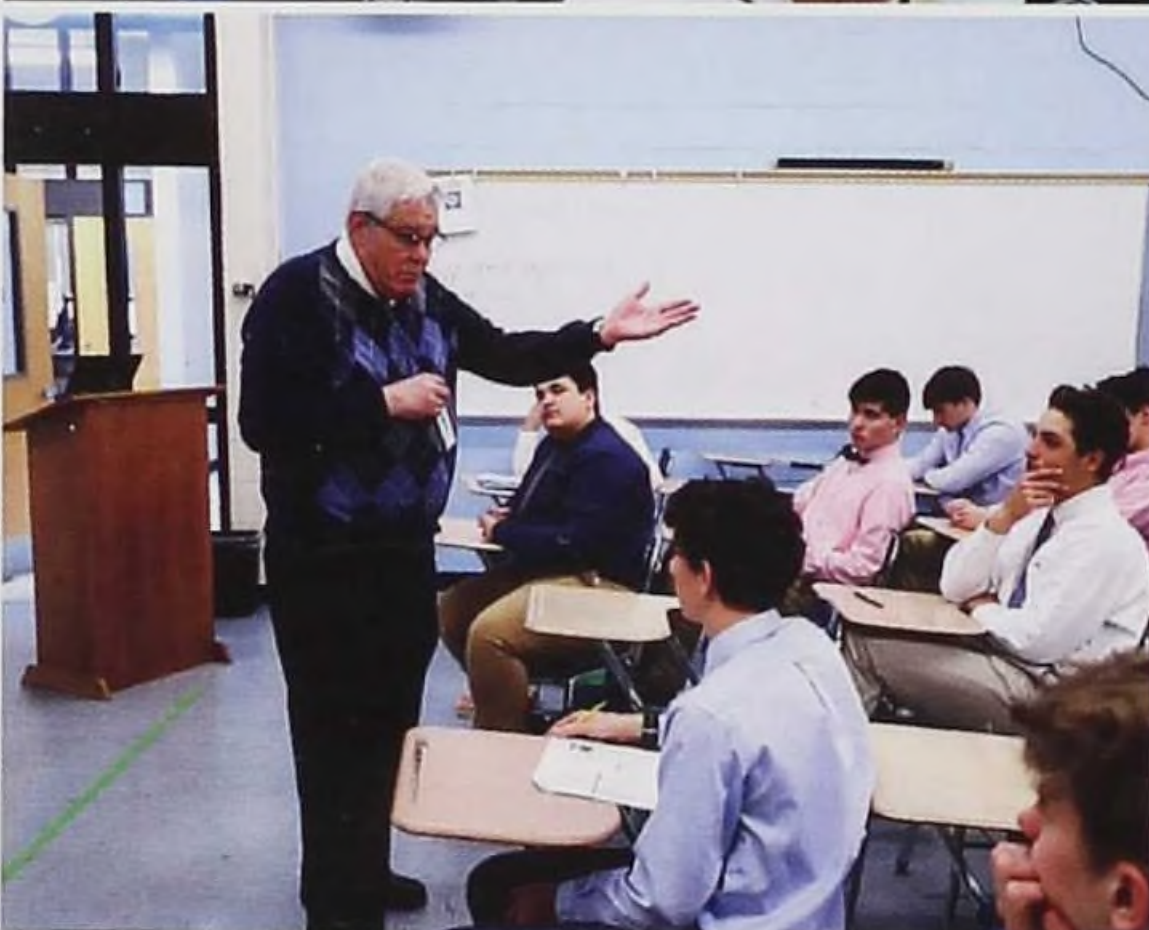
### LIFELONG LASALLIAN

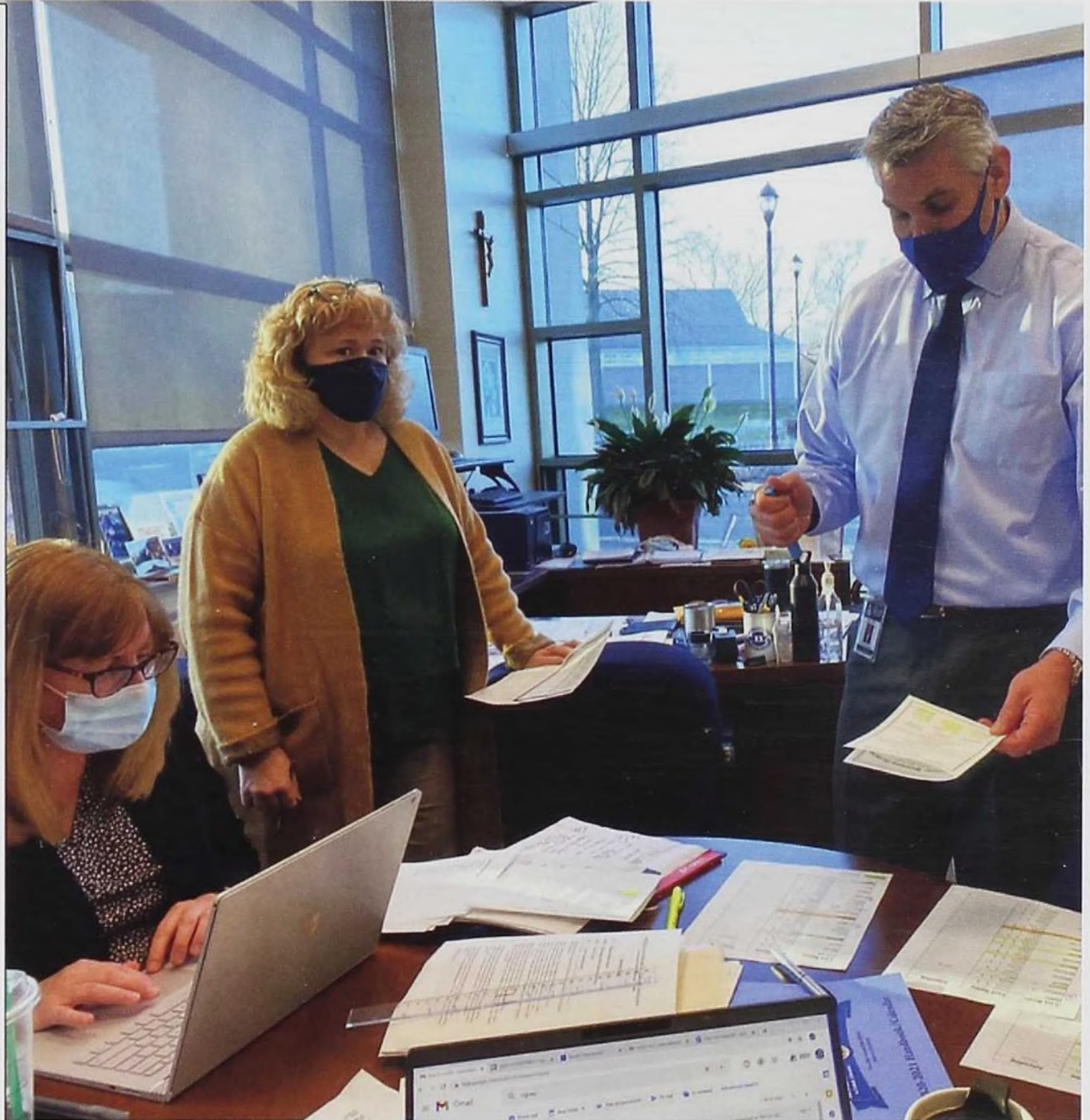

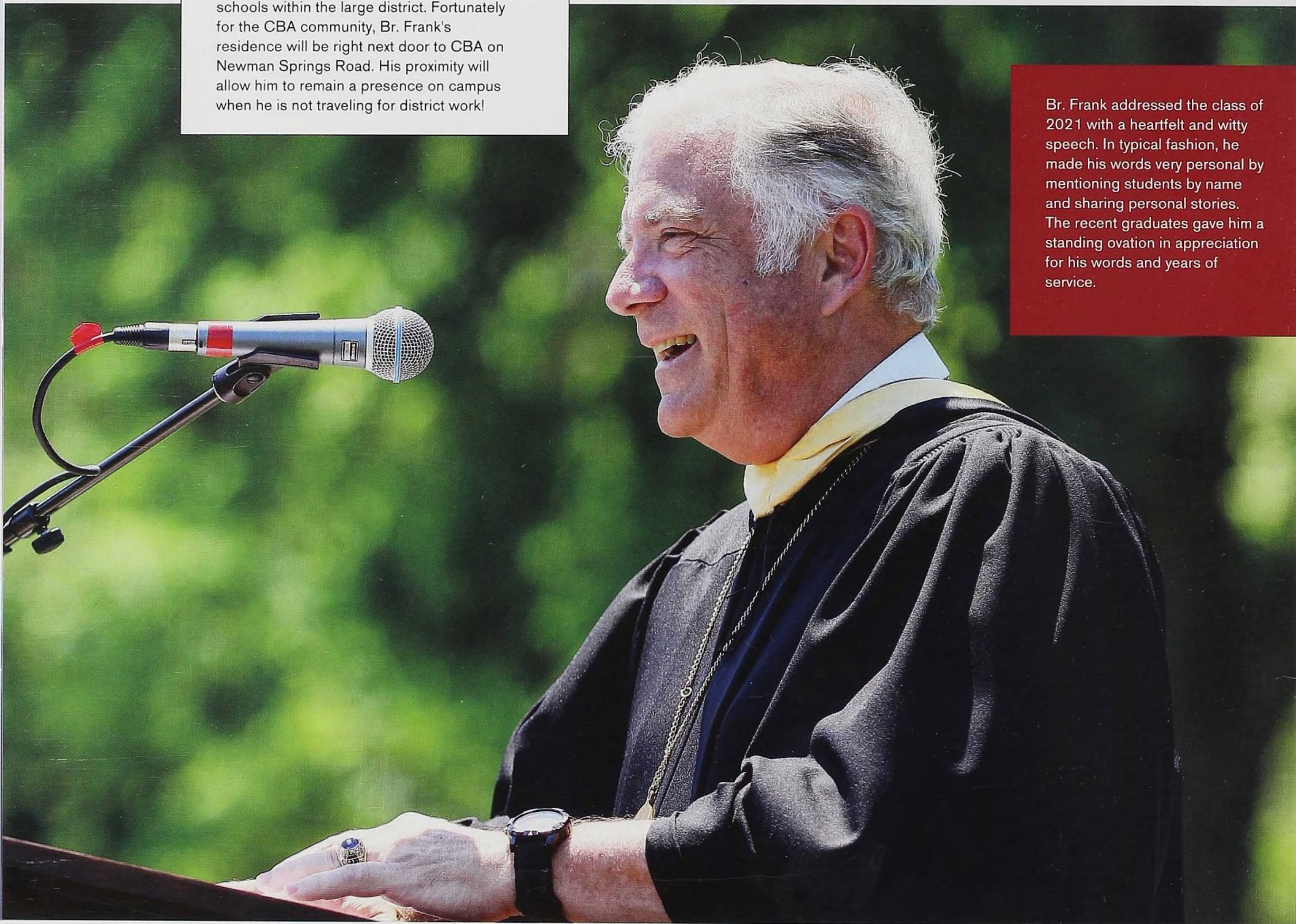


## OUR NEW NEIGHBOR

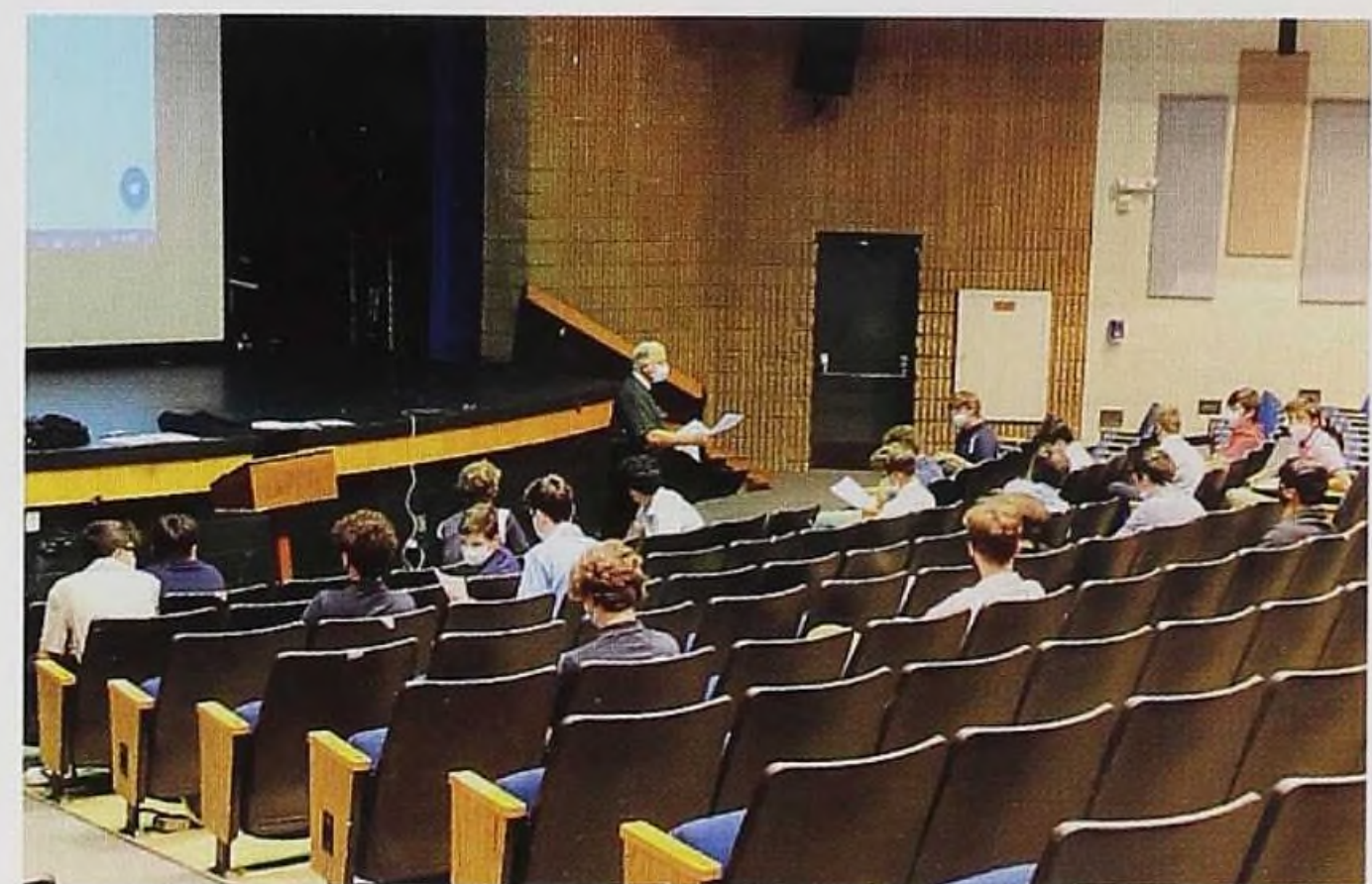
# BEST WISHES BR. FRANK

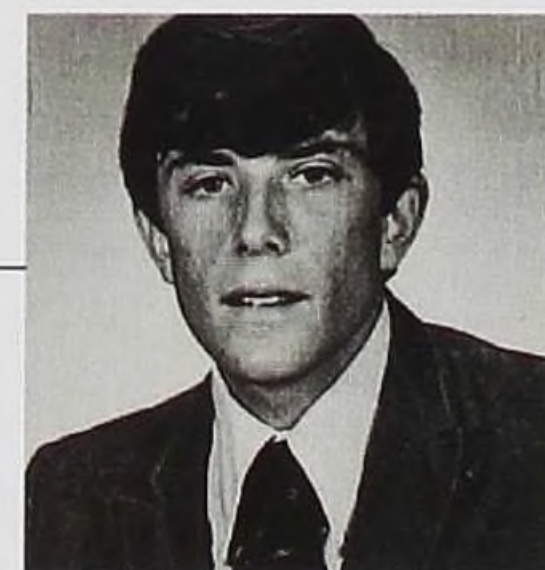
Br. Frank helped students begin a beloved CBA tradition: the Pipes and Drums Band. He plans to continue mentoring these students in his new role.

Mr. McGann has dedicated 29 years to CBA as both a history teacher and the Director of Alumni Relations. He will certainly be missed!



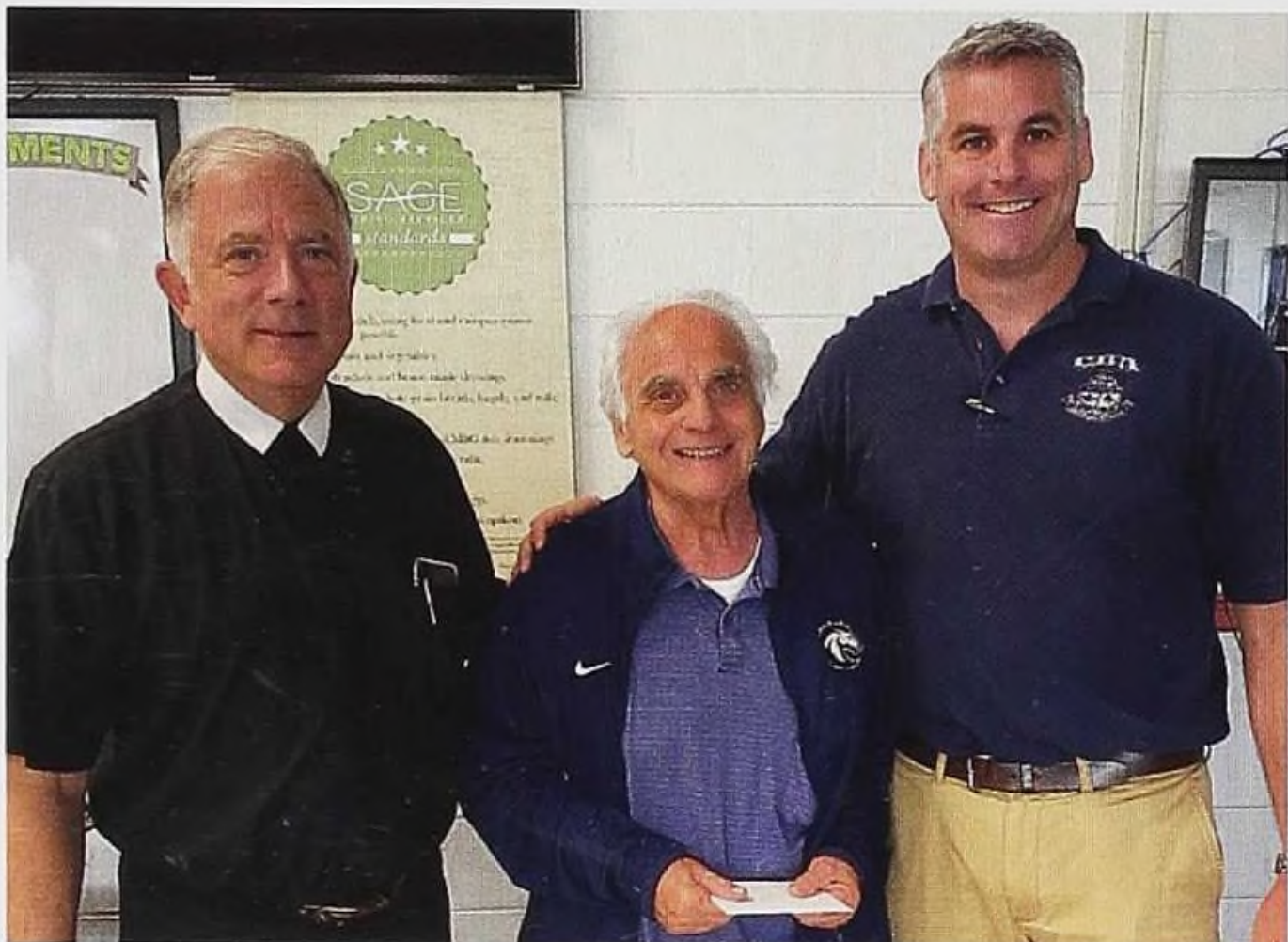
## MRS. KATHLEEN WHALL

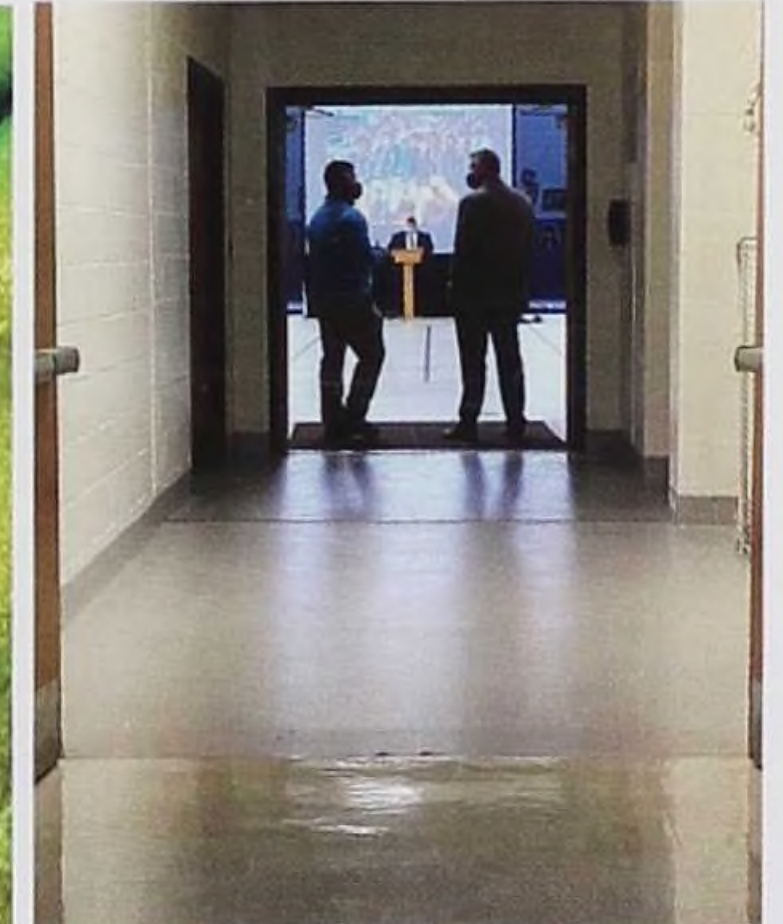
## THE FIRST OF SEVERAL GATHERINGS

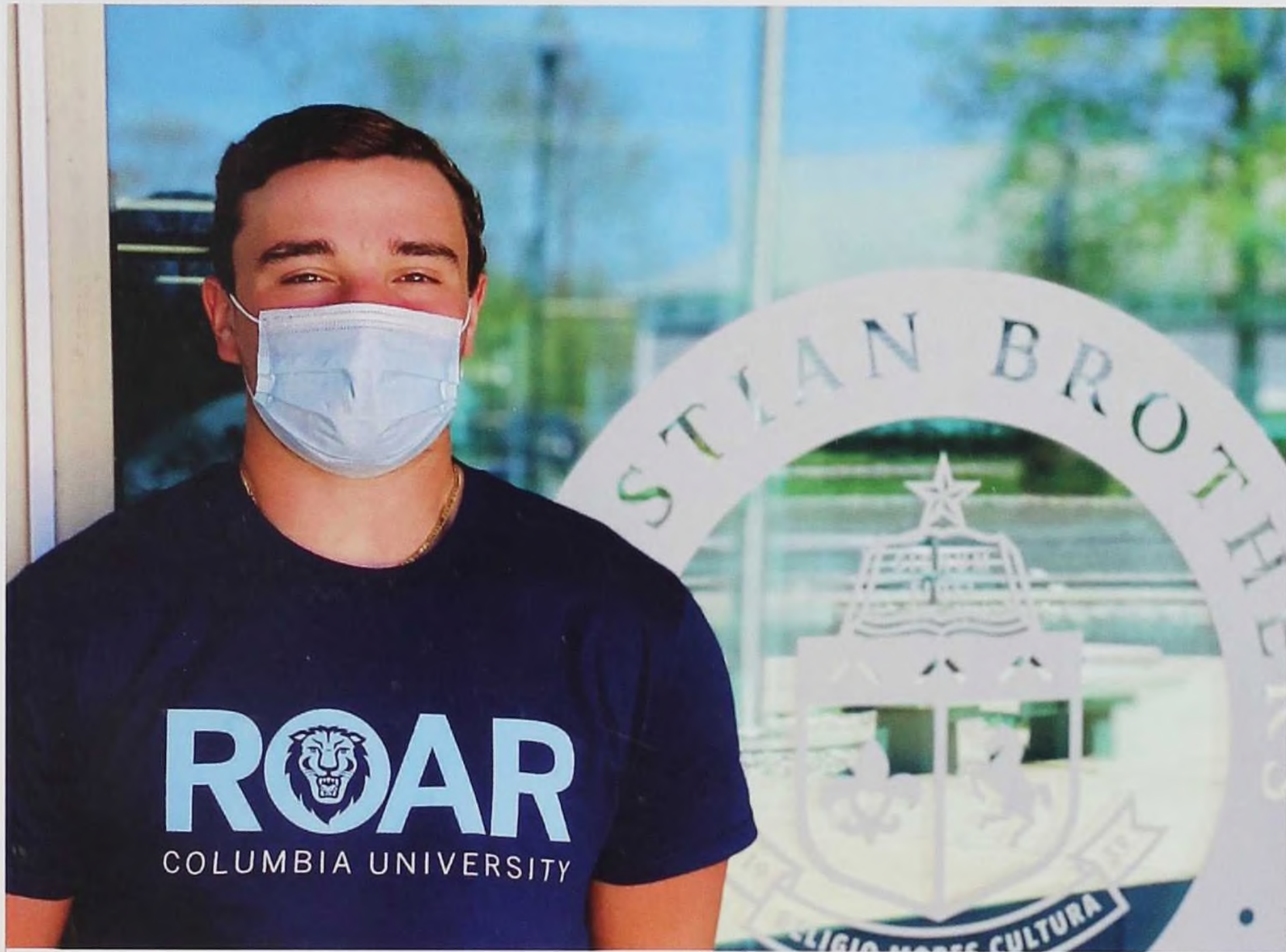
### FUTURE IN PHYSICAL THERAPY

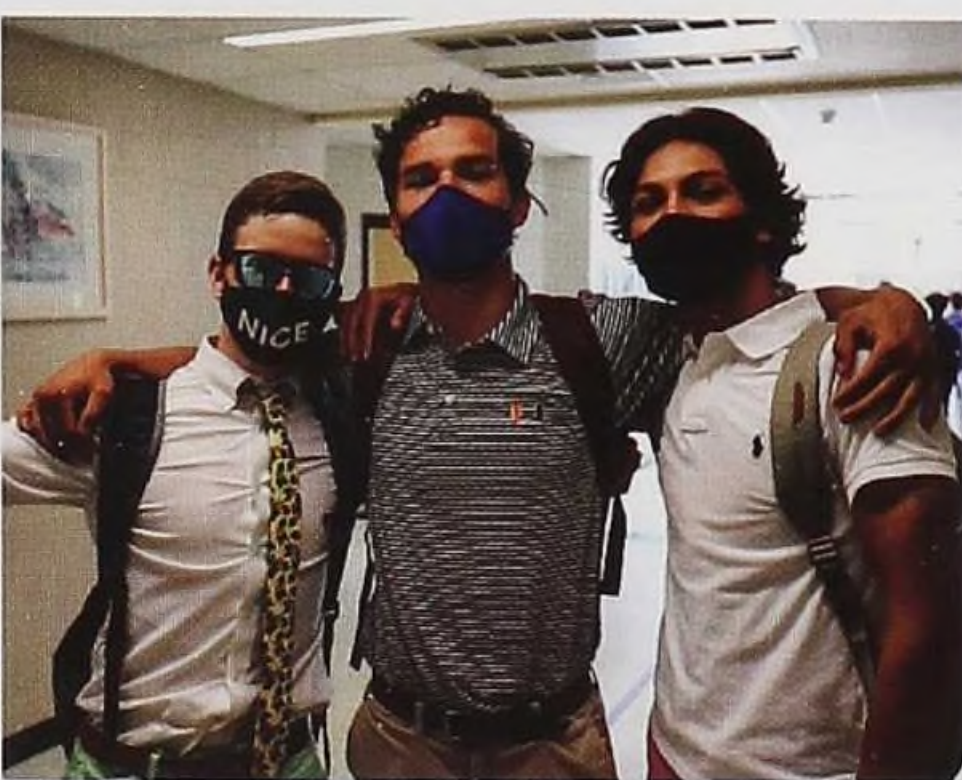

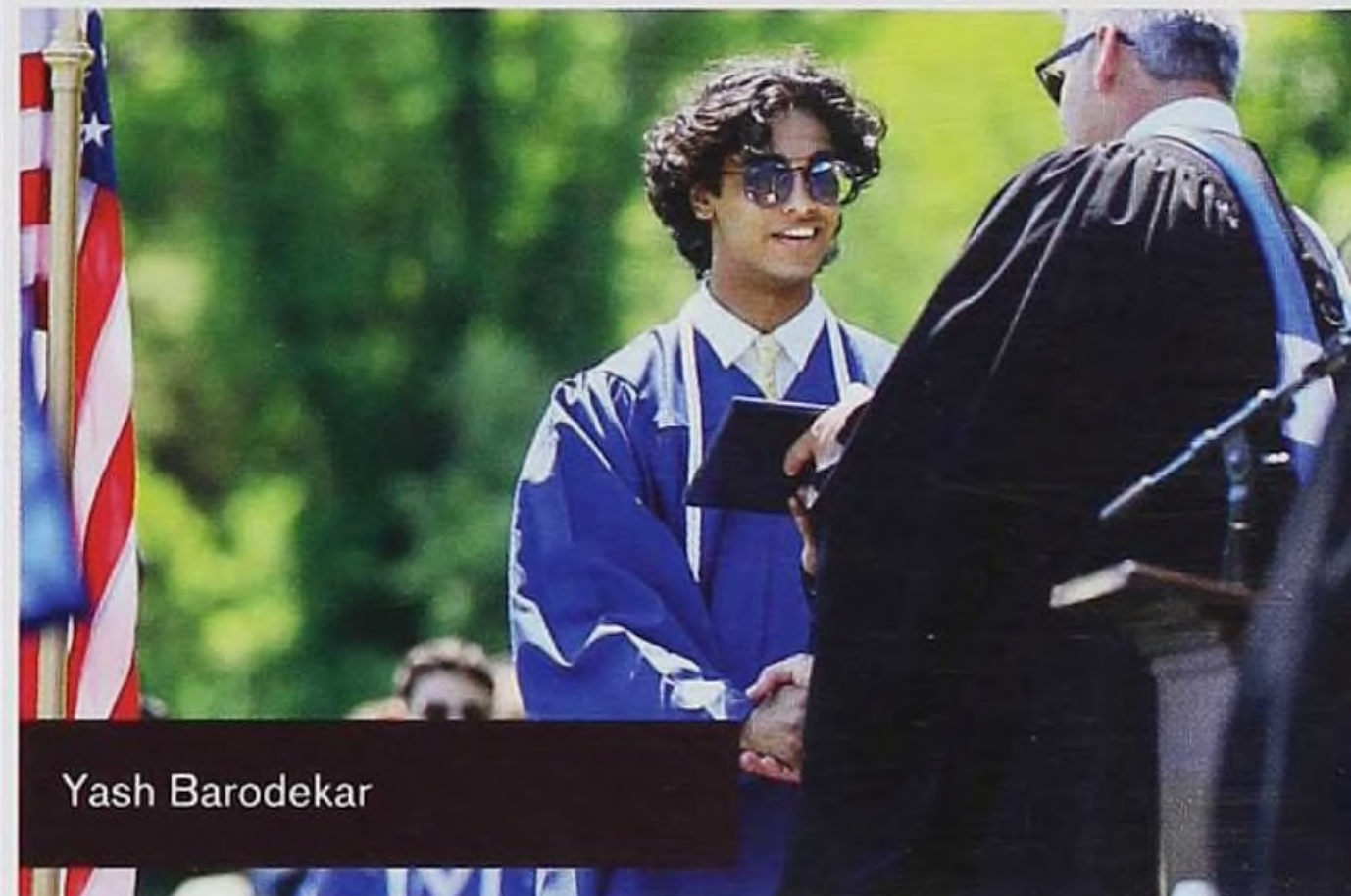

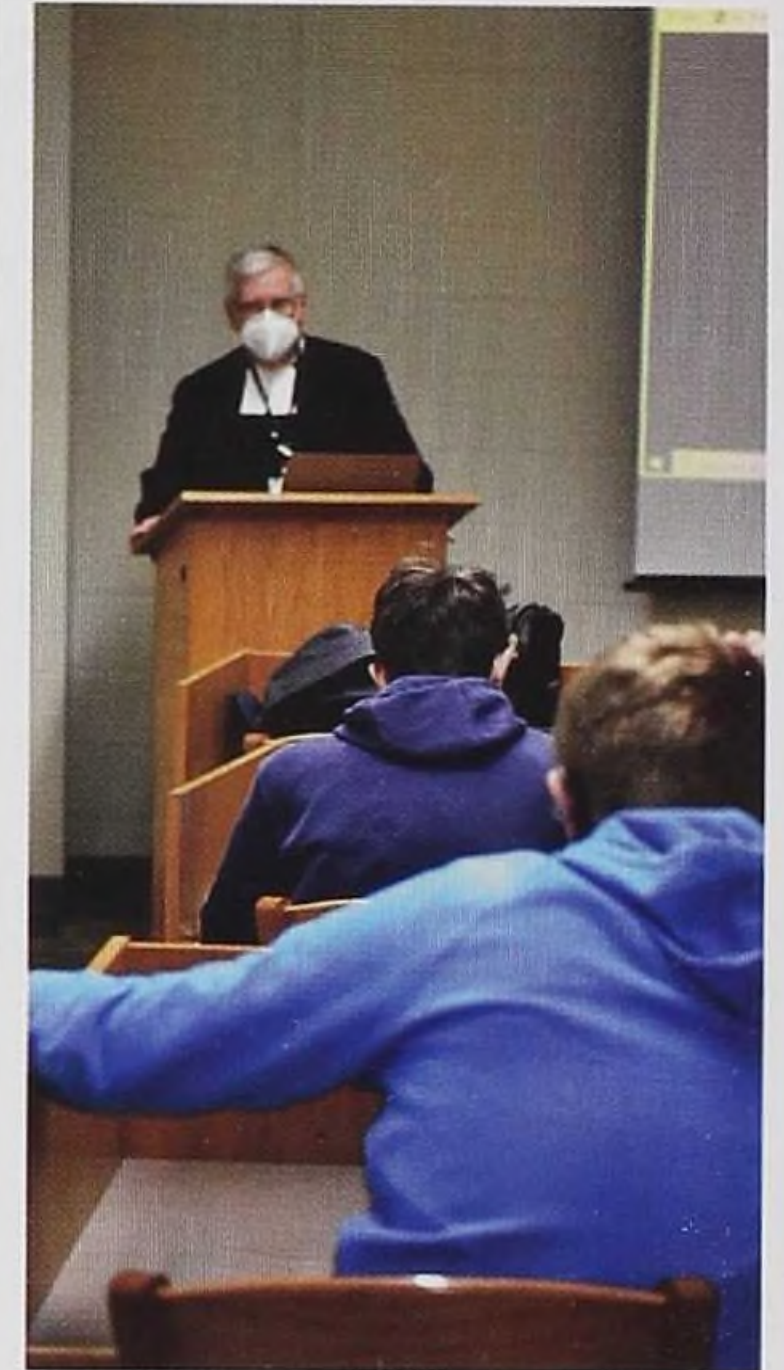
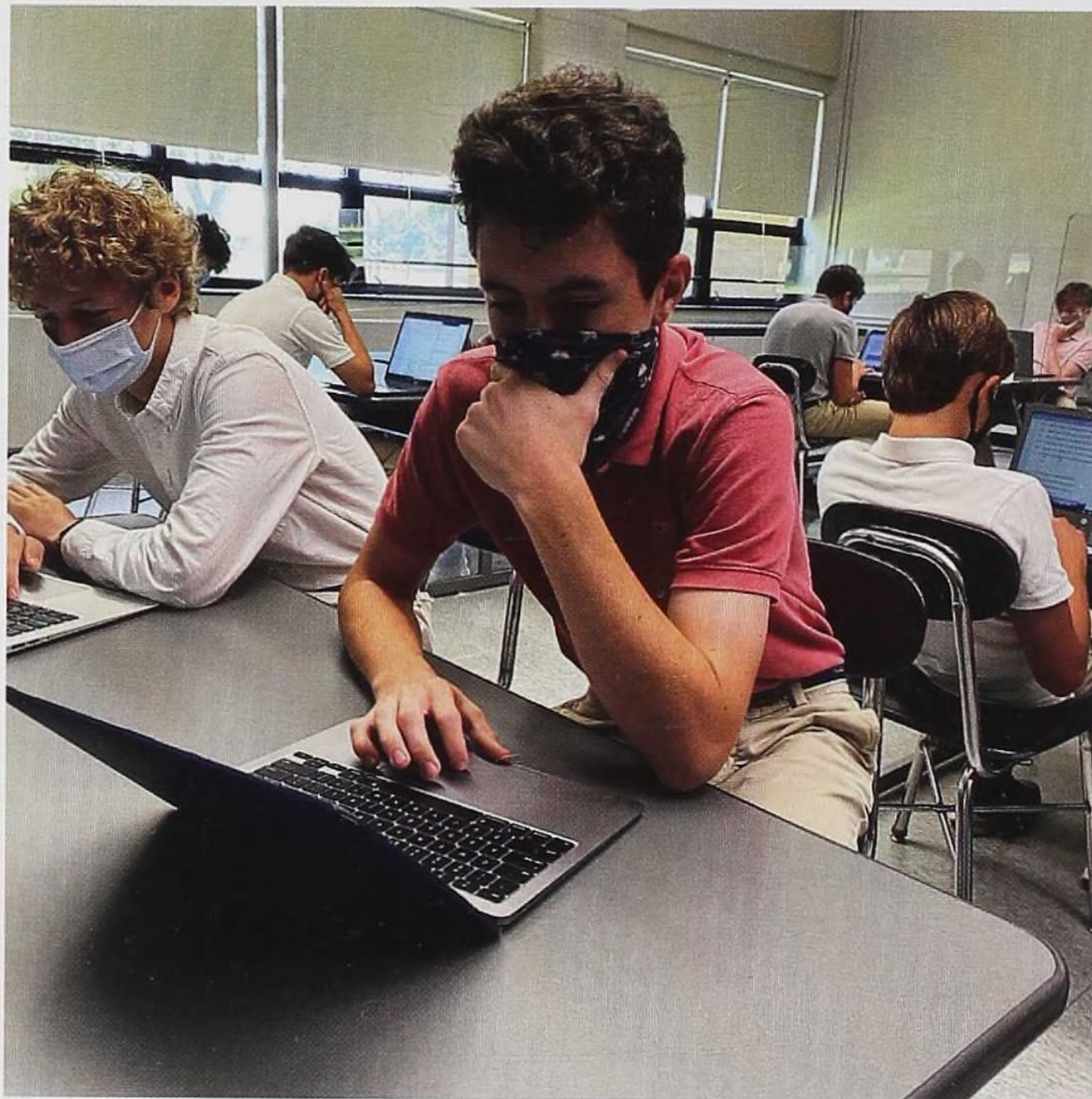
# ONLINE LEARNING TECHNOLOGY

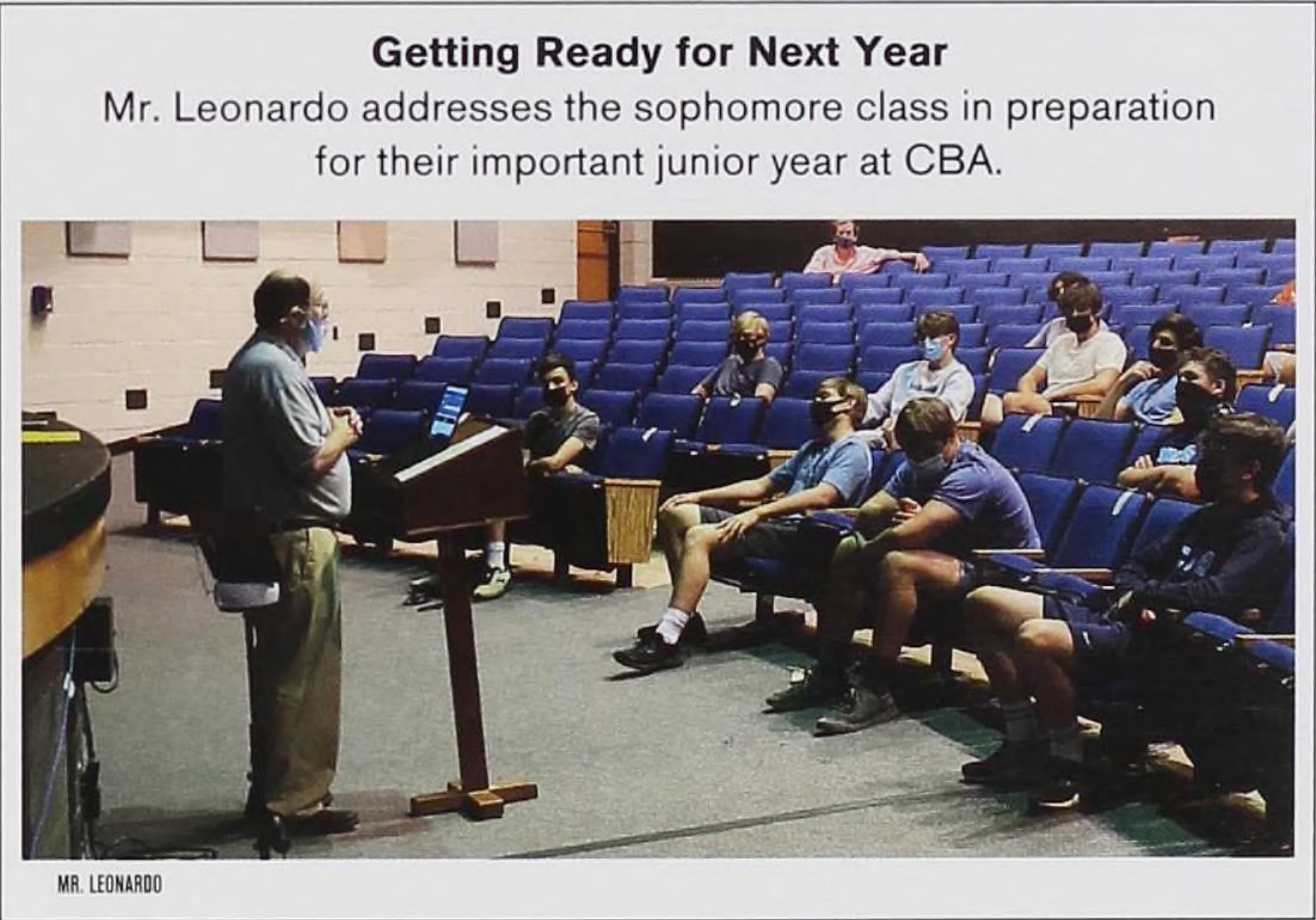

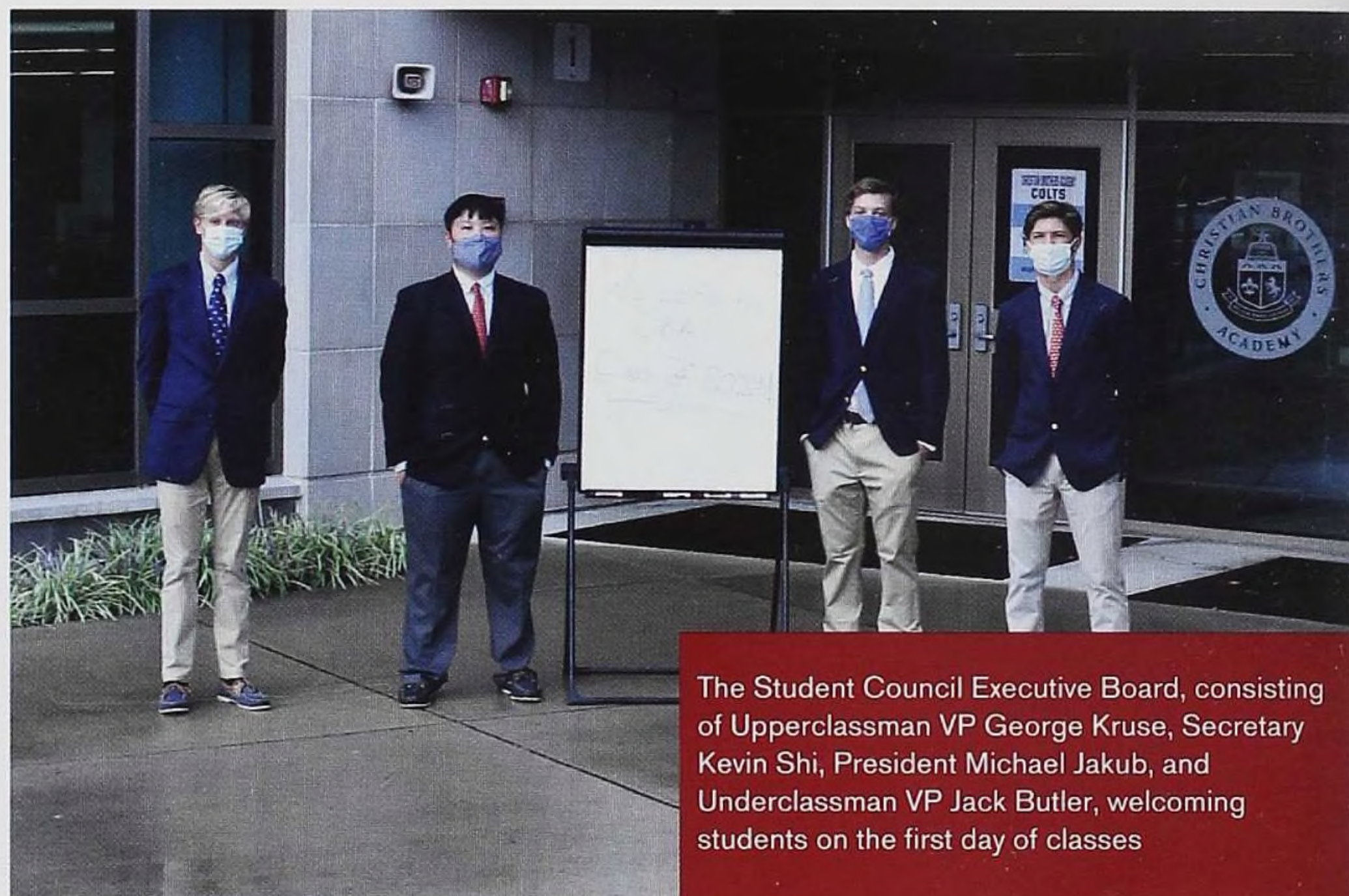

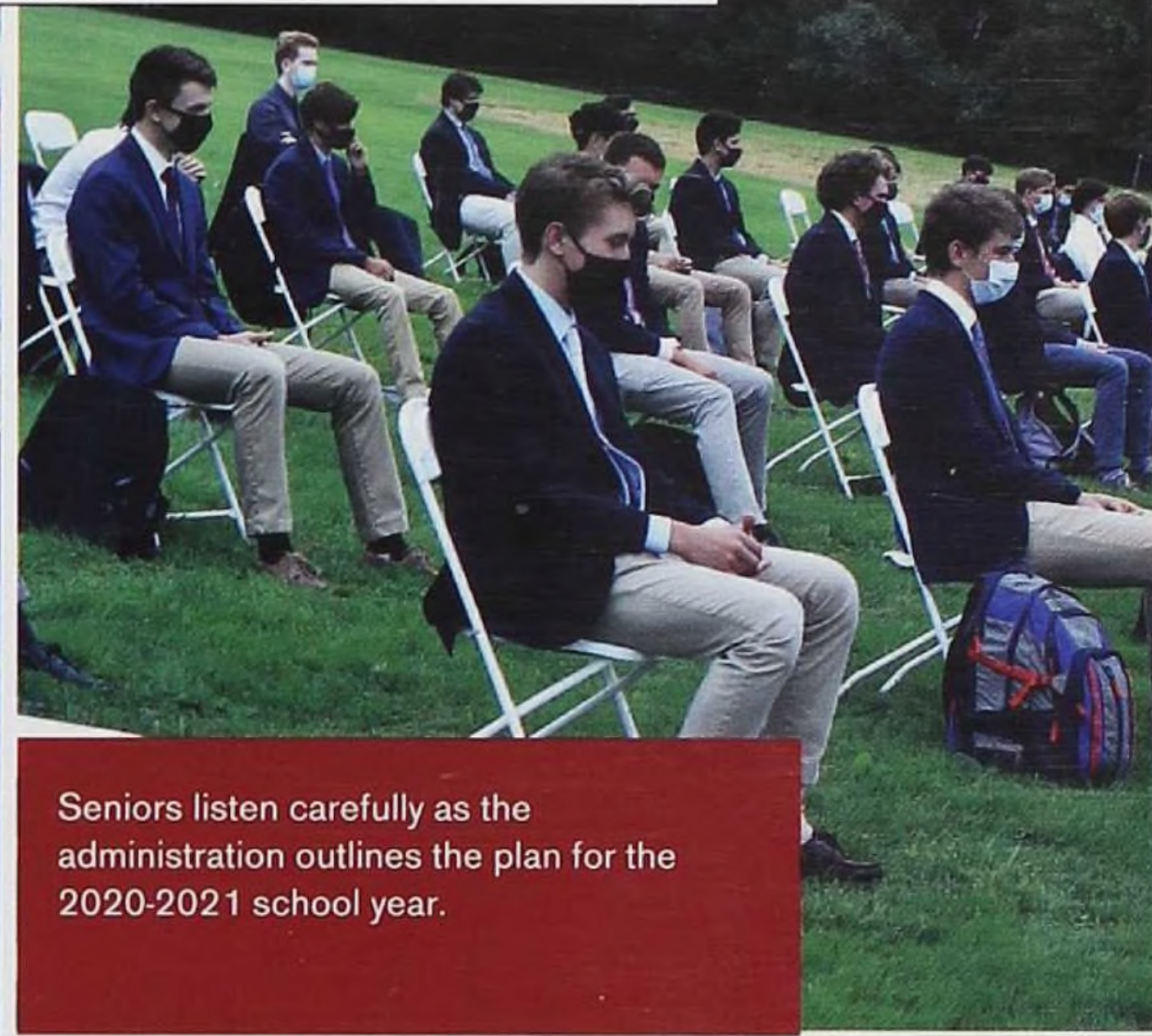


# UNUSUAL FIRST DAY

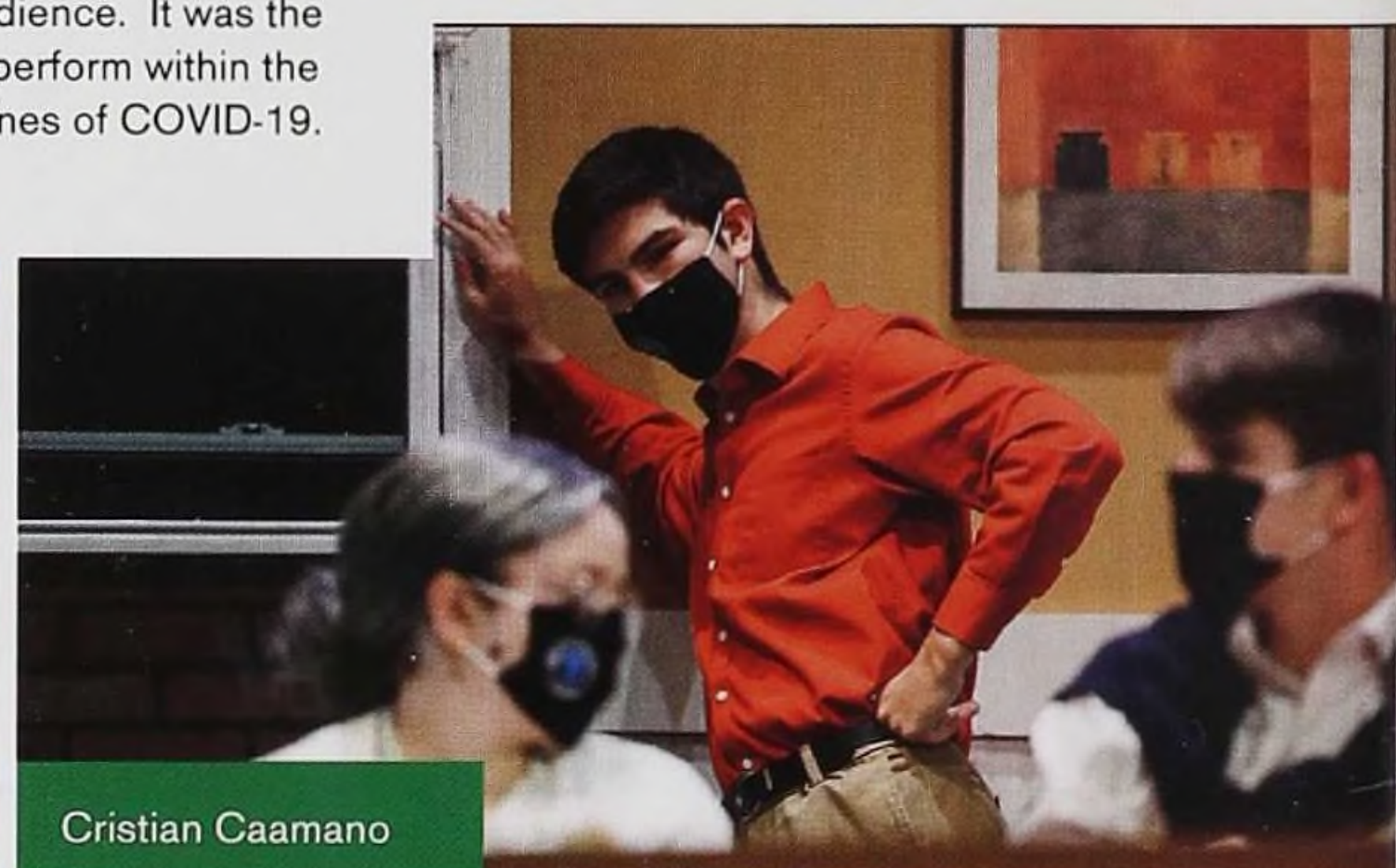


### COURTROOM DRAMA

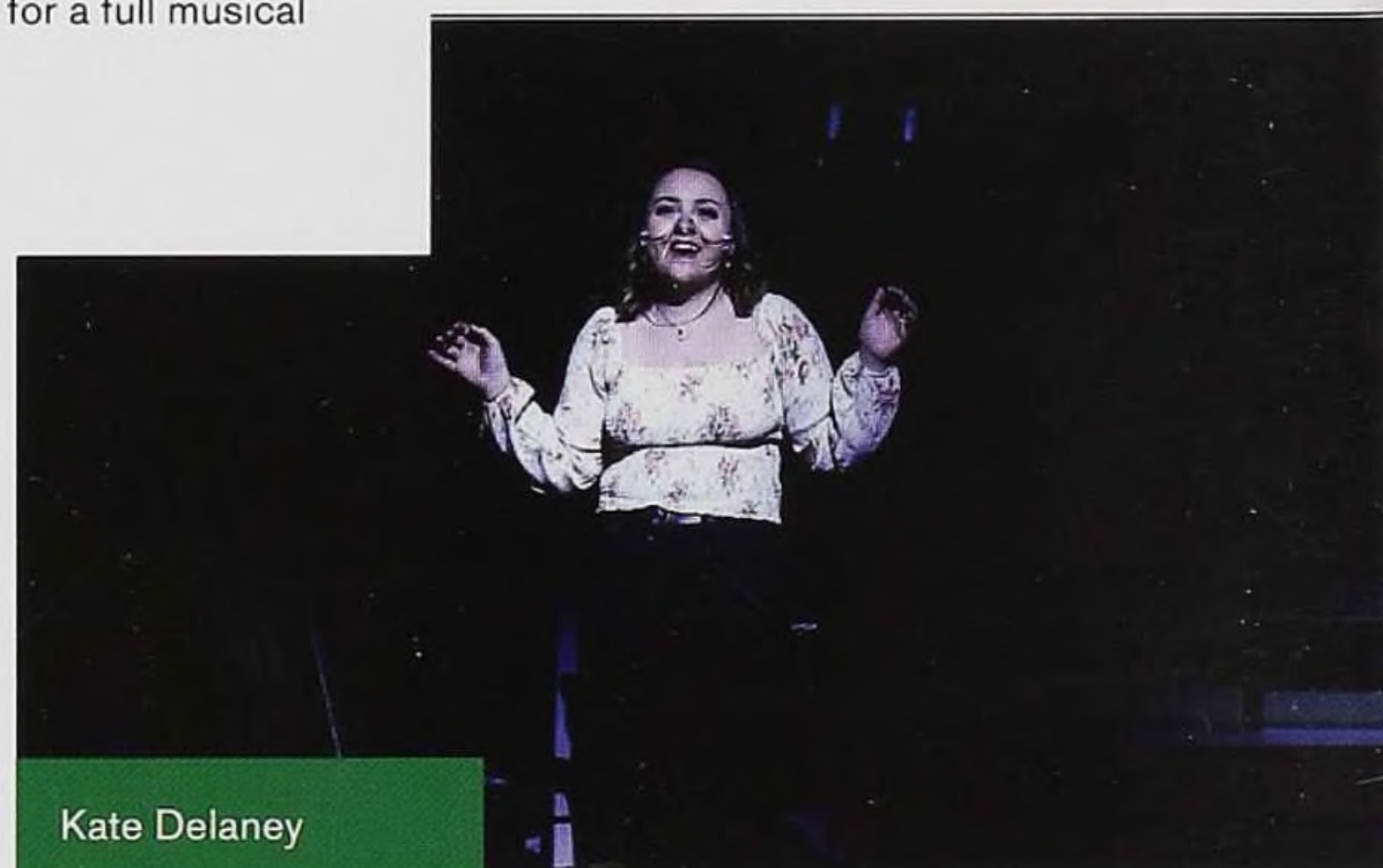


### PERFORMING IN SAFETY

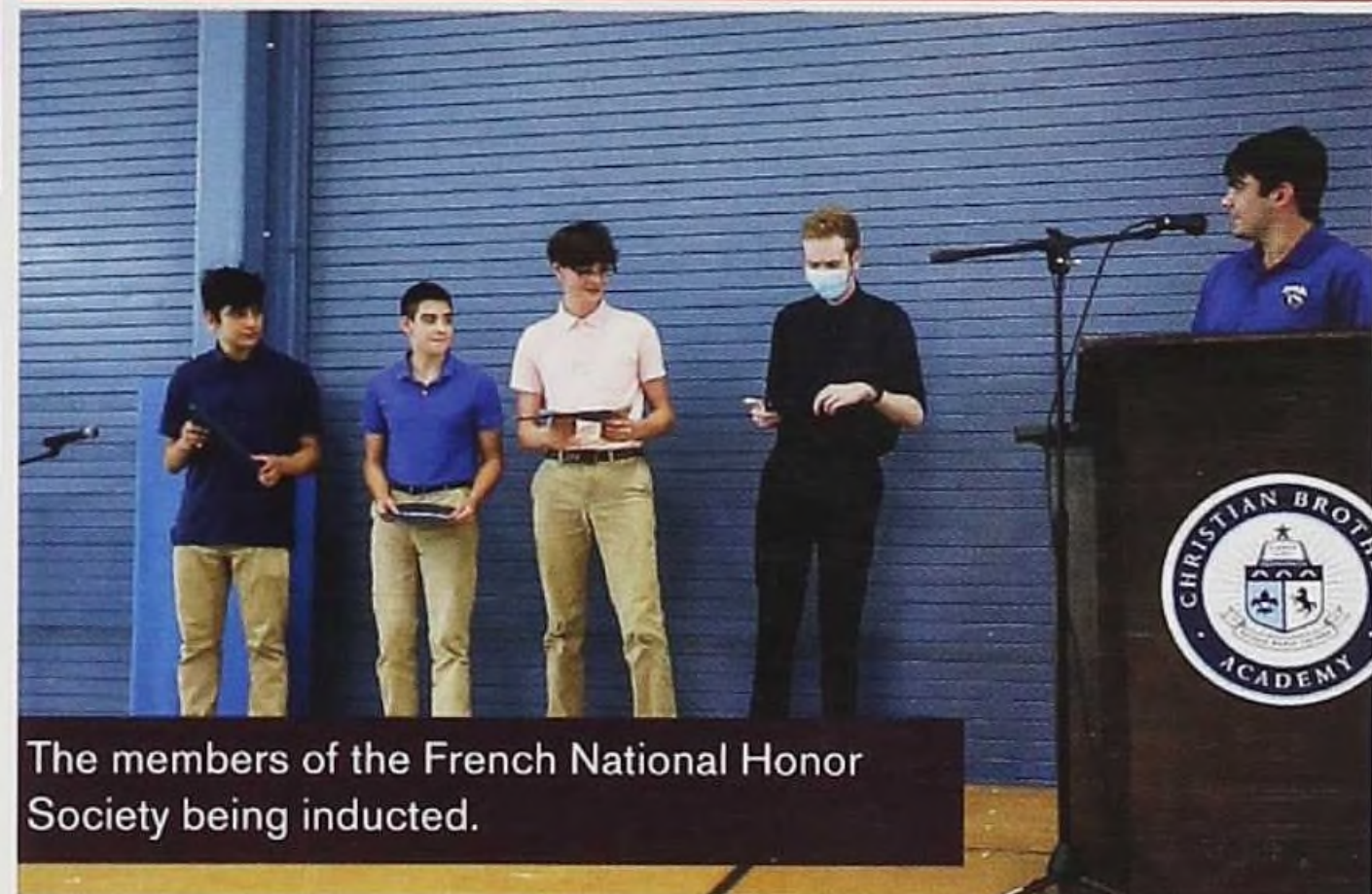

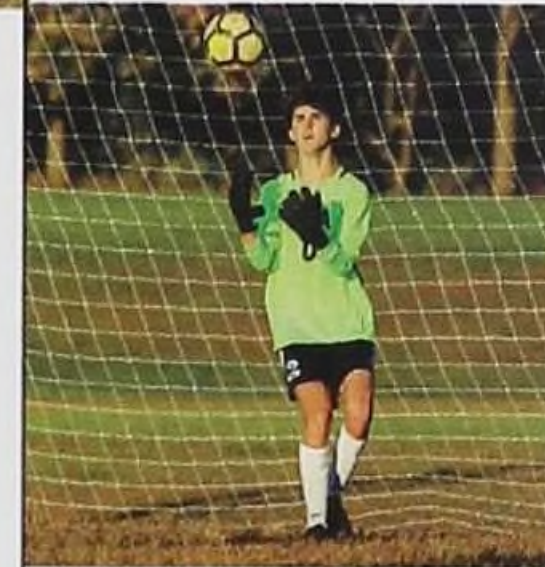

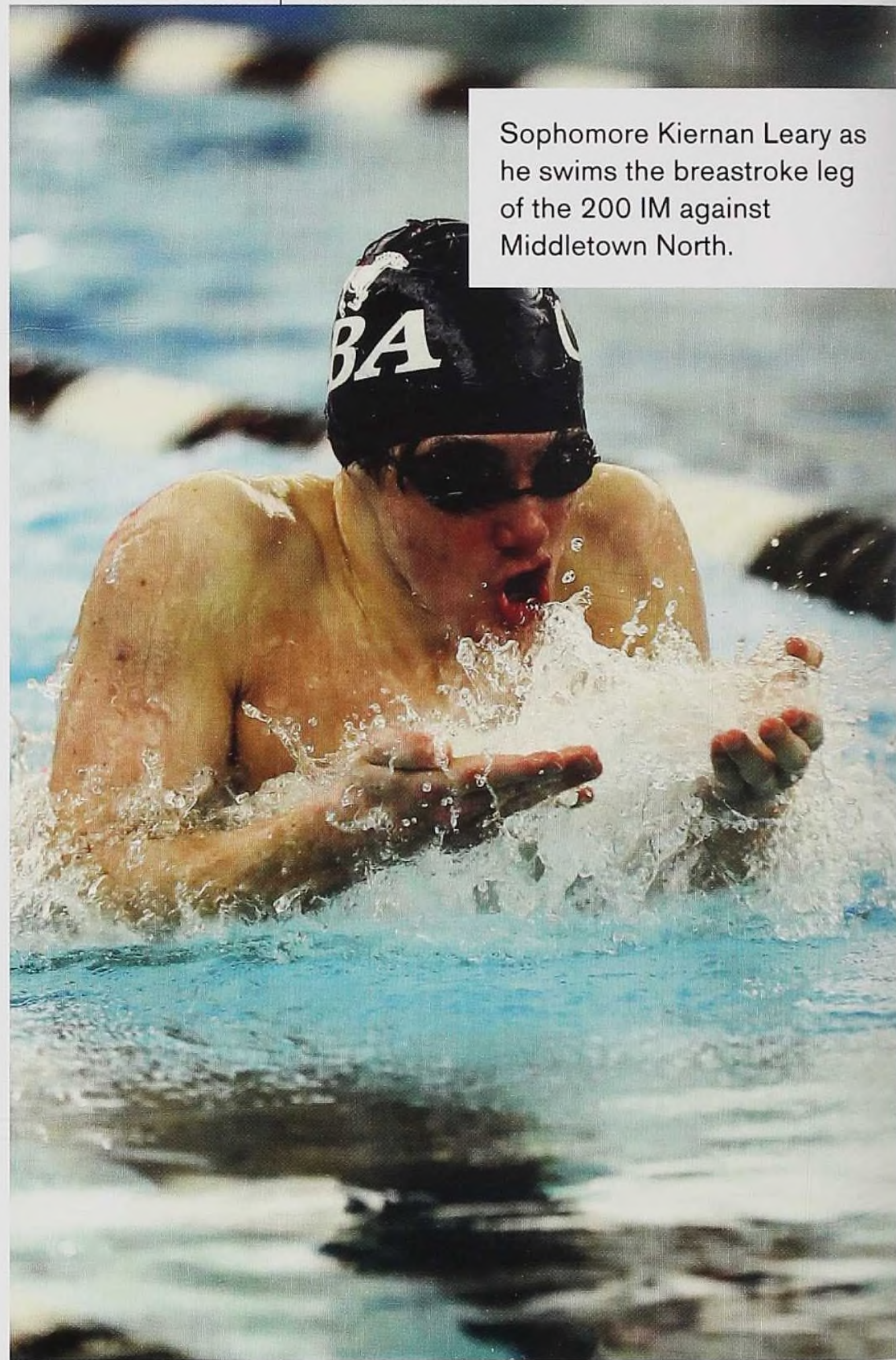

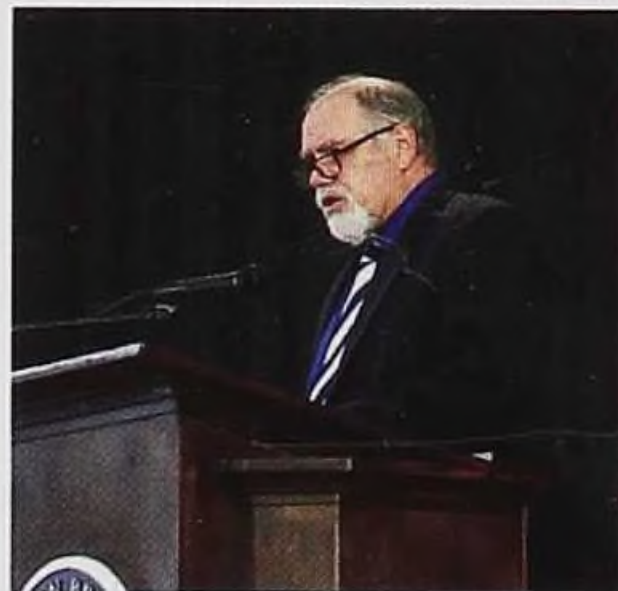

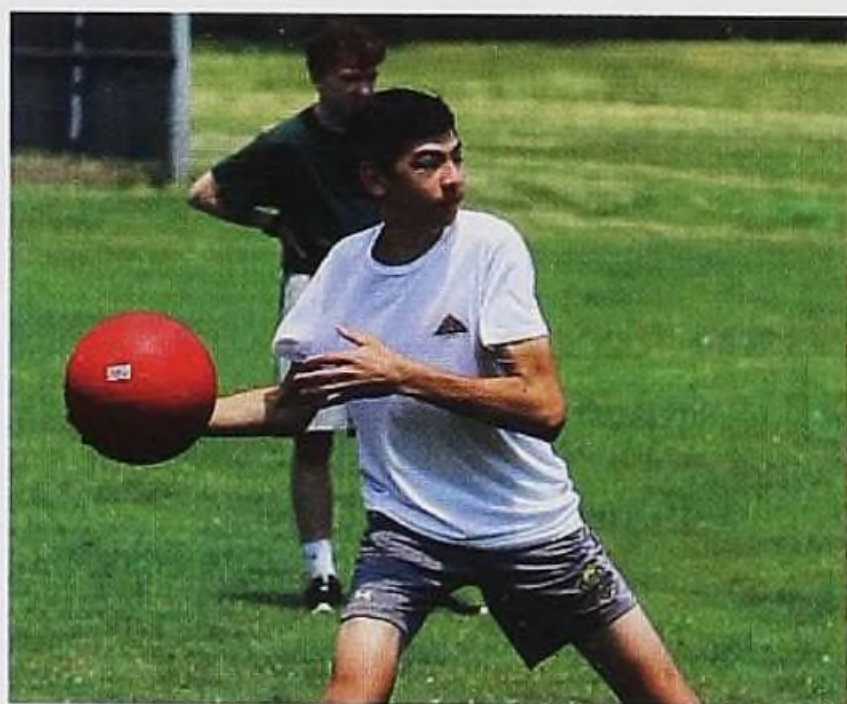
