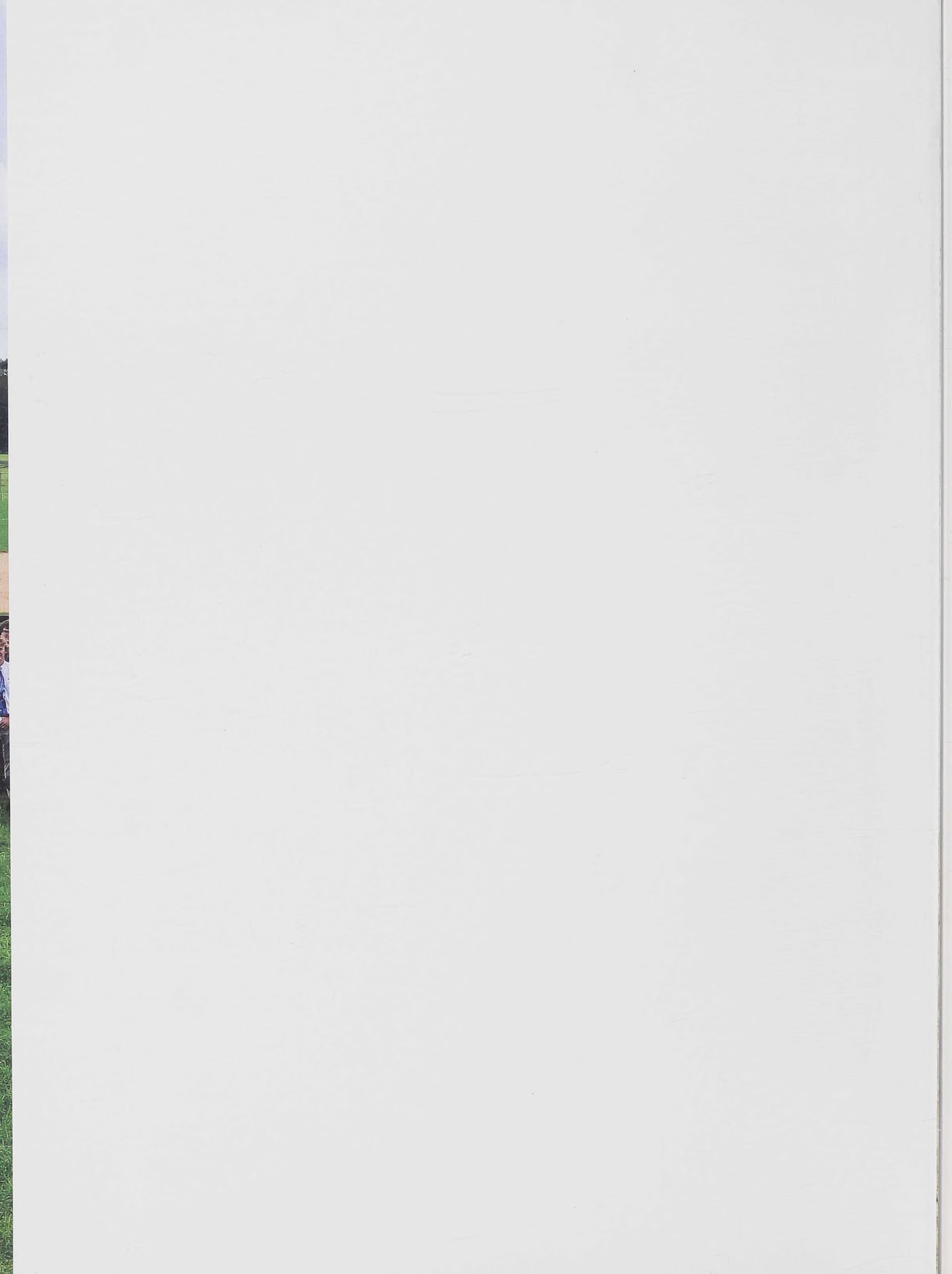

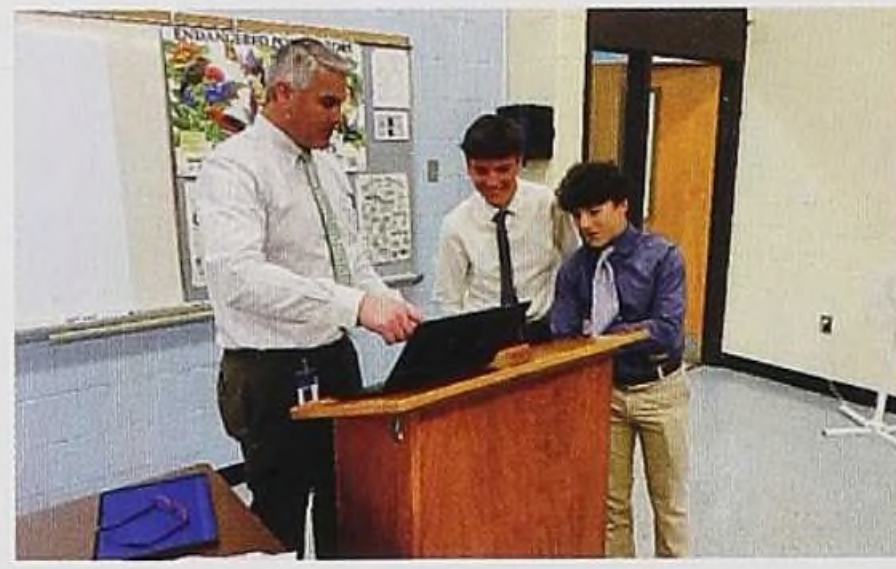
UNMASKED...

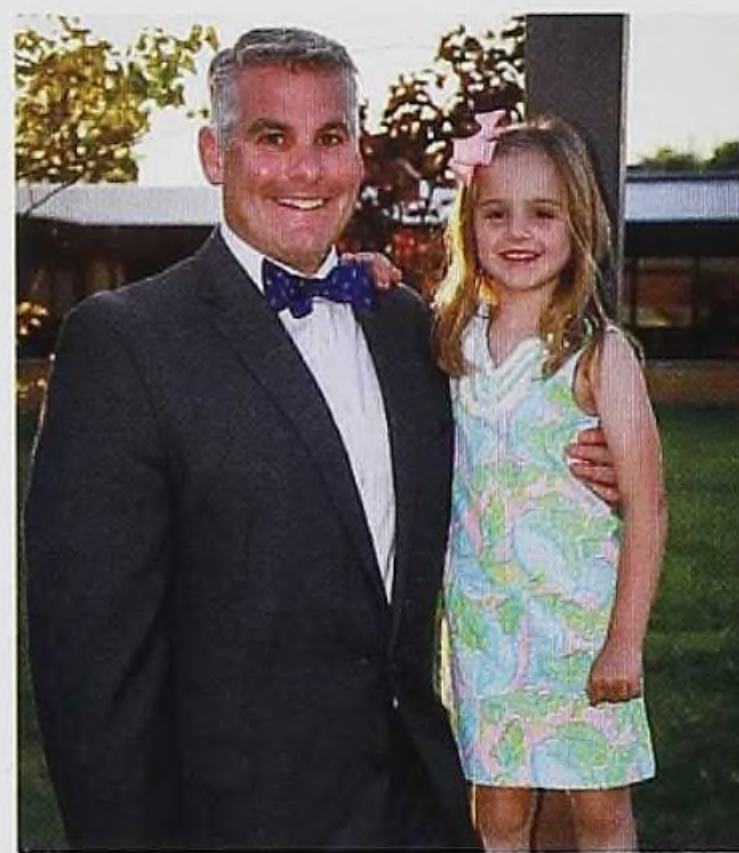

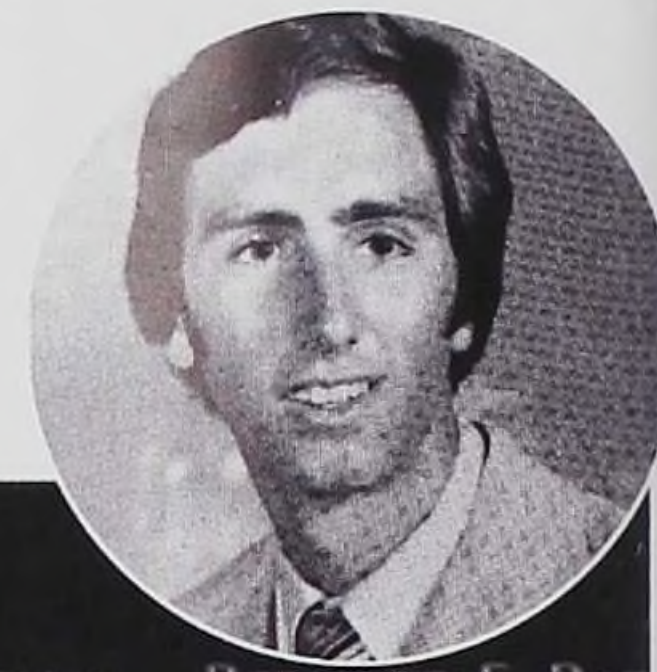

Mark Hemschoot: Class of 1974

Intramural Football
State Champion Hurdler

Mark Hemschoot graduated from CBA in 1974; he participated in intramural football, but was most notably a varsity hurdler for indoor and outdoor track. After graduating in '74, he went to LaSalle University and graduated in 1978. Hemschoot was a high achiever; he graduated magna cum laude, with a double major. He worked at Aon Corporation for 22 years, eventually becoming Senior Vice President of the company. Hemschoot was an upstanding member of his community, serving as a volunteer firefighter in Red Bank. He was remembered by both his CBA and college friends as someone who went out of his way to help anyone in need. On September 11th, 2001, his wife attempted to call his office, leading straight to his voicemail, which indicated that he may have evacuated the building. He may then have returned to his office on the 105th floor in the South Tower, either told to go back to his office by an announcement or to grab his briefcase with his insulin supply. At that point, the second plane struck. Mark Hemschoot is survived by his wife and two sons. The CBA community remembers the entire Hemschoot family in our prayers.

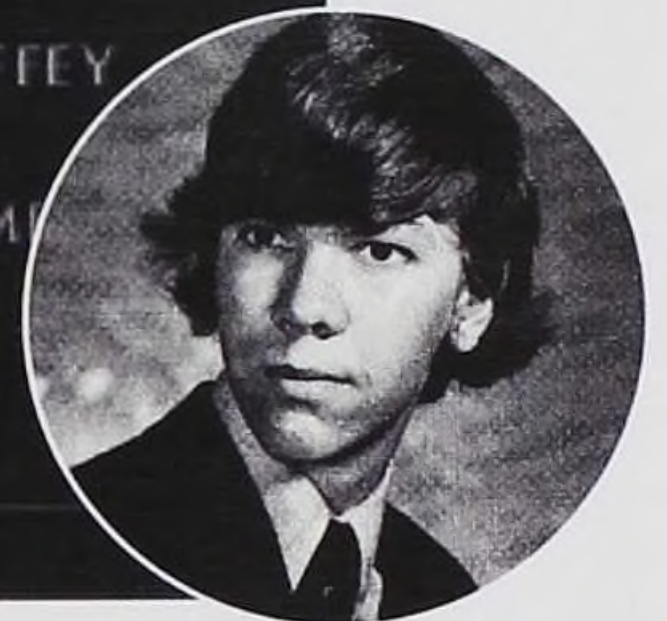
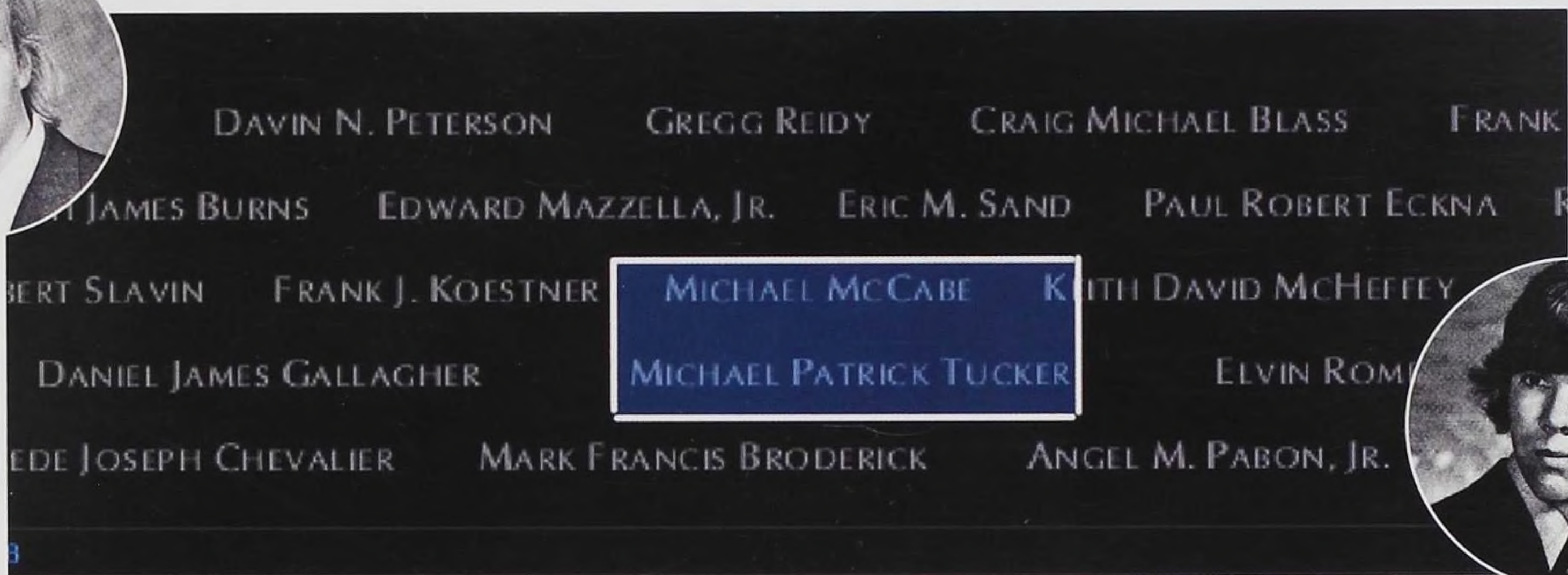
Dan Gallagher graduated from CBA in 1996, as an active student who participated in intramural football, soccer, and ultimate frisbee. He was also in the Spanish Club during his first two years and was an Open House member in his first year. After graduating, he furthered his education at DeSales University and graduated in 2000. Gallagher was remembered as an upbeat guy, always happy, and the life of the party by his college friends. Known as 'Reds' by his friends, his memory lives on in all those he knew. He was the sole DeSales graduate that died on September 11th. He was on the 104th floor of the North Tower on September 11, 2001, after starting his job with Cantor Fitzgerald. A college fund at DeSales University was created in his name, and since 2001, it has benefited seven students attending the university. We send our love and prayers to his family and friends so that they may have the strength to find peace.



2021 marked the 20th anniversary of the events of September 11, 2001. On that day, CBA lost five of our brother alumni. This year, the staff of Pegasus wishes to pay tribute to those young husbands, brothers, fathers, sons, athletes, scholars, and friends. They live on in the halls of CBA and in our hearts...forever.

Michael McCabe: Class of 1977

Three Clubs, Two Intramural Sports

Michael McCabe attended the Academy from 1973 to 1977; in that time, he was an active member of three separate clubs and participated in two intramural sports. After graduation, he attended Rutgers University, where he graduated in 1981. McCabe worked as a lifeguard on the Jersey Shore, reportedly saving countless people. He took his first significant job at Prudential, where he worked for 18 years. In the summer of 2001, McCabe quit his job and took the summer off on vacation until his friend since high school, Michael Tucker '79, approached him and offered him a job at Cantor Fitzgerald. The two had been close friends since attending CBA together. Remembered as a calm, cool, and collected man, McCabe is still cherished as a loving father and husband. On September 11th, 2001, just a week after McCabe started at Cantor Fitzgerald, he was on the 104th floor in the North Tower. After twenty years, we send our prayers to the McCabe family to find peace.

Michael Tucker: Class of 1979

Three Intramural Sports, Varsity Hockey Player

Michael Tucker, nicknamed "Tuck," graduated in 1979; he was a very active student at the Academy. He played three different intramural sports, including football. He also was a varsity athlete, playing for the CBA hockey team. During his time at CBA, classmates described Tuck as someone who loved everyone and how every conversation about him would involve a funny story about time spent with him. After CBA, Tucker went to Syracuse University, where he graduated in 1983. A notoriously hard worker, he started his career in his basement. Still, after twelve years, he was one of the most notable and well-known traders at Cantor Fitzgerald and became a partner within the company. A selfless man when it came to his family, he tended to the needs of his four daughters and reportedly never complained when it came to taking care of his family despite his stressful job. Notably, he was also a caring friend, hiring a friend the day after he was laid off from his job. On September 11th, 2001, Mr. Tucker was on the 104th floor in the North Tower; he was said to always be the first one in the office. We send our prayers and love to his family and friends.

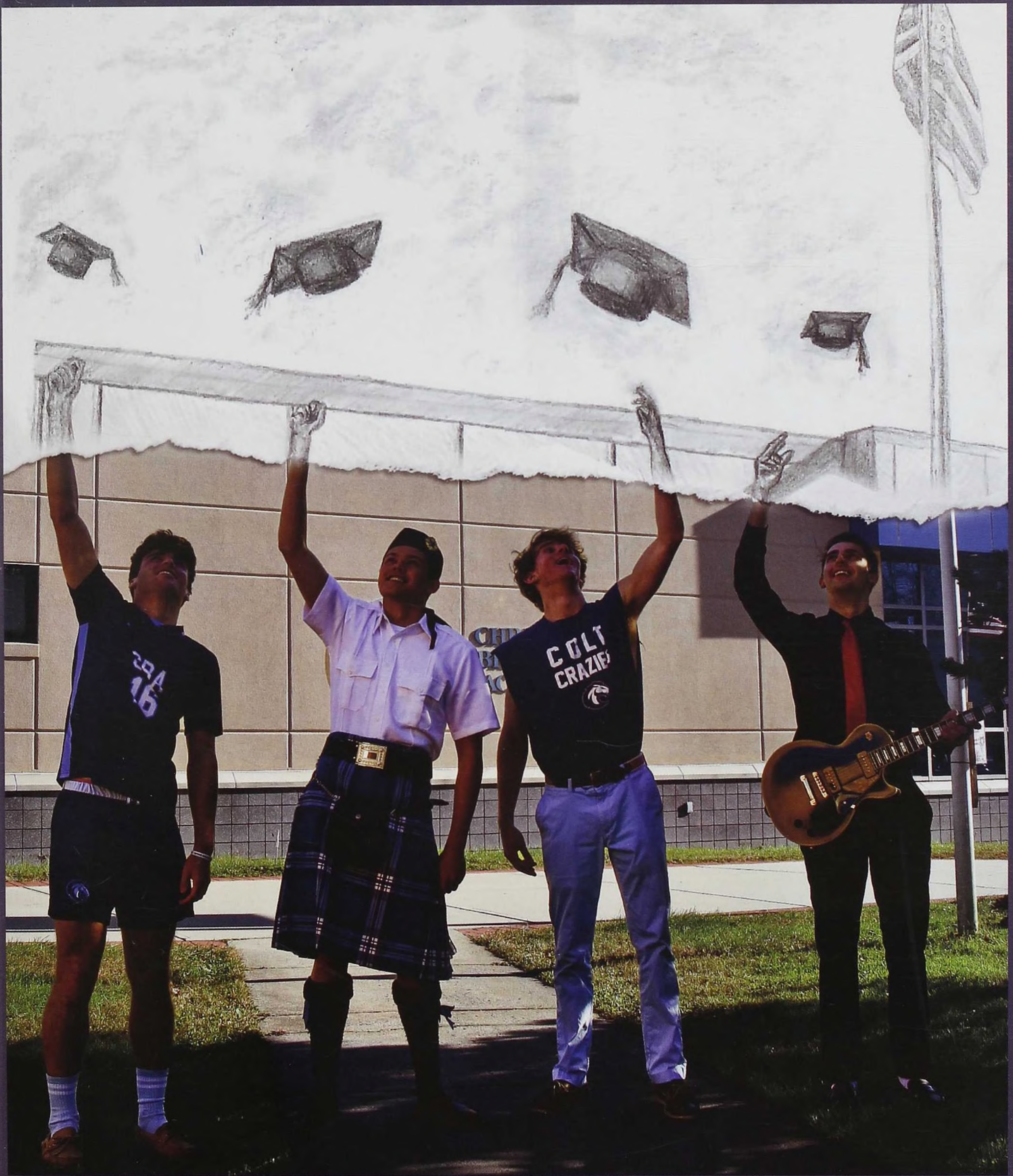

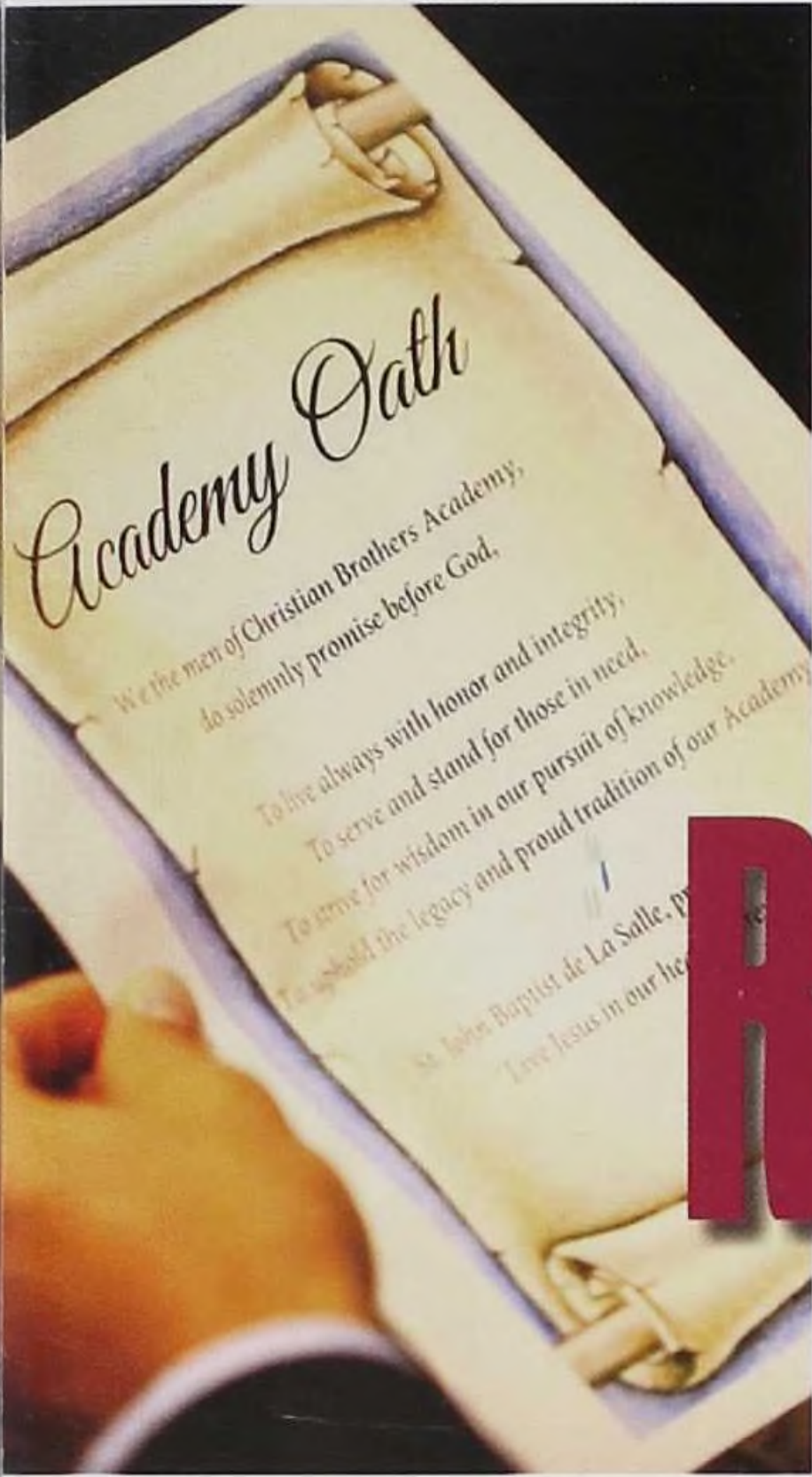
FRESHMAN OATH DAY

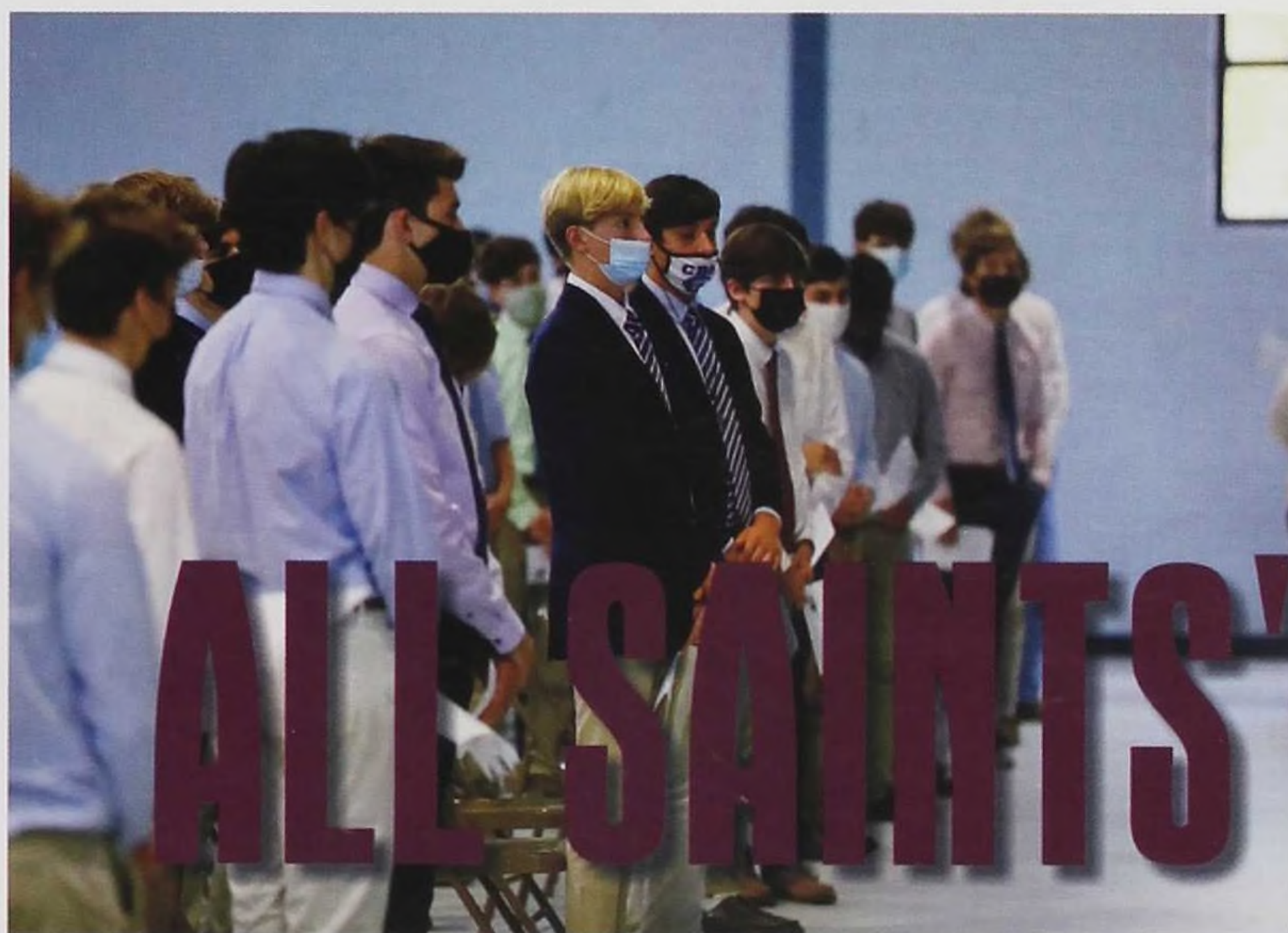

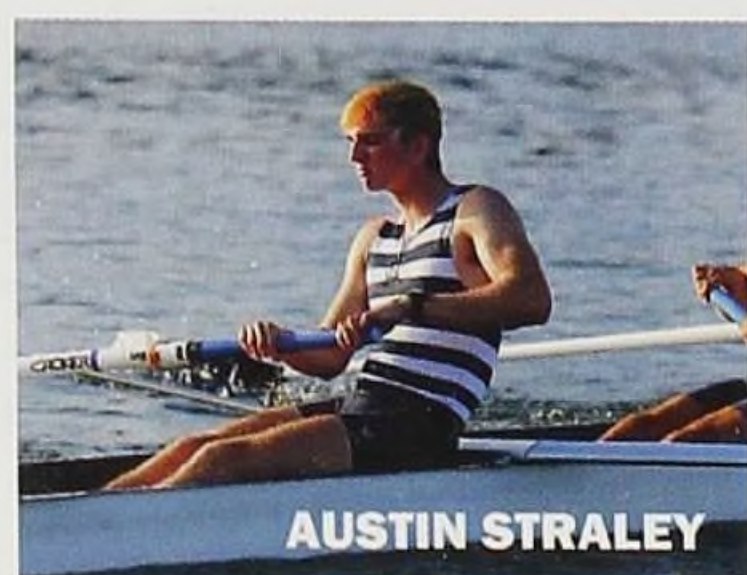


THE POWER OF TEAMWORK...

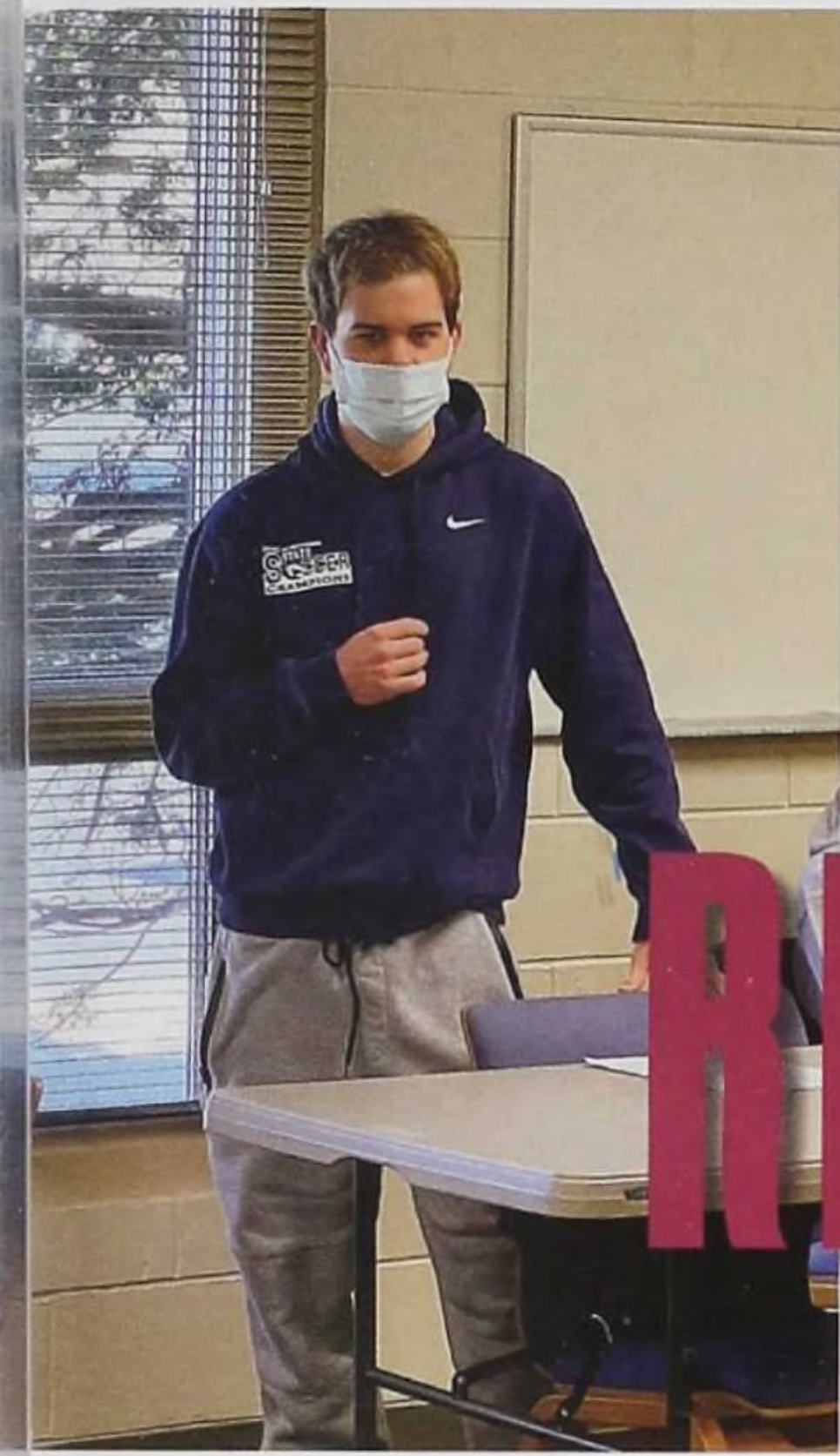
REPENT

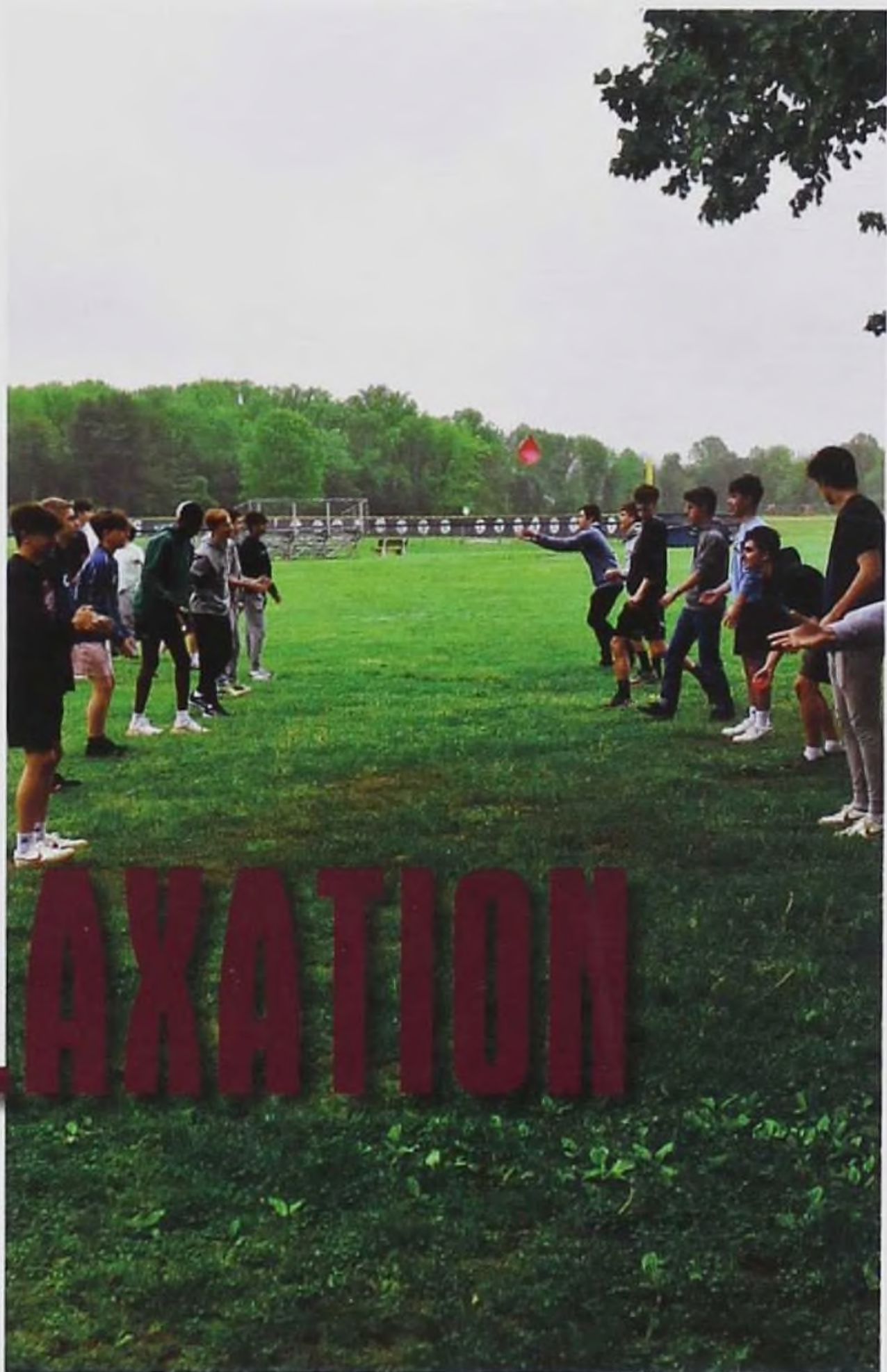

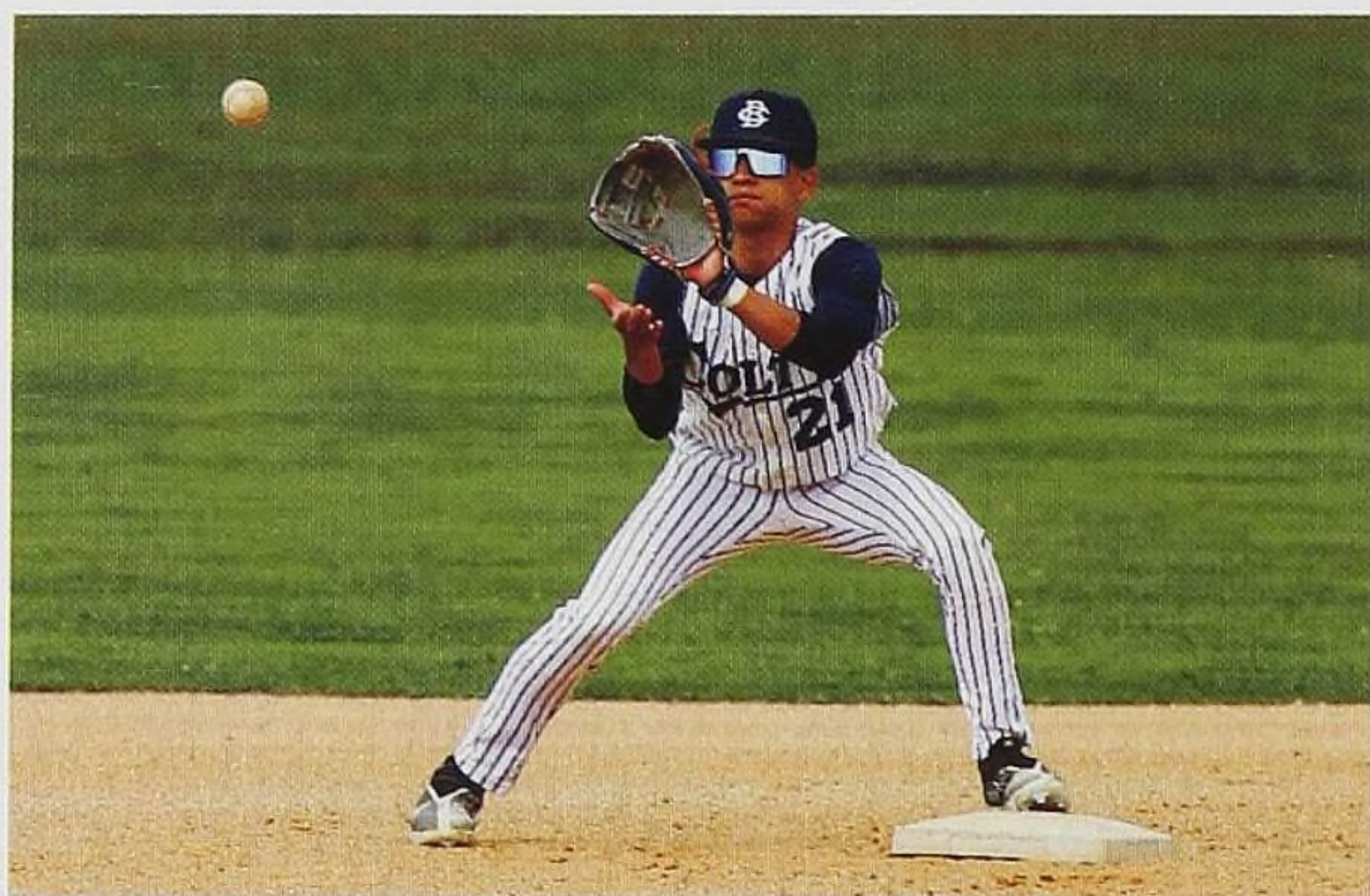

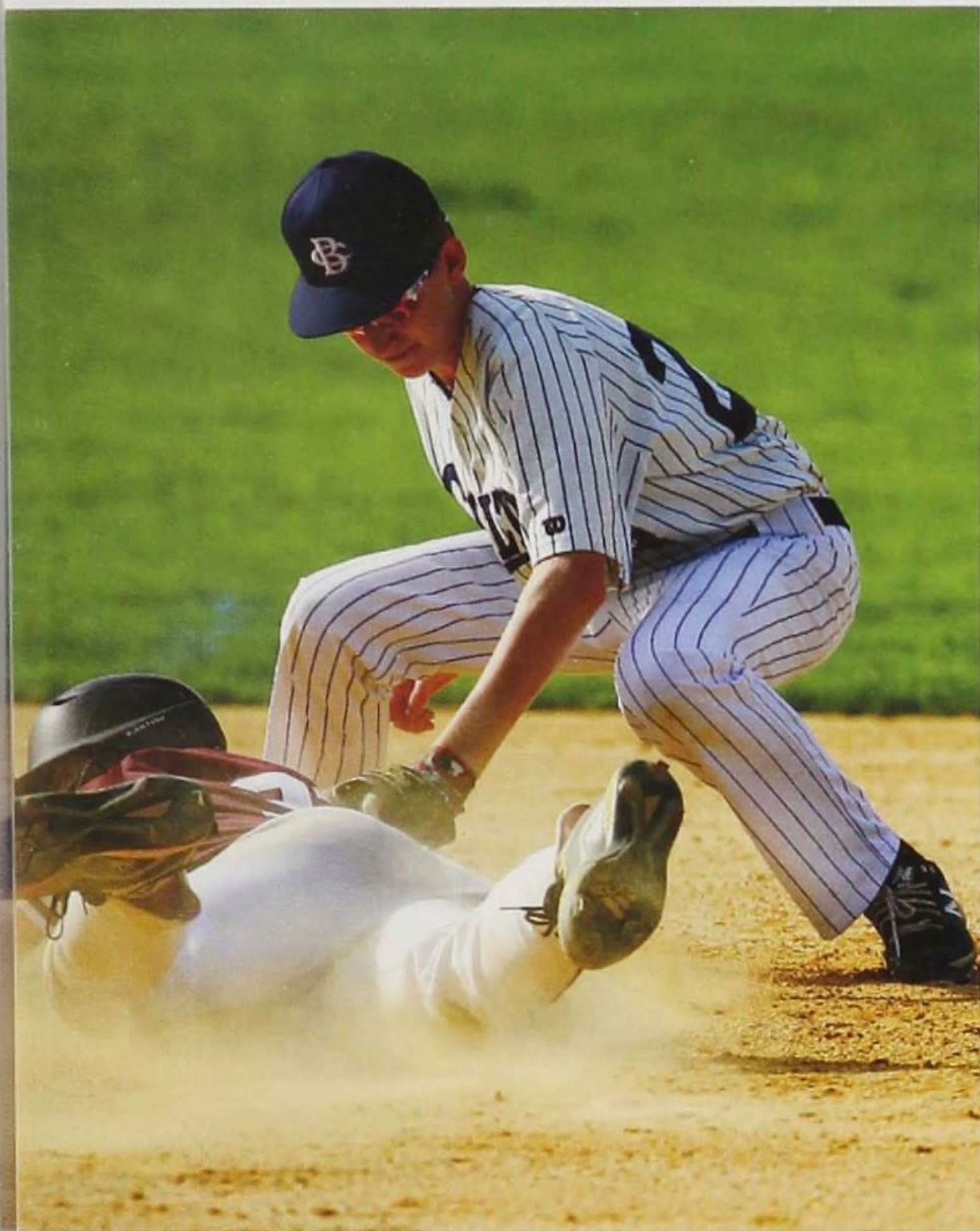

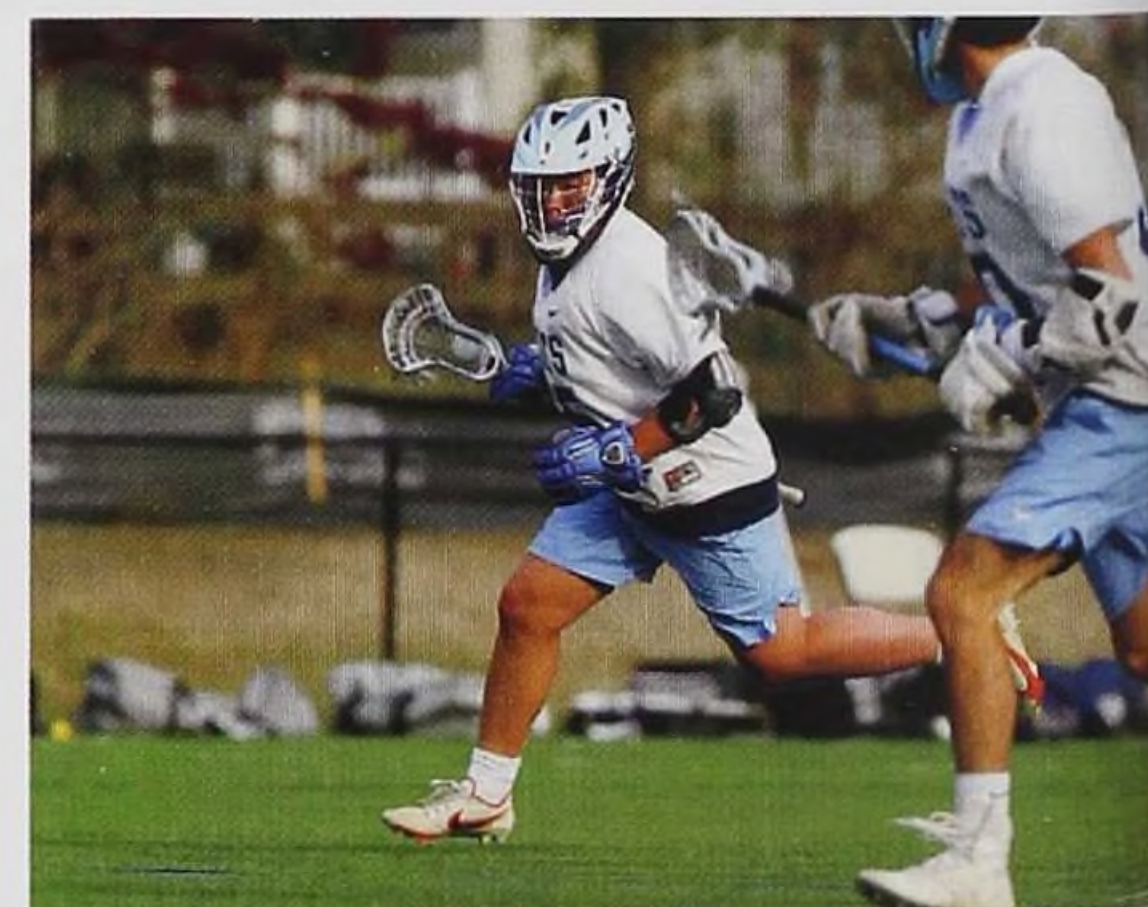

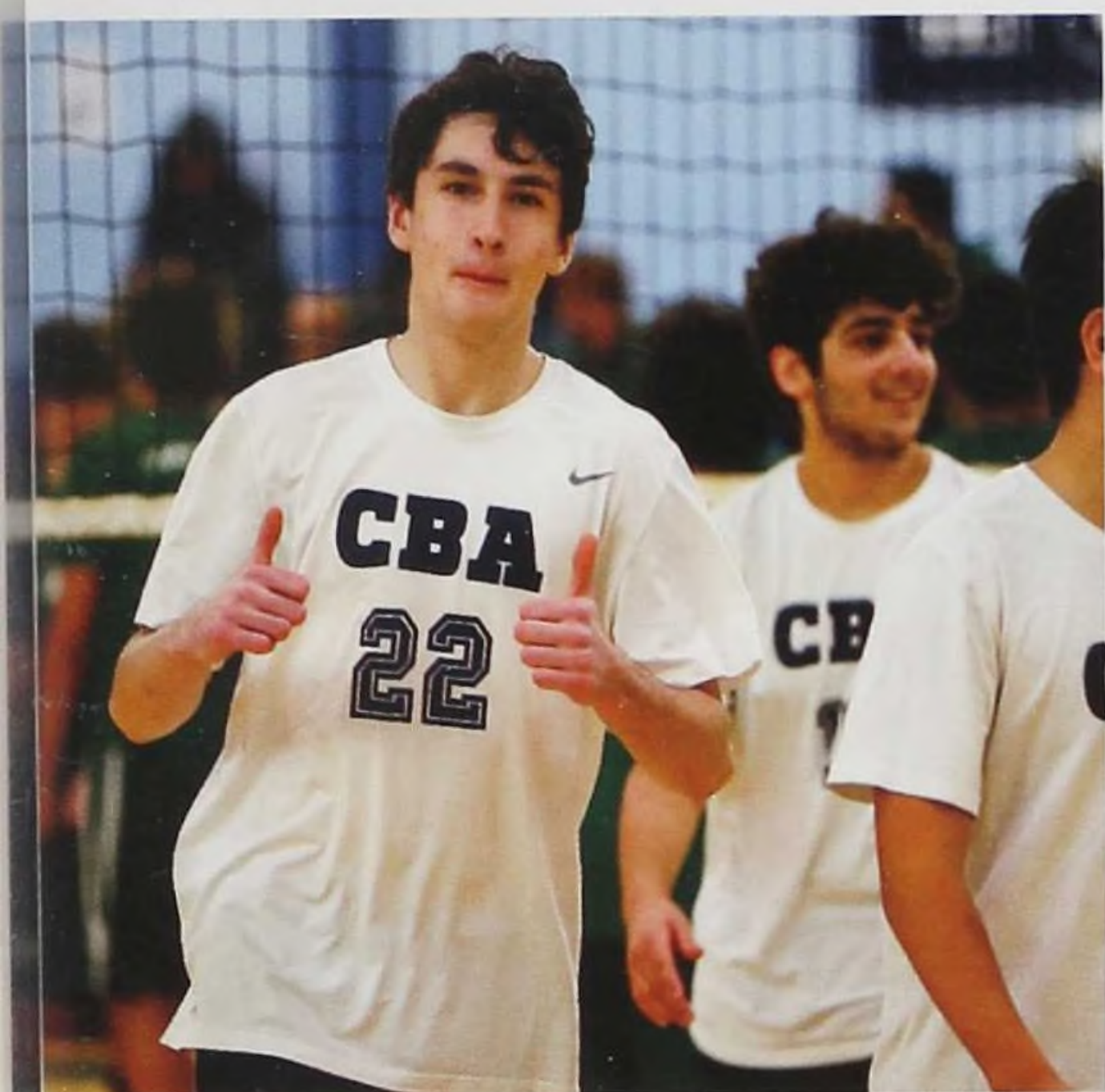

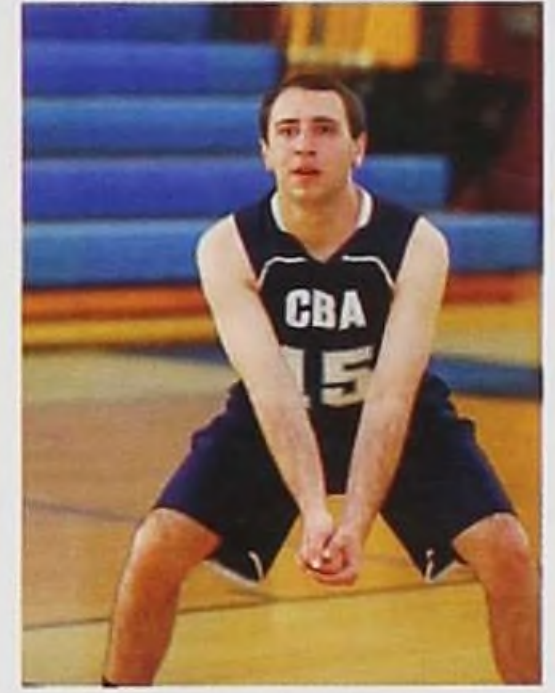

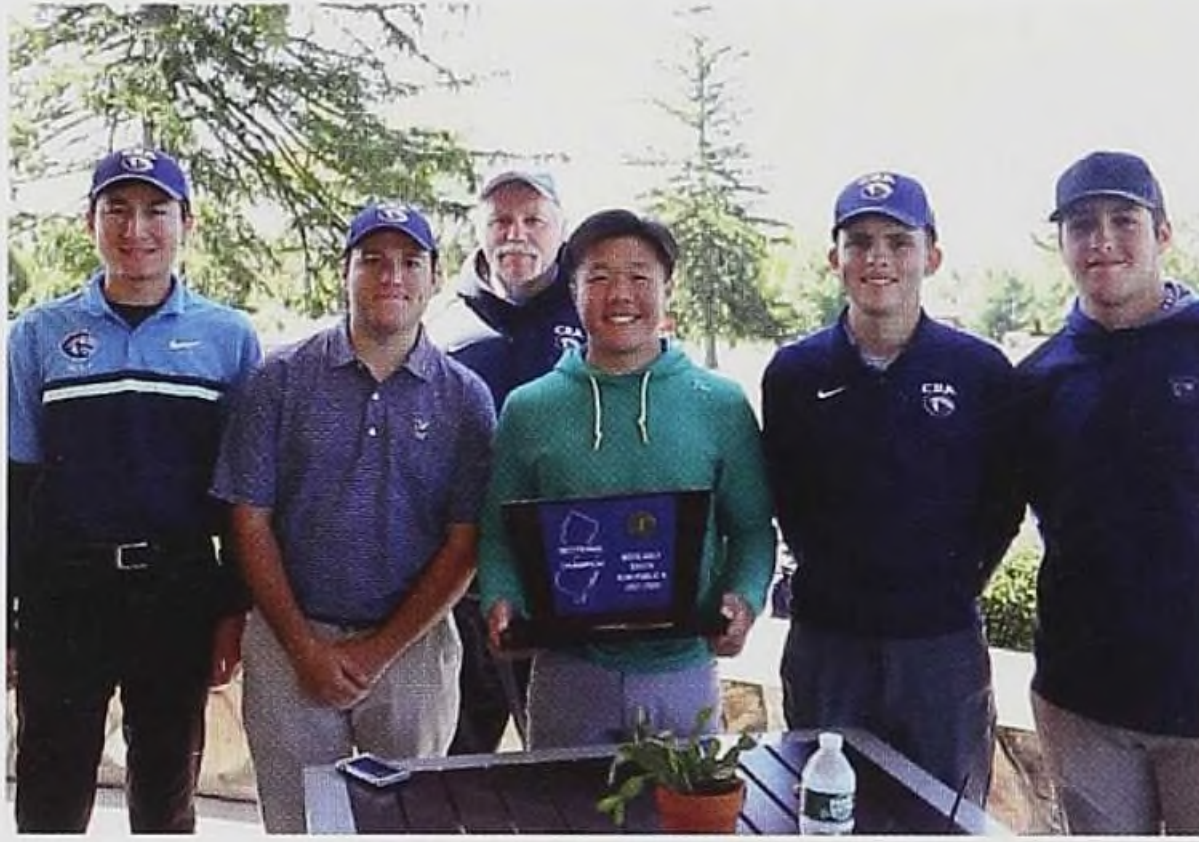

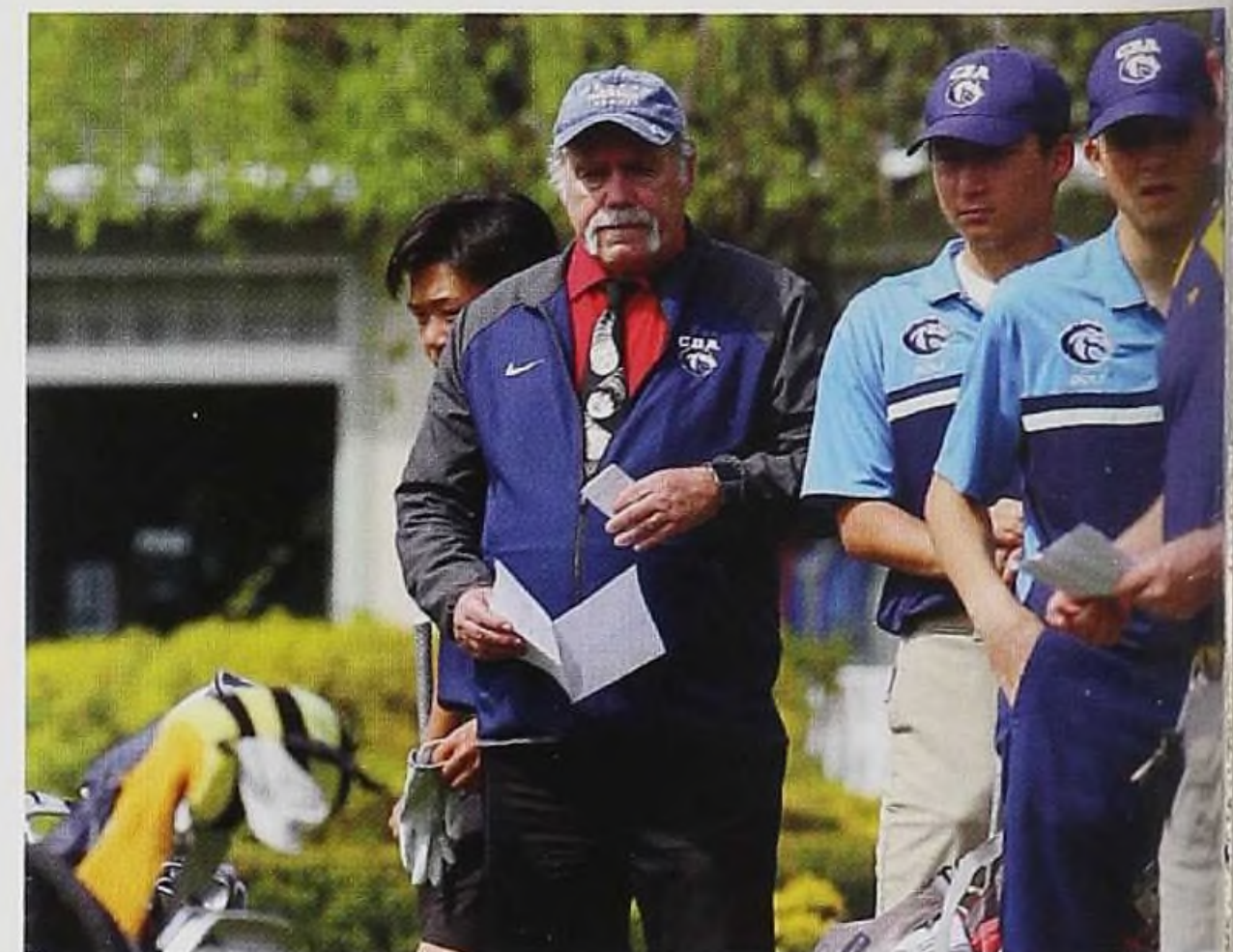

GURU PROGRAM

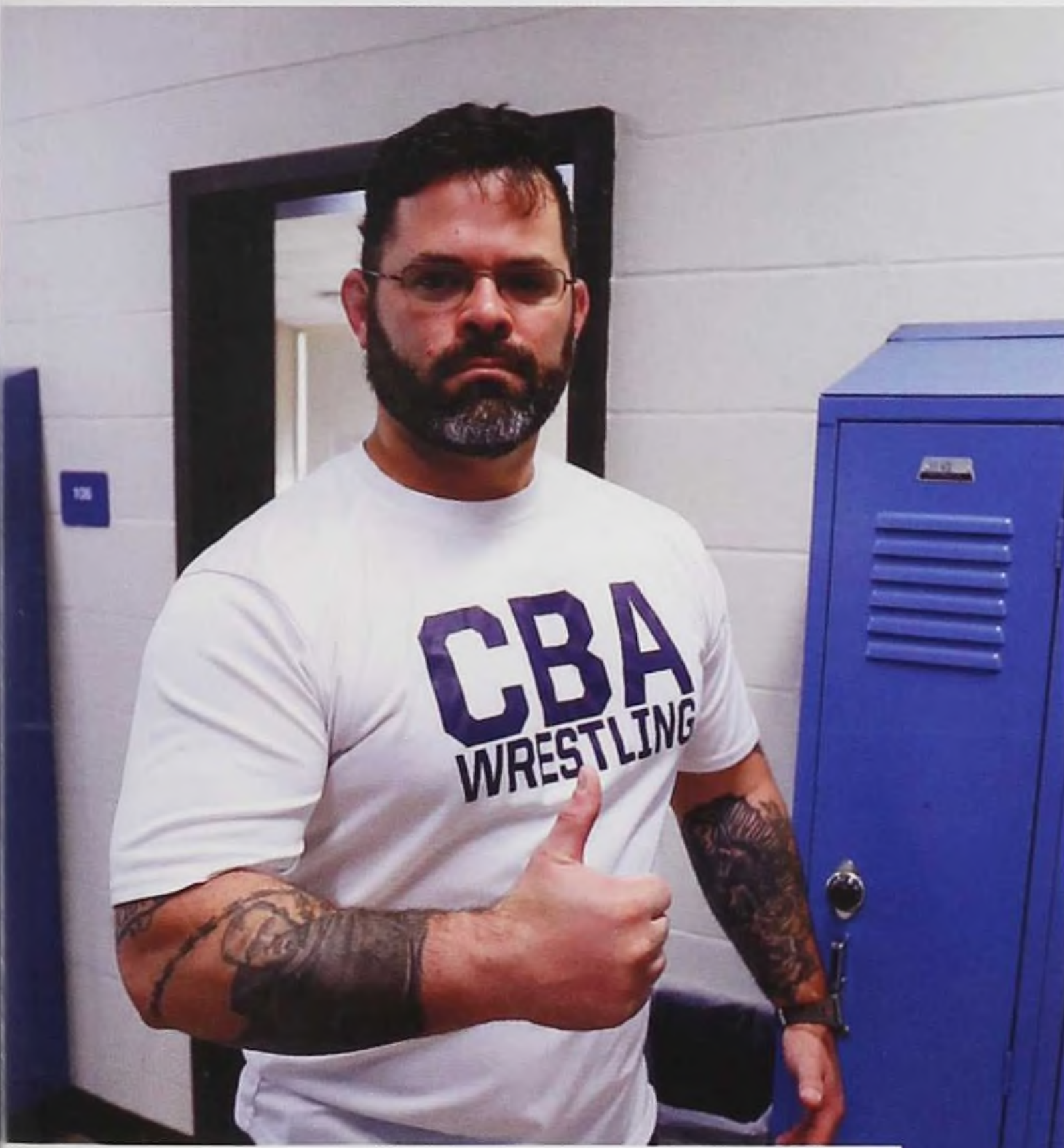

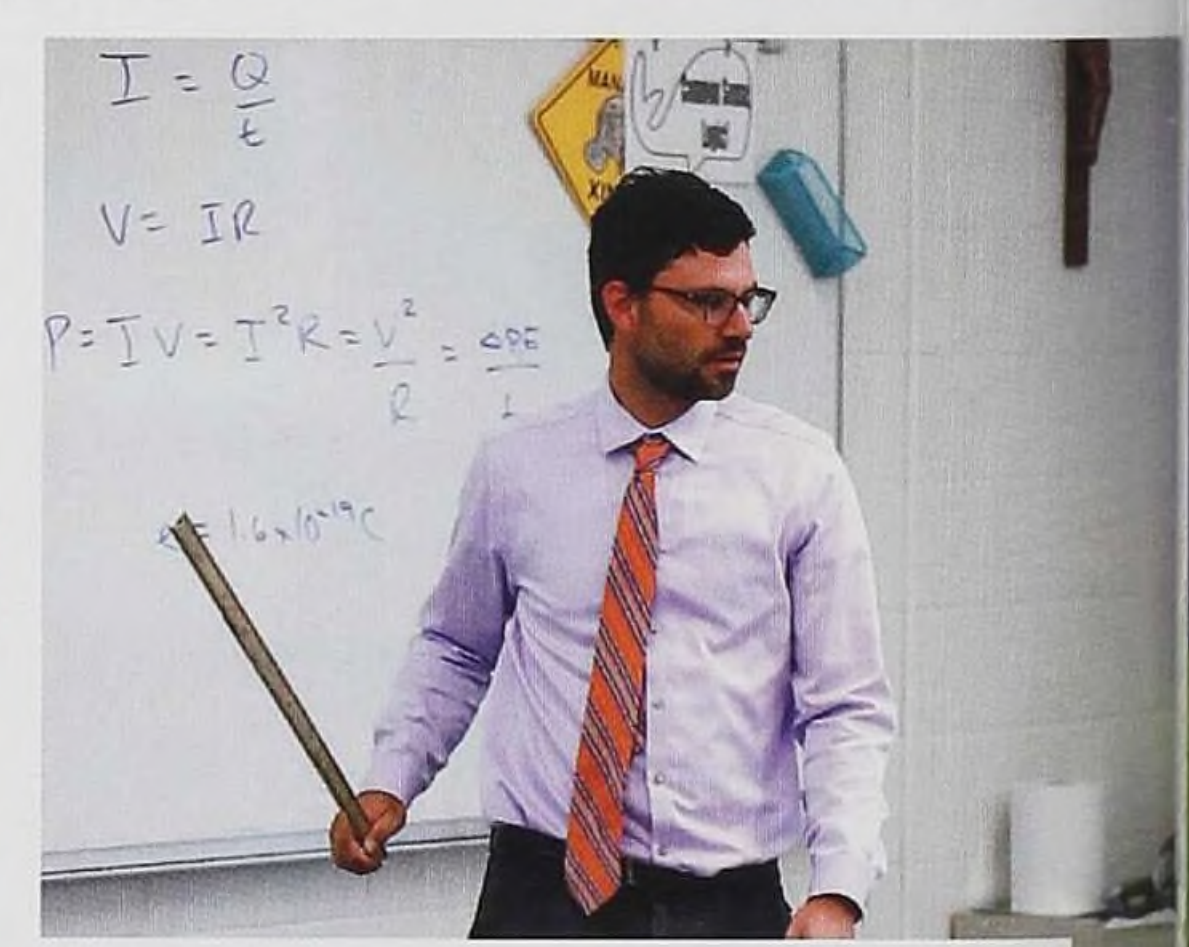
IN THE LAB...

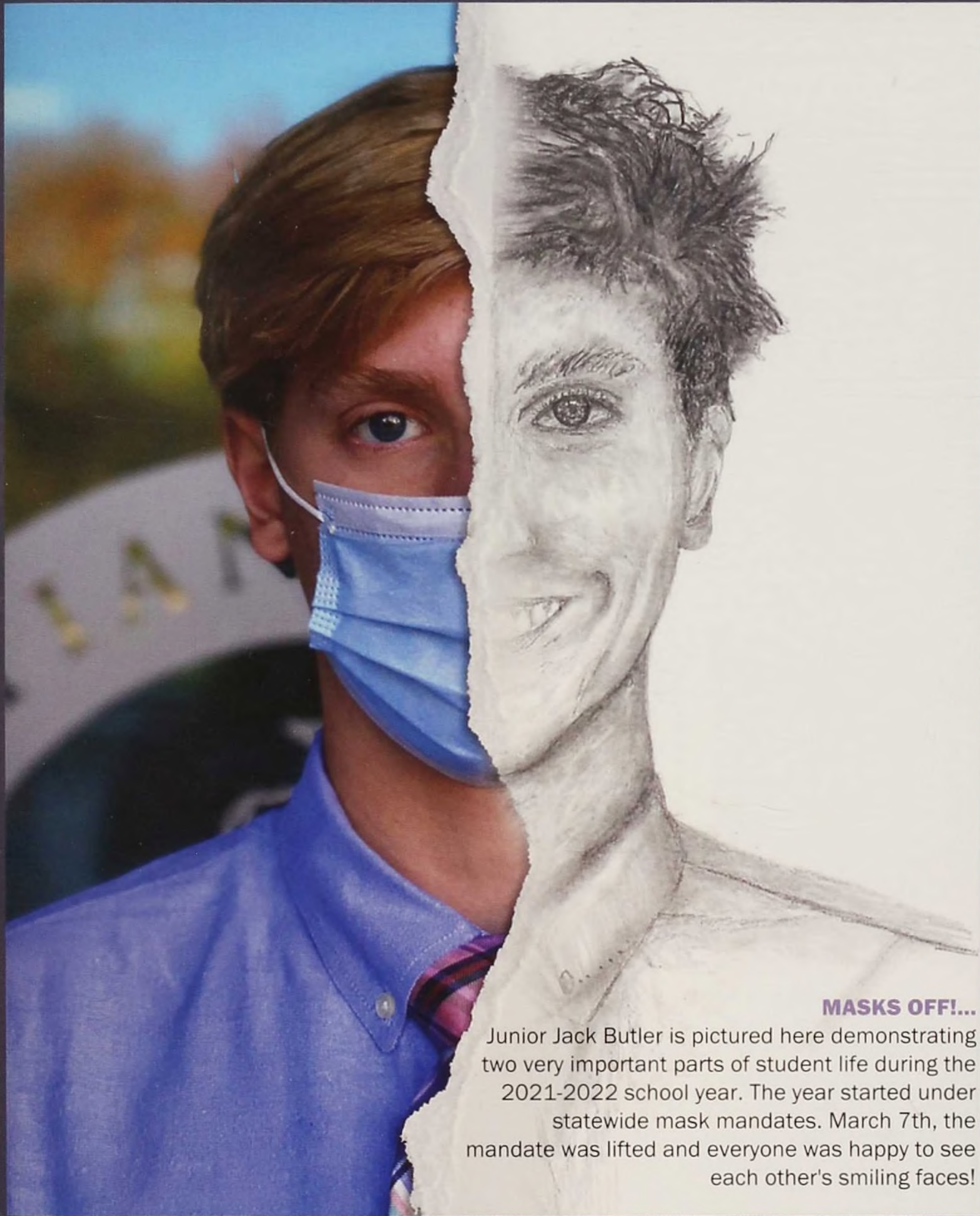
STUDENT COMMUNITY

Most students were stuck in school when the Varsity Soccer team kicked off in their state semifinal match, but some teachers were nice enough to live stream the start of the game!

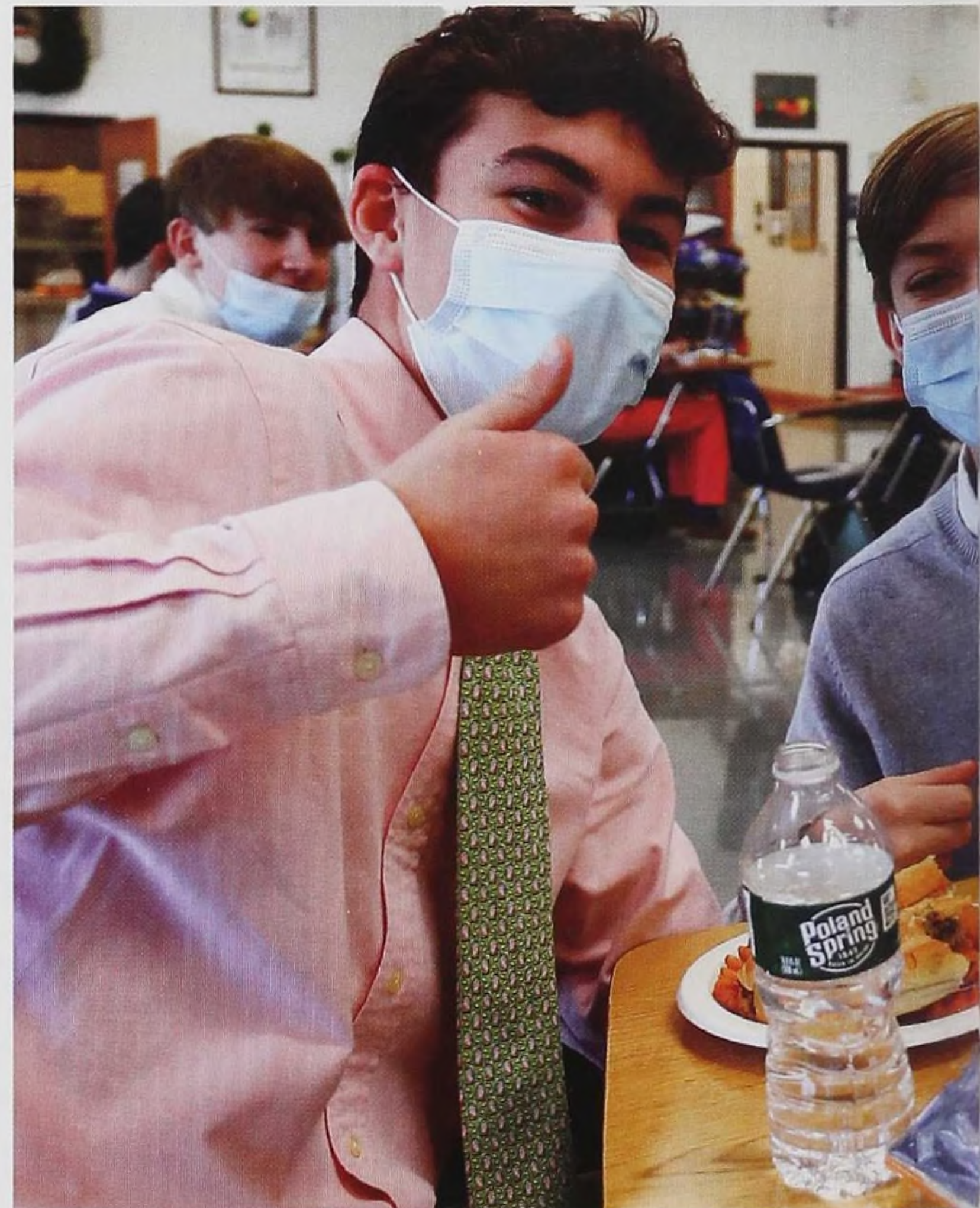

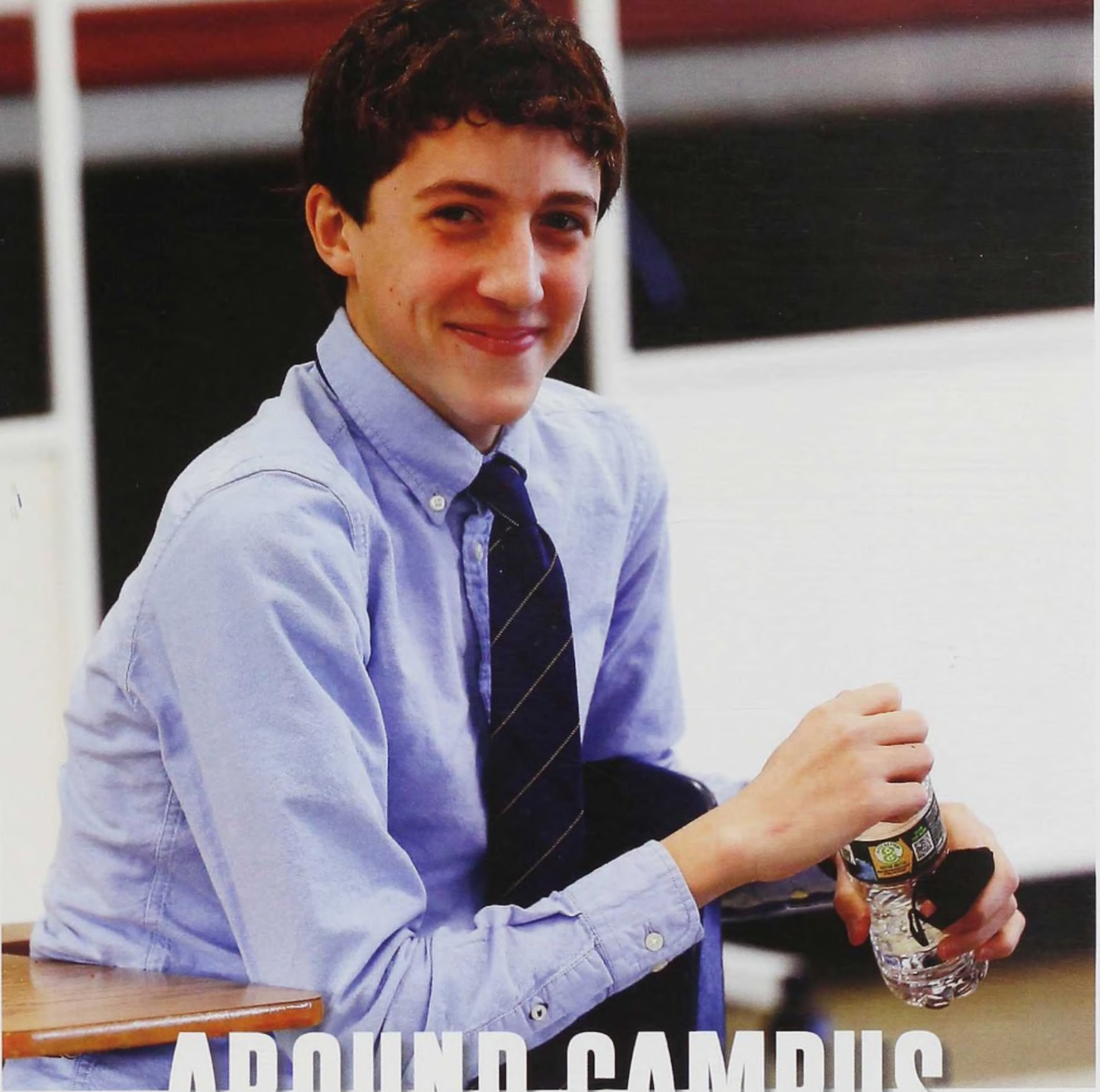
At some point during the year, the seniors made big plans to wear duck masks to a basketball game. When the plans fell through, the masks randomly appeared in classes.
